Board to ratify new teacher pact

Teachers in the Wayne-Westland School District have reached a tentative agreement with the district on a new, two-year pact. Faced with a Monday target for reaching accord on wage concessions with the teachers' union, the Wayne-Westland school board had scheduled a special meeting for 7 p.m. tonight to ratify the agreement.

Bob Kowalczyk, executive director of the Wayne-Westland Education Association (WWEA), said that the union's executive board will recommend to its governing board that the pact be approved. The governing board then has the option of ratifying the agreement ance the district's budget.

or asking its entire membership to do so, a procedure that can take two to three weeks.

The agreement was reached during negotiations held over the weekend.

"The agreement worked out was based on the proposal we made Monday night," said Kowalczyk. "It's something we can live with. We don't like it, but it will save those programs."

The board is asking for wage concessions from the WWEA on an extended contract it approved about a year ago. Without the concessions, administrators say the board will be forced to lay off teachers as part of a plan to bal-

At last Monday's board meeting, board members learned that the teacher layoffs would result in "extreme bumping" that would change 40-50 percent of the staff as some schools next semester. Giving that word was Bill Taylor, assistant superintendent for

employee relations. Other budget cutting measures also are being adopted by the district. Adminstrators said said that elementary art, music and physical education programs will be dropped if no agreement is reached with the teachers.

Apparently the district is seeking a one-year agreement.

"We made a new offer (Monday), and we urged the board to consider it," said Kowalczyk. "There is a two-year package that we've been negotiating and that we are still negotiating.

"There isn't the willingness (by the

board) to go beyond one year." Kowalczyk said that the WWEA has proposed wage and benefit concessions amounting to \$1.5 million in each of the two years of the pact - 1982-83 and 1983-84. In return the union is asking that programs not be cut and, therefore, teachers not be laid off for the entire 1983-84 school year.

"They (district negotiators) raised a concern about that guarantee of programs for the whole year. So we asked them to guarantee them for the first semester," explained Kowalczyk. "They would have the money for this year's programs, and they'd have \$1.5

million in concessions for next year.

KOWALCZYK SAID that the union is asking that the district not lay off any teachers until February 1984. If the district's financial problems continued at that time, Kowalczyk said the two sides could "talk or they could attempt to implement" layoff procedures provided for under the contract.

The concessions proposed by the union include reducing raises to six percent each year, giving up two days off without pay each year and picking up the cost of deductible charges in insur-

The contract, which had been approved in October 1981, had called for wage increases of 7.14 to 9.14 percent, depending on the consumer price index.

Voters tap four at polls on Tuesday

Voters will select four new members for the Wayne-Westland school board in Tuesday's special election to fill vacancies created after a successful recall election in September.

Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. in the district, which also includes a portion of Canton Township.

Ten candidates are vying for the four seats. To be filled are two six-month and two 18-month unexpired terms.

Competing for the six-month terms are Glenn Anderson, Mathew McCusker and Sharon Scott, all of Westland.

Candidates for the 18-month terms are Wayne residents Kathleen Chorbagian and Raymond Robichaud, and Westland residents Joseph F. Arbini. William J. LeDuc Jr., Phyllis M. Runion, Kathryn Shaw and Dorothy A. Stockwell.

Of about 50,000 registered voters in the district, about 15 percent had turned out to recall former board members Mary Arbour, Mildred Batterson, Kenneth Marshall and Donald Rusnock from office.

Taxpayers United Together (TUT), which had spearheaded the recall drive, said the four were removed from office based on their votes a year ago to extend a teachers' contract with wage increases before it had expired. The administration is now seeking wage concessions from the education association.

Appointed by the governor to fill the vacancies on an interim basis were Andrew Spisak, Dortha LeSuer, John Ryan and Donald Bedard.

Police seek clues in Greenfield case

Mystery still surrounds the execution-style slaying of Westland businessman, Timothy Greenfield, 24, whose body was found Nov. 22 in the trunk of his family's car in Pittsfield Township. He had been shot twice in the back of the head.

Westland Police Sergeant Robert Barthold said that as of Friday there were no suspects.

"We are continuing to follow leads, but right now we are at a dead end," he said. Greenfield ran a business called Unique Video which put video games into party stores.

He had been missing since the morn- and were considering hiring a psychic

ing of Nov. 10. His brother James said that Timothy left him about 7:30 a.m. saying he was going to check out some

video game machines for his company. He had told James he would be back to pick him up at 8 a.m. to attend a businessman's breakfast.

When Timothy failed to return and hadn't been heard from for several hours, James started checking with people at various video game outlets. None of them had seen Timothy.

James notified police and he and friends started their own search.

As days passed, the family placed newspaper ads offering a \$2,000 reward for information about him, conducted an aerial search by helicopter to aid in the search.

The original reward has been raised to \$5,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the murderer.

THE FIRST LEAD to Timothy's whereabouts came when the license plates from his car were found on a stolen car in Ann Arbor.

The victim's father, Harry Greenfield, conducted a search in the area and discovered the car in the parking lot of the Windover Apartment complex. He notified police and they found Timothy's body in the trunk.

Police said there was nothing in the car's trunk to offer any clues.

An autopsy report from the Washtenaw County medical examiner police at 722-9600.

showed Timothy had been dead six to 12 days.

His father is a former candidate for state Representative. His mother, Marian, is president of the Wayne-Ford Civic League.

Timothy was a 1976 graduate of John Glenn High School and had lived in Wayne since marrying the former

Sandra Vanhulle of Wayne. He is also survived by five brothers and three sisters.



Area shoppers start slow

Ronald Carr wonders if this is the long-heralded year when the spirit of Christmas buying finally fizzles.

Jim Peterson calls the next few shopping weeks before Christmas "critical."

"I wonder if this is finally the year they have been predicting for the last three years, the year when people won't spend," said Carr, manager of MacAuley's, Inc. at Livonia's Wonderland Mall shopping center. "I think this may be the year. This is the first year I've seen it this bad. This past weekend was very disappointing. The day ofter Thanksgiving is traditionally a busy day."

Added Westland Center manager Peterson: "For many stores, if Christmas is unsuccessful, the entire year is unsuccessful."

But Carr and Peterson both said they have what most other retailers contacted in a post-Thanksgiving shopping survey also said they have — lots of hope of making it profitably through another Christmas shopping season.

"There's a greater optimism among merchants than there was during the last 15-16 months," Peterson said. "I think we've realized we've reached a point where the economy has taken an upturn. You have to be positive about the way things are going."

Some, such as Jon Maston, manager of the Crowley's store at Livonia Mall and Mickey Esqueda, owner of Wonderland Mall's Cedar Chest, had good reason for their optimism.

Maston said the number of shoppers in his store the three days after Thanksgiving was "maybe better than last year." Esqueda said she had tripled her sales from the same three-day weekend last year.

Others said they expected the worst and wound up pleasantly surprised. "It was rather encouraging," said Faigie Vinegar, manager of Corey's Jewelry Box at the Livonia Mall. "I thought it might be worse. It was so-so, but nice. But I do think customers are more negative than usual. The whole country's negative and they're afraid to buy. It's a feeling that's hard to overcome."

Still others, however, had some bad news to face as they looked at their post-Thanksgiving figures: less traffic, less sales and fewer coins in the till.

"To be honest, we're down," said Charles Manning, manager of Kresge's in the Seven Grand Shopping Center, Seven Mile and Grand River. "I don't know by how much, but there was less traffic in our store, and among those who came in, there were less purchases."

Almost identical words were spoken by a clerk at the Seven-Grand Gift Shop also in the Redford shopping center. "We had lots of customers in here on Friday, but they weren't buying," she said. "I'd say business in the whole (shopping) center is down."

Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, was also a poor sales day for Barbara Cotter, manager of the Winkelman's store at Seven-Grand. "Friday didn't come through for us," Cotter said. "Shopping started out slow in the morning, probably because of the snow, then

peaked in the afternoon. Te evening bottomed out. Saturday we were busier than Friday, which is just the reverse of the usual day-after-Thanksgiving trend."

At the Sims Mens and Boys Wear store, also at Seven-Grand, manager Robert Heuser called Friday a "decent" shopping day.

"I'd say we had about 80-90 percent of our normal volume," Heuser said. "So that's not so bad. Friday was decent, and the customers were out buying."

The managers interviewed all said they were trying to give customers' what they wanted most this year: good values on practical items and lots of sales and special promotions. "Everybody loves a bargain," Heuser said.

Crowley's Maston described this year's customer as one who has money, but "maybe not quite as much" as in previous years. "This forces us to have a keener awareness of the mood of our customers and maybe show more concern here,' he said.

Vinegar, at Corey's Jewelry Box,

predicted retailers will have to fight harder for sales this year. "People are watching what they will spend and we will have to fight for and work for every dollar we get," she said.

In MacAuley's, Carr said customers were paying more with cash and less with credit cards.

"Usually, they buy on credit at Christmas," he said. "This year, they're spending only what they have."

Pryor, Gleason bring out laughs from weak script

Jack Brown, an unemployed journalist, never suspected as he looked for work that he would end up as Jack in the Box. That's what happens to him, though, in "The Toy" (PG).

In this slapstick comedy, Richard Pryor (Jack) ends up a plaything for a millionaire's son. When young Eric Bates (Scott Schwartz), also known as Master Bates, is taken on a tour of his father's department store and told he can pick any present he wants, he points to Jack and announces, he'll take "the black man."

The accompanying executives argue that you can't buy a person. They think it's against the law, but they're not sure. However, Master Bates' wishes are his father's commands. Therefore, his father, U.S. Bates (Jackie Gleason), makes an offer Jack can't refuse - \$3,000 for one week with Eric. (Bates is divorced and only has Eric for one week a year.)

After a few minutes of Eric, everyone can agree with Jack that the divorce settlement was harsh; one week is too long.

BATES IS A TYRANT who rules a business empire that includes a newspaper and factories as well as the department store. If he tells an employee to shave off his mustache or drop his pants in public, the employee does it or the next thing that will be dropped is his name from the payroll.

Within this domain, Bates, who is on a first-name basis with the Grand Dragon of the Ku Klux Klan, doesn't employ any blacks, except in menial jobs.

You can see that the situation calls for drastic changes, and Richard Pryor as Jack is just the man to initiate them. Jack affects their lives by burrowing from within. First he teaches the spoiled, bratty son a couple of lessons about human relationships, and eventually, he gets through to the father.

Is this movie funny? Not as funny as it could be because Brown's

potential for disrupting the establishment is never fully exploited. The movie works best in the first 30 minutes when the emphasis is on Pryor playing poker for discount coupons and food stamps with other unemployed workers; arguing with his girlfriend who works for "Klan Watch," a legal aid society for the poor, getting a job as a "cleaning lady," and facing the stress and humiliations of being unemployed.

THE HUMOR IN THESE scenes has a bright, original spark with real substance behind the clowning and pratfalls. When the emphasis shifts to Pryor as Jack Brown, Eric's toy, the comedy takes a decided downturn. The movie then becomes nothing more than a series of practical jokes, physical comedy children will probably enjoy but which lacks the punch of earlier scenes.

The incidents are completely predictable: a bucket of goop poured on someone's head, a tablecloth laden with plates of food pulled to the floor and the mandatory chase scene. In "The Toy," Brown and Eric destroy U.S. Bates' lawn party as they ride electric carts among the tents and tables, knocking down everything in

There is no faulting Pryor or the other actors in "The Toy." They all did a terrific job. I just wish they could have worked with better material.



HOLIDAY COOKIE HO

Even if you're not a crafts expert, you can build this cookie house. Just follow the step-by-step directions to make a charming holiday decoration you will be proud to display.

The materials and methods you use for this project make it simpler and more economical than most cookie houses. The base is a cardboard box, covered with decorator frosting, so you do not need to work with large, fragile cookies.

Using the refrigerated ready-to-slice cookie dough saves you the time and effort of mixing and rolling batches of cookies. The refrigerated dough makes especially attractive cookies for the house, because it bakes to even-sized, light golden brown cookies. Two rolls of dough will complete the entire project.

The roof shingles are formed simply by slicing the refrigerated dough and sprinkling the unbaked cookies with colored sugar. To make the smaller wall "bricks" you cut each slice of dough into four pieces.

No cookie cutters are required for the decorated holiday shapes that trim the front of the house. Directions are given for forming the shapes by cutting and arranging pieces of dough.

The decorator frosting covers the walls and roof of the house and also acts as "glue" for the cookies. Make three separate batches of frosting, following recipe directions, for ease in mixing.

The cookies should be completely cooled before you work with them, so you can do the baking a day ahead. If you'd rather complete the cookie house in one half-day session, start by baking the cookies. While they are cooling, you can construct the cardboard base, then finish building the house.

To create an attractive holiday scene, display the finished house with miniature evergreens and Christmas figures, such as carolers or angels.

Cookie houses like this have been kept from one season to the next, with just a little patching necessary the second year. The house should be placed in a cardboard box and stored in a cool, dry place.

HOLIDAY COOKIE HOUSE

MATERIALS NEEDED:

2 (17-oz.) rolls Pillsbury Slice 'n Bake Refrigerated Sugar Cookies

Red tinted sugar

Decorator Frosting (see recipe) Pastry tube and tips

Cardboard box with flaps (approximately 9x12x9-inch) Heavy cardboard for roof (approximately 14x15-inch) Masking tape

GENERAL DIRECTIONS:

To Bake the Cookies:

For easier cutting and shaping, work with part of the dough at a time and refrigerate the rest until needed. Slice cookie dough as directed. Shape cookies on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 325°F. for 8 to 10 minutes or until light golden brown around edges. (Do not overbake.) Cool completely on wire rack before decorating.

For Roof Shingles:

Slice one roll of the cookie dough into 50 slices (less than 1/4-inch thick); sprinkle each with red sugar. Bake and cool as directed.

For Wall Bricks:


Slice 28 (1/4-inch) slices from second roll of cookie dough. (Refrigerate rest of dough.) Cut each slice into 4 pieces. Bake and cool as directed.

3. For Front Of House Decorations:

Slice remaining cookie dough into 1/4-inch slices and follow directions for making Holiday Shapes.

TO MAKE THE HOUSE

Cut the two longer flaps from box (reserve one for the chimney and the other for reinforcing). Shape shorter flaps into triangles, cutting from top center of flap to corners of box, to form peak at front and back of house. Reinforce triangles on the inside by taping cardboard. over the flap fold. Fold 14 x 15-inch piece of cardboard in half to form roof. Tape securely to house. From reserved flap, form and tape chimney, cutting bottom at same angle as roof. Tape to roof.



TO DECORATE THE HOUSE

- 1. Prepare decorator frosting according to recipe. (Keep frosting covered as you work.) Spread white frosting over sides of chimney. Using red tinted frosting and small writing tip, pipe on lines to resemble bricks. Spoon white frosting around top of chimney to resemble snow.
- 2. Spread white frosting over roof. Starting at the bottom, arrange a row of cookie "shingles". Overlap remaining shingles in rows to cover roof. (Carefully press cookies into frosting to secure.)
- 3. Spread a thick layer of white frosting over sides and back of house. Press cookie "bricks" securely into frosting.
- 4. Spread white frosting over front of house. Using green tinted frosting and leaf tip, make door. Using blue tinted frosting and small writing tip, make window. Arrange decorated cookies on front. Press into frosting to secure.
- Spoon remaining white frosting on peak and around edge of roof to resemble snow. (If frosting becomes too stiff, add a few drops of warm water.)

DECORATOR FROSTING

- 1 cup shortening
- 4 cups powdered sugar -
- 1/4 cup water





- 5) Frost hat and moustache with white frosting, using a decorator tip, if desired. Sprinkle hat with red sugar.

Gingerbread chalet is fun, easy to make

Hansel and Gretel were lured, the tale goes, into the nefarious clutches of a wicked witch who built her house of gingerbread and who caught them nibbling at her home.

This little gingerbread chalet, decorated with candy canes and gumdrops and fenced with licorice, should prove equally alluring to children in your household.

The gingerbread recipa-makes plenty for the house, with enough left over for a few cookies. Red and green gumdrops, candy canes in various sizes, licorice "logs," peanut brittle and flaked coconut are used to decorate the A-

Another decorating idea is to cover the roof with tiny cookies, frosted and decorated with colored sprinkles.

This simple A-frame is a modernized version of the traditional four-sided house. The "deck" is tricky but can be made easier with the help of a temporary support from a candycane.

Use the photographs as guides and the step-by-step directions to make your own holiday house.

GINGERBREAD DOUGH

- 5 cups of sifted all-purpose flour
- 1 1/2 tsps. baking soda 1 1/2 tsps. salt
- 2 tsps. ground ginger
- 1 's tsps. ground cinnamon

¾ tsp. ground cloves 34 tsp. ground cardamon 1 cup plus 2 tbsps. butter 1 cup sugar 4 cup dark molasses 1 tbsp. grated orange zest

Sift together the flour, baking soda. salt, ginger, cinnamon, cloves and cardamon. Beat the butter until it is creamy and beat in the sugar until the mixture is fluffy and light. Beat in the molasses and orange zest.

Add the flour mixture to the butter mixture, adding one-third of the flour mixture (at a) time and blending it in. The dough will be stiff.

Refrigerate the dough serveral hours

ROYAL FROSTING

3 egg whites 1/2 tsp. cream of tarter I (1-lb.) pkg. sifted confectioners' sugar

Beat the egg whites with the cream

of tarter until they are frothy, then cool and firm, carefully peel off the beat in the sugar until the mixture forms very stiff peaks.

Keep the bowl covered with a damp

Baking the gingerbread: Folowing the chart, cut paper pattern pieces. Remember, you will need to bake two roof pieces, two walls and two chimney sides. If you wish to add a deck, cut a pattern 1x13 inches.

Place about one-third of the dough on a foil-covered board, press it down and cover it with wax paper. Roll it to about quarter-inch thickness.

Pull off the wax paper and place a pattern over the dough. Carefully cut around the pattern, removing any excess dough.

Carefully slide the dough, still on the foil, onto a baking sheet that will not warp (we used the botton of a roasting pan). Bake it at 350° F for eight to 10 minutes. Baking time will vary with the thickness of the piece.

When the cookie is baked, remove it from the oven and let it cool a few minutes on the pan before removing it to a rack. When the cookie is completely

CONSTRUCTING the house: When the gingerbread pieces are completely cool, prepare the frosting. Fill a cake decorating bag, fitted with a plain or star tip, about one-third full of frosting. When not in use, cover the tip with a damp towel.

Place the base on a foil-covered flat surface. Pipe a line of frosting along the bottom edge of the back wall and along the back edge of the base. Place the wall on the base, holding it upright a few minutes. It should stand up without support after a few minutes, as the frosting hardens quickly.

Decorate the front wall now. Pipe on a front door outline, a window or any other decorations that you wish.

If you add a deck, remember that this wall will be divided. Use colored frosting to make a wreath on the door or fashion some other decoration from cnadies and frosting.

Pipe frosting along the wall botton, and in a line on the base, about one inch in from the end. Place the wall on the base, allowing the frosting to harden. Reinforce connections by piping frosting along the edges

frosting along the edges on one side and press on one-half of the roof. You may have to prop it up (we used licorice seams. candies) until the frosting hardens. Repeat with the other roof piece. Don't be alarmed if there is a gap at the center of the roof. Ours had about a threeeighth-inch gap.

After the frosting hardens enough that the roof pieces don't slide, pipe reinforcing frosting along all the

PIPE FROSTING along each edge of the gap in the roof and place gumdrops along the top in a decorative pattern. They will fill in the gap and simulate

To attach a deck, pipe frosting on three sides and carefully slide the deck piece into place. Prop it up with a broken candy cane and let the frosting harden. Reinforce the seams with more frosting.

For rails, break candy canes into short pieces of the same length. Dab frosting on one end of each piece and

stand them up along the deck edge. Let that stand to harden while you construct the chimney.

Pipe frosting along the back and side edges. Place the back flat on the table and attach the sides, holding them upright a few minutes. Let the chimney

When the walls seem solid, pipe harden while you go around the house with frosting, covering all the exposed edges and reinforcing any doubtful

> When the chimney is solid, pipe the edges that will touch the roof and place the chimney on the roof. Hold it a few minutes until the frosting hardens. Trim the himney back piece to fit. To trim the gingerbread, use a sharp paring knife and run it over the line several times, cutting more deeply each time until it is completely cut through.

> TO DECORATE the house, use frosting to glue each piece of gumdrop or candy cane to the house. We cut green gumdrops in half and placed them in a circle for the wreaths, then used a red gumdrop in the center of each.


Candy canes were broken to fit and attached with frosting.

Pipe frosting in a decorative pattern along the deck edge.

Break pieces of peanut brittle and place them on the base by the front wall. Use more brittle to make a path

to the edge of the foil-covered base. Alternate gumdrops and licorice logs to make a fence, stacking two gumdrops at one corner to make a gate. Sprinkle conconut all over the base to

simulate snow. Take a deep breath and remove the deck support. All that's needed now is a pretty tableton







NOW is looking way back when

Now it's been a full decade of battling for feminist issues for the Northwest Wayne chapter of the National Organization for Women.

The chapter — born on the Schoolcraft College campus and growing up to attract women from all over the western suburbs - will mark its 10th birthday with a special meeting at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday in the little theater room of Hoover Elementary School, 15900 Levan.

Old times and new challenges will be front and center that evening. Mary Jo Durivage, current president, has invited past presidents and former members to share in the occasion.

Also planning to be on hand is Livonian Laura Callow, the only charter member among the chapter's current roster 83 actives.

Callow was attraced to the group over credit and health issues.

"I was called 'one of those complaining women' when I objected to mistreatment when my son was born," she said, "and my mother and a friend were subjected to credit discrimination when they were widowed."

- Callow went on to become one of the state's top leaders in the fight for passage of the Equal Rights Amendment.

THOSE PRESENT probably will talk of the ERA as a still lively issue, but they also will be looking to the future, discussing NOW's present more political stance, assessing the value of the consciousness-raising, networking and telephone banking the chapter has used to push its goals.

They will look at their own chapter, and they will look at their national organization, now numbering 220,000 members and targeting to increase that number to a million by 1986.

And they are sure to look back to the

At that time there were only a few chapters in Michigan, but the women meeting with Seaman indicated by signing their names on a paper that went around the room that they were interested in forming another.

Vukmirovich was the first president of the new chapter, and she remembers she wound up with the job because "I somehow was given the list and asked to set up an organizational meeting."

The new feminists met again the following month. The new chapter of NOW was on its way. It was chartered formally the next year.

Vukmirovich remembers her interest in feminism started with medical questions.

"I had been on maternity leave and had some medical problems." she said. "It seemed to me the doctors were condescending. They wouldn't bother to tell me things I would have liked to

"And they wouldn't discuss birth control. They were giving the pill because it was easier."

Her interest in feminism broadened, though, when she and other women started looking carefully at the Schoolcraft faculty and administration.

"We looked at who had the influential jobs," she said. "The faculty was 80-percent male, and most of the women were in nursing. The English department was about equal, but there were no women teaching social or natural sciences, and of course no women administrators."

"Decisions were made by chapters in their state," said Durivage. "Fenwick was pro-choice but against gay rights. Heckler had been a big proponent of ERA, but was anti-choice and went right along with Reagan programs."

JAN EVANS was president from 1980 to 1982, after Patti Wooldridge and Noreen Sweeney had served terms.

An educator who lists her occupation as a junior high band and orchestra director, Evans became involved in NOW during a court battle she initiated with the South Redford school district. She claimed the district acted unfairly in moving her from junior high to elementary level in music instruction, and early this year a consent judgment was signed providing payment to Evans of \$22,500.

She believes her major contribution was emphasis on networks for women and the phone bank activity.

That was used a lot during the recent election campaign, she said.

"We'd get a lot of us together and take names from petitions, or lists of those who have attended rallies, or ERA support lists," she said. "We'd tell them we were supporting Blanchard for governor, and we'd tell them why.

"Most of those we called would then ask about the judges and other candi-

They considered just a few. The telephone sessions, said Durivage, have helped make the organization known. "People will say they don't know much about a particular issue and ask for more information," she said. "You finish with the feeling you've made an impression."

Vukmirovich noted things have changed at Schoolcraft.

"We got them to start looking at hiring practices," she said. "The number of women in influencial positions still isn't high because there just isn't any hiring now, but they are a lot more sensitive. We're still at the lower edge of acceptable numbers, but we keep chipping away."

She also noted that Schoolcraft has kept its Women's Resource Center, established a child care center and has a

woman vice-president, Barbara Geil. Laura Callow, who realized "I was a feminist without knowing it" before the visit of Barbara Seaman and the organ-

ization of the NOW chapter, sees major changes in the time the chapter has been operating.

"I see the past 10 years as a time of massive education," she said. "We've brought about public awareness.



He teaches his native 'tongue'

The Madonna College classroom is filled with students, chatting back and forth, waiting for the instructor to arrive. There is a constant level of noise until he enters the room. Then there is

The tall curly-haired instructor smiles broadly at the class, gives a quick wave hello, then raises his index finger to get their attention. He puts his hands together as if in prayer and swiftly opens and closes them. The students understand. He places his hands together again, then begins slowly opening them and holding them there. The students respond, opening their

That is how Dennis Berrigan, a deaf instructor at Madonna College in Livonia, begins his sign language studies class. Berrigan, deaf since birth, does not speak and does not use an interpreter to communicate with his hearing pupils. Everything is done in sign language.

AMERICAN SIGN Language (ASL) is Berrigan's native language. In written answers to questions, he said he started signing just before his first birthday. He learned from his parents, who are both deaf. He also has two brothers and a cousin who are deaf.

Berrigan attended St. Mary School for the Deaf in Buffalo and went on to receive a degree from Gallaudet College. He also received a master's degree in education from Western Maryland College.

Before joining the Madonna faculty earlier this year, he was a teacher of the hearing imparied in the Bloomfield Hills School District. It was there he met Ken Rust, chairman of the sign language studies/interpreting department at Madonna.

"Dennis is a natural role model for our students," Rust said. "He is a native user of ASL, has the educational background and the pleasant, supportive personality needed to teach sign language courses.

The way he teaches is the most appropriate, Rust said. "Students would be as proficient in using ASL if they relied on English to learn sign language."

BERRIGAN TEACHES beginning. intermediate and advanced ASL courses. There are 140 hearing students majoring in the SLS/I program. Students can earn an associate's or bachelor's degree, or a one-year certificate of achievement.

In addition to those in the interpreting program, there are more than 50 hearing-impaired and deaf students at the college, studying in a number of areas. They are assisted by interpreters, notetakers and other special aides at no cost to them. Enrollment of deaf students began in 1975 with two.

Madonna College recently was awarded a grant from the U.S. Department of Education to establish a regional training center for interpreters for deaf people in Michigan and Ohio. The college also will hold workshops on issues of importance to hearing-impaired people and will assist in upgrading skills of interpreters currently em-

Berrigan said it is surprisingly easy for him to tell when students'don't understand, through their blank facial expressions and lack of feedback. When that happens, he stops and repeats the message until he is sure there is no misunderstanding.

WHAT IS NEEDED to learn ASL.

"You have to have a good attitude", said Berrigan "and you have to believe it is a distinct language and also have an understanding of deaf culture, where it is naturally developed and

He called Madonna a national leader in the field of education for deaf peo-I'm proud, because a basic goal of

the interpreter is to incorporate signs into a comprehensive language, making it possible to communicate with

deaf people, and we are accomplishing that here," he said.

"The administrators, staff and faculty have supported the program and philosophy of sign language studies and interpreting. We have many hearing-impaired persons at Madonna, and our communication rights are respected by all connected with the college.'

BERRIGAN MET his wife, Peggy, who is also deaf, at a New Year's Eve party in 1974 at the Buffalo Club for the Deaf. They lived in Southfield.

In high school, Berrigan was named

twice to the Western New York First Team All Catholic basketball squad. He also played four years for Gallaudet College. His basketball career has continued at Madonna, where faculty and staff members occasionally get together for a fast game instead of eating lunch.

After hitting a 20-foot jump shot, Berrigan is greeted by big smiles and "high five" hand slaps, universal communication signs. "Most people don't realize how often in their life they use sign language to communicate," he
