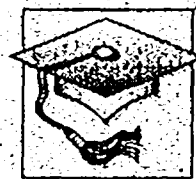

## Exodus leaves teachers to hire



For the first time in nearly 20 years, the Wayne-Westland district is planning to hire new teachers. One reason is that 78 teachers opted to take an early retirement bonus. New teachers are expected to add new blood and enthusiasm to the district.

Job opportunities have been limited for Wayne-Westland school teachers recently. Financial troubles have seen to that.

But notices of job vacancies were ex-

pected to be posted last week in numbers not seen in years due to the exodus of 78 teachers who accepted the school district's retirement incentive. The retirees, who will leave this June, are taking advantage of a one-time cash bonus of \$24,000.

The district's existing staff members

will get the first crack at some openings through transfer rights. Others will be filled by new hires.

"My guess is there is going to be a significant number of teachers who are going to want to transfer," said Bill Reece, president of the Wayne-Westland Education Association.

That includes, for example, junior high teachers moving to high schools, elementary teachers shifting to secondary schools, and vice versa; also, special education teachers changing to mainstream classrooms. Instructors will also

be changing buildings, and in some cases, changing subjects.

Fewer than 10 percent of the teaching staff is retiring, but a typical year sees 10-15 retirements in total, school officials said.

Reece said new teachers will be joining one of the area's oldest teaching staff. More than 700 of the district's 900 teachers have 15 years or more seniority, a requirement for the incentive program.

## No bonus rankles teacher

Social studies teacher Lynn Ehrle will retire next month after 35 years with the Wayne-Westland school district.

But unlike his 78 colleagues who will leave the classroom this year, Ehrle will not collect a \$24,000 retirement bonus.

As you might imagine, Ehrle, 59, is unhappy about that.

"I was punished or, well, now I'm being

punished again," the veteran instructor says.

The school district claims that Ehrle retired last year, too early to qualify for this year's bonus.

Ehrle was disciplined last year for his role in circulating a bogus memo about staff cuts. The facetious paper was copied onto the stationery of then-superintendent Dennis O'Neill so it appeared to be an official memo. It was distributed among some staff members.

As part of the discipline procedure worked out between the teachers' union and O'Neill, Ehrle was docked five days pay, suspended with pay from the classroom April-June 1991 and asked to submit a resignation letter effective June 1992.

He submitted the letter last year and the school board approved it then. According to a school district official, Ehrle's 1991 retirement letter makes him ineligible for the special bonus the district has offered to teachers retiring in 1992.

"Quite simply, he can't retire twice," says acting superintendent Thomas Svitkevich.

"It was completed and the board accepted his retirement," Svitkevich says.

## Husband faces trial in shooting of wife

A Westland man accused of shooting his wife of 18 years was ruled competent to stand trial and will be arraigned on charges in Recorder's Court next week.

Harry Ransom, 37, waived a district court examination in Westland Thursday and was returned to the Wayne County Jail. He is charged with assault

with intent to commit murder and a felony firearms violation.

The charges stem from the Jan. 14 shooting of Janice Ransom, 36, at their house on Bakewell, in the Wayne Road-Warren Road area. The couple had filed for divorce, but were living together at the time.

Authorities say that Harry Ransom shot his wife once with a sawed-off 12-

gauge shotgun following a domestic dispute. He has pleaded not guilty.

Janice Ransom, who did not attend the 18th District Court hearing, survived the blast but, according to relatives, has not completely recovered.

"She still has to have more surgery, and I don't know who is going to pay for it," said the woman's mother, Grace Erickson.

Psychiatrists who examined Harry Ransom determined he was mentally sound. The assault charge carries a maximum penalty of life in prison. The firearms charge is a two-year felony.

The defendant's attorney Nicholas Smith said Harry Ransom was found to be coherent and in touch with reality.

# Candidates seek support in run for 2 board seats

## Kozorosky-Wiacek: Led board in search

As president, Sylvia Kozorosky-Wiacek has led the Wayne-Westland school board through some dramatic and controversial steps in recent months — most notably the search for a new superintendent.

She drew both praise and criticism for her leadership, which resulted in former Superintendent Dennis O'Neill stepping down and being replaced by new schools chief Larry Thomas, a longtime West Bloomfield administrator.

Kozorosky-Wiacek, a 57, a Westland resident and city of Westland senior citizens director, has been on the school board for seven years. She hopes to retain her seat in the June election and continue to chart a new direction for the 16,000-student district.

"I'd like to be there to lead our students into the 21st century," she said, during school board candidate interviews conducted by the Observer. She's competing with seven other candidates for two four-year terms.

Kozorosky-Wiacek, supported by three other board members, pressured O'Neill in October to step down. She believed the embattled district desperately needed new leadership.

Although she said conflict can bring positive changes, she said it's now time to put political battles behind and begin charting a long-range plan for the district. She

wants to help the new administration deal with such issues as drug abuse, Public Act 25, schools of choice and employee contract negotiations.

In response to a question about school violence, she said she supports the district's policy of expelling students caught with guns and other dangerous weapons in school. But she believes the DARE (Drug Abuse Resistance Education) program can help reduce the violence problem, and she has suggested expanding it into upper grade levels.

When asked to cite the district's No. 1 problem, Kozorosky-Wiacek

said the district needs to strive to provide equal educational opportunities for all students. To address the problem, she said, the board "must become a team and work together closely with the new superintendent."

When asked about teacher salaries and whether the faculty deserves raises this year, she declined to comment. As a current board member, she said she would be violating the trust of teachers and administration by talking about negotiations.

To improve the board's credibility, she said, it's time the board and administration realize that "children are the most important" asset in the district. She said steps already have been taken to improve the district, such as buying new textbooks.

Kozorosky-Wiacek has taken exception to criticism that she and some board members have overstepped their policy-setting boundaries. She said she understands her role.

"I am a part-time legislator, and I am to set policy and follow through with it," she said.

Some indicated some board members have been aggressive in recent years because they had failed to receive the information they needed from the administration to make decisions. But she said that's beginning to change.

## Winter: Pupils' quality of life stressed

Francis "Bud" Winter worked in education for 37 1/2 years, as a teacher and longtime principal of such schools as Wayne Memorial High School.

Now the 63-year-old Canton Township resident wants to take on a different educational role by winning one of two seats at stake in the June 8 Wayne-Westland school board race.

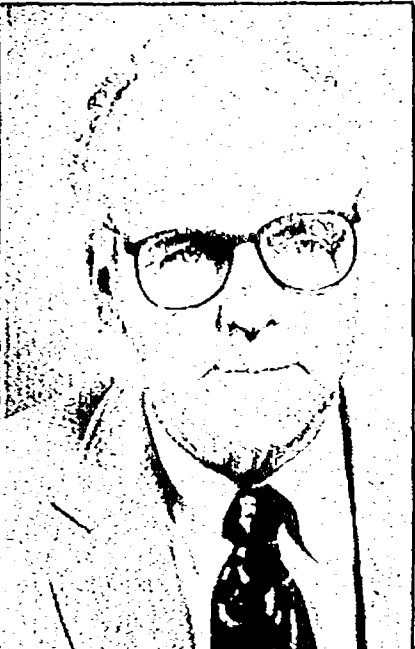
Early indications are he's drawing a lot of support. Some supporters appeared in awe at the large crowd that attended a recent fundraiser for Winter — the only candidate who lives in the Canton Township portion of the Wayne-Westland district.

"I'm running to improve the quality of life for students and to put education first," Winter said.

Winter has repeatedly called for a cease-fire in the district's political squabbling. He wants to see the district returned to the "lighthouse district" it once was, and he believes it will require a concerted effort among all board members.

Winter has accepted — without argument — the departure of former Superintendent Dennis O'Neill, and he suggested that board members who can't accept O'Neill's retirement under pressure "should leave the board."

On a question about school violence, Winter said he "wholeheart-

edly" supports expelling students, and he said students shouldn't be placed in an alternative program until they are recommended for it after receiving a psychological evaluation.

He also called for efforts to identify potentially troubled students early on — so that preventive measures can be taken in hopes of averting later problems.

When asked to identify the district's number one problem, Winter cited the inter-related problems of poor communication, financial woes

and the need to improve educational programs.

Poor communication has resulted in endless board squabbling, and administrators "don't even want to stay on the job" anymore, he said. He demanded efforts to improve board-administration relations.

When asked about teacher pay raises this year, Winter suggested that negotiations should result in a reasonable raise only after educational programs are paid for. Programs for students must become the top priority for spending, he said.

To improve board credibility, Winter said the board must become pro-active, rather than reactive. And board members must renew their focus on education and work with the new superintendent to set goals for the next three years, he said.

Some board members have been criticized for overstepping their policy-setting boundaries. Winter said one of the board's primary functions is to hire a superintendent and set goals.

Board members shouldn't try to perform the day-to-day responsibilities of the administration, Winter said. But board members must be the ones to answer to the community about district problems, whether real or perceived, he said.

## CLARIFICATION

A bold-face quote of Steven Lind, printed in the Monday, May 18, Observer, should have reflected the complete position of the Wayne-Westland school board candidate

on the issue of teachers' union raises. On salary hikes, Lind suggested no pay raises for this year, in the wake of the 11.9-percent salary increases that teachers received over

the last two years. "Teachers, like anybody else, need raises," Lind said, though he believes the rate of increase has been too high.

Harry Ransom has his own health problems.

Smith said his client is "without functioning kidneys," needs regular dialysis treatments and is awaiting surgery for the condition. His care through the county jail has been costly and ineffective, Smith said.

The attorney asked Judge Thomas Smith to allow Ransom to leave the jail to live with his mother in Brighton, which would make trips to St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ann Arbor easier.

But Judge Smith denied the request and continued Ransom's bond at \$250,000 cash. The judge read a portion of Ransom's psychiatric evaluation that noted the defendant's inability to control his temper and tendency to project anger on others.

"This leads me to believe this

man's a danger to society," Smith said.

Harry Ransom's mother was in court but sitting away from Janice Ransom's brother, sister, mother and cousin, who also attended. The shooting has split the family. The couple has two children.

Attorney Nicholas Smith suggested the shooting resulted from the "emotional entanglement arising out of the marital relationship." He said the divorce proceedings included a charge of infidelity.

Indicating a possible trial defense, the attorney also said there was "a question of whether the dis-

charge of the weapon was intentional or not."

Janice Ransom's relatives disputed that scenario, however.

"She's afraid. She's afraid he'll get out," said Ron Erickson, Janice's brother.

She walks with a cane, cannot work and in an April Observer interview said she is living in constant pain. She was wounded in the stomach and hip, has undergone surgery four times and spent 33 days in the hospital because of the shooting, she said then.

- Best junior high marching, Franklin Junior High.



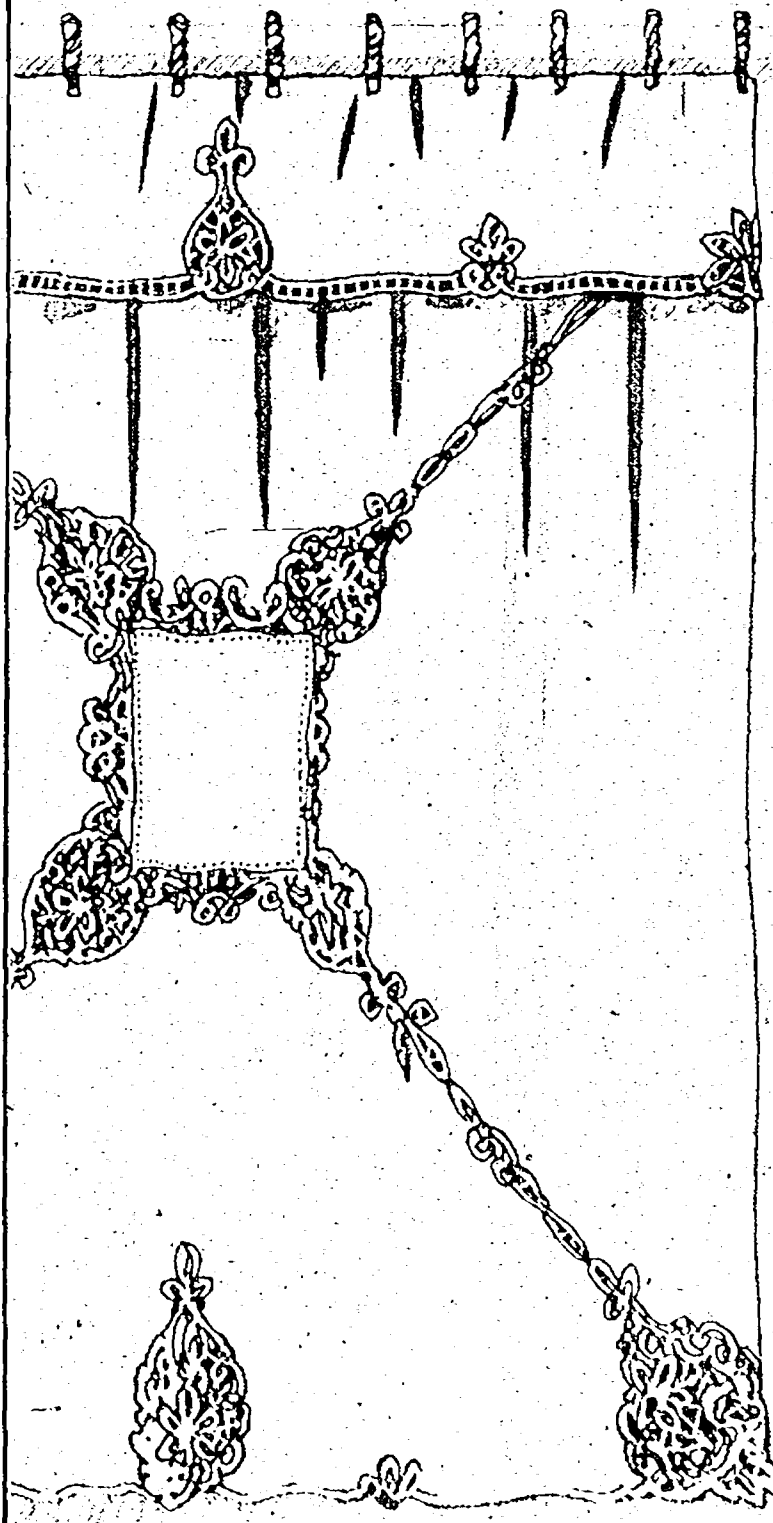

"I'd say we'll see a bigger number of new hires than we've seen in the last 15-20 years," said Reece, adding that the new teachers usually bring youth, enthusiasm and energy to school. He estimated the district will add 50-60 new teachers.

Deputy Superintendent Thomas Svitekovich said the district could hire up to 70 new teachers.

"We'll be able to recruit younger people who have new skills, skills that have just been learned," he said. The young people will need experience, a strength of the existing staff.

Younger teachers tend to be interested in coaching and other extra-curricular activities, Svitekovich said.

They work cheaper, too. He added

that new teachers will enter the lower rungs of the district's salary ladder and replace the retiring veterans who collected higher salaries, based on seniority.

Wayne-Westland administrators already have a large file of resumes

from prospective employees, the acting superintendent said.

The district is projecting an enrollment decline next year of 250 students from the current 16,000. That will affect the number of

teachers hired. Svitekovich also said he hoped the district would hire enough minority teachers to more closely reflect the district's 12 percent minority student population.

Despite the openings, the administration announced last week that nine employees, six teachers included, will get layoff notices.

These include one vocational education teacher from the William Ford Vocational-Technical Center, a speech specialist, two psychologists, a social worker and a special education teacher.

Reece said there are now no certified teachers on the district's layoff list. He said the district notices to the teachers and three unaffiliated employees was a formality, and that layoffs were not likely next year.

Ehrle says the original punishment was ridiculous and happened because O'Neil "had it in for me."

At the time, O'Neil called the memo tasteless. The hoax letter concerned the staff reductions and teachers' early retirement. About 100 Wayne-Westland employees faced layoffs at the time, and O'Neil said the memo made light

of a serious issue.

Ehrle says he filled out the paperwork this year to apply for the bonus, and Bill Taylor, the dis-

trict's associate superintendent for employee services, promised to take it to the school board for consideration but never did. Taylor could not

be reached for comment.

Ehrle says he will file a grievance through his union, the Wayne-Westland Education Association. But that is a lengthy procedure, he says.

That's two years. It's a long way for a grievance procedure to be, he added.

The Michigan Senate gave a 37-1 boost to a bill aimed at helping downtown merchants meet the mall competition.

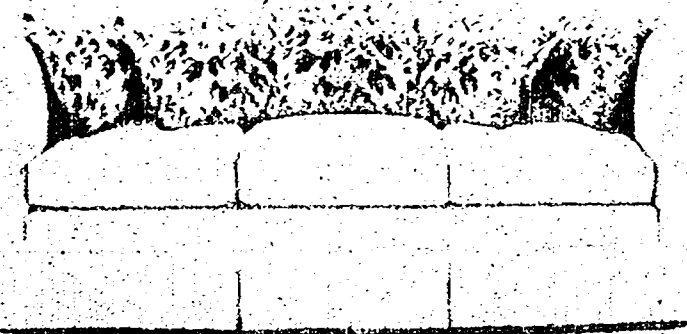

# Police look into handgun dispute

Livonia Public Schools recently threw the Cooper school clean-up ball back into the hands of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and should find out this week whether the DNR will keep it.

A DNR official Thursday refused to say how the department will respond next week to the district's demand that the DNR take over responsibility to investigate the Cooper site.

The demand to relieve Livonia schools of the responsibility to pay for the costly site investigation at Cooper in Westland came in a May 13 letter from the district's environmental attorney, Eugene Smary of Grand Rapids.

The letter was addressed to Oladipo Oyinsan, the DNR's environmental response supervisor based in Livonia.

## LIVONIA SCHOOLS

"They're frustrated, like we are," Oyinsan said. "They tried to find responsible parties and couldn't. Just like we tried and couldn't."

At the request of the DNR, Livonia Public Schools last year put together a plan to take soil borings and do other investigative work at the contaminated school site on Ann Arbor Trail.

The DNR approved the plan, but the district has not yet implemented it.

In essence, Smary's letter says the district, acting on the direction of the Livonia Board of Education, has no intention of implementing the plan until the DNR helps the district find "responsible parties" under Michigan law who will help pay the clean-up bill.

Responsible parties are those persons who ei-

ther owned, operated or dumped trash at the former landfill.

Smary said Livonia schools won't spend dollars which should be spent on educating children to clean up a site it didn't own when the dumping occurred more than 40 years ago.

"In its desire to protect its own financial resources, the DNR is attempting to place on the Livonia Public Schools the burden of choosing between providing a proper education to the children of the district, and spending hundreds of thousands of dollars of scarce school district funds to perform an investigation that should properly be undertaken by those who have actually caused the problem," Smary wrote.

He said the costly burden comes at a time when the district is laying off more than 100 teachers.

# Fued erupts on picket line

There was trouble on the picket line last week, according to a police report.

A 16-year-old Westland resident told police he was on the picket line at Kroger, Ford and Wayne Road, the night of May 18. He said he

yelled "scab" at a man walking into the store. When the man left the store, he walked over to the youth and without provocation, slugged the picketer in the stomach. The man then walked to his car and drove off.

# Long-absent bluebirds are nesting here again

They trrrrrr back. Bluebirds, that is.

"They are as blue as the sky. It is just wonderful to have them back," said Jean Fox, of a member of the Farmington Naturalists Club.

It's been awhile — like since the 1920s — since the small, insect-eating bluebirds (not to be confused with bluejays) have called this area home.

Some of the rare birds have now relocated to Heritage Park thanks to the Farmington Naturalists Club, whose members put up 16 boxes March 1 to attract the birds with blue feathers and orange-red breasts.

"The benefit is the excitement you feel of going out and watching these marvelous little birds," said Don Teets, owner of Backyard Birds, Farmington. "They haven't been seen in Michigan for years. They declined 90 percent in a very short time."

That's because of development which took over farmlands and with it old or dead trees where bluebirds nested. Farmers also no longer use wooden fence posts, another favorite nesting spot. Pesticides haven't helped either.

"I had never seen a bluebird in Michigan until about three years ago," said Farmington Hills naturalist Joe Derek, a club member. Plentiful house sparrows — which are not native to North America and are not protected — haven't helped the bluebird population. They are a natural enemy. "They will kill a whole family to take over a nest," Teets said.

The club's project began after 85-year-old Alan Bolton — a former Farmington native — talked to members about bluebirds. Bolton, who now lives in Fenton, makes bluebird boxes, which Teets stores.

"It got our interest," said Teets, who visited Bolton and was stunned when he saw the rare blue-

birds nesting on the property. "We decided the park would be a great place for the bluebirds."

### Don't get close

No doubt the bluebirds are great to see. But club members urge park visitors to keep away from the nests and boxes. The birds cannot be disturbed and there is no reason to approach the birds. You will get a better view from the trail. Besides that, park officials are keeping a watchful eye.

"The best way to view them is with a pair of binoculars," Teets said. "We could succeed or fail based on people tampering with the boxes."

The club bought 10 boxes and Teets donated six and a bluebird trail was established in the park. There's rhyme and reason to where and how the boxes are located.

The boxes must be placed in a meadow, not around trees. But the box should face a large shrub, for example, so when the time is right,

baby bluebirds who are learning to fly have somewhere relatively safe to land.

"If located properly, the threat from house sparrows can be removed. Location and the size of the box has everything the bluebirds are looking for," Teets said.

The boxes are paired — one for bluebirds and one for their pals, tree swallows. Tree swallows and bluebirds won't live next door to their own kind. They like to integrate.

"In effect, you're giving up one box to the tree swallows," said Mary Teets, also a club member. As neighbors often do, the bluebirds and tree swallows become pals and will protect each other's nests.

By late March, club members noticed that bluebirds had arrived at their new home. The male bluebird usually locates the box for the female. "He will care for his little lady friend. If she accepts the home, he has found, they're in business," Teets said.

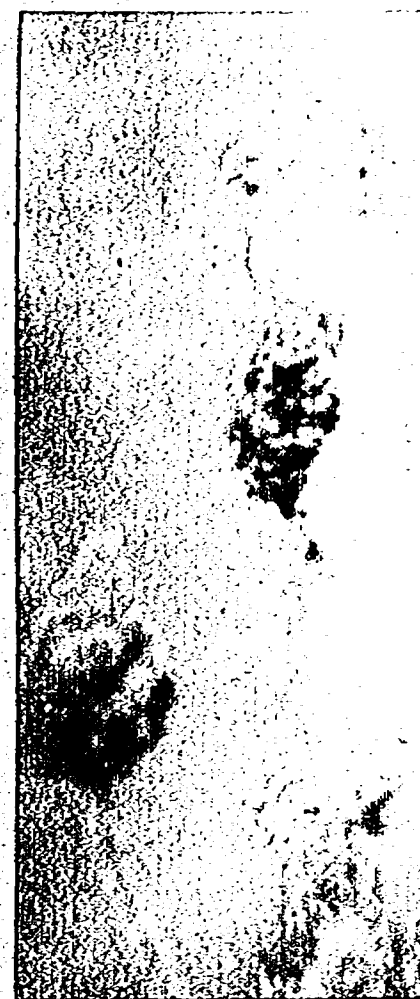
Not all the boxes in the park have nests. But some of the bluebirds who moved in have started families. While the mother bluebird incubates the eggs, the father bluebird feeds the mother. The first brood should fledge (begin to fly) this week.

### Club monitors boxes

Generally, bluebirds have two broods a year. The first brood often helps feed the younger brood. They will nest here and leave for the winter. Those who survive, particularly those born here, should return next season.

Club members have been assigned boxes to monitor. The information gathered will be given to the North American Bluebird Society, formed in 1978 to re-establish the birds.

Area residents have bought their own bluebird boxes and put them up in their yards with success. But the Farmington area isn't the only place where bluebird projects are underway. The Oakland County Parks Commission about six years ago started its own projects at Independence Oaks, for example.

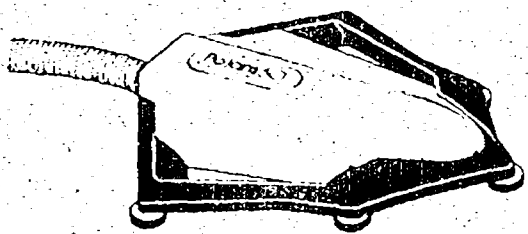

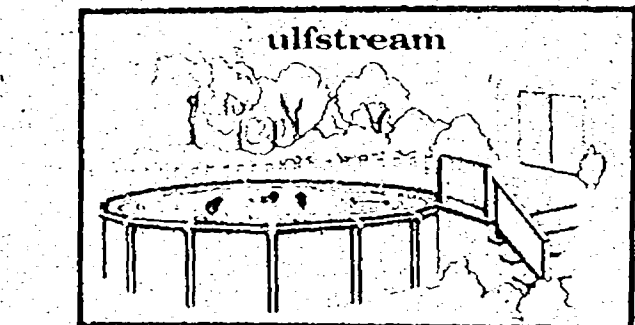

# Basic skills lacking, publisher says

Back to basics: Newspaper publisher Phil Power told the Canton Economic Club Wednesday more cooperation is needed between employers and public schools in educating the workforce in basic job skills.

Suburban newspaper publisher Power told the Canton Economic Club on Wednesday that collar workers possess poor skills when compared to their counterparts.

Power referred to his work on the National Commission on Skills in American Workforce that concluded in a report called "America's Choice" that poorly trained workers not limited to any one part of U.S. economy, but "characterize entire work force."

Employers, he said, have complained for a dearth of well-trained workers by breaking up big complex jobs into a bunch of small jobs. "You can then displace a worker with a machine," Power said, or you can find some poorly trained guys to do the small easy jobs for peanuts, and they're usual in Mexico.

Power said the day of the low-skill, high-wage job is over.

Japanese and American employers both complain that there aren't enough job applicants with good basic skills, Power said. But the Japanese definition of "basic skills" is so far ahead of the American definition that it includes knowledge of advanced trigonometry and computer programming.

Power called the popular American strategy of using poorly skilled workers to do small easy jobs a "low skill, low productivity, low wage" plan. He prefers a "high skills, high productivity, high wage" system.

To make that work, Power said we should have greater cooperation between employers and public schools so high school graduates are

better prepared to tackle high-skill jobs.

That includes having more business owners on local school boards and setting up apprentice programs whereby kids can learn more on their summer vacation than how to flip hamburgers.

As it is now, he continued, government schools are too focused on training kids for college. Concomitantly, "the kids that aren't going to go to college . . . we throw them away. We have a terrible school-to-work transition system."

Also, Power said American businesses should invest more money in employee training. All the American companies that are really competitive internationally do that, he said.

The changes Power recommends can't come from the federal or state governments, he said — referring to them as "Uncle Whiskers" and "our geniuses in Lansing," respectively — but must be implemented by local people. If his plan ever reaches fruition, Power said, it will take the form of a "series of alliances between local businesses and schools."

For instance, employers should consider a job applicant's grade transcripts before hiring him or her. And voters should elect more business owners to school boards.

If we don't do what he recommends, Power said, the United States will be the "world's first advanced third-world country."

Power is the chairman of Suburban Communications Corp., which owns the Plymouth and Canton Observer Newspapers, which are among the 12 Observer and Eccentric Newspapers.

# Woman, 84, to get high school diploma

Sybal Breen might take a while to do things, but she gets the job done.

On June 5, she will graduate from Clarenceville High — 66 years after completing her junior year in high school.

She has been a participant in Clarenceville's senior services program, in which the district conducts classes in senior citizen centers, since the fall of 1987.

Breen recently passed Clarenceville's competency exam, which is

ceremony. "It's a wonderful thing," said Rose Govig, adult education manager for Clarenceville who has seen several senior citizens get their diplomas.

Senior citizens, said Govig, "get to walk across the stage, get to wear a cap and gown, and probably receive a great deal of applause."

Breen's high school career was postponed in 1926, just after she finished her junior year. She and three of her nine sisters moved from southern Illinois to Detroit to care for her brother, who had suffered a

hand injury. They were soon joined by their parents.

"When you get out and start working, you sort of forget about school. I went down to register a couple of times, but I didn't go through with it," Breen said.

For Breen, a high school diploma will act as a tangible symbol of her education, though it was not her objective in taking classes. "It was just that I wanted to take classes. I hadn't really thought about finishing but Rose Govig got after me to finish up."

# Murder-suicide claims parents

A domestic quarrel ended in tragedy last week when a Southfield attorney shot his estranged wife in the couple's West Bloomfield home — as their 3-year-old slept in a nearby bedroom — and then killed himself at the gravesite of his mother.

The wife, Linda Binder, 35, was still alive when police arrived at the couple's home about 10 p.m. Wednesday, according to police. But she died within hours at Pontiac General Hospital.

The couple's home was in the 5600 block of Fox Hunt Drive, in a fashionable neighborhood south of Walnut Lake Road, within a mile of the police complex.

"It's a clear case of murder-suicide," said police Chief Ron Cronin, who said Mrs. Binder filed for divorce the day before she was killed.

Officers and EMS units were summoned to the home of Michael and Linda Binder by her mother, Ester Gutman, according to the police report. She was temporarily living at the home to help her daughter with the couple's only child,

Justin, who had undergone eye surgery earlier in the day at Detroit Children's Hospital.

"She's dead, my daughter's dead," a distraught Mrs. Gutman reportedly told the first officer at the scene. "He shot her."

Mrs. Binder had been shot at least twice and was laying under a table in the breakfast nook, police said. The smell of gunpowder was still fresh.

Paramedics administered CPR and other first aid measures, then rushed her to Pontiac General.

Justin slept through the entire episode, police said.

As an officer was phoning police headquarters to ask for an all-points bulletin, a telephone operator broke into the conversation, saying she had an emergency call from the woman's husband, police said.

The operator said the caller wanted to talk with his wife. Police did not reveal any other parts of the conversation. The call was subsequently traced to a fast-food restaurant in Clinton Township, police said.

By the time that call came in, po-

lice said the victim's brother, Leonard Gutman, had arrived at the home. Police said Gutman told them Michael Binder had come to his office that afternoon.

He told them his brother-in-law, described as normally "aloof and condescending," seemed "edgy and nervous."

Gutman also reportedly told police that Michael Binder's parents are buried in Clinton Township, in Hebrew Memorial Park near Mt. Clemens.

After Clinton Township police were alerted, they found Binder's car, a 1985 blue Volvo, Cronin said.

Binder had apparently shot himself once in the head with the same pistol used to kill his wife, Cronin said.

Michael Binder, 40, had been a special assistant attorney general since 1988, according to Chris DeWitt, a spokesman for Attorney General Frank J. Kelley.

"He was essentially in private practice, but did work for the attorney general on an as-needed basis," said DeWitt.

# Biplane pilot finds business is taking off

After a ride in Doug Keen's replica 1935 biplane, a typical response is "Wow!"

For the more adventurous types who ride in the double-wing aircraft, pilot Keen will perform steep-banked turns or figure-8s. These stunts let a passenger experience increased G-forces, which make one's weight seem to double or triple.

But even the basic ride in the open-cockpit airplane is quite a show.

"Just put your hands up over the wind screen," Keen told a passenger on a recent flight over Plymouth.

That action causes the plane's nose to rise slightly, as you feel the wind whipping against your palms.

Keen, 29, is a Northville native who learned to fly at Mettetal Airport in Canton. He is partners with his father in a business which offers biplane rides to the public.

The business is headquartered in Ft. Myers, Fla., in the winter and Charlevoix in the summer. But after offering rides out of Mettetal over Memorial Day Weekend, Keen planned to remain and continue offering rides for a few days, before heading to Charlevoix.

"This is my home airport," Keen said of Mettetal. Flying, he said, "was just something I always knew I was going to be involved in one way or another. I just loved to be around the airplanes doing anything."

His father David is a pilot, and his grandfather flew airplanes in the 1920s.

After graduating from Northville High School, Keen entered the Air Force where as an avionics technician, "I was working on planes all the time."

He also continued his involvement in the Civil Air Patrol, an auxiliary of the Air Force which promotes aviation.

But Keen said he was especially inspired by a popular book about the joy of flying, "Jonathan Livingston Seagull."

"Each pilot, no matter what airplane he flies, knows it's not just a machine. It's a living, breathing thing," Keen said.

Then last year, an article in an aviation magazine moved him to start his own sightseeing-by-air business.

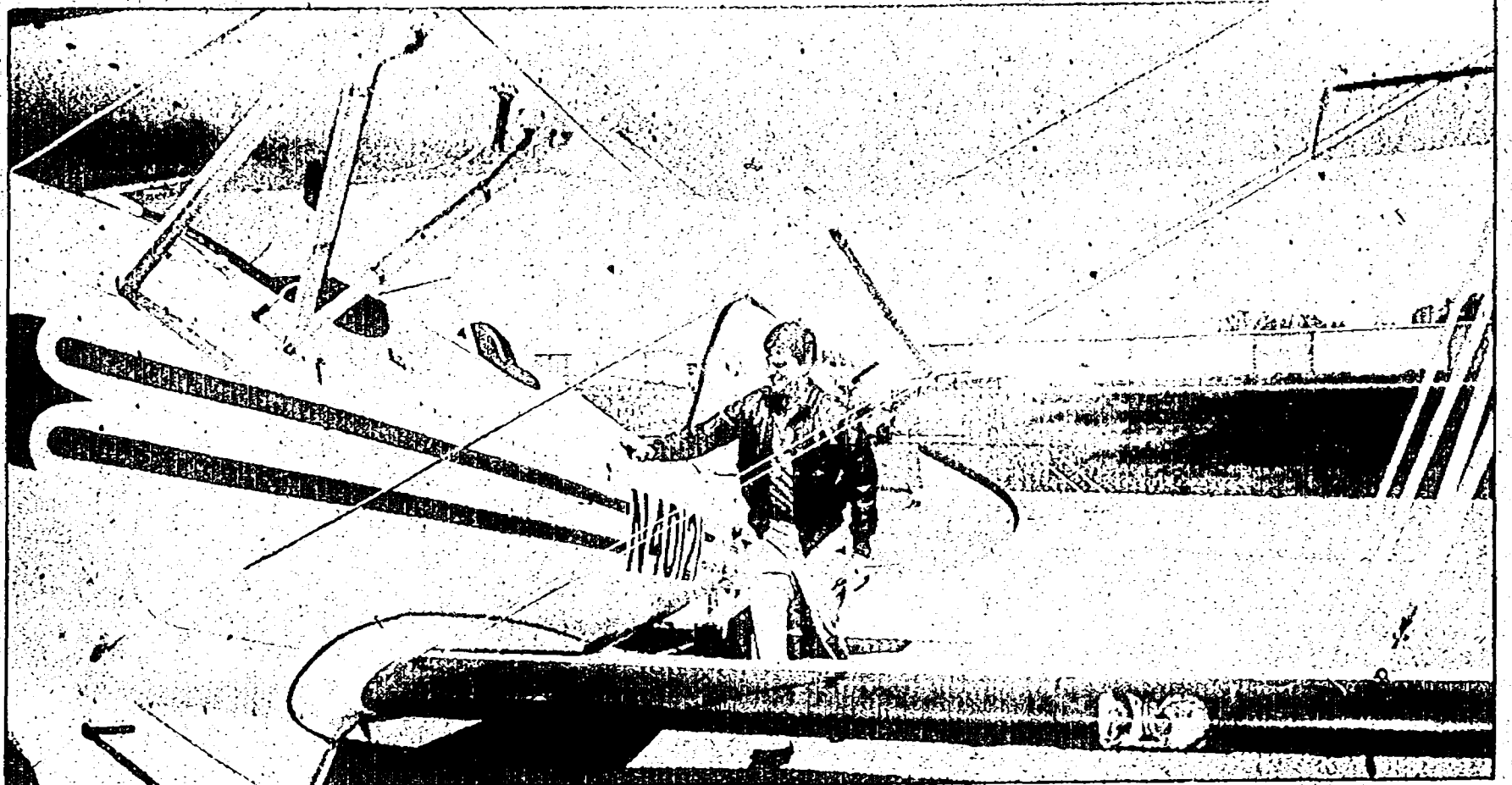
"I talked to some operators, there's about 10 in the United States. It looks like a very good business, he said.

Keen, who is married with one child, said Ft. Myers is his winter base because his dad had chosen it as a retirement home, adding, "There's a large tourist base."

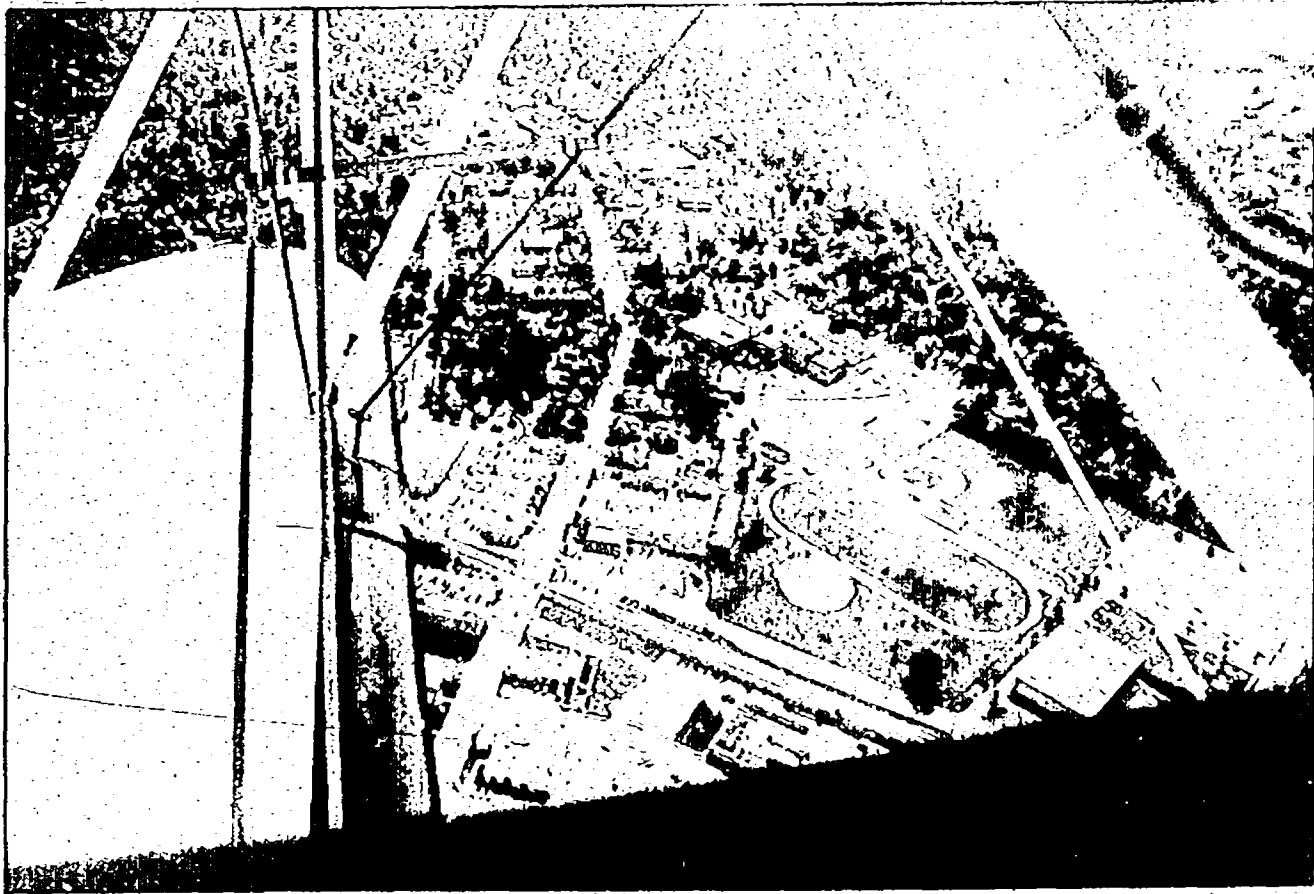
And Charlevoix, he said, "has close access to Traverse City, Harbor Springs and Petoskey."

Since starting the business in March, "It's going really well. People go to the airport and ask, 'Where's that white biplane?'"

The \$200,000 biplane was built by Classic Aircraft of Lansing. Rides are \$46 per person.

# Local residents are delegates to Dem national convention

The Ross Perot candidacy will work against President George Bush, says Democratic National Chair Ron Brown.

It shows two-thirds of the voters are unhappy with the administration. Brown told party workers last night in Lansing.

Brown spoke in Hart-Kennedy House in the morning and at midday to an AFL-CIO convention, many of whose leaders will be delegates to the Democratic National Convention.

Party leaders recently completed the Michigan slate of 159 delegates to the national convention which starts July 13 in New York City.

Arkansas Gov. Bill Clinton (C) won 73 delegates, based on his 50 percent showing in the March 17 primary; former California Gov. Jerry Brown (B) has 38 for his 26 percent showing; former Sen. Paul Tsongas (D) of Massachusetts has 26 because of his 16 percent tally; and the remaining 38 are unpledged. Sens. Tom Harkin of Iowa and Bob Kerry of Nebraska and mayerick Lyndon LaRouche were on the ballot but didn't qualify for delegates.

Democrats allocated their delegates among the current 18 congressional districts, not on the new 16 which take effect this election. Their selection procedure was largely in place prior to the April 15 federal court redrawing of Michigan's congressional map.

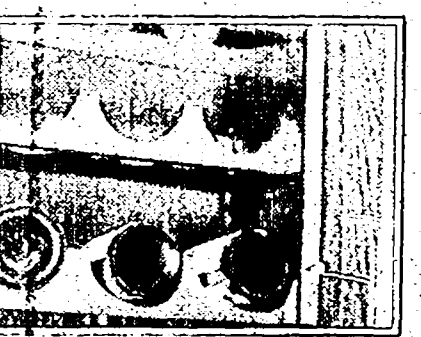

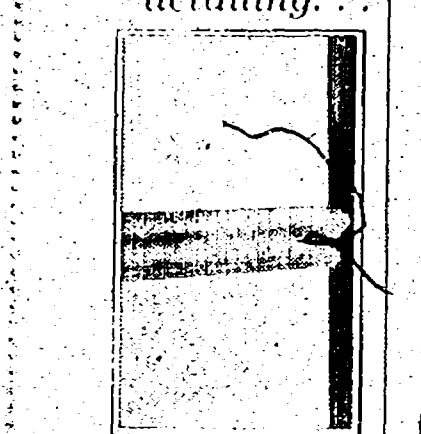

# Panel urges voters to elect pro-choicers

The heat is on as abortion rights advocates looking toward the August primaries get together to garner support for pro-choice candidates.

"We're in for a long, hot summer but it will be an interesting one," said State Rep. Jan Dolan, R-Farmington Hills.

Dolan, along with three other pro-choice supporters — Maxine Ber- man, D-Southfield, Barbara Dobb, R-West Bloomfield, and Shirley Johnson, R-Royal Oak — spoke recently before a near-capacity crowd of National Organization for Women (NOW) members, Oakland Chapter, in Oak Park.

The panel of representatives, dubbed the "fearless four" by NOW board member Marion McCracken of Farmington, is among those now on an active campaign to see victo-

ries in the primary elections for abortion rights supporters.

And the representatives are urging people to cross party lines, if necessary, to elect pro-choicers. The issue concerns choice, not republican versus democratic, they insist.

"The only way we are going to see the numbers in Lansing that we need to get our bills passed is to focus on getting pro-choice candidates elected, even one at a time if we have to," said Dobb.

Dobb, who represents West Bloomfield, Orchard Lake and Keego Harbor, is known for her one-vote victory against a controversial Debbie Schluskel in the 1990 primary.

NOW is reporting that, in light of this year's redistricting, a large turnover of seats in the Michigan House of Representatives as well as

in the state congressional delegation is expected. Currently, 43 pro-choice representatives are in the state House.

To achieve NOW's No. 1 stated goal of a pro-choice majority in the legislature, supporters are stressing communication, voter identification, volunteer campaign help for endorsed candidates, and financial contributions to those candidates' election committees.

"We need to build bridges with pro-choice candidates . . . a few hours a week and a few dollars. We can do it . . . we really can," said Johnson, representative for Royal Oak. And Johnson praises her fellow pro-choice advocates for their efforts in the state House.

"In spite of our losses we have wonderful, articulate spokespersons. We have strength in our numbers. Our credibility

mounts everyday," said Johnson.

Added Dolan: "I hope we can continue to count on organizations like NOW, knowing that definitely strong pro-choice people need help — not just money, but time. We need that involvement in the election. We can make a difference."

"And remember it's 'pro-choice,' not 'pro-abortion.' You can choose to have a dozen children — or none — if you want."

"It's about who makes that choice. Should it really be 'Big Brother'?"

The problem in Chicago, as in other

American cities, is government reformers and newspapers who hand-in-hand will goof us down the drain, if we don't stop them.

Making sure something is so squeaky clean it wouldn't make a nun blush is one sure way to kill a project or stop needed repairs from being made. A little of that seemed to be happening in Chicago where some government geek was waiting for everyone with a shovel to turn in a bid on the hole plugging project.

And when it comes to construction bids, things are never what they seem. The low bid from a goof ball firm can end up costing the tax payer five times more than the highest bid.

At that point the inspector would usually head back to his truck for a nap.

The result was that for a few bottles of whiskey, both the gas company and its customers got the job done cheaper and with no safety hazards.

But that was 20 years ago. These days it would have taken a room full of lawyers and government inspectors a month and about a \$1 million to solve such a dispute with a contractor.

It's just too bad we can't go back to the old days when one bottle of Canadian Club was worth more than 10 lawyers. It's no wonder that things are on the rocks.

# GOP rivals — what they say between the lines

In a campaign of code words, three rivals are seeking to be Republican national committeewoman from Michigan.

Rarely does the public see a national committee member at work. The job is fund-raising and bolstering the spirits of the party faithful.

Ronna Romney of Bloomfield Hills emerged from the Headlee for Governor campaign eight years ago to win the job. Seeking a third term from delegates to the GOP national convention, she is being challenged by Betsy DeVos of Grand Rapids and Andrea Fischer of Birmingham.

There's no salary but some travel reimbursement. The GOP National Committee picks the national chair and sets the national budget. Members may do any number of jobs at the state level.

Delegates to the Oakland County GOP convention heard from the Romney, Fischer and a stand-in for DeVos. Here is what they said and, with the help of assorted delegates who asked to remain anonymous, the meaning of the code words.

"I had hoped I could run unopposed," said Romney, 48, promising this would be her last term. She announced early so that successors can have "four years to prove themselves."

In the job you "drive and drive and drive and raise money, I invited some people to my house for dinner one night, and they asked how much it would cost."

When her predecessor, Ranny Riecker, left after 14 years, "she hadn't lost her luster, and neither have I."

Translation: I've done the job, at great personal sacrifice. I'm not over the hill. My rivals have yet to prove themselves.

Betsy DeVos, 38, comes from the Grand Rapids political and business family. Her letter was read by Lori Packer, a 1988 Robertson for President campaigner who stuck with the party.

The GOP needs candidates "who share our values..." The word "values" is repeated later.

"Like each of you, I have distributed literature, put up yard signs, recruited volunteers, worked on

campaigns from local school board to president," DeVos emphasized her "grass roots experience" as a county and district party chair.

Translation: My rivals' divorces lurk in the background. I started at the bottom, not the top. The religious right plays a role.

Fischer, 33, of Birmingham, is "a working mother (with) a successful career" as an attorney at Miller Canfield, her literature says. She started by working on housing arrangements for the 1980 national convention in Detroit.

Fischer is an Oakland University trustee, former board member of the Michigan Strategic Fund (per Engler appointments) and former aide to then-VP George Bush.

"In 1988 I went out and helped Engler raise over \$1 million. You helped me..."

"When Brooks Patterson came to me two years ago and said I want to run for county executive, I said I'm here and started right away, and that's why he's on board with me. When the governor asked for help on Cut & Cap (property tax cut), I got out there, got petitions signed,

raised money, spoke to groups. "When Mat Dunaskis came to me for help on his Senate race, I was there. That's why he's supporting me."

"When people ask me for help, I respond." Translation: I'm wired to the current movers and shakers and can do the job you want better.

Prognosis: Young rivals don't want to wait for Romney to retire. Her divorce, after authoring pop psych books, has hurt.

Gov. Engler is taking no part, a rarity for him.

DeVos has a handicap: The national committeeman, Chuck Yob, also is from Grand Rapids, and Republicans believe in geographic ticket balancing.

Romney could survive. But the clear lesson is that it's unwise to hang onto a political job too long.

Delegates elected at county conventions will attend a state convention May 29-30 in Detroit to pick the national committee man and woman. (State chair David Doyle is the third Michigan member).

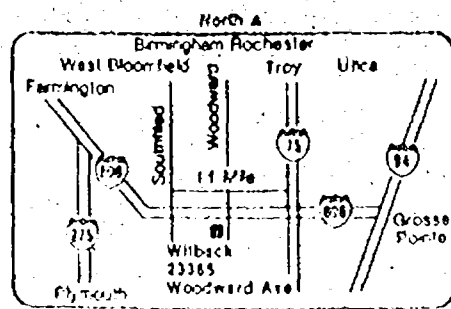

### Soaking up sun, ideas at culinary convention

There's something about Miami, Fla. that helps turn a person's mind into a culinary obsession.

Having just returned from a week in the sunny south, yours truly attended his third International Association of Culinary Professionals annual convention. About 600 of us convened upon Miami and she showed us some pretty exotic culinary treasures.

Maybe it was the carambolas, known north of the Mason-Dixon line as star fruit, sweet and delectable and made into everything from chutney to a syrupy sweet dessert sauce. It might have been the aroma of the guavas that were sliced, diced, pureed and poached and then made into a tea cake that melted in your mouth with a sampling of pure Jamaican Blue Mountain Coffee. Then again, maybe it was the slightly chewy taste of the local treasure, conch, that was frittered and fried into every known shape and size. Whatever it was, I soaked it in faster than the noon day sun can blister your skin.

In addition to working sessions that featured the likes of Julia Child, Joe Baum from the Rainbow Room and Chuck Williams of Williams-Gonoma fame and many more of the folks who mold the foundation for the cooking industry, I took it upon myself to test for what the IACP claims to be, a Certified Culinary Professional (CCP).

### Chef passes test

After a three-hour written exam featuring questions on nutrition, sanitation, food chemistry and general culinary knowledge, my months of study and review of all the major cookbooks and study guides paid off with a passing grade and a new title. My peers questioned my reasoning for taking the test, many of whom retake two or three times before receiving a passing grade. Did I really think the new title will bring me more money? Hardly. Fame and adulation also had little to do with it as most people could really care less. I took the test, as I explained to Jeanne Sarna, Certified Home Economist, to test my own knowledge of food, where it comes from, how to keep it and where it goes. Testees are not given a grade, only a designation as whether or not they passed, and thank the dear lord, I passed!

In addition to meeting the movers and shakers of the food world, the conference also afforded me an opportunity to learn more about the exotic foods from the Caribbean. Miami is home to a diverse array of ethnic groups. Even though pork is pork, when slathered with a mango chutney or seasoned with Jamaican jerk seasoning, new flavors and tastes resurrected. A personal favorite was the wise array of plantain preparations I discovered. Plantain is a quasi vegetable-banana that can be served unripe, ripe, raw, cooked, fried or baked. Available locally in many vegetable markets, the plantain's Cuban heritage excelled in diversity of preparation and you can bet that it will become a popular dish on the Janes Gang table.

### Area well represented

You can rest assured that metro Detroit was well represented at the conference. In addition to Nell Benedict, longtime Oakland County food demonstrator, Mary Rebelski and Kathleen O'Neill, co-owners of the chic Canape Cart catering company in Royal Oak, there was Toula Patsalis, co-owner of Kitchen Glamour.

Patsalis also received an award for placing as one of the top three finalists in the Noilly-Prat Vermont international recipe contest with her recipe for Vegi Oscar using sweet vermouth. We dined together on Saturday night for the IACP Cookbook Awards and shared various workshop experiences. Patsalis, who is fast gaining notoriety for her work with chocolate, raved about the pre-conference Master Class on chocolate preparations that will undoubtedly end up shared with her customers at Kitchen Glamour.

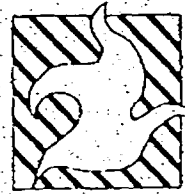
There were a few surprises emanating from the conference. One was Julia Child's admittance that she wanted to still learn more about the art of meat cutting, which was music to my roommate's ears (Dave Brown, also known as the "Canadian Butcher"). The conference also acknowledged that the trend for the '90s will include "coming back to the kitchen," with cooking again becoming an integral part of home living. Look for new cookbooks on getting the family involved, particularly an emphasis on kids cooking. The children today are our future cooks of tomorrow and with school budgets being slashed during tough economic times, new roads must be laid to teach our children that there's more to cooking than fast food, simply opening cans and pressing microwave buttons.

# FIRE up the GRILL with perfect PORK

Versatile pork is one of America's favorite grilling meats. Fire up the grill, and learn the secrets to melt-in-your-mouth ribs.

Fire up the grill, Memorial Day weekend heralds the start of another barbecuing season. Pork, from hot dogs to ribs, is one of America's favorite grilling meats.

"Firing up the grill in sizzling style is easy to do once you decide to expand your grilling horizons," said Robin Kline of the National Pork Producers Council. "If you're ready to go beyond the wienies-and-burgers grilling experience, there are a variety of simple ways to spice up your grilling routine."

If you're concerned about calories, think of pork as the other white meat. For example, a lean cut of pork tenderloin weighs in at 4.1 grams of fat and 139 calories per three-ounce cooked and trimmed serving.

Depending which you choose, hot dogs can be a low fat choice too. "Currently two brands of turkey hot dogs — Hormel Light and Lean and Healthy Choice — have only 1-2 grams of fat per hot dog versus most others at 9-13 grams," said Zonya Foco, a nutritionist from Catherine McAuley Health System's Nutri-Care Nutrition Services.

If you're short on time, pork's a quick meat option," said Kline. "We like to say 'think pink' when grilling pork. Pork is best cooked to an internal temperature of 160 F. for medium doneness, 170 F. for well done. When the juices run clear and there's a slight hint of pink in the center, pork is perfect. Use a meat thermometer just to be sure."

Jack Trabue, who owns The Porter-

house Meats and Word of Mouth Foods, Inc., 1058 S. Main, Plymouth with his wife, Kristin, said the mistake most people make with pork is they overcook it.

There's nothing tastier than ribs grilled to perfection on the grill. "Here's the secret," said Trabue. "Season and parboil them, but not in a big pot. I put mine in a frying pan with the water half up to the ribs. They'll hang over the sides a little. Cover the frying pan with aluminum foil, but let a little steam seep out. You've got to watch them to make sure the water doesn't boil away. Cook the ribs about an 1 1/2 hours until they're fork tender."

"Then grill them on low heat, and baste with barbecue sauce. You've got

to be patient with this. It will take about another 45 minutes. I cook mine until the sauce gets goopy."

If you're planning to serve ribs at a party, Trabue suggests parboiling them the day before. "They don't have to be hot when you grill them," he said.

"Be gentle when you barbecue," said nutritionist Gail Posner of Southfield. "Don't char food, we believe it's related to the risk of cancer. Enhance the flavor of meat and vegetables with marinades. An easy one is no-fat Italian salad dressing."

Make enough marinade to cover all surfaces of meat. Usually 3/4 cup to one cup is enough for one pound of meat. Put the meat in a plastic bag or glass,

steel, plastic or enamel container. Never use aluminum because of the acid content in marinade.

Ideally, use a container that will hold the meat in a single layer. Sealable plastic bags are ideal, because you can turn the bag occasionally so that the meat is evenly exposed to marinade. Pour marinade over the meat, and refrigerate two to 24 hours before grilling.

**CHICKEN CRESCENTS**

1/2 cup crushed herb-seasoned croutons  
1/4 cup chopped walnuts or pecans  
3 ounce cream cheese with chives  
2 tablespoons butter softened  
1/2 teaspoon lemon pepper  
1 cup cubed, cooked chicken  
1 can, 2 oz. mushrooms, drained  
1 can Pillsbury crescent rolls  
3 tablespoons butter, melted  
1 package chicken gravy mix (Sauce)  
1-2 tablespoons chopped chives (Sauce)

Combine croutons and nuts and set aside. In a separate bowl, combine cream cheese, 2 tablespoons butter and seasoning, mix well. Stir in chicken and mushrooms, set aside. Separate the crescent dough into 8 triangles. Spread each with about 1/4 cup of the chicken mixture. Roll up starting at the shortest side of the triangle and roll to the opposite point. Tuck the sides in and point under to seal completely. Dip rolls in the melted butter. Coat with crumb-nut mixture, place on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 15-20 minutes until golden brown. Add chives to gravy and spoon a small amount on top of each roll. Serves four.

**FRUIT SALAD**

Your choice fresh fruit  
1/2 cup confectioner's sugar

1 teaspoon dry mustard  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon paprika  
1 teaspoon celery seed  
1/4 teaspoon onion juice  
1 cup salad oil  
4 tablespoons cider or white vinegar

Combine and spoon fruit into individual serving dishes and top with a spoonful of the dressing. To make dressing, mix together the sugar, mustard, salt, paprika and celery seed. Add the onion juice. Very slowly, add the oil and vinegar a little bit at a time. Beat with a whisk or a fork until well-blended and thick.

**CAKE**

1 box graham crackers  
2 packages instant French vanilla gelatin pudding  
8 ounce carton Cool Whip  
3 cups milk

Spray 9x13 pan with non-stick spray and line with whole graham crackers. Mix pudding with 3 cups of milk. Fold in Cool Whip. Put half of the pudding mixture on top of the graham crackers. ## Many cooks prefer charcoal briquettes

Charcoal briquettes, a combination of coal, sawdust, woodchips and sand are relative newcomers on the grilling scene. They were invented after World War II by Henry Ford as a way to use scrap lumber from wooden auto bodies. While gas grills are gaining in popularity, some people, about 25 billion Americans a year, still prefer briquettes. Here are some tips.

Start the fire 20 to 30 minutes before placing your meat on the grill. Place the briquettes in a pyramid in the center of the grill. Ignite with charcoal lighter fluid or an electric starter and wait for the fire to die out and the coals to glow. About 30 minutes. The coals are ready for cooking when they're ash-covered and glowing. Place a generous amount of coals in the fire grate with 2 to 3 inches extending beyond where the meat cuts will be placed on the grill above.

# Award-winning veal with sweet vermouth outstanding

## VEAL OSCAR SAUCE

3 tablespoons butter  
2 shallots, chopped fine  
1 clove garlic, crushed  
1 1/2 cups chicken broth  
1/4 cup sweet vermouth  
2 tablespoons lemon juice  
1/4 teaspoon salt  
1/8 teaspoon pepper

6 tablespoons butter  
1/4 cup flour  
1 egg yolk beaten with 1 table-  
spoon chicken broth

In a 2-quart saucepan, saute shallots and garlic in butter for 3 minutes on medium heat. Add chicken broth, vermouth, lemon juice and spices. Bring to a rolling boil and cook, uncovered, for 20 minutes over medium heat.

Strain broth in a bowl.  
Melt 6 tablespoons of butter. Stir in flour with a whisk and make a smooth paste; cook a second. Slowly add broth, whisking as you add the liquid. Stir. Turn heat up and continue to stir until the mixture thickens. Add egg yolk mixture and whisk briefly. Cook 1 minute. Remove from heat; set aside.

## VEAL

1 1/2-2 pounds veal steak  
1 cup seasoned breadcrumbs  
1 stick butter  
1 pound fresh asparagus, cleaned and steamed for 8 minutes.  
1/4 cup Fontinella cheese  
1/4 cup Parmesan cheese, grated salt and pepper to taste

Cut veal into serving pieces. Using a meat pounder, flatten steaks to about 1/4-inch thick. Pat seasoned breadcrumbs over entire surface, front and back.

In a large skillet, melt the butter. Heat until butter begins to froth. Turn heat to medium and saute veal pieces for 2 minutes on both sides, about 4 minutes. Layer on ovenproof platter. Artistically place the bundles of steamed asparagus on the platter. Top entire surface with the sauce mixture. Sprinkle top with mixed grated cheeses and bake at 375 degrees for 15 minutes. Serve with steamed rice. Serves 6.

2 1/4 cups all purpose flour  
1 teaspoon baking powder

3/4 cup Maple syrup  
1/2 cup buttermilk  
1/4 cup fresh Florida orange juice  
2 tablespoons grated orange zest  
5 oz. (1 cup) coarsely chopped macadamia nuts

orange maple glaze (recipe follows)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Grease and flour a loaf pan. Combine flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt in a medium bowl. Set aside. 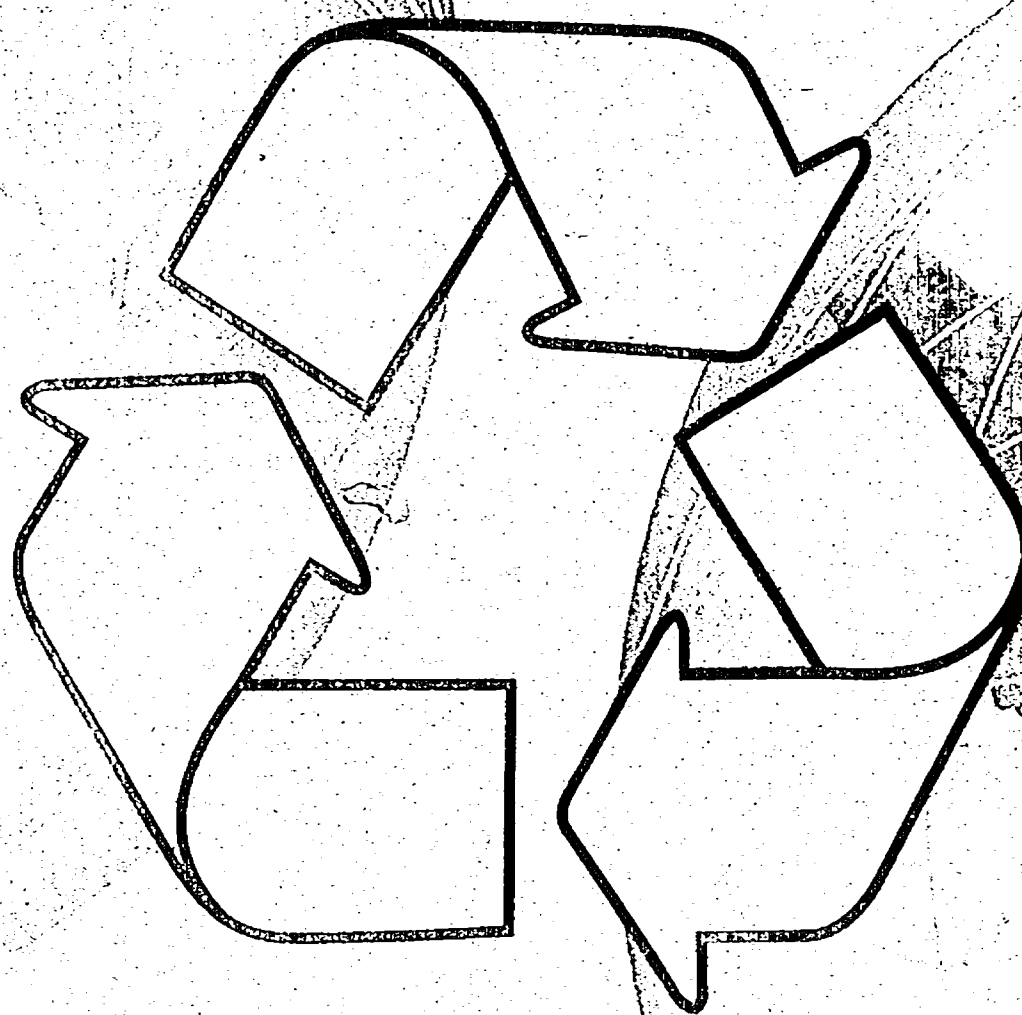

AP — In small amounts, olive oil adds a mellow flavor to your cooking. Splashing a little onto salads, bread, pasta, or grilled foods captures a real taste of the Mediterranean.

Much has been written about olive oil's nutritional benefits, including a claim it lowers blood cholesterol. It's true that olive oil is relatively high in monounsaturated fat and low in saturated fat.

However, research has not proven indisputably that olive oil helps to lower cholesterol any more than other oils or foods.

So, for your health's sake, follow the same rule of thumb for olive oil

as you would for any other dietary fat — enjoy it in moderation.

Selecting an olive oil, like selecting a wine, is a matter of personal preference.

Because there are many different kinds of olive oil, be sure to pick the one that satisfies your taste and your cooking needs. Extra-virgin olive oil is considered top of the

line. Nutritionally, all olive oils are the same.

To store any of the oils listed below, tightly cover the container after each use. Then, place it in a cool, dark cupboard.

Refrigerating it will make it turn cloudy. Olive oil will stay fresh for up to one year.

**Extra-Virgin:** Extra-virgin olive oil has a perfect olive flavor and a green-gold color. It's delicious when brushed onto crusty bread with crushed herbs.

**Fine Virgin:** Fine virgin olive oil has a superior flavor and aroma, but with a little higher acidity than extra-virgin olive oil.

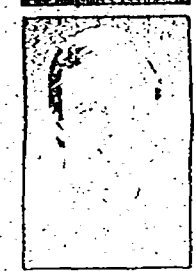
Making a debut: The Ann Arbor-based Big Chief has proven it's up to the challenge musically with its debut album, "Face," on Sub Pop.



## Big Chief: No apology necessary



From the debut album of the Ann Arbor-based Big Chief to the latest from the Pale Saints, the record industry has a plethora of new sounds on the market these days. And some are well worth a listen.

From the gallows of tortuous metal to the gutters of cosmopolitan funk, can Big Chief sound any bigger? The Ann Arbor quintet's debut on Seattle-based Sub Pop, "Face," would indicate not.

And being on Sub Pop, that fabulous label that has brought us Reverend Horton Heat, Dwarves, Mudhoney and some other band whose name escapes us at the moment, (Did you say Nirvana?), there's much to be expected of Barry Hennisler's thump and grunt outfit.

Big Chief hasn't let this become a creative shackle nor do they sound the least bit like they're riding the Nirvana bandwagon.

Their sound has always been insular as much as it is primal. A Big Chief number manifests itself through inner exploration of wrought feelings and dense grungy guitars. The sum total of that becomes intertwined with a texture of styles from metal, funk to some free jazz thrown in for good measure.

Hennisler's voice is a growling exhaust pipe worthy of an AET inspection. Angry? Yes. Mindless rage? Never. Big Chief and Hennisler are far too clever for that.

Rather, they want to show they're in control. The new metal aesthetic calls for such prescribed venom. A little Spanish guitar to douse the flaming embers from "Who's Gonna Do All That?" Show them some subtlety. A full-fledged discharge of uptown funk/hip hop in "Lie There and Be Good?" Show them you're street smart.

All of which could be interpreted as an attempt to distance themselves from every spandex-clad, blond-haired metalhead who has inhabited earth since 1970. In Big Chief's case, one figures they just want to take the genre to a higher art form.

"The Ballad of Dylan Cohl" initially relies on the dungeon metal guitar but quickly shakes out into a scorching electric crescendo of '70s Hendrix-like proportion. By contrast "Desert Jam" is brooding — bludgeoned into submission by thick Black Sabbath-style guitars and a thumping bass.

Raw and savage, but Big Chief need not make any apologies. (Caroline/Sub Pop, 114 W. 26th St., New York, N.Y. 10001)

■ "BEDLAM A-GO-GO," SOMETHING HAPPENS — Oh, and you wonder why. This band seemingly possesses every ingredient it takes to make giant strides in the industry — infectious, melodic songs; powerful, flawless vocals; and a reputation for hot, awe-inspiring gigs.

A listen to the quartet's latest on Charisma will only make you wonder all the more. Unlike "Stuck Together with God's Glue," where almost-crystalline production rendered some of the band's otherwise brimming numbers inert, Something Happens are back to their usual, self-assertive ways thanks to Ray Harmon's blistering, seemingly visceral at times, guitar playing.

Thematically, numbers are a tad more mature — topped off by the big, all-encompassing question posed by lead vocalist Tom Dunne in "Beautiful Country," a soft acoustic tempered song that delves into nationalism and the disintegration of one's homeland.

The penchant for indelible, straightforward dance floor numbers is still there as revealed in songs such as "Diane on the Cross." There's always a tension at the core of a Something Happens' song, which in its release is immersed in the fountain of sanctifying rock 'n' roll glory. (Charisma Records)

■ "HEY BABE," JULIANA HATFIELD — "Ev-

eryone loves me but you," sings the Blake Babies vocalist on the opening cut of her solo debut on Mammoth Records produced by Gary Smith.

Her sweet vocals, cooing ever so childlike on these jaggedly constructed pop numbers belie those feelings. Feel sorry for her? She's not asking you to.

Hatfield's trademark with the Blake Babies is/was to detach herself somewhat from the songs she's singing. On "Hey Babe," Hatfield apparently wants to reconcile this (and perhaps distance herself from her work with the Blake Babies in general) with some rather personally revealing lyrics.

Yearning and unfulfillment are recurring themes in her songs.

So, too, apparently is some Morrissey self pity. "I'm ugly with a capital U and I don't need a mirror to see that it's true," sings Hatfield in "Ugly." Hatfield can cut to the heart of matter, vividly describing a dysfunctional relationship as she does in the festering guitar lament "Forever Baby." Mature, and definitely something Hatfield can call her own. (Mammoth Records, Carr Mill, 2nd Floor, Carrboro, N.C. 27510)

■ "IN RIBBONS," PALE SAINTS — A listless state of melancholy only to be awoken by a chilling piece of dissonant guitar feedback. Then to be lulled back into a blissful existence by an ethereal vocal track — such is the Pale Saints modus operandi on their latest 4AD release.

On "In Ribbons," the Pale Saints turn giddy at the mere insertion of an orchestral element such as a cello or violin into their music. This obsession almost leads them astray from those gorgeous, fractured guitar introspective numbers they're so adept at performing.

When the Pale Saints find the right track, such as in the shimmering "A Thousand Stars Burst Open," the results are breathtaking. But it's a hard fought battle through out, featuring the Pale Saints ever exploring their vocal and instrumental potential. Theirs and the listener's patience are aptly rewarded, though. ## Traveling show goes for laughs in karaoke style

Perhaps it was just bound to happen.

The idea of merging karaoke, the entertainment sensation of the '90s, with stand-up comedy, which enjoyed its greatest popularity during the '80s, is actually a highly logical proposition.

Known as "Stand Up to Go," this interactive karaoke-style program is now touring the country to promote Comedy Central, cable television's all-comedy network. And shoppers at Oakland Mall in Troy were among the first to try out the new concept at the inaugural stop in a 15-city tour.

"This is Comedy Central's way of showing you what it's like to be a successful stand-up comic," said Lee Michael Buckman, the comic who serves as master of ceremonies for the "Stand Up to Go" tour. It's Buckman's job to grab people's attention as they pass the large high-tech display in the center of the mall.

Those itching to participate could get on a mock stage (in front of a red curtain facsimile of the trademark comedy club brick wall) and perform their favorite one-liners and comedy bits from a menu featuring the work of the world's funniest comics.

Some of the categories on the "Stand Up to Go" menu included "The best of Henny Youngman," "Knock, Knock," "My Mother-in-Law" and "Take My Family, Please!" The performer simply made a selection from the menu and read the jokes to the audience from a monitor placed directly in front of them.

Others more familiar with the comedy trade could elect to do their own material. To make the proposition more enticing, audience reaction clips, laughter and applause were mixed on a video cassette tape which the performer got to keep.

But wait, there was more. The performer chosen as the Detroit area's best received a chance to host a segment of Comedy Central's daily comedy clip program, "Short Attention Span Theater."

The lure of instant stardom brought 61 brave souls to the

stage. Evan Branch of Royal Oak was the first. He has tried his hand at comedy before — a few open mike nights at local clubs — and he was disappointed in his performance.

"I have a lot of material," Branch said, "but most of it's dirty. They told me it had to be clean."

Many of the performers had never tried their comedic luck in a club setting. They were just too young to get in. Nevertheless, a few of the younger set managed to steal the show by exhibiting grace under pressure.

"My sister was going to do it, but she chickened out," said Lisa Alrey of Rochester Hills, a student at West Middle School. She performed jokes from the category of "My Lousy Childhood."

To date, Matthew Nyquist has never had the opportunity to take center stage during productions at Athens High School in Troy, but for a few minutes, he was able to show the poise of a pro — and get some laughs.

When it was all said and done, Bryan Ferguson of Detroit was chosen as the day's winner. An auto mechanic by day, Ferguson has moonlighted as a comic the last four years, appearing at most of the local clubs as an emcee or feature act. But performing in the middle of a mall was definitely a different experience.

"People were walking through wondering what in the world I'm doing," Ferguson said. "It was pretty cool, though."

It got even better when he was selected as the winner.

"I couldn't believe it," said Ferguson, whose taped segment aired last week on Comedy Central. "I'm starting to get really serious about comedy now, and that really helps."

Royal Oak's Karl C. Kohl, who also has graced the stages of a few local clubs, best summed up the afternoon's activities.

"It's a great idea," he said. "It gives people who aren't familiar with the business a chance to see what it's all about."

Now there are 61 people a bit more familiar with "the business," perhaps, comics may start to get a bit more respect around here.

Tokyo is transformed by an explosion of nature's fireworks and a sweeping succession of time-honored festivals each spring.

Ohanami, or flower viewing, which began with cherry blossoms, continues in breathless bursts of dangling wisteria, voluptuous peonies, flamboyant azaleas and fragrant roses until 100 varieties of irises come into full bloom at the Meiji Shrine Garden in mid-June.

The winding lanes and bustling shopping streets of Shitamachi, Tokyo's most traditional district, come under the spotlight too, as neighborhood shrines and temples welcome spring with boisterous celebrations.

Dating back to the early Edo period (1603-1867), one of the city's oldest and liveliest festivals is taking place here during May.

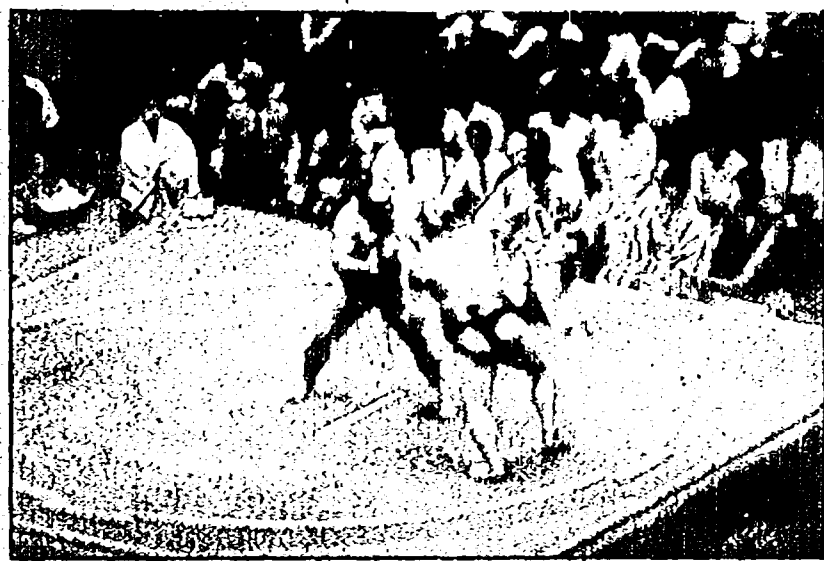

# Small changes make big difference in health

It's never too late for older people to benefit from preventive health-related measures. For example, an individual past age 65 who stops cigarette smoking returns to an average risk of heart attack after only two years.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, most Americans consume only half

of the recommended minimum five daily servings of fruit and vegetables each day.

Polyunsaturated oils include corn, safflower, canola and sunflower oils. Monounsaturated oils are peanut and olive oils. It's best to use cooking oils from both categories, because using only polyunsaturated oils can lower both your LDL (bad) cholesterol and HDL (good) cholesterol. In contrast, monounsaturated oils can lower the LDL level in your blood while maintaining the HDL.

The Food and Drug Administration is warning women with high

blood pressure that taking angiotensin converting enzyme (ACE) inhibitors during pregnancy can cause serious birth defects. Recently, physicians received notification that due to increased reports of fetal complications and even death, ACE inhibitors should not be prescribed for pregnant women.

A new study shows that an overwhelming number of cases of one form of skin cancer originate on the ear. These findings highlight the importance of wearing protective sunscreen or a hat with a brim.

Repeated cycles of losing and gaining weight may increase your

risk of developing heart problems. Several years ago, researchers at Northwestern University reported on a group of 1,700 men who were followed over a period of 25 years. Those who showed the greatest up-and-down weight swings also had the highest risk of sudden death from heart disease.



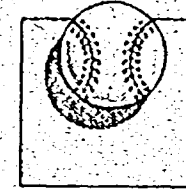

Karen Seremet, who went all seven innings, was the winning pitcher. Michelle Averill suffered the loss.

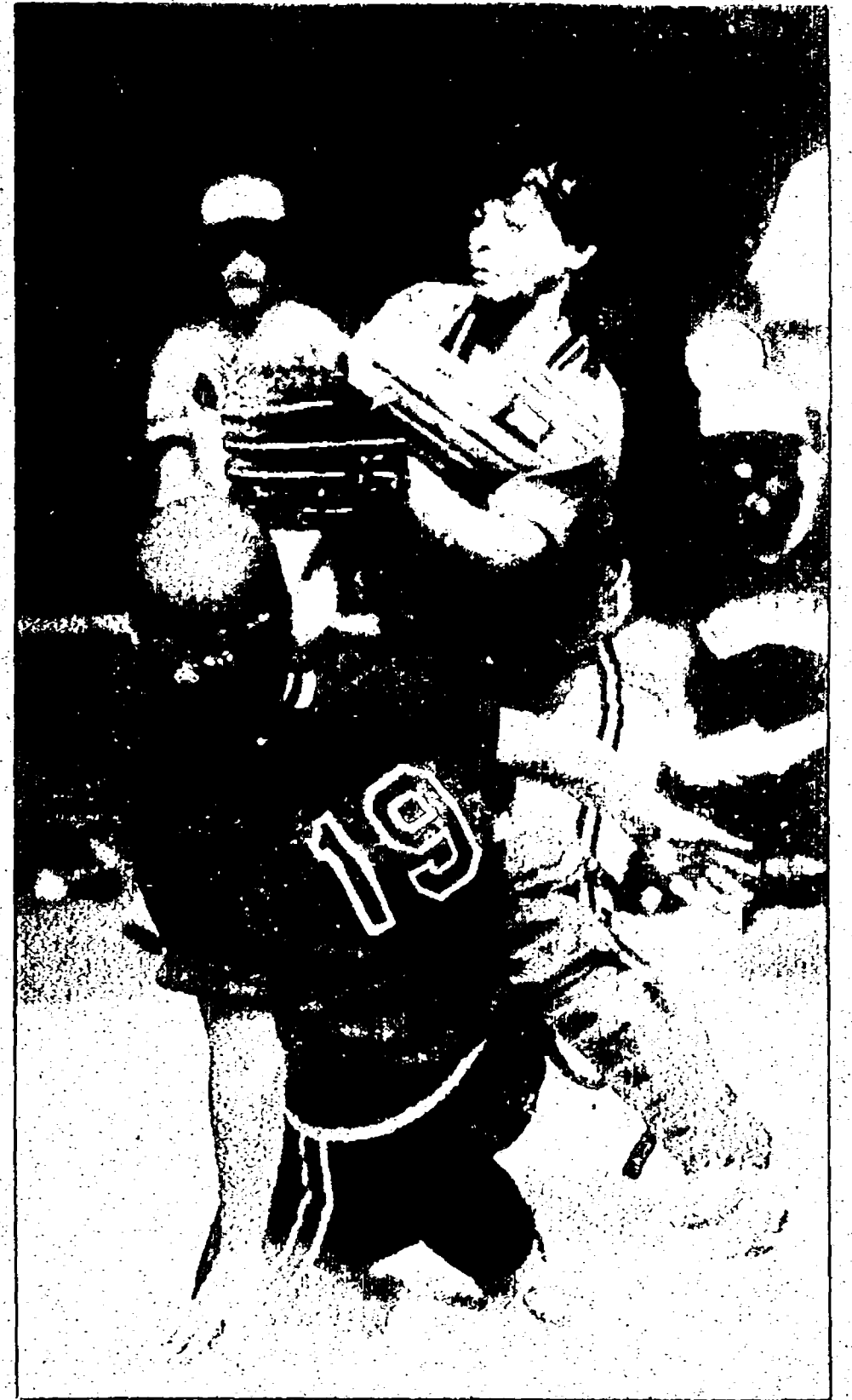

# Plymouth Salem gets WLAA crown

If Mark Gregor had his way, Plymouth Salem would have won the Western Lakes Activities Association title in the 300 hurdles, but the Rocks finally got their due Tuesday.

After finishing second last season and third in Gregor's first four years as the Salem coach, the Rocks took first place and defended their title at Centennial Educational Park.

"It looks like we had a five-year plan, but we really didn't have one," Gregor said. "We hung around the top the last four years, and I guess it was our turn this year."

Salem was ready to challenge the Chiefs this year and overcame Canton with a strong finish. The Rocks scored 170 points, Canton 137, Livonia Stevenson 163 and Walled Lake Western 100.

"The thing that is great about the Salem team is they're so strong down the stretch in the 300 hurdles, 200 dash and 1,600 relay," Canton coach George Przygodski said. "You know they're

going to score points.

"We were hoping to amass as many points as we possibly could early in the meet and hope we could hold on. We just couldn't catch the lead enough on them, and they were able to come back."

Canton led until midway in the meet when Salem junior Tonya Wheeler won the 400-meter dash and put the Rocks in front 105-100. Then Salem captured three places in the 300 hurdles, with senior Theresa Giacherio winning the race, and extended its lead to 126-110.

"Twenty-one points is outstanding," Gregor said. "Any time you hit the scoreboard with that many points in a close meet, it takes a little air out of the teams that are close to you."

Wheeler repeated as the 400-meter champion, also won the 200 this year and anchored Salem's winning 800 and 1,600 relay teams.

"I can't say enough about Tonya Wheeler," Gregor said. "She's had an outstanding year, and it doesn't just happen for her. She works at it the year round."

Giacherio was a double winner,

top. Besides winning the 300 hurdles for a second time, she improved upon a third-place finish in the 100 hurdles last year to add that league title.

"She's had a great career, but the last three weeks she's done the best hurdling I've seen from a Salem girl," Gregor said. "We had a good one in Jennifer Harris, and she's right there with her."

While Wheeler and Giacherio were individual standouts, the Rocks relied on a lot of girls to produce the team victory, scoring in every event but the shot put.

After Salem finished second in the regional meet Friday, Gregor was concerned about his team being ready for another top performance in the WLAA meet.

"Once we got started on the track, momentum took over," he said. "The girls feed off each other's success, and we got better as the meet went along."

"A lot of great coaches told me the strength of your team depends on your ability to run 400 dashes. If you can develop quarter milers, there are a lot of things you can do with them, and that is the strength of our team."

Przygodski was asked what he saw as the difference between the Canton and Salem teams of a year ago and 1992. The Chiefs overpowered the opposition last year by scoring 176 points, Stevenson 119 and the Rocks 102.

There was nothing Dean Kobane would have liked more than to end his collegiate career, as part of University of Michigan's golf team, in style.

In other words, with a score low enough to challenge the best in the Big Ten.

But he didn't. Kobane, a 1987 Livonia Churchill graduate, had one of his worst outings of the season at last weekend's Big Ten Tournament, finishing tied for 35th with rounds of 75-76-70-79, a 300 total. U-M placed seventh.

It was hardly a true reflection on the rest of his season. A senior, Kobane was the Wolverines' best, finishing with a 74.5 stroke average and leading his team's scorers in eight of 12 tournaments.

"Basically, I was pretty content with (my season), until the Big Ten," said Kobane.

"I'm kind of perplexed by it. I felt I was in a good groove going in, then — bang — I lost it. Right with the first round, I never got on track. I temporarily lost it."

Kobane hoped to find some part of his game that would allow him to salvage the tournament, but his confidence wavered. "Basically, you need a bread-and-butter shot, something you have a lot of confidence in," he explained.

He could not find anything at a time he wanted — and needed — it most. "You try to find something that will temporarily work, but playing at that level, it's hard to find a temporary Band-Aid," Kobane said.

His disappointment was tempered by the knowledge that he's better than he showed. "It's not the end of the world. It is a little

frustrating. I tried to peak at the right time. I just didn't."

"I got off-track at the wrong time. It happens in this game."

Which adequately sums up the most maddening element of golf. No one can force success. Unlike other sports, in which anger and frustration can be channeled into a stronger performance, getting angry in the middle of a poor round of golf won't improve it.

Kobane realizes all this, of course. Indeed, he experienced it last weekend. And now —

"I want to forget about it."

Not golf, mind you. Just that last tournament. "You want to reach a peak for that one competition," he said. "I hit a valley. I can't really explain why things like that happen."

Nor does he plan to dwell on it. Kobane will work this summer at a golf shop in Ypsilanti and while continuing to work on his game. A pro career is possible, but he isn't sure he wants to devote his life pursuing such a questionable future.

"I want to be realistic," he said. "You have to spend a lot of time on the game if you want to play pro. I think I may have the ability if I work really hard at it. But I've got to decide if I want to make the commitment."

"I want to continue playing the game, but I want to be able to count on a weekly paycheck."

Kobane plans to play in both the Michigan Amateur and Michigan Open in June. After that, he'll become a teaching pro.

Whether or not he'll pursue a pro tour card is something he can't say for certain.

# Mustangs gallop to championship

Led by double-winners Jeff Brust and Bill Crosby, Walled Lake Western finished a strong second place in Wednesday's Western Lakes Activities Association boys track meet at Farmington.

"This is the best I've ever finished," said Warriors' coach Dennis Keeney. "That's the best Western has finished in 10 years."

Western's 116 points were second only to Northville's 131.5.

Farmington Harrison was third with 98 points, although Hawks' coach John Schumacher was not nearly as happy with his finish as was Keeney.

"It was a good meet (for Harrison) but it was far from being our best and far from being a great performance," he said.

Livonia Churchill was fourth

with 81 points, followed by Plymouth Canton (76), Westland John Glenn (66.5), Farmington (65.5), Plymouth Salem (51), North Farmington (28.5), Livonia Stevenson (25.5), Walled Lake Central (11.5) and Livonia Franklin (11).

Western boasted the most individual winners. Brust won both hurdles events, taking the 100 in 15.11 — edging Salem's Don Johnson by .01 — and the 300 with a time of 40.32. Crosby won the 800 in 1:57.86 and the 1,600 in 4:28.47.

Crosby hoped to add a third victory, but in his fourth and final event, the 3,200, he suffered from cramps and fatigue and faded to fourth. He also anchored Western's lone relay winner, the 3,200 team, which won with a time of 8:07.86.

Keeney said seniors Brust and Crosby "really took us through."

Keeney was also pleased with the 3,200 relay squad, which broke Western's school record.

"We've been trying to do that since this group of kids started in high school," Keeney said. "I'm glad we could get our top four half-milers in this event." In addition to Crosby, the other runners were Jim Sweetman, Brandon Keeney and Matt Wright.

Entering the meet, Keeney felt his team had a shot at reaching the 120-point mark. "I felt if we could squeeze out every last drop we might get 120 points. We just about squeezed out every last drop," he said.

Harrison triumphed in long and short races Wednesday, winning three sprints and one distance event.

Duante Anderson won the 100 (11.23). Roy Granger, the runner-up in the 100, broke their tape in the 200 (22.83). Granger and An-

derson then ran first and fourth, respectively, as Harrison won the 400 relay in 43.73. The other team members were Scott Gurke and Jason Dreyer.

Jason Zdyrski and Todd Haney gave the Hawks a one-two finish in the 3,200. Zdyrski won the race in 10:00.41.

Schumacher, who noted that Harrison had "some great individual performances," was also pleased with Dreyer's second-place finish in the 800.

Unlike Western, which featured Crosby and Brust running in four events each, Schumacher said he didn't use his top performers "to the max."

"If we would've loaded up events we would have scored more points," said the Harrison coach. "From a team standpoint I think that was sort of our downfall."

Northville won three individual events and two relays.

# 'Alien 3' slices, dices, rehashes its predecessors

The original "Alien" had atmosphere to spare and a good director -- Ridley Scott of "Blade Runner" and "Thelma and Louise" fame. "Aliens," the equally popular sequel, put "The Terminator's" James Cameron behind the wheel.

So what makes video director David Fincher think that he knows anything about science fiction/action pictures? His "Alien 3," which landed in area theaters this past weekend, is a mind-numbingly lousy rehash of its predecessors.

Sigourney Weaver returns as Ripley, who can't remember a time when she wasn't battling the nightmarish creature. This time around, she crashes on a planet populated by convicts.

All of the intergalactic jailbirds have bar codes stamped on their shaved heads. Most sport English accents and are virtually impossible to tell apart.

Perhaps, to lessen the obvious sexual tension, Ripley shaves her head too, Sinead O'Connor style. It doesn't keep a group of inmates from cornering and attempting to rape her.

At first, Ripley doesn't volunteer what she knows about the organism that probably crash-landed with her. No tension or sense of wonderment is created with the audience since we already know it's out there.

"Alien 3" has no problem rehashing previous plot devices. Ripley plugs in the oozy head of an android to seek out information, just like the original. The endless corridors and airshatts of the penal col-

ony have the appropriately dingy and utilitarian feel, but couldn't the action move to some original locale?

Despite the obvious nods to "Metropolis" in the appropriately dark and oppressive cinematography, this is an ugly movie. There was always something strange and beautiful about this perfect organism, but here it's just another monster with a messy job to do.

The creature and the human actors carry out their tasks in the most mundane way possible. You could tell that the forces behind the previous "Alien" movies loved making an audience jump and laugh nervously at a false alarm. No luck here.

Instead, we have the overuse of a hokey Alien's-eye-view as it chases victims through corridors.

The advertising tag for the original read, "In space, no one can hear you scream." But how about yawning? Even the usually sedate crowd at a Southfield critic's screening was audibly bored. One reviewer even booed.

Hopefully, bad word of mouth will put the \$50 million "Alien 3" to rest for good.

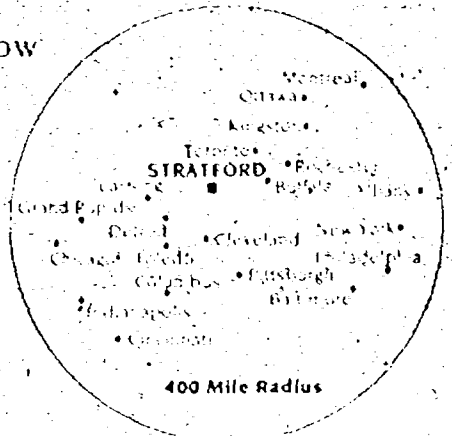

# 'Under the Sun:' Something got lost in the translation

The title on the box of this video should probably have been a tip-off that something 'about' the French film "Under the Sun of Satan" was going to be lost in the translation. It offered an alternate title using "Son" although the French title read "Soleil" or sun.

Georges Arnaud is a priest who professes to his superior that he isn't up to the duties demanded of a parish priest. Coming from a rural farming life, Depardieu feels he has only physical strength to offer God and finds it miraculous that he managed to be ordained.

When his confessor reassures him that God isn't displeased with him, Depardieu laments he can only "weep or absolve" the people of the parish.

The priest's doubt and insecurities about his relationship with God result in the usual zealot's self-abasement — wearing a hair shirt and bloody self-flagellation.

Sandrine Bonnaire plays an emotionally disturbed and self-destructive teenager. Promiscuous with a couple adult lovers and seething with rage and self-loathing, she kills one of her lovers in an off-camera shooting. She composes herself and is next seen at the river washing blood from her shoes.

No one knew about the girl's relationship with the older man, whose death was ruled to be suicide. Like the priest, the girl is seeking redemption through abuse and punishment. She would have been much happier charged with the man's murder than having another lover, a local magistrate, make light of her confession.

Walking in the rain to a neighboring parish to help out with services, Depardieu loses his way as it becomes dark. A fellow traveler joins him and shows him a short cut through the woods. The man

claims to be a son of Satan (remember that confusion about the title I mentioned?), and the priest is faced with a crisis of faith on that dark country road.

This self-proclaimed son of Satan does most of the talking, the priest ends up exhausted and looking overwhelmed. The next day, never having completed his journey, the shaken priest returns to his home parish.

In the single interaction between the priest and the girl, he meets her in a garden. Somehow he knows everything about her, including the shooting. He knows her remorse and is concerned about what lies ahead.

As she continues on her path of self-destruction, he knows but is unable to make a difference.

Later on, the priest apparently has acquired the gift of healing. He is reluctant to use his healing powers, which he attributes to Satan's intervention. That puts him in the position of offending God by using the powers. It's a paradox. If he does what he should as a priest, using the tainted powers, he sins.

The whole story is rather muddy and unfocused. The priest and the girl don't really relate to each other as characters or as part of the story. It's like there are pieces missing. It's a jumble of literal minded religiousness with visions and visits from the devil in human form.
