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Former UAW official faces gun charge

Westland man called 'police groupie'

A 52-year-old Westland man, described by one law enforcement officer as a "police groupie," was arrested in Canton late Saturday and charged with carrying a concealed weapon.

The suspect, Richard Debs, also had a cache of police paraphernalia in his late-model Cadillac, according to a Canton Township Police report.

He was arraigned on the charge and released on \$5,000 bond. He faces a preliminary hearing Friday in 35th District Court.

Debs, a former president of Local

1776 of the United Auto Workers, was carrying a semiautomatic handgun and a 3 1/2-inch military style knife when police arrested him about 11 p.m. at the White Castle restaurant on Ford Road. Police had been dispatched to the eatery on a report of a suspect impersonating an officer.

DEBS WAS wearing a blue shirt that had "Police" imprinted on it and a patch that said "Michigan Po-

lice," the report said. He also had a Van Buren Township Police identification card in his pocket and a deputy chief badge in a badge wallet. Debs told police he was on "reserve status" with the Van Buren police, but the chief of that department denied that assertion.

Debs was employed on a part-time basis as a Van Buren officer from the fall of 1981 until the spring of 1982, according to Van Buren Township Police Chief Joseph Davies.

After impounding Debs' car, Canton authorities found a police scanner, a blue police portable flashing light and an "official Wayne County Sheriff's Department" placard on his dashboard, the report said. They also found a Wayne County sheriff's badge, picture identification card and cap in the car and a 12-gauge shotgun in the trunk.

Police also confiscated from the car a military identification card that bore Debs' picture but another

man's signature and a partially filled out Van Buren Township police identification card.

Davies said he has gotten "numerous reports" in the last couple of years of Debs claiming to be a Van Buren officer. Debs was arrested in July in Anaheim, Calif., on a charge of impersonating an officer, Davies said. He is due back in California later this month for a hearing on that charge.

TONY SHANNON, director of

training for the Wayne County Sheriff's Department, and Canton police said there have been several similar incidents involving Debs in the state.

Debs was not charged with impersonating an officer in Saturday's arrest because he "never displayed it (the identification card) in a way so as to impersonate an officer," Canton police Detective Charles Raycraft.

Shannon said the county badge found in Debs' car Saturday was the type distributed in the mid-1970s by former county Sheriff William Lucas.

Resident shot, older sister and father charged

A Westland man and his daughter were charged Monday in connection with an apparent botched murder-suicide plan against the man's other daughter at the family's Wildwood home.

Police said the intended murder victim, 32-year-old Anna Kwiatkowski, was shot twice in the head from close range with a .32-caliber handgun Sunday afternoon. Kwiatkowski survived the shooting and was reported in serious condition Tuesday at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital, Ann Arbor.

Valentine William Kwiatkowski, 78, was arraigned by 18th District Court Judge Gail McKnight on one count of assault with intent to commit murder and one count of possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony.

Carol M. Kwiatkowski, 43, was charged with one count of assault with intent to commit murder.

Not guilty pleas for both were entered by the court. They were re-

manded to the Wayne County Jail in lieu of a \$50,000 cash bond for each.

A PRELIMINARY examination was set for 9 a.m. Monday and McKnight ordered court-appointed attorneys for the pair, who said they don't have the money to pay for their defense.

The two defendants, joined by handcuffs, appeared bewildered and slightly disheveled at Monday's arraignment. The father, who spoke with a mild eastern European accent, asked McKnight to repeat and explain the charges.

The attempted murder charge is punishable by a maximum of life in prison. The felony firearms charge carries a maximum two-year sentence.

The victim, who weighs about 350 pounds and suffers from "substantial health problems" including asthma, was asleep when shot about 1 p.m., said executive Lt. Michael Frayer.

When she was still alive 90 minutes later, the two took her to the hospital, Frayer said.

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Group sues mall to force book sale

A pro-life organization will go to court to try to force Westland Center to reinstate Saturday's used book sale on the mall's lower level.

Right to Life-Lifespan of Metro Detroit filed suit in Wayne County Circuit Court Monday against the mall and its operator, Center Companies of Southfield.

The Livonia-based pro-life group is expected to ask for an emergency hearing by the end of the week in an effort to hold the fund-raising sale as scheduled.

"Our plans are still on hold," Alice Radwick, Right To Life' president,

said Tuesday. "We haven't looked at any alternate sites."

The lawsuit accuses the mall of breaking an agreement to provide space for the fund-raiser last week after it received several telephone calls threatening boycotts and other disruptive actions by pro-choice supporters.

The suit claims the breach of contract "will result in substantial profit being lost" to the group and that the mall is liable for those damages, a spokeswoman for attorney Robert Van Cleef said Tuesday. Van Cleef, who is representing Right To Life, was out of town and unavailable for comment.

No specific damage amount is listed, according to the spokeswoman.

CATHERINE O'MALLEY, director of management services for Center Companies, said Tuesday she hadn't seen the lawsuit and declined to comment.

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Condo project OK'd, residents complain

Residents along the city's southwestern border are going to have new neighbors, whether they want them or not.

The Westland City Council Monday approved — with some late revisions — the preliminary site plan for a \$30 million detached condominium development bounded by Palmer, Glenwood, Newburgh and Hix.

More than 150 people, including dozens of Westland and Wayne residents who live adjacent to the project site, packed the council chambers to voice their opinions during a 2 1/2-hour public hearing and council debate on the Windmill Acres development.

Late arrivals in the overflow crowd found themselves confined to the second-floor lobby in city hall, where they complained that they couldn't hear the proceedings. A lobby speaker was removed from the public address system last year when the building was remodeled.

THE 74-ACRE development will feature 345 detached "New England-style" condominiums. Developers are Delcor Associates, PM Equities and Bernard Gleiberman of West Bloomfield. Progressive Associates of Bloomfield Township is the architect.

Concerns expressed by nearby residents ranged from how the develop-

Proposed sale of park land protested

With picket signs and pamphlets, a group of Westland residents is fighting a proposal to sell off a portion of Hines Park.

Residents of the Sunflower Valley subdivision picketed in the Wayne County park last weekend and say future protests are possible. Their goal: block the sale of 40 acres of park land abutting their homes.

The county is considering selling the land to Hawthorne Valley Golf Course. The Westland-based course seeks to add nine additional holes.

The county would receive an estimated \$200,000 for the land, and use

the money used to buy or improve other park land.

Those plans, however, met with disapproval from subdivision residents.

"WE'RE CONCERNED about golf balls flying through our yards," said Penny Lezak, who helped organize Sunday's protest.

"We're concerned about the loss of ball diamonds," she said. "We're also concerned about the run off from pesticides and fertilizer. The Rouge River is polluted enough as it is."

Subdivision residents were scheduled to meet this week to discuss their future plans.

"We may picket again," Lezak said. "But we've also called the

county commission asking for a public hearing on the issue."

About 30 families are involved in the protest, she said.

County parks director Hurley Coleman called the protest "premature."

"NOTHING'S BEEN decided yet," he said. "We were approached with an offer and we're considering it."

"While these people have the right to protest, we also have the right to consider an offer, as we would for any county resident who approached us," Coleman said.

A hearing before the Michigan Department of Natural Resources was held in early July.

At that hearing, the DNR accepted

verbal and written comments on the land sale. It is reviewing those comments before issuing findings on whether the sale would be environmentally acceptable.

At this point, it isn't certain when the DNR will issue its findings, although department spokesman David Pingel indicated they may be issued about Oct. 12.

Hawthorne Valley seeks to restore an 18-hole golf course at its Merriman Road site. It has been a nine-hole course since a previous owner sold off golf course property for homes.

The course seeks to build five new ponds to offset the loss of wetlands, according to course architect Matthews and Associates of Lansing.

"It was a status type of thing," said Shannon. He said Lucas, like law enforcement officials nationwide, deputized citizens as a way of giving supporters "a little bit of prestige."

Shannon said Debs "carried a lot of clout with the unions and in the political arena" at the time.

"Basically, he's a police groupie," said Shannon. "There's a lot of people who like that stuff but were never able to achieve" such a position.

"It happens."

DEBS IS employed at the General Motors Hydramatic plant in Ypsilanti. He was ousted as president of the UAW local there in the last election.

Shannon said police badges, radio scanners and flashing lights can be purchased at military equipment stores or through police equipment distributors.

"It's not against the law to buy any-of that," he said. "I always tell people to ask for ID cards because anybody can get a badge."

Davies said the hiring of Debs in 1981 created a political uproar that ended with his resignation.

Debs was appointed to the part-time post and was promoted "within weeks" to police commander, the second-in-command spot in the department.

"I believe there was something political in that," said Davies, who was a patrolman in the department at the time.

After a series of articles about Debs appeared in a Detroit newspaper, pressure was put upon the Van

Buren township board and Debs resigned.

Debs was indicted but was not convicted in a 1983 corruption case that involved Westland District Court Judge Evan Callanan. Callanan, his son and a Dearborn businessman were convicted in connection with case fixing.

Debs sued Van Buren Township in 1984 and a judge ordered that he be put on inactive reserve. Davies said that was not done because Debs failed to show up to take the required tests.

ment would affect their property values to whether nearby schools could handle additional students and how the police and fire departments will cope with more development in the area.

In the past month, different groups of residents have circulated petitions either supporting or opposing the proposed development.

"It's very hard to remain calm when you're dealing with an emotional issue that affects the lives of hundreds of people," said Pam Phillips, who was opposed to the project.

"I'm concerned about the kind of education my kids and those that move into the area will be getting," said Bernard Rich, also an opponent. "The quality is bound to go down as the schools become more crowded."

Both Schweitzer Elementary School and Stevenson High School, which currently serve the neighborhood, should be able to accommodate additional students as families move into the development, according to Dennis O'Neill, Wayne-Westland Community Schools superintendent.

O'NEILL, IN a letter to the council, said declining enrollment in the district pushed enrollment at Schweitzer to 615 pupils last year, down from a high of 740 in 1969. Stevenson has experienced a similar decline, he said.

Students could be shifted to other schools and portable classroom units — used at Schweitzer several years ago — would be available if needed, O'Neill said.

Others homeowners supported the development.

"We've done a good job trying to keep up our property," said one resident. "This will enhance it and offer affordable housing for younger and older people."

The developers said they plan to market the condos to young couples and retirees. The two- and three-bedroom units with one-car garages will range from \$70,000-\$100,000, they said.

Site plan changes requested by the council included elimination of units under 1,000 square feet. The plan approved Monday calls for 115 units of 1,050-1,200 square feet and 230 units of 1,200-1,400 square feet.

DEVELOPERS ALSO agreed to build all units with basements and

increase the amount of vacant land between the development boundary and homeowners on its eastern edge from 35 to 60 feet.

Thomas Artley was the only council member who voted against the amended plan. Artley, citing concerns for increased traffic, said the project lacked proper acceleration and deceleration lanes at its entrances.

Council members Charles Pickering and Ben DeHart also expressed concerns, but voted in favor of the amended plan. DeHart said the changes were necessary to "upgrade the community."

The first units should be ready for occupancy early next year, developers said.

Woman shot, family charged

Sgt. Robert Barthold told the court Monday that while in the hospital, Carol Kwiatkowski told her sister that her father had shot her. Although neither defendant has a previous criminal record, Barthold asked the court for a high bond because "it appears they discussed a suicide pact."

POLICE SAID mounting health care costs for Anna Kwiatkowski, who is unemployed and a volunteer at the hospital, appeared to play a role in the case.

The father is a retired General Motors employee. Carol Kwiatkowski works for Detroit Edison.

The pair reported to hospital workers they had no insurance and could no longer afford Anna Kwiatkowski's medical bills, Barthold told the court.

Police said Monday that Anna Kwiatkowski was an invalid, although a neighbor said she wasn't confined to the house.

"I've seen her out running errands in the car," said Kevin McKenna, 15. "The three of them were always together."

McKenna said the family has lived in the neat ranch house on Wildwood, north of Hunter, ever since his family moved to the neighborhood 10 years ago. Valentine Kwiatkowski has sold raffle tickets to members of his family, McKenna said.

On Monday, a hand-lettered sign advertising "Flower Arrangements for Sale" was visible against the backyard fence.

THE VICTIM had no knowledge of the plan, which was apparently devised in advance by her father and sister, Barthold told the court.

The elder Kwiatkowski was reportedly admitted to Westland Medical Center Wednesday night after complaining of stomach pains.

Police said Valentine Kwiatkowski purchased a large freezer from an appliance store last week and the pair planned to hide the corpse inside to prevent the decomposing body from drawing suspicion to the house.

Radwick said the group received the center's approval in a phone call to hold the sale several months ago. The group purchased \$2 million in liability insurance, as requested, she said.

O'Malley admitted last week that the sale was originally approved, but said the approval was the result of a "mix-up." She said the mall marketing director, who granted the approval, wasn't authorized to do so.

Some 2,000 books have been donated for the sale, according to Radwick. They are being stored in a private garage.

The group, which has 10,000 members in the tri-county area, has used the mall for previous fund-raising activities.

Or the 280 children and their parents who flocked to the program's "grand finale" last week at the Wayne Community Center.

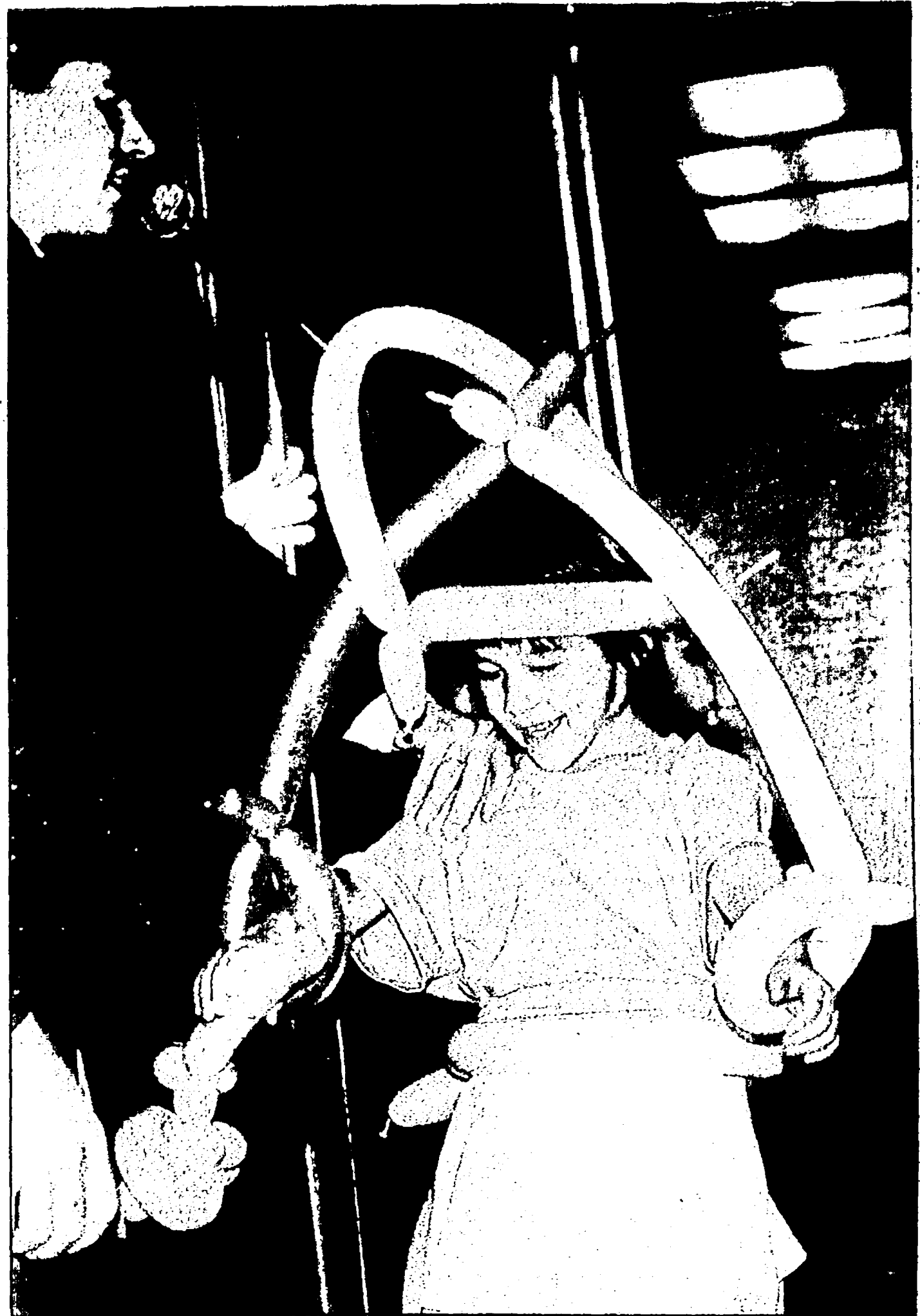



POLICE confiscated a semi-automatic pistol loaded with 18 rounds of ammunition from an Inkster woman Saturday in an incident at an apartment complex on the 6600 block of Yale.

Nobody was injured in the incident, police said.

Officers were called to the complex at 5:24 p.m. by a resident who said the woman was running between buildings screaming about her boyfriend, who also lives in the apartment complex.

When questioned by police, the woman originally said her 26-year-old boyfriend was a drug dealer and that he had assaulted her and threatened to kill her and other residents of the complex. But the woman, who police said had a history of emotional problems, changed her story several times and eventually told police her boyfriend "would never hurt me."

The woman was taken to the Psychiatric Intervention Center near Westland Medical Center for observation, police said.

A RESIDENT of the Venoy Pines apartments, Venoy near Cowan, told police thieves made off with more than \$3,000 in guns, jewelry, entertainment equipment and collectible items from his apartment last weekend.

Police were alerted to the burglary by an apartment complex employee who saw the interior of the ransacked apartment through an open window.

The break-in occurred between 5:30 p.m. Friday and 9 a.m. Saturday while the resident was out of town, police said.

Among the missing items was an 1890 U.S. silver dollar, worth approximately \$20, and \$600 worth of collectible whisky bottles, the resident said.

Stolen firearms included four shotguns, a rifle and a .22-caliber, semiautomatic handgun.

Police said the culprits apparently pried open a screen over the kitchen window to enter the apartment. A screwdriver that police believe was used to pry open the screen was confiscated as evidence.

The Freeland rescue operation was just great. But residents near the CSX railroad in that Saginaw County village told state legislators Monday to make sure tank cars carrying hazardous chemicals don't derail in the first place.

"Once an accident has happened, the system has failed — regardless of how good the evacuation is," George Blackhurst of nearby Midland told a House panel chaired by Rep. James Kosteva, D-Canton.

"To them, it (a crash) is just one of the costs of doing business," said Wayne Ziegler, a Freeland resident who attacked CSX's safety record as the worst per mile in American railroading.

"Freeland is a 5 or 6 on a scale of 1 to 10," said Tom Horrigan, spokesman for Citizens Against Toxic Trains (CATT), a group formed after an April 25 derailment in Oakland County's Highland Township. "Think in terms of a Saginaw, a Detroit, a Grand Rapids," he said.

A STANDING room only crowd jammed the Tittabawassee Township Hall for more than three hours to emphasize preventing the kinds of accidents that occurred July 22 when 40 were injured and 3,000 evacuated for several days.

Fourteen cars of a CSX train went

off the track at 11:25 that morning, including three carrying Dow Corning hazardous chemicals.

Kosteva, whose western Wayne County district is criss-crossed by railroads, said lawmakers first want to assure "the quickest and best possible response" — labeling of tank cars, proper records of what trains are carrying and training of employees.

Second, the state needs to see what it can do to oversee rail safety, despite federal pre-emption of that field, Kosteva said.

To Rep. Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion, the mystery was why the rail cars broke open and burned. "The cars are built to withstand crashes," said the northern Oakland lawmaker. "That should be the focus of legislation."

Rep. Jan Dolan, R-Farmington Hills, learned from a CSX manager that there is testing of employees for drug and alcohol use after a crash.

Dolan asked about the crash's effect on wildlife and was told by a Department of Natural Resources official that no deaths of birds or deer were attributed to the crash. Most residents near the crash site have city water, although DNR said there might be some danger to those with shallow wells.

Rep. Willis Bullard Jr., R-Highland, whose district saw an April 25 derailment, blistered CSX for having an incomplete list of chemicals

aboard that so-called "death train."

Replied Al Crown, CSX Transportation's divisional manager: "A clerk's error was in not notifying the train crew by radio" that a car had been added, but there was accurate information at the CSX terminal.

SPOKESMEN FOR the Michigan State Police, Saginaw Sheriff's Department, CSX and Dow Corning heaped praise on Bill Kirchner, chief of the 24-member volunteer fire department in Tittabawassee Township, a rural community of less than 5,000. Kirchner chaired the cooperative rescue effort.

"Everyone pulled together. Fantastic. No injuries to rescue workers, no property damage," said James Kelly of the Sheriff's Department.

"There was immediate response — in minutes," said Pat Haley, Kirchner's deputy. CSX and Dow Corning personnel were on the scene within a half hour and could read labels on tank cars through binoculars despite the fire. "The system worked," Haley said.

"We're working with the petroleum industry to build a center for training in Lansing by the first of the year," said Lt. Arthur Nash Jr. of the State Police fire marshal division.

"In 18 months, we've trained more than 4,000 emergency handlers," said Capt. Arlen Brower of the State Police emergency management division. But Brower said federal fund-

ing has run out and wasn't renewed for fiscal 1990.

RESIDENTS OF Freeland and nearby Midland had their agenda for legislators:

- An executive order of a 25 mph speed limit for trains carrying hazardous chemicals. The CSX Freeland train was traveling 37.

- A state fund to help communities pay for firefighting, traffic control, evacuation and cleanup when a disaster occurs. "Our budget is blown out of the water," said deputy chief Haley. A resident reported that an Ohio city hadn't been reimbursed by CSX a full year after a crash there.

- No legal limit on dollar liability, even after residents had signed agreements for compensation from the railroad, because of the possibility that ill effects might not show up immediately.

- More frequent and more stringent track inspection. "The Federal Railroad Administration doesn't have the manpower or budget to safely inspect these rails," said resident Kim Maxwell.

- "Lessen our dependence on products made with hazardous chemicals. Use the marketplace," said Ann Hunt of Citizens for Alternatives to Chemical Contamination.

- Better construction of tank cars. "The CSX cars exceeded federal standards," said Kathy Garthoff of Concerned Citizens in Freeland.

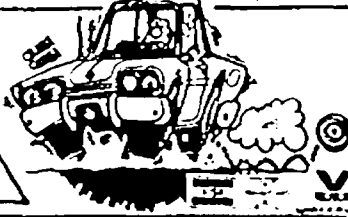
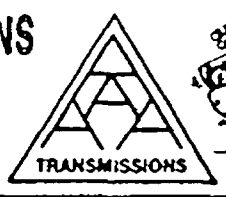

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SEMCOG chief aims to promote recycling

Every Wayne County household would have to begin recycling under newly proposed changes to the county's master plan for solid waste disposal.

Milton Mack, chairman of the county's Solid Waste Implementation Committee, said he was strongly considering several changing the county plan to boost recycling.

A key element of Mack's proposal would restrict county landfills from accepting unseparated trash. Trash separation is a necessity for any recycling program. Under such a program, households would be forced to put selected items in separate trash containers.

THE GOAL, Mack said, is to force consumers to recycle waste items that can be recycled — including pa-

per, plastic and glass products — while leaving landfills open only for those products that cannot be recycled.

The proposed landfill restrictions would force communities to develop recycling programs, Mack said. It would also de-emphasize the 50 percent cut in county waste currently projected in the still-to-be adopted master plan.

The idea, he said, came from a recent waste handling symposium he attended.

"We've been looking at numbers. But in talking to people from eastern states like New York, New Jersey and Connecticut, I've found numbers weren't as important as getting a system in place that will work," Mack said. "Recycling, I believe, will work."

Under the previous plan, communities would have to cut waste 50 percent from current levels by the year

200 in order to continue using county landfills.

Mack, D-Wayne, is a four-term county commissioner whose district includes Canton Township. He is also chairman of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments. As SEMCOG chief, he said, he would try to promote regional recycling programs.

Local governments, especially those in western Wayne County, had complained that mandating a percentage cut in trash would force them to build costly and controversial incinerators.

Plymouth Township supervisor Maurice Breen said Mack's proposal would represent a welcome change.

"IN CONCEPT, I don't have a problem with it," said Breen, who oversees waste issues for the Conference of Western Wayne. "What he's trying to do is take the emphasis off burning."

The CWW is an intergovernmental group representing 17 communities, including Livonia, Westland, Garden City and Plymouth, as well as Canton, Redford and Plymouth townships.

Bill would make criminals pay fee

Every convicted felon and drunk driver would pay a \$30 fee to compensate crime victims under a bill passed by the state Senate.

The bill goes back to the House of Representatives to see if they will agree to Sen. Doug Cruce's amendment to bring drunk drivers into the program.

"This will provide funding for the crime victims rights' program," said Cruce, R-Troy, referring to the constitutional amendment approved by voters last year.

No area senators opposed House Bill 4869 as it passed 31-0. Sen. Richard Fessler, R-Commerce, had an excused absence. Sen. George Z. Hart, D-Dearborn, missed the roll call.

THERE WAS NO immediate estimate of how much would be raised for the program because the

bill was amended extensively in a Senate committee.

The bill establishes a six-member Criminal Assessments Commission under the Department of Management and Budget.

The panel would investigate and determine what is needed to pay for crime victims' services, estimated currently at \$5.5 million annually by the Senate Fiscal Agency.

Whatever costs weren't covered by the fees would have to be made up by the general fund budget. But sponsors hope the fees will cover the costs.

It's one thing for the state Legislature to pass a law and another to collect the money. According to the staff analysis, several things could happen.

• Some courts may not order the assessment.

• Other courts may waive or reduce them, if the convicted person is unable to pay.

Teachers union backs half-cent hike in sales tax

Two leaders of the education establishment are going separate ways on the two state school tax proposals on the Nov. 7 ballot.

The Michigan Education Association is endorsing Proposal A, a half-cent increase in the 4 cents sales tax. The Michigan Association of School Boards is backing Proposal B, a 2 cents increase with part of the money going to property tax reduction.

"Supporting Proposal A is probably one of the most significant improvements for education in Michigan that could happen," said Larry Chunovich, the former Southfield math teacher who is MEA president.

CHUNOVICH said MEA is committing \$1.5 million to an estimated \$3 million campaign.

After the union's 60-member board unanimously endorsed the proposal last weekend in Sault Ste. Marie, it began a leadership conference to train 550 members on how to mount a campaign.

"Proposal A not only provides dollars for current programs, it sets standards for improved curriculum and decision making processes in the school system," he said. It would pump about \$400 million in new money into public schools.

Chunovich said Proposal A will help 90.3 percent of Michigan K-12 students and deliver more education money because it takes effect sooner.

Proposal A was developed by the so-called "Harden Commission" of business leaders, unions and educators. It is supported by Gov. James J. Blanchard.

If voters approve both proposals, the one with the most yes votes will become part of the Michigan Constitution.

PROPOSAL B was endorsed last week by the MASH, consisting of elected school board members.

It would raise the sales tax by 2 cents, bring schools \$460 in new rev-

enue and cut school operating property taxes a net of \$1.1 billion, or 33 percent on residences.

"It is clear to us that 'B' is the only proposal that addresses the overburden of property taxes on local taxpayers in Michigan," said Justin King, executive director of MASH.

The so-called "Nye-Oxender" plan, Proposal B would collect part of school property taxes statewide, resulting in tax base sharing between wealthy and poor school districts.

The Michigan League of Women Voters added its support to Proposal B last month, saying it would be the most effective way to raise the spending level of poor districts while permitting wealthy districts to maintain or even increase their spending levels.

Grant aims to reduce minority mortality rate

The Wayne County Health Department office in Westland was among 20 health agencies receiving grants under a new \$750,000 state program designed to improve the health of minority citizens.

The Westland office's grant is targeted toward reducing mortality rates for black adults from cardiovascular disease and stroke.

Other grants are targeted toward reducing infant mortality and increasing the number of minority workers in health care professions.

Minorities suffer significantly higher rates of cancer, cardiovascular disease, stroke, chemical dependency, diabetes, homicide, accidents and infant mortality compared with whites, state health director Raj Wiener said.

Michigan's minority population is approximately 1.76 million, including blacks, Hispanics, Arab-Americans, Asians, Pacific Islanders and American Indians. One out of five Michigan residents is a minority group member, Wiener said.

Area residents elected to county school board

Mary Blackmon of Detroit was elected president of the Wayne County Intermediate School District board at a recent WCISD meeting.

She replaces Canton resident Charles Akey, who served as president last year.

Blackmon is a former member of the Detroit Board of Education. Akey, a former Livonia Board of Education member, retains his seat as a WCISD trustee.

Other WCISD board members are: Armen Barsamian, Garden City, vice president; Kathleen Chorbaghan, Wayne, secretary; Boyd Arhurs,

Trenton, treasurer.

Chorbaghan is a member of the Wayne-Westland Board of Education. Barsamian is a former Garden City Board of Education member.

Board members are elected to six-year terms by a body consisting of one representative from each of Wayne County's 34 public school districts. Candidates may nominate themselves for the seat. A secret ballot election process is used.

Board meetings are held 8:30 a.m. the second Wednesday of each month at the WCISD Education Center, 33500 Van Born, Wayne.

Child care in crisis

County program costs skyrocket

Kim and Billy Miller, ages 3 and 5 respectively, have been in county protective custody since a recent rain storm, when neighbors reported the two youngsters were locked outside their home, a shabby apartment in a western Wayne suburb.

The children, neighbors said, often appeared hungry and dirty, neglected by their mother, Sharon, 22, a high school dropout who is known to abuse alcohol.

Sharon also suffers from depression, ever since her boyfriend, Kim's father, left last year. She was divorced four years ago from Billy's father whom she married after discovering she was pregnant. Both men were abusive and neither pays child support. Sharon's life is a constant struggle to make ends meet.

Jason, 17, was having trouble both at home and in school last year when he was attacked and seriously injured another youth. A ninth grader at the time, he was chronically truant from the suburban high school he attended. He lived with his mother and a stepfather he detested and with whom he regularly fought.

Convicted in juvenile court of assault and battery, Jason was confined to the Wayne County Youth Home for assessment.

The two incidents are not real. They are composites of actual cases, situations most common to social workers who work in suburban Wayne County.

Kim, Billy and Jason represent thousands of youngsters here who annually require alternative shelter

because of neglect, abuse or delinquency.

THE COST OF providing such care is Wayne County's "biggest fiscal hemorrhage," according to Jennifer Granholm, an executive assistant to Wayne County Executive Edward McNamara.

In the past three years, county costs have skyrocketed from \$21.8 million in 1986 to a projected \$46 million next fiscal year. Combined expenditures by Wayne County and the state have increased from \$10 million in 1986 for the abused and neglected to an expected \$20 million next year, and from \$12 million for delinquents in 1986 to a projected \$22 million in 1990.

This year, the county has budgeted \$36 million for child care expenses, a figure expected to fall \$3 million short, according to Granholm, who said the single most expensive item is housing which has increased in cost by some 21 percent since 1986.

"When we receive the monthly bills, we are constantly surprised at the increases," she said.

Orchards Children's Services, a private agency with facilities in Livonia and Southfield, provides group housing for 24 youngsters ages 8 to 17 years and individual foster home placement for another 300 children.

Orchards foster home residences, most of which are in the suburbs, is one of the least costly forms of alternative housing, according to the agency's financial officer Jennifer Bagley.

DAILY FOSTER home rates, set

by the state, range from \$10.85 to \$13.61 for children who have no special needs. For those with special difficulties, in need of counseling or other therapy, rates range from \$26.90 to \$29.66 daily.

Orchards operating budget this year is \$6.5 million. Upkeep on the agency's three group homes, aimed at maintaining state standards, is one of the more costly line items in the budget, according to Bagley, who said such costs have jumped 11 percent since 1986.

Spectrum Human Services, a Livonia-based private agency, maintains 22 residential facilities, including three homes of six beds each in Westland for youths ages 13 to 17 years.

Daily costs range from \$112 to \$144 per child, depending upon required services that include everything from comprehensive counseling to assistance in obtaining summer employment.

"There are two things less expensive (than staffed housing)," said Candace Spaulding of Spectrum, "foster homes, which are hard to find for older kids, and independent living, but you have to be 18 or nearly 18 (years) to live there."

Regardless of cost, "it's cheaper than the alternative," Spaulding added.

THE NEED FOR for housing alternatives "mirrors society," according to Orchards director Deborah Dinco, who blames drugs for

the increase in the number of youth who need shelter.

"Substance abuse is a serious problem. It prevents parenting and leads to some very severe neglect and abuse," Dinco said.

In recent years, the number of children requiring housing has increased an estimated 15 to 20 percent annually. Since January 1988 through January of this year, the number of Wayne County children in protective services increased from 6,400 to 9,100. The number of delinquent youths in custody increased from 650 to 800.

Marvin Kornegger, a social worker for 36 years and now manager of the state's Child Services Center at Westland, said drugs are responsible for "profound changes" this past decade. "We're seeing a sharp increase in the number of children in difficult home situations as a result of drugs, particularly crack cocaine."

By year's end, social workers will investigate an estimated 3,500 incidents of abuse and neglect in western Wayne County suburbs, according to Kornegger, who said county wide there will be 12,000 such incidents.

THE AVERAGE length of stay in the Wayne County Youth Home is 21 days at a daily cost of \$111.23, during which time youthful offenders are individually assessed and reassessed.

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


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Ford agrees to buy gas from area landfill

Ford Motor Co. has signed a five-year agreement with Waste Management to buy daily 2 million cubic feet of methane gas produced at the Woodland Meadows recycling and disposal facility in western Wayne County.

A mile-long pipeline will be constructed by Waste Management to transport the gas to the Wayne Plant boilerhouse, where it will be used to fuel steam-generating boilers for Ford's Michigan Truck and Wayne Assembly plants.

Woodland Meadows is a 150-acre facility at Van Born and Hannan roads in Canton Township.

CONSTRUCTION OF the pipeline and a processing plant, to be built north of the facility by Waste Management, will begin in the fall, pending permit approvals from both Canton Township and the city of Wayne.

"The system will be similar to a gas recovery plant Waste Management has in operation in Ohio," said Ray Kellas, midwest regional landfill operations manager for Waste Management.

"Burning methane is much cleaner than coal and produces no ash," Kellas said.

SUBSTITUTION OF landfill gas for coal at the Wayne plant means an annual reduction of more than 40,000 tons of carbon dioxide emissions and 200 tons of sulfur dioxide emission, said Vic Sussman, Ford's director of environmental control. That's because Ford will use the landfill gas instead of burning coal to raise steam for the plant.

Ford Motor Co. has signed a five-year agreement with Waste Management to buy 2 million cubic feet of methane gas a day from Woodland Meadows recycling and disposal facility, a 150-acre facility at Van Born and Hannan roads in Canton Township. A mile-long pipeline will transport the gas to the Wayne Plant boilerhouse, where it will be used to fuel steam-generating boilers for Ford's Michigan Truck and Wayne Assembly plants.

The coal will be replaced by the methane from the landfill that Waste Management must, by law, burn but has no use for the heat.

The methane gas will be extracted using vacuum pumps and a series of wells linked together by a collection pipe system. The methane will be transported north under the county drain and ConRail right-of-way to a processing plant.

AT THE plant, the gas will be filtered, dehydrated and compressed before being placed in the pipeline, which will transport it to the Ford boilerhouse as a replacement for much of the coal now being used. An estimated 1 billion Btu of heating power per day will be produced by the system.

Area government officials are supportive of the project.

"I'm pleased to see this kind of cooperation between an industry which generates waste materials and another company responsible for disposing of it," said Wayne County commissioner Milton Mack, D-Wayne, whose district includes Canton.

"Siphoning the landfill gas not only conserves our natural fossil fuel resources as an energy source, but also eliminates a potential source of odor pollution at the landfill," said Mack, who is chairman of the Wayne County Solid Waste Planning Committee.

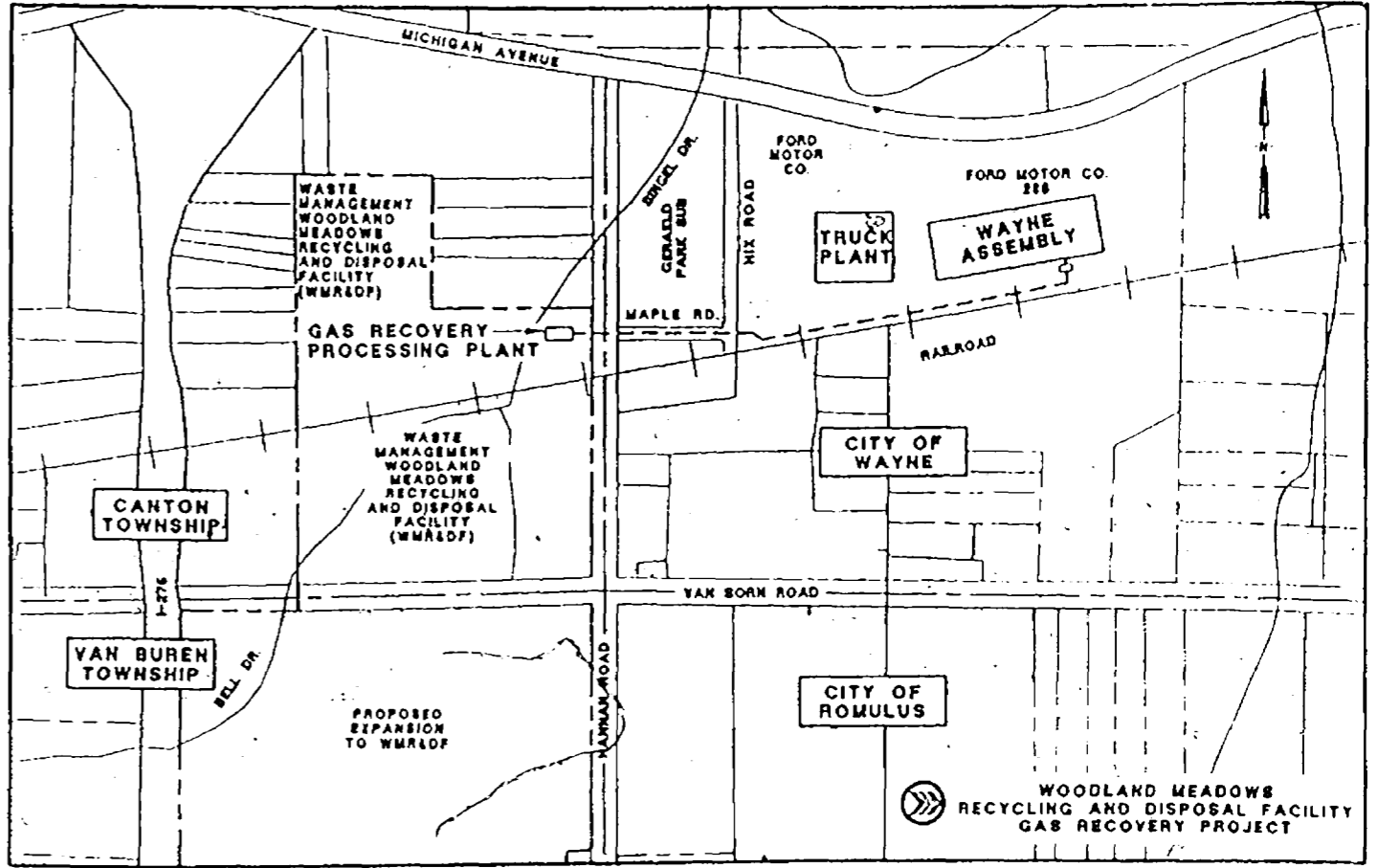
THOMAS YACK, supervisor of Canton, described the project as an ideal situation.

"Converting the methane to energy is an economic, efficient method of utilizing a natural resource created by the landfill decomposition," Yack said.

He said the location of the Ford boilerhouse to the Waste Management facility is another advantage.

"The productive use of the methane is so much better than burning at the site and wasting all that energy. It's the ultimate in recycling."

Landfill gas — How it's captured

Woodland Meadows consists of two separate landfill areas. The size and capacity of each bowl is determined by a geological survey conducted to study the local subsoil and groundwater conditions.

Each day an average 7,500 yards of municipal solid waste, collected throughout metropolitan Detroit — primarily Wayne County, is dumped into the landfill and covered with dirt by compactors.

At this rate, it will take 1½ years for the last remaining landfill area to reach its capacity of solid waste.

• Ninety percent of the total 138 acres used for solid waste disposal at Woodland Meadows has reached its capacity and has been sealed with a 3- to 6-foot deep clay protective cap. Grass has been planted on top of each landfill to prevent soil erosion.

• Because solid waste begins to decompose immediately, methane

production starts early, but does not accumulate until the landfill is covered with clay.

• Landfill gases, a mixture of 50 percent methane, 47 percent carbon dioxide, 3 percent water vapor and other miscellaneous gases, is produced as solid waste decomposes in the oxygen-free landfill. If the odorless, colorless gas is not collected it will migrate underground until it finds breaks in the subsoil and es-

apes. To prevent methane from escaping, wells, usually from 40 to 120 feet deep, are drilled into the sanitary landfills. The wells are tied together with a system of horizontal pipes. Approximately 2 million cubic feet of methane is currently collected daily at Woodland Meadows. Until service to the Ford plant is begun, all methane collected is burned by a continuous flame system.

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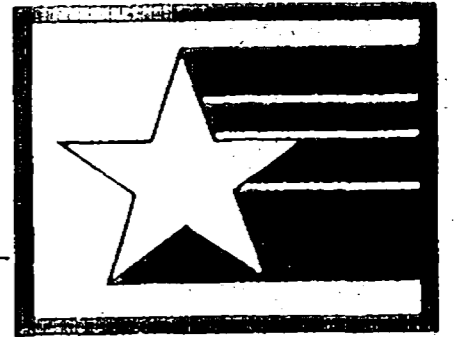

IT'S AUGUST, 1550. The King and Queen have invited you to feast with them and you're getting ready.

Remember, it's not every day one is invited to dine with the King and Queen. Don't be late. But don't be the first nobility over the drawbridge, either.

And gentlemen, be careful you don't miss that last button on your doublet (vest). Make sure your skirt is straight (yes skirt), and that your jerkin (ancient suit coat) has been to the cleaners recently.

Ladies, allow yourself plenty of time to get ready. Remember, it takes more than three hours for a lady to be properly coiffured and dressed in a bum roll (big is better), corset (at the same time - smaller is better, too), petticoats, floor-length skirt with hoop, bodice with detachable sleeves, stomacher (outer bodice), collar and hat.

MOVING FORWARD from 1550 to 1989, there is still-occasional debate on what one should wear and how long it should take to dress. But you can come as you are to the 10th annual Michigan Renaissance Festival and enjoy the general merrymaking and, of course, the authentic costumes worn by more than 400 craftspeople and entertainers.

Barbara Logan of Royal Oak, a former Farmington Hills resident, is marketing director for the festival group, which is housed in a small, downtown Birmingham office. "People really aren't sure what the Renaissance Festival is," she said. "But the brave go and have a great time. Our exit polls indicate 96 percent of our guests will return. And they tell their friends. Last year, over our seven weekends, 130,000-people attended the festival."

The Renaissance festival is an accurate re-creation of a 16th century European village during a harvest celebration. Continuous entertainment (merrymaking) fills the nine-acre festival site on a wooded clearing in Holly.

The village is peopled by jesters, servers, wenches, dancers, mimes, magicians, jugglers, puppeteers, minstrels, knights, lords and all manner of townsfolk. Craftspeople from pickle sellers to glass blowers to clothesmakers offer their wares for sale. But to be truly accurate, the "villagers" need to look the part. "With over four hundred costumed

participants, you can imagine the cost involved," said Logan. "That's why, except for the principles, everyone provides their own clothing."

A COSTUME can cost the Renaissance \$75 to \$300, depending on the degree of elaborateness. And also depending on the character to be portrayed, because in Renaissance times, as one's social station rose, more elaborate fashion was dictated. Keeping up with the Joneses originated in the fashion world of the Renaissance.

"As the middle class developed, they wanted to look like and started to wear the fashions of the wealthy," said Laurie Danforth of Rochester, one of the costume designers for this year's festival. "Many folks back then put almost their entire fortune into the clothes and jewelry they wore."

Danforth is a free-lance costume

designer whose work has appeared at the Music Hall and Attie Theater and in the Oakland University production of "Amadeus." She also has been head of the costuming department for the Detroit Institute of Arts' Wassail meal.

"We want to be as authentic as possible. And since patterns really don't exist for this type of clothing, I research extensively," Danforth said.

Two costumes she worked on for the festival are for upper-class characters and have taken an average of 60 hours each to complete. "Working with clothing of this period is especially difficult because of the thickness involved for an accurate look. Textiles were crude back then and without the benefit of central heating, thicker clothes were a necessity," she said.

EVEN MORE important to the

people of the time, Danforth explained, was that they didn't want to look as if they had to work. Thus, the more layers of clothing they wore, the more money it was thought they had.

Costuming for the Renaissance Festival has to be extremely heavy duty in construction because it takes a lot of wear and tear. Danforth favors modern materials like cottons and polyesters.

"As with anything else, budget determines many priorities. In theater, upholstery fabrics are used for their thick look, but they're heavy and not all that comfortable to wear. And the festival people wanted the right look but the garments had to be washable. I went a bit overboard on these. They're some of my best work. I just wanted them right. I made undergarments like the bum roll (makes hips look larger) and a collar and hat on my own time because when the actress steps into this, I want her to feel the part. It's just great seeing an actor get so excited about his or her role when they get into an outfit."

The jester wasn't kidding when he recommended costume designer Mary Musinski of Detroit to the Renaissance Festival management.

"It's true, I'm on a referral from the jester," said Musinski. She runs her own clothing design and production studio in downtown Detroit where she manufactures a clothing line for women that is distributed locally. Her work has appeared in the movies "The Rosary Murders,"

"Collision Course" and in smaller production companies around town.

MUSINSKI WORKS primarily in middle-class clothing for the Renaissance, although one of her favorite costumes she has done for the festival is for royalty, the Queen Mother. "Eighty percent of this costume is older drapery fabric, which I've lined with more contemporary fabric for comfort," she said.

She finds much of the fabric she uses for period costumes at going-out-of-business sales, treasure shops and garage sales.

"Aside from the challenge of making a well-built garment, one that can stand up close and live scrutiny,

I'm dealing with limited quantities on some of these older fabrics," she said.

The Queen Mother costume took 30 hours to construct.

Musinski also dons costume to work at the Renaissance Festival in the Face Painting and tattooing booth.

"In the Renaissance period, tattooing was very popular with royalty and took the form of dragons, unicorns, hearts, flowers or rainbows. Of course, our tattoos are just painted. We also do faces in animal styles. Kids love it. I look forward to painting a lot of happy faces every year," she said.

Canceled Mall should allow book sale

WHAT ARE the responsibilities of a privately-owned regional shopping center in allowing community groups to use the mall for fund-raising purposes?

The problem surfaced this month when Westland Center canceled a planned book sale to be sponsored by a pro-life group.

Legally, malls can control which groups use their property for any reason. But it created a potential community relations problem when it canceled the book sale planned by Right to Life/Lifespan of Metro Detroit.

The group claims that it had verbal, though unwritten, permission to hold the sale this Saturday. But the sale was called off by the center management after it admitted receiving several telephone inquiries after the sale was promoted on the mall's marquee on Wayne Road near Warren Road two weeks ago.

The mall management added that it already had a commitment for another event Saturday and didn't have the available time or space to allow the book sale at the same time.

The book sale, a fund-raising strategy that has been used by many other groups in past years at the mall, should have been allowed to continue, even if a new date had to be scheduled.

There is no question that the mall management has the last word on how its property is used and by whom. Certainly, the pro-life group is actively involved in a controversial issue — whether abortions on demand should be allowed under public policy and provided poor women through the state Medicaid program.

But the pro-life group wasn't circulating petitions advancing its cause, promoting a political position, or planning a high-visibility campaign that would prompt pro-choice groups or persons on the other side of the abortion dispute to mount a counter-protest at the mall.

Fund-raisers should be more encouraged at regional malls.

CERTAINLY, mall owners and managers aren't in the business of sponsoring political debates or events. They just want to promote their retail tenants so shoppers will come in and spend money in a climate-controlled, hassle-free atmosphere.

But the other side of the coin of social responsibility is that malls have intentionally and aggressively marketed themselves — since Northland opened its doors in 1954 — as the "new downtowns" and business centers where large numbers of people are encouraged to come and spend their money.

Before malls were built, communities used public buildings or facilities to hold political events or fund-raising projects.

Since then, the malls have taken over that function. They sponsor senior citizen dances, walking clubs, band concerts, fashion shows and fund-raisers by civic groups — even book sales.

While the pro-life group has other malls in which to hold its sale, it felt it had approval from Westland Center for the Saturday date.

If the sale is there or any other mall and pro-choice shoppers are offended, they certainly have the choice of walking by and refusing to buy a book.

People buying books at any sale may not necessarily be endorsing the views of the sponsoring organization, whether it's a church organization or civic group.

But groups should have a reasonable opportunity — if not a legal right — to raise funds in the new downtowns.

Suburbs, city Cooperation can improve region

SUBURBANITES should take a great interest in Detroit's mayoral election — not because of who is or isn't running, but because of what strong, well-measured leadership means to southeastern Michigan.

We hope Detroit's residents get the mayor they want and we hope they persuade that person to widen the field of cooperation with suburban communities. When that happens, we trust those communities involved and Detroit's mayor can put aside one, maybe even two of their differences and get about the business of working together to improve this part of Michigan.

Some question why this newspaper occasionally mixes Detroit's issues with those of the communities we cover. It could be said that as Detroit goes, so goes this corner of the state, but that's a debatable point.

Suburbanites must be more concerned with facts.

• Many people and businesses in the communities we cover have an interest in Detroit's good health. Convention visitors fill hotels and restaurants in the suburbs. Many businesses contribute to the mayoral candidates of their choice because that candidate's policies affect their ability to do business in Detroit.

• True regional mass transit, a benefit for all, will come into existence only when Detroit and the suburbs decide to find some way to cooperate with one another.

• Eventually a major mass transit system has to be built for the good of both city and suburbs. The economic viability of the suburban inner-core as well as the city of Detroit depend on it.

• Erasing racism as a factor in the urban/suburban relationship is imperative. Standing on either side of Eight Mile and yelling epithets at each other accomplishes nothing; nor does proclaiming the still-unfinished I-696 freeway the new barrier between Detroit and the northern communities, as some already are doing.

• Integration as a cohesive and unified policy must be forged between city and suburb before we are ever to have economic stability and civil peace.

• Suburban crime will not subside until Detroit gets a grip on its own problems. Shoving drug dealers back and forth across Detroit's city limits merely shifts the problem around — it doesn't change it.

Regional cooperation is necessary, particularly regarding jail space. For example: Redford Township's police are stumped because their department arrests alleged drug dealers, but

they're told there's no room for them in the Wayne County Jail. They say Detroit has a priority in housing criminals in that facility. True or false, the perception is there.

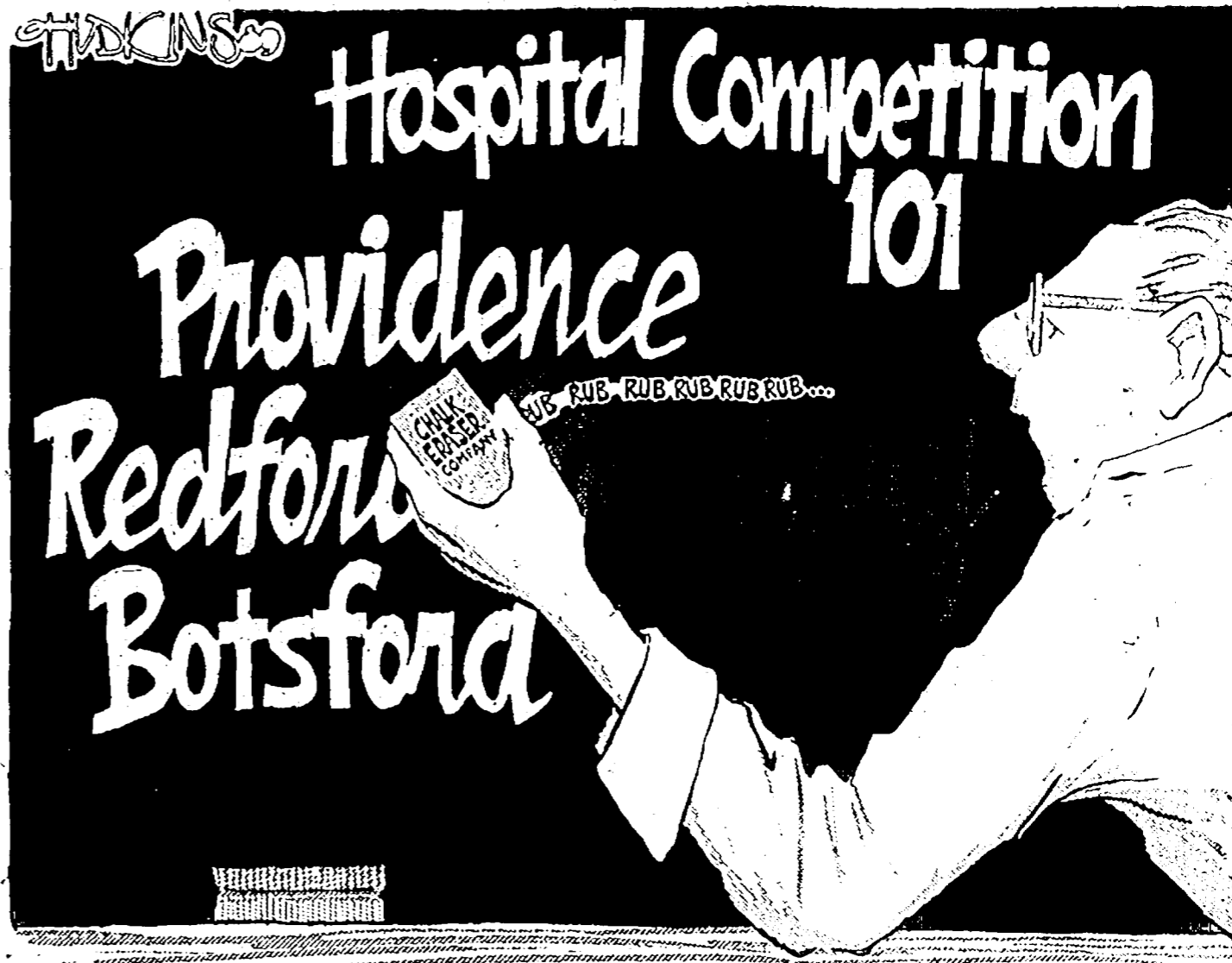
• A metropolitan area's reputation is imperative in either building or destroying its economic base.

A bad reputation for Detroit transfers to all our communities. Those outside of Michigan don't separate Detroit's problems from the metropolitan area. We've found that when we're visiting another state and people ask where we're from, the answer West Bloomfield or Canton isn't specific enough for them. They want to know the location of those communities and their proximity to Detroit. When they find out how close we really are to Detroit, they either respond with a crummy joke or just wince. One person recited a litany of 15,000 empty homes, Devil's Night fires, franchised crack dealers and the curbside sale of weapons. No one needs that kind of local, national or international reputation.

• Many of us are linked via pipeline with Detroit — a large percentage of our communities use Detroit water.

• Any weekday morning, look at the eastbound Jeffries and I-94, or southbound I-75 and the Lodge. Those traffic jams mean that much as we might like to believe we don't need Detroit, the evidence speaks to the contrary. Even tattered, it still is an important center of commerce. The weekends aren't much different — lines to the JLA, Brunch with Bach, ethnic festivals, concerts, special showings at the art institute, jazz festivals, the Grand Prix, boat races and Greentown. . . point made.

Detroit also gets a lot from our communities — and the rest of Michigan — in the form of tax dollars, clout in Lansing, grants from Washington that might have gone elsewhere, and, perhaps most importantly, a chance to set the tone for the way this area is perceived by the rest of the world.



Consumers victimized by employee neglect

SUBURBAN malls are full of them.

Suburban restaurants are too. And so are the much utilized fast food outlets.

And we all are victimized. I'm talking about incidents of employee neglect — especially when it comes to young employees.

My favorite example of employee neglect revolves around a trip to a clothing store with my daughter. Standing at the counter was a girl, not much older than my 14 year-old daughter.

She was working the store alone. Not a supervisor, manager or owner in sight. Behind the counter was an out-of-place pay phone. Curiosity got the best of me.

"How come the pay phone?" I asked.

"Oh, they don't want us using the phone for personal calls. Nobody is ever here to watch us and they really don't trust us by ourselves. So they took out the regular one and installed this," she replied.

What a sad story. Whoever owns or manages this store cares little about the employees or the customers, for that matter. Instead of hiring a manager to work with the employees, the owners would rather save the salary, install the phone and leave some untrained kid alone to survive as best as her instincts would allow.

UNFORTUNATELY this kind of employee/customer neglect is becoming more and more common.

As a consumer you've been victimized by one or many similar incidents.

For example

• Waiters and waitresses who let customers wait for service as they talk among themselves.

• Far too many tables left uncleared so patrons have to wait to be seated and those seated are left to glare at others' garbage.

• Food which is served cold and waiters and kitchen personnel who are unable to get it heated to an edible temperature.

• Clerks in retail stores who spend their time waiting on you while complaining to a colleague about some personal problem.

• Clerks who know little about the product they sell and who show little concern over your concern.

• Fast food counter personnel who are unable to handle an unusual situation outside the programmed routine.

Asking to see the manager is of little help. Oftentimes the manager is as young and as unskilled as the employees.

It really doesn't have to be that way. Really it doesn't.

And you can't blame the kids. But those with the power, business

owners and managers, are falling down on the job.

Somewhere along the line, the business work ethic has been replaced by greed. Not by everybody, mind you, but by enough to give a bad name to business in general.

Grabbing the biggest buck in the shortest time is too often the credo of business today.

This need for greed is reflected in the neglect of employees by managers and owners. With the labor shortage increasing, the problem is only going to get worse.

Far too often, young adults and teenagers, many of whom never have worked before, are hired into a job, given little training and, even if trained, are rarely monitored in their day-to-day job performance.

It's a problem which only will be stopped when consumers say enough. No mas, no mas.

Football gets too much?

To the editor:

Now that the Wayne-Westland school board has announced the approval of \$53,610 for the John Glenn football stadium press box, I feel I have to speak out.

Football's position as the premier high school sport has always puzzled me. To begin with, the sport is limited to the 50 varsity and junior varsity players. Unlike track, swimming, tennis, basketball and baseball, most students and the community can't participate in or take advantage of the facility.

The equipment cost per player is one of the highest of all the interschool sports, and the cost in crippled young men (how many girls ever play?) is a crime. As athletes, football players are limited in overall ability by their specific positions. Creative thinking by individual players on the field is discouraged and even punished. The only plus is that it serves as a focal point for school and community spirit.

The rest of the world, and much of this country, embraces another form of football — what we Americans call soccer. As with track, swimming, tennis, basketball and baseball, the majority of the student body and the community at large can take advantage of the facilities.

Equipment cost per player is right in line with baseball and track. Serious injuries are uncommon. As in any transitional game (basketball, hockey) individual thought and ac-

tion are just as important as teamwork.

Imaginative thought is not just allowed, it's encouraged in all players. Both girls and boys can play on separate or combined teams. As a participatory sport, it ranks second nationally, behind bowling, in terms of players of all ages in organized leagues.

STUDENTS from Wayne-Westland schools participate on local teams and clubs. The Westland Youth Soccer League (WYSL) has teams that are predominately John Glenn and Wayne Memorial students. These teams have shown themselves competitive against teams that are essentially the high school teams from other districts.

These Wayne-Westland players have earned positions to U.S. National team and Olympic team player pool programs, and soccer scholarships to nationally ranked colleges and universities. These kids want to represent their high schools in soccer.

In the past, WYSL has offered to assist in establishing high school soccer for Wayne-Westland schools. At the time, budget cuts impacting existing sports were given as the reason for not having soccer.

The field exists, though it's a "football stadium," and the equipment costs are minimal. The players are available, coaching is available, and the U.S. is on the brink of world class competition. Surely, if there is \$53,610 for a press box to support 10 varsity and junior varsity football games a year, there is something for other athletes.

Isn't it time to see if the WYSL offer is still available? Isn't it time

to bring world class competition to Wayne-Westland schools?

Hospitals are in a fight to survive

IT'S SURVIVAL of the fittest. And in the Great Hospital War, tiny Redford Community Hospital has succumbed.

Others could follow. It was predestined that something had to give as hospital costs rise, the number of insured days a patient may stay in a hospital falls and Medicare-Medicaid reimbursements fail to meet the costs of hospital care.

In addition, improved technology in the medical field has reduced the average in-patient stay at hospitals, while an increase in out-patient surgery has caused a decrease in occupancy rates at many hospitals.

In the area covered by the Observer & Eccentric, Redford Community Hospital, which had just 68 beds, was the first casualty.

Meanwhile, the giants — Henry Ford, Providence, Beaumont, Sinai — fight to be the hospital of choice. The target: our suburbs. And others, such as Crittendon in Rochester Hills, Botsford in Farmington Hills St. Mary in Livonia, Garden City Osteopathic and the Westland Medical Center, stay in the running.

Their battle is waged on several fronts:

- Advertising dollars spent to woo patients.
- Participation in a major health

insurance plan. • Physical presence in the suburbs.

OUR COMMUNITIES are well aware of the drive for physical presence.

It is a drive that may have been begun by Henry Ford Hospital as it placed satellite out-patient care clinics in Troy and West Bloomfield in the mid-'70s — and specialty clinics in other suburbs.

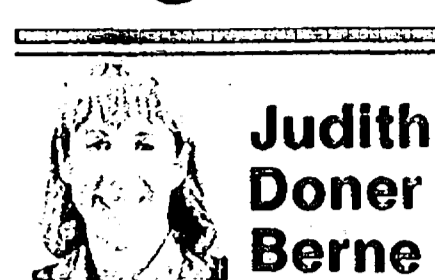
Royal Oak-based Beaumont has its Barnum Center right plunk in the center of a Birmingham neighborhood, taking over a former school. It also has a major medical office building in West Bloomfield.

And Providence has recently announced its plans to build another facility in Novi and move a portion of its beds out of Southfield. It also is trying mightily to pitch a 90,000-square-foot office building-outpatient clinic in Farmington Hills. So far that city's council has said no.

Sinai Hospital of Detroit has some facilities in West Bloomfield.

And since the early '80s, Sinai and Henry Ford have been seeking a joint hospital on the West Bloomfield campus of HFH. That venture is still up for approval by the state.

BELIEVE IT or not, dollars spent

on health care advertising are down. But not out.

It is generally reported that the dollars spent are considerably higher than the early '80s, but not as much as perhaps two or three years ago. But hospitals are still seen as aggressive marketers.

As far as insurers, health maintenance organizations are now operable in hospitals where the Blues once reigned all but supreme, and are another promotional device.

So where does all of that leave all of us, the people who use the hospitals? Paying more for health care though it may be closer to us.

• Those on Medicaid/Medicare may be treated as second-class citizens because most hospitals are reimbursed for about 75 cents of every dollar spent on Medicare/Medicaid patients.

• The cost of private insurance is astronomical, leaving many with no choice but to be uninsured.

• For those lucky enough to be

receive group insurance through their place of work, attempts by companies to cut those benefits — changing to less expensive plans and/or asking employees to contribute, will become more common.

Reasons why WC3 hasn't won support

WC3, AS THEY call Wayne County Community College, is the only two-year public college in Michigan that has never won voter tax support. And trustees frequently voiced concerns over constituent perceptions.

But at their July meeting in Detroit, chairman Ollie McKinney repeatedly shot them all in the foot with his handling of the gavel. Readers in Redford Township, parts of Westland and Canton ought to know about it because they have the misfortune to be in the WC3 district.

Bradford White, who writes a political newsletter called Trial Balloon, asked time to address the board early in the meeting. While the state Open Meetings Act requires boards to hear public comments, it doesn't say when. McKinney made White cool his heels until late in the meeting.

Bad decision. By that time, White, who wanted to discuss the case of Chonich vs. WC3, wasn't so cool.

"I WOULD LIKE to caution you," interrupted McKinney, "when we discuss anything in litigation, we go into closed session. I'm prepared to gavel you down if you talk about Chonich."

McKinney was wrong. First, the board may close its doors under certain circumstances to discuss "specific pending litigation," but it's not the chairman's decision.

Second, if the board chooses not to discuss the case publicly, it can't gag a private citizen from mentioning it. "The case is decided and published," said White, waving a copy of the U.S. Court of Appeals decision (874 F.2nd 359, decided May 12).

Third, White pointed out — and trustees didn't deny — that at their June 28 meeting they held a closed session without revealing which "specific pending litigation" was the topic, as the Open Meetings Act requires.

Fourth, White noted the board spent nearly 2½ hours behind closed doors at the earlier session, delaying the start of its public meeting by 1½ hours. It's not illegal, but it's dumb public relations, to keep your public waiting. "Reform your practice," said White. Amen.

THE LAWSUIT by two white males charges WC3 with discrimination and defamation of character.

Milan Chonich, 44, of Troy, was demoted as director of development, denied a request to return to faculty and currently finds his annual earnings reduced by \$20,000, according to attorney Sue Radulovich.

Carmen Pascoretti, 41, of Birmingham, was demoted from administrative director of student services; systems, denied a return to the faculty and terminated in 1986. He's selling real estate.

Both rejected early retirement in return for dropping their suit.

The men say board secretary Juanita Ford defamed them when she circulated a 1984 letter, not on WC3 stationery, charging, "The so-called budgetary problem is a subterfuge being utilized to eliminate jobs held by blacks and women," and naming (among others) Chonich and Pascoretti, who weren't even on the budget committee. Her letter went to the NAACP and 17 public officials, including state legislators.

A JURY IN U.S. District Judge Horace Gilmore's court awarded Chonich \$375,000 actual damages and \$25,000 punitive damages; Pascoretti, \$450,000 actual and \$25,000 punitive — a total of \$875,000 plus 12 percent interest from the 1984 date of filing.

Gilmore threw out the defamation charge.

The Court of Appeals reversed, saying 1) damages were excessive, 2) Gilmore's instructions to the jury were faulty and 3) the defamation count against Ford should go to the jury.

Attorney Radulovich tells me that on Aug. 22 Gilmore will set a new trial date. "This could be an absolute gold mine for me," she said, relishing the chance to try the defamation case.

Not only does she think the first jury awards weren't excessive, but she believes "I'm going to get a lot more" for Chonich and Pascoretti the second time around.

"It's an absolute outrage they (WC3) will not settle this case," she said. (Settlements are generally cheaper than trying cases.)

THAT WAS what White was trying to tell WC3 trustees — settle it before it costs the taxpayers even more megabucks. Use the money for teaching, something community colleges do extraordinarily well.

All A student stands out from the pack

Q. Your response to a recent question about studying talked about cramming and a photogenic mind. When I was a student, frankly I didn't study that much and did cram, but was still an A student in science and math. Although I did get a few A's in social studies and language arts; science and math always seemed to come easier. I suppose for some students, English, literature and social studies are easier than math and science and vice versa. Is this typical of students?

A: The answer is yes, that is why an all A student is truly an unusual breed.

Some students tend to favor math and the sciences while others tend to favor English, language arts, literature and social studies.

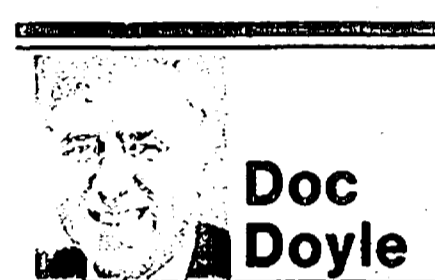
An easy answer would be that it depends on what the student is most interested in. And in many cases this is true. I believe it goes beyond that simplistic answer. Some students

tend to be convergent thinkers and some students tend to be divergent thinkers.

Convergent thinkers tend to focus on what is the answer, the solution. They know that 10 squared = 100. A convergent thinker should be very comfortable being, as an example, a bookkeeper or accountant, an auto mechanic — anything with a definite solution, from balancing the books to making the car run... visualizing, seeing and having a clearly defined answer.

A divergent thinker tends to see or visualize several different reasons for an answer and seems to function better in literature, social studies or political science.

Let's take a simplistic example. Given a multiple choice question such as, "What was the cause of the Civil War," the convergent thinker tends to look for the answer, the divergent thinker tends to question the test writer's choices — especially if the response is not crystal clear.

Suppose the choices to why the Civil War were: (a) free the slaves (b) develop a north-south cultural exchange (c) unite all new world settlers (d) for economic reasons. A clear answer to the question for the convergent thinker would be Lincoln's desire to free the slaves. However, the broad-based divergent thinker may easily pick (d) for economic reasons — and support the selection by reasoning that the southern plantation owners did not want to loose free slave labor.

The National Merit Scholarship Test is the toughest test in the country for high school students. Many test questions have been revised by

bright divergent thinking high school students who justified more than one choice to a question; choices that don't distinguish or discriminate enough between the right answer and the wrong answer.

This country is made up of convergent thinkers, the engineers, the CPA's and divergent thinkers, the teachers the professors and creative lawyers. Frankly, I am pleased we have engineers such as yourself who are convergent thinkers. I don't want to take off at Metro Airport and have had a broad based divergent thinker the designer of the plane wing.

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State universities move toward dorm option

All but one of Michigan's 14 public universities with student housing are moving toward giving dormitory residents the choice of having a roommate who doesn't drink, a drive begun by a group of Oakland County activists.

Beginning this fall, 12 schools will consider student preferences about alcohol use when pairing roommates.

Wayne State University will offer students such a choice beginning in the fall of 1990.

But Michigan State University, the state's largest public college, has no such plans.

"I think they've come a long way, but they haven't come far enough," said U.S. District Judge Bernard Friedman, who led a fight to encourage the schools to give students the choice of having a roommate who doesn't drink or use illegal drugs. "But let's give them credit where credit is due."

Friedman, who handled many drug- and alcohol-related cases while a 48th District Court judge, said that legislation is needed to enforce the plan and address the use of drugs as well as alcohol. The non-drinking roommate option should also be implemented at the state's 44 private colleges, he said.

FRIEDMAN, DRUG and alcohol abuse counselors and students and parents banded together more than three years ago to pressure schools into providing the option, he said.

A major concern was that students recovering from a substance abuse problem would be tempted back into drug use when confronted with drug or alcohol use in their dormitory room. But Friedman said students should be given the choice of avoiding roommates who drink or use illegal drugs no matter the reason.

"All we're saying is that people should have a preference," he said. "We don't want to get into the legal or moral issues."

Lorna McEwen, public relations director for the Maple Grove Centers, substance abuse treatment clinics affiliated with Henry Ford Hospital, said the group will monitor how the non-drinking roommate option works.

She said she would also like to see more alcohol education programs at the colleges, including training for residence assistants in the dorms.

In the long run, she said, legislation may be needed.

ERIC WORLEY, an 18-year-old graduate of West Bloomfield High School, testified before a state-legislative committee last fall about the need for the roommate option. The committee was studying a bill sponsored by Rep. David Honigman (R-West Bloomfield) that would have forced both private and public colleges to provide the option on housing application forms.

Ironically, Worley, who says he's a recovering cocaine user, plans to attend Michigan State in the fall. But

he applauded the steps taken by the other schools.

"As long as (the option to choose a roommate who doesn't use alcohol) helps some people in some situations, that's good," Worley said. "I'll have to be faced with it."

Worley said that he doesn't have a drinking problem, but fears that drinking could lead him back to drug abuse. But, he said, he wouldn't hesitate to confront a roommate if drinking in their room became a problem for him. "I wouldn't think twice about letting him know my feelings," he said.

AT MICHIGAN STATE, Moses Turner, vice president for student affairs, said that giving students the choice of a teetotaling roommate wouldn't address the real issue — drinking by those under 21.

"We think we have long been implementing policies designed to minimize the consumption of alcohol in the halls," Turner said. "We are not a Johnny-come-lately to this prob-

lem. We have been at it. We haven't solved it."

School policy forbids on-campus drinking by students under 21. Students can be expelled for repeating offenses such as underage drinking or supplying minors with alcohol, Turner said. Students over 21 can drink in their dormitory rooms, but most students who live on campus are under 21, he said.

MSU also has a program of education about alcohol use and counseling for students with a drinking problem, Turner said.

Most of the 13 other state universities with dormitories ask students to indicate on housing forms if they want to room with someone who doesn't use alcohol.

In addition, the University of Michigan addressed the issue and how it will be enforced in a supplemental letter to incoming students. "Students who sign up for and then violate the substance free living arrangement will be expected to make

a room change immediately," according to the letter, signed by Robert C. Hughes, director of housing.

But three schools — Michigan Technological University, Lake Superior State University and Saginaw Valley State University — suggest on the forms that the option is only available to students of legal drinking age.

And Ferris State University doesn't approach the issue directly, but asks on housing forms if physical conditions, including chemical dependency, should be considered in room assignments.

FOR HONIGMAN, who backed legislation that he says helped pressure public colleges that were not providing the option to do so, the fight is not over.

Honigman said he may introduce legislation in the fall that would force all of the state's colleges, public and private, to offer the option and better help monitor the policy.

The Maxey Training Center in Whitmore Lake currently houses 490 youths, ages 13 to 18 years, in mini-

mum and maximum security facilities. Each attends school five days a week, including regular or special education classes and vocational training, at a cost of an estimated \$140 daily.

Youths from Wayne County nor-

mally comprise 75 percent of the total population and 10 percent of those are from suburban communities, according to Julie Jenkins, program director at the facility. Since October 1988, 264 Wayne County youths have been considered for placement.

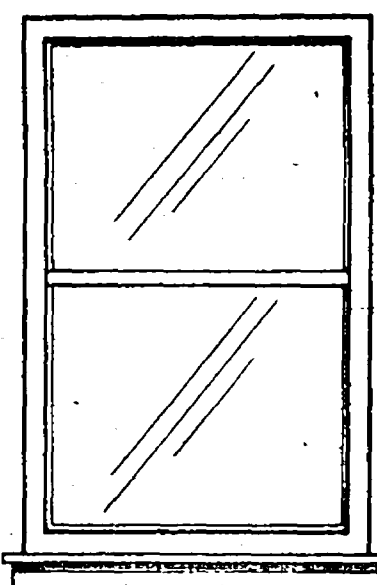
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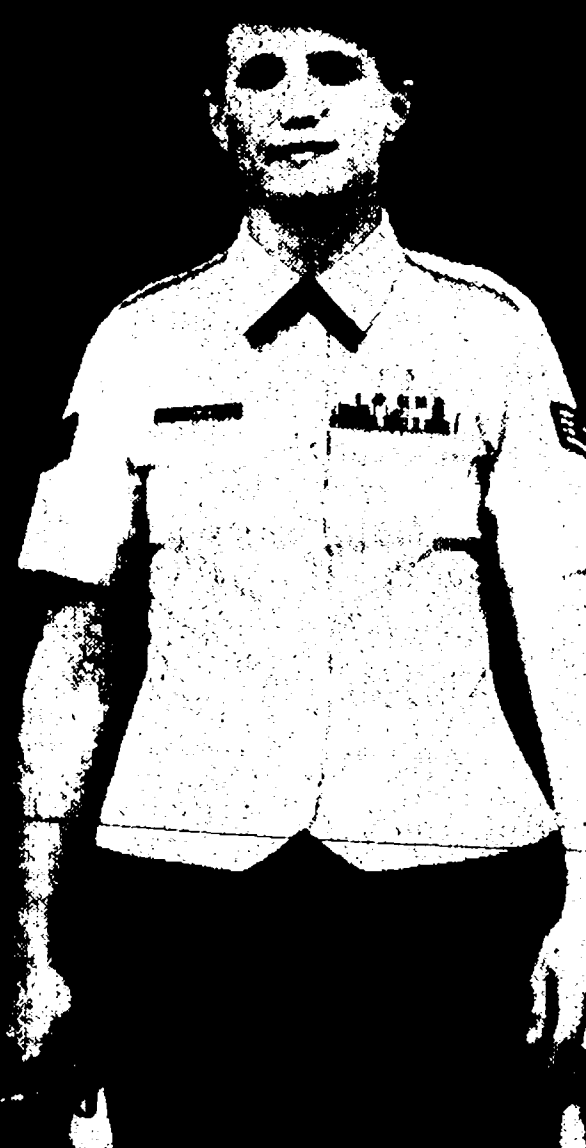
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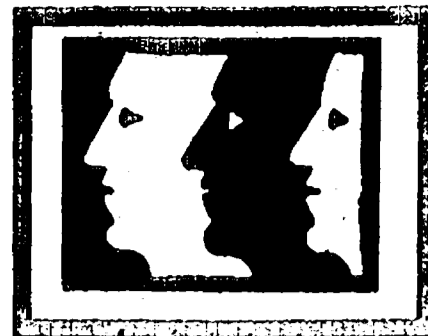

Button, button

'Sack' suits invade men's fashions

The winds of change are blowing in the men's fashion industry, but for the fashion-conscious male, there's no need to panic. Change is coming, but not at break-neck speed.

Preppy ties, oxford button-down shirts and the like are on the wane. This fall the well-dressed man will don what the industry is calling the "sack" suit, an updated traditional that's a harbinger of changes already taking place in men's wear in Europe.

"The most visible change in men's wear is the silhouette," said Luciano Franzoni, men's wear designer for Hartmarx Corp., the largest men's clothing manufacturer in the United States. "It's a derivative of what's going on in Europe and Italy. It's full, with a relaxed easy fit, and the shoulders are softer."

"It's good news for the general consumer because it's a comfortable suit to wear."

The sack suit features broad shoulders, taking into account the new male physique, the result of Americans' love affair with physical fitness, and smaller waistlines, Franzoni said.

Many sack suits will lack the vents in the back of the jacket — the looser fit has made them obsolete — and they will be paired up with pleated pants.

"The silhouette is fairly well reflected in the lines of suit," he said. "They style started in Italy awhile ago and its acceptance has been tremendous. And the number one reason for it is the comfort."

STILL QUITE popular is the two-button suit and double-breasted suits still are gaining momentum in the marketplace.

The winds of change centers on the re-introduction of the three-button suit, a contemporary interpretation of the "old, fairly vertical suit." Like the sack suit, it has a softer look, but for now, it's a novelty item, Franzoni said.

"It's an avant-garde look and as such there's not a lot of buying (by stores) yet," he said. "Store buyers are taking a wait and see attitude, but it may make a dent a couple of seasons from now."

What men will see in suits this fall is a toning down of colors.

There will be plenty of suits in shades of prune, plum, amber, brown, olive, steel gray and charcoal blue as well as the perennial favorites of navy blue and gray.

Fabrics will have a more sophisticated texture. Suits will come in pure wool and good wool blends with fairly subdued colors and muted window pane checks and plaids as well as muted bird's eye and nail-head patterns (microdots that are barely visible and give texture to the material).

"I think the new direction in men's suits is readily acceptable because men have been complaining for years that their business uniforms

have been uncomfortable," Franzoni said.

Even accessories have gone through changes.

Ties will be in patterns and colors reminiscent of Art Deco. Some will have a metallic cast to them, while others will reflect the colors in suits but in a more flamboyant way, Franzoni said.

STRIPS WILL still be popular in shirts, but making new gains is the white shirt, which acts as a buffer between the suit and colorful ties. Shirts will be made of lighter cloth as opposed to materials like the heavy oxford cloth.

Button-down collars will still be around for the traditional dresser, but the fashion-minded gentleman will choose a shirt with a small spread collar rather than the oxford style, Franzoni said.

Shoes are back to the classic styles, but light and supple and without the heavy soles.

The novelty item in men's hosiery. Discreet patterns in dots, diamonds and strips will add a dressy look to the suit, Franzoni said.

Franzoni has been a designer of men's wear for more than 30 years and was in town recently to promote his fashion line — Confezioni Riserva/Luciano Franzoni suits, his own design manufactured by Hartmarx's Intercontinental Branded Apparel division. The suits, the first Italian style suits made in the United States, are available exclusively at Jacobson stores and fall into the "below \$300" price range.

Hartmarx decided to begin offering American-made Italian suits to avoid the fluctuation in prices of imports due to changes in the value of currency, Franzoni said.

Franzoni has seen a lot of changes

in men's wear since he came to the United States in 1968. At the time, suits were utilitarian in depressing colors. They were, he said, "a dark uniform."

WHILE CHANGES have taken place in men's styles and in the choice of colors, he said there "are still pockets of resistance among businessmen."

He likens the men's department of today to an art gallery because of the many colors and patterns that are featured. But he laments that most men miss the show.

"Most men don't open their eyes when they go through the men's department," he said. "They go right to what they're comfortable with, so they miss a lot. They're not as open the fashion changes as women."

Quaal and Lochinski, 25, are partners in Albie's, a budding business that along with subma-

For the "uneducated," pasties are the original pocketbook sandwich. While many people presume pasties are native to the U.P., their origin can be traced back to Cornwall, England, where miners carried them to work each day.

The original pasty includes beef, potatoes, rutabaga and onions hidden inside a pastry crust. But the duo have updated the pasty to offer customers not only the original beef, but beef and cheese, chicken and vegetarian versions.

A real winner

Athletes hit and pitch way to honors

THERE WAS no shortage of winners at the Michigan Special Olympics state softball tournament.

The event was held Friday and Saturday, Aug. 4-5, at the Canton Softball Center. It attracted some 826 athletes, chaperones and coaches, in addition to other volunteers, said Dick Clark of Wayne, tournament director.

"No rain, we're doing great," said Clark, a member of the Wayne Civitan Club, which hosted the event. He and others organizing the tournament had been concerned about the stormy weather, but Saturday's skies were clear and sunny.

"I got very little sleep last night," Clark said Saturday. "I sat in my living room watching it rain."

Athletes played some games Friday night, with tournament play continuing on Saturday. A total of 38 teams competed, in addition to skills competition involving some 40 athletes.

TEAMS COMPETED in different divisions, based on ability levels. Special Olympics provides opportunities for athletic competition and achievement among mentally retarded people.

Athletes must be at least 8 to compete in Special Olympics events, with no upper age limit set. This weekend's tournament marked the second consecutive year the state event has been held at the Canton Softball Center.

"It's going real well," said Susie Pidosny of Canton, Wayne County area director for Special Olympics.

The tournament included opening ceremonies Friday evening, followed by a dance at the nearby UAW Local 735 on Michigan Avenue in Canton.

Following skills competition and tournament play, the awards presentation was held Saturday afternoon at the Canton Softball Center.

During the tournament, athletes stayed at two hotels near Detroit Metropolitan Airport. Having the athletes stay together makes coordinating the tournament easier, Pidosny said.

All athletes returned home with a medal or ribbon. There were gold, silver and bronze medals, plus team trophies for first-, second- and third-place teams. Other athletes received ribbons.

"I guess my biggest concern is that they come and have a good time," Pidosny said. Athletes learn the value of sportsmanship and team effort.

"It's a good example of what Special Olympics is all about," she said.

ATHLETES BENEFIT from the experience of competing, said Clark, the tournament director. They benefit from being away from home, from working together and from interacting with other people.

One action-packed game involved the Plymouth-Canton Thundercats and the Northwest ARC (Association for Retarded Citizens) Blasters. The Thundercats won that game.

The Thundercats team included 16 players, with an additional five athletes participating in skills competition. Skills competition includes such things as batting, ball toss, base running, fielding and throwing for distance.

The Plymouth-Canton Thundercats played the C.I. Wildcats Friday night and lost that game.

"We're starting to get a lot more competition, which is better," said Mike Keith of Plymouth, head coach for the Thundercats.

The athletes, some of whom live at the Plymouth Opportunity House, have been practicing since right after Memorial Day. They've played the Northwest ARC Blasters and other local teams in scrimmages.

This year, Keith and the other Thundercats coaches have stressed that athletes should adapt themselves to the game, rather than the game being adapted for the athletes.

"It's a lot harder for our guys," said Keith, who has a son, 16-year-old Neil, on the team. "We train them by the book."

WESTERN WAYNE County was well-represented at the tournament. 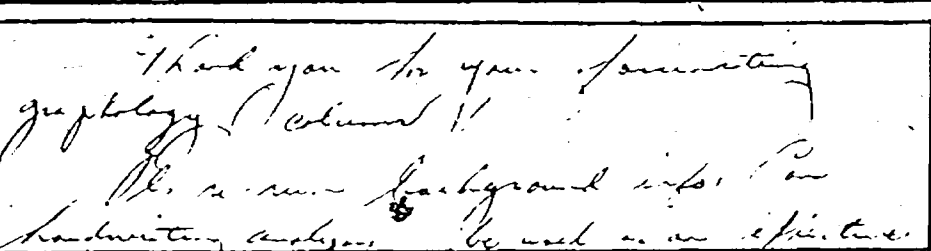

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Partners promote pasties as newest fast food

 pasties place. They left the eatery in September 1986 and spent the winter putting together their business plans. They got "good advice" and help on the financial end of it from Quaal's father, who had been in business for himself. They latched onto the pasty recipe from a good friend of Quaal's who had managed the U.P. string of Madeline Pasty shops popular 10 to 15 years ago, Quaal said.

The pair started out with one store in September 1987 and have slowly expanded. The latest addition is their Garden City store and hopes are to open a fourth store next spring.

"Our attitude right now is one at a time," Quaal said. "We'll know when we're ready to open our next store. Our hope is to build Albie's into a small chain."

Quaal, a native of Ishpeming, meet Lochinski while they were stu-

dents at Michigan State University. He was majoring in business, Lochinski in communications.

Quaal admits that his professors didn't touch on owning your own business too much in class. Their focus was more of how to succeed in the corporate world. But those professors who did had an important message — do what needs to be done to succeed.

"That's the attitude we take," Quaal said.

On the average, they work from 70 to 80 hours a week, not in three-piece business suits, but in aprons and green Albie T-shirts. They're in the kitchen, working with the 18 to 20 employees they've hired to keep the dough rolling.

THEIR WORK days usually go from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and most mornings, you're sure to find them in the kitchen of one of the stores, grinding rutabaga, rolling dough and

making the pasties. Granted they have a lot of time-saving equipment in the kitchen — a machine that rolls out the dough balls, one that cuts peeled potatoes into neat little cubes and a grinder that turns rutabaga cubes into yellow mush.

"We grind it so it mixes more thoroughly with the meat and onion and spreads the taste throughout the

pasty," Quaal explained. "That way you taste everything in every bite."

But even with the time-saving machines, there's still between 400-500 pasties to be made each day. Most are sold the day they're made. The leftovers are frozen and sold that way for people interested in stocking their freezers.

They claim their pasties have that Upper Peninsula taste and point to

residents of Calumet, who buy their pasties and take them across the bridge.

One customer, Joanne Whell, ordered about 50 pasties for a farewell dinner for her husband's relatives, Dennis and June York, natives of Cornwall, England. Admittedly, Whell was nervous about serving an American-made Cornish dish to the Yorks, but said they were "thoroughly enjoyed."

"It made their last day in the States a good one," she said.

To make sure, they taste-test pasties made at every store every day. And while the novelty of eating pasties has worn off, they admit that they haven't gotten tired of making them.

"It's exciting when you have a big order," Lochinski said. "You spend the entire week making them and all the while you're thinking about the 500 people who are going to eat

them. It really gets you excited."

Now that they're budding businessmen, they do have a some advice for those considering self-employment.

"PATIENCE, endurance and confidence," Lochinski said. "You have to have patience because nothing happens overnight. And you have to be able to endure all those long days."

"And you have to have confidence that you have the best product. People aren't going to walk in and say they know your product is good. You have to have the confidence to tell them that it's good."

"The main thing is that whatever you do, make sure there's a market for it," Quaal added. "Second, be ready to work and make a commitment."

And as for being successful, they said their employees are "a real big part" of their making it in the business world.

Employers take a look at 'Diapers and Dollars'

On June 12, the Troy Chamber of Commerce co-sponsored a unique one-day seminar, "Diapers and Dollars," for employers in Metro Detroit.

Other sponsors included the Oakland County Community Coordinated Child Care (4Cs) Council and the Troy Education, Training and Consulting Collaborative (ETC).

The seminar, one of the first of its kind in the area, gave employers the opportunity to hear how other employers are addressing child-care issues in their workplace.

"The goal of the seminar," said organizer Deborah Shepherd of the Troy Adult and Community Education, "was to educate employers child-care does not necessarily mean 'on-site' and that addressing child-care needs will benefit company productivity, absenteeism and morale."

MORE THAN 80 employers sent representatives to the seminar. Based on the variety of businesses in attendance, it is clear that the issue of child care is being acknowledged as a growing need for today's workforce.

In addition to area hospitals and child-care centers, those attending included First of America, General Dynamics, General Motors, Ameri-



tech Publishing, Days Inn Hotel, K-Mart, La-z-boy Chair, Mazda, Michigan National Bank and many others.

The seminar provided employers with a general overview of child care and the workplace.

"The morning sessions dealt with the rationale and decision-making process—whether businesses should address child-care and how to conduct a needs assessment and research required for the best decision," said Shepherd.

AFTERNOON SESSIONS explored specific child-care options. Presenters included representatives from the UAW, Plante and Moran of Southfield, Steelcase of Grand Rapids, and St. Joseph Mercy and Mt. Carmel Mercy hospitals.

Bill Hankins of the Governor's Human Service Cabinet Council provided a legislative update relating to employer supported child care.

"We plan to do a follow-up study in about a year to assess the progress of those who attended," said Shepherd.

Caped Crusader's original 'wheels' will 'star' at mall

As the Boy Wonder might have said: "Holy Batmobile, Batman!"

The original Batmobile of the 1960s will be on display at Wonderland Mall Sunday, Aug. 13. Its appearance coincides with the resurgence of Batmania following the release of the latest "Batman" movie, starring Michael Keaton as the Caped Crusader.

Created by George Barris of Barris Kustom Industries, it took hundreds of hours to design and build the Batmobile for the television show, which aired from 1966 to 1968.

Barris is known for creating such famous cars as the Munster Coach and Monkee Mobile, as well as cars for "The Beverly Hillbillies," "Green Hornet," "Dukes of Hazzard" and super spy James Bond.

THE BASIS for the Batmobile was an experimental Ford Lincoln Futura with the 23-foot, aerodynamic body then hand-sculpted. Barris extended the

drive train 11 inches to accommodate the longer body.

Among the other features added to the car were twin plastic windscreens to protect the Dynamic Duo in high speed runs, flashing lights and a dashboard equipped with colored lights, anti-theft smoke blowers, TV monitors and emergency Bat turn levers.

The car also was powered by a moon-equipped 429 Ford racing engine, plus a dual Granitelli Paxton turbochargers and nitrous oxide thrust control. The engine also had a hydro-transmission mounted into a locked position rear end.

Barris also created the Batcycle from an enduro Yamaha and the Batboat from a Wellcraft Scarab for the show, but it's the Batmobile that attracts crowds.

THE RESURGENCE of Batmania can be seen throughout the mall, with Batman cards, shirts, lunch boxes, hats, earrings, pins, keychains, cassette tapes, watches, posters and mugs found in abundance at 18 stores.

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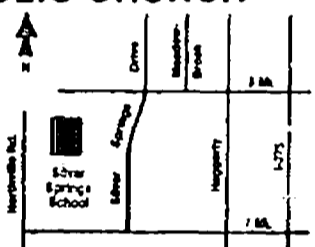
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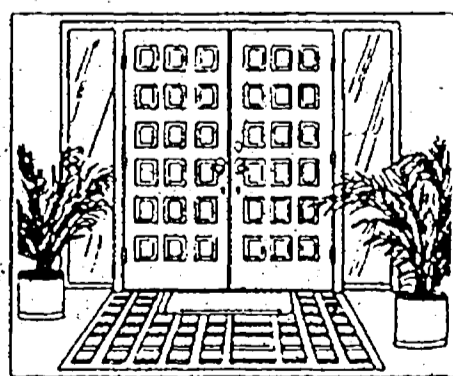


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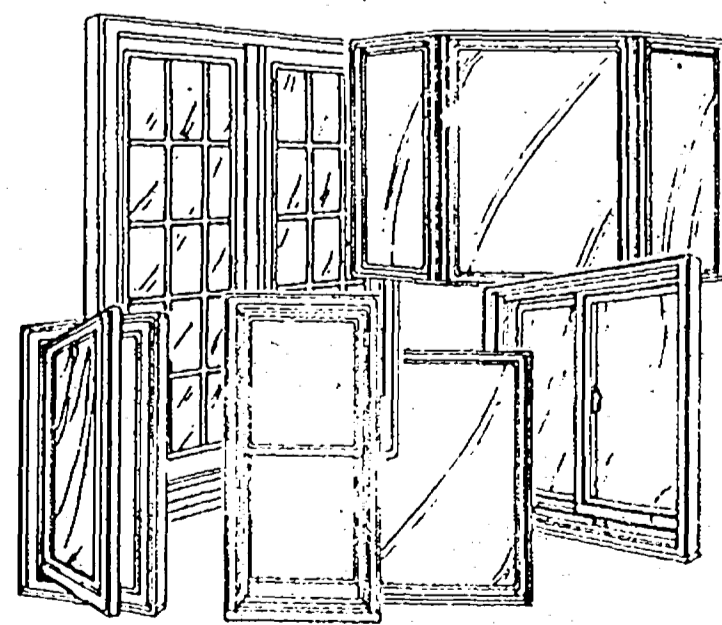

Pastor's a people person

As a college student, the Rev. William Myers Jr. used to commute from Inkster to Eastern Michigan University in Ypsilanti. He'd pass through Canton during those drives.

"When I commuted through Canton, it was entirely rural, entirely."

Myers, who has seen the community grow and change, is in Canton to stay these days. He's pastor at the Faith Community Moravian Church in Canton, a position he has held since December of 1986.

Myers, 43, grew up in Inkster, graduated from Cherry Hill High School, and attended Eastern Michigan University. He worked his way through college, earning a bachelor of business administration degree.

"I thought I was going to be an accountant." He didn't start out in the ministry. Myers spent some seven years working in the trucking industry, interspersed throughout his time at EMU.

HIS FINAL position in the trucking industry was as operations manager for the Yellow Freight System terminal in Ann Arbor.

"It was not that fulfilling. I realized I was more of a people person."

He entered the Moravian Theological Seminary in Bethlehem, Pa. That seminary's student body includes Methodists, Episcopalians, Presbyterians and those of other denominations.

Myers, a Canton resident, earned a master of divinity degree from the Moravian Theological Seminary in 1976. During his time there, he met his wife, Beth, then a senior at Moravian College.

Beth Myers, who has a degree in music, is involved in music programs and other activities at the Faith Community Moravian Church. They have two children, 13-year-old Robby and 11-year-old Sarah.

Moravian church.

"Most of my ministry, I've been a hospital chaplain." Before coming to Canton, he worked for a couple of years as a chaplain at Children's Hospital of Wisconsin in Milwaukee.

Myers was present when some 70 to 75 children died at the hospital. That work was difficult but rewarding, he was able to comfort parents whose children had died.

"It hurt a lot. I used to feel guilty when I came home and had two healthy kids at home."

BEFORE THAT, Myers worked

as the Protestant chaplain at a Catholic hospital, St. Elizabeth Hospital in Appleton, Wis.

He'd started his work as a pastor at a Moravian church in Wisconsin. That church shared a pastor with a nearby Methodist church. Sharing a pastor isn't an uncommon practice for small, rural churches, he said.

During that time, St. Elizabeth Hospital set up a volunteer chaplaincy program. Myers did that work as a volunteer for a time and was then asked to join the staff as a chaplain.

He continued to serve as pastor at the Moravian church in Wisconsin but gave up his duties at the nearby Methodist church. Myers' ministry also included some time pastoring a United Church of Christ congregation in Wisconsin. That was an interim position he held between his time at the two hospitals.

The Faith Community Moravian Church has about 150 members. The church began in 1978, with services held at Pioneer Middle School; members have been meeting in the church building on Warren in Canton since the early 1980s.

The Moravian church is one of the oldest Protestant denominations, Myers said. Its roots go back some 100 years before the time of religious reformer and theologian Martin Luther, leader of the Protestant Reformation in Germany.

A Roman Catholic priest, John Hus, was attempting at that time to reform the practices of his church.

HUS OPPOSED the practice of granting indulgences; he argued

that forgiveness could not be granted by the church and that doing so was contrary to the Bible's teachings. Hus was burned at the stake in 1415.

Some say Vatican II, which in the 1960s altered worship practices and teachings of the Catholic church, vindicated Hus. He was in many ways a man some 400 years before his time, Myers said.

Historically, the Moravian church has emphasized the importance of missionary work. The majority of Moravians are non-white, with the largest provinces found in Africa.

Myers hasn't gone overseas to do missionary work, but does know about those efforts. He's a ham radio operator and has gotten to know many missionaries through that work.

There are three Moravian churches in Michigan, including the Grace Moravian Church in Westland and a church in Unionville, in the thumb area.

The job Myers has at the Canton church includes varied duties. He's the worship leader and the primary manager of day-to-day activities. His work includes planning, implementing programs, meeting new people in the community and counseling. Myers recently returned from a youth camp session in Ohio, an enjoyable but somewhat tiring activity.

Paperwork isn't his favorite task. Myers enjoys the one-on-one contact, "being able to enjoy people, to laugh with them, but at the same time to be with them in the not so happy times too."

We cannot abandon our values

Two young men confronted me with their question. What should the president do about the hanging of Lt. Col. William Higgins by the Muslim extremists? They were stirred by reports of U.S. Naval ships going to the area. The two young men pushed more for an answer.

It is not just the United States. You have to put Israel into the picture. The fundamentalists on both Jewish and Arab sides will not give an inch. They both are demanding what they believe is God's will. Neither side will forget or forgive.

Our country is perceived as a supporter of Israel. I explained that the solution will not be made by a few actions by our own country. I also stated that the greatest mistake that we could make was to escalate the violence.

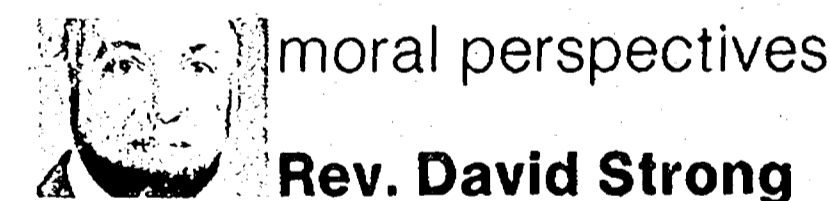
The two young men illustrate the idea that we "must do something." The young men express the attitude

that America is so powerful that we can fix problems like this.

I asked my friends how many people had been killed in the latest airliner crash. Higgins is one man. Why will we risk war and further retaliation because of one man? It is our pride and status as a nation, this is what prods us to do something.

CERTAINLY WE feel compassion for the hostages. We do everything possible to seek their release. We must also relate our own moral values to what we would ask our nation to do. We cannot hold one set of moral values as individuals and then ask the nation to function with an entirely different set of values.

Would the average American order a shelling of a portion of a city in another country? Would you or I lead a terror mission designed to kill terrorists? The newspapers report that some of our nation's officials complain that Congress has with-

drawn the CIA's capability to fight terror with terror. Fine, it is better to preserve the values of our nation than for us to adopt the terrorists' own methods.

I have traveled in the Middle East. I know that there are many both on the Arab and Israeli sides who want the conflict to continue. It is in their interest to prevent peace. There are many nations who do business with Iran. It is in their best interest. The problems there will not be solved by any one nation. Agreement must be

built among the nations.

IN THE meanwhile, we must not bow to patriotic pressures to attack. We need to keep our own moral posture in mind when we urge our leaders to resort to violence.

Winning, in this situation, means holding true to our principles. Success means counteracting the crisis images promoted by the news media. As a ship's captain would say, "Hold her steady as she goes. We will stay on course and weather the storm."

Black marriages face a higher risk of breaking up

The marriages of black men who are deeply concerned about their ability to provide for their families are at greatest risk for separation or divorce, according to a University of Michigan study of the first four years of marriage.

"No matter what their income, young black men are subject to acute anxiety about their role as providers," the U-M researchers said. "This anxiety may lead them to be leery of marriage in the first place, and once married, it may continue to cloud their marital commitment."

"White husbands in our study also worried about family finances, but that concern didn't seem to predict marriage problems."

The researchers were Shirley Hatchett, assistant research scientist at the U-M Institute for Social Research; Elizabeth Douvan, professor of psychology and research scientist; and Joseph Veroff, professor of psychology and faculty associate.

The four-year study is in its first year, with the data collected during annual interviews in 1986, '87 and '88 with 199 black and 174 white couples randomly selected in the Detroit metropolitan area. All the brides were under age 36 and all the couples were in their first marriages.

The separation and divorce rate for black couples is about 2½ times greater than the rate for white couples. According to the study, black marriages are also more likely to be at risk if:

- The husband says he is not emotionally satisfied or fulfilled by the marriage.

- THE HUSBAND'S father is well educated.

- The wife has very strong kinship ties with her own family and feels her in-laws are intrusive.

- The husband and wife each have separate groups of friends.

- The wife is very young.

"All of these factors can affect any marriage, but we found that they were much more likely to have

an impact on the stability of black marriages," the researchers stressed.

Sharing decision making power is a difficult for black men because for historical reasons, power in the home is particularly important to them, the researchers said.

"American black men and women traditionally have been out of sync with mainstream gender roles. In the past, blacks lived in a world where men were supposed to be powerful and women were supposed to be protected. In reality, however, black men were not powerful and black women could not be protected," they added.

The researchers were surprised at first to find that the sons of educated

black fathers were likely to have unstable marriages. But like the economic and power issues, the finding is less surprising when considering the educated black male in an histor-

ical and social context, they said.

Educated black men always have faced unusual pressures which put stress on their marriages and their children, the researchers said. Many

of the fathers of the men in the study entered adulthood before the civil rights movement, when well educated blacks were lucky to get jobs as railroad porters or postal workers. The lack of mobility and opportunity led to resentment and frustration.


THE FATHERS who became adults during and after the civil rights movement faced a different but equally stressful situation, for now they were getting jobs never held by blacks before, the researchers said.

"In both periods, the fathers may have taken out their stress on their spouses, and these frustrated, anxious, distressed fathers were the role

models for the sons who are now getting married."

They also discovered that, contrary to popular notion that black kinship ties are a strength in black marriages, wives who were firmly attached to their own families and who reported problems with their in-laws, were likely to have troubled marriages.

"Many of these wives had been single parents before marriage and may have received a great deal of support from their families. Those ties, however, eventually may have hampered the development of integrated family networks with the couple at the center," the researchers said.



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

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Credit card doctors can make you ill

A new scam is afoot, one involving "doctors" and "patients," but it has nothing to do with medical care.

In this case, "doctors" are con artists armed with computers, and "patients" are consumers in need of improved credit ratings.

"Doctors" steal good credit ratings from computer files maintained by local credit bureaus and then sell the information to "patients" willing to pay \$500 to \$1,500 for the service. (See accompanying story.)

Relatively new on the consumer scene, the scam is thought to have originated in Houston, Texas, according to Deborah Nigbor of the Detroit Better Business Bureau. She said police there have uncovered goods amounting to approximately \$15 million, bought by consumers using doctored credit ratings.

"They're buying everything from small merchandise to automobiles to homes," she said, citing one instance in which an unsuspecting Houston auto dealer sold 93 vehicles to different consumers, each using doctored ratings.

BASED ON THE possibility of big profits and the relative ease in fraudulently obtaining credit information, it is believed the scam is apt to spread quickly to other parts of the country.

"There are many techniques for obtaining credit files, and I'm certain profits must be good" based on how fast the scam is growing, Nigbor said.

In Texas operations, "doctors" obtain code numbers to local credit bureaus and access computer files with home computers and telephone modems.

BUT ACCESS to credit bureau files is not easy, according to Darlene Taylor, operations manager of Trans Union Credit Information in Southfield. It is one of the larger credit bureaus in the nation.

"There are levels and levels and levels of security to keep (computer) hackers off the system. It's a must in our business," Taylor said.

Jennifer Neu of another major credit bureau, TRW Information

Services in Farmington Hills, agrees.

TRW maintains more than 143 million files in 75,000 locations throughout the country, accessible only through sophisticated codes. Even if codes are broken, stolen or otherwise obtained, requests for information are closely monitored by a security computer program.

"Any deviation from use by legitimate subscribers, time, volume, location, specifics, anything out of the ordinary, is instantly noted," Neu said.

All suspicious use is immediately investigated.

MOREOVER, FILES maintained by credit bureaus frequently do not contain detailed information normally required in establishing new credit or securing loans, such as driver license numbers or mother's maiden name and date of birth.

Chris Anderson of Credit Bureau Reports Inc. in Farmington Hills works as a middleman. She solicits credit information from Trans Union, TRW and other credit bureaus, passing the data along to her clients, banks and mortgage companies lending large sums of money for the purchase of new homes.

Anderson receives numerous calls from irate consumers attempting to obtain homes loans and claiming credit report information supplied to the bank or mortgage company is inaccurate.

"It happens all the time, people calling and saying information is incorrect," Anderson said.

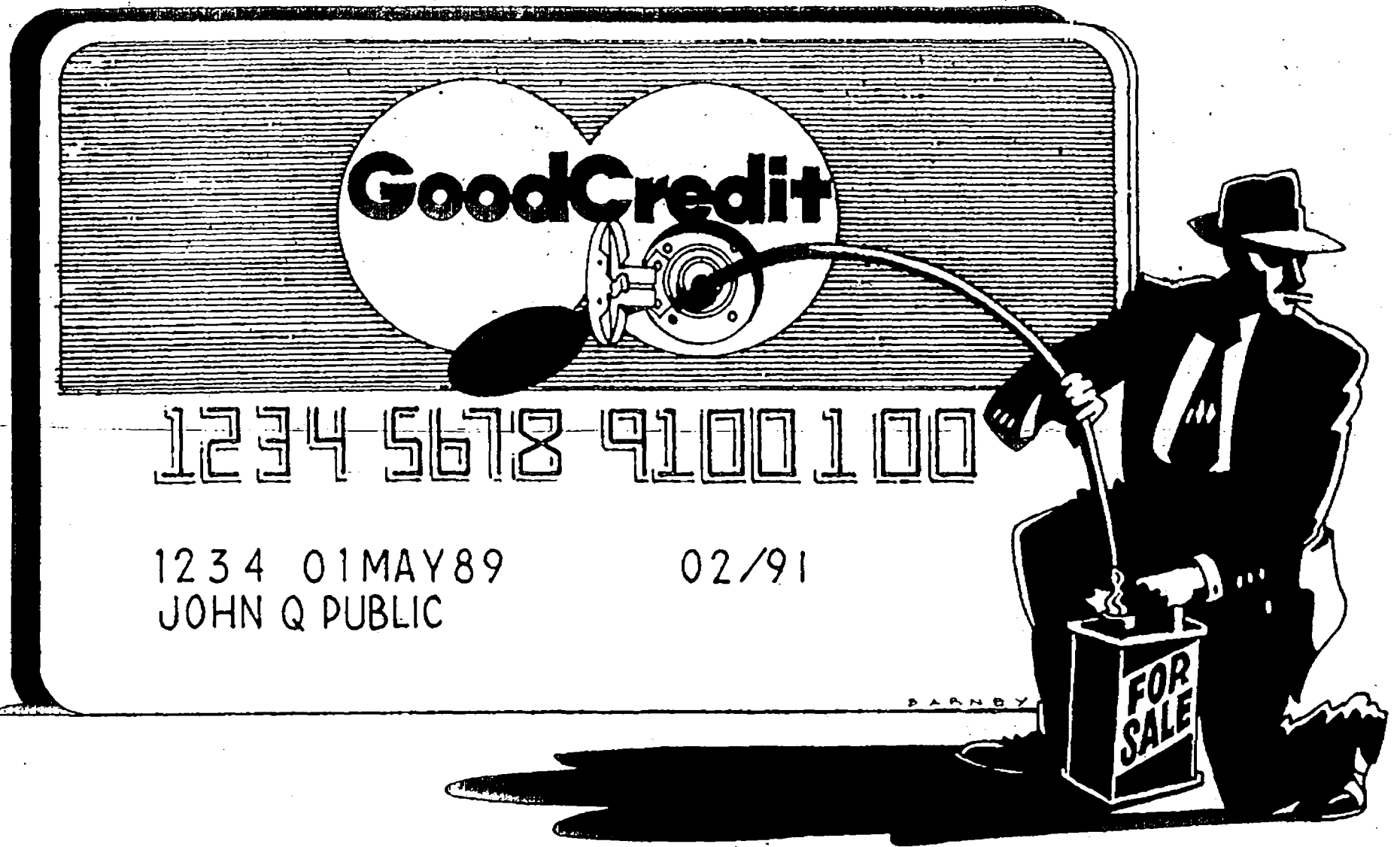
SHE ASCERTAINS accuracy by contacting the lender in question.

"If Art Van says they owe money, I call Art Van directly."

If the information proves inaccurate, she corrects the error, never learning the reason why mistaken information was originally included.

Queries by Anderson and others is often the first time "innocent consumers" learn they owe for goods they have never bought, merchandise bought by others using their credit information, according to Nigbor.

"Negative information is contained in their ratings. Sometimes



they are even asked to foot the bill," she said.

The best guard is periodic inspection of your own ratings maintained by firms like TRW or Trans Union.

NIGBOR ALSO advises lenders to verify employment history in addition to credit ratings, as an added precaution against fraud.

In computer credit fraud, both "doctor" and "patient" are liable for prosecution on charges of fraud, according to an agent in the FBI's Troy office — the "doctor" for supplying fraudulent information and the "patient" for using it.

If, for example, a home is bought and the lending institution requests a title search by mail, wire fraud has been committed, punishable by up to five years in prison. If the phone is used to transact business, wire fraud may be involved, also punishable by up to five years in prison.

Supplying fraudulent and false statements to secure new credit or a loan constitutes a felony punishable by a fine of \$5,000 and up to two years in prison.

Computer fraud also violates such federal laws as the Fair Credit Rating Act and the Computer Fraud and Abuse Act, each punishable by up to one year in prison and fines of up to \$5,000.

Texas, an agent said, "makes sense" as a center of credit fraud.

"Whenever the economic climate is poor, people tend to walk away from mortgages they can't pay," Nigbor said.

Rewriting credit history 'cures' deadbeat's woes

Credit "doctor" fraud normally follows a common routine.

Let's assume you're an average, hard-working, honest consumer who nearly always pays bills on time. Your credit rating is pretty good.

Then, out of the blue you receive a call from a collection agency, harassing you about an overdue bill. This is the first you've heard of the bill. No doubt a case of mistaken identity. But the collection agency seems to have detailed and correct information about you and your credit rating.

The collector, familiar with claims of mistaken identity, is persistent. The conversation becomes heated. Chances are, neither of you

suspect credit fraud.

Here's how it works, according to Marvin Kaplan of Associated Credit Bureaus in Houston, Texas, where this particular form of fraud has found fertile ground. Millions of dollars in merchandise has been purchased by patients of credit doctors.

A poor credit risk needs an improved rating. He or she approaches a credit doctor who, for a hefty fee, sells him your good credit rating.

The credit "doctor" knows the code number and password that allows him entry to computer records maintained by credit bureaus. He or she locates a history that best matches the client. The credit rating happens to be yours.

Once the information is purchased, the buyer changes your address and phone number. Both are usually fictitious. Then, he or she applies for credit, charging merchandise or obtaining a loan without ever making a payment.

The lender, unaware of the scam, sends past due notices to the fictitious address for several months, before turning the account over to a collection agency.

The collector contacts you. He or she has no way of knowing you are not the person who made the fraudulent credit purchase. The collector is as innocent as you are and assumes you are trying to throw him off track in collecting what appears to be a legitimate overdue account.

Know thy credit rating

Stored in the computer of one of the nation's 2,000 credit bureaus is a detailed listing of how much you owe on personal loans and credit cards, how quickly you pay these bills and how many times your payments have been late.

Most of us have no idea what our credit reports say — until it's too late. Jane, for example, didn't know her credit report erroneously said that she had defaulted on a student loan until a bank rejected her mortgage application. By the time the mistake was corrected, the house she wanted to buy had been sold.

To prevent such last-minute credit problems, the Farmington Hills-based Michigan Association of CPAs suggests you check your credit report periodically. In most cases, your record is probably filed with one of the country's five largest credit bureaus: Trans Union, TRW, Chilton, CBA or Associated Credit Services.

As a general rule, credit bureaus usually will charge a fee ranging from \$3 to \$25 for a copy of your credit report. If you have been denied credit on the basis of information supplied by a credit bureau, the creditor must provide the name and address of a credit bureau issuing the report on which it based its decision. You then have 30 days to request a free copy of your report. You must supply the credit bureau with your full name, telephone number, Social Security number and the name of the party that denied your credit application. Expect to receive a copy of your report in two to three weeks.

The average credit report can be bewildering to read. Nowhere in the report will you find a simple sentence explaining whether you are a good credit risk. A credit report does not issue any judgment on your credit reliability. Instead, it provides a

factual but selective account of your employment and credit history. For example, the credit report may list an inactive department store charge account but make no mention of how you handle your utility bills or your mortgage payments.

At the heart of the report is your credit history, translated into an elaborate system of number and letter codes to indicate how you have handled debt over the years. A key to the codes is found on the form.

Although the format of a credit report will vary between credit bureaus, the information contained is essentially the same. Generally, the report will detail the name, number, type and activity of credit cards issued in your name; the amount of your credit limits and the amount of your outstanding balances.

OTHER ITEMS that may be found in a credit file include the names of the companies that have requested copies of your report as well as notations indicating whether you have been involved in civil suits or bankruptcy proceedings. All of this information is provided to the credit bureau by your creditors or other parties.

If you find an error on your credit report, you should write to the credit bureau immediately. When Jane informed the credit bureau she had paid off her student loan some seven years earlier, the credit bureau investigated her case and found that the issuer of the loan had somehow switched her records with those of another consumer.

When a credit bureau determines a mistake has been made or if it cannot verify the information in its files, the items in question must be deleted from your credit report. You may discover that a credit report presents certain correct but derogatory information out of context. In such instances, you should mail a concise explanation (approximately 100 words) to the credit bureau summarizing your side of the story.

Consider this example. After being denied a credit card, Paul checked his credit record, which showed he had paid his car loan and credit card bills late for a period of four to five months. The information was correct, but during this time Paul's wife was undergoing treatment for cancer. The late payments were a result of the financial and personal stress he suffered at that time. At the recommendation of his financial adviser, Paul sent a letter to the credit bureau explaining the circumstances behind his uncharacteristic period of late payments.

Paul also asked the credit bureau to send this information to any creditors who had denied his applications in the past six months.

HOW LONG CAN a negative statement be kept on your record? If the statement relates to bankruptcy proceedings, it may stay on file for as long as 10 years.

The Michigan Association of CPAs suggests consumers write to the Federal Trade Commission Correspondence Branch, Washington, D.C. 20580 for a copy of the Fair Credit Reporting Act of 1971, which clearly explains their rights to credit information.

Finally, a sale that really means business.

Sort of like "a Coke" used to work in a res-

taurant without a followup question like: "Classic Coke or Diet Coke?"

THE LAST real Chevy (pronounced Chivvy) that Chevrolet ever built was a straight-six Nova, preferably gunmetal blue with an automatic transmission. A nun's car, as a guy I worked with who had dropped out of a Jesuit seminary called it. Also once described as a "Heavy Chevy Blue-Bomber Special" by a young woman acquaintance who drove one, who also left me convinced that a \$600 car bought with the earnings of a first job can look as good as a faded pair of jeans.

A proper Chevy improved with age, like wine, or at least aged with dignity, managing a certain aplomb even while propped on a couple of cinder blocks with the engine hanging from the limb of a tree. A proper Chevy engine came apart with a

Crescent wrench, the seats quickly developed a patina that resisted further staining, and you were allowed one or two holes generated by a screwdriver left in your hip pocket.

Near the end of the line old Chevys kind of blurred together, like old married couples who begin to resemble each other, as a red door got rehung on a blue car and a transplant transmission was installed that slipped a little less.

BUT THEY were unquestionably Chevys.

All of this came to mind as I read about the efforts of Jim Perkins, who is to Chevrolet what Billy Martin is to the Yankees, struggling to improve the brand identity of Geo with Chevrolet dealers by spending a bundle on a new ad campaign.

Along with trying to make Geo a household word, Perkins has to sell a bunch of cars with names like Lumina, Celebrity, Corsica and Beretta — the latter the subject of a lawsuit by the handgun manufacturer of the

same name. Try those on a parking lot attendant while you are in a hurry sometime.

Not that proliferating names and confusing customers was invented by Chevrolet. Chrysler still is trying to sell cars through more divisional umbrellas than General Motors, although to its credit it still makes things simple by calling most of them LeBaron. Even the most recognizable importers such as Volkswagen keep making up names to further confuse their customers, some of whom are still waiting for a phone call on their used Dasher.

Worst of all are relatively new marques such as Mitsubishi, with such unfamiliar names they are as likely to end up in the stereo section of the classifieds as the auto section.

The lack of brand identity can plague you in mysterious ways. The

other day I heard a story about a guy trying to sell a Mitsubishi who waited about a week without a single call. Finally, he changed the ad to read that he had a Honda to sell, and was deluged. To the inquiries, he claimed that the paper made a mistake, but you ought to see this Mitsubishi anyway. He sold the car in a day.

When I stop to think about it, there isn't a single car on sale today that conjures up an undiluted image in my mind when I hear its name. Jeep comes close, but that's before you realize there isn't a simple "Jeep" anymore — it's XJ, Sahara, Wrangler, etc.

It's enough to make you want to reach for a box of Kleenex.

Closed-end mutuals for income

Q. You had a recent column in which you named some stocks where you came up with a current income almost as good as you could get on one- to two-year CDs. Would you show me some other ways to get a higher return from common stock?

A. This week I had a market letter come across my desk from the Chicago-based brokerage firm of Wayne Hummer & Co. that pointed out the bargains in value and income you could get in a number of closed-end investment funds. As you may know, the shares of closed-end funds sell on the market like other shares of stock and frequently can be bought for less than their net asset value.

The brokerage firm named three very high-quality funds.

One was Adams Express. It recently was selling at \$15½, yet if

all of its holdings were liquidated, it would have yielded \$18.20.

OVER THE past 10 years, the average annual dividend has provided a yield of 12.4 percent. The major holdings of Adams Express are IBM, GM, McDonalds, Coca-Cola, Merck and Wal-Mart.

Another similar investment is Lehman Corp. It was selling at \$13, yet had an asset value of \$15.77.

Over the last 10 years, its dividends have provided an average return of 13.7 percent on net assets.

This fund's major holdings are IBM, Digital Equipment, Philip Morris, ITT Corp., K mart Corp. and Marion Labs. This fund emphasizes growth more than the other two funds.

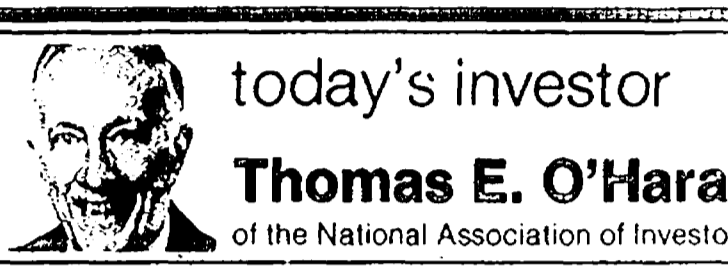
THE THIRD suggestion was Tri-Continental. This is the biggest closed-end fund. It was selling at \$22½ and had a net asset value of \$27.11. Its major objectives are long-term appreciation and growth in income.

Its largest holdings are Boeing, Time, Disney, GTE, Ford, Deere

and AT&T. Its dividend average over the last 10 years has been 13.6 percent of net assets.

These funds do not always trade as such substantial discounts, but if you watch them for periods when they are out of favor, you may get an excellent value. As you can see from their major holdings, they all stress quality.

Snooty help can impact sales

Small business retailers, beware. Your employees may be exhibiting "snob syndrome," a malady found in those who deal with the public in establishments known for their upscale image and clientele. When employees begin to play judge and jury with every customer who walks through your doors, you stand to lose a great deal over the long term.

Anyone who has patronized a posh store without being dressed for it knows what I'm talking about. "I remember the time a friend and I went shopping for purses," says one Oakland County business owner. "We were dressed in our jeans, so nobody wanted to wait on us. Instead the salespeople were fawning over some woman who was trying to decide on a scarf, and here we were, ready to spend at least a few hundred dollars between the two of us. Needless to

say, we bought the purses somewhere else."

What causes a salesperson to take on the role of snob as part of his or her daily dealings with customers?

"I think salespeople who act that way are very insecure, generally speaking," said Catherine Kasten, a Plymouth resident and self-employed computer specialist. "If these people are gossips by nature, then it isn't surprising to see them judging customers they know nothing about."

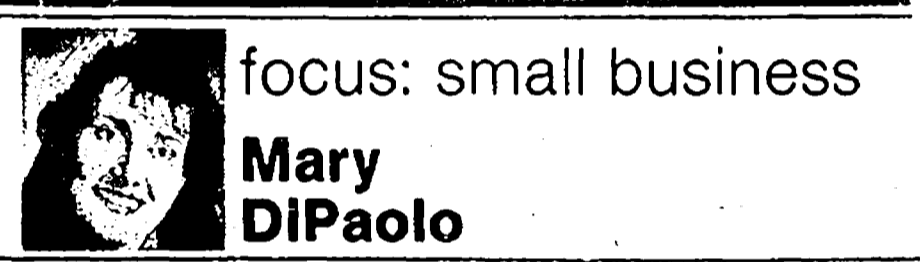
Business owners and managers who have received complaints about snooty sales personnel should always treat these types of incidents seriously. "If the manager or owner doesn't seem to care or doesn't act on the complaint immediately, you've got to question where they're at in terms of their own attitudes and behaviors," Kasten said. "When-

ever I've had problems and found the management to be uncooperative or apathetic, I make a point to warn friends about the business and how it operates."

No business stands to benefit by hiring or retaining employees who take it upon themselves to judge the "right" from the "wrong" customers. Every customer should be treated with the same amount of respect and service regardless of the size or nature of the sale.

Next week, we will discuss what can be done to deal with employees and co-workers who instigate such problems.

Marauders down Bud Light in final

Brennan tallies game-winner; Cobras feel slighted in semis

There were plenty of nifty passes made Sunday in the Great Lakes Men's Soccer League title game played between the Livonia Marauders and Bud Light.

But the most important assist of the chilly night at Bicentennial Park came from a rock.

John Brennan's seemingly harmless shot from 30 yards out late in the game hit a stone, took a bad hop and bounced over the head of Bud Light goalkeeper Mark West, giving the Marauders a 3-2 win and the Clarke Cup.

Brennan, a Dearborn resident who plays at Oakland University, was accepting congratulations afterward when teammate Jim Rhoads joked, "the assist goes to a rock."

BRENNAN NODDED.

"I didn't think it was going in, that's for sure," Brennan said. "I was just trying to create something."

The bad hop wasn't the only misfortune suffered by Bud Light. Bud lost Carl Hopfinger late in the first half because of a red-card infraction, and that meant the team had to play short a man the rest of the match.

Light, which scored the game's first goal, was able to move the ball beyond midfield several times late in the game despite being shorthanded.

"The red card definitely hurts," Bud Light coach Kevin Fiebertz said. "It was a hard-fought match. There's nothing we can do about it. We were a little unlucky today."

"I still felt we carried the play after the card. We had opportunities. These two teams are evenly matched."

THIS WAS THE first year the Marauders have won both a league regular-season title and the Clarke Cup, which signifies the playoff champion. The Marauders, who were the defending Clarke Cup champions, were 8-0-1 during the regular season.

Defender/midfielder Dan O'Shea is the team's elder statesman in terms of experience, although he's only 24.

"This is without a doubt the best Marauders' team I've played on," said O'Shea, who played at Oakland University and Livonia Franklin. "And Bud Light's the strongest (GLMSL) team I've ever played against. It was a really rough game."

"They played harder once they went down a man. We tended to push forward more thinking we should be

ahead but they'll catch you flat-footed with their good forwards."

Chris Larson, one of Light's most dangerous forwards, tied the score at 2-2 midway through the second half when he headed Chris Koppi's corner kick past Marauders' goalie Colin Jex.

THE TEAMS were tied 1-1 at halftime but former Livonia Stevenson standout Gary Mexicotte gave the Marauders a 2-1 lead early in the second half.

Bud Light took the game's first lead on a goal by Jay Ruby, but the Marauders' Steve Morell evened the count minutes later, converting a crossing pass from Bob Neuman.

Although the Marauders finished the season undefeated, coach John Petterson said his team learned midway through that a team can go only so far on talent alone.

"This team was the most talented I've had, but we learned a lesson midway through that talent alone doesn't win games," he said. "We were in a slump the last three or four games and said 'This is it.' We decided we were going to shut our mouths and play hard."

TROY COBRAS UPSET: The Marauders received a scare last Thursday in the semifinal against the Troy Cobras, and were fortunate, perhaps, to advance to the finals. The Marauders and Cobras were locked in a scoreless tie Thursday after two overtime periods when the game was called because of darkness.

League rules state the game must be re-played the next day, said Dan Bowman, the neutral GLMSL representative for the semifinal game.

The Cobras had to forfeit Friday's re-scheduled game, however, because several players were attending the wedding of teammate Joe Moreau.

Cobra player Walt Kilza said his team told Petterson, who is the president and registrar of the league, that they could field a team Saturday.

But Bowman had jurisdiction of the game because of Petterson's involvement in the playoffs. Bowman decided the rule book takes precedence.

"It's not a very fair way to determine who goes to the final," said Kilza, a 1981 Livonia Bentley graduate. "A semifinal game should be decided on the field, not around a table — you know, politics."

"We're all very upset. I wouldn't have had any regrets if we would have lost with the winner going to the finals. In this situation that wasn't the case. But I respect the Marauder players."

Buff Whelan captures 'screwed-up' NABF title

Rey Fracassi, the manager for Duffy's Plumbing, may have summed up best the National Amateur Baseball Federation's College Division regional last weekend at Livonia's Ford Field.

"This is the most screwed-up draw

of any tournament that I've been associated with," he said.

The eventual winner of the five-team tournament, Buff Whelan Chevrolet, won in a peculiar way.

The Detroit Adray League representative played a triple-header on Sunday, capped off by a 9-7 victory, a game which inched past the stroke of midnight, against Livonia Collegi-

ate Baseball League representative Hines Park Lincoln/Mercury.

Whelan manager Dr. Joe Arends, whose team advances to the NABF finals today in Dayton, Ohio, said, "I've never had a longer day of baseball."

"I'm sure tired after 27 innings of ball, but can you imagine how these kids feel? But I'm not terribly surprised. The NABF has never been a highly organized group."

Sunday started with three survivors — Whelan, Hines Park and Duffy's (the other LCBL representative).

After taking a 13-2 pounding Saturday afternoon from Whelan, Duffy's came back in Sunday's opener to hand the Detroit squad its first loss of the double-elimination tournament, 8-1.

Stuart Hirschman, a 17-year-old pickup by Fracassi, threw eight strong innings to earn the victory. Jason Hicks came on in the eighth to finish up as the Detroiters were held to just two hits.

Duffy's collected 12 hits, led by Ron Makowski's 3-for-3 effort. Mike Kaczmarek, Todd Fracassi and Lee Tappy, all from Observerland high schools, added two hits apiece. Shortstop Steve Michelz knocked in a pair of runs.

BUT AFTER reviewing the NABF tournament bylaws, Duffy's was forced to play Whelan again in the second game on Sunday.

The reason? Both Whelan and Duffy's had already been given byes, while Hines Park, which had been scraping by in the loser's bracket, was entitled to its first bye on Sunday.

"We play Buff Whelan three straight times and never once play Hines Park, a team in our own league . . . tell me that makes sense," said Fracassi.

In Sunday's second game, Whelan eliminated Duffy's in a squeaker, 6-5, as relief pitcher Joe Skalsgir came on in the eighth inning to slam the door on Duffy's.

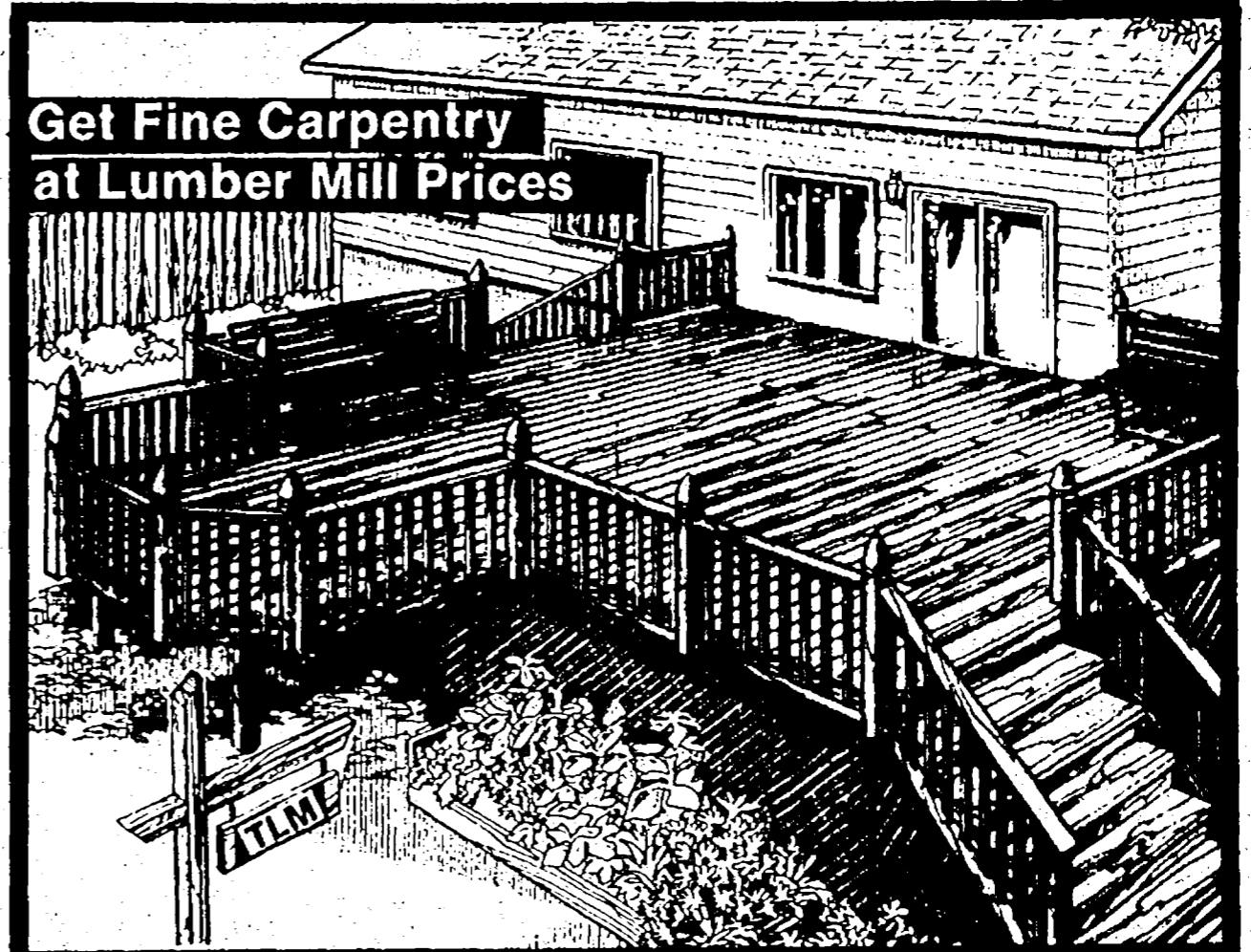

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
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
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Mustangs grab silver

Potts scored his second goal and gave the Broncos their only lead at 11:11 in the third, drilling a centering pass from Stahley on the power play.

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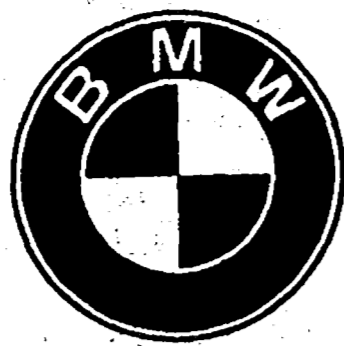
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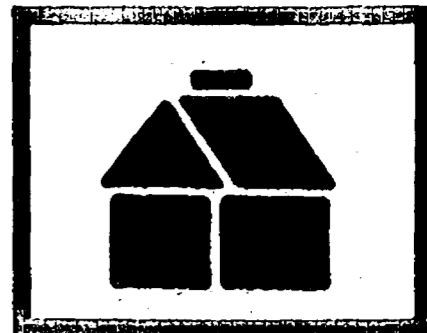

Eye for beauty Art-oriented office design suits surgeons

Art sends few stronger messages than those in the offices of three doctors specializing in cosmetic surgery in Bingham Farms. It is reassuring to find that all three have eye for color, design, line and aesthetic values of all kinds of art.

Drs. E. Jan Beekhuis and Jeffrey J. Colton recently added a partner, Michael F. Milan, and doubled their office space. With the help of Susan Monroe architect and Vicki Beekhuis, interior designer, the offices were renovated and expanded from 2,600 to 5,200 square feet. Architect and designer succeeded in balancing opposites — sophistica-

tion and warmth; and privacy (when necessary) with a feeling of openness and light.

The waiting room is luxurious and contemporary in style with polished marble floors and carpeting in a deep shade of raisin. The color theme throughout is black, white and raisin with touches of dark brown.

"There is a lot of very dark and

very light," said Vicki Beekhuis. The reception area in the elegant, softly lighted, waiting room has been greatly expanded. From the new counter, there is a wide open view of the inner offices with sunlight filtered through the new glass brick wall panels and colorful works of art on white walls in the hall and offices beyond. The whole area sends a

coming message of friendliness and good taste.

READILY VISIBLE from several vantage points are a framed Navaho piece which Colton smilingly referred to as a "physician's desk reference for Navaho people" a Margie Hughto painting. Colton said the medicine man carries these paintings on cloth with him when he goes to visit a patient. He unrolls them on the ground to refresh his memory, each has symbols and instructions in sign language on what to do about a particular malady. Hughto's painting on handmade paper, a trademark of this nationally known artist, author and teacher, is light, refreshing and definitely uplifting.

From a large empty area (to expand the offices), Beekhuis and Monroe created a hall with examining rooms and an office along the outside wall. The hallway wall is staggered glass brick panels which give the area an artistic dimension that a flat straight wall never could while providing privacy and lots of pleasant light for the small rooms.

The wall design, Beekhuis said, "Allows the light to move in and out." At the end of the hall is a large striking, abstract painting by Ray Frost Fleming of Birmingham and along the straight sided hall wall is a long, rectangular, framed work of art in brilliantly colored and sculpted handmade paper by New Mexico artist, David McCarthy. Colors and design lead the viewer's eye in a most appealing way.

The lighting in the long hall is small, low voltage, incandescent track lighting, similar to that used in

many art galleries. Beekhuis said it lights the art well and provides drama.

Another Hughto work is around the corner in one of the smaller rooms. The art in the examining rooms is pleasant, undisturbing scenes — nothing about food, since many of the patients are there for liposuction.

EACH DOCTOR'S OFFICE, however, is highly individual and says a lot about the occupant. Dr. Beekhuis's office contains artifacts which he has brought back from his world travels. Colton's, done by interior designer Sheldon Scott a number of years ago and still holding up beautifully, has a wall display of masks from Indonesia, Bali and Africa.

"I have an interest in masks," Colton said, "I'm interested in the features and the way different cultures see themselves." He pointed out the broken nose on one of the African masks.

Beekhuis said Milan's office is going to be done in an Amish style with plain, handsome pieces with a handcrafted look to them: Colton and Dr. Beekhuis share an interest in art. Colton admires paintings by an artist which his partner found in Australia that have colorful, almost childlike quality.

"Both of us seem to like similar kinds of things," said Colton.

Architect and interior designer found the doctors receptive to their ideas to take out walls, create interesting spaces, heighten the drama, make the offices sophisticated and still keep the atmosphere pleasant, open and friendly.

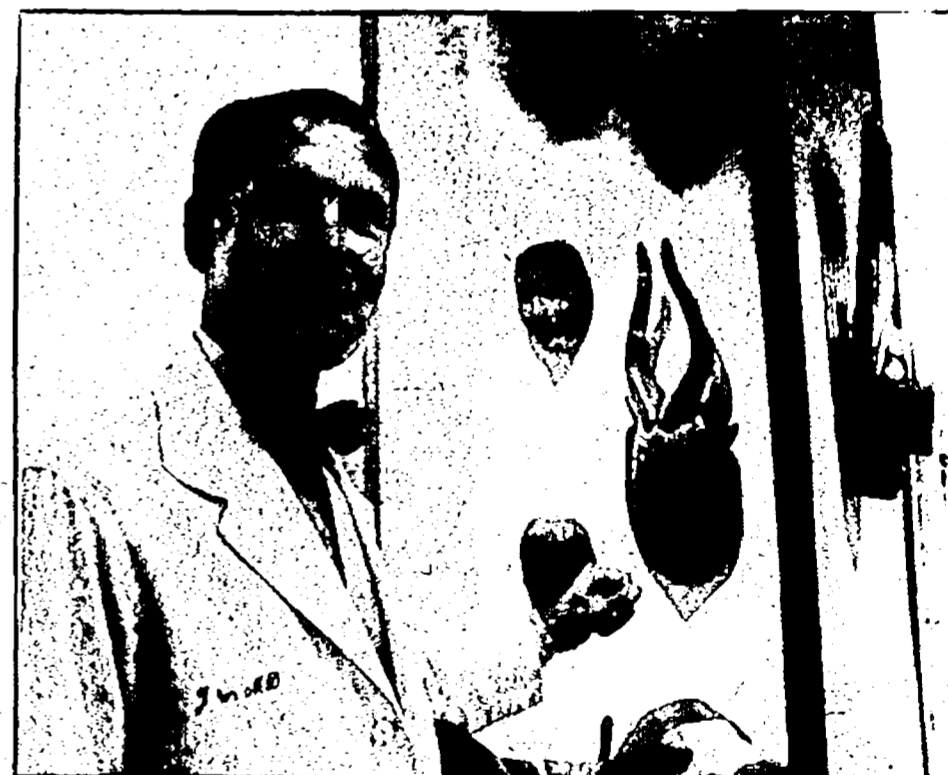
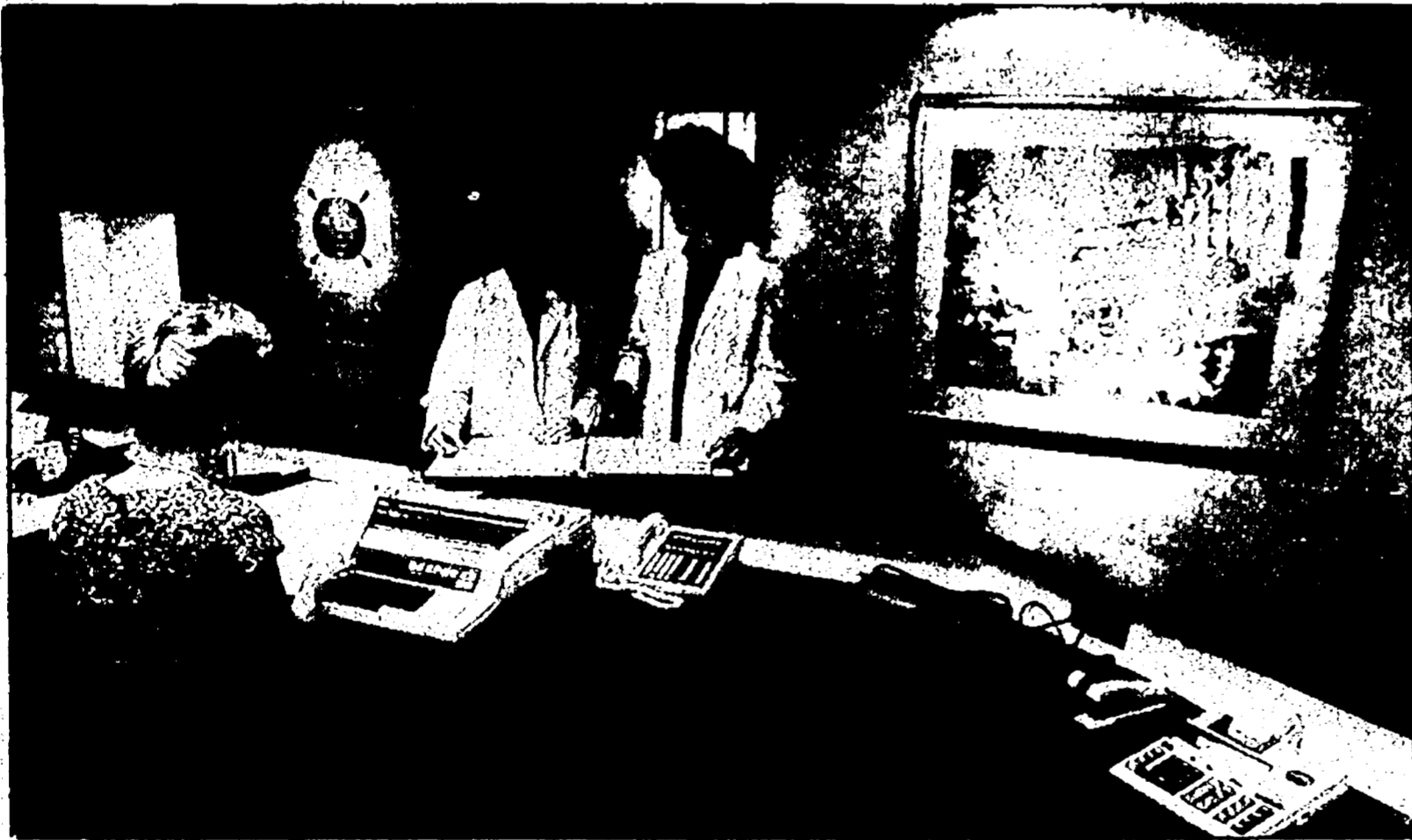

Auto art sets record

The art which was on display and for sale as part of the Concours d'Elegance at Meadow Brook last weekend, set new records in interest as well as prices realized.

Tom Hale, chairman of the Invitational art exhibition, said he was delighted with the response from the public.

At the Saturday evening auction, the original painting by Pete Malar of Buck Hill Falls, Pa. for this year's poster brought a record \$31,000. That's \$8,000 more than was paid for the original painting for the 1988 Concours. Malar's finely detailed, egg tempera painting of the 1929 Packard convertible parked at the front entrance of Meadow Brook Hall is 48 by 64 inches. Benton — all-American as apple pie

How could Thomas Hart Benton be labeled regional? He's so all-American — so in love with the cities, the rural landscape, the history, the customs — most of all the people, the kids, the old men, the gangsters and bootleggers, the movie crowd and the pretty young women.

Yet that's the label he continues to have — he's a regionalist artist. He may have been born and raised in Neosho, Mo., but he studied in Paris and lived on the east coast a good part of his life.

The exhibition of his work at the Detroit Institute of Arts through Oct. 15 is a colorful, stimulating walk through Benton's development as an artist as well as through American history. He planned to do a series of 75 large paintings, "The Explorers and Adventurers of Early America," but grew tired of it after 18 paintings deciding he would rather paint real life scenes.

One large gallery in the exhibition is filled with these strong, aggressive works. Yet the paintings that seem most alive are those filled with colorful characters, busily engrossed in the tasks and pleasures that make up their daily lives. It wouldn't be a bit surprising to hear strains of "Ameri-

Travel jaunts between bookends

I'VE taken a lot of trips this summer. I've explored the Great Smokey Mountains, a number of bizarre bazaars in the Far East, the sidewalks of New York, the road to Morocco, and the shore of Lake Superior. I've even soaked up some of the atmosphere in Australia's rugged outback.

No, I'm not a bit tired. And not once did I have to worry about jet lag, lost luggage, missed connections, or anything like the daunting revenge of Montezuma. It was all highly enjoyable and, financially speaking, set me back less than 50 bucks. I made all the trips via what is really the next best thing to being there: marvelous travel books — some of which I purchased, most of which I found on the shelves at my local library.

Travel books do several things for me. From the snug harbor of my favorite at-home reading spot, they not only spirit me away to places I've visited often, but perhaps never "seen" so clearly as when I experienced them on the printed page. The books also, of course, have the potential to shape a part of my future. In a sense, might I someday find myself strolling the exotic streets of Tangier, traversing faraway Patagonia, or haggling for bargains in the markets of Katmandu, all because I encountered some intriguing words written about them once upon a time? You bet.

ONE OF MY MOST delightful summertime jaunts was taken just recently, after I discovered Stephen W. Plumb's "The Streets Where They Lived: A Walking Guide to the Residences of Famous New Yorkers" (Marior Press, \$12.95). ("This is a record of the places in Manhattan where the famous have lived in approximately the past 100 years," writes Plumb. "It aims to guide the reader, in a series of short walking tours, street-by-street, to the actual houses, apartments, and hotels where they have stayed.")

The book, with a list of more than 400 addresses, including even a few belonging to infamous gangsters, also contains a brief history of each celebrity's residency. If lifestyles of the famous are your thing, you'll want to keep this small paperback at hand the next time you hit the streets of Manhattan. If you're not particularly celebrity-struck, you can still enjoy it as a

unique guide to a bit of American history.

For a more exotic journey, you may want to take a look at "Worldwalk" (William Morrow & Co., \$19.95). Steven M. Newman's recent account of his trip around the world — on foot. Newman, a 28-year-old journalist set out from his home in Bethal, Ohio in 1983, and returned there four years later, after having trekked to such far-flung spots as Northern Ireland (where his dirty laundry was mistaken for a bomb), Morocco (where he was nearly done in by a mob of hustlers), Turkey (where he was jailed), Thailand (where he faced machete-wielding bandits on a long, lonely road one night), and beyond. Though Newman's prose is sometimes awkward, and his Pollyanna-like attitude grinds now and then, "Worldwalk" is still a grand adventure.

CLOSER TO HOME, try Jim DuFresne's "Michigan: Off the Beaten Path" (Globe Pequot Press, \$8.95) to discover relatively-unfamiliar nooks, crannies, and points of interest in the Great Lakes State.

Examples: The Horton Bay General Store, near Charlevoix, which was a frequent haunt of the youthful Ernest Hemingway when he spent his boyhood summers in northwest Michigan. The store (which appeared in his famed short story, "Up in Michigan") was built in 1876 and looks very much the same today as it did then, except that now, even though it still operates as a general store, it is very much a preserved shrine to Hemingway.

Other Hemingway memorabilia can be found at the Little Traverse Historical Museum in Petoskey, which also houses displays devoted to Michigan writer, Bruce Catton, who grew up in nearby Benzonia. Among the Catton artifacts at the museum is the original manuscript of "A Stillness at Appomattox," for which Catton won the Pulitzer Prize in 1953.

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Look for harmonic contrast

Q. We are planning a formal Christmas wedding which will take place in the late afternoon. We both like the idea of the dramatic contrast of black and white for the bridesmaids' gowns. But this combination would require I also wear white, which makes me look washed out. I'm open to other colors but do not want to look too unconventional. Any ideas?

A. Nothing can match the sharp, dramatic contrast of black and white. But there are other colors that can lend themselves to harmonic contrasts while flattering skin tones. Here's one color scheme to consider: Select a pale apricot for your gown and veil and have that

color coordinated with a very deep, warm red in a two-tone combination for the matron of honor and the bridesmaids' gowns. The red I'm referring to relates to the apricot family and is not the harsh crimson.

Be careful to select a silhouette and fabrics for your gown that are subtle and flattering. The principle is basic: the more color you introduce into the traditional gown, the more careful you have to be with the design and materials. If you choose satin, for example, then soften the shiny quality with grosgrain ribbon and lace. Accessorize with pearls and not the hard-cut stone jewelry. The hardest accent should be your diamond. Your bouquet should be a blend of pale peach, rose and yellow

flowers. In combination they will create an optical mist that will blend with the pale apricot of your gown.

Whoever is giving you away can wear a standard black tuxedo, but the groom and the ushers have an option of wearing very dark gray tuxedos. If your mother and future mother-in-law want to contribute to the overall color scheme, have them choose colors for their dresses in the either very pale or dark blue-green colors.

The bridesmaids' two-tone gowns and the groom's and ushers' dark gray will accent and frame your presence not only for the wedding itself, but for the photographs of the event. Pale apricot will flatter you more than stark white, and the

bridesmaids will have gowns they can wear for other festive occasions.

Q. I have been attracted to a black, green and blue iridescent bedspread that I would like to use in my bedroom. I know it will help me achieve a sophisticated look but I'm not entirely sure how to harmonize other colors for the room. Can you help?

A. In order to achieve a sophisticated look with the shifting colors of iridescence, you have to work within a narrow and carefully disciplined range of color and design options. Don't try to match any one of the fleeting, lustrous blues or greens. In-

stead coordinate with the optical mix these colors produce.

For all the other elements in your bedroom, coordinate within the range of analogous or neighboring colors. These would include blue-green, blue, blue-violet and a very selective use of magenta. So that the end result isn't too somber, use the colors in two distinct values: either very dark, or intense, or very light and slightly grayed. The paler colors would be suitable for the walls and the carpet, or rug, while the intense colors would be best for the bed's decorative pillows. Anchor the entire scheme with a black border, perhaps accented with blue, for the rug.

Also keep the range of textures compatible with the lustre of the iridescent bedspread. Avoid anything heavily textured, or adding too many accessories that themselves are shiny and bright. Everything has to re-

inforce the iridescent effects and not balance or contradict it.

Q. We have recently redecorated our living and dining rooms, which are connected by a large arched open doorway. The furnishings are traditional and conservative. The same broadloom carpeting is used throughout. But instead of our choice of low-keyed colors in white and pale golds conveying subtlety, they look monotonous. We were thinking of adding color to the walls for a little more excitement. What do you think we should do?

A. By all means more colorful walls will add interest to a monotonous color scheme. In keeping with the present arrangement, I see three

ca the Beautiful," "Nobody Knows the Trouble I've Seen" "Oh, Susannah" or "I've Been Workin' on the Railroad" in the background. If someone painted those pictures today, it would be corny, maybe it was when he did them, but they survive and flourish, corn can be life-giving.

THOUGH BENTON documents with a close to illustrator/narrator point of view, he's better than that. His highly refined style developed as he searched for the most effective way to respond to what he saw on his travels around the country. The long, fluid lines and rolling curves, the careful composition and sense of design all were honed to a fine edge.

In the first part of the exhibition are Benton's paintings before he had

found his strong, individual style. No doubt about his talent, but he still had to shake off the influences of Europeans such as Cezanne and Manet, the cubists and the impressionists to become more than a very good imitator.

When he finds himself (it started to happen when he was living in Chilmark on Martha's Vineyard), his life commitment to art, seems to be restated in each painting. The bravado style shouts over and over — This is what I do. This is who I am. Take it or leave it.

The exhibit is open 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday-Sunday. Tickets are \$3 for adults, students and seniors, children under 12 and Founders members are free. Organized student groups, with advanced appointments, are admitted free.

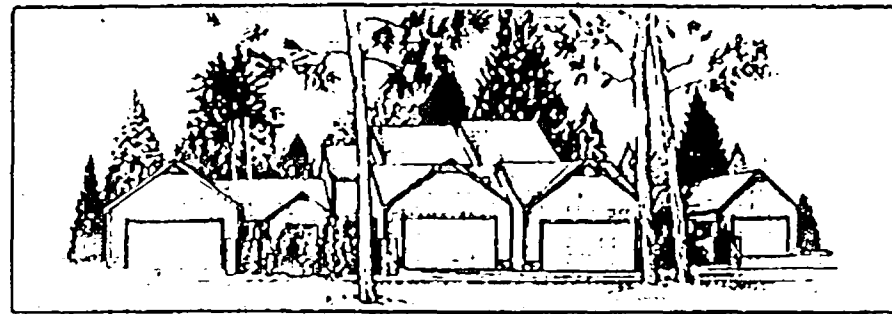

options that will strengthen and coordinate the two rooms.

The most conservative of the three options would be to paint the living room walls in a soft gold, but more lively than the present golds. Introduce a soft rose through deco-

orative pillows and an extravagant silk floral arrangement. Then use the same color in the connecting dining room. Reverse the strategy by adding brighter gold accents into the rose dining room. The second option, which uses the after-image principle, would be to paint the living room walls in gold, and the dining room in soft blue.

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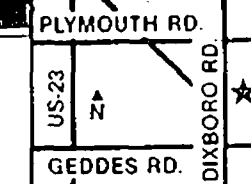
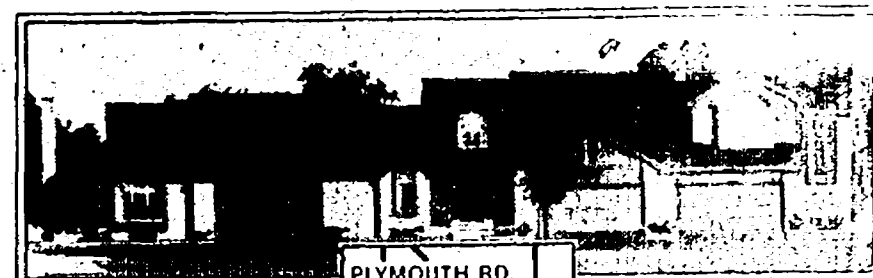
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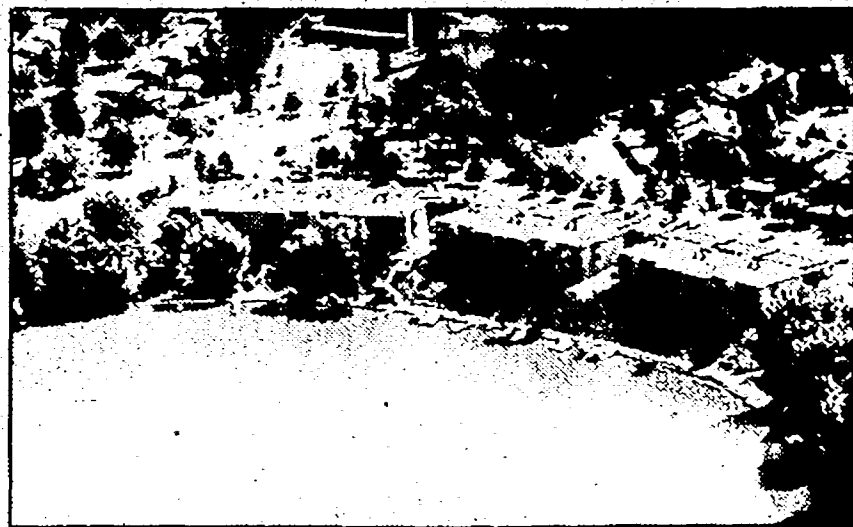


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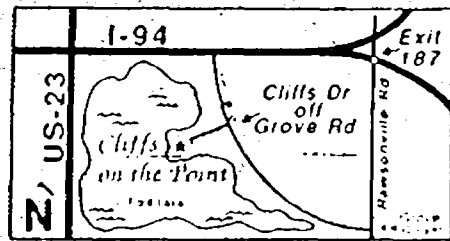
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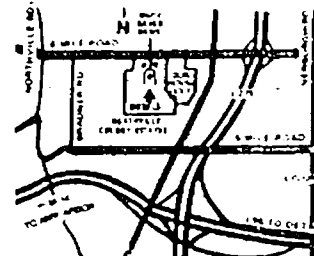
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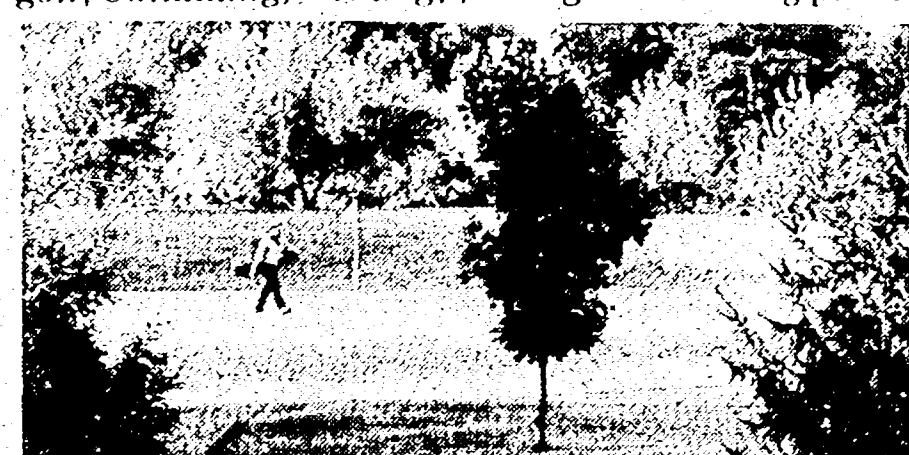
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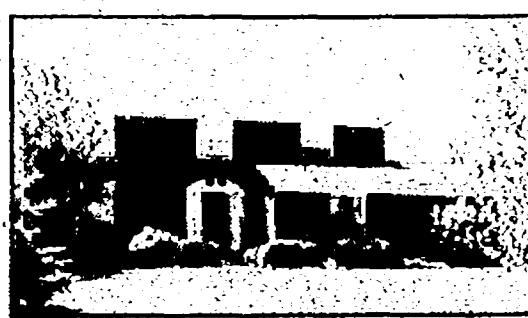
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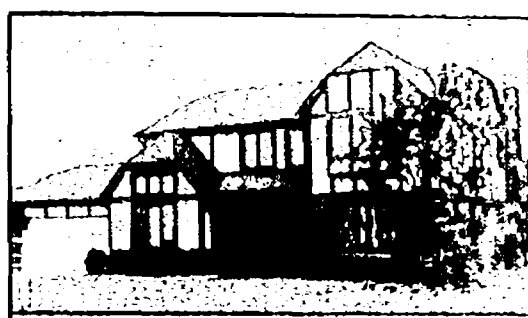
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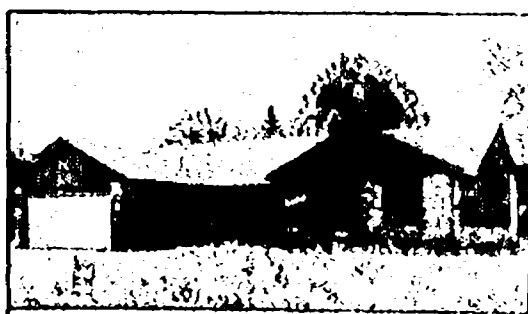

Be sure to add details such as color, size, condition, brand name, age, features and benefits. Be accurate! Don't embellish your ad with misleading information. Stick to the facts and reap the rewards!



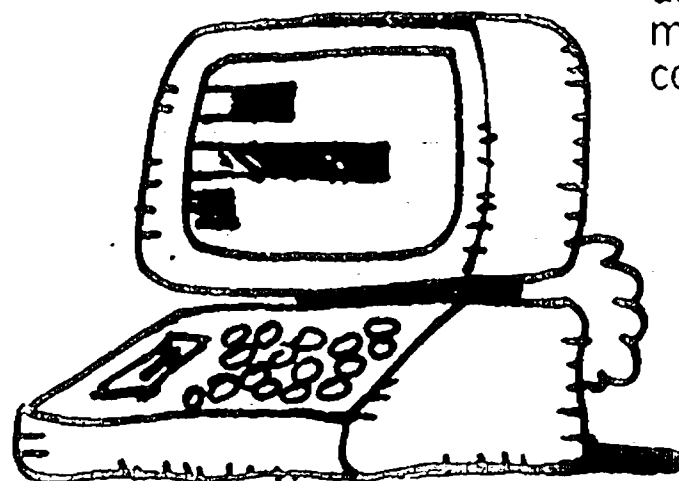
2. Include the price. Don't waste your time or a potential buyer's time. If you advertise the price of the item or service you offer, the people who respond to your ad will be those who are genuinely interested. Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.



3. Avoid abbreviations. Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WSW (white side wall) tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.



4. Include phone number and specify hours. Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a sale!



5. Run on consecutive days. Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative.
