City deficit may force program cuts

Layoffs and possible cuts in service face Westland in 1983 as the city tries to cope with a budget deficit that may reach \$600,000.

Mayor Charles Pickering blames city council actions and loss of state revenue sharing for the deficit.

A "token" reduction in the millage rate and lower than recommended increases in street lighting assessments are two areas that Pickering said the council has "deliberately attempted to create a deficit in this budget.

"They're selling our city short," Pickering added.

Pickering and the city council have to a higher value placed on property in

been feuding since the mayor took office. Pickering twice vetoed budgets approved by the council, which finally overrode his veto.

He also accused the council of "taking advantage of the fact that citizens are concerned" about taxes and the deficit.

Last June the city council approved an operating millage levy of 7.16 mills - a reduction of one-half mill in the tax rate levied last year. Pickering said that amounted to about \$10 less in taxes for average homeowners in Westland. The half-mill represents a total of about \$325,000 for the city.

Taxes still increased, however, due

14.45 mills.

Pickering said that council approval of a 6 percent increase in street lighting assessments, instead of the overall 8.5 percent he requested, amounted to another \$75,000 in the deficit.

He said that state funding cuts would amount to more than \$200,000.

TO COPE WITH the deficit, the mayor recently held a "brainstorming" session with city employees asked to offer ideas on how to save money. The mayor's assistant, Joe Hawrylak, who also serves as personnel director, is now evaluating about 50 ideas submit-

Some ideas concern increasing fees

the city. The city's total tax rate is for permits and inspections, the disposal of city-owned property and unused equipment and others that are more long-range in nature.

"The goal was to examine every possible idea (to save money) without impacting the work force," explained Pickering. "The deficit is so huge, we're facing layoffs after the first of the year.

"We can't continue with a deficit. We thought we would be able to use 18month (revenue) projections for balancing the budget, but we didn't anticipate the state revenue loss and the street lighting assessment being low."

Another concern is whether the Reagan administration will continue to allocate the \$700,000 the city receives

in federal revenue sharing funds.

CONCERN OVER the budget deficit is forcing Pickering's administration to consider a "major adjustment in services" offered to residents. He said that total programs may have to be elimi-

"We're doing a hard study on what programs are needed," continued Pick-

To be given first priority are those programs and services which affect the health and safety of residents. Such services, Pickering said, would include police and fire protection and road

maintenance. Other areas such as parks and recre-

Equipment failure becomes burning issue for facility

Local rubbish will be buried instead of burned starting next week.

The reason is a long-standing dispute over whether locally owned rubbish incinerators meet Wayne County Air Pollution Division standards.

Because equipment which cost \$3 million failed to meet those standards, the county told the Central Wayne County Sanitation Authority to close its three furnaces by Jan. 1.

The authority, organized 20 years ago, by Garden City, Westland, and three adjacent cities, will be forced to layoff nearly half its work force some time in January, said Virgil L. Eller. executive director of the authority for most of its lifetime.

He said one supervisor and 13 hourly employees will lose their jobs although he hopes that changes in air-pollution equipment on one of the three furnaces will be able to meet county standards and resume burning.

But Eller said that that could take at least five to six months and possibly a

When the furnaces close down next week, contractors which collect local rubbish will continue to use the authority's equipment on Inkster Road between Michigan and Van Born in Dearborn Heights to transfer the rubbish to area landfills for burial.

Eller said that using landfills instead of incinerators is more expensive but feels that there would be no additional charges levied against the contractors which in turn are transferred to the cities using the furnaces and then to their

ELLER EXPLAINED the problem, which began about 12 years ago when the county told the authority to bring its air-quality standards from its thentwo furnaces up to county standards.

The authority, after its third furnace was completed 10 years ago, began planning the improvements for its newest furnace. If the improvements were successful there, they would be installed on the older two units.

The dispute ultimately involved the county air-pollution division, federal Department of Energy, and the designer and manufacturer of the equipment installed on the newest of the three fur-

The director said the Peabody Co. which designed the equipment, and Barton Malow Affiliates, which installed it, promised it would allow the

furnace to meet county air-pollution standards.

But after numerous tests and changes, it didn't, Eller said.

The sanitation authority is suing Barton Malow with a trial expected to be held early next year."

Peabody now wants to come in "at about the 11th or really 12th hour" and make more tests which it hopes will allow for equipment changes to meet the air-quality standards.

Eller-said that in the late 1970s, the authority received preliminary approval from the federal energy department for \$25 million in loan guarantees which would help the suburban agency get \$35 million for air pollution and other equipment.

But when Ronald Reagan was elected president, he put a hold on all such loan guarantees.

The authority also tried to get private financing but after getting two proposals it concluded that it was too expensive based on the rubbish tonnage reported at the incinerator.

ELLER TALKED WITH pride about the incinerator authority which was formed long before it was popular to burn rubbish instead of burying it in

Some of its customers have been the Michigan State Lottery Bureau, post office, Ford Motor, General Motors and numerous banks which have to burn confidential records and paper work.

The authority has burned more than 3 million tons of rubbish, more than any other incinerator agency in the country, Eller said.







'Miss Dig' fields 2 millionth call

"Miss Dig" has saved hundreds of lives and millions of dollars in property damage since she began operating in Michigan 12 years ago.

"Interruption of utility service has been avoided in countless instances," said Michael Digon, executive secretary of the pro-

and private utilities experienced frequent service interruptions caused by excavators striking pipes and cables," he added.

"Prior to the 'Miss Dig' program, public

This week the "Miss Dig" program passed a milestone by fielding its two-millionth call. Here is how the program works:

ANY CONTRACTOR or private property owner who is planning to excavate, dials "Miss Dig" at least 48 hours before beginning an excavating job. The contractor gives the operator pertinent information about the planned job, including exact location of the job.

The information is entered into a computer and teletyped to all utilities serving the

Those utilities then stake out their lines with color-coded markers, sometimes meeting with the contractor on large jobs to discuss excavation plans.

Assistance may also be provided by an electric utility if equipment is to be used near electric overhead lines.

Five Michigan utility companies - Michigan Bell Telephone, Detroit Edison, Michigan Consolidated Gas, General Telephone and Consumers Power - started "Miss Dig" in November 1970. They have administrative responsibility of operating the sys-

Earlier this year Consumers Power established a subsidiary to take over opera-

"MISS DIG" began with a pilot program in four townships bordering Detroit and spread rapidly throughout the state.

There are now 450 participants in the "MISS DIG" program. An average of 1,000 calls are received each day at the call center in Royal Oak. Fourteen operators have 19 phone lines open.

The original telehone number spelled MISS DIG, but the toll free number 1-800-482-7171 was added to accommodate the entire state.

At first, only underground telephone, telegraph, gas, electric, water sewer and storm lines and drains were of concern. Digon said. From 1977-79, "MISS DIG" added coverage of overhead electric lines throughout the state. Recently, "MISS DIG" began taking responsibility for underground television cables.

State law vs. charter on sheriff's appointment

It seemed to be over within minutes. By a 2-1 vote Tuesday, a three-member committee appointed Deputy County Clerk Robert Ficano to succeed Wil-

liam Lucas as sheriff of Wayne County. But there's more to it than that. A controversy has erupted over who should appoint Lucas' successor.

LUCAS, WHO will become county executive Jan. 3, was quick to attack Ficano's appointment, calling it "an affront to the will of the people," "premature" and "unfair."

Lucas contends the new county charter gives him, as county executive, authority to name the new sheriff. He declared he would appoint current Undersheriff Loren Pittman as sheriff "immediately upon taking the oath of office for Wayne County executive."

The Ficano appointment was made by a selection committee composed of County Clerk James Killeen, chief Probate Judge Joseph Pernick and Prosecutor William Cahalan. That panel was established by a 1954 state law governing counties generally.

AT THE OUTSET of that committee's meeting Tuesday, Clerk Killeen distributed copies of state and county law and a written opinion from state Attorney General Frank Kelley.

Killeen said the statutes and attorney general's opinion clearly give the committee - not the executive - authority to name the sheriff's successor.

The attorney general's opinion noted "the Charter County Act therefore does not confer upon an elected county executive . . . the power of appointment or the filling of a vacancy. . .

"This is the way it is, has been and the attorney general says it will be," Killeen stated. "Nobody has said to me this would be challenged."

THE CHARTER, section (2.212) cited by Lucas says the chief executive officer may appoint someone to fill the vacancies in the offices of prosecuting attorney, sheriff, county clerk, county treasurer, register of deeds and drain commissioner, "if permitted by law."

But Kelley's written opinion cited by Killeen said a 1980 amendment to the 1966 charter county act provides that "the duty and responsibility of an elected county executive . . . shall include the power of appointment and at pleasure the removal of heads of departments . . . except elected officials.

"The charter county act therefore does not confer upon an elected county executive . . . the power of appointment, or the filling of a vacancy; of the prosecuting attorney, sheriff, county clerk, treasurer or register of deeds," Kelley wrote.

Generally, state law takes precedence over a county or city charter.

Divorce tough on kids, too — prof

The stress on parents undergoing divorce often blinds them to the signs of stress in their children, according to a Michigan State University professor.

"When parents are on that slide toward divorce, constant tension tends to drive them inward so they sometimes become insulated from their children's problems," says Anne Soderman, assistant professor of family and child

Soderman says children typically conceal their stress. But alert, caring parents can interpret the signals.

"Really young kids are firmly attached to their parents," she explains, "so they quickly develop a fear of being abandoned. The mother might tell the child, 'Daddy and I don't love each other any more so we're going to live apart,' but the child might think, 'If she can leave daddy, she can leave me,

YOUNGER CHILDREN, Soderman notes, experience a "depressive reaction" which they often manifest through regressive behavior.

"A child who hasn't wet the bed in a long time wets the bed. One suddenly wants a bottle even though he's given it up. They watch a lot of TV, lose interest in their toys and start hanging around the house to be wherever the

Soderman says typical reactions in middle childhood (roughly ages 6-12)

are sadness and guilt. "They wonder why they can't keep their parents together and often feel it's their fault that their parents are breaking up," she

Another reaction is anxiety about having to move away, leave their friends, change schools. "It's different for younger kids because they don't really care where they live as long as it's with their parents," Soderman ex-

ADOLESCENTS, she says, think more about the future - what they'll have to do to get money, how they'll go to college, whether or not they too will end up divorced.

A further problem occurs when parents who have separated begin working out their hostilities by manipulating the

"A lot of parents can make the break egally but not psychologically," says loderman. They're angry, bitter, hurt ind they play 'pain games' with their x-spouses, using the kids to spy on and nanipulate one another.

"For example, the wife says, 'You tidn't send the alimony check this week o when you come to pick up our son his weekend, forget it, he won't be

After a while, the children learn to nanipulate the parents, too.

"They see they can satisfy some of heir own needs by using the parents

he way the parents use them," Sodercan says. "They'll say, 'Mom, I like joing to dad's better. I get to stay up ater, go, to movies, and I don't have to o housework. It's more fun there, and e does t't yell at me the way you do."

TO AVOID this, parents should present "a united front," Soderman advises.


"Parents have to be above this sort of behavior themselves before they can stop the kids from dollig it. They have to learn to support one another when talking to the children, avoid badmouthing each other and apply similar rules at both residences.

The children usually want to be with both their parents, so parents shouldn't force them to take sides. "The loyalty conflicts are very painful for children, and they tend to keep it inside themselves. It's emotionally wrenching," she

Also, parents should remember that their behavior sets examples for their

"They're teaching their kids how to react to stress situations and to relatiònships," Soderman says.





'Still of the Night' copies Hitchcock without arty story

"Still of the Night" (PG) is a white-knuckle movie from the startling opening to the tension-filled ending. It is also something of a miracle because it bristles with suspense even though the story deals with two dull and foolish characters.

Robert Benton directed it from his own screenplay, and took more than a page or two from the notebook of the master. Alfred Hitchcock. The movie is awash with references to, or quotes from, Hitchcock movies, including "Spellbound," (a dream sequence), "Rear Window" (a peeping-Tom view into an apartment) and "Vertigo" (a narrative description of a fall from a bell tower). Even one of the principal settings, an auction gallery, calls to mind a key scene from "North by Northwest."

In addition to such distinguished precedent, Benton has the advantage of Nestor Almendros' shadowy, mood-filled photography and the high-powered presence of Meryl Streep and Roy Scheider.

This should add up to the "psychological thriller" the publicity leads us to expect. Instead we get a movie in which the psychology has little to do with the suspense - created by superb use of sound, lighting, photography and editing. The story is disappointing.

SCHEIDER PLAYS a psychiatrist whose patient (Josef Sommer) has been found murdered. When the victim's lover (Meryl Streep) shows up at the psychiatrist's office, the recently divorced doctor finds himself attracted to her. His interest is undaunted, or maybe even excited, by police suspicions that the murderer is a woman.

From what the psychiatrist learns as he reviews tapes of his sessions with the murdered man and from what the police theorize, everything points toward Streep. Is the doctor in love with a killer? Why is he attracted to her? Is it all that nervous twitching and the kinky behavior?

Streep's character would put off anyone except a mental-health professional. However, Scheider's interest seems more than professional. I say "seems" because both these characters are so cold, when they kiss it's like two icebergs sliding against each other. There is no warmth there. They don't click as a couple, and they don't fare much better as individuals.

Streep is so edgy and jittery that we can't believe she actually is employed in a fine-arts auction gallery where she handles precious and delicate objects. And Scheider's character does nothing to disprove folk wisdom that says certificates and diplomas have nothing to do with common sense.

Every time he makes a move, he puts himself in jeopardy. You can't expect an audience to sympathize with characters who are just plain dumb, and that's the way the psychiatrist is in "Still of the Night." If there is a dark, dangerous and isolated place, trust him to find it.

THIS FOOLHARDINESS extends to walking through Central Park at night. Now that's stretching things beyond all credibility. Even foreign tourists know enough to avoid the park at night.

The only minimally interesting aspect of the character is his relationship with his mother (Jessica Tandy), also a psychiatrist. They get together and chat about dreams. He gives one interpretation, she another.

The other worthy part of the film is the inside look it gives us of the operations of a major auction house, probably modeled after Sotheby-Park Bernet. Now if the characters were of some interest, I'd make a bid for this move. As it is, I can only admire Benton's expertise in creating suspense out of such thin stuff.



Roy Schelder plays the victim's psychiatrist, a man singularly tacking in common sense. He seems to take every opportunity to needlessly expose himself to danger - such as taking a midnight stroll through some of New York City's more dimly lit streets,



Based on the regular season, it was a very good year for four area prep girls' basketball teams.



'Still of the Night' copies Hitchcock without arty story

"Still of the Night" (PG) is a white-knuckle movie from the startling opening to the tension-filled ending. It is also something of a miracle because it bristles with suspense even though the story deals with two dull and foolish characters.

Robert Benton directed it from his own screenplay, and took more than a page or two from the notebook of the master, Alfred Hitchcock. The movie is awash with references to, or quotes from, Hitchcock movies, including "Spellbound," (a dream sequence), "Rear Window" (a peeping-Tom view into an apartment) and "Vertigo" (a narrative description of a fall from a bell tower). Even one of the principal settings, an auction gallery, calls to mind a key scene from "North by Northwest."

In addition to such distinguished precedent, Benton has the advantage of Nestor Almendros' shadowy, mood-filled photography and the high-powered presence of Meryl Streep and Roy Scheider.

This should add up to the "psychological thriller" the publicity leads us to expect. Instead we get a movie in which the psycholog has little to do with the suspense — created by superb use of sound, lighting, photography and editing. The story is disappointing.

SCHEIDER PLAYS a psychiatrist whose patient (Josef Sommer) has been found murdered. When the victim's lover (Meryl Streep) shows up at the psychiatrist's office, the recently divorced doctor finds himself attracted to her. His interest is undaunted, or maybe even excited, by police suspicions that the murderer is a woman.

From what the psychiatrist learns as he reviews tapes of his sessions with the murdered man and from what the police theorize, everything points toward Streep. Is the doctor in love with a killer? Why is he attracted to her? Is it all that nervous twitching and the kinky behavior?

Streep's character would put off anyone except a mental-health professional. However, Schelder's interest seems more than professional. I say "seems" because both these characters are so cold, when they kiss it's like two icebergs sliding against each other. There is no warmth there. They don't click as a couple, and they don't fare much better as individuals.

Streep is so edgy and jittery that we can't believe she actually is employed in a fine-arts auction gallery where she handles precious and delicate objects. And Scheider's character does nothing to disprove folk wisdom that says certificates and diplomas have nothing to do with common sense.

Every time he makes a move, he puts himself in jeopardy. You can't expect an audience to sympathize with characters who are just plain dumb, and that's the way the psychiatrist is in "Still of the Night." If there is a dark, dangerous and isolated place, trust 'him to find lt. .

THIS FOOLHARDINESS extends to walking through Central Park at night. Now that's stretching things beyond all credibility. Even foreign tourists know enough to avoid the park at night.

The only minimally interesting aspect of the character is his relationship with his mother (Jessica Tandy), also a psychiatrist. They get together and chat about dreams. He gives one interpretation, she another,

The other worthy part of the film is the inside look it gives us of the operations of a major auction house, probably modeled after Sotheby-Park Bernet. Now if the characters were of some interest, I'd make a bid for this move. As it is, I can only admire Benton's expertise in creating suspense out of such thin stuff.



She will be working part-time for SCAM, a summer camp administered by the Clarkston school district for children in special education programs. She will coordinate volunteers and work on public relations and raising funds for the agency.

Assistant director Debbie Koltunchik Bartnick will take over her Northwest Communities work on a pro tem basis. The local ARC plans a party for Olesnavage 4-7 p.m. Friday, Jan. 7 at the Wayne County ARC workshop, 32229 Schoolcraft, Livonia.

WHEN OLESNAVAGE came to work at the Redford-based ARC, it was a time when the whole picture was rapidly changing for the mentally retard-

Poor treatment of mentally retarded persons at Plymouth Center for Human Development was front page news, and the public was beginning to see the developmentally disabled as persons in need of society's attention.

Professionals were increasingly convinced that needs of the mentally retarded would be served best in a homelike community setting, so group homes were being established and controversy over the location of these homes was mounting.

More laws were being passed offering the mentally retarded more protec-

"Probably the best thing that ever happened to our ARC was hiring her as director," said Sylvia Kloc of Redford, president of the organization at the time Olesnavage was selected. "She has good administrative skills, ability to meet people and speak competently and comfortably in public. Many ideas originate with her, ideas that blended with ours."

Kloc added that sometimes when a volunteer organization hires professional staffers, the volunteers fade

"Margaret has the ability to continue to keep people interested in volunteering," said Kloc.

When Olesnavage arrived on the scene there were about 100 active volunteers. Today there are 150-200. Membership rose from about 400 families to close to 600.

THERE WAS ONE point that gave the ARC board a moment of hesitation before hiring her. Olesnavage had been jailed for burning draft records during the Vietnam War. She was later told that one ARC board member sought a minister's counsel about this. This person was told that if Olesnavage was that committed to an ideal, she would

"It's been an excellent job," said the former director.

be good for ARC.

She said she will miss most her work as an advocate "on the front lines for the rights of mentally retarded." Her job has taken her to Lansing to testify. in their behalf, and to demonstrations in Lansing and Washington, DC with mentally retarded people who are wor-

ried about budget cuts. Would she also miss her 28-hour dancing stint with her husband when the ARC raised \$3,160 with a dance-athon last year? Probably not, she admitted, but added that the results were worth the swollen ankle.

DURING HER TENURE, she and ARC volunteers established a training facility for adults who are mentally re-

Angora wool just one use

Try 4-H rabbits for a real soft touch

Rabbits offer a multiplicity of reasons for being the focus of a 4-H club.

"They're nice pets," said Patricia Smith, for 10 years the adult leader of 4-H youth interested in

'But they also are a food animal," she noted. And besides that, Smith pointed out, rabbits have fur that can be turned into soft coats or spun into even softer wool.

Rabbit clubs are popular in the 4-H, said Connle Testorelli, a program assistant in the 4-H division of the Wayne County Extension.

"They're good for kids who are interested in farm-type animals but live in suburban areas and can't work with cows or horses," she said.

tarded. Called Cambridge Club, this restaurant was close to the hearts of parents who want to see their children achieve some kind of independence through having a job.

The project ran out of runds and is now closed, but its board of directors hope to reopen it.

Olesnavage's time with ARC has seen several other innovations.

A Youth ARC was founded, made up of are high-school students who help mentally retarded teens by accompanying them to cultural and social events and training them for the Speciál Olympics.

Péople for Independence was also begun. Its members are adults who are mildly retarded. They elect their own officers and board of directors. The group has its own bank account, newsletter, mailing list and volunteer

"Its treasurer, Theresa Smith, now sits on the board of directors of Northwest ARC," said Olesnavage. "She is one of the most vocal and active board members. That says what ARC is all

"About 70 percent of the people with mental retardation can be self-supporting and speak for themselves. We started that kernel 21/2 years ago, and now it's growing."

A TROOP of Boy Scouts came into being, although some parents were certain their retarded sons could not do various Scout tasks.

"John Stowe, the leader has taken them miles; it's really a Boy Scout group," said Olesnavage. "The same with the baseball team. A parent might say Bill can't hit a ball. But Bill is now

catching and fielding in addition to hitting the ball."

Genetic screening has been sponsored by ARC. Its main thrust is to let parents of a retarded child know if there is something in the parents' genetic makeup that might cause them to give birth to a second retarded youngster.

"One family found they had the 'fragile X syndrome'," said Olesnavage. "They found they can do preventive things so future children are not born retarded."

ARC donates funds to research. Olesnavage noted that half of the birth defects involving retardation are pre-

MARGARET AND JOHN Olesnavage have moved to the Clarkston area because he is director of a northern Oakland County day-care program for the mentally ill.

Recently they became instant parents, adopting two brothers - Curtis who is 12 and Mickey, 7. Both had lived in a succession of foster homes.

"Though they are natural brothers, they didn't live together for five years," sald Olesnavage, who has discovered that "family life is just really neat.

"It's become clear to me in the past year that a family is an important part of marriage," she said. She then explained that their new house on Lake Whipple has an extended family in the form of ducks, rabbits and a dog.

Long hours at work plus evening meetings have kept her away more than she wishes from these two boys, whose greatest happiness lies in the times the whole family is together.

Curtis and Mickey have also put in a request for a little sister, which their parents are taking seriously.

to watch with their owners.

Pacheco took the unprotesting Snowbird and showed the club how the long hairs can be combed out and then carded so it is ready for the spinning

"You don't clip angora rabbits," she said. "Spinners don't want clipped hair; there are too many short ends."

She said an angora like Snowbird can be combed several times a year and the hairs stored in a paper bag. When she had some of his coat combed out, she began pumping her spinning wheel and turning the fur into soft yarn.

"Some spinners just put the rabbit on their laps and start the wheel going," she noted. "I don't do it that way, though."

She twisted her fibers as the wheel turned. "Angora is easy to spin because you don't have to do anything to the fiber," said Pacheco. "You can mix it with wool to make it go further. But it's the softest fiber there is. Merino is the finest wool you can spin, and it's not anything like angora for softness."

WHILE PACHECO was letting some of the club members take their turns at the spinning wheel, Smith talked about the group she heads.

A psychiatric nurse, she has been with the rabbit club since her own daughters were in 4-H and The 30 or more youngsters who show up for

monthly meetings range in age from 10 through high school. "They're in the club for different reasons," Smith


said. "Some have one rabbit and it's a pet. Some have angoras and sell the wool. Some have show rabbits, French lops or tans or Netherland dwarfs. "And some are raising meat rabbits."

All members attend the slaughtering and tanning

clinics, she added, and other 4-H club members come for those events. "It's important to all rabbit owners to know about slaughtering," she said. "Then when you have a litter you can't sell you can slaughter them and eat them."

The club also puts on its own show each year and joins in 4-H shows at the Belleville fairgrounds. Steven Hatyps is the current president.

The club show used to be in Smith's Livonia back yard, but this year it will be in the barn on the Wayne County Extension complex in Wayne.

Read this before trying to jump start your car

Jump starting a car can be dangerous if proper procedures aren't followed, warns the Automobile Club of Michigan.

Before attaching booster cables, make sure both cars are in park and do not touch each other. Turn off the ignitions and all electrical accessories.

Connect one end of a cable to the positive terminal of the healthy battery (Step One in drawing) and attach its other end to the positive terminal of the

disabled battery (Step Two). Then connect one end of the other cable to the negative terminal of the healthy battery (Step Three) and attach the last clamp to the engine

block or generator mounting bracket of the disabled car, as far from the battery as possible (Step

Start the healthy car's engine and let it run for several minutes before starting the disabled car.

To remove the cables, reverse the order. If the battery has water cell clamps, remove them and place a damp cloth over openings before

jump starting. Some batteries have small screws on their sides instead of conventional terminals. There are sidemount clips (approximately \$2 per pair) designed for boosters which snap onto a ridge of the screw.

To weather winter

Vinyl tops need extra care

Now is a good time to wax your car to protect its finish from the harshness of winter, according to the Automotive Information Council (AIC).

At the same time, the car's vinyl top should be treated, but you should not use regular car wax for that job, the AIC says. Specifically formulated coatings for vinyl are available at auto supply centers and at car dealerships, and only those should

Many car owners believe vinyl tops need no attention; but that's not the case.

About 25 percent of new cars sold have vinyl tops, many of which end up being neglected. If not treated properly, they grow dull, discolor and even

Car owners are advised to apply a dress coating when the car is fairly new, before dirt and grime settle into the top's texture. Regular washing also is

The vinyl top should be re-coated whenever water fails to "bead up" on the surface, just as the car should be waxed when that condition occurs. Old wax should be removed with a vinyl cleaner before a new coat of wax is applied.

Without proper protection, the aging process of a vinyl top can be rapid because, being on top of the car, it is exposed to the full effects of sun, rain,


