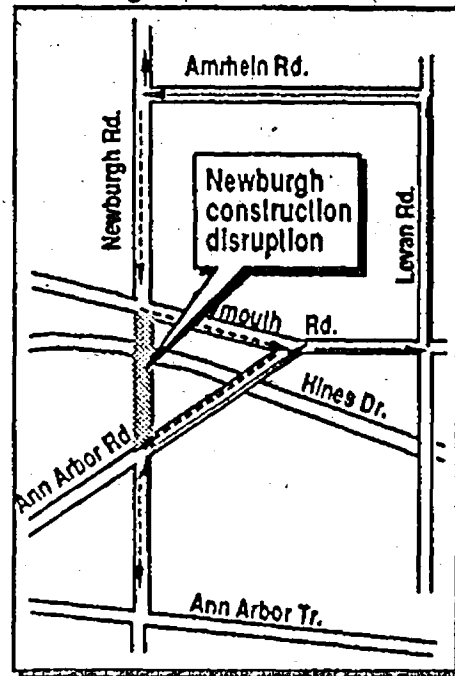

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## Newburgh detour



## Project drives forward

For the past six weeks, Westland motorists who used Newburgh Road south of Hines Drive have been forced to take alternate routes because of the Newburgh widening between the Hines Drive and Ann Arbor Road and the rebuilding of the Newburgh bridge.

The \$1.5 million project should be completed by early November.

When finished, Newburgh will be widened to five lanes from two lanes.

Contractor for the job is Greenfield Construction Co.

The project, to be paid for with federal funds and with help from the city and county, was sparked by

traffic concerns.

A further widening of Newburgh from Ann Arbor Road south to Joy Road will likely begin next year, Clark added.

During construction on the bridge,

northbound traffic is being detoured east on Plymouth Road to Levan while southbound traffic is being diverted east on Plymouth Road to Ann Arbor Road and west back to Newburgh.

## Shooting hearing Aug. 11

A preliminary hearing for a Westland woman charged in the July 5 fatal shooting of her ex-husband will be set next month, a Colchester, Ontario police officer said Monday.

Sheree Craig, 25, is being held without bond in the Windsor jail. She is charged under section 235 of the Canadian Criminal Code, the U.S. equivalent of first-degree murder.

Craig will return to Windsor Provincial Court 9 a.m. Friday, Aug. 11, at which time a preliminary examination will be set, said Inspector

Ronald Forsyth of the South Colchester police. She won't enter a plea until the exam, Forsyth said.

If convicted of the charge, she faces a maximum sentence of 25 years in prison.

Police said Godfrey Ernest Craig, 25, was shot once in the chest with a .38-caliber handgun after answering the door at his lake front home in Colchester, about 25 miles southeast of Windsor.

Sheree Craig was arrested as she tried to re-enter the United States

via the Ambassador Bridge, police said.

Police are still searching for a murder weapon, Forsyth said.

Forsyth said the investigation into the incident is "continuing at a satisfactory pace," but refused to comment further.

The couple had been divorced about two years, police said.

## Residents score in 7-Eleven fight

Residents in a northeast Westland neighborhood won a month-long reprieve Monday in their fight to prevent construction of a 24-hour convenience store at the corner of Joy and Merriman.

The Westland City Council voted unanimously to table site plan approval of a 7-Eleven until Aug. 21 in order to discuss residents' concerns and possible revisions of the plan.

The postponement came after an emotional hour-long debate involving council members, residents, the would-be franchise owner and a representative from Southland Corp., parent company of 7-Eleven.

The setback was the second in two years for the Southland Corp. at the intersection's southeast corner. In 1987, the council turned down a special use waiver that would have permitted construction of the store.

Before that, resident opposition killed a proposal for a Burger King

restaurant on the corner, which is currently home to a vacant gas station.

"Things look better than they did before, but we'll have to see what happens," said homeowner Wilhelmina Lawson following the postponement.

ABOUT 20 neighborhood residents attended the meeting. Their concerns ranged from the proposed 24-hour operation of the store to placement of trash dumpsters and building upkeep.

The group has collected 270 signatures on petitions opposing the store, said spokeswoman Cathy Munoz.

"Our safety and privacy are the key issues," said Munoz, who lives on Cooley, directly behind the proposed store.

"Why do we need another 24-hour business?" Munoz said. "There are already four 24-hour businesses in our area (Danny's supermarket, an Amoco station and two other 7-Elevens)."

The council asked City Attorney Charles Bokos to look into the possibility of approving the site plan but limiting the hours of operation. There is no city ordinance regarding 24-hour businesses.

But Michael Raezler, Southland division development manager, said the company wouldn't back down on its requirement for business hours.

"That's the nature of our business," Raezler said, adding that all 100 7-Eleven stores in metropolitan Detroit are open 24 hours a day.

Raezler did agree to the residents' request for a brick wall separating the store from nearby homes.

RESIDENTS WERE also critical of the store's proposed location, a few blocks from Livonia Franklin High School, and the record of would-be franchise operator John Lambert.

"When it comes to students, this thing is going to be an attractive nuisance."

## Griffin enters race

Saying that he is "running on my record, and I think it's a good one," Mayor Charles Griffin Monday announced his intention to campaign for a second term this fall.

Griffin, during a 40-minute press conference in his city hall office, talked about his administration's accomplishments during the last 3½ years and his goals for the 1990s.

The announcement wasn't a surprise — bumper stickers touting Griffin's re-election sprouted last spring and the mayor himself hinted about his plans during the annual state of the city address in front of the Westland Chamber of Commerce last January.

So far, Griffin's only announced opposition is Robert Thomas, a department of public services employee and president of the city's AFSCME Local 1602. Several other potential candidates, including city council members Thomas Artley and Charles Pickering, have been circulating nominating petitions.

The filing deadline is 4 p.m. Tuesday. A primary would be held Sept. 12 if there are at least three candidates.

The general election is Tuesday, Nov. 7.

GRIFFIN TOOK credit Monday for helping restore stability and "fiscal integrity" to the city since his 1985 election and, with the cooperation of the city council, improving the city's image.

"The city's condition is the best that it has been in the last 15 years," Griffin said. "We have seen the city's total millage lowered from 17.99 to 14.28 — that's down 3.71 mills in four years."

The revamped economic development department has increased the city's industrial/commercial SEV (property values) by 6 percent, "relieving homeowners of some of the burden of paying for city services," the mayor said.

He pointed to better relations between the administration and the

# Man sought for assaults

Westland police are looking for an unidentified man in connection with several attempted sex assaults at local apartment complexes this summer, said officer Laura Moore, who handles investigations of sex crimes for the department.

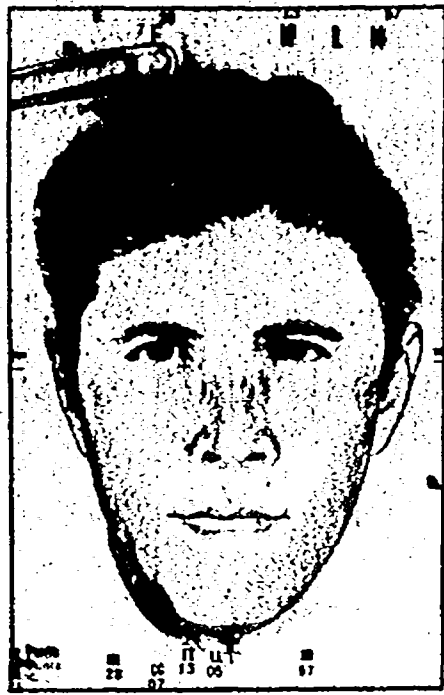
Police released a composite sketch of the suspect last week.

Moore said the attempted assaults have occurred in parking lots, vestibules and laundry rooms at Woodland Villa, off Warren Road east of Newburgh, and The Landings, off Warren Road west of Wayne Road.

The assailant approaches unaccompanied women from behind and knocks them to the ground or grabs them, Moore said.

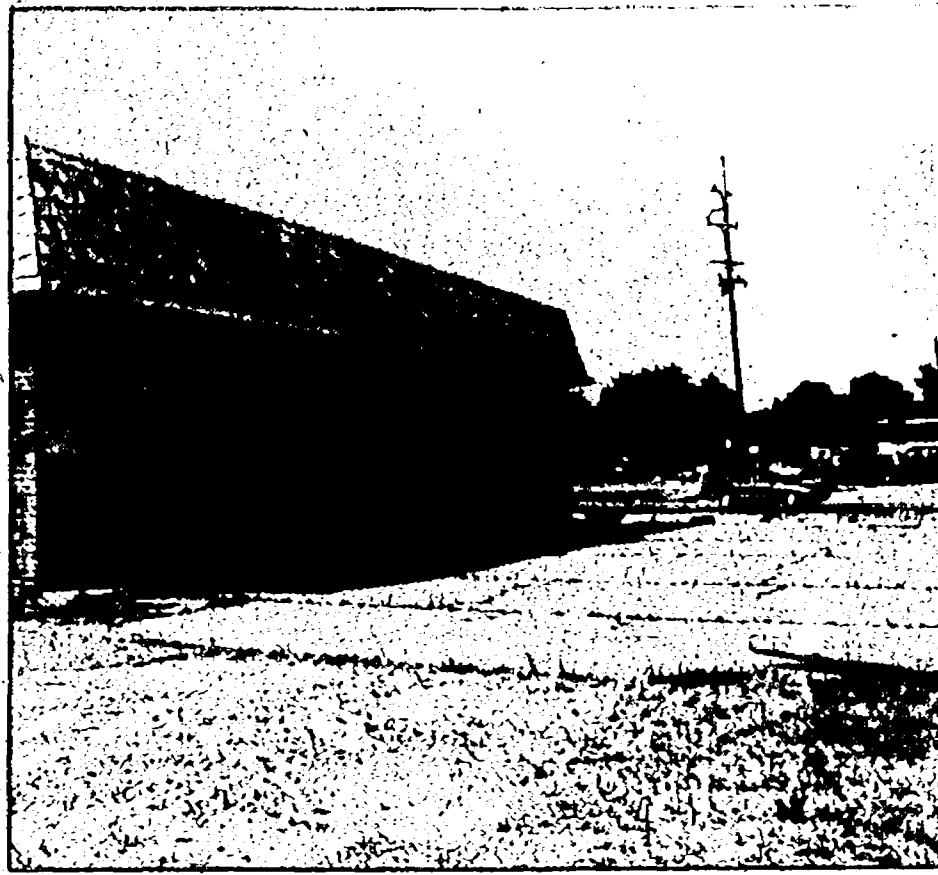
She described the suspect as being a white man in his mid 20s, 6 feet 2 inches tall with a heavy build and short, dark brown hair worn straight back. He has brown eyes, is clean shaven and has a pale complexion. He usually wears jogging suits or shorts, Moore said.

sance," said Ann Kmet. "I think we all know where they're going to end up after 2:30."

Munoz was critical of Lambert's other 7-Eleven store, at Wayne Road and Avondale. The rear of that building is kept up poorly and the parking lot has become a hangout for loitering teenagers, she said.

Lambert, who lives in the neighborhood behind the proposed store, agreed that the rear of his current store "needs paint."

But he said the store's interior was well kept and his employees are told to break up crowds of kids in the parking lot.

Several council members were critical of previous Southland Corp. projects in the city.

# Woman dies in car after heart attack

A 62-year-old Inkster woman died Sunday after suffering a heart attack behind the wheel of her car and driving into a second vehicle stopped at a traffic light on Palmer near Merriman, police said.

The driver of the second car, a 63-year-old Westland woman, wasn't seriously injured.

The victim was identified by police as Ruth Elder Massey. According to a report from the Wayne County Medical Examiner, Massey

died of heart failure before the impact.

Police said Massey was driving a 1980 Chevrolet westbound on Palmer at 6:35 p.m. when the incident occurred. Massey's car struck the rear of a 1981 Ford that was stopped at a red light at Merriman.

There were no signs of braking by the victim, police said.

# Mehl to seek a third term

Kenneth Mehl will seek a third term on the Westland City Council.

Mehl, the council president, announced his re-election plans in a press release Monday.

He is the first incumbent to formally declare his candidacy. Two other council members are circulating petitions.

Council member Kent Herbert isn't seeking re-election.

The filing deadline for nominating petitions is 4 p.m. Tuesday. A Sept. 12 primary would be held if there are at least three mayoral candidates or more than eight council candidates.

Four city council seats will be filled in the Nov. 7 general election.

Mehl said balancing development and growth with concerns about the environment and the city's quality of life is his top priority.

"I will work for quality affordable housing, to maintain our parks and seek continued improvements for our families to enjoy, and to explore other programs that will add to, and enhance the quality of life" for residents, he said.

"With regards to industry, I will work within the existing industrial parks to seek quality, non-polluting type businesses," he said.

Mehl, who has served as council president since 1986, also cited his support of the city's Enhanced 9-1-1 emergency telephone system and other public safety improvements and said he will continue to push for further upgrading of the police and fire departments.

Mehl was first elected to the council in 1981 and re-elected in 1985. He served on the city planning commission from 1975-81 and was chairman of the Westland Summer Festival Committee for five years.

He has lived in Westland for 20 years and is a General Motors engineer. He is married and has two children.

city council, this year's increases in police and fire personnel and the formation groups such as the Westland Cultural Society and Friends of the Nankin Mill as accomplishments which improved the city's quality of life.

Griffin listed five major goals for a second term:

- Improve and begin to rebuild the city's roads
- Develop the Elipse property at Michigan Avenue and Merriman
- Complete development in the city's Tax Increment Finance Authority district (the downtown retail area)
- Continue to upgrade the quality of life and the city's image
- Stress ordinance enforcement as part of an effort to increase property values.

WHILE ATTRACTING retail and industrial development to the city has been a cornerstone of his first

term, Griffin said the city should attempt to balance its expanding economy with residents' concerns.

"Any construction or growth will be done within the approved master plan and zoning ordinances and will meet environmental rules and guidelines," he said.

The mayor also said administration leaders and the city council have agreed to limit strip center development in the Ford-Wayne Road area to projects "where there is a major tenant already committed."

Griffin said stalled contract negotiations with the police department's Sergeants and Lieutenants Association — which spilled over into the campaign last week when the union distributed bumper stickers critical of the mayor — haven't created additional tension.

"It doesn't bother me and I won't be intimidated by it just because I'm a candidate for re-election," he said.

"I hope we can get a settlement, but it has to be one this city can afford."

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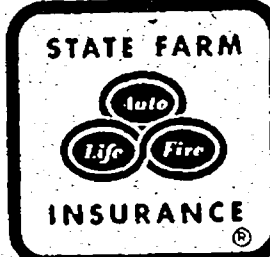
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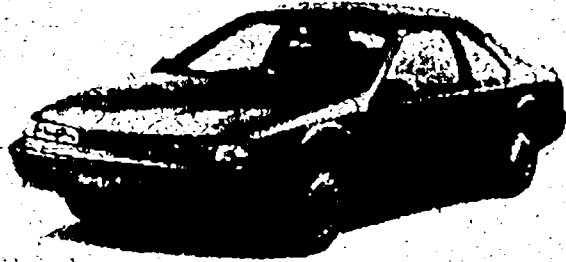

A FORMER Westland man has been sentenced by Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Thomas Jackson to a 45- to 80-year prison term for the November 1988 armed robbery of Deluca's restaurant, at Warren and Inkster roads.

Michael Alan Weaver, 40, pleaded guilty June 30 to three counts of armed robbery and one count of possession of a firearm during the commission of a felony.

Police said Weaver and a female accomplice escaped with several thousand dollars in the daylight robbery. The popular Italian restaurant was preparing to open for lunch when a woman knocked at the back door and asked for a job application.

A man later identified as Weaver then knocked at the door also asking for an application. He followed an employee inside and pulled a shotgun from under his coat, police said.

Weaver, who has previous convictions for armed robbery and manslaughter, is also facing charges in connection with the armed robbery of a Farmington Hills coin dealer last spring. He had been released from prison on probation at the time of the Deluca's robbery.

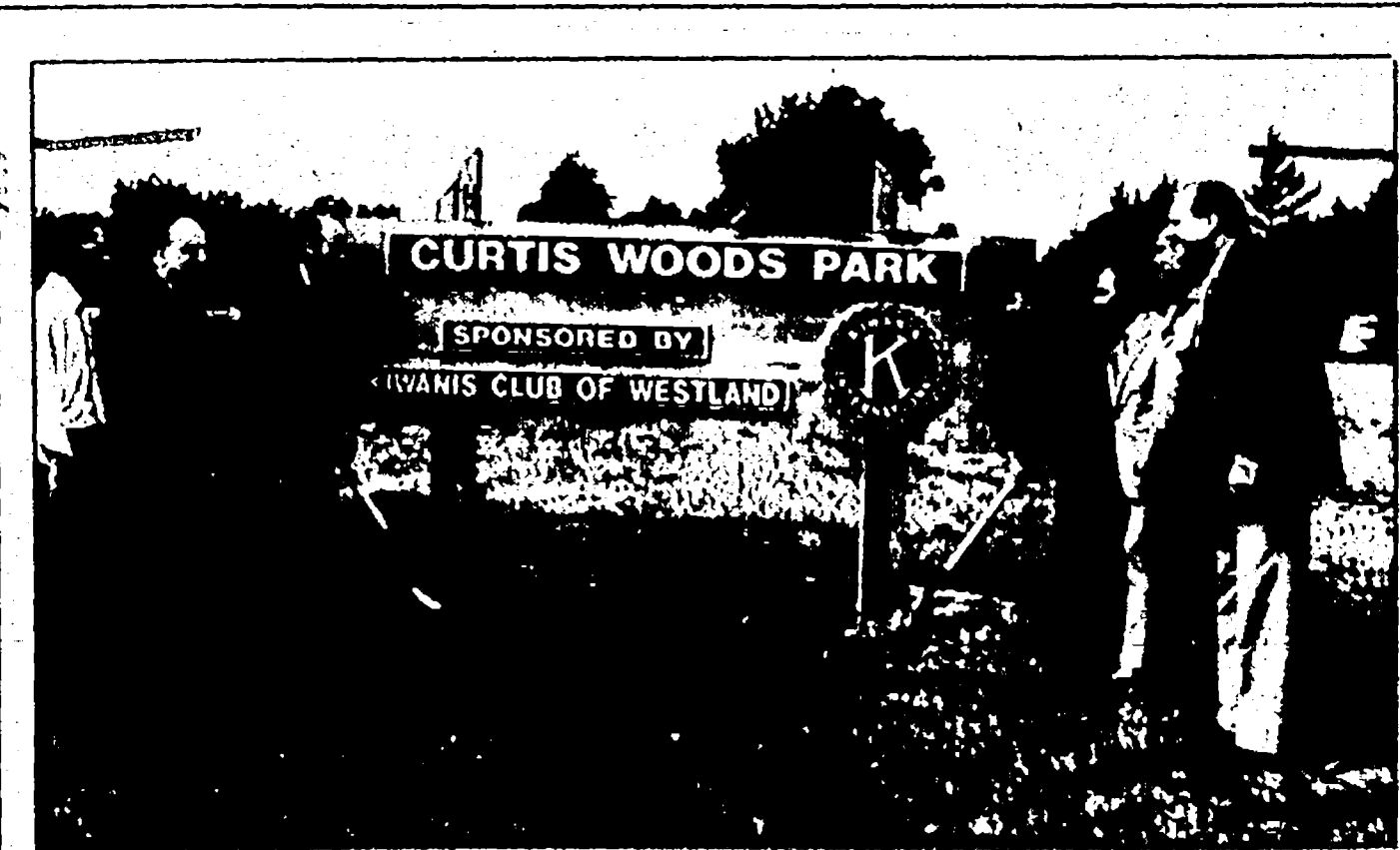

A 22-YEAR-old Westland woman told police she was driving on Ford Road Saturday afternoon when an unidentified man pulled up next to her and exposed himself.

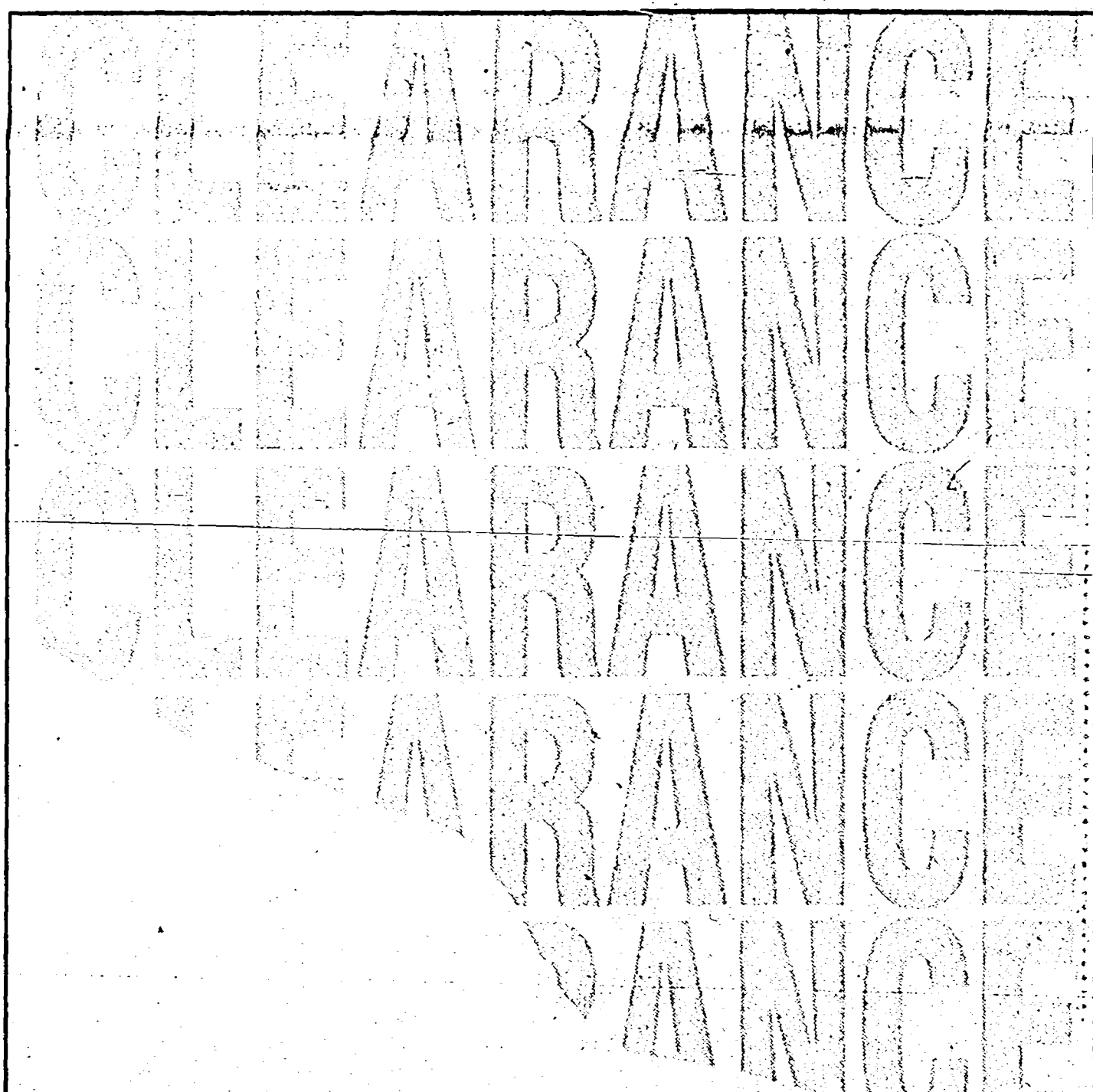
The woman said she was stopped in the left turn lane at the Ford-Wayne Road traffic light at 3:10 p.m. when the man pulled up.

## Home sought for rescued cat

Most people think that all cats save nine lives.

But that may not be the case for "Jane Doe Kitty," who was rescued recently by a Westland woman and a Garden City teenager. The cat is being temporarily adopted by a Michigan Humane Society employee for two weeks.

The cat was bloodied and injured, apparently during a mauling by a dog in a nearby yard, when it was found by Beverly Melasi of Westland and Janene Tackett of Garden City.

Melasi said she was driving on Grand Traverse near Casplan in Westland July 8 when she and her passenger noticed the cat, with a blood-covered face, in the street.

They hope that someone will permanently adopt the cat.

The cat is now temporarily housed by its "adoptive parent," Linda Thomas of South Lyon, a staffer at the society's shelter on Marquette near Newburgh.

The shelter serves Westland, Garden City and three other cities.

After picking up the young cat from the street, Melasi said she initially looked for a nearby veterinarian before heading for the MHS shelter.

A few days later, Melasi returned to check on the progress of the cat, estimated to be about 6 weeks old.

"I DON'T know what compelled me to do that, but it may have saved her life," Melasi said after learning that the cat would be put to sleep the next day.

Jackie Kunze, assistant shelter manager, said that a veterinarian inspected the cat, found no evidence of internal injuries, but had given it a penicillin shot.

Kunze told Melasi that the shelter holds stray animals for four days

and then destroys them if no one claims them.

The assistant manager added that the cat Melasi and Tackett brought in was too young to be adopted.

But she suggested that the cat be placed in a foster home until it is old enough to be adopted.

Later that day, Kunze phoned Melasi to say that Thomas agreed to adopt the cat.

Thomas, 26, often takes in animals that are too small for adoption or who have special problems that make them temporarily unadoptable.

She pays for the food and litter while the Humane Society pays for additional medical treatment.

Thomas will have the cat for two weeks and be in the company of three other cats in the household.

"Hopefully, by the end of the two-week period (which ends Friday, July 28), someone will adopt Jane Doe Kitty," Melasi said.

Those interested can call the shelter at 721-7300.

THE CAT Melasi and Tackett rescued is one of 1,150 strays brought monthly to the Westland facility.

Annually, the shelter receives 15,000 strays, with June, July, and August being the peak months. The three MHS shelters in the Detroit area receive 47,000 strays each year, with about 7,000 being adopted.

"We would love to save every animal that comes in here," said Sue Gates, shelter manager. "We do what we can to save as many animals as possible, either by adoption or the Leader Dog program (for blind people), but people have to care, too."

She appealed to pet owners to spay or neuter their pets and avoid having them run wild.

## Woman charged in drug thefts

A 33-year-old Canton woman has been charged with two counts of armed robbery in connection with robberies at two Livonia pharmacies and demanding drugs.

The woman isn't a suspect in robberies of other area drug stores, including one in Westland, police said.

Bond was set at \$50,000 for Beverly A. Hopfner, who pleaded not guilty at her June 29 arraignment.

Hopfner was arrested June 24, a week after holdups were reported at the Perry Drug Stores on Farmington Road at Seven Mile and on Grand River at Eight Mile, according to Livonia Police Detective Jesse Bartlett.

Willse's Pharmacy in Plymouth was also robbed by a woman on June 17, and Arbor Drugs on Middlebelt in Westland was held up

the following Monday. But Hopfner is not a suspect in those cases, Bartlett said.

Bartlett said Hopfner does match the description given of that suspect, but he said "It's a possibility there could be two out there."

IN ALL of the incidents, a woman who said she was armed demanded drugs from the pharmacists. The woman asked for Percocet, a pain killer, and Xanax, a muscle relaxant.

All of the victims described the robber as a white, 5 feet 7, with shoulder-length blond hair, wearing a denim jacket.

Bartlett said Hopfner was picked up after another Livonia officer "had a hunch" and gave him a photo of Hopfner from a previous arrest.

Judge James McCann has not set a trial date.

Hopfner has been in the Wayne County Jail since her arrest.

## Reward offered in fatal shooting

A \$10,000 reward has been offered for the June 19 shotgun killing of a 67-year-old Livonia man, Exavor (John) Giller.

The family of Giller is offering the reward for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the person who fired a shotgun blast at Giller around 10 p.m. outside Giller's house on Seven Mile Road.

Anyone with information should call Livonia Police at 421-2141.

POLICE HAVE determined that Giller fired his own handgun at least once before he was felled by a shotgun blast to his chest. Giller's own handgun lay on the ground next to his body.

"He had time to react," said Sgt. Donald Vandersloot.

"Police also believe the men who broke into Giller's home knew him.

"We don't think it was a random burglary," Vandersloot said. "But did they intend to shoot him? Tie him up? Find out where his money was?"

Police believe, but are "not 100 percent" sure, that the killer took

guns from Giller's home. Police also suspect that Giller, a gun collector, might have been shot with one of his own guns.

Giller and wife Catherine, 64, had just returned from a shopping trip when the shooting took place. It appears the Gillers surprised burglars who were in the house.

As Catherine Giller walked into her house she was hit on the head and knocked unconscious for an unknown period of time.

FOR SOME reason, Giller walked around the side of the garage and had almost reached the backyard when he was shot, apparently by someone standing near the front yard.

Catherine Giller told police she saw two white males in the house.

Police said a basement window had been smashed and the house ransacked.

Giller, a street-wise, tough, businessman, owned the Greater Detroit Cab Company. He had survived a gunshot fired last year by an angry cab driver he had dismissed in Detroit.

Giller's murder was the first in Livonia in nearly three years.

## You may request agendas

# County commission chief speculates on his future

Arthur M. Carter was destined for politics. The 49-year-old chairman of the Wayne County Commission grew up in an atmosphere of political activism. His godmother is Detroit City Council president and mayoral candidate Erma Henderson. His mother was involved in the Young Republicans in the '30s, before switching party allegiance during the Roosevelt administration. His dad and uncles, all members of the United Auto Workers, had spirited discussions on their union. And young Arthur soaked it up in his house on Detroit's near east side — the current site of Joe Muer's Restaurant parking lot. Although there are probably days Carter would rather be cruising down the Detroit River on his charter boat Renaissance Queen, his main love is politics. "I've devoted a great deal of my life to county government. There's still a lot of work to do here. There are things I'd like to pursue," said Carter, a Democrat whose district covers a big chunk of northwest Detroit including Outer Drive, Rosedale Park and Mt. Carmel and Sinai hospitals. "ONE OF MY goals would be to one day be county

executive. That's a very definite goal." Earlier this year there was some speculation that Carter would jump ship to the beleaguered Detroit Public Schools administration. But he shrugs off that possibility. "I haven't really talked with anyone in several weeks now," he said. Carter, who has represented the 7th district since Jan. 1, 1975, is six months into a second two-year term as chairman of the 15-member board, which is the legislative branch of county government. He was unanimously elected chairman by his peers — a historical first. "This is the best commission in Wayne County history," Carter said unabashedly. "We're very diverse, but we work together very well. "I've seen division between Detroit and the suburbs dissolve. The lines aren't drawn at Telegraph Road. We've really tried to work together whether it's a park issue — all the county parks are in the suburbs, or indigent health care." Although Wayne County still has budget problems, Carter said the situation is a far cry from the early 1970s.

# Auditors report county finished '88 in the black

For the first time in some 14 years, Wayne County has balanced its budget and closed its own books for the year.

"This is a very happy moment. The county is operating like a true business," announced a smiling Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara at a press conference Tuesday.

The county ended fiscal year 1988 last November with an operating surplus of \$433,000, based on a recently completed audit by Ernst & Whinney.

"Tremendous," said Wayne County Commissioner Susan Hines, R-Northville Township, who credited the balanced budget to the county's 1987 solvency package. "It put us on the right foot."

McNamara said the budget surplus, while insignificant in a total budget of \$227 million, was "symbolic. It means we took in slightly more than we spent," the result of an austere budget.

In early 1988, some \$2.6 million was trimmed from the budget, including \$200,000 from mental health services, \$220,000 from the county clerk's office and nearly \$300,000 from the county sheriff's department.

McNamara maintained that county services have not suffered as a result of the trimming. "If anything, we're giving better service," he said, citing highway maintenance and trash pickup.

TO ASSURE a balanced budget this fiscal year, McNamara said "We

are still in a truly austere period." A limited hiring freeze continues to be implemented and department budgets are under close review.

Of greatest concern is the county's portion of the Child Care Fund for abused, neglected and delinquent youth. Budgeted for \$32 million, costs are rapidly escalating, causing budget concerns.

"There are some complications here," McNamara conceded.

There are no plans to increase revenue by selling off county-owned property, aside from the sale of the former Child Development Center, a 1,000-acre plot in Northville Township.

Any additional income from this source would likely be used in upgrading such existing services as the Hall of Justice or the Wayne County Morgue, according to McNamara.

Earlier this year, the county's financial recovery received a major boost when Moody's, a Wall Street credit rating agency, upgraded the county's credit rating to "investment" level for the first time since 1979.

When McNamara assumed office in 1987, the county had a \$134 million deficit and was on the verge of bankruptcy.

# DSO talks about Lansing bailout

Lansing's ears should be burning. People at the nearly bankrupt Detroit Symphony Orchestra are talking about state government as the leader in an \$18 million bailout.

"I've talked to the budget director, and they agree something should be done so they don't have problems," said state Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, the Legislature's chief supporter of the arts.

"I intend to do something again," said Faxon, who despite his minority party status has a major role in getting state money for the arts.

"DSO LEADERS announced Monday there is 'no way' they can meet this week's \$200,000 payroll. They are asking 97 musicians and 58 staff members to accept half pay.

Board chairman Steve Miller said the orchestra needs \$18 million in pledges over four years to remain solvent. "A source close to the DSO was quoted as saying the state had been asked for half or more of that sum.

Faxon, an Appropriations Committee member, said the state provides DSO \$2.5 million currently.

"There is also lurking in the Senate and House a 'supplemental' appropriations bill," said Faxon. The \$500 million bill has yet to be acted on by a joint Senate-House committee. It would supplement the current year's budget.

A SPOKESMAN for Senate Majority Leader John Engler, R-Mount Pleasant, said there was no plan to consider more DSO money until the next budget year.

Another Appropriations member,

Sen. R. Robert Geake, R-Northville, said "I haven't heard any discussion" of more money for the DSO.

Faxon said he met two weeks ago with Deborah Borda, DSO's executive director and chief staff person. "I indicated my concerns and gave her some suggestions. She has a lot of energy. She knows her business."

BUT FAXON said that except for brief social encounters he hadn't met with Miller, the Chrysler executive who took over the reins at the DSO board last year.

"I don't know him that well. I don't know where he's going," Faxon said.

The Oakland County senator said Miller brought DSO "tremendous adverse publicity — national and international" — when he caved into pressure from two black legislators and hired a second black musician.

"She (Borda) believed if this wasn't done, they (the DSO) weren't going to get their (state) money. It just wasn't true," said Faxon. His unspoken message was that Miller should touch bases with him on legislative protocol.

"If someone were holding a gun to me, I'd want to find out who my friends are," Faxon said.

FOUNDED IN 1914, the DSO has been in trouble several times. During World War II, it suspended activities. In 1949-51 it suspended its entire seasons.

In 1982 the musicians went on a nine-day strike. In 1987 there was a 12-week work stoppage when management sought to impose an 11-percent pay cut.

"WE'RE ON our way out of the mire and muck. We're healthier, stronger, more responsible to the citizens. We can't cure all the problems overnight. We still have significant problems, but I'm very upbeat. Government leaders have to be somewhat futuristic."

What worries him most is the rising cost of health care for indigents and the cost of caring for abused and neglected children — two areas the county is responsible for by law.

"These are two major hurdles to the financial solvency of Wayne County," said Carter.

The legislative and executive branch have locked horns on many issues, most recently child care for county employees. KidSpace advocates (with the blessing of County Executive Edward McNamara) crammed a recent board meeting to demand action on the day care proposal.

But Carter questions the fiscal responsibility of offering a limited option (KidSpace would be licensed for up to 90 children) to a few employees out of Wayne County's 4,500 worker pool.

"The fact is we are running a deficit," Carter said. "I've seen money spent on good programs in the past, but that's why we're in dire financial straits now. I'd be the first to support (KidSpace) with outside funding."

Carter believes controversy is a good thing in politics. "I NEVER shy away from a meaningful fight," he said. "It's healthier than the good ol' boys sitting in the back room cutting deals."

A project dear to his heart is creation of a youth camp where non-violent juvenile offenders can get education and training that can turn them away from a life of serious crime.

"The Wayne County Residential Youth Academy would be an intervention tool," he said.

County voters approved a millage last August that includes funds to develop the youth work and learn facility. Carter said he hopes the project is under way by September.

The program will be based on the highly successful Glen Mills schools in Concordville, Pa.

"After seeing Glen Mills and witnessing how these aggressive young men are being transformed into motivated citizens, we are filled with hope and conviction that something positive can be done about juvenile crime in Wayne County."

Carter, a graduate of the now defunct Eastern High School, received bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees from Wayne State University. The degrees are in special education, counseling and educational psychology.

Carter began his career teaching mentally retarded students.

"Politics was an avocation. But I had a family to feed," he said.

His offspring include a 25-year-old daughter, a 21-year-old son who just graduated from Harvard, and another son, an 18-year-old college sophomore. He and his second wife, Deborah, assistant to the provost at Wayne County Community College, have a 3-year-old son and the family also includes Deborah's 15-year-old daughter from a previous marriage.

Carter has also been on staff at Wayne County Community College the past 17 years. He heads enrollment planning.

When he's not at the county building on Randolph Street or the downtown WCCC campus, he's apt to be cruising down the Detroit River on his 41-person charter boat, giving historic tours of the Detroit waterfront.

"The (Freedom Festival) fireworks display is our biggest night of the year," he said.

He also enjoys reading science fiction or viewing a good science fiction films away from the pressures of the office — a continuation of an interest begun in childhood.

The biggest source of his excitement regarding Wayne County is the prospect of an intensive \$1 billion airport expansion to be carried out over the next decade.

"It's going from a local to a major international travel complex. The hotels, conference centers and office buildings will become a major part of our tax base. We can use the revenue to enhance other programs. I can see that happening."

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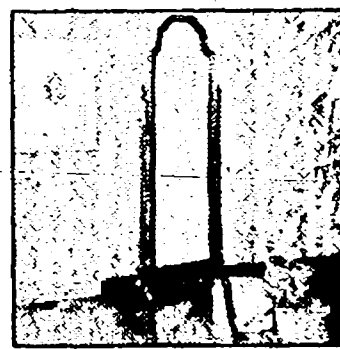
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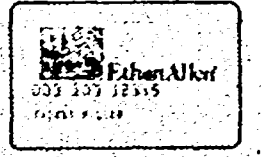
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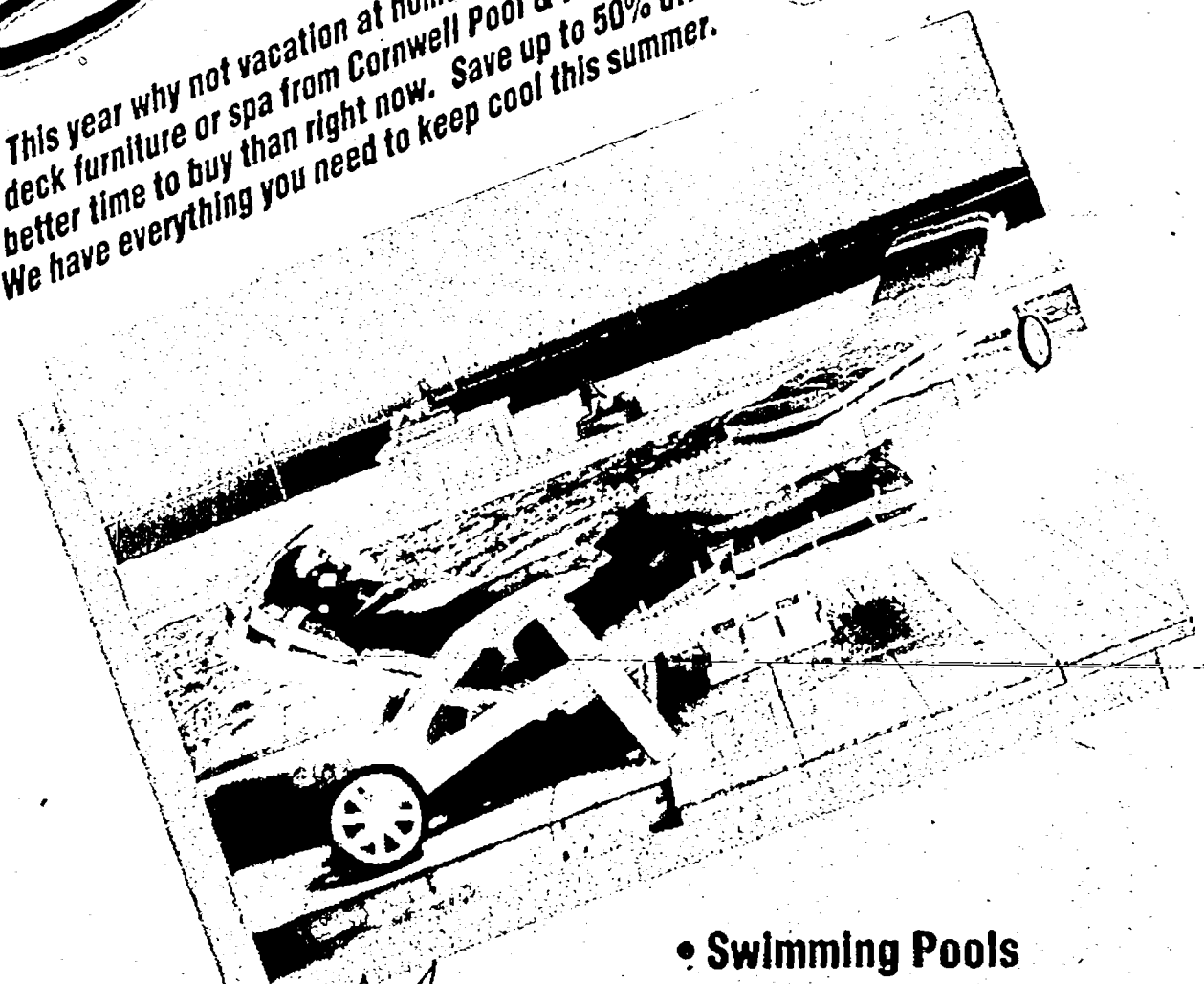


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# 9 demonstrators found guilty, 24 acquitted

After almost five hours deliberation a Livonia jury found nine pro-life demonstrators guilty and acquitted 24 others Monday of disorderly conduct in an April protest at a Livonia abortion clinic.

The nine could face up to 90 days in jail, a \$500 fine and court costs for the misdemeanor conviction at the Sept. 15 sentencing set by 16th District Court Judge Robert Brzezinski.

Sylvania; and Daniel Strauch, Brighton.

No appeal is planned at this time, according to a spokesperson at defense attorney Mark Hibbs' Detroit office.

"It's a hollow victory," said pro-life spokesperson Lynn Mills of Livonia. "We need to be able to state to the jury that human life is in danger and it was necessary to trespass."

Judge Brzezinski had denied the use of the "necessity defense," which essentially holds that saving a life is more important than what they believe to be minor ordinances, like trespassing.

Despite Mills' reservations, however, Hibbs' representative, who declined to be identified, said they

were "generally pleased" with the trial's results.

"Up to now we've had a great deal of difficulty getting anybody acquitted in these cases," he said. "This is one of the first times, the first people who've gone to the jury who've gotten acquitted."

But while Brzezinski formally denied use of the "necessity defense," Hibbs' representative said in this case he did allow defendants to state more of their motives. It was not "as ugly as the trial of the 'Livonia Seven,'" he said.

IN THAT trial before Judge James McCann, seven pro-life protestors who acted as their own attorneys weren't allowed to state their motives.

"Everything they tried to say in their own defense was cut short by the prosecutor or the judge," the representative said. McCann sentenced them in June to 18 months probation, 25 days on a community work program, and about \$1,000 in fines including supervisory fees for the work program.

Hibbs' office filed an appeal for the "Livonia Seven" on July 18.

The 33 defendants were part of a larger group arrested in the April 29 protest at Womancare of Livonia, 27634 Five Mile east of Inkster Road, for blocking access to the facility by sitting in front of two doors and not heeding police warnings to leave the premises.

Fifty of the April protestors who pleaded no contest were immediate-

ly sentenced by Brzezinski to three months voluntary probation and court and state costs of \$125.

Brzezinski said jury selection for the remaining defendants to be tried will begin July 25.

BASIS FOR the Monday acquittals and convictions hinged on whether the 33 actually heard the police warning. A video taken of the incident was part of the evidence presented.

"Naturally I was disappointed" with the verdict, said assistant city attorney Catherine White, who prosecuted the case.

White felt that sufficient evidence in testimony and on the video was given that people at each door were warned. But sound on the video was faulty, she said.

It appeared the police sergeant

was giving the required warning, and he testified to that fact, but "the audio just didn't pick it up," White said.

# Helicopter helps area police make quick capture

A plea of not guilty was entered

for him. He failed to post a \$50,000 bond and is now in the Wayne County Jail. He faces a July 25 preliminary examination in Livonia's 16th District Court.

House was arrested Saturday night after a high-speed chase involving Detroit police and a Detroit police helicopter.

After Livonia police broadcast the

description of a white 1988 Pontiac Fiero reported stolen in Livonia, Detroit police saw a car matching the description near Pinehurst in Detroit and two squad cars and the helicopter pursued it.

Police said the driver of the Fiero jumped out of the car and fled. Police arrested a man found hiding in some nearby bushes.

Detroit police said they recovered a weapon — a knife made to look like a gun — that had been thrown through the window of a nearby house.

HOUSE HAS been charged with stealing at gunpoint a car belonging to a Francavilla street family and kidnapping the woman from her home.

The victim told police a man came to her home at 9:30 p.m. Saturday to look at a car the family had advertised for sale in Trading Times.

After looking at the white 1988 Pontiac Fiero in the garage, she said the man took a pistol from his pocket, pointed it at her head and demanded the car.

### Court ruling on flag inspires song

When Bruce Young heard about the U.S. Supreme Court's decision that offers legal protection to those who burn flags, he decided he wasn't going to take it lying down.

"I guess it was kind of fighting words," said Young, 70, the owner of Talent Live Entertainment, a Canton recording studio.

So Young sat down and wrote "Don't Burn our Flag." His son, Rick, put the lyrics to music and recorded it in the Michigan Avenue facility. Rick Young, who was a member of the now defunct rock group Teezers, is the lead vocalist.

The Fabulous Falcons, who used to count Wilson Pickett among their members, also came to the studio to record an R&B version of the song.

And on both recordings, the backup is done by four girls from Canton. The parents of the girls, who sing in their respective church choirs, are friends of the Youngs. The youngsters are Emily and Jennifer Bowling and Chanel and Heather Ukkestad.

Young said his experiences in the Navy during World War II — and the things he witnessed in the course of the war — made him appreciate the U.S. flag. The lyrics were born out of a desire to voice

some opposition to the Supreme Court ruling.

"I feel that if I as an individual burn the emblem of authority of this nation, I'm putting my citizenship on the line," said Young. "When you start reducing the value of that flag you are reducing the equivalent in your citizenship, and the more devalued and the less you believe in your government, the closer you reach the direction of anarchy. This country doesn't need that kind of thing."

Now that the voices and the musical instruments have been recorded, all that remains is for radio stations to start giving the song some air time.

## Classic car dealer gets green light for waiver

A classic automobile sales outlet has gained approval to operate in Livonia.

The Livonia City Council voted 4-2 Monday to approve a zoning waiver request by M. Louis Sabatini to allow the sale of classic automobiles in an existing building on the north side of Plymouth Road between Merriman and Hubbard.

The waiver was required because classic car sales was not a permitted use under the existing zoning for the site.

Voting against the waiver were councilmen Robert Bishop and Joe Taylor; voting in favor were Joan McCotter, Dale Jurcisin, Ron Ochala, and council president Fernon Feenstra. Laura Toy was absent.

AFTER APPEARING before the planning commission and city council on previous occasions, Sabatini provided the council with a written description of the type of classic vehicles that would be sold.

Some council members were concerned that if Sabatini's business failed, a new owner could buy adjacent properties and expand the business into a full-scale used car business.

Waiver use approval Monday was made contingent upon Sabatini's written description of the cars to be sold and four other conditions imposed by the planning commission.

The type of cars specified by Sabatini include antique automobiles,

exotic cars, specialty vehicles and historic cars.

The conditions recommended by the planning commission June 14 included limiting the display of the cars to inside the building and a stipulation that a fence be built along the north and west property lines.

Bishop said he was opposed to having "a full-blown used car business on Plymouth Road" and asked if there was any way the council could limit the type of vehicles sold.

CITY ATTORNEY Harry Tatigian quipped that "one person's jewel is another person's junk" and said he's read classic car advertisements with prices ranging from \$500 to \$25,000.

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# Director aims to boost parks' image

Call it the birth of a salesman. Hurley Coleman is out to sell area communities on a product they've had for 70 years — the Wayne County Park system.

"It's been here practically forever, yet we're finding that many people still aren't even aware it exists," said Coleman, the county's new parks director. "We've got an image problem."

To boost the parks' image, he's starting with a simple premise:

"If, all of a sudden, people were to lose the county parks, would they know what they've lost?" Coleman said, describing the question that will guide him during his tenure as county parks chief.

"Right now, there are city softball leagues that use our diamonds," he said. "If they weren't there, these teams would have no place to play. This is the kind of thing we hope to stress."

ON THE job three weeks ("And what a three weeks it's been"), Coleman has begun meeting with city, township and county officials to sound out their perception of the county parks.

It's not that the county parks system is in danger of disappearing, but

the direction county parks might take in the future could emerge after Coleman's sessions with area officials.

"I'm trying to ascertain what kind of community support there is for the county parks," he said.

Part of his job could be in building a county "parks community," he said.

"While the people I've met so far have been very warm and very interested in the parks, it appears people in one community generally aren't aware what goes on among their neighbors," he said. "What we need to do is have people look at the parks as a package."

FOR ITS part, the county parks system is considering offering services to local recreation agencies.

"This is still in the planning stage, but what we'd like to do is to offer something, at least in the way of expertise, that the locals couldn't provide on their own," he said. "In some cases, we could even come in and run programs."

"We have a very dedicated, capable staff, all the way around," he said. "That's one of the things that's impressed me most."

Fees from local municipalities would ensure the outreach programs paid for themselves, Coleman said.

Beyond that, he said, the program could strengthen ties between the county parks system and the communities it serves.

A canoe launch, near the Nankin Mills recreation area, is another top priority, he said. County officials hope to be able to allow canoeing at least along a portion of the Rouge River by next summer. A canoe storage area is being targeted as a special Michigan Youth Corps project, he said.

IN ADDITION to participating in the Rouge Rescue last month, Coleman has traveled to Washington, D.C., to help gain financing assistance for the parks.

"This is one of the oldest parks systems in the United States; and in many ways it's a role model for the federal system," he said. "What we'd like to see is at least some kind of historic designation for the parks."

Money, he acknowledges, has traditionally been tight. Nor is any movement afoot for a county parks tax.

"I don't see it for the foreseeable future."

Coleman, however, is convinced he can work with county commissioners and other officials to help secure more money for county recreation.

"When (Wayne County Executive) Ed McNamara selected me for the job, it sent a message that here is a young person with a commitment to parks and with the ability to get along with people," Coleman said. "I think that's important."

COLEMAN, 36, spent the past four years as recreation administrator for the city of Saginaw. There, he oversaw installation of a wave-action pool and water slide.

McNamara praised his ability to maintain parks services despite cutbacks in city financing.

As Wayne County parks director, Coleman will oversee nearly 4,500 acres of open space, a 38-hole golf course and a boat launch and marina, in addition to Holliday Nature preserve in Westland and Canton Township.

In addition to his county duties, Coleman is chairman of the Governor's Recreation Advisory Committee and is president-elect of the Michigan Recreation and Parks Association.

Married and the father of three, Hurley said he and his family are definitely "parks people."

"If my wife and I want to make our children happy," he said, "all we have to do is tell them we're taking them to the park."

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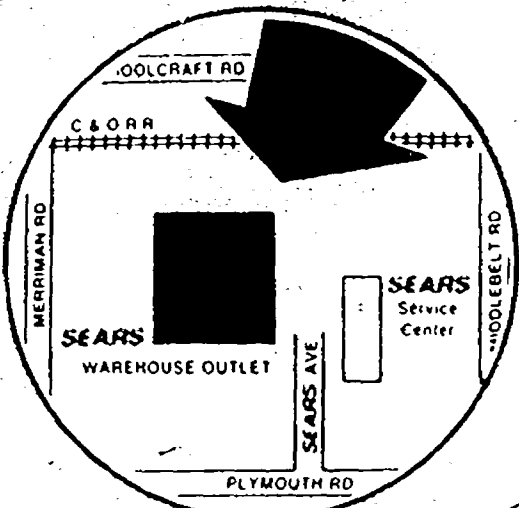


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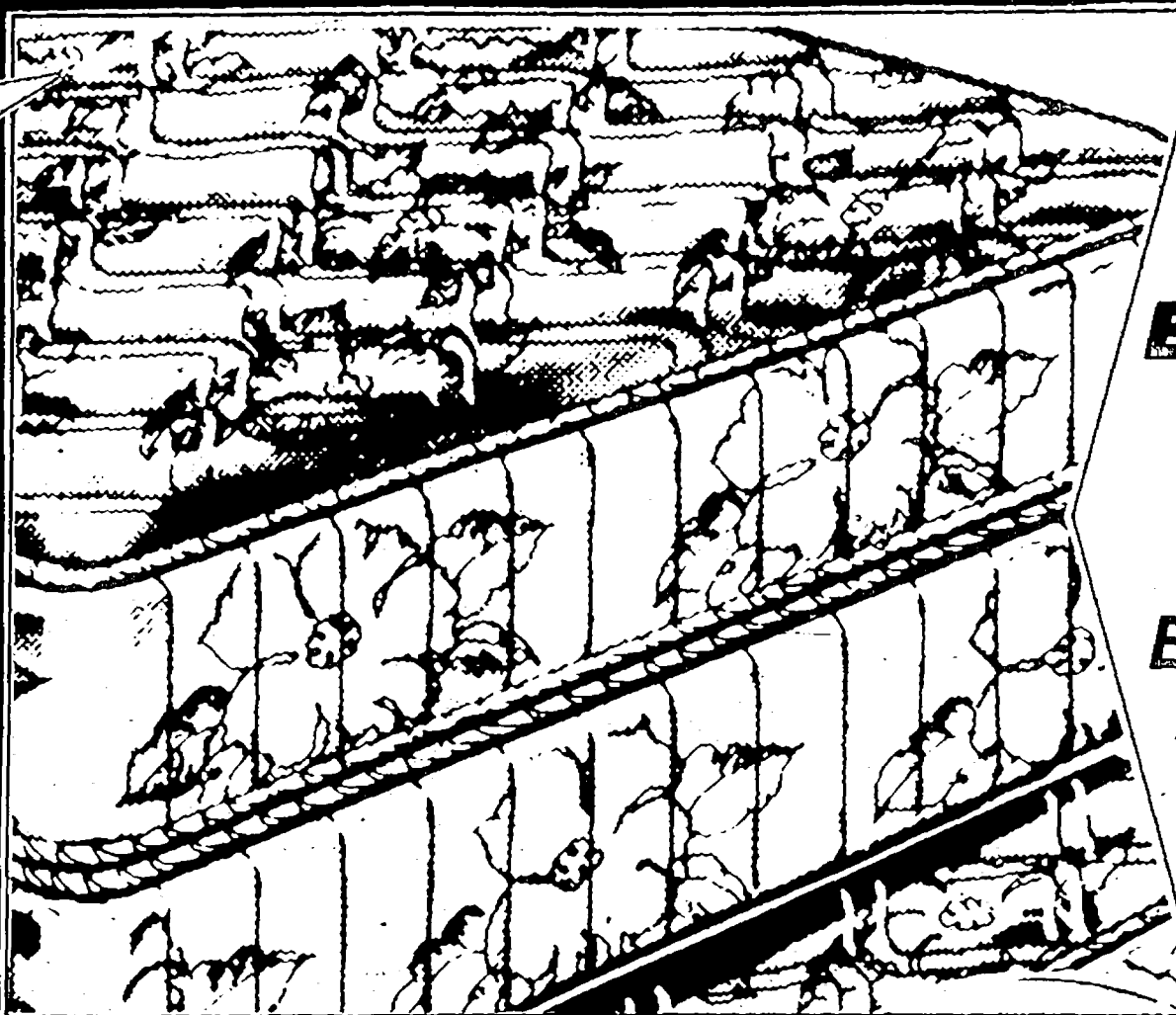
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# Abortion battle

## Stage is set for hot debate

Look for a donnybrook at public hearings over state pro-life bills in September and October.

That's when chairman Fred Dillingham's Senate Human Resources Committee is likely to take up four pieces of legislation in the wake of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision allowing states greater powers to regulate the termination of a pregnancy.

"It's a committee designed for terror," said Sen. Jack Faxon, D-Farmington Hills, who is pro-choice.

"It's a double-stacked committee," said Faxon after the Senate rejected pro-choice Sen. Lana Pollack's effort to send the measures to the Health Policy Committee.

"Dillingham pledged a full opportunity for hearings," countered Sen. R. Robert Geake, R-Northville, a member of Dillingham's panel.

**THE SENATE HUMAN Resources Committee** is one of the most conservative and pro-life in the Michigan Legislature.

Dillingham, R-Fowlerville, has his name on efforts to cut state spending for abortions. Geake, a psychologist, is pro-life.

Other members are Harmon Cropsey, R-Decatur, a religious fundamentalist; Gil DiNello, D-East Detroit, the Senate's most conservative Democrat; and John Cherry, D-Clio, who is pro-life.

"Pollack moved to send it to the Health Policy Committee, which she thought would be friendlier," said Geake. Health Policy is headed by moderate Sen. William Sederburg, R-East Lansing, and includes a physician, Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek.

Geake predicted the measures would probably pass the full Senate in fall but might have more trouble in the House and on Gov. James J. Blanchard's desk.

Judiciary Chairman Rudy Nichols, R-Waterford, said the bills didn't belong in his committee because no constitutional issue involved.

**DILLINGHAM WAS** out of town and unavailable for comment, but an aide said the Human Resources panel has dealt with similar issues in the past.

"A great portion of the abortion issues are social ser-

VICES issues," said Jim Crawford, the aide.

"His committee has done a lot of health issues. It wasn't shenanigans" to send the anti-abortion issues to Human Resources.

"We've had a few pieces of mail already," he said.

**THE MEASURES** are:

• Senate Bill 513 (sponsored by Jack Welborn, R-Kalamazoo) — requiring parental consent before a minor (someone younger than 18) could have an abortion. But the minor could obtain a judge's consent under certain conditions.

• SB 514 (Welborn) — based on the Missouri statute upheld by the Supreme Court on July 3. It would prohibit abortions in hospitals associated with the state and require medical tests to determine whether a fetus could survive outside the womb. The Missouri act also contains a preamble declaring that life begins at conception.

• SB 515 (Dillingham) — a ban on abortion counseling by state employees.

• Senate Joint Resolution H (Dillingham) — a constitutional amendment to outlaw abortion as a benefit in state employees' health care packages.

A two-thirds vote of both chambers would be required to place SJRH on the ballot, and voter approval would be required. Gov. Blanchard would have no veto power.

The three bills would require only a simple majority in both chambers, but Blanchard has threatened to veto them.

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## Infertility? Problem pregnancy? Oakwood specialists are here to help.

### Q. What is infertility therapy and who needs it?

**A.** Infertility therapy is an investigation into and the treatment of problems preventing conception. We evaluate women who have been trying to become pregnant for at least one year. If the woman is over 35 years of age, she is evaluated after six months of attempting to achieve pregnancy. We evaluate immediately a woman who has an obvious cause of infertility such as lack of menstruation or known damage to the fallopian tubes. In addition, we offer treatment for people who have had sterilization and desire reversal, for women who have had repeated miscarriages, and for women with uterine fibroids or pelvic endometriosis.

### Q. What kinds of infertility testing does Oakwood offer?

**A.** Tests are conducted on both the husband and wife, beginning with the simplest tests. Included may be evaluation of ovulation by observing basal body temperatures in the wife, hormonal studies, a hysterosalpingogram (a test to determine if the fallopian tubes are obstructed), and semen analyses.

If these tests are normal, we conduct a postcoital test a few hours after intercourse to see if the sperm are surviving well in the cervical mucus. If this is normal, we do an endometrial biopsy to evaluate the lining of the uterus, to tell us whether it is developing well enough for an egg to attach. As a last step, we use a laparoscope (a telescope-like device with a camera) to view and evaluate the uterus,

fallopian tubes, and ovaries through the navel.

### Q. Once the cause of infertility is diagnosed, what can you do to correct the problem?

**A.** We prescribe medication (fertility drugs) to correct lack of ovulation. Blockage of the fallopian tubes is corrected by surgery. If the woman has a problem with her cervical mucus, we administer medication or perform artificial insemination with the husband's semen.

If problems with semen quality are encountered, medication, insemination with the husband's semen, or referral to a urologist for repair of a varicose vein in the scrotum (if one exists) may be used. If the semen quality cannot be improved, we offer artificial insemination with donor semen.

In vitro fertilization is offered in cases of irreparable tubal damage, severe endometriosis, uncorrectable cervical problems, and very low sperm counts.

### Q. How long does a patient need to see an infertility specialist?

**A.** Until a successful pregnancy is achieved or we determine that a problem exists which cannot be corrected. A successful pregnancy is defined as being able to detect a fetal heartbeat in the uterus on an ultrasound. If the pregnancy is progressing normally, the woman is referred back to her obstetrician. If it is considered a high-risk pregnancy, the obstetrician may seek consultation with a perinatologist, such as Dr. Mariona.

### Q. How do you determine if a pregnancy is "high-risk"?

**A.** We review the patient's previous obstetrical history and present health. A high risk pregnancy can occur in a young woman with a chronic disease, such as diabetes, high blood pressure, or heart disease; a woman with a history of past problem pregnancies, including multiple miscarriages; and/or a woman who is over age 35.

### Q. What is the first step a woman fitting any of these profiles should take when considering pregnancy?

**A.** First she should come in for preconception counseling with her partner. During our initial meeting, we would discuss the couple's general health and medical history and determine what their risks are for carrying a baby to term.

### Q. What services does Oakwood's Division of Maternal-Fetal Medicine offer for high-risk pregnancy?

**A.** We perform prenatal diagnosis on the fetus to give the couple appropriate information on the presence of a normal or abnormal baby. These tests include chorionic villus sampling (CVS), in which a portion of the placental tissue is examined for genetic abnormalities while the fetus is attaching itself to the lining of the uterus. This test can be performed as early as eight or nine weeks into the pregnancy. We also do amniocentesis when the fetus is between 13 and 15 weeks old. During this procedure, we obtain a sam-

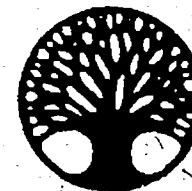
ple of amniotic fluid that is then examined for genetic abnormalities.

If the pregnancy is further along, we perform ultrasound, in which high frequency sound penetrates into the tissue and bounces off the structure of the fetus to generate pictures that we can observe. We use various types of ultrasound to look at organs, how the organs are functioning, and how the baby's systems are developing. We then arrive at a total evaluation that tells us if the baby is normal, growing, and functioning as it should.

Later in the pregnancy, other observations are performed, including but not limited to electronic and biophysical observations of the developing fetus, along with continuous monitoring of the mother to detect or treat complications.

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# SC program encourages future scientists, engineers

Bad Boy T-shirts, broad grins revealing shiny braces and giggles are representative of a handful of "bright" students participating in an enrichment program offered for the first time this summer by Schoolcraft College.

Twenty-five minority youths, ninth and 10th graders primarily from Detroit area public schools who aspire to careers in engineering and science, are enrolled in computer, math, science and communication courses. It's all part of an intense three-week engineering enrichment program offered by the college under the auspices of the Detroit Area Pre-College Engineering Program.

"They're bright. Some of them are super bright," said Schoolcraft assistant dean Jeanne Bonner of the participants who have been selected on the basis of outstanding scholastic achievement. Bonner heads up the Schoolcraft program.

Jasmin Campbell, 13, who will be

a ninth grader in Detroit's Martin Luther King High School, is typical. Jasmin, an excellent student, wants to be a chemical engineer. Jason Orr, also 13 and an entering ninth grader at Renaissance High School in Detroit, aspires to bio-engineering. Antar Salim, 14, a ninth grader headed for Harrison High in Farmington Hills, talks of becoming an accountant.

"I LIKE IT. It's interesting," said Che Patterson, 13, of the summer studies. Che, an entering freshman at University of Detroit High School, abounds with energy. "Interview me. I'm interesting," he teased.

On a more serious note, Jasmin

said she expects the experience to "help me in high school." Antar also "figures" it will be useful later, in high school science and math classes.

Jason, who otherwise likes the program, dislikes "the long bus ride." Five mornings each week, his mother drives him to Schoolcraft, but he relies on bus transportation provided by the program for the return trip home.

Che voices an alternative to the daily commute. "Live on campus. I wanted to go to the University of Michigan so I could live in," he said.

## Federal money sought for Rouge cleanup

The appropriations subcommittee on veterans affairs, housing and urban development and independent agencies has approved \$500,000 for a demonstration project in cleaning up the Rouge River, according to U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Taylor, whose district includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township and portions of Livonia.

The funding must now be approved by the entire U.S. House and Senate.

The project consists of four parts, including immediate remedial ac-

tion and longterm consideration of a primary treatment facility.

If approved, the project will be implemented in four stages in cooperation with Wayne County, according to Ford.

"We face many years of hard work ahead. If approved, these mon-

ies will go a long way in helping local communities in cleaning up the Rouge River," Ford said.

The river winds through a 467-square mile area known as the Rouge River Basin. It includes 48 communities in three counties with a population of 1.5 million.

Of the five colleges and universities participating in this summer's program, Schoolcraft is the only school without facilities for on-campus living. The University of Michigan, Wayne State University, Michigan State University and the University of Detroit offer dormitory housing.

"It's impossible for us," Bonner said, because Schoolcraft is a commuter school. But in other ways, she added, the Schoolcraft experience is comparable. Schoolcraft has modeled its program after that offered by U-M and to compensate for an on-campus living experience, Schoolcraft provides two student assistants to help with homework, social or other problems.

"I TRY AND be a friend to them, assist them when there are problems and help motivate them," said student assistant Robin Patell, 21, of Canton, a mechanical engineering major at U-M.

"Several are extremely motivated. Some aren't," Patell said of his charges.

Student assistant Garry Kaluzny of Livonia echoed Patell. "Some are not terribly enthused about being here."

A certain reluctance is understandable, according to Bonner. "This is quite an investment for these kids. It's their summer vacation and here they are working. Plus they have homework every night."

"But it's an investment in their future and they will be the better for it," she said.

Opportunity is one of the primary reasons DAPCEP was founded in 1976, according to executive director Kenneth Hills, who said the program has been nationally recognized as a model by the U.S. Department of Education. Funded entirely by private grants, the program provides exposure to minority students who are "historically unrepresented in engineering and science careers."

Of the 4,000 students who have participated to date, some 80 percent of those who complete college earn degrees in science and engineering.

KILEN JACKSON and Kwesi Hill both attended middle school at Go Lightly Educational Center, an alternative school within the Detroit Public School system. Math teacher Patricia Charters encouraged them to participate in the enrichment program.

Kilen, who is an entering freshman at Dominican, a Catholic high school, finds Schoolcraft classes "kind of easy."

But Edward Ware, who previously attended the Greater Grace Temple Christian Academy, describes Schoolcraft courses as "challenging and exhilarating."

To accommodate various skill levels, classwork is tailored to individual ability. Math, for example, is taught at three levels, ranging from beginning algebra to calculus.

All three — Kilen, Kwesi and Edward — are lucky. Of the 350 students who applied for participation in the program, only 150 were accepted due to lack of space.

DAPCEP board president Harry Greenleaf recommended earlier this year that the program be expanded to Schoolcraft College where he serves as a trustee. The board is seeking additional participating universities, according to Hill.

In addition to the summer enrichment program, more than 500 high school students participate in Saturday programs, courses taught one day weekly at area universities, including U-M, Dearborn and Oakland University. Lawrence Institute of Technology will offer classes this fall.

DAPCEP also hosts the annual Science and Engineering Fair of Metropolitan Detroit, an event involving thousands of students in a variety of scientific activity.

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# Grants are available for wellness programs

Michigan has started funding grants for company wellness programs to help promote employee health and stem rising health-care costs for businesses.

Created by the Michigan Health Initiative legislation of 1987, the fund has grants available for up to \$5,000 for public and private employers.

On-site wellness programs include stress tests, cholesterol checks, blood pressure and weight control screenings, stop-smoking help and information on safety and alcohol use.

Grant priority is given to businesses with fewer than 500 employees that involve employees in planning the program, offer programs

to target more than one health risk and commit to continuing such programs after the grant ends.

The MHI says grant applications are brief, easy to complete and adds funds are readily available and usually awarded within 30 days of receiving a grant request. Its staff also helps plan wellness activities, complete applications and select approved vendors for wellness services.

MHI is administered by the Michigan Department of Public Health and the Michigan Department of Commerce. It serves Oakland and Wayne counties.

## Tradition Union jumps into campaign

**I**N AN election year, Westland voters shouldn't get worked up about political hassles and labor relations disputes at election time.

But what seems to be a local political tradition, the pace of contract negotiations of a union representing police lieutenants and sergeants has been injected as an issue in the upcoming mayoral campaign.

The union is unhappy about the pace of bargaining talks and is blaming Mayor Charles Griffin, who is seeking a second four-year term this fall.

But the union campaign is designed to embarrass the mayor more than to speed up negotiations.

Voters should remember a few basic principles when sorting out the arguments and counter-arguments.

**A municipal employee union is renewing a political tradition by jumping into the upcoming mayoral election.**

One: Griffin's only announced opponent at this writing is Robert Thomas, head of the union that represents most non-police/fire city employees.

Two: A state law prohibits police officers from striking but provides them the opportunity to get their salary increases through arbitration.

Three: Employees' salaries and fringe benefits account for nearly two-thirds of the city budget.

The bottom line is that unions want more than just a sympathetic ear from the mayor's office — they want more money.

## Tardy? Earlier school start is needed

**W**ESTLAND students in the Livonia school district are hot and bothered — and it has nothing to do with the summer heat or humidity.

As in past years, the youngsters are upset with being held hostage in classrooms until late June, usually a week or two when their counterparts are out of school and — for high schoolers — starting summer jobs.

The late closing of the school year for students is tied to the school calendar negotiated by the school board and Livonia teachers' union several years ago.

The district and union agreed on a calendar that had school starting the week after Labor

Day. The later starting date was a major priority during the regional contract bargaining efforts by area teachers' unions that led to a week-long midwinter recess between the Christmas/New Year holiday and Easter vacation.

**BUT LIVONIA** could take a lesson from the neighboring Wayne-Westland district, which serves most of the community.

While there are few options available for allowing classes to begin the week before Labor Day, school officials, union leaders and parents should keep trying to find a way to start earlier and let students out of school in early June.

## Freeway fear Time for drivers to fight back

**A**S A FREEWAY driver, how long has it been since you've laid on the horn and shouted at the jerk who's glided into your lane without signaling, nearly sheering off your front bumper?

Probably a long time. Freeway shootings have seen to that, and made us that much more paranoid in the process.

It's not healthy and it's not natural. Any doctor will tell you stress needs an outlet. Any driver will tell you navigating metro area freeways is stressful.

Yet we do nothing, fearful of having a bullet squeezed off in our direction. People don't even look at people in other cars, fearful that their facial expressions may prompt an act of hostility.

SO WE seal ourselves in our cars, stare dead ahead and let rage silently build inside us. That's ridiculous. A few armed lunatics have made us afraid to honk a horn in the Motor City.

Honking off that blind fool careening across lanes is a time-honored tradition around here. It relieves stress. It directs frustrations where they should be directed and keeps us from taking it out somewhere else, on someone else.

So let's get together on this. Someone saw the guy in the Geo Tracker who took a shot earlier this month at a car on I-696 near Orchard Lake Road. Call the police and help prosecute.

Fight back. Call and write your legislators and tell them you want laws enacted specifically addressing penalties for those convicted of freeway shootings.

This is not some complex, abstract issue steeped in philosophical meaning that will require time and even-handedness to resolve. It is an immediate problem that affects every one of us every day.

After all, how many tombstones do we need bearing the inscription: "Here lies X, dead for committing the unpardonable sin of sticking his tongue out at the driver next to him."

## Abortion debate Other issues need our attention

**W**ITH THE onslaught of the Michigan gubernatorial sweepstakes, voters can only hope there is more to political life in Michigan than the abortion issue.

Important, yes, but abortion shouldn't be the all to end all of political debate in the Wolverine state. Unfortunately, the danger exists that, with the recent U.S. Supreme Court decision giving states more latitude in limiting abortion rights, this very emotional issue will become the main focus of political debate.

Without a doubt, the pro-life forces will inundate candidates of all stripes with their litmus test of loyalty to their cause. And pro-choice forces will be forced to respond with equal fervor.

Neither politicians nor abortion activists, pro or con, can be relied upon to keep the ship of state on an even keel.

**ONLY VOTERS**, those out of the mainstream of power and special interest, can be relied upon to maintain a balance in the upcoming debate. Only the reaction of voters can ensure that all

important issues will remain in focus. While a militant group of citizens do feel that abortion is the most important issue, others realize that this state's leaders must address an agenda of political concerns.

- The governor and Lansing lawmakers must resolve the dilemma of public education which is rapidly becoming a system of haves and have-nots.

- The state must take a more active roll in dealing effectively with the war on drugs.

- Highway expansion and repair must be sorted out before we are overwhelmed with clogged highways.

- Economic development still must be a number one concern of a state which still lags behind much of the rest of the nation in maintaining healthy employment figures.

They are a spirited bunch. To survive, they have to be. Live theater, even at its most successful, is a struggling venture.

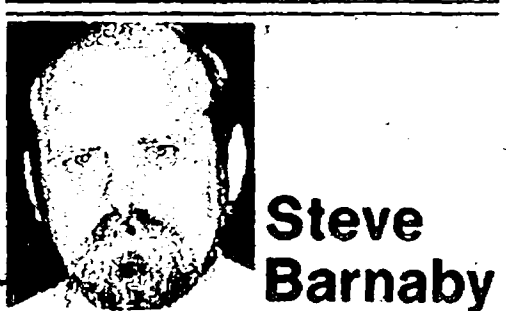
Many don't survive. But the arts in our area has always had a fringe existence. As we can see by recent events in the metro area, the arts is a hard sell.

# Beverage industry loses a round

THIS TIME the beverage industry caved in fairly quickly.

The Michigan Legislature last week put the finishing touches on a pair of bills to deal with unclaimed deposits on beer, pop and wine cooler bottles and cans.

Those are the containers we all occasionally break and which some of us still discard along roadsides, woods and lakeshores.

Depending on whom you want to believe, those unclaimed deposits each year total \$12 million (manufacturers and wholesalers) or \$38 million (state Department of Natural Resources).

Under the new pair of laws, that money will be accumulated for 10 years in a state trust fund. Then for the following 50 years, the interest — maybe \$50 million a year — will be used for toxic cleanups, solid waste disposal, recycling and enforcing environmental laws.

Without doubt, Gov. Jim Blanchard will sign the second bill as he did the first.

THAT VICTORY didn't come easily.

Let's note, at the outset, that Michiganders as a group take pride in their state's beauty. In contrast, note the trash-laden hillsides along I-75 or any other road in Kentucky. Michiganders want their state kept tidy. That is a given.

In 1976 the Michigan United Conservation Clubs asked the Legislature to pass a law requiring deposits on all beer and pop containers. No luck. MUCC and its allies used an initiative petition to place the deposit bill on the ballot.

There ensued a vicious campaign on the part of the industry, organized as the Committee Against Forced Deposits, though I prefer to call it the Litter Lobby. Its theme, essentially false, was that only a tiny fraction of the litter was due to beer and

pop containers. Yeah, and I suppose my dog severed a tendon in his foot on a gum wrapper and not a busted beer bottle covered by a quarter-inch of snow.

The Litter Lobby coated the pages of newspapers with ads, but the public knew better. The deposit bill passed with nearly 70 percent of the vote, and the law took effect two years later.

Overnight, the litter on our landscape was reduced about 90 percent.

NEXT CHAPTER came in the mid-'80s as wine coolers came on the market.

The morning before the state Liquor Control Commission (LCC) held a hearing on whether to place a deposit on wine cooler bottles, I recall picking eight wine cooler empties off my lawn.

The industry's response was to question the patriotism of anyone who would place any restriction on wine coolers, a totally American product.

First the Legislature decided the LCC lacked authority to amend a voter-initiated law by a rule. Then the

lawmakers dillydallied while the MUCC and its allies cranked up a second petition drive.

In the end, the wine cooler industry was defeated, and the Legislature, under pressure, gave three-fourths approval to an amendment to the deposit law covering wine coolers.

THE THIRD chapter is closing.

This time MUCC had to gather only 30,000 petition signatures of the 300,000 it needed in order to convince the Legislature it was serious about using unclaimed deposits for environmental cleanup.

If the industry had had its way, it would have given a fraction of that money to toxic cleanups and alcoholism programs.

As this chapter is written, I have no way of guessing what the next episode in the deposit story will be. But as it unfolds, I hope industry will have brains enough to grasp that Michiganders want a clean state and that the Litter Lobby will give in without an expensive, knock-down, drag-out fight.

# Racial attitudes need changing

WAKE UP.

That's the opening line from Spike Lee's new film, "Do The Right Thing." And right there, both in the opening and title, lies its ambiguity — and its brilliance.

In fact, at 8 a.m. Monday, on a cooler summer day than Lee depicts, in Birmingham, not Brooklyn, 25 people — suburban white and black people — showed up at The Community House to probe what indeed this amazing film is all about.

Who, in fact, is Lee asking to wake up? And what, in fact, is the right thing to do?

Lending a practiced eye as well as a wealth of background in film to the discussion was Lewis Beale, a Detroit Free Press reporter recently transferred from L.A. where he had been a film industry reporter for the Los Angeles Daily News. He and his wife are new residents of Birmingham.

And those he was leading were members of the Birmingham-Bloomfield Task Force on Race Relations and Ethnic Diversity. They are the concerned people who recently put on the community forum in response to the racial problems in Birmingham schools and who now are planning a fall communitywide conference on achieving a diverse community.

BEALE, WHO IS white, criticized the white media, particularly the all-important New York City white media, for misinterpreting the film, for seeing it as "a very New York picture" and a call to racial violence.

No, this is not just a New York City film. As Marcia Femrite, a white former Detroit teacher now from Bloomfield Hills said, "You don't have to go far from here to see that street. The rage is not surprising at all."

Said Dana Cunningham, a black woman from West Bloomfield, "I think Spike makes his pictures for black people." Her interpretation of "Wake up" is that black people need to learn to take care of themselves economically.

Black people haven't done what other immigrant groups have, she said. They haven't gone from the pushcart, to a bigger pushcart, to the stand, to a store. "Historically, blacks who have done that have been murdered, have been 'fired' out of business."

In the film, black people want the Italian pizza parlor owner to put up photographs of black people on the wall, and they taunt the Korean couple who owns a small fruit and vegetable store.

Beverly Knight, a black woman from Birmingham, says that in the neighborhood where she grew up the fact that none of the markets is owned by black people is "a constant issue."

GORDON MAY, the black director of Oakland Community College's Pontiac Center, sees the film as a call for corporate America to wake up. When the pizza parlor owner refuses to hang other-than-Italian celebrities on his wall, May extends that to: no minorities on the wall of corporate America.

When Mary Cay Dirks, a white Bloomfield Hills resident, responds that it's obviously in corporate America's best interest to hire and train minorities, Cunningham points out:

"It may be in corporate America's best interest, but we haven't seen enough of it," adding that business is one of the main opponents of Michigan's school finance reform.

Much of the discussion of what is indeed "the right thing" turned on the film's ending, which featured a quote from Martin Luther King urging non-violence followed by one from Malcolm X, ostensibly urging violence.

"The movie stands on its own. It doesn't need that benediction," said the Rev. Almus Thorp Jr. from Christ Church Cranbrook.

"To me, the movie is about ambiguity," Dirks said. "The movie is raising the issue."

Beale sees the film and the ending as stating that when you are attacked, you attack back.

"DO THE RIGHT Thing" is "one of the most important films made in this country in the last 10 years," Beale says.

It will may be, for whatever your interpretation, the scenario it depicts is real — the growing rage of the young black community.

How the current backward march in civil rights will play into all of this is a clear question. But it's one we all, city dwellers and suburbanites, blacks and whites, had better attend to pretty quickly. Wake up.

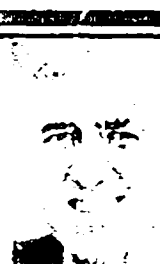
# Year-round school has some support

Q: The state of California is considering a year-round school program; specifically, the 45/15 — whatever that is. The article I read said that with such a program, buildings don't sit vacant all summer. Should Michigan look at the year-round school?

A: Some districts have looked at the program. Proposals for a year-round school program always seem to surface in states, such as California, or school districts in which an enrollment crunch packs school facilities.

A 45/15 program means children are in the classroom for 45 days and then have a 15-day vacation four times a year. There are four groups of students. Three groups are in class while the fourth is on vacation. Buildings are therefore used all year long and are not sitting idle from June to September.

The value to a school district is

that existing buildings can house one-fourth more students, and that money is saved because the construction of new schools is not needed. The program is relatively easy to implement at the elementary level. Due to the type of scheduling at the middle and high school levels, it becomes extremely difficult and costly to implement a 45/15 year-round program. At the high school level, if a school district has one advanced placement physics class of 28 students in a 45/15 year-round school program, you could have only seven

students in each of the four different groups. Instead of one teacher for 28 students, one teacher is needed for every seven students. This requires hiring additional staff and would drain a district's budget.

In Michigan, there is parental and teacher support both for and against the 45/15 concept.

Problems arise if a family with two or three children have, for example, a cottage up north. Their children could be on different cycles; that is, one child may be going to school in July and August when the other children in the family are on a break. Districts in Michigan that have used the 45/15 program worked diligently to schedule all students on the same 45-day cycle, i.e., February, March, April. However, it doesn't always work.

The bottom line is that most districts that adopt the program tend to return to the September to June

schedule when enrollment levels off and facilities become available.

I personally favor the 45/15 schedule because teachers and children get a break every 45 days, facilities are used more and learning is more evenly distributed over the entire year. However, traditions and vacation habits are powerful and will probably never draw us away from the September to June school year, a model that originated during the agrarian era to allow youths to work the farm in the summer.

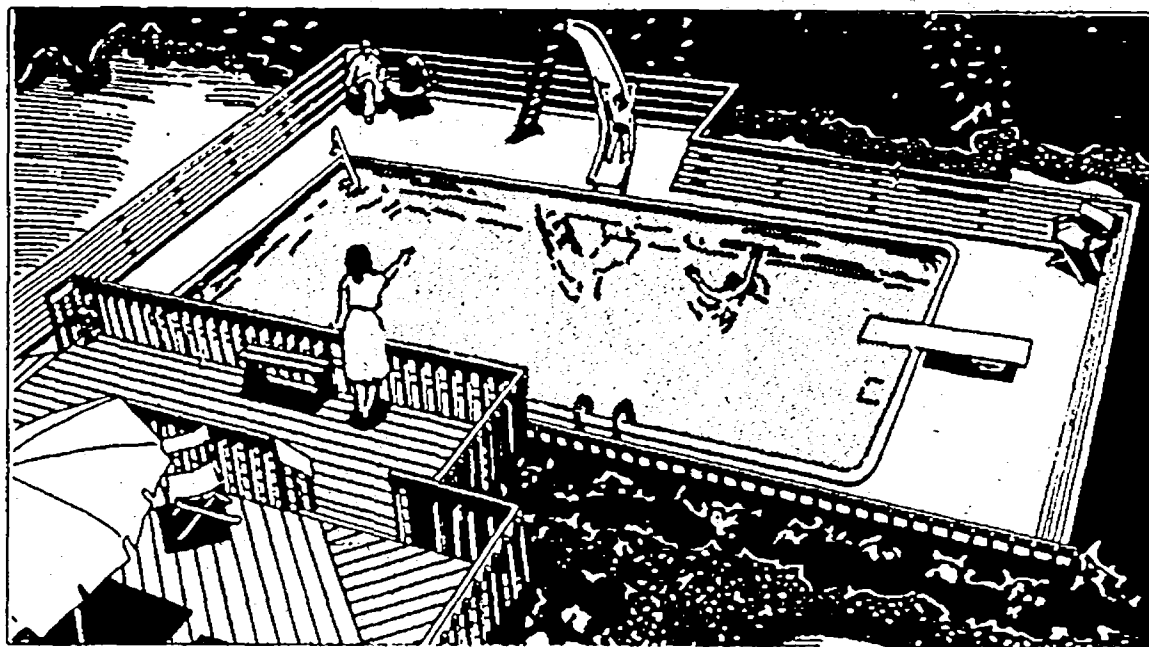

## Has civilian life changed L. Brooks?

Six months into civilian life, after 16 years as Oakland County's prosecutor, L. Brooks Patterson is still a man of carefully chosen words.

When asked if there was something he'd always wanted to say during those 16 years, but couldn't because he was prosecutor, Patterson didn't hesitate.

"— you, Judge Thorburn," he said with a big smile. Patterson and James Thorburn, who used to be an Oakland County Circuit Court judge, had several celebrated, loud disputes over cases and judicial procedure during Patterson's tenure.

Thorburn has left the Oakland County bench and Patterson is in the litigation section of Barbler and Tolleson, a Troy law firm. "I'm still on a learning curve. I was out of civil practice for 16 years," he said.

HE THINKS, he left the prosecutor's office with a 90 percent success rate. He enjoys his new job. And he hasn't backed away from issues important to him.

"I'm looking for a petition in the fall," Patterson said in reference to Citizens Unfairly Taxed, a group that wants to decrease school millages to offer homeowners property tax relief. CUT would place the burden for replacing those funds on the state.

Patterson said he's really just acted as a facilitator for the group, bringing it together and helping give it direction.

He's also supporting U.S. Rep. William Schuette for the U.S. Senate seat held by Sen. Carl Levin. Schuette is the stepson of the chairman of Dow Chemical in Midland, according to The Almanac of American Politics.

PATTERSON THINKS Levin can be beaten, but hasn't been yet because the Republicans have thus far supported lackluster candidates.

"Jack Lousma was still in the dug-out by the seventh inning," Patterson said of the former astronaut's failed

campaign. "But even then, Levin barely called it a victory."

Patterson said he has "no immediate agenda" regarding his own political career, but added "I'll never say never" when asked if he'd eventually make a run for the governor's office.

On other issues, Patterson:

- Said if he were a citizen on the county's newly appointed Judicial Selection Committee, which will interview candidates for the two circuit court openings in next year, the top three characteristics he would look for are "fairness, intellect and objectivity, in that order. I never wanted a judge who was so prosecution you knew it was going to be your verdict," he said, citing concern about a reversal on appeal.

- Thinks Richard Thompson, the Oakland County prosecutor who worked for him for 16 years, "has a nuts-and-bolts approach and extremely high integrity."

- Feels a slight "inability to make things happen. I had authority as a prosecutor. I could solve problems with a phone call. Now I file complaints," which he said is effective, but takes longer.

- Misses "the strokes the most." He said on his last day as prosecutor, while he was walking down the hall, a crying woman ran up, hugged him and thanked him for bringing her daughter home. Patterson said it was a case where the woman's divorced husband had taken their child out of state and he'd brought him back with two phone calls — one for a warrant and one to "the feds. I had the child back home within days."

- Expected the Supreme Court to overturn Roe v. Wade.

- Feels really cheated by only one case — a "classic," he called it, where a killer admitted, on videotape, that he'd murdered someone, but the judge ruled the confession inadmissible.

And what's it like to have Patterson working for you? "It couldn't be better," said Ralph Barbler. "He works harder than anybody in the firm. I'd love to find something negative to say about him, but I can't."

## Road bills hit legislative snag

State Sen. Richard Fessler's bills to raise the fuel tax 2 cents and float a \$900 million bond issue for road construction have hit two snags.

"My bills were referred to the Senate Finance Committee," said Fessler, R-Commerce. He had hoped they would be referred to his own State Affairs, Tourism and Transportation Committee.

The Finance Committee is headed by Sen. Norm Shinkle, R-Monroe County. The referral was made by Senate Majority Leader John Engler, R-Mount Pleasant, the probable GOP 1990 candidate for governor.

Fessler guessed that Engler might be concerned about looking like a tax-raising candidate.

SO FAR, no public hearings have been scheduled by the Finance Committee. Fessler had hoped for public hearings this summer.

A Fessler aide said the prolonged legislative battle with Gov. James Blanchard over the budget and "supplemental" spending might make it difficult to schedule summer hearings.

The Senate is scheduled to meet only every two weeks throughout the summer.

Fessler's Senate Bills 488 and 489 would lift the fuel tax to 17 cents from the current 15 cents a gallon effective in 1991 and use the increase to pay off a \$900 million state bond issue.

THE MICHIGAN Municipal League, an organization of cities and villages, is opposing one major feature.

"The League is strongly opposed to earmarking the municipal share of a state-issued bond," it said in a legislative report. "Cities and villages should continue to decide locally how much of their street money to allocate for maintenance and how much, if any, for bond issues for construction."

"If municipal governments need to bond for street projects, they have the authority to do so. The Legislature should not mandate it."

"Under the bill, the state's share of the increase is earmarked for a bond issue to construct seven specific state highway projects."

THE STATE Department of Transportation also opposes legislative earmarking of specific projects, although it agrees with Fessler's choices.

Among them are M-9 (Haggerty corridor), widening of M-59 in western Oakland and Livingston counties, and reconstruction of the Davison freeway in Detroit.

## In the good old summer-time

### Shorts: Stylish at last!

If you live in Michigan, there's two things you can count on — cold winters and hot, humid summers.

And if you live in Michigan, you learn to dress accordingly. Heavy coats, hats and gloves are a must for winter and shorts are a mainstay of summer casual wear.

But it wasn't so long ago that shorts — on women in particular — were met with disapproval. A case in point was a 1931 pamphlet, "Modest Apparel — An Earnest Word to Christian Women," written by a Christian businessman Mr. T.W.I., who admonished women for wearing bathing suits, short dresses and, God forbid, shorts, saying they dressed "like harlots."

"As women have always been the instruments of Satan, it is not surprising that by their dress, they should tempt hapless men to crimes of passion," he wrote. "Remember, the girl who dresses in an alluring way cannot condemn anyone but herself, if the lure of her dress brings her the treatment which is usually accorded to women of questionable morals."

If Mr. T.W.I. were alive today, he'd probably be speechless. The barker the better is the key word for bathing suits are briefer, short dresses are back in vogue, and shorts... well, let's just say they're a common sight once the temperatures top 65 degrees.

But it wasn't so long ago that shorts were relegated to men, and women were literally covered from head to toe.

According to "Fairchild's Dictionary of Fashion," shorts are brief trousers ranging from mid-thigh to knee high in length. They were originally worn by athletes, but later adapted by men as underpants, then summer sportswear. And it wasn't until the 1930s that women began wearing shorts as sportswear.

**BUT THE** reformation of the bottom half of women's clothing can be traced back to the 1890s. (Blame it on the introduction of the bicycle.)

Heavy skirts were no go for bicycling since Victorian men would have been treated to a bit more than a glimpse of stocking, so it wasn't long after the bicycle came into being that someone



came up with the idea of a divided skirt for female bicyclists.

Not that the divided skirt was anything great. It was, shall we say, voluminously modest. And even though it concealed a nicely turned ankle, the divided skirt drew criticism from men who called it unfeminine and even shocking.

By the 1920s, women were starting to wear slacks, and even shorts, for sports and lounging, which, like the divided skirt, was greeted with masculine disapproval and ridicule.

Some were heard to comment that it made women look "ugly" and that wanting to wear them was "unnatural and sexually unattractive."

In the age of the liberated female, those comments are fighting words, but the male reaction is understandable, considering that until the '20s, pants had been the badge of male authority for hundreds of years.

By the mid-30s, women had more freedom to wear pants and shorts, but those fashions were limited to their private and infor-

mal side of life. A woman who dared to show up at a formal affair clad in say a trouser suit was considered to be "Bohemian and probably a lesbian."

By World War II, when women became a mainstay of the war effort at home, functional masculine clothing became a must for factory work. Among women, it was looked upon as "part of the comradery of the war effort."

**BUT IN THE** post war years, men still expressed disdain for such dress, saying it was a "slackness of behavior" on the part of women. One man, in a letter to the editor of a newspaper, wrote that he "refused to be seen in public with a female wearing shorts or slacks and dangling a cigarette from her lips."

Slowly, shorts became acceptable casual dress for women and by the late 1960s were respectable fashion for women. In the 1960s and '70s, shorts were paired up with jackets as pant suits.

But — there's always a but — before the feminine liberation movement of the 60s, women

were only outwardly liberated when wearing shorts. Underneath, they were pinched and trussed up with underfashions to have a fashionable figure — a small derriere and no hips.

With the liberation movement, clothing changed, including underfashions which vanished or were mutated into harmless forms. Girdles and garter belts went out the window with the invention of panty hose, and brassieres emphasized a natural shape rather than a particular contour.

Contributing greatly to the rise of casual wear, including shorts, was a change in America's work habits. The advent of the 40-hour, five-day work week gave more and more people leisure time that once was the bastion of the well-to-do. The leisure class suddenly became the leisure mass.

Along with the increased leisure time came the ideal of beauty linked with the concept of good health. Today, sportswear is representative of a national style and image. The clothing reflects a clean cut, wholesome, all-American image.

**TODAY, SHORTS** come in all shapes and sizes.

There's even skorts — short divided skirts. For the brief coverage, there's short shorts. For a bit more coverage (mid-thigh to knee high), there's the sandpiper or Nassau, Jamaica and Bermudas. For the more modest types, there's the knee high surfer or jam-kini.

And in the between range — between slacks and shorts — there's deck pants and pedal pushers.

And even though, shorts are acceptable leisure attire for both sexes these days, the jury is still out on their place in fashion overall.

But rest assured someone is pressing the issue.

New York writer and editor John Fuller, in revolt against drab business suits, has been wearing Bermuda shorts to work for several years. He's been greeted with disdain in his refusal to be "slavish" to conventional business clothing.

His main motive, he says, is "why shouldn't men be comfortable at work?"

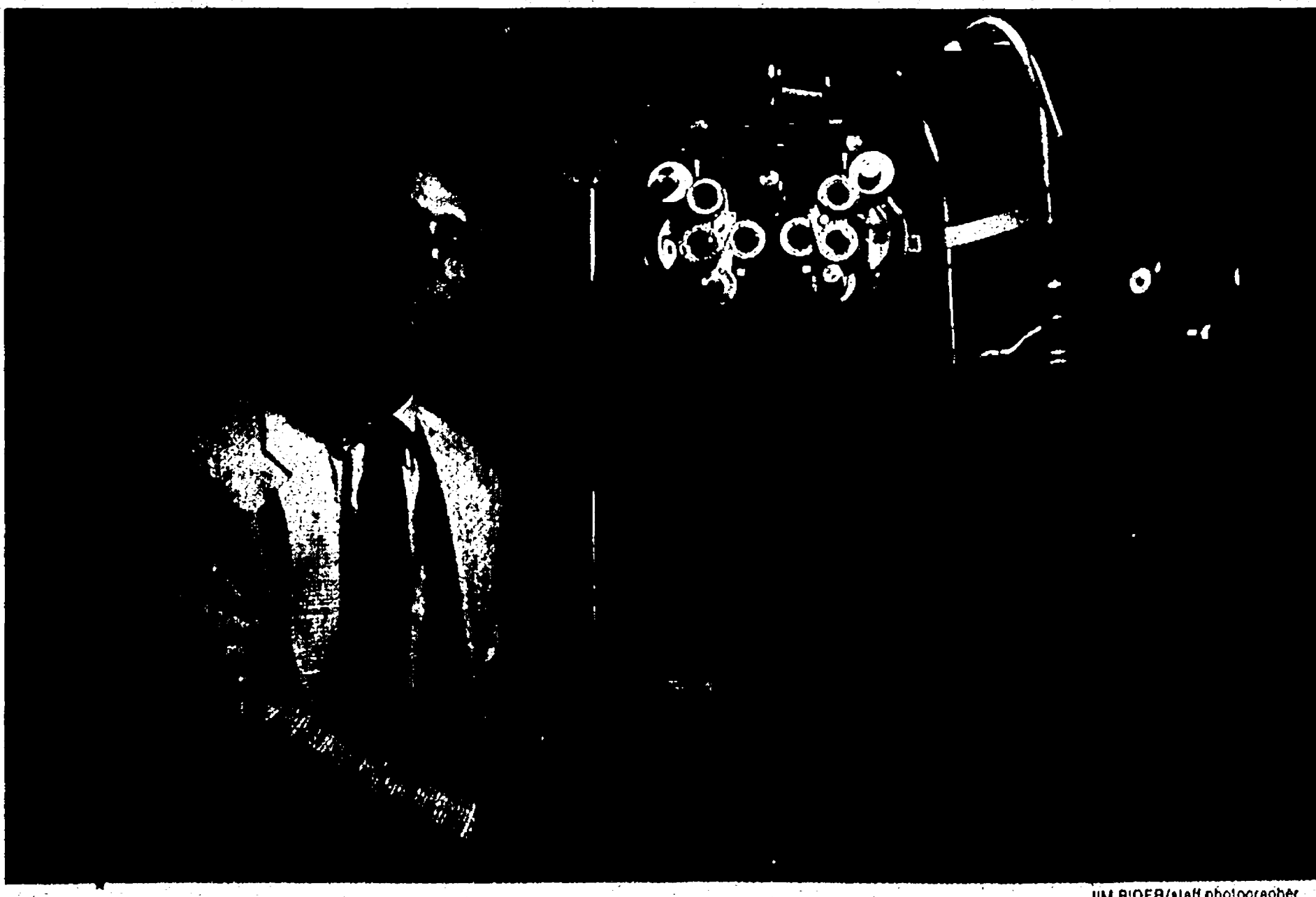

## Sunglass chic: Stylish, helpful

Wearing sunglasses and a wide-brimmed hat can do more for you this summer than mask your identity. It can help save your eyes.

Although consumers are becoming more aware of the harmful effects of too much sun, optometrist Barnett Leland feels most people aren't taking the initiative to change habits.

"It's difficult to tell patients the long-term benefits (of protecting their eyes) when they can't see it in the short term," said Leland, who oversees B. Leland & Associates. The corporation offers eye examinations and contact lens fitting in four Lens Crafters stores in the metropolitan Detroit and Flint areas.

"It's like smoking a cigarette," Leland said. "You're not going to die five minutes later, but the effects are cumulative."

**RESEARCH HAS** found that exposure to ultraviolet (UV) B radiation over a period of years can lead to cataracts. UV radiation is found in sunlight, to which everyone is exposed.

"A cataract is an opacity within the crystalline lens of the eye," Leland said. "There are lots of layers to the lens — similar to an onion. Any cloudiness within the layers is referred to as a cataract. It's like looking through a dirty window."

Cataracts must be removed surgically. And most implants are now UV-coated to protect the retina, Leland said.

**"THERE'S ALREADY** conclusive evidence of the harmful effects of ultraviolet rays on the skin, resulting in skin cancer," Leland said. "But if you lie out in the sun, you don't get eye burn. What's happening is that by age 55, you begin to develop cataracts."

Wearing UV-absorbing sunglasses and a brimmed hat combine significantly to reduce the risk, he said.

"It's important that the sunglasses you select have adequate UV absorption," Leland said. "A dark lens with no UV absorption can actually do more damage, so it's more important to have a quality lens."

## A 'model' event Contest helps launch careers

For the aspiring models in the Model of the Year U.S.A. competition, the event is not all glamour.

"It was hard work," said the current title holder, blonde, hazel-eyed Lisa Richardson, 23, of Union Lake, who exudes a sparkle and finesse that makes one believe it was easy for her to win. "We did rehearsals from daybreak until sunset. We had to rehearse over and over."

"I think the tough part is the rehearsals," agreed Willoughby Woods, 22, of Rochester, a blonde, green-eyed third-time pageant contestant. "We have worked until 12:30 at night before."

But for Richardson, Woods and three other contestants who gathered to talk about the competition on a recent afternoon, the hard work is worth it.

For them, the competition gives a unique opportunity to professionally showcase their talents before an audience of top modeling agencies, casting groups and talent scouts, which might lead to a modeling contract or a launched modeling career.

Judges of the event are representatives from major modeling agencies such as Elite from Chicago, Click Models from New York and Agence from Greece, who look to the competition as a way of acquiring fresh faces.

This year, the competition will be held Sat., July 29 at the Macomb Center of the Performing Arts.

"Without the exposure you have nothing," said brown-eyed, dark-haired Angelica Sgambati, 18, of Livonia. "You can be the best looking person in the world, but if nobody sees you, nothing comes of it."

**THE MODEL OF THE YEAR U.S.A.** competition, now in its fourth year, is owned and directed by Robert and Kimberley Djurovic of Rochester Hills.

Kimberley Djurovic, a former model, said the idea for the competition came about when she served as part of the Miss America delegation

and wondered how contestants who were aspiring models could be put face to face with modeling agencies.

The contest was launched. As in a major beauty pageant, there are judging categories including runway, swimsuit, evening gown, personality and photogenic. Contestants are 18 to 29 years old, and need not have had prior modeling experience. They all must be U.S. residents.

But call it a beauty pageant, and Kimberley Djurovic is quick to correct you, by saying, "We are a 'modeling competition.'"

Marie Anderson, vice president of Elite in Chicago and a judge of Model of the Year U.S.A., agrees that the contest is different from pageants.

"I don't look at it as a beauty pageant," said Anderson. "There's a big difference. The pageant industry tends to make them into Barbie dolls. I don't want that. I want them to be as natural as they possibly can be. In the modeling industry we tend to accentuate what the model was born with."

"Anytime you have an opportunity to meet up with a potential model you never met before is a tremendous opportunity. To actually have them presented to you — that's ideal," added Anderson, who has written a book called "The Complete Guide to Being a Professional Model."

Nevertheless, Anderson said, so far her agency has not exclusively signed a "Model of the Year" contestant.

Djurovic notes that "it is more than just the winner" who can get a contract from being in the show, because the agencies may spot a girl

with a look they need, and sign her to do a contract.

**THIS YEAR** there were some 600 applicants, mostly from around Michigan. Starting in 1990, preliminary competitions will be held in all 50 states. Djurovic has hopes that the competition will soon be televised.

"We started from scratch, and every year we get bigger," she said.

Contestants are chosen on the basis of potential and further groomed in professional make up, fashion and modeling techniques. The Djurovics supervise them as they attend seminars, photo shoots, yacht outings and parties.

The winner wins not only the opportunity to launch her career, but a prize package worth at least \$15,000, including priority interviews with top modeling agencies, a full length fox fur coat, a vacation to Cancun, and a full model's portfolio.

While participation in the competition opens doors, it doesn't guarantee jobs — especially in the Detroit area, where the modeling market centers on auto shows.

"Just because I received my title didn't automatically guarantee me work," said Richardson. "To work locally, I had to be aggressive."

Probably the biggest success story so far has been 1987 winner Ann Loosle of Livonia. Loosle, 18 when she won, went on to receive assignments including a recent two-month contract with Agence Model Management in Athens, Greece. She has appeared in the Elle, Seventeen and European Kai magazines.

Prior to winning the title, "I didn't know anything about modeling," said the 20-year-old Loosle. "I was ready to give up. I went to a modeling school, but they don't teach you how to break into the business."

Djurovic looks forward to seeing many more aspiring models fulfill their dreams through her competition.

"The best part is seeing our contestants actually succeed and make something of their modeling career," she said, a smile lighting up her face.

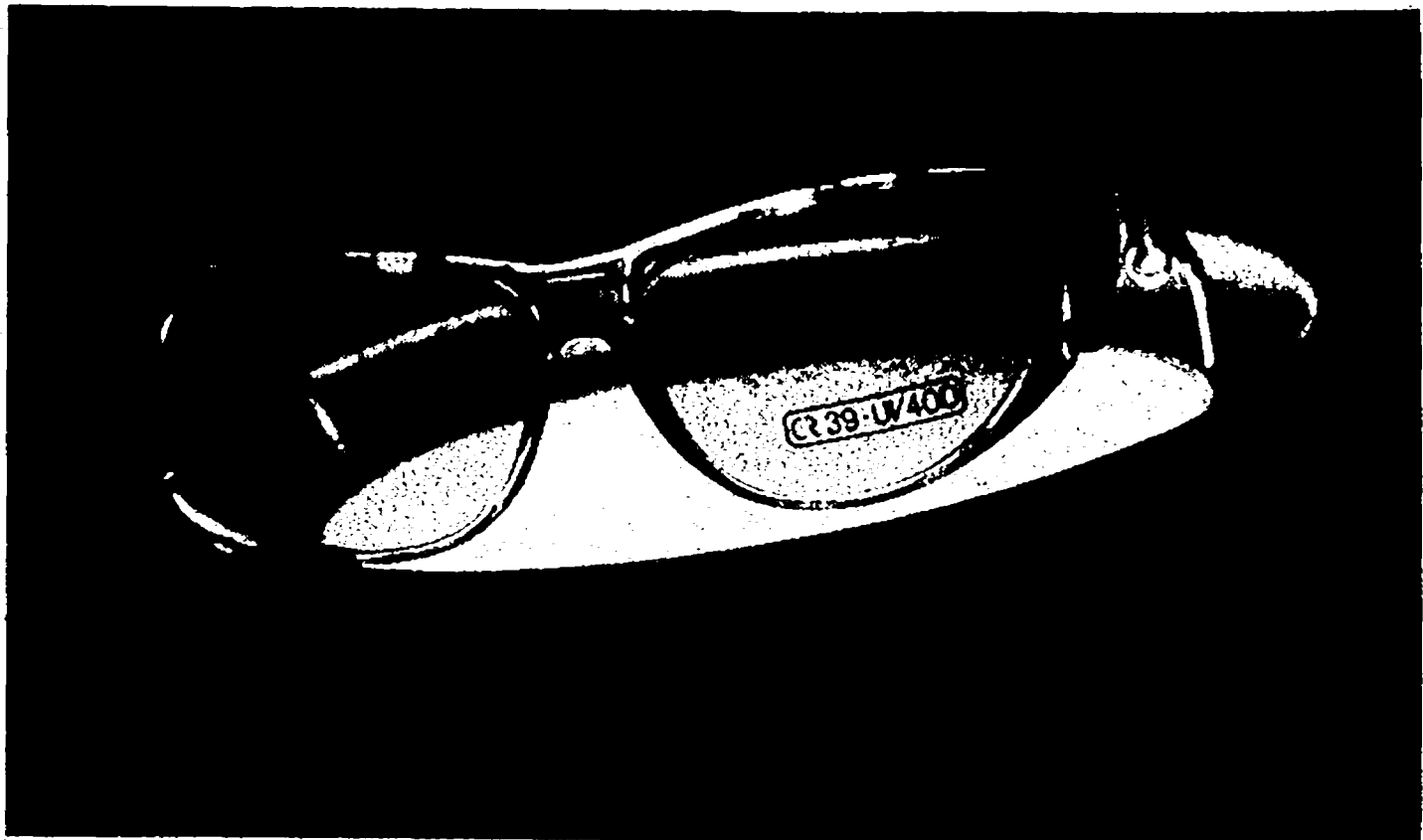

## Sunglasses save eyesight

Color also can be deceiving. A clear lens can have more protection than a darker lens. Amber- or yellow-tinted glasses are not as effective as UV-protective lenses in safeguarding the eye from radiation.

UV-B RAYS, which cause sunburn, are the most dangerous radiation. UV-A rays are less harmful. UV-C radiation is absorbed by the ozone layer in the atmosphere and doesn't reach Earth.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration has issued a voluntary labeling system — not yet widely in use. The three categories of sunglasses are cosmetic, general purpose and special purpose.

● Cosmetic glasses provide 70 percent protection from UV-B and 20 percent UV-A protection and block less than 60 percent of visible light.

● General purpose glasses block 95 percent of UV-B rays, 60 percent UV-A, and 60-92 percent of visible light.

● Special purpose glasses block 99 percent of UV-B rays, 60 percent UV-A, and block out 97 percent of visible light.

● DRIVERS SHOULD take special precaution between the hours of 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. when sun intensity is greatest. While a windshield provides some protection from ultraviolet rays, Leland recommends sunglasses with UV protection for motorists.

Tanning booths are another source of possible eye damage.

"Even with the eyelids closed, UV rays can get to the corner," Leland said. "It can cause a gritty sensation and be very painful."

● OTHER FACTORS are increasing the overall risk of cataracts. Envi-

ronmental factors can be hazardous. Harmful fluorocarbons are entering the atmosphere through holes in the ozone layer.

People are living longer and the risk of developing cataracts increases with age — from 3 to 4.5 percent of adults in the 52- to 64-year-old range develop cataracts and as many as 45.9 percent of 75- to 85-year-olds get them.

Behavioral patterns are another contributing factor. People are more involved in leisure-time activities, like skiing, water sports and golf.

When buying sunglasses, Leland suggests looking for a UV label. For normal use, general purpose sunglasses are sufficient. For water skiing, boating and especially snow skiing, special purpose glasses are needed.

"And make sure the sunglasses offer adequate protection to the top and sides of the eyes," Leland said.

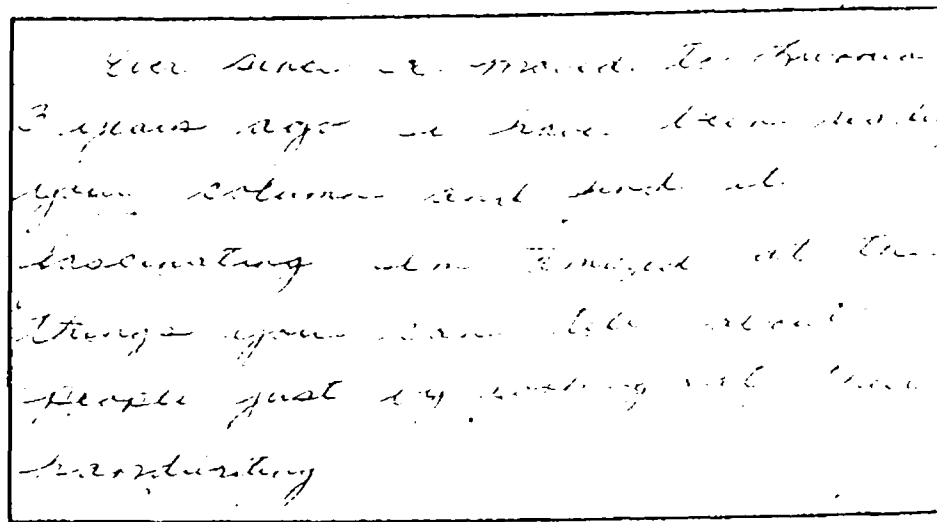

# A degree of humanity

## Program offers skills in ministry

Pastoral ministry is not for the chosen few, but those who choose it.

With the decrease in clergy, there is a large need for qualified laity to fill the bill. Madonna College has a new pastoral ministry program designed to help a few good people find out what they are good at.

Students can major or minor in the program, supporting scripture and moral/ethical courses with practical skills. People can specialize in criminal justice, gerontology, hospice, sign language or business administration.

In fact, Sister Ann Stamm can't think of one area where the pastoral ministry program wouldn't be applicable.

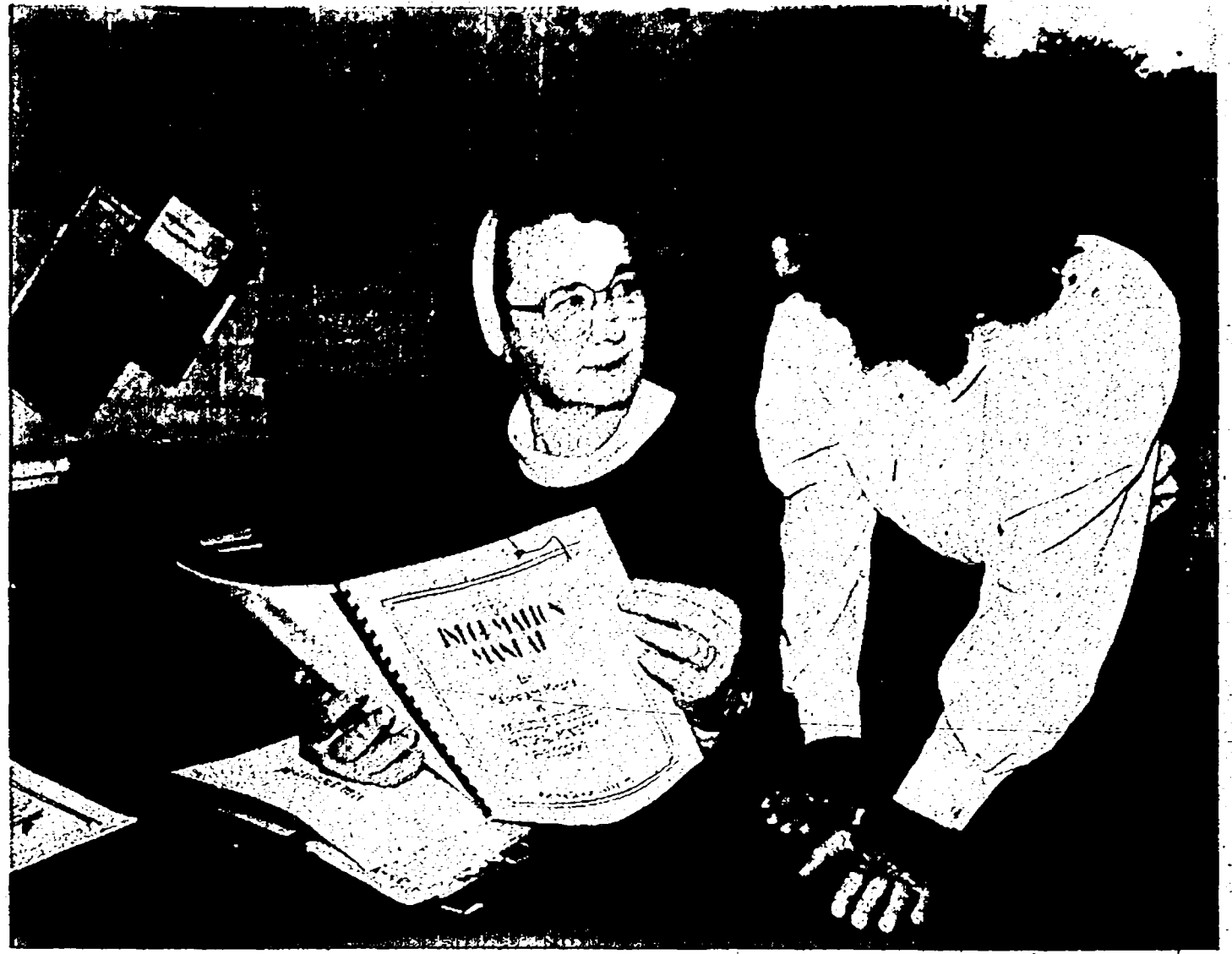
"This program is designed for people who have done a wide variety of things, but never pulled them together," said Stamm, who is chairwoman of the religious studies/philosophy department at Madonna College. "This program will take an awareness of what areas where the person is strong.

"You can't give what you don't have. But you have to know where your strengths are."

That, perhaps is what separates Madonna College's pastoral ministry program from others of its type. The program is individualized, finding a specialization and then applying it to everyday life.

**FOR EXAMPLE,** a retired police officer is enrolled in the program so he can help troubled youths. He can use his experiences on the street and enhance those with counseling and other skills taught in the program.

Mariann Lupinacci of Canton knows where her strengths lay. With this program, she hopes to make

them even more into focus. After graduating from Bishop Borgess High School in Redford, Lupinacci began taking religious classes. She had aspirations of becoming a nun.

Then she met John, who later became her husband.

Lupinacci, though, didn't marry away her willingness to help others. She has taught religious education at various parishes. She's also worked with victims of domestic assault and unwed mothers.

Her goal is to specialize in secondary education, perhaps venturing out in marriage counseling.

"This program allows me to be

more of a professional," said Lupinacci, who met her husband in Stamm's religious class at Madonna. "It will take my experiences and apply them in other areas."

The program evolved indirectly from an internal study of Madonna's religious studies/philosophy program three years ago. In the course of comparing curriculum at other Catholic colleges in the area, it was found there was a dire need for a pastoral ministry program.

STAMM THEN worked on a three-year study, looking at pastoral ministry programs across the country. The program is ecumenical and mul-

ti-dimensional with both long- and short-term goals.

The program can assist someone already in the ministry, who wants to become updated with some courses. Or, it can help someone tackle a new career with a purpose of help others in mind.

The later is particularly important. Along with the shortage of clergy, skilled lay people can bring experience to areas where perhaps a priest or a nun would be hard pressed.

"As a mother, she can bring a dimension to it that I couldn't," said Stamm, pointing to Lupinacci.

# Ruling on abortion further divides us

It was the kind of insight that is developed through experience. I had never heard it in my 14 years spent in classrooms following high school graduation. (I might have missed it along with a number of other insights.)

He was a member of our church council and he said to me one day, "There are two important things to remember in all negotiations. You never leave the room and you never push the other person into a corner."

Genuine care and regard for his colleagues in the office and on the line made him an especially effective negotiator and personnel officer. He knew them as men and women with goals and dreams and hopes and skills. He knew many of them by name. The plants under his responsibility had higher productivity and fewer grievances than all the others.

His observations about negotiations included the two popular features of humanity that create the very ambiguity we experience in the center of our lives. We have the potential of destruction for ourselves and our fellow human beings. We have the potential for fulfillment for ourselves and our fellow human beings.

THESE TWO powers are constantly at work in our beings and seldom, if ever, are they totally distinct. It can easily happen that the fulfillment we seek is rooted in the destruction of others around us. To be number one means that another has to be number two.

Beyond knowing the truth of human character is the practice of love and care in that constant effort for true community. Some peo-

ple have the ability of arousing another person's every evil intent, and others have the ability that the consequence is exactly equal to the intention.

The recent decision of the Supreme Court regarding abortion and the actions of many groups supporting this decision have pushed those who do not support this decision into a corner.

With a ruthless disregard for the very nature of community, the gift of human life has been turned into a political issue where one claims victory over another.

Choosing for or against abortion (the word itself is a political word and should not be used in public discourse except in carefully defined terms) is not a political issue nor even a legal one. It has been turned into one because the fabric of community life has been torn by contempt and neglect.

**PEOPLE LOCKED** in mortal combat have no time and space for that exercise of care and regard fundamental to societal well-being. The net effect of destroying community life in order to save it is a very real responsibility.

It has been said that one cannot choose family, but one can choose friends. Perhaps that is why the plan of Providence is to set the care of life in the midst of family and not in the midst of friends.

To cause the choosing of sides for or against abortion in the affairs of state is to reject the very relationship of life that was created to carry it.

# A little humor, some song and-banter Benefit bash stars comic Steve Allen

Tomorrow an entertainer's entertainer will be appearing at the Royal Oak Theatre, Fourth and Washington.

He's a man who had his first network television show in 1950, on CBS, has written 30 books, composed about 4,000 songs, and appeared on countless television programs.

He's Steve Allen. The 8 p.m. event is "Comedy Cares for Seniors," a benefit for the Catholic Social Services of Oakland County, a non-profit social service agency.

On Monday, Allen was in New York, where he was about to host an event at the Plaza Hotel for the Italian Clothing designers, who were showing off the new fall line. He took a few moments before rehearsal to talk about the show at the Royal Oak Theatre.

ALLEN INDICATED that "Comedy Cares for Seniors" would probably consist of passing cards around to the audience and have them ask questions. He'd read the cards and

answer the questions with the famous Allen flare, which he used to do on his television talk shows.

And he's scheduled to perform some of his famous songs, such as "This Could Be the Start of Something Big."

Opening for Steve Allen will be magician comedian Jeff Hobson, a Detroit based performer.

The event also will give those who attend a chance to get Allen's autograph later in the evening, possibly on a copy of his latest book, "Murder on the Glitter Box."

ALLEN DESCRIBED the book as a "murder whodunit," which from conception has taken two years to be realized in print. The story opens on a television talk show, not unlike "The Tonight Show," on NBC, of which Allen was the creator and first host. There's a guest host and wonderful guests and everything is going well. Then there's a murder - one of the guests keels over right on camera. The victim's been poisoned.

Of course, the remainder of the story is about finding out who the killer or killers are, all good fun for

the amateur arm chair detective reading in a big chair on a dark night.

"Murder on the Glitter Box" is Allen's 29th book in print.

THE NEXT BOOK, scheduled to come out is "The Passionate Non-Smokers Bill of Rights," which should be released in September.

Another book scheduled to be released soon is "Meeting of Minds," which will feature scripts from the interview show seen on PBS stations in the late 1970s and early 1980s, in which Allen interviewed great historical characters (that is, actors pretending to be such great historical characters), such as Ben Franklin.

In the 1980s, Allen has hosted and produced such shows as "Steve Allen's Music Room" and "Steve Allen's Comedy Room," both of which were series made up of six specials shown on the Disney Channel.

This season, Allen hosted another television interview show for syndication, and this summer WXYZ-TV, channel 7, has carried it.

It's "Host-to-Host," a set of 13 half-hour shows, in which Allen in-

terviews the interviewers, such as Dick Cavett, Hugh Downs, Larry King and Joan Rivers.

No other television shows are in the works for Allen at the moment.

HOWEVER, ALLEN'S wife, Jayne Meadows, has worked on two pilot television shows over the last two weeks, both of which are comedies.

Allen does have a second record album for Yamaha scheduled to be released soon, consisting of 12 of his own compositions.

Over the last few years, Allen has put together many albums or other artists have recorded his material. Some of the albums are "Paul Smith Plays Steve Allen," "Ann Jillian sings Steve Allen," "Steven Allen's Hip Fables," and "Funny Fone Calls," and "More Funny Fone Calls," the latter two albums of which use material from an early 1960's television comedy-talk show of Allen's that featured such comedians as Mel Brooks, Carl Reiner, Louis Nye and Jack Lemmon.

Another of some 40 albums of Allen's is "Shakin' Loose with Mother Goose," with Jayne Meadows.

ALLEN MENTIONED that his wife was currently involved with giving lectures about powerful women in history and that his son, Bill, was doing well as an executive with MTM Productions, the television company that over the years has put together such shows as "St. Elsewhere" and "Newhart."

The Catholic Social Services states that last year 80 Foster Grandparents served 270 children in 16 sites, for a total of 74,000 hours and that for the Retired Senior Volunteer Program, 390 volunteers chalked up 67,500 hours.

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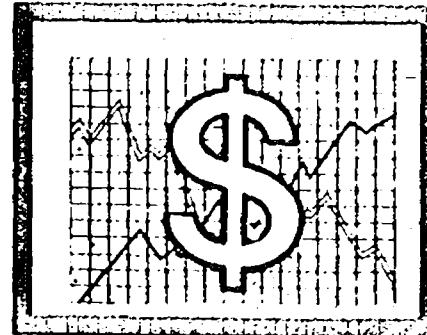

## Early start bodes well

### But plastic debt is high

Local financial planning experts reviewed the data of the family profiled here and made general recommendations based on the participant's resources and goals. It has been said that proper preparation prevents poor performance. This month's situation centers on Sheri Woods, who is trying to prepare for a solid financial future.

Woods, a single parent living in Farmington Hills, earns \$24,600 as a legal secretary. Her income is supplemented by child support payments of \$300 per month.

Her short-term goals are modest — she would like to buy a new car this fall and do some home remodeling at a cost of approximately \$3,500. Her long-term goals include preparing for her son's college tuition costs and beginning a program of retirement savings.

WOODS, 36, has been frugal with her money. Her only "extravagance" is sending her son to a private school at an annual cost of \$1,000. Her son's education will continue to be a high priority for her.

Although she would like to be able to send her son to the college of his choice, she realizes that money constraints may require that he attend a college near home or perhaps a community college for two years to reduce costs.

Woods and her son should plan for this early. We suggest that when her son, who's age 10, enters high school, Woods should familiarize herself with college financial aid programs, talk with financial aid counselors and make use of the many excellent resources available at local libraries.

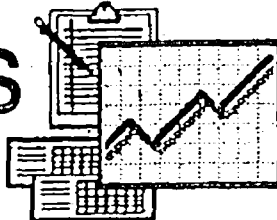
WE WOULD also strongly suggest that she involve her son in the process of selecting a college and financing his education. If possible, it may be a good idea to allocate a majority of the child support payments (beyond that being used currently for private school expenses) to a college fund.

In general, Woods' estate planning is in reasonably good shape. She has established a testamentary trust within her will. The trust takes effect on death and acts and part of her will.

Presumably the needs of her son and the eventual distribution of assets to him is taken care of under the terms of the testamentary trust. One concern to note here is that because the trust is established within the will, it will remain a part of the probate process under Michigan law until all of the assets have been distributed.

THIS MAY create additional cost and delay under the probate process. At some point Woods may want to consider modifying her estate plan

by executing a revocable or "living" trust to replace the testamentary trust. The living trust, because it is a separate document from her will, will not be a part of the probate process and therefore will not delay the closing of the probate.

TO THE extent assets are funded into the living trust prior to death, they can be controlled for the benefit of Woods and her son if Woods becomes incapacitated.

Except for disability insurance coverage, Woods' insurance picture is in good order. She currently has \$50,000 of life insurance coverage that, with other assets, is sufficient to provide for her son's needs should anything happen to her.

She also has full coverage for her home and automobile, including at least \$300,000 of liability coverage in each policy. She may want to review the collision coverage presently carried on her car.

BECAUSE IT is an older model (1983) with a value of just \$1,500, she might find it advantageous to drop the collision and comprehensive coverage on this auto. After paying the \$200 deductible on any claim, the maximum she could collect from the insurance company on this policy is \$1,300.

The significant premium cost of this coverage may not warrant the limited potential benefit. Once she buys a new car, she should add collision and comprehensive coverage for that car.

As the sole wage earner of the household, Woods realizes the need to protect her income stream in the event of her disability or illness. If she has no disability coverage available through her new employer, she should consider buying a personal policy covering their income needs until age 65. At her age, the premium should be affordable, and this would fill a major gap in her insurance picture.

ONE FINANCIAL weakness we see is the credit card debts that Woods maintains, and the high interest cost associated with the debt. Woods may want to consider establishing a home equity loan to repay all the credit card debt.

The interest rate on the loan would be lower and would be fully deductible for tax purposes. Care should be given with this strategy, and she should pay off this home equity loan in a two- or a three-year time frame if at all possible. She should resist the urge to extend the period for repaying this loan.

ANOTHER OF Woods' concerns is planning for retirement because she alone is responsible for her long-term financial security. She should be commended for thinking about this so early.

She is fundamentally in good financial shape and because she has the desire to begin providing for long-term financial security now, with proper planning she has a good chance of meeting her goals. Her most consistent method of saving over the most recent years has been to over withhold taxes from her wages. She then receives a lump sum tax refund and invests it.

THOUGH SHE knows that this is not the most advantageous way to save, it is a forced discipline that puts money aside that might otherwise be spent. Her refunds have been about \$2,000 per year.

If Woods believes that this is the only way she can set aside money for the future, she should continue this practice. But there may be other ways to reach the same objective, such as direct deposit of a portion of her income into a separate savings account.

Another plus for Woods is the profit sharing plan that her new employer maintains. Over time this

## Avon opens outlet store

Avon calling. Glamour and Gifts To Go, a modest shop off Middlebelt near Five Mile in Livonia, is the nation's first Avon outlet store, dubbed the "Avon warehouse" by founder and owner Chris Malinowski, 36. An Avon dealer, she conceived the retail shop idea after deciding the extensive traveling required of her as a door-to-door Avon saleswoman had to go.

"Every so often I come up with something innovative," she said of the idea that Avon corporate executives have called "ingenious."

Receiving Avon legal approval earlier this year, Malinowski launched the shop in April, slowly building a clientele of Avon aficionados who live in areas where there are no sales representatives.

Collectibles, limited editions of Avon ceramics, and a wide array of Avon-manufactured jewelry,

cosmetics, scents and lotions are all available at Glamour and Gifts. "Wanted" boards assist in matching customers with coveted hard-to-find merchandise.

Malinowski also sells Avon's current items, including videos on such topics as successful fishing and Mary Hart's Shape Up to an new line of MTV paraphernalia.

"HAVING BEEN in the business (Avon door-to-door sales) for five years, I knew quite a few of the girls (other saleswomen), and I knew they each had quite a lot of extra stock," Malinowski said.

For many, disposing of old stock was arduous and financially unsound.

The idea of an outlet sprang to life at a party of Avon reps last Christmas in the home of Jan Allen of Farmington. Allen, who took over her daughter's Avon route four years

ago, now works hand in hand with Malinowski.

Originally, Malinowski wanted to name the shop Chris' Avon To Go, but the idea was quashed by corporate officials. Now she has been given the green light to include "featuring Avon products" in all advertising.

"BUSINESS HAS been a little slow," Malinowski admits, but she expects things to pick up next month when Avon sales traditionally rev up in anticipation of the Christmas season.

Glamour and Gifts occupies 1,100 square feet of space in a storefront set back off Rayburn Street. The front of the shop features display cases full of such products as miniature Avon ceramics of Scarlet O'Hara or Elvis and bottles of Col-

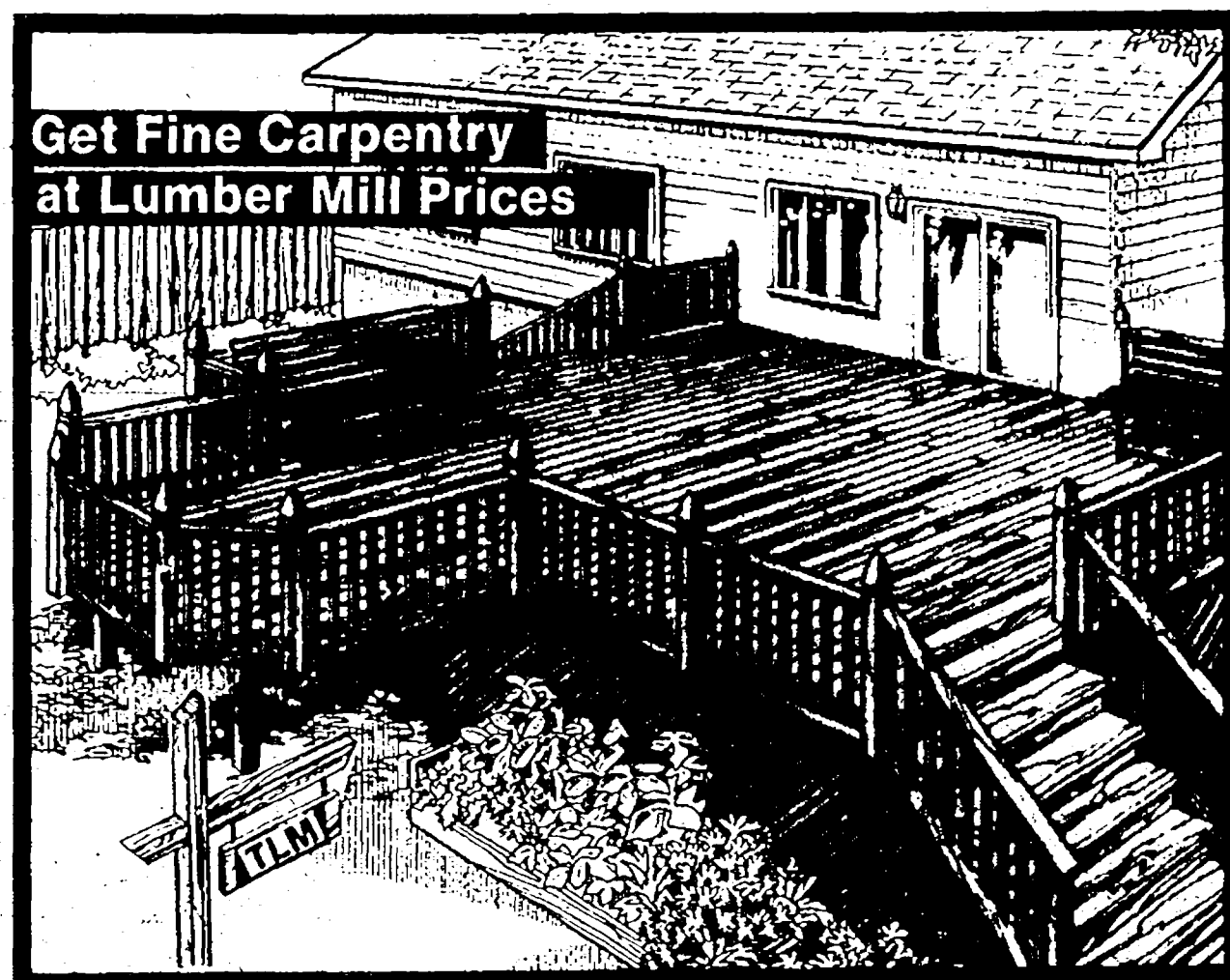

goph Booster that ABC TV's 20 Minutes called one of the better aging products on the market.

One shelf area is devoted to Skin So-Soft, a bath oil that discerning consumers realized early on was an excellent mosquito repellent. Sales of the lotion have been brisk, constituting a major portion of Malinowski's business.

In the back of the shop, Emma's Hair Salon features only Avon products. Sales of Spritz, an Avon styling mist for \$2.59 a bottle, have also been brisk.

"WHAT? AVON still exists?" an astonished guest said in the home of one of Malinowski's Livonia customers.

The comment, she said, is typical today because of the extreme shortage in door-to-door sales reps, particularly in high income areas like

Birmingham and the Bloomfields or in areas of high crime.

"Places like West Bloomfield are wide open. I get calls from all over, people who want products but who don't have a rep. Somehow they got my name," she said, adding the most surprising call came from a restaurant owner in Romulus.

The firm's newest advertising campaign centers around direct phone sales by calling 1-800-858-8000. Phoned orders from metropolitan Detroit are forwarded to an area manager who passes them along to sales reps. If none are available, she places the order with Glamour and Gifts.

Malinowski and Allen continue to service clients door-to-door but both urge customers to utilize the shop in hopes of one day discontinuing in-home sales entirely.

IN 1886, David McConnell, a door-

to-door book salesman in New York who gave female customers promotional bottles of perfume, realized the perfume was more popular than his books.

He founded the California Perfume Co., named for the romantic notion of a state he had never seen.

By the turn of the century, McConnell had in his employ a staff of professional perfumers who were busy manufacturing products that were advertised in monthly issues of Good Housekeeping.

From those humble beginnings grew Avon that in the first quarter of 1989 netted \$704 million. The firm employ more than one million sales representatives both here and abroad.

"Our mothers and grandmothers have been using Avon products for 103 years," Malinowski said, and she aims to see future generations continue the practice.

could provide a considerable retirement nest egg at no cost to her.

BUT A weakness we see is Woods' low cash reserves. When possible, she should bolster these reserves. We would suggest a target range of \$5,000 to \$5,000 in a money market account. By adding \$100 to \$200 per month to this fund, this goal could be reached within a couple of years.

Woods' modest portfolio is in reasonably good shape. But her individual stocks are not well diversified.

She should re-evaluate her holdings and liquidate shares where appropriate.

Proceeds might be allocated to more stable assets, such as treasury notes or high-quality corporate bonds. This would also provide her with some additional diversification.

BY PREPARING early and taking the steps necessary to meet goals set, Woods should be satisfied with the performance of her assets. She is well on her way to meeting her priorities of a good education for her son and a comfortable retirement

for herself.

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# Dad's taste improved with age

"No one in his right mind would pay \$1,000 for an automobile" was one of those pronouncements my father would make now and then to cool my adolescent yearnings for a Porsche, which I had already figured out would only be obtainable if I convinced him to buy one, and then I would borrow it.

I started thinking about my father's Oldsmobile as I started to write something about cars I have owned, which is when I realized my dad owned many more interesting cars than I ever did.

Another reason I started thinking about the cars my father owned was because I had to listen to another of those tired pronouncements about how youth has rejected not only Oldsmobiles, but Cadillacs, and most American iron in general in favor of a yuppie-mobile of choice — mainly high-performance sports sedans built somewhere north of France.

I REMEMBER when my father bought his first foreign car.

This was, in fact, after the Oldsmobile convertible, which was two-tone red and white, bought shortly

after he found himself single in middle age. It seemed the right vehicle to start pursuing the opposite gender a second time around.

The Olds followed a series of Cadillacs, which were considered good road cars that held their value, which followed a couple of Chevrolets. He wouldn't buy anything built by Chrysler after trying it once and finding the only reliable mechanic was at the Jefferson Avenue plant — a fact he brought up 30 years later when I bought a Dodge.

"YOU CAN'T get service," he warned. But I digress.

My dad bought his first foreign car when a friend's son in the Army in Germany got a good deal on a Volkswagen and offered to bring it back for my father.

What came back wasn't even a run-of-the-mill Beetle, but one of the first six Karmann Ghias imported into the U.S. Somehow the bright red, weird-looking car sans gas gauge, with its 25-horsepower, air-cooled motor in the rear struck a chord in my father's engineering heart, and that was the end of the Oldsmobile.

After that, foreign cars reigned, including one of the few targa-topped Hilman Minxes seen on North Woodward. In an odd sort of way, the McCosh household was preceding the current fascination with imports by a couple decades.

UNNOTICED BY me, however, my father was aging. While I was driving the VW to school and getting called out of study hall to get it off

the front steps where my classmates had a tendency to carry it in a course attempt at humor, the car's rough ride was getting him down.

Enter the 1965 Lincoln Continental, as big a reaction to the tiny foreign jobs as the VW was against the Oldsmobile.

The Lincoln had presence, mass, an incredible ride and more electronics than could be learned in an evening. It was the last car my father ever drove.

That wouldn't be so remarkable except he lived for another 20 years after buying that Lincoln. Eventually he owned three of them, all 1965s. As they aged, he repainted, reupholstered, and for a variety of reasons had to replace them, but always with a 1965.

MY SISTER, in fact, still has the last one, and still drives it when she isn't using her aging Japanese pickup.

Actually, the Lincoln wasn't the last vehicle my father bought. His stockbroker once related to me how he first met my dad, by then in his early 70s.

"He'd just come back from the beach, and he came roaring up to the office on that motorcycle," he said, without adding that by that time my father had trained his dog to ride on the back.

Now tell me again what car you are going to be driving after you retire.

Resumes serve many functions and should help employers identify and evaluate an applicant's career intentions, skills and experience. The best resumes employers receive clearly communicate what applicants want to do and can do for the companies considering them instead of merely presenting work history information. Understanding this fact makes the resume screening process a lot easier and less confusing for small business owners and managers.

Lola M. Coxford, in her book, "Resume Writing Made Easy for High-Tech," says employers should expect resumes to serve as a concise fact sheet that advertises an individual's qualifications and experience prior to being contacted for a personal in-

interview. PHILIP MEAGHER, president of the Southfield Chamber of Commerce, agrees with Coxford and adds that a well-written resume is like an appetizer that encourages employers to find out more about the applicant once his or her resume has been reviewed.

"Simply put, a good resume clearly states a person's career objective and then presents the facts indicating how he or she has gone about achieving that objective through past and present activities," Meagher said. "A recent college graduate may have little work experience in the field they hope to pursue but may belong to a club or volunteer group that is related to their area of interest. When this is the case, the information should be included in one's resume."

EMPLOYERS should also check for any inconsistencies that relate to an applicant's previous work experience. "If a person claims to have supervised 16 people but was employed as a clerk, there's good reason to be skeptical," Meagher said. Before arranging for an interview, employers should make a point to call at least one of the referenced organizations or contact people listed on the applicant's resume. This gives the employer an opportunity to discuss a candidate's skills and qualifications in more detail.

"IT'S OFTEN easier to get information about an applicant from other small business owners or personal reference sources," Coxford

said. "Larger corporations are now quite restricted about what can and cannot be said about former employees."

Typically, large organizations can only confirm a former employee's length of service, regardless of the circumstances surrounding a voluntary leave or termination.

## Hines Park wins; rain stops Caesars

The grass needed it, but Livonia Little Caesars baseball coach John Moraitis could have done without all the rain that fell Wednesday at Livonia's Ford Field.

Constant rain and mud halted Caesars game against Walter's Appliance with Caesars leading 6-0 in the third inning. The game, which will be made up in its entirety at noon Saturday at Ford Field, left the Livonia Collegiate Baseball League playoff picture looking equally muddled.

"We've got to play it by ear, now," Moraitis said. "I felt we'd get at least five innings in. This is going to screw up my pitching rotation now."

Hines Park Lincoln Mercury, tied for first place with Caesars before Wednesday, defeated Duffy's Plumbing 12-1 earlier in the day to improve its record to 21-5-1 and take a half-game lead over Caesars.

If there is a tie for first place after Saturday's game between Caesars and Walter's, Caesars and Hines Park will meet at 2:30 p.m. Saturday to decide who is seeded first in Sunday's four-team LCBL playoffs. The playoffs begin Sunday at noon.

Although Hines Park appears to have the upper hand, coach Dave Racer is taking the season's final innings one pitch at a time.

"One win don't mean a thing, if you don't win the next one," Racer said. "We're the little guy in this league. It seems everyone is pulling for Caesars. You read it in the papers — 'Caesars bombs someone, Hail Caesars.' We have to prove ourselves."

Hines Park proved it can back up the complete-game pitching of Dennis Szczechowski with timely hitting. Duffy's pitchers walked 13 batters and Hines Park got another banner day from Chris Sisler, who was 5-for-5 and drove in four runs. He has hit safely in 14 of his last 17 trips to the plate, a terrifying .824 clip.

"It's a good time for him to start," Racer

said. "All the boys are hitting well. I hope it continues."

Szczechowski allowed only three hits and struck out five Duffy batters. Duffy's only run came in the fourth when Chris Mussat drove in Mike Siwajek with a one-out single.

Steve Young, the first of three Duffy's pitchers, suffered the loss, allowing three runs, three hits and eight walks over three innings.

Caesars also was the beneficiary of wild pitching. Walter's coach Mike Keller said two of his pitchers weren't in uniform so he started seldom-used Marty Wolfe, who walked six of the first seven Caesars batters in the first inning.

Caesars knocked Wolfe out of the game in

the second, after Steve Malgay delivered the game's only real blow, a double down the left field line that scored Tim Napier from first base. Then came the rain. What a coincidence.

"We did a hell of a rain dance," joked Keller. "We feel fortunate. We'd like to beat them one of two. Hines Park sure would like us if we did and it would be gratifying."

Caesars assistant coach Ken Wandzel had the day's most clever idea while waiting through the rain delay.

"I'll tell you what we can do," said Wandzel. "We can all fly out on a jumbo jet and head to Toronto and have the Sky Dome down and play in no time."

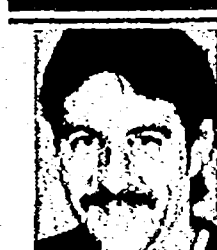
## Olympians motivate kids

CALL IT an investment in the future.

Because it will be years from now — perhaps as much as a decade — before the results are in. Maybe it'll happen at the Olympic Games in the year 2000; a 21-year-old will climb out of a pool moments after a gold medal-winning performance and plunge right into a TV microphone, announcing to billions:

"When I was 10, I met Mary T. Meagher and Dave Berkoff, and that really inspired me."

At least that's what all those Northwest Suburban Swim League and Michigan Stingrays officials, coaches and parents are envisioning. They're the ones responsible for bringing in the two Olympians for a

series of five clinics Tuesday and Wednesday in Bloomfield Hills, Beverly Hills, Farmington Hills and Lathrup Village.

Reasons for recruiting such distinguished athletes — Meagher, known as "Madame Butterfly," has won three Olympic gold medals and holds two world records; Berkoff won a gold and a silver in Seoul last year and has one world mark — to conduct several three-hour sessions can vary, from motivational to technical.

BUT THE REASONS don't matter any more than what the athletes actually said or did during the clinics. What really mattered was they were here. And in a sport like swimming, that is very important indeed.

First, understand the swimmer's dilemma. There are long (four or more hours a day), often boring, usually tedious, and mostly submerged workouts daily. Their only object seems to be to test an individual's mental and physical endurance.

And for what? There are no pro swim circuits. When college ends, so do most swim careers. Only the very elite swimmer (translated: Olympic gold medalists) can make money from swimming.

It is a sport requiring single-minded dedication to achieve national success. No other sport can interfere. There's no time for it. Top-grade swimmers train year-round.

No sport requires so much of its athletes and offers so little in return. Which is why it is so important to have people like Meagher and Berkoff pay visits.

DON'T MISUNDERSTAND. Both believe they are ordinary people, like anyone else in the crowds that gathered to see them. But they aren't. Suffice to say that Oakland County, Michigan's best for swimming, has yet to produce a swimmer the equal of these two Olympians.

When they talk about how to prepare for big meets, or training harder than hard, the gap between them and ordinary people widens. Listen to Berkoff, a Harvard graduate, explain what he enjoys about swimming:

"Money was never important to me. My happiness was important. And I was always happy in the water. Money shouldn't be a motivating factor to kids.

"To me, workouts are the greatest thing in the world. That's what I really miss. I don't miss the competing at all."

Does that sound ordinary? When Meagher related her experiences with the pressure surrounding the Olympic Games to a bunch of kids by saying "To me, it was no different than it was when I won my first national (event) when I was 10" — who could possibly identify? How many will even compete at a national meet, let alone win at one?

These are two athletes who experienced a greater degree of success by the time they were teenagers than most of their audience will in a

lifetime. As Meagher admitted, winning motivated her.

While success may not have come easily to them, there's no denying it came more often. Certainly more often than the average person experiences.

SO THERE was precious little the kids in the crowd could actually relate to, at least on a comparable athletic level. The gap separating the crowd and the Olympians was like the difference between an Escort and a Ferrari.

Even their advice on technique was too brief to be really useful. As Meagher said, "They may learn a few technical things, but I'd never take credit for a future butterfly. I don't expect to do miracles."

That's why their mere appearance outweighed anything they said or did. That's what made the gamble of bringing them into Detroit a good one for the NSSL and Stingrays.

A sport like swimming desperately needs ambassadors. It needs people like Meagher and Berkoff — and Rowdy Gaines, who appeared briefly at Farmington Hills Mercy earlier this year — as role models and

motivators.

Even if the kids in the crowds can't identify with Olympic experiences, or imitate a Berkoff Blastoff and dolphin-kick on their backs 25 meters underwater, at least now


they know such people do exist. They've met 'em, in the flesh.

And one day maybe, just maybe, one from the crowd will assume the ambassador's role.



## Concours D'Elegance

### Finally — automobile accepted as fine art

**A**RTIST PETE MAIER runs on as many cylinders as the vintage cars he paints and draws — Rolls-Royces, Duesenbergs, Packards, LaSalle, Mercedes and Auburns.

Maier, poster artist for the Concours d'Elegance at Meadow Brook Hall on Sunday, Aug. 6, is a man with a mission. When he left General Motors as senior designer for the Chevrolet, Pontiac and Cadillac divisions in 1980, to become a full-time artist, he was determined "to bring the automobile as a subject into the realm of fine art rather than illustrative art."

To do this, he traveled a circuitous route. He concentrated on subjects such as animals and people and moved to rural Pennsylvania, convenient to New York City.

He established himself as a versatile artist who delighted in doing larger than life paintings of cows and horses and still lifes as well as cars. He eventually found two New York City galleries ready to handle his work and promote him widely — Louis K. Meisel Gallery and Gallery Henoch.

recently bought one of his drawings for a record \$30,000, a distinct improvement from what his drawings and paintings used to sell for at the Shain Park arts fair when he was living in Troy and working for GM. When he works with classic cars as his subjects, he frequently will do the same basic subject in each of the five mediums in which he works, "Each one is handled in a different way," he said.

The size in which he works, the planning, detail and the techniques which he has developed since those early days of his career give him a special place in the art world. He has perfected a technique in his front views of cars of showing much more in seemingly perfect perspective than the human eye could possibly see.

This requires not only an intimate knowledge of the vehicle, but great technical and artistic skill as well. It's like a camera's fish-eye lens view or frog's eye perspective without any distortion. From a video which Maier made, it's clear that there's very little guesswork in this process.

"My auto paintings are the biggest being done in the world today. . . . The fine art world has accepted my autos as fine art — but, boy, that took a while." The largest is 6 by 7 feet and he plans to do side views in the 8 by 25 foot range.

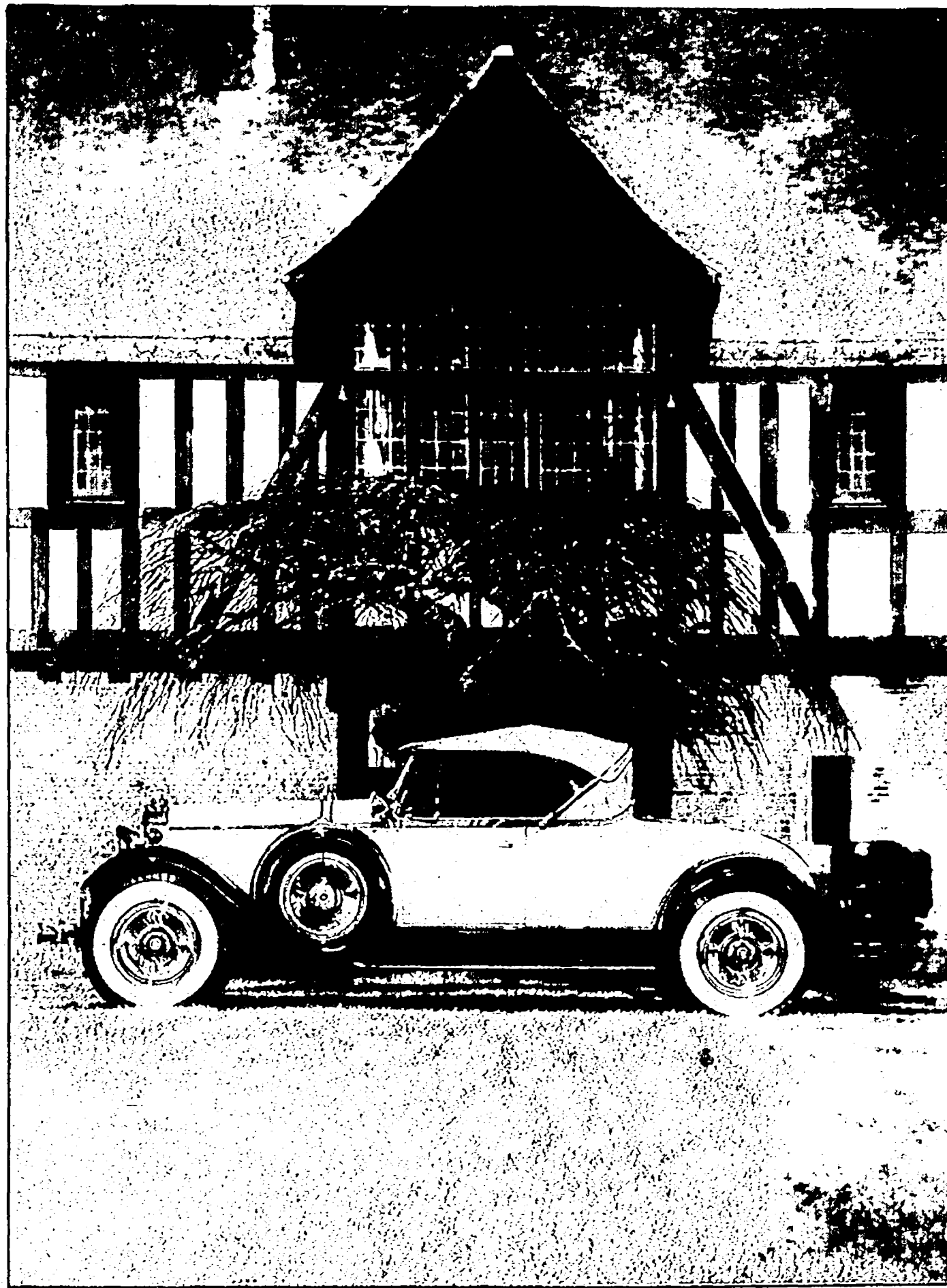
HE SAID HE HAS SOLD more than 400 paintings since he left GM in 1980, but he hasn't had a one man show — not because he hasn't been asked, but because everything he does sells so fast, he can't accumulate a body of work.

"It sometimes takes six to eight weeks to do one piece. The watercolor paper is imported from England on a roll. I build my own stretchers."

He said paper is affixed to the stretcher and every inch is wetted down before he begins.

His egg tempera painting for the Concours d'Elegance poster is 48 by 64 inches. He said, "I had a big frame made and I finished it up to sort of look like the architecture at Meadow Brook. It weighs 75 pounds." It will be sold at the special preview auction on Saturday, Aug. 5, before the Concours.

Maier builds his own frames as well as his own stretchers. He said that the big ones framed, properly

set back and ready for hanging weigh 185 pounds each.

Maier won the award of excellence at the 1987 Concours and among his awards is the Gold Medal of Honor from the Allied Artists of America and the Edgar A. Whitney Award from The American Watercolor Society. Dick Kughn of Southfield, longtime Concours committee member, classic car collector and exhibitor, is one of Maier's biggest patrons and currently owns more than 30 of his major pieces.

Maier learned last spring that Automobile Quarterly will be doing a full color ten-page write-up of his art for next spring's issue. While the publication has done illustrations in the past, he is the first fine artist to be featured.

TOM HALE OF Northville, who was also a GM designer before he left to become a full-time artist, is chairman of the art exhibition. Hale, like Maier, not only does paintings of cars, but handles a variety of other subjects adeptly as

well. He is one of 13 nationally recognized artists in this year's art exhibition at the Meadow Brook Pavilion.

Hale said the proceeds for last year's auction, which lasted about 30 minutes, were more than \$60,000. He predicts this year's will top that. Part of the proceeds from the preview auction will benefit Meadow Brook Hall.

The Concours is the largest annual single-day fund-raiser for Meadow Brook Hall.

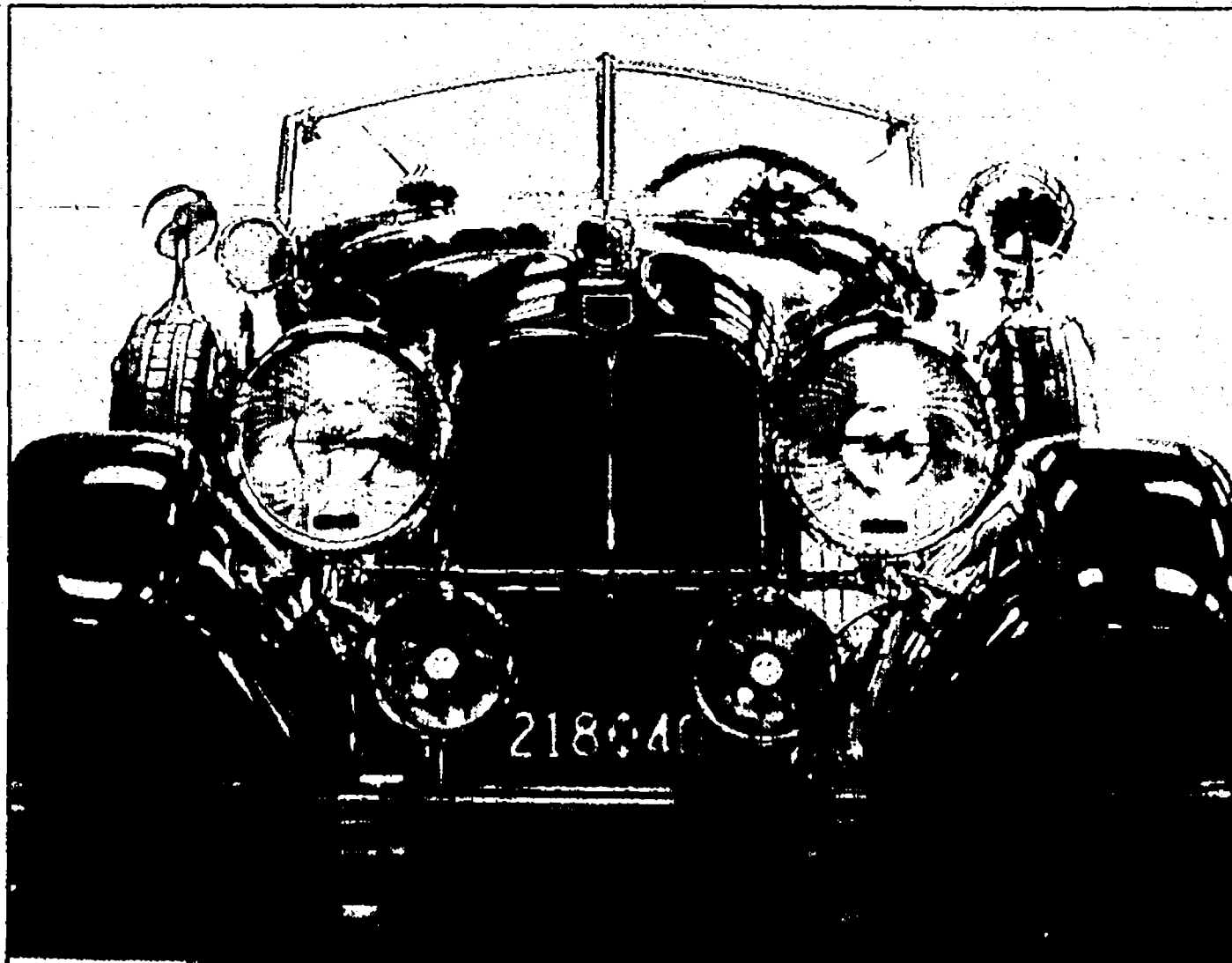

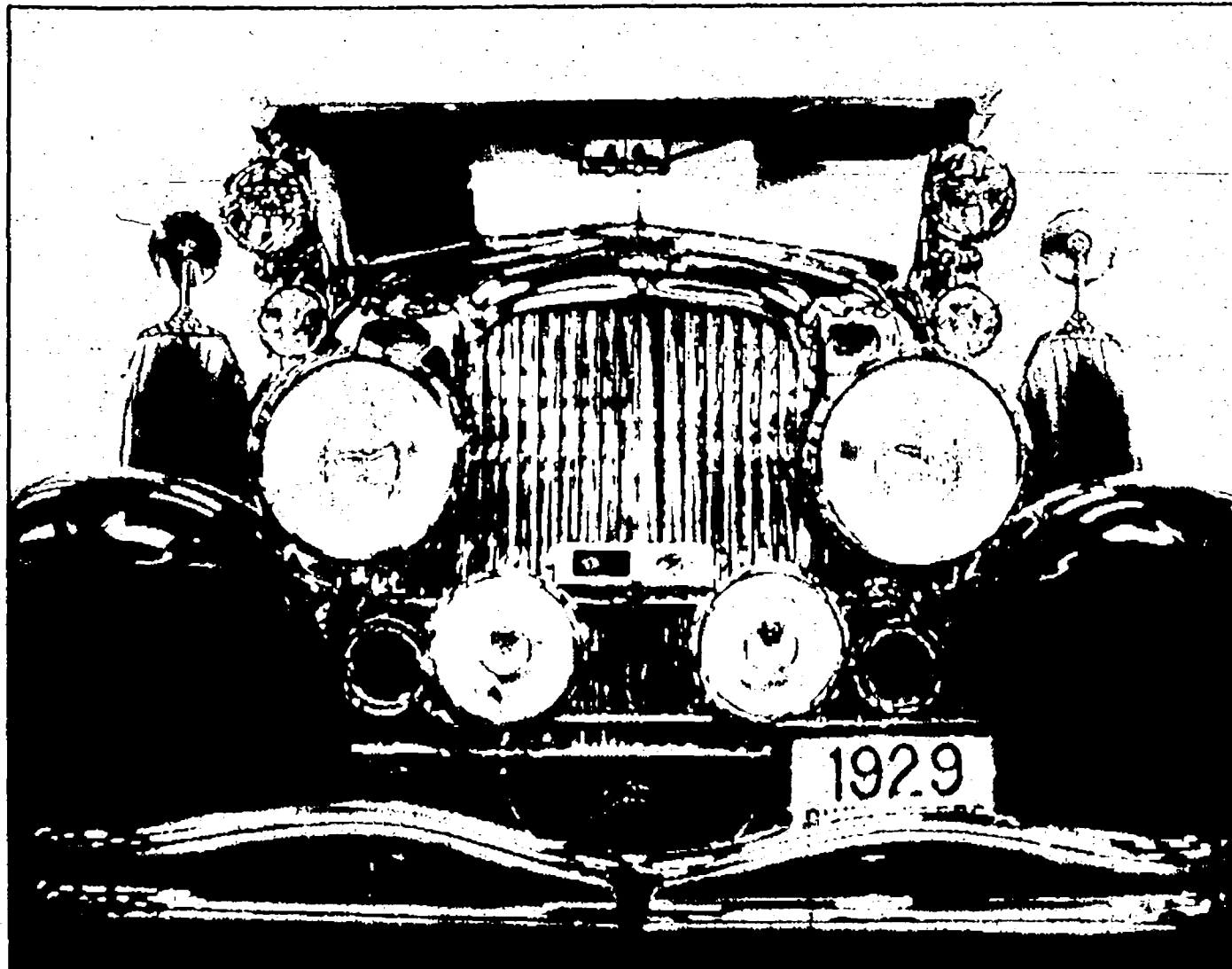

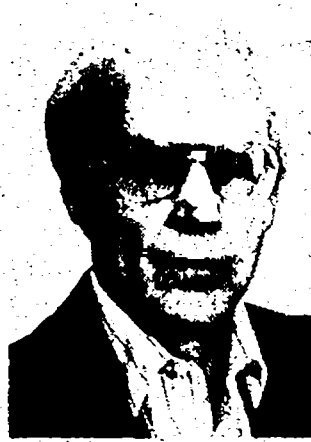

# Background can heighten impact

In past columns, I've mentioned the need for simple, plain backgrounds that don't distract from the main subject in your photograph:

Plain backgrounds direct the viewer's attention to the subject and normally result in greater impact in your shots.

But there are times when using the environment as a background will add extra dimension to your pictures, especially those of people.

A background can add information to a photograph of a person, particularly when the surroundings form his or her natural environment. A background can tell us something of a person's interests, job or social sta-

tus. Even though the person will invariably be the focal point, don't allow the background to dominate. The environment should always complement the subject, not overpower it.

Try placing your subject in the middle or near foreground for pleasing size proportions. For good composition, don't center the subject in the viewfinder and be sure your aperture is small enough to place both the subject and background in the camera's depth-of-field.

The photograph shown here was taken in Matamoros, Mexico. Notice how the little girl is without doubt the focal point of the photograph, but

In this case, the impact of the photograph is derived from the complementary background. Notice, too, how much information is conveyed by the background, how it helps to "tell the story."

As in all good photography, pay attention to lighting and camera angle

and choose the lens that will enable you to include all that you want in the viewfinder.

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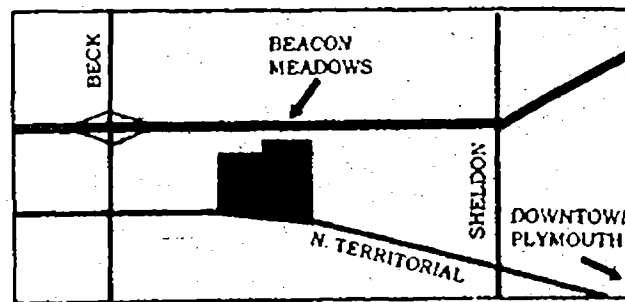
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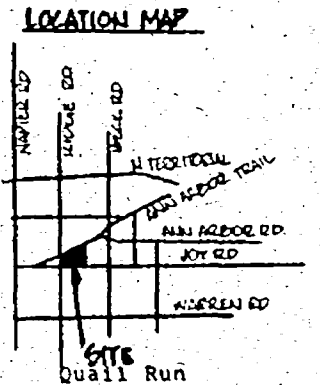
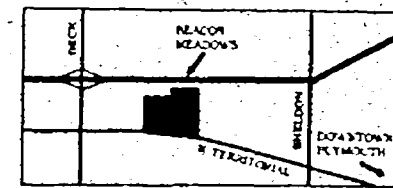

# '88 plates-of-the-year performance tracked

Plate of the Year and Market Performer for 1988 have been announced by Michelle Suttle, of Georgia's Gift Gallery, an information center for the Bradford Exchange, the world's largest trading center for limited-edition collector's plates.

Limited-edition plates are initially sold to collectors at issue price on the primary market. After an edition is closed, plates are bought and sold from one collector or dealer to another on the secondary market, where prices rise and fall depending on supply and demand.

After entering the secondary market in May 1988, "Pao-chai" — the first collector's plate from the People's Republic of China — generated a record level of trading activity and

appreciated 165 percent in value to \$74 by the end of 1988, according to Suttle. This performance earned it the title of Market Performer for 1988.

ARTWORK FOR THE plate was created by Zhao Hulmin. Produced by Imperial Ching-te Chen Porcelain. "Pao-chai" was the initial issue in the "Beauties of the Red Mansion" series.

Plate of the Year was "The Pintail" from Knowles China. This honor is bestowed on the collector's plate posting the largest secondary market gain in active trading during the preceding year. "The Pintail," which appreciated 310 percent over its issue price of \$19.50, was trading at \$80 by the end of 1988.

## Shuttle will get you to fair

The Ann Arbor Art Fair is taking place now through Saturday. The fair is 900 artists, artisans and craftsmen, outdoor entertainment and restaurants, sidewalk sales and displays — all in the small university atmosphere of Ann Arbor.

It is open from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. today and Friday and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Saturday. The best way to get the fair — and some say the only way to get to the fair — is the Ann Arbor Transportation Authority shuttle bus service operating from the Briarwood Mall and Pioneer High School parking lots.

The shuttles operate every 10 minutes and cost \$2 round trip. Children 7 and younger ride

free. The shuttles will take you to and from either end of the fair so you can walk from one end of the fair to the other and ride back to your car.

The transportation authority also provides circulation service within the fair. For the first time this year, the authority will use old-style trolley buses for the air fair circulator. The circulator is free to those who buy round-trip tickets on the shuttle and is 50 cents for all others.

Shuttle parking can be reached off I-94 at the State Road (No. 177) or Ann Arbor-Saline Road (No. 175) exits or from M-14 at the Maple/Miller Road (No. 2) exit. Posted signs will direct you to the lots.



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

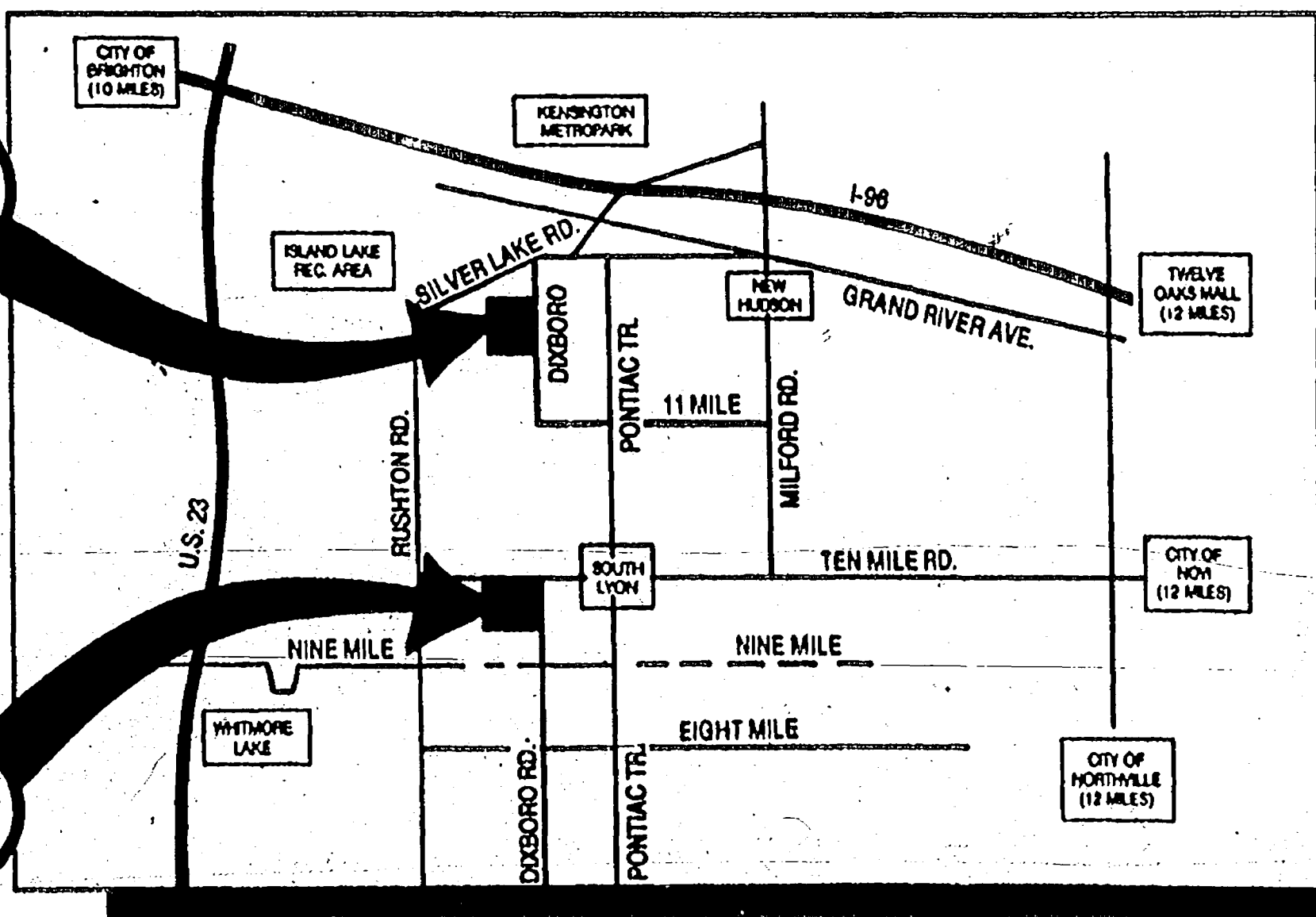

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# Inuit exhibit offers glimpse of Canadian Arctic

An exhibition of Inuit prints at the University of Michigan Museum of Art will offer a rare glimpse of one of the world's last traditional hunting cultures and celebrate the 30th anniversary of printmaking by the Inuit.

"A New Day Dawning: Early Cape Dorset Prints," on display through July 23, will exhibit 20 prints from the first five years of printmaking in the Canadian Arctic, featuring 16 artists.

"The artists represented form an important group, and the images are diverse in nature, illustrating the day-to-day activities and the mythologies of the Inuit peoples," said

Graham Smith, interim director of the museum of art.

"Many of the early Cape Dorset artists were women, and their vision provides a particular insight into the

lives and beliefs of the Eskimo peoples."

Prior to 1959, the Inuit had a long tradition of carving in ivory and stone but no knowledge of printmaking. Canadian artist James Houston introduced printmaking into the Arctic and, under his encouragement, the Inuit produced carvings and lat-

er prints for exhibition throughout the United States.

Along with Houston, U-M regent emeritus Eugene B. Power encouraged the Inuit to pursue printmaking and established Eskimo Art Inc., through which the Inuit could distribute and market their works. Power and his wife have donated

two prints from their personal collection to the U-M Museum and loaned others for the upcoming exhibit.

Marion Jackson, associate dean of the U-M School of Art and expert on Inuit Art, assisted the museum in organizing the exhibit. She has written the catalogue for the exhibit.

**Q.** We are building a new home. The house will have 4,000 feet of living space. Our ceilings are nine and 10 feet high. The floors will be marble. We like a contemporary look.

**A.** We now have two navy blue leather sofas in our living room. Can we use them in our new home with marble floors? Our interior designer has suggested raised panel doors, crown moldings and various trims. Are these appropriate for our new home?

**A.** You may use your leather sofas with the marble floors. However, since you have used them in your living room, why not change and try them in your library or family room? I agree with your interior designer on the various trims for architectural detail. The sleek lines of modern or contemporary are a wonderful surprise with the traditional trim.

**Q.** My under curtains in my living and dining rooms are dacron-polyester. I was told the fabric is machine washable. Should I try to do them myself?

**A.** If your curtains have a rod pocket you

should have no problem handling them. If they are pinch pleated, I suggest sending them out. I personally have sent my curtains and draperies to the Custom Drapery Cleaners in Hamtramck. They do a wonderful job — they not only remove them, but rehang them as well.

Very frequently I am asked how long one should wait to have curtains and draperies cleaned. My answer is that unlined curtains should be done once a year. Lined draperies that are vacuumed frequently can go for two to three years.

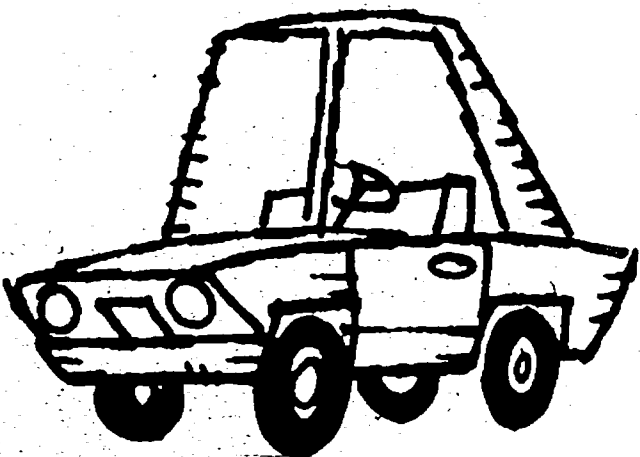
**1. Give the reader specific information.** Pretend you are someone reading the classifieds. What would you like to know about the item, service or job you are advertising? Be sure to add details such as color, size, condition, brand name, age, features and benefits. Be accurate! Don't embellish your ad with misleading information. Stick to the facts and reap the rewards!



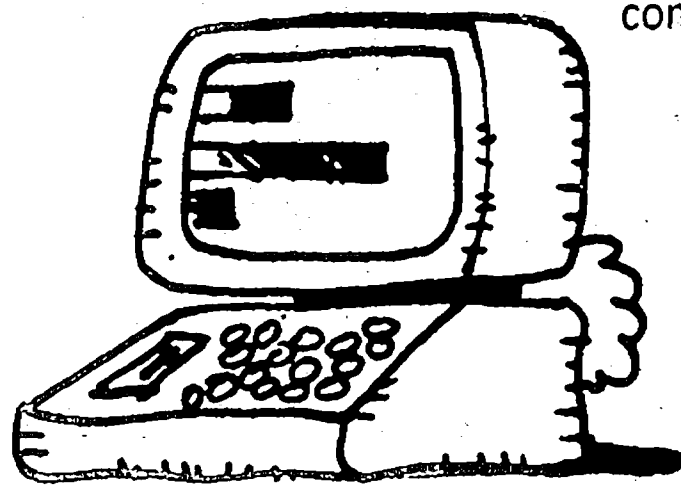
**2. Include the price.** Don't waste your time or a potential buyer's time. If you advertise the price of the item or service you offer, the people who respond to your ad will be those who are genuinely interested. Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.



**3. Avoid abbreviations.** Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WSW (white side wall) tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.



**4. Include phone number and specify hours.** Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a sale!



**5. Run on consecutive days.** Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative.


