Judge: murder charges stand

A judge refused Friday to dismiss murder charges against two Westland teens accused of plotting to murder a 19-year-old Westland man.

Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Denise Page Hood's refusal to drop murder charges against Ian Bruce Cowan and Gregory Hister came just

hours before testimony in the two-week trial ended.

A jury began deliberating Cowan's case Friday and will continue today (Monday). Hister waived a jury trial, and Judge Hood will decide his verdict.

Cowan, 17, and Hister, 16, are accused of plotting with two other teenagers to murder 19-year-old Everett Earl Bowen Jr., who was shot to death the night of Nov. 15 behind Adams

Junior High School in Westland.

Hood decided Friday that, despite conflicting testimony, enough evidence existed to try Cowan and Hister on charges of first-degree murder, conspiracy to murder, and first-degree murder in the commission of another felony, robbery.

The shooting victim's mother, Patricia Bowen, wept and left the courtroom after hearing the judge's decision. "I'm relieved," she said, standing in the hallway.

However, she added that she's more

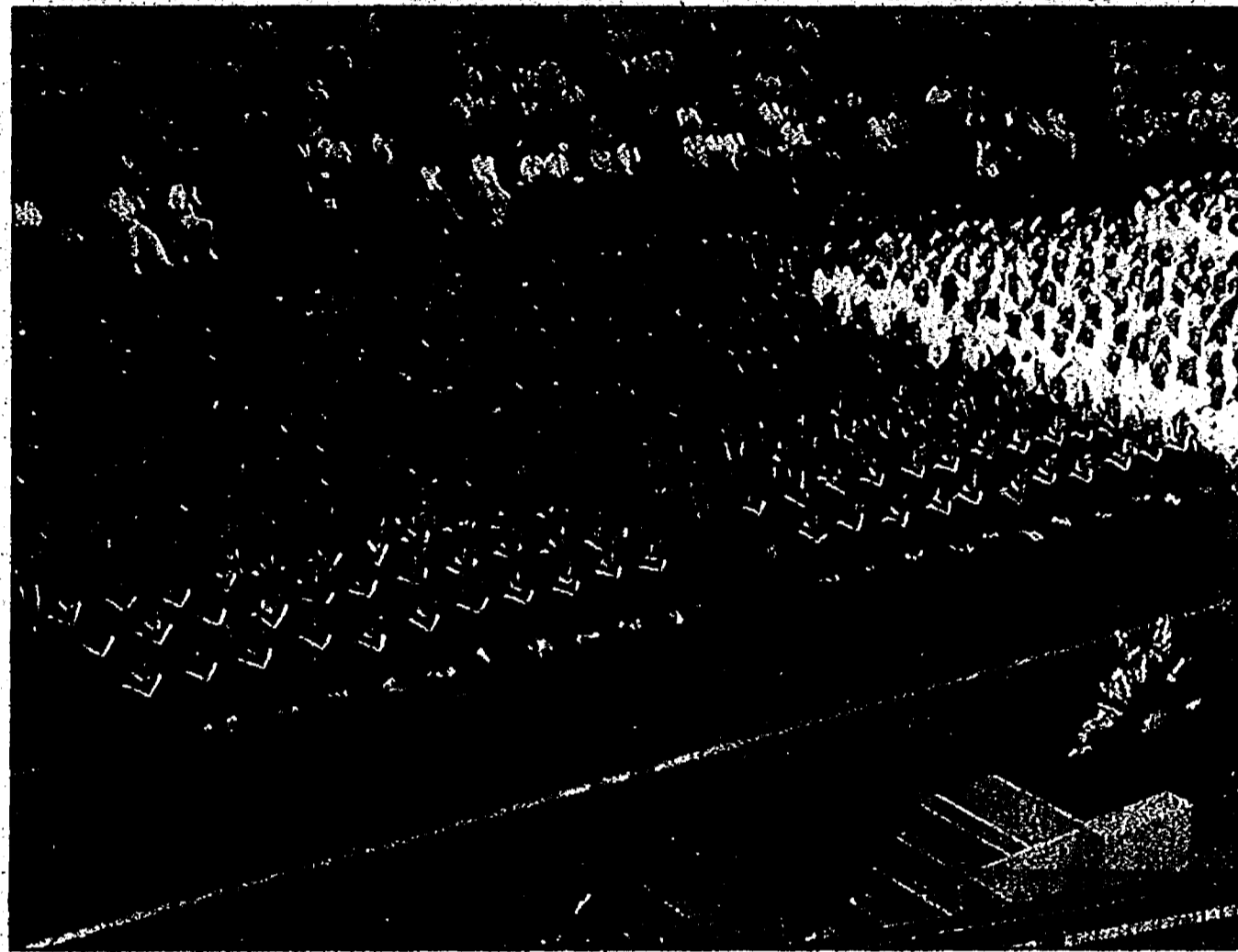
concerned about Cowan's case than Hister's, saying she blames Cowan more for her son's death.

Police have accused Cowan, Hister and two other teens, Jermaine Stevenson and Jerome Omar Ingram, of arranging to meet Bowen at Adams school for a supposed drug deal. Bowen had been a known crack cocaine dealer.

But prosecutors have said the teens merely tricked Bowen into meeting them so they could kill him. The teens wanted revenge for an earlier fight in which Bowen stabbed Cowan's legs several times with a screwdriver, prosecutors have said.

No jail time in sex case

A 64-year-old Westland businessman convicted of sexually abusing his 10-year-old step-granddaughter won't be sentenced to prison.

Instead, Willis E. Young, owner of Bill's Print Shop, has been placed on probation for five years and told he can't have unsupervised contact with minors.

Young also has been ordered to receive psychiatric counseling and to pay for any therapy that his step-granddaughter may need.

Young's sentencing Friday before Detroit Recorder's Court Judge M. John Shamo came six weeks after he was convicted of two counts of second-degree criminal sexual conduct.

Shamo, who found Young guilty during a bench trial, could have sentenced Young to a maximum of 15 years in prison.

"We feel that it was a fair sentence," Young's attorney, Jeffrey Schwartz, said Friday. "I'm happy with the sentence."

"We would like to put this whole thing behind us and make the best of the situation," Schwartz added.

Young's sentence came eight months after his 10-year-old step-granddaughter, weeping at times, testified during a preliminary examination in Westland's 18th District Court that Young put his hand inside her clothing and penetrated her.

The girl also said Young made her touch his sex organ through his clothing.

That preliminary examination resulted in Young being bound over to Recorder's Court for trial.

Initially, he had been charged with four counts of first-degree criminal sexual conduct. But Shamo found him guilty on only two counts — and reduced those to second-degree.

First-degree counts carry a maximum penalty of life in prison.

Assistant Wayne County prosecutor Lora Weingarden, who handled the case, is on maternity leave, according to the prosecutor's office, and she could not be reached for comment.

In the preliminary examination, Young had denied sexually abusing the 10-year-old, and his attorney had tried to cast doubt on the youngster's credibility.

Polls close at 8 — school races now in voters' hands

Local voters will decide board of education races today in the Wayne-Westland and Livonia school district elections. Polls will be open until 8 tonight.

In the Wayne-Westland district, eight candidates are seeking two four-year terms in a campaign dominated by attacks against board president Sylvia Kosorosky-Wiacek by the former school superintendent and others.

Others seeking a term are Richard LeBlanc, Michael Flemming, Mathew McCusker, Steven Lind, Kenneth Raupp, Francis (Bud) Winter and John Albrecht. Winding up her school board member is Kathleen Chorbagan, who isn't running for a third term.

In the Livonia district, which covers the northern section of Westland, there will be a schools-of-choice proposal on

the ballot as well as eight candidates seeking two four-year terms.

The Livonia board of education is asking district residents to vote on whether the district should implement a schools-of-choice plan.

If the ballot proposal is approved, the district would then have to provide transportation for residents who opt to send their children to designated non-neighborhood schools.

Under the present open enrollment policy, parents may elect to send their children to a non-neighborhood school if space is available but must provide transportation.

Incumbent Richard Thorderson has decided against seeking re-election but incumbent Marjorie Roach is running for another four-year term.

Today's elections will let voters decide the board of education races for both the Wayne-Westland and Livonia school districts. A schools-of-choice proposal is also on the Livonia ballot. Polls stay open until 8 p.m.

The challengers are Alicia Hildaigo D'Orazio, Ralph Walko, Katherine Pate, Gerald Parcheta, Kenneth Timmons, Susan Thompson, and Pamela Guarnieri.

Contestants wanted

Contestants are wanted by the Westland Festival Committee to reign as queen during the annual summer event, to be held during the 4th of July weekend at Central City Park. The pageant is open to young women between 17 and 23 and Westland residents who have never been married. There will be no swimsuit or talent competition, said the committee. Judging will be based on information supplied by the young woman's application, poise, personality and general appearance.

Deadline for applications, which must be accompanied by a photo, is 9 p.m., Wednesday, June 17. Applications are available at municipal government and high schools in the city. They are to be returned to Miss Westland Summer Festival Pageant, c/o Pam Martin, 85935 Bakewell, Apartment 4, Westland 48185. The pageant winner will receive gift certificates worth \$200. The first and second runners-up will also win prizes.

School parties

There will be two similar but very separate recep-

tions involving Wayne-Westland school district officials in the next 10 days.

The school board has mailed invitations for a reception welcoming its new superintendent, Dr. Larry Thomas, from 4:30-6:45 p.m. Wednesday in the Dyer Center, on Marquette between Wayne Road and Newburgh. Thomas was picked as the top administrator last month, effective July 1.

Friends and supporters of Dennis O'Neill, who stepped down in early November because of school board pressure, and Dr. Thomas Svitkovich, his deputy superintendent, will host a private party at a farewell reception scheduled for Thursday night, June 18. Last fall, O'Neill took a medical retirement, effective Aug. 31, closing out a career of 34 years in the district. Svitkovich, who served as the district's top administrator for the past six months, is leaving this month to become the new Carman-Ainsworth school district superintendent.

Mother testifies at son's murder trial

The mother of a Westland teenager accused in a murder conspiracy testified Friday that her son never indicated he wanted to kill 19-year-old Everett Earl Bowen Jr. of Westland.

Robin Cowen testified in the murder trial of her son, Ian Bruce Cowen, that he only wanted to fight Bowen to even the score for an earlier dispute.

Robin Cowen said her son told her that "he wanted to feel his fist in (Bowen's) face."

Court testimony has suggested that Ian Bruce Cowen, 17, was angry because Bowen had stabbed him several times in the leg with a screwdriver during a fight several weeks before Bowen's Nov. 15

death. The mother also said her initial reaction to the stabbing was that she, too, wanted "to hurt this young man (Bowen)" for harming her son. But after she calmed down, she knew that police in Dearborn — where the stabbing occurred — should handle it, she said.

Police never arrested Bowen. But on the night of Nov. 15, behind Adams Junior High School, Bowen was shot to death by two bullets that struck his head and back. A

friend, 20-year-old David Wayne Adkins of Westland, also was shot in the head, but survived.

Prosecutors have blamed Cowen and three other Westland teens — Jermaine Stevenson and Jerome Omar Ingram, both 18, and Gregory Hister, 16 — for plotting Bowen's death in revenge for the stabbing incident. Police have accused the teens of arranging a purported drug deal with Bowen, a known crack cocaine dealer, to kill him.

Cowen's mother has said that her

son never knew a handgun was being brought to Adams school. In court, defense attorney James Howarth has said Stevenson and Ingram had a "private agenda" to rob Bowen and brought the gun on their own, without Cowen and Hister knowing it.

Other testimony, however, has indicated that Cowen was seen with a gun even before the Adams school meeting took place.

Testimony suggested that Stevenson fired the bullets that killed Bowen and wounded Adkins.

Even so, Bowen's mother, Patricia Bowen, said in an interview during a recess in the trial, that she's not as angry with Stevenson as she is with Cowen. She blames Cowen for pursuing the Adams school meeting.

"I am more angry with him than I

am with (Stevenson)," she said. Cowen's and Hister's cases are expected to be decided this week. They have been tried together in a two-week trial, and testimony ended Friday.

Stevenson and Ingram haven't yet been scheduled for trial.

Trials for Stevenson and Ingram — both 18 when charged — haven't yet been scheduled. However, court testimony has already emerged that suggested Stevenson fired the fatal shots that hit Bowen's face and back.

Stevenson also has been accused of firing a shot that wounded 20-year-old David Wayne Adkins, a self-described bodyguard of Bowen who had accompanied him to Adams school on Nov. 15. Adkins survived, but a bullet remains lodged in his head.

Though Judge Hood refused to drop murder charges against Cowen and Hister, she did rule Friday to dismiss a charge of assault with intent to murder — a charge that stemmed from Adkins' shooting.

Judge Hood pointed out that the alleged plan

to kill Bowen didn't involve Adkins, who had merely accompanied him.

Adkins' mother, Nancy Adkins, didn't appear upset that assault charges against Cowen and Hister were dropped.

"They didn't pull the trigger. They didn't even know David was going to be at that school," she said. "I know they didn't intend to shoot David." But she said she'd be furious if Stevenson escaped a charge of assault with intent to murder when his trial begins.

"I'd like to see him hanged," she said.

Hister's attorney, Otis Culpepper, said Friday that he didn't blame Judge Hood for refusing to drop the murder charges against Hister and Cowen, because the judge was bound by legal rules favoring the prosecution.

But Culpepper appeared to have doubts that

the jury would convict Hister and Cowen of murder.

"No one can say either of those two did anything to cause the death of this young Everett Bowen," Culpepper said.

Court testimony has indicated that, on the night of Bowen's death, all four defendants had talked about wanting to "get someone."

However, defense attorneys have argued that Cowen, angry that he had been earlier stabbed by Bowen, only wanted to fight him — not kill him — as revenge.

All four defendants remain in custody. They could be sentenced up to life in prison if convicted.

Cowen, Hister and Stevenson had attended John Glenn High School.

Mehl questions police promotions

Westland City Councilman Kenneth Mehl is questioning whether proper procedures were followed in the recent promotion of two city police department employees.

Mehl accused the city administration last week of possibly violating procedures by promoting two patrol officers to sergeant without the council's approval.

The city has a manpower budget that calls for 19 sergeants, but 21 are now employed in the police department, Mehl said during a recent council session. The change should have received council approval, Mehl said.

In a March 19 memo, Police

Chief Michael Frayer had indicated to council President Charles Pickering and the Mayor Robert Thomas administration that he wanted the promotions.

"I have no intention of deceiving anyone," Frayer said last week. "I don't promote anybody unilaterally. That's ridiculous to suggest I do."

On Monday, finance director Michael Gorman indicated the promotions were made after the administration received no inquiries about Frayer's memo from council members. Administration officials said that's the way such promotions have been handled in the past.

"That's been a matter of practice," personnel director Kent Herbert said in a telephone interview.

Mehl didn't have problems with such promotions under the previous administration of former Mayor Charles "Trav" Griffin, whom Mehl supported, Herbert said.

Herbert indicated Mehl's concerns stem from his political opposition to Mayor Thomas. "The mayor isn't his friend," Herbert said.

But Mehl said he's concerned that, with more patrol officers being promoted to sergeant, fewer officers are on the streets fighting crime. Several council members have indicated they want street patrols maintained.

Administration officials have said that, on some occasions, patrol officers have been promoted in

preparation to replace soon-to-be-retiring sergeants. Officials said it's possible some sergeants could retire in the next few months, though Frayer didn't know of any definite retirements.

Herbert, meanwhile, stressed that the promotions didn't cause the police department to overspend its budget, even though sergeants are paid \$42,580 compared to a top salary of \$36,393 for patrol officers.

That's because the department currently has five vacant positions for patrol officers — positions that aren't requiring the city to spend money, Herbert said.

Some council members, however, have indicated they want those patrol positions filled in the next year, in efforts to beef up street patrols.

Police: car the key to credit union robbery

A late model, two-tone Pontiac Grand-Am with black mud flaps over all four wheels, which police feel belongs to someone in the Westland-Livonia area, could provide the key to solving a string of area bank robberies during the last year.

Livonia police are looking for the distinctive car in connection with the May 29 robbery at the Wayne Out County Teachers Credit Union on Middlebelt near West Chicago.

"I think the key to identifying these people is going to be the car," said Detective Sgt. Jesse Bartlett. "Someone in (the Livonia-Westland) area has to have seen it or know something about who owns it."

A number of witnesses got a good look at the

car and its occupants during the latest robbery, which didn't go off as smoothly as planned, Bartlett said.

Two of the suspects — dubbed the "Ninja Bandits" by police and FBI agents investigating the robberies — were forced to flee on foot through area backyards after the getaway driver became jittery and left them behind.

Bartlett said a witness saw the blue-over-gray Pontiac with no license plate pull into the credit union lot about 2:45 p.m. and two suspects wearing white ski-masks get out.

The witness, in his own car, followed the getaway vehicle behind the credit union. The witness followed the driver onto westbound Minton and then south to Joy, where he lost the car in traffic at Louise.

"He just couldn't get close. He felt this guy

was onto him," Bartlett said, praising the witness' involvement.

Witnesses inside the credit union told police the two men ordered employees and customers to the floor before jumping over the counter and grabbing an undetermined amount of cash from teller drawers.

No weapons were used and nobody was hurt, Bartlett said.

Bartlett said the robbery was consistent with other pulled by the "Ninja Bandits."

All three suspects were described as white males in their late teens or early 20s.

A woman who saw the pair running through nearby yards was able to provide a good physical description, Bartlett said.

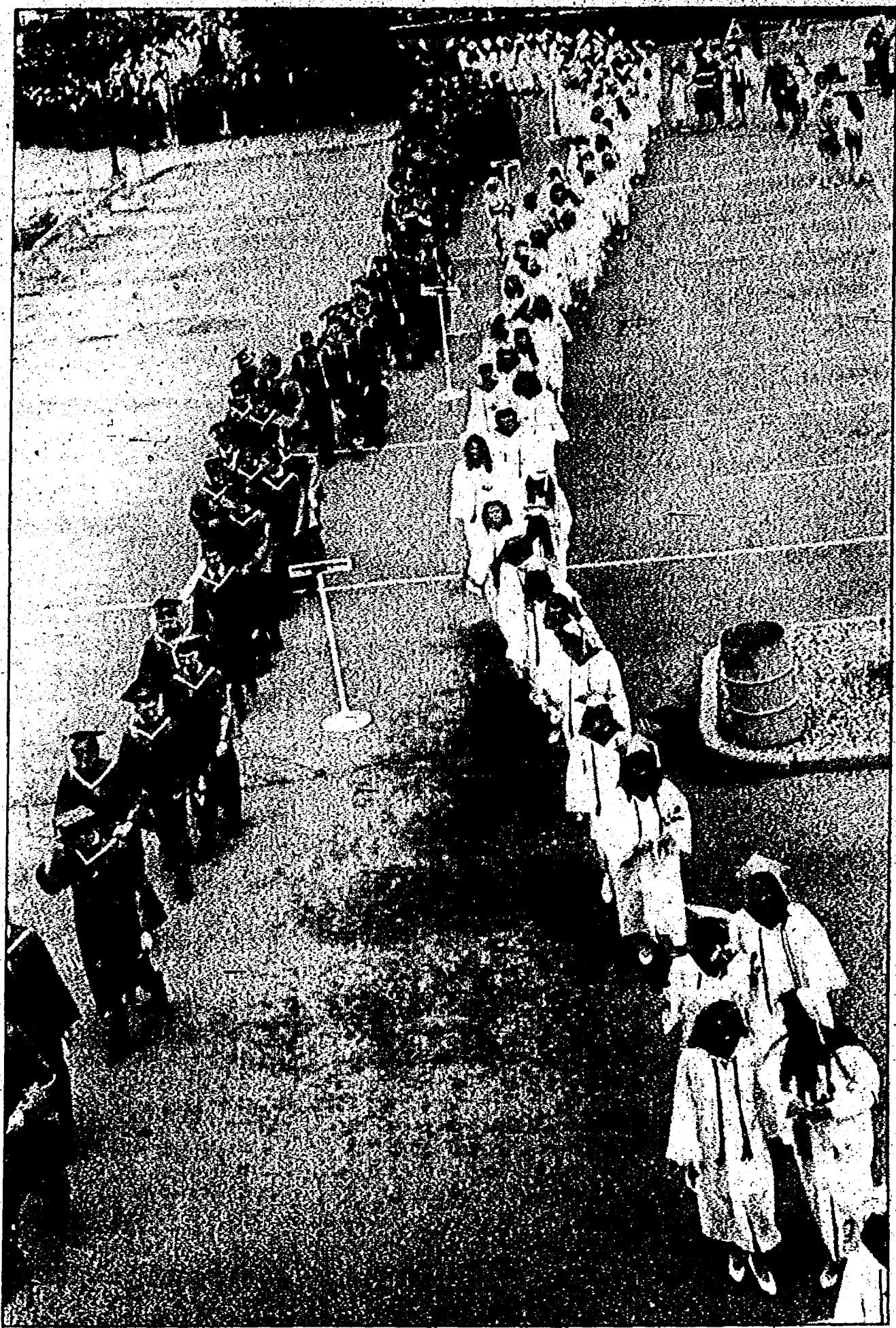
Graduates end careers

Perry wins state award for fight against arson

Westland Fire Marshal Robert Perry won the "President's Award" from the International Association of Fire Investigators.

Westland was one of the first cities to buy and equip an arson investigative vehicle. Under Perry, the vehicle is equipped to handle any investigation while also being used in the department's surveillance work.

Glenn recognizes pioneer in sign language research

Lynn Sweeney, member of the John Glenn graduating class of 1973, has been selected as this year's recipient of her alma mater's Distinguished Alumni Award.

Sweeney has become a pioneer in the linguistic analysis of sign, one of only a handful of researchers dealing with this subject.

During her graduate work for her master's degree in speech-language pathology from Central Michigan University, she became interested in the sign language of the deaf.

Her continuing research in the area of notational and descriptive analyses of sign language has appeared in journal articles nationwide and internationally, and Sweeney has presented these studies in Cardiff, Wales, and Stockholm, Sweden, as well as throughout the U.S.

Following graduation from Central, she was a speech-language pathologist at several facilities, including the Michigan Department of Mental Health and the University of Michigan Residential Aphasia Clinic.

In the late '70s a new field, augmentative and alternative communication, caught her interest. She spent

the next seven years raising funds to establish a center-based program specializing in such services.

Now she is the director of the alternative communication technology center at Central, as well as a professor for both the psychology and communication disorders departments.

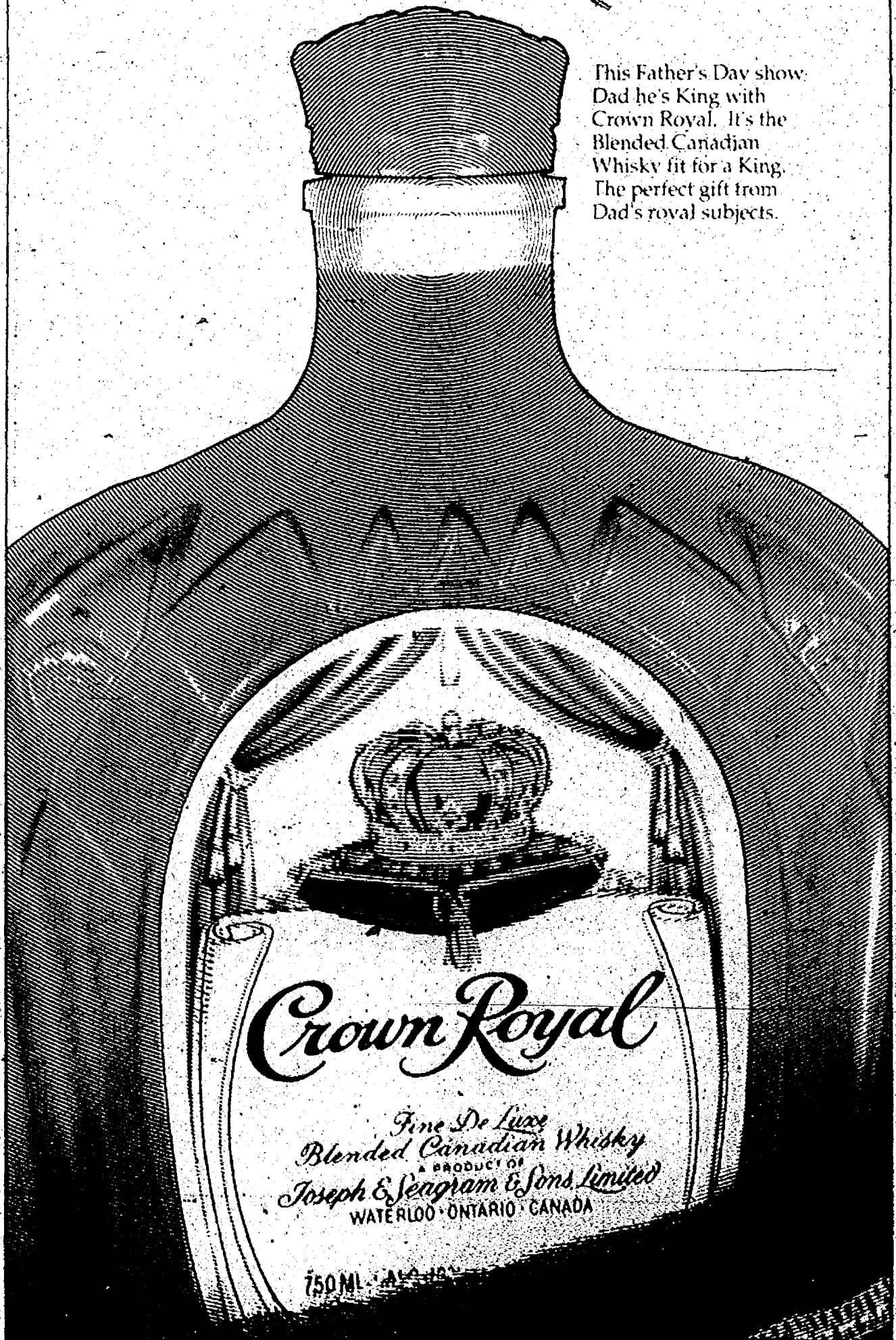

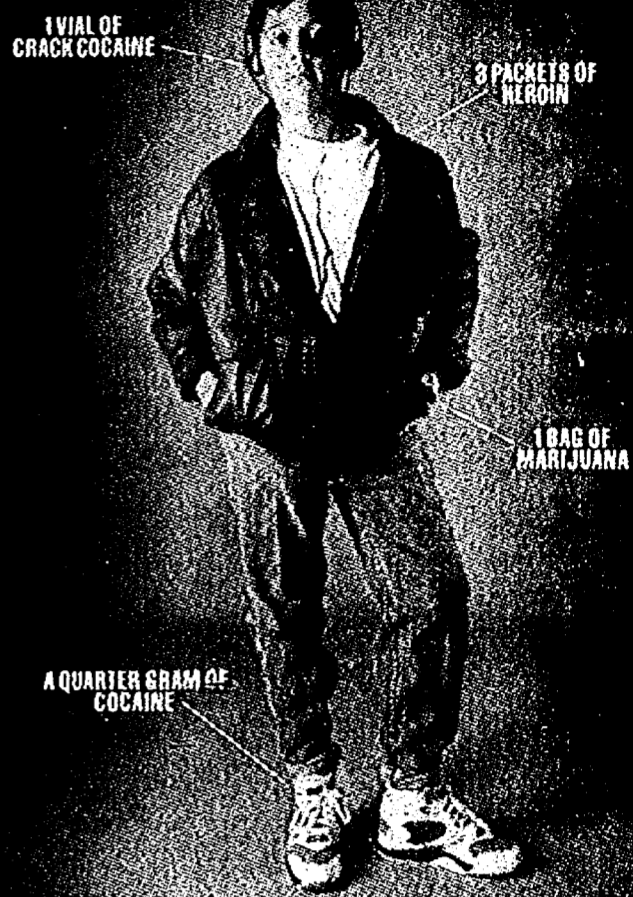

AAA: Insurance rates to fall if voters set cap for damages

Voters should start studying five pages of fine print about auto insurance — the "Lower Rates Now" plan of AAA Michigan.

The state's largest auto insurer Tuesday will file its ballot proposal to "cut auto insurance premiums an average of 20 percent by controlling medical and legal expenses," in the words of president Ronald L. Steffens.

AAA will file more than 200,000 petition signatures for a spot on the Nov. 3 ballot in the wake of the House of Representatives' failure Thursday to enact a new essential insurance law.

There were many sticking points, but the simplest had to do with maximum benefits for such "catastrophic claims" as closed-head and spinal injuries. Current law caps them at \$5 million; AAA's plan would cap them at \$250,000; House Democratic leaders want \$3 million; Republicans and dissident Democrats seemed to have a majority for \$1 million.

All sides want insurance rates cut by 15 to 20 percent.

Vote cut off

As minority Republicans and 10 dissident Democrats shouted protests, House Speaker Lewis Dodak, D-Birch Run, twice cut off roll call votes on a compromise plan that seemed sure to pass, then adjourned the House until Tuesday.

"A total obstruction of the process. An abusive display of power," said Rep. Barbara Dobb, R-Union Lake.

"We need a new speaker," said Rep. Jan Dolan, R-Farmington Hills. "It's wrong what he did — tie everybody up because it wasn't going his way."

"We had great bipartisan support," said Rep. John Jamian, R-Bloomfield Township. "They were fearful that with a few amendments we'd get something done today."

But Democrats portrayed AAA as holding the House hostage.

"AAA will be voted down (by the public)," predicted Rep. James O'Neill Jr., D-Saginaw.

"I'm sick and tired of a major PAC telling us we have to vote. This House still belongs to the people — not AAA, the lawyers or the doctors," said Rep. Maxine Berman, D-Southfield.

"Berman was wrong about AAA holding us hostage," said Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Livonia. "In order for us to get good bills, we have to have some clout over the speaker's head. We were ready to work 'til midnight. I'm embarrassed for government."

AAA to file plan

AAA's proposal, due to be filed with the Secretary of State Tuesday morning, has a couple of barriers to leap — the Board of Canvassers and the voters.

"Anyone with any influence with two members of the Board of Canvassers can block the petitions," said Rep. Lyn Jondahl, D-Okemos. The four-member board, which checks petition signatures, has two Democratic members who could block the process, as Republicans have blocked a Democratic property tax plan.

Then voters would have to approve. Although AAA's insured members circulated petitions, most Democrats will oppose the plan, and many Republicans are cool.

"Dodak may be banking that the people won't back an insurer-backed proposal," said Rep. Frank Fitzgerald, R-Grand Ledge. But Fitzgerald thinks voters might like voting on Gov. John Engler's 30

percent property tax cut and AAA's 20 percent insurance rate cut Nov. 3.

"I don't believe AAA is bluffing," said House minority leader Paul Hillegonds, R-Holland. "The public is very angry at the legislative institutions; that are unable to solve their problems."

Dems cap rejected

After more than 1½ hours of caucuses, the House rejected a Democratic bill with a \$3 million cap on catastrophic claims.

In the day's only roll call, members were 48 in favor and 56 against with five absent. Here's how area members voted:

Yes — Democrats Justine Barns of Westland, Maxine Berman of Southfield, and William Keith of Garden City.

No — Republicans Lyn Bankes of Livonia, Barbara Dobb of Union Lake, Jan Dolan of Farmington Hills, Georgina Goss of Northville, John Jamian of Bloomfield Township, Gordon Sparks of Troy.

Not voting (equivalent of voting no) — Democrats John Bennett of Redford, James Kosteva of Canton and Wilfred Webb of Hazel Park.

Kosteva turned out to be a key behind-the-scenes player, emerging as one of the 10 dissident Democrats supporting the \$1 million compromise plan on which Dodak blocked the roll call.

That compromise also contained another feature that Republicans and insurers like but Democrats and trial lawyers oppose: a limitation on lawsuits. A person more than 50 percent at fault would be unable to sue for damages.

The 10 dissident Democrats represented a major shift from party thinking which has favored state-ordered rate cuts without limits on benefits.

AAA describes its rate cut plan:

Michigan AAA's Larry Givens, vice president of corporate relations, gave this outline of the insurer's plan for an average premium cut of 20 percent or \$150:

- Catastrophic claims would be capped at \$250,000, but customers could choose to buy up to \$5 million coverage. Some 99 percent of claims are \$250,000 or less.
- Assessment for catastrophic claims, which have jumped to \$111

today from \$33 five years ago, would be cut.

• A medical fee schedule — fixed rates for doctors — would be set.

• "Double-dipping" would be prohibited. An injured person could not collect from auto and health insurance.

- Only seriously injured people could sue for "pain and suffering."
- Drivers more than 50 percent at fault would be barred from suing.
- Policyholders could waive cur-

rent mandatory liability coverage to protect them from suit. Insurers, however, would be required to offer protection from being injured by an uninsured motorist.

• Insurers could give discounts to customers who are claim-free for five years.

• Companies would have to give customers refunds if premium income exceeded claims and operating expenses by more than 5 percent over three years.

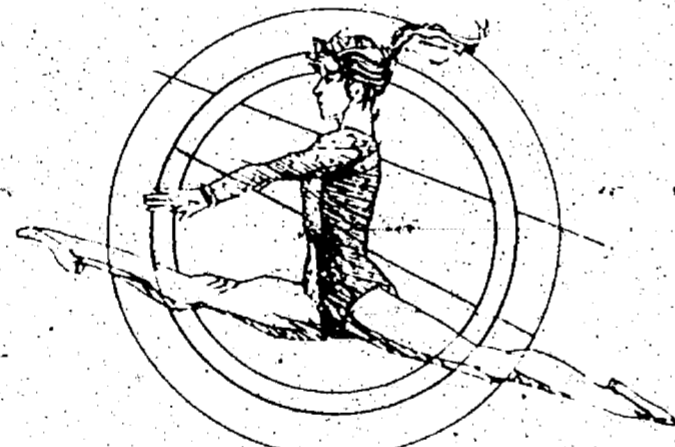

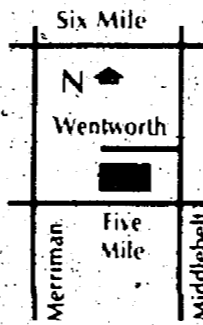

Even fish know that kids need a father at home

From the boat launch, I looked into the shallows and spotted him — less than seven inches long, hovering over a saucer-shaped depression. Earlier in spring, the bull bluegill had scooped out the nest, herded a female, then fertilized the eggs she laid.

The bull bluegill, with his iridescent gill covers and yellow bowtie, will guard the eggs until they hatch. Let a minnow, beetle or another fish venture too near, and the bull gill attacks, his sharp dorsal fin flashing. When a slovenly carp or idiot speedboater stirs up the bottom, the bull gill fans away the silt with his pectoral fins. The gill is vulnerable to anglers when he's on guard because, hungry or not, he will take a whack at anything that comes near the nest.

Other fish, like muskie and salmon, scatter their eggs and spawn, then depart. Not the bluegill, who has an excellent reproduction rate and is one of

Michigan's most widespread and successful species. The bull bluegill, though cold-blooded and pea-brained, is a better father than many human males. - Their infant mortality rate is double their counterparts, says the state Department of Social Services.
- They are three times more likely to be classified EMI (educable mentally impaired).
- They are more likely to be raised in poverty. "Women and their children account for 50 percent of Michigan's poor, largely because of the poverty of single parents. . . 55 percent of female-headed families with children were in poverty," said the Michigan Women's Commission.

teen mothers within four years, it being understood that 70 percent of births to teens are out of wedlock. Says the National Urban League: "That act alone is a passport to poverty."

- There are no hard statistics, but DSS says kids in single-parent families do poorly in school.
- Three years ago, I wrote about monitoring child disaster stories — small children who get shot, drowned, left in dumpsters and so on. Only about one story a year involves children with two parents. Watch them on TV yourself. You'll see grieving mothers, aunts, sisters, grandmothers — rarely an adult male.

The worst result of a kid not having a father, however, is prison. Some years ago, the Michigan Department of Corrections released some horrifying figures to the effect that a disproportionate number of prison inmates were from fatherless families. As I recall, a kid from a fatherless home had three or

four times as much chance of going to prison as a kid from a two-family home. This is not to say that all kids from two-parent homes will do well. Witness Leslie Williams, the confessed serial killer and rapist.

Nor is it to say that every kid from a single-parent home is doomed to hell. Witness statesman Willy Brandt, Leonardo da Vinci, Lawrence of Arabia and conquistador Francisco Pizarro. It's a matter of odds. It's possible for a colt carrying 145 pounds to win the Derby against a field carry 120, but that isn't the way you want to bet. Dads won't eliminate rioters, but they will better the odds their kids won't grow up to riot. Good fathers are important in raising kids and keeping them out of prison. Even a fish knows that.

Sports drought will mean fewer Olympic medals

In this Olympic year, recent racism could hurt the historic dominance of America's dashmen. In 1957 my sprint teammates on the United States team were mostly black, and African-American runners have essentially ruled ever since. But now our annual share of the world's fastest sprint times is declining sharply. The pool of young blacks who could prevent this decline has shrunk to thousands of potential sprinters in prison or violent death.

Imprisonment rate for black males — a group plagued with problems unimaginable to middle-class whites — is 3,370 per 100,000 compared to the overall figure of 455. A majority of urban youngsters are running drugs instead of track. Meanwhile, the few inner-city track clubs are ill financed. High school track budgets have been cut, and college scholarships and programs are disappearing as a partial result.

Just look at Detroit. During my day our Detroit Track Club's sprint relay teams medalled nationally and broke a world record — but the club no longer exists. The Wayne State University program that made me an All-American and turned generations of street kids into top sprinters is gone, too.

Thus, the records I set at WSU 35 years ago will stand forever. The University of Detroit track program which physically developed Cleveland Browns' defensive back Jim Shorter and other good dashmen is also defunct. The U-D track is now a parking lot.

When I dashed in Detroit in the 1950s and coached there in the 1960s, dual meets between powerful schools drew more than a thousand spectators. Clockings like Cliff Hatcher's incredible 48.8-second 440-yard dash for the city title in 1951 and the "Gray Ghost"

Henry Carr's world-record 20.0-220 a decade later consistently bettered state and often national records. (And we dashed on dusty dirt rather than expensive AstroTurf).

Detroit launched international sprinters Lorenzo Wright out of old Miller High, Carr from Northwestern, John Lewis from old Northeastern, Eddie Tolan from Cass Tech, Stan Vinson from Chadsey, Marshall Dill from Northern, Elliot "The Train" Tabron from Murray-Wright and me from Denby. All but me were black, and Tabron 10 years ago was the last of the breed.


Beyond the Motor City, the drought has been even longer. Except for Reggie Jones of Saginaw in the 1970s, there hasn't been a Michigan-bred international speed-burner from outside Detroit since Hayes Jones of Pontiac and Rex Cawley of Farmington in 1964 — and they hurdled more often than they

sprinted.

The NCAA's escalated admission standards will further handicap ghetto students. Community college track programs like the excellent one at Macomb Community College with its liberal admissions have eased that problem a little, but football money is luring more sprinters — and older stars like Carl Lewis are fading.

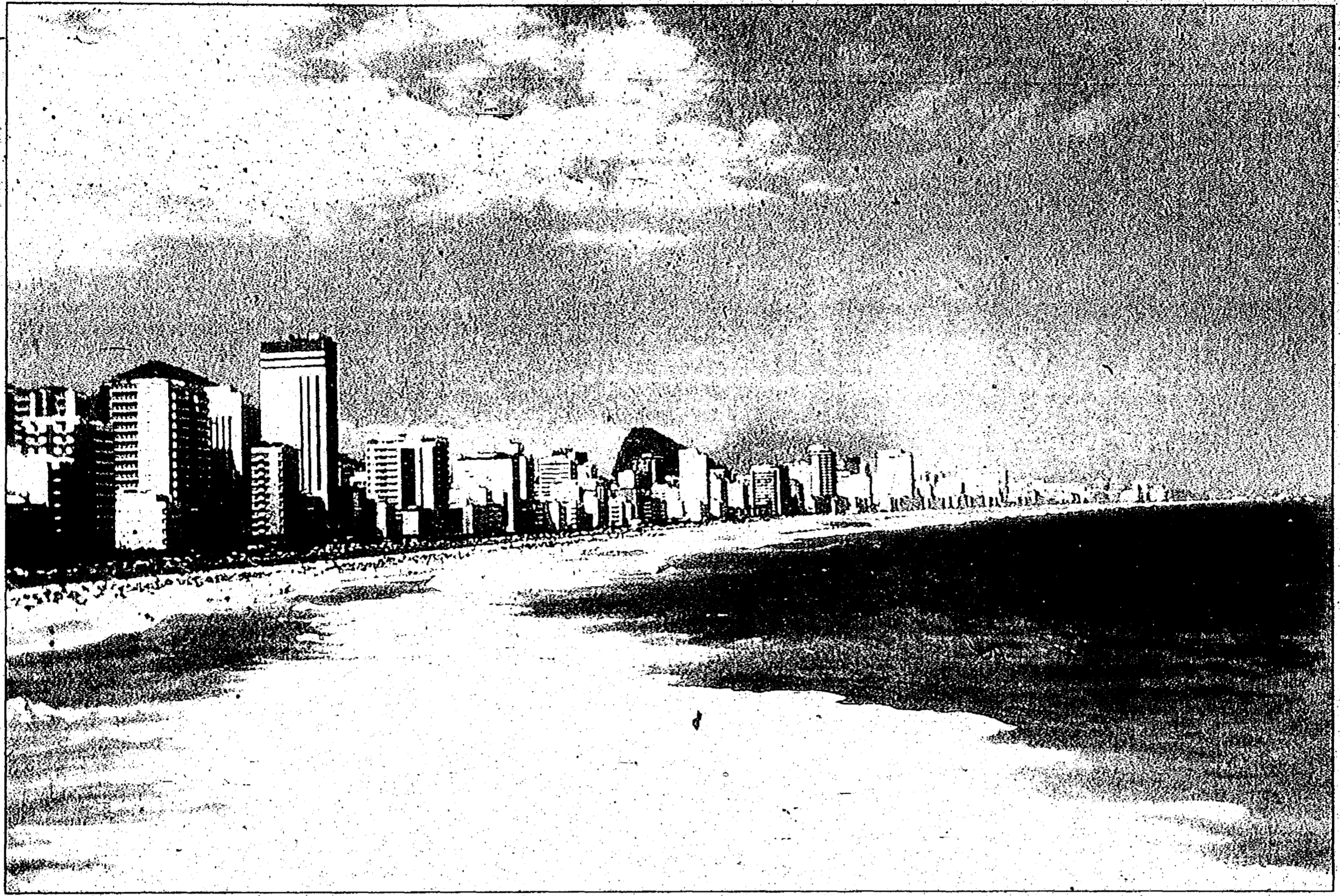

On the road to Rio

Brazil's capital city spruces up for Earth Summit

Back in the days when environmentalists called themselves naturalists and traveled by steamship, Rio de Janeiro's green forests, gray granite hills and south Atlantic beaches exerted a legendary allure.

So it is appropriate, 30,000 environmentalists have descended by jet on Rio, a tropical city where nature is never far from view.

Formally called the United Nations Conference on Environment and Development, the meeting will last until June 14.

Preparing for what may be modern history's largest environmental gathering, Rio's city leaders have invested heavily, hoping to reverse in one stroke a negative image of crime and decay.

From Rio's newly refurbished international airport visitors will speed down a specially constructed five-mile superhighway that feeds into tunnels leading to the South

ern Zone's beachfront neighborhoods.

Along 20 miles of open ocean beaches, from Copacabana to Barra da Tijuca, new sidewalks, new bicycle paths, new food kiosks, tightened water pollution control and improved police protection have restored Rio's special lure: the urban beach.

Despite its surface sensuality, however, Rio is not a Caribbean resort but a city of 6 million people, largely poor, and street crime is a serious problem.

Avoid pickpockets by walking in the same alert way you would in the downtown streets of a large American city. Leave your hotel with the minimum — a cheap watch, a photocopy of your passport, enough cash for the day and, if necessary, a camera hidden in an old shopping bag.

Cultural events

At the Museum of Modern Art, at 85 Avenida Infante Dom Henrique, six expositions will take place. There is a \$2 charge for entrance to all of them.

Until July 26, noon to 9 p.m., the Eco Art 92 gathering of 120 artists from the Americas will exhibit their paintings on ecology. Concurrently, there will be an exhibit by Franz Krajcberg, a renowned Brazilian artist. For more information call 210-2188.

There are two English-language, event-oriented programs on Rio radio: "That Man in Rio" every day from 6 p.m. to 6:05 p.m. on Tropical FM 104.5 and Eco Radio on Imprensa FM (102.1) from 6 a.m. to 10 a.m. until June 20.

Tips on how to avoid muggers will be given every morning on ECO Radio by Ronald Biggs, the British mastermind of the 1963 Great Train Robbery, who has lived in Rio since 1970.

The way to truly enjoy Rio's ex-

uberant flora and fauna is on foot. For \$1 admission the doors swing open at the Botanical Garden, in the neighborhood of the same name, Jardim Botânico.

One square kilometer of greenery planted in the heart of the city, the 184-year-old garden contains 6,200 species of plants and trees from all over the tropics. Spruced up with its largest cleanup in 40 years, the garden's well-kept paths are ideal for quiet walks and quiet talks. The garden is open Tuesday through Sunday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Visitors who do not have the time to fly 2,000 miles north to the Amazon will be happy to discover that an untouched chunk of rain forest is a 20-minute \$10 cab ride from downtown Rio.

Tijuca National Forest, a dense, 13-square-mile tangle of Atlantic jungle, is considered the largest urban forest in the world. Hikers routinely get lost, marooned in the wilderness only a few miles from a city of 6 million people.

Brazil Nuts, a travel agency here, offers a Tijuca National Park Ecology hike — a six-hour, \$50-a-person program, that includes a guided hike to the 3,350-foot summit of Tijuca Mountain and a stop for lunch (\$10 extra) at the Floresta Restaurant, an 18th-century house renowned for the hummingbirds on its veranda.

On most tours here, prices are lower for larger groups. For more information call Brazil Nuts in Rio 511-3636, or Brazil Nuts in Fairfield, Conn. (800) 553-9959.

Another colonial structure worth visiting is the Acude Museum, at Estrada do Acude, Alta da Boa Vista. Surrounded by walking trails and endowed with a rare collection of Portuguese tiles, this museum on the edge of Tijuca park reopened May 30 after extensive renovations.

Indeed, in preparation for the Earth Summit, 240 workers have been cleaning trails and sprucing up the park. The museum will be open from Thursday to Sunday, 10

a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission is 40 cents.

What to do
In a city filled with fresh-air excursions a newly popular outing is to rent bicycles and pedal down the new paths alongside beaches around Rio's internal lagoon.

Bicycles can be rented for \$2 an hour from a tattooed young surfer named Robson who operates the southernmost food stand on Leblon's oceanfront avenue, Delfim Moreira, near Rua Rita Ludolf. (Prices may briefly balloon during the Earth Summit.)

To master Rio's confusing geography of hills, tunnels and beaches, first-time visitors traditionally have climbed to Rio's landmark statue, Christ the Redeemer, at the top of 2,329-foot Corcovado Mountain. Access is by taxi or funicular train, which leaves every hour during daylight from 513 Rua Cosme Velho.

The visit has been improved by a recently completed \$2 million overhaul of the 61-year-old statue

Terrain influences couple's pottery, weaving

One of the most charming, evocative places in Ireland is the Dingle Peninsula.

On the map it juts out like a finger from the southwestern corner of Ireland. Dingle is the northernmost of five such peninsulas, the most famous being the Ring of Kerry.

It is mountainous with gentle, sweeping valleys. In some areas the cliffs dip into a raging Atlantic Ocean. Sun, wind and rain often occur at once; the colors of the sea and sky are always changing.

The land is sparsely populated and Irish is the first language. Many visitors come to see the area's array of Iron Age fortifications and early Christian monuments.

The Dingle peninsula is also home to Louie Mulcahy, one of Ireland's best-known potters. A former TV cameraman for RTE, the national network, Mulcahy is a self-

taught ceramacist who left Dublin and moved to the remote village of Clogher in 1975 with his wife Lisbeth, who is Danish.

"We began as a two-man operation," Mulcahy says, "and now we employ 23 people here at the pottery, mostly locals. There's lots of unemployment in this part of the country, and we walk a knife's edge trying to keep young people from emigrating."

Indeed, the Dingle peninsula is not an easy place to make a living. While the region is dotted with picturesque cottages, many of them are holiday homes, inhabited only a few weeks a year.

But the Mulcahys have braved a sparse resident population and the vicissitudes of the climate.

In fact, they use elements of the landscape in their crafts. The forms and glazes of Mulcahy's pottery, which is popular throughout Ireland and abroad, display the colors of the landscape.

The designs are simple, sensuous and strong. The glazes are as full of contradiction as the Irish sky. For example, a blue glaze is never solid blue, but mottled with green and gray.

Among the most affordable buys are bowls, which display Mulcahy's glazes very well and range from about \$29 to about \$60. Dingle oil lamps are about \$13. Table lamps can be fitted for American electrical service. They range from about \$35 to about \$108.

The tall planters and urns for which Mulcahy is well-known start at about \$300. A bathroom vanity sink about 15 1/4 inches in diameter, available in a variety of glazes, is about \$110.

A pale-blue dinner service for six, with the pieces edged in terra cotta, is about \$389. A tea set for six is about \$149 and a cappuccino set is about \$63. All these pieces can be shipped to the United States.

Lisbeth Mulcahy, a weaver, owns The Weavers' Shop in the town of Dingle, a charming seaport with the heart of the peninsula.

Located in a 60-year-old house on Green Street, the two-story shop is filled with hand-loomed articles which she designed.

Throughout the day visitors hear the timeless and hypnotic clacking and banging sound of one of the shop's four looms as Mulcahy patiently makes shawls and rugs.

Like her husband, Lisbeth Mulcahy is influenced by the look of Dingle's terrain — and she actually uses the natural plant dyes from local plants in some of the knee rugs and shawls.

Mulcahy uses only natural fibers to make scarves of alpaca or linen

and cotton. Her wall hangings and floor rugs are made of wool or colored yarn.

Gossamer light linen/cotton scarves are about \$17.50; alpaca scarves are about \$22. Finely woven wool stoles in majestic color combinations of purple and black or purple and green are about \$98.

Shawls are about \$30 and floor rugs that could double as wall hangings range from about \$316 to about \$687. Soft Knee rugs, perfect for cuddling in front of a fire, are about \$49. All items can be shipped to the United States.

Both Mulcahys keep a small stock of each other's wares at their respective shops. Keep in mind that 21 percent of each item's price is the value added tax, which is refundable on leaving the country.

Vary colors, textures to make perfect salads

Salad season has come; warm days that call for no-cook meals with great flavor!

Salads are delicious and nutritious. They're one of the oldest of culinary traditions. Regarded as a food of the Gods by citizens of ancient Rome, the salad has been popular dining fare for many centuries. In Shakespeare's England, the salad was thought to be a fountain of youth. Salads went on to gain popularity as an addition to the meal in the early 1900s and a meal in themselves by the 1950s.

There are a few set rules, more guidelines than anything to follow when a culinary attempt is made, to create the perfect salad. One of the foremost suggestions is that you use several types of greens which will provide a variety of colors, tastes and textures.

Head lettuce is OK, and especially plentiful and cheap during the summer months, but an addition of watercress, endive, celery leaves, beet tops, radicchio and romaine will make the blandest salad simply jump with flavor! Always pick or buy greens that are fresh looking. Lettuce should be bright green.

Storing greens

To keep the greens as fresh as just picked, wash greens immediately and wrap in layers of paper towel. Store in a plastic bag and place in the crisper. The dry paper towels will absorb any additional wetness and the coolness will keep the greens fresh and crisp for at least two, possibly three days.

If you were one of those who bought the so-called great salad spinner of yesteryear (some are still around today) now is the time to get your money's worth. I put mine in the garage sale, not because I was disappointed in its performance, but because my kitchen is already cramped and the space needed to store the thing was just not there. I even tried hanging it in the corner, filled with dusty plastic flowers, all to no avail.

There are some very trendy additions that can be added to many salads. With the influx of haute cuisine, a few of the more upscale markets now stock interesting varieties of greens virtually unheard of three years ago.

Trendy greens

Greens like arugula, which was grown and used first in Italy has emerged as the "in" green. Tasting very tender with a mustard flavored bitterness, it resembles radish leaves in flavor and appearance. Not being ready to be upstaged by the Italians, the French have their own trendy green called Mache, also called lamb's lettuce or corn salad. The leaves have a tendency to taste somewhat nutty, closely resembling the richness of Bibb or butter lettuce. Unfortunately, trendiness does come with a price and these greens are expensive.

A suggestion would be to buy small amounts of various greens and combine them, adding both texture and varying flavors to an otherwise plain salad. Lest you forget, these greens are prized for their interesting flavors and should never be saturated in a heavy, creamy based dressing. A simple doubling of a vinaigrette, made with olive oil and flavored vinegar allows the flavors and the pricey taste to really emerge.

Salad dressing

Last but not least, one of the big mistakes most salad makers make when preparing the salad is the timing of the dressing. Pour the salad dressing on at the very last minute because the vinegar or lemon juice in the dressing causes the greens to become limp in an amazingly short period of time. And, whatever you do, DON'T drown the poor salad. Each leaf should be only lightly coated with the dressing. Contrary to popular belief, the dressing should not puddle in the bottom of the salad bowl.

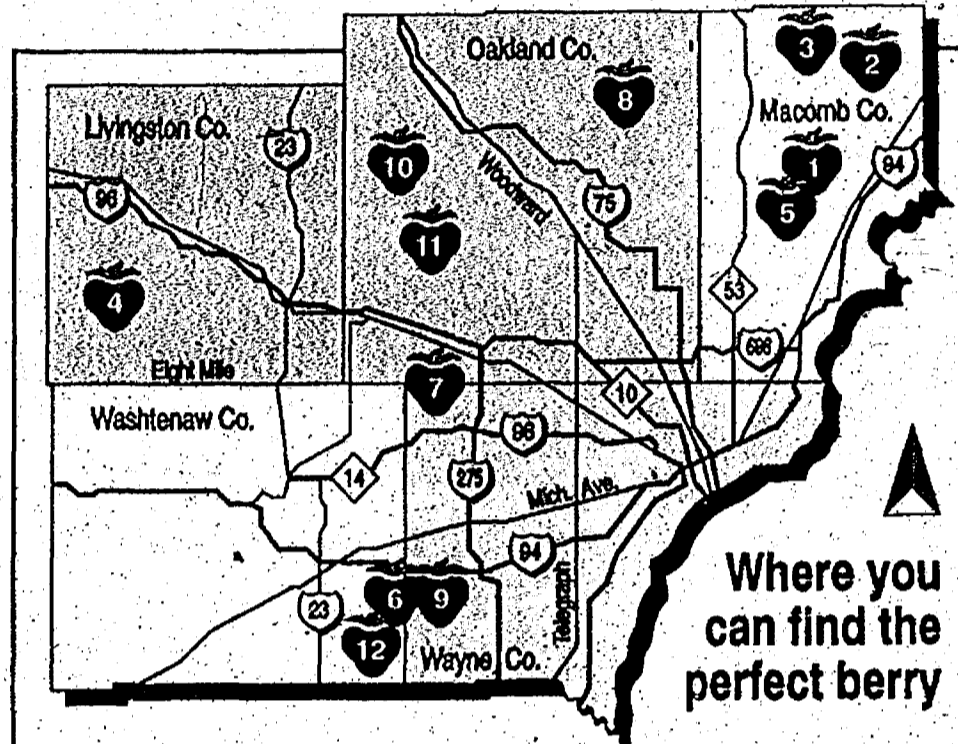
Speaking of salad bowls, if you own a wooden bowl, you should be aware that under no circumstances, should the bowl be washed. EVER! (I can see my mama just cringing knowing that I never wash my wooden salad bowl.) Wooden bowls, when washed, dry out and crack, ever so easily.

The best possible way to clean a wooden salad bowl is to pour in 1/4 cup of ordinary table salt and to wipe vigorously with a dry towel or paper towel. The salt, being aseptic, not only absorbs the grease from the dressing but acts as an abrasive to cut through dressing build up. If your wooden bowls are excessively oily, it might take 2 or 3 tries with this method, but trust me, it works.

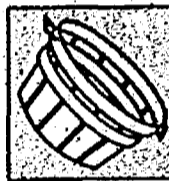

Strawberry patches roll out welcome mats



Red, sweet, juicy, Michigan strawberries will be ready to pick this week. Some farms open June 11, others won't open until June 16, call ahead before you go. The strawberries are about two weeks later this year than last year. See the map for U-pick farms.

Mother Nature's spring cold snap didn't hurt the strawberries, but it will make them a little later this year. "I've found that strawberries have a way of recovering, if it's cooler, it takes longer for them to ripen," said John Sherman of the Strawberry Patch in Milford. Sherman who offers fresh picked berries at his farm, said he's opened on June 10 eight of the last nine years. Other farmers predicted the berries would be ready sometime between June 11 and June 17.

"There should be a really good crop," said Barbara Middleton of Middleton Berry Farm near Lake Orion. "The berries like cooler weather. We have some enormous blossoms, and that means big berries."

Most farmers don't price the berries until the crop comes in. This year's

prices are expected to range from 60 to 99 cents a pound. There are about 1 1/4 pounds in a quart.

Don't wear your Sunday clothes when you go berry picking, they'll get dirty. There are only two ways to pick strawberries — on your knees, or stooped over.

Call before you trek out to the farm, and leave the pails at home. Farmers will provide baskets to put your berries in.

Michigan berries don't ripen after they're picked. What you see is what you get. When you find the perfect berry, snap it off at the stem.

Besides tasting good, strawberries are low in calories, about 55 calories a cup, and high in vitamin C and potassium.

If anyone tells you a strawberry isn't a fruit, don't argue. Botanically they are a member of the rose family.

If you don't have a lot of time to cook, or wonder what to make on days when it's too hot to cook. This menu is for you.

Make the salads in the morning, and they'll be waiting in the fridge for a quick, cool, no-fuss dinner.

Instead of plain iced tea, try ice tea with lemon. This iced tea gets its lemony flavor from lemonade. It's simple to make, and very refreshing.

COLD TUNA PASTA SALAD

- 2 cans tuna, 7-ounce size, rinsed and drained well
- 1 tablespoon dill weed
- 1 cup celery or carrots, chopped finely
- 1/2 cup red onions
- 4 ounces cooked rotini noodles, about 2 cups uncooked
- 1 cup peas
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- 1/2 cup plain yogurt
- 2 tablespoons vinegar
- salt and pepper to taste

Combine all the ingredients and mix well.

Chill for at least two hours before serving. Serve plain or on a bed of lettuce. Serves 4-6

This delicious summertime salad is best when made in the morning and refrigerated until serving time.

For a quick and easy side dish that requires no cooking, slice some tomatoes and cucumbers

to serve with cold tuna pasta salad.

Potato bread rolls, or pumpernickel bread are suggested to round out the meal.

Serve Orange-Pineapple Salad for dessert.

ORANGE-PINEAPPLE SALAD

- 1-2 bananas, sliced
- 1 large can chunk pineapple, drained or 1 fresh pineapple, cut into chunks
- 1 large can mandarin oranges, drained
- 1/2 cup coconut
- 1 cup small marshmallows (optional)
- 1/2 cup vanilla yogurt (or plain yogurt mixed with some of the reserved fruit juices)

Combine all of the ingredients and toss with the yogurt dressing. Refrigerate until chilled.

ICE TEA WITH LEMON

- 4 cups or 1 quart water
- 3 to 4 tea bags
- 4 cups of lemonade

Pour water into glass or plastic container. Hang tea bags inside container and place in refrigerator for several hours or overnight.

Remove bags, add lemonade. Stir to mix. Add ice cubes, and garnish glasses with a lemon slice if desired. Makes 1/4 gallon.

KIWI FRUIT AND TURKEY SALAD

- 2 cups cooked turkey, diced (chicken or ham can also be used)
- 1 cup cabbage, shredded
- 1 cup watercress or fresh spinach, chopped
- 1/2 cup walnuts, chopped
- 1/4 cup green onion, sliced
- 1/4 cup red pepper or radishes, sliced
- 3 kiwis, pared and sliced

Combine all salad ingredients except kiwis and cabbage. Toss. Arrange salad on cabbage on individual plates. Garnish with kiwis. Pour dressing over salads (see recipe below). Serves 6 to 8.

-DRESSING

- 1 kiwi, pared and sliced
- 2 tablespoons wine vinegar
- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil

- 1 teaspoon minced fresh gingerroot
- salt and pepper to taste

Place dressing ingredients in a blender or processor and process until smooth.

TOTEABLE LIME BEAN SALAD

- 1 (15 oz.) can red kidney beans, drained
- 1 (15 oz.) can garbanzo beans, drained
- 1 pound fresh or 1 package frozen green beans, cooked and drained
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1/2 cup sliced green onion
- 1/2 cup sliced ripe pitted olives
- 1/2 cup salad oil
- 1/4 cup lime juice
- 2 tablespoons vinegar
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- dash salt and pepper
- lettuce leaves and lime slices to garnish

In a large bowl combine beans, pepper, onion, and olives and toss gently. Combine remaining ingredients and shake to mix dressing. Pour over bean mixture

and allow to marinate in the refrigerator at least three hours or overnight. Place lettuce leaves on a plate and place 1 heaping cup of the bean salad on the leaf. Garnish with lime slices. Serves 6-8. Salad tastes great with cheeses and cold cuts.

GREEK ROTINI SALAD

- 3 cups (9 oz.) rotini pasta, uncooked
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1/2 cup olive oil or vegetable oil
- dash salt and pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon dried oregano (1/2 teaspoon fresh)
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 2 tomatoes, cut into wedges
- 1 cucumber, peeled and thinly sliced
- 1 cup thinly sliced green pepper strips
- 1 1/2 cups (6 oz.) feta cheese, crumbled
- 8 radishes, thinly sliced

Cook rotini pasta according to directions. Drain well. Cool. Combine lemon juice, oil, salt, pepper, oregano and garlic. Mix

well. Should be thick and creamy. Combine rotini, pasta with remaining ingredients. Toss gently. Pour dressing over the top. Toss gently to coat. Serves 6-8.

APPLE AND WILTED LETTUCE SALAD

- 6 cups romaine lettuce, torn
- 4 cups leaf lettuce, torn
- 2 apples, cored and thinly sliced
- 1/2 cup sliced celery
- 6 slices bacon, fried until crisp (reserve drippings)
- 1/2 cup cider vinegar
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 (6 oz.) package Italian salad dressing mix
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 1/4 cup sliced green onion

Place greens, apple and celery in a bowl. Toss to mix. Add vinegar, sugar, water and Italian dressing mix to bacon drippings. Bring to a boil. Pour over salad. Sprinkle with crumbled bacon and green onion, toss to coat. Enjoy. Serves 8.

Bread, desserts are strawberry delights

STRAWBERRY APPLESAUCE BREAD

- 3 cups applesauce
- 1 cup coarsely pureed strawberries
- 5 jumbo eggs
- 5 1/2 cups cake flour
- 1 3/4 cups raisins
- 1/4 cup melted butter
- 3 cups granulated sugar
- 1 tablespoon salt
- 1 tablespoon plus 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 tablespoon ground cinnamon
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cloves
- 1/4 cup chopped pecans
- 1 tablespoon plus 1 teaspoon baking powder

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine all ingredients in the bowl of an electric mixer and stir with paddle — or by hand — just until all ingredients are combined thoroughly. Do not overmix. Fill three buttered and floured 9-by-5-inch loaf pans a little over half full. Bake in preheated oven about 20 minutes, then quickly rotate pans in the oven to ensure even cooking. Bake another 20 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean.

Remove pans from the oven and transfer to a baking rack to cool. Turn loaves out of pans after 5 minutes, and continue cooling right side up. These freeze very well if wrapped tightly as soon as they are cold. (Makes three 9-by-5 inch loaves)

PEPPER-BERRY FOOL

- 2 pints strawberries
- 2 cups lemon yogurt
- 1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground pepper

Reserve four of the prettiest strawberries for garnish. Hull and chop the remaining berries. In a medium bowl, use a fork to thoroughly crush 1 cup of the berries. Stir in the yogurt and pepper. Fold in whipped cream and remaining chopped berries. Spoon into four stemmed glasses; garnish each serving with a whole strawberry. Cover and refrigerate for at least three hours.

FRESH BERRY PIE

- 5-6 cups fresh blueberries, blackberries or strawberries, picked over
- 1 cup sugar, or to taste
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 2-3 drops food coloring (optional)
- 1 (9-inch) conventionally baked pie crust
- whipped cream

Place 2-3 cups berries in a food processor and puree. Transfer to 2-quart bowl, add sugar to taste and cornstarch, stir, and microwave on high 2-3 minutes, or until mixture reaches a boil. Stir and microwave on 70 percent power 5-7 minutes, or until thickened, stirring several times. Stir in food coloring, if desired. Cool fruit glaze to room temperature.

If using strawberries, halve or quarter remaining ones, if large. Spread about 1 cup glaze on bottom of pie crust and arrange remaining berries in shell. Spread remaining glaze over berries. Garnish generously with whipped cream. Serves 6-8.

STRAWBERRIES ROMANOFF

- 1 quart fresh strawberries
- 3 tablespoons superfine sugar
- 2 large oranges
- 2 tablespoons Grand Marnier
- 2 tablespoons Cognac (optional)

Remove the stems from the strawberries and rinse them quickly under cold running water. Do not let them soak in a bowl of water or they will become waterlogged and tasteless. Dry the berries on paper towels, arrange them in a serving dish, and sprinkle them with the sugar.

Peel the oranges and cut between the membranes to remove the orange segments. Add the orange segments to the strawberries; squeeze the orange juice remaining in the pulp over the berries. Add the liqueurs, toss lightly, and serve well chilled. (serves 4)

- 2 cups fresh strawberries
- 2 cups hot water

- 1 1/4 cup sugar
- Juice of one lemon (about 3 tablespoons)

Wash and hull strawberries; place in a blender. Combine hot water and sugar; stir until sugar is dissolved. Add lemon juice.

Pour juice mixture into blender jar; puree until smooth.

Pour mixture into six 8-ounce durable plastic cups or margarine containers. Do not use plastic cold cups because they are not strong enough. Freeze for one

hour. Remove and break up mixture with a spoon until slushy. Return to freezer for 45 to 60 more minutes or until desired firmness is reached. Break up mixture with a spoon; serve immediately. Makes 6 servings.

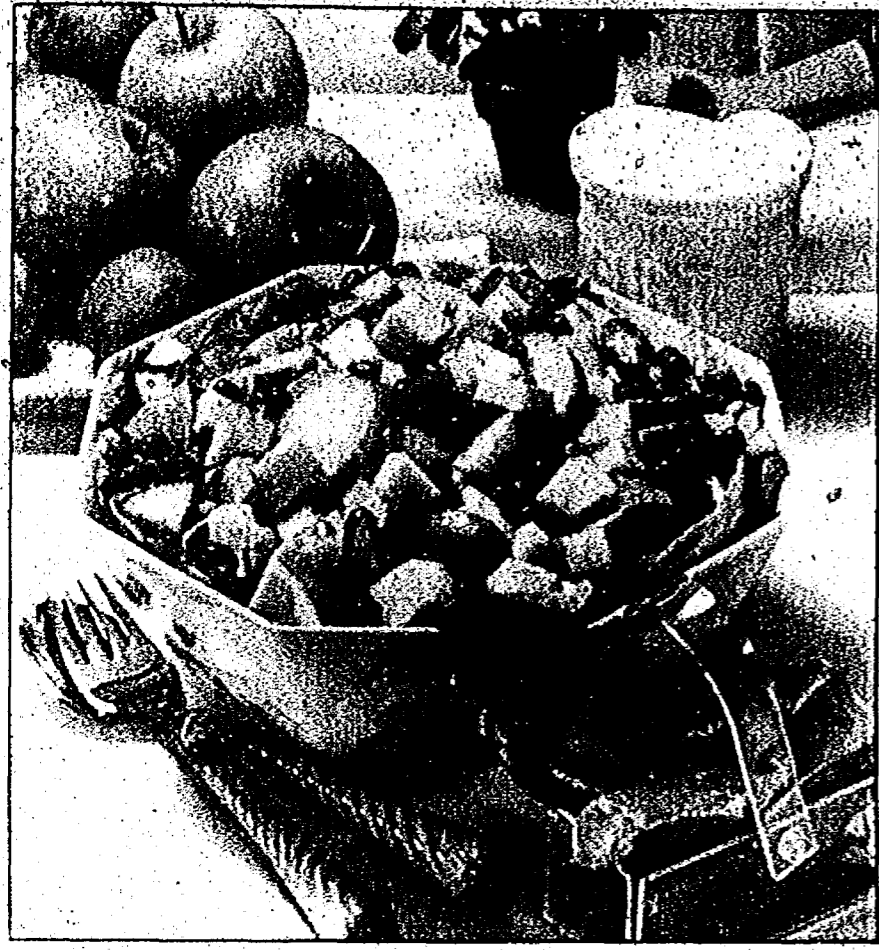

In medium bowl combine apples, potatoes and peas. In small

bowl combine yogurt, horseradish, mint and salt; mix well. Pour dressing over apple mixture; toss. Cover. Chill several hours. Serve on lettuce leaves. Yield: 4 servings.

Refreshingly different: Combine apples, tender new potatoes and mint for refreshing change from the familiar potato-egg-mayonnaise salad.

Did you know soft drinks and

salad dressings are the leading sources of calories and fat in women's diets, according to the Continuing Survey of Food Intakes analyzed in a recent Journal of the American Dietetic Association.

Lots of people are counting calories, and cutting the fat in their diets, nearly six in 10 shoppers, (58 percent) say they've made major changes in their diets for health reasons in the past three years. Also, a majority (60 percent) believe it's easier to cook healthy foods now than three years ago.

These findings come from a 1992 study by Food Marketing Institute in cooperation with Prevention magazine. Diet changes generally fit into these categories — Switching from full-fat to low-fat products, such as skim milk, low-fat cheese and yogurt, white meat and low-fat mayonnaise.

CLARIFICATION

Use butter or margarine when you make the cake listed in the May 25 Winner Dinner recipe. Non-stick spray won't work. "The graham crackers absorb the butter," said Winner Dinner Winner Bonnie Goodrich. The corrected recipe is below.

CAKE

- 1 box graham crackers
 - 2 packages instant French vanilla gelatin pudding

 - 3 cups milk
 - Butter or margarine to grease pan
- Rub the sides of a 9x13 pan with butter or margarine and

line with whole graham crackers. Mix pudding with 3 cups of milk. Fold in Cool Whip. Put half of the pudding mixture on top of the graham crackers. Add another

layer of crackers, the rest of the pudding mixture and then another layer of graham crackers. Spread frosting on top. Refrigerate overnight before serv-

ing. To make frosting combine, 1 1/2 cups powdered sugar, 2 pucks of Nestle chocobake, 1 tablespoon light Karo syrup, 1/4 cup butter, and 2 tablespoons milk.

Parents take heed;
Kids get obnoxious
in really sweet way

Kids 10 and under are in a bit of a quandary — they want to assert their independence but aren't quite sure how. They know that one good way is to annoy their parents. From the first time they discover the many wonderful uses of the word "No!" at age two, kids grasp the awesome powers of refusing to do what their parents want.

The no tactic works well for a few years. It's very effective in forcing parents to realize that their cute little baby is developing a personality — quite possibly a trait they're not yet sure they're going to like. But saying no gets old after awhile. The independence-minded kids need to develop more and better tactics to get under mommy and daddy's skin. For the 10 and under crowd, two very effective tactics — getting a rad haircut and wearing tough-looking clothing — are out. Between allowances and tooth fairy earnings, the single-digit age group simply doesn't have the cash to get these symbols of independence.

So, it has to be something they can afford. In a word, candy. And it works. Actual parents have formed committees to fight the insidious threat of kids buying certain candies, like "Garbage Pail Kids" trading cards. Presumably, the idea is that buying one "Atomic Fire Ball" is the first step on the road to debauchery. A kid eating "Tear Jerkers" will be well on his or her way to living in a moving box, babbling incoherently to invisible friends.

Is this a real problem or do some parents just need to get a hobby? In the interest of investigative reporting, we had to find out. We scoured local mom and pop stores, searching for the best examples of parentally incorrect candy. Here's what we found: "Cry Baby"/"Extra Sour Tear Jerkers"/"Sour FX". These little candies are the Holy Trinity of the obnoxious candy world. Eating them in front of peers is sort of a rite of passage in the elementary school set. The test is whether or not a child can actually eat the candy.

All of these are coated with a vile, sour tasting substance on the outside. If the kid can make it though the yucky outside into the sugary jaw breaker or gum inside, he or she is cool. A taste test revealed that, indeed, eating this candy is a true test of courage. The outside has a taste akin to bathroom scouring powder. The fact that kids eat this stuff anyway is a tribute to their fortitude in the quest to annoy Mom and Dad.

Parental annoyance factor: High. Typical parental comment: "Is that stuff safe?" "The Real Ghostbusters Slimer Bubble Gum". It comes in a toothpaste tube and is the color of bright green fluorescent toxic waste. For some kids, it's the only green thing they'll volunteer to eat. The slime has the consistency of ultra-sugary, watered-down cookie dough. A taste test revealed that grown-ups don't have the right jaw power to compact the slime into actual gum.

Parental annoyance factor: High due to an extremely elevated gross-out quotient. Typical parental comment: "Don't get that stuff on the couch!" "Garbage candy". This product is made in China, is simply labeled "candy" and comes in a tiny blue garbage can. The little tangy candies are shaped like garbage can delicacies like meat bones, fish scales and empty soup cans. Yum.

A taste test revealed that, shape aside, these aren't too bad and the garbage can can be used as a handy storage container. Parental annoyance factor: Medium due to easily concealed size. Typical parental comment: "Now, why would you want to put something like that in your mouth?" "Thumb candy". This candy consists of a plastic ring mounted with a life-size edible thumb, complete with lines and fingernail.

If you're Caucasian, the thumb is the color of your skin, so it's like sucking your own thumb. If you're African American, native American, Asian, etc., the thumb is the color of someone else's thumb. (Perhaps, you could pretend it's George Bush's thumb.) A taste test revealed that the candy has a mild cherry flavor although the concept of eating a body part was difficult to get over.

Parental annoyance factor: High due to fears about infantile behavior. Typical parental comment: (overheard) "Hon, do you think we should talk to the doctor about Junior's oral fixation?" "Nose candy". This tiny, pellet-like candy is dispensed from the nostrils of a 3-inch tall plastic nose. The idea is that they're boogers. When eating these, it is proper to call over a friend and say, "Hey look, I'm eating boogers!" Supposedly, hilarity ensues.

A taste test revealed that these aren't so bad tasting and not at all like real boogers (or so we assume). Parental annoyance factor: Medium to high. Parents are usually relieved that Junior has switched to fake boogers. Typical parental comment: "So this is why you didn't eat the delicious egg salad sandwich I made for you."

Dillon Fence puts pop in music

As Squeeze, XTC and, of late, Matthew Sweet continue to prove, pop in its purest and most joyful form triumphs over the arcane debate whether its AOR or alternative. Dillon Fence makes such labeling insignificant. The Chapel Hill, N.C., foursome perform a shimmering brand of guitar pop, using the broadest strokes and the simplest melodies that need no classification. "It's alternative in the sense it's not getting played on the radio," said vocalist and guitarist Greg Humphreys with a laugh. Dillon Fence achieves this accessible, all-encompassing platform by not sounding like a jangly guitar R.E.M. derivative despite being from the Southeast region. An intensity bores through on the outfit's 11-song debut "Rosemary" on Mammoth Records that soldiers each member to their armor of impenetrable pop convictions.

Ron St. Germain produced "Rosemary," helping cultivate a collaboration of Scott Carle, Chris Goode, Kent Alphin and Humphreys into a sterling debut release. Humphreys credits the producer of such renowned outfits as U2, The Cure and Mick Jagger for getting the best out of the band in the studio.

The good songs were already there, eliciting a wide variety of comparisons from '80s British pop bands like Style Council and Aztec Camera to the flourishing soul of Marvin Gaye.

For Humphreys, songwriting is an arduous process. He sits down with an acoustic guitar and bangs out a core of a number on a four-track. From there, it's dissected and rebuilt to perfection in the studio.

But what makes a good number? "I think it's when the melody meets the lyric," Humphreys said. "When the lyrics are honest and hit the listener and they can feel what the song is about... it sounds so simple but it's really difficult."

Many of Dillon Fence songs are about perhaps the non-simplest emotion of all — love. Theirs is

not bitter recants of relationships gone sour. Rather, Dillon Fence focuses on the often vulnerable state in which love leaves us.

Revealed in the hook-ridden "I'll Wait": "Sometimes I get a little impatient/Sometimes I get a little frustrated/Go away and use that phone/cause I'll be sitting right here alone."

Or, as further explored in the guitar-driven melancholy "I Will Break": "My side hurts every step, but I just can't accept/You don't love me — you don't love me."

Against furor of the guitar and bass interplay, though, such pain is almost betrayed in a cathartic, triumphant way.

Dillon Fence was formed by the most natural inspirations. The success of bands such as the dB's and Mitch Easter's group Let's Active led Humphreys and Alphin to put Dillon Fence together while students at the University of North Carolina.

Crowds in the Southwest immediately took to Dillon Fence, reflected in the 8,000 sales of their self-produced EP and the subsequent 20,000 copies of "Rosemary" being gobbled up.

"We just wanted to make a guitar pop album," Humphreys said.

And, quite simply, they did. Dillon Fence will perform open for Flat Duo Jets Friday, June 12, at Blind Pig, 208 S. First, Ann Arbor. For information, call 996-8555.

Bleeding's pit stop is 'Penetration' LP

Paul Lemos of the underground industrial outfit Controlled Bleeding says the band's latest LP is not a sign on the road of things to come but merely a pit stop. "Penetration," the outfit's latest on Third Mind, came about as a result of several fragmented ideas Lemos collected and recorded informally in his home. When Lemos took them into a 24-track studio with creative collaborator Chris Moriarity, he found the numbers suddenly took on a life of their own. The release isn't reflective of a

particular direction the outfit is headed in the future. "It really depends on the general feeling at the time," said Lemos about the process of making records. "All of our records are very personal. It depends on how angry we are... or happy we are will depend on what mood the records will take."

Lovich left legacy as Franklin A.D.

He was a father figure, a coach, and an athletic director, but more important, he'll be remembered as a man of steel.

George Lovich is retiring as Livonia Franklin High's athletic director and I'd be remiss to say that part of the school's heritage will be lost.

In fact, two of Lovich's closest associates, Armand Vigna and Gerry Cullin, the men who guided the Patriots to the 1975 state Class A football title, will be retiring soon as well.

"I'll miss the people, but not all the late hours at school, the 12- to 14-hour days," said Lovich, who served 18 years as A.D. "I have some hobbies. I like to fish and golf. I haven't gone the last couple of years, but I like duck hunting, and when I go it's usually with Joe Jandasek (a fellow teacher in Franklin's industrial arts program.) I'd probably still like to coach if I can, too."

Lovich grew up in Monessen, Pa., 20 miles south of Pittsburgh, where he worked in the steel mills for four years and competed in a variety of sports including volleyball, gymnastics, track and football (playing against former Minnesota Viking kicker Fred Cox).

Perhaps Monessen is where the foundation was laid, but ultimately teaching, coaching and his wife Mary Ann brought him to Detroit.

He joined the Franklin staff in 1964, first serving as a JV coach and then as varsity assistant.

Once again, Lovich laid the cornerstone for one of the most feared high school football programs in the state, ringing up an impressive 49-9-1 record as varsity coach from 1968 through 1974. (During his final season the Patriots went 9-0.)

In 1974 he took over as A.D. when Walt Cosens, one of his dearest friends, passed away unexpectedly.

That meant Lovich had to step down as head coach, leaving the reins to Vigna. The transition went smoothly as Lovich stayed on as an assistant, running the vaunted 4-3 defense as the Patriots went 10-1, capturing the first-ever state football championship sponsored by the Michigan High School Athletic Association.

"We had a real run from '68 to '77," said Vigna, who remains the varsity coach to this day. "It was marked by a lot of good fellowship. It was very exciting during the playoffs. During those two weeks it was sure fun to practice and the kids even thought it was fun."

Cullin, who spent 27 years at Franklin, fondly recalls that championship season.

"The weekly meetings would get hot and heavy, but we respected each other and we always resolved things," said the former varsity baseball coach. "The three of us worked well together and just felt comfortable."

Lovich continued to coach into the '82 season when the Patriots went 8-1, narrowly missing the playoffs.

He also took on added responsibilities as A.D., coordinating all the scheduling for the newly created 12-school Western Lakes Activities Association.

But even though he was faced with numerous changes and new challenges of an ever-evolving job, Lovich continued to reach out to his fellow coaches and students.

"He can be real tough, and then tough, but turn around and be as soft and vulnerable, and cry as a 2-year-old," Vigna said. "We're as close as brothers. We've been through a lot together, on and off the field. He was a man of principle."

Rick Lee, a Franklin staff member who coaches football, track and basketball, was a former player under Lovich. He caught a touchdown pass in the '75 title game.

"George demanded everything because he wanted you to be the best you could be," Lee said. "He was a hard-working man and tough, but very, very fair. He could yell at you at practice, but then put an arm around you and explain things as you were walking off the field."

Lovich has three daughters, but calls Lee, John Wilson (another Franklin coach) and Joe Fry his adopted sons.

"I always look after them, they were the sons I never had," Lovich said. "They've really helped me and I could always count on them."

Fry and Wilson knew Lovich more than just as a coach or A.D.

"George did a lot for me," Fry said. "He kept me straight. He took care of me."

Added Wilson: "George taught me the way to treat people... that there's a right way and a wrong way with kids, parents and officials. If not for George and Armand, I'd never gotten an education."

After 28 years at Franklin, Lovich will no longer have to deal with the pressures of being an A.D. He can now "catch up on all the projects."

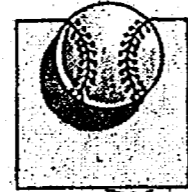
Cullin summed up best what this outgoing A.D. meant to us all.

"George had a set of values and he dealt fairly with the kids and adults," he said. "He was dedicated to what he believed in. He was a good man."

Rockets' red glare stuns CC

Westland Glenn knocked off the state's top-ranked Class A baseball team, Redford Catholic Central, 5-4.

Talk about reversal of fortunes. It was only late April when Westland John Glenn's baseball team was mired in a slump and off to an uncharacteristic 2-6 start.

But on Saturday the Rockets came full orbit, knocking off No. 1-ranked Redford Catholic Central, 5-4, and Lincoln Park, 2-1, to win the Class A regional title at Tempeance-Bedford.

Glenn, now 17-7 overall, returns to the state semifinals Friday at Battle Creek's Bailey Park. The Rockets, who have won 13 of their last 14 games, will take on Port Huron regional champ Lapeer West. (Game time is 1 p.m.)

It's Glenn's second trip to the state semifinals. The Rockets were beaten in 1986 semis by Birmingham Brother Rice, 1-0.

"I always thought we had a shot getting here," Glenn coach Norm Hoenes said. "But early in the season we could not pick up a ground ball. Now, when somebody makes an error, it's OK because we're not making five or six."

Hoenes, with the help of sophomore defensive whiz Derek Besco at shortstop, a late-season call-up from the JV squad, appears to have all the pieces of the puzzle in place.

The Rockets made only one error on the day in 14 innings.

Defensive turnaround

"It's been fielding and defense, and now we have confidence in each other," said junior right-hander Aaron Scheffer, who beat CC on a four-hitter and ran his personal record to 6-4 after an 0-3 season start.

"We're a lot better defensively now, everyone seems to be hitting the ball, and we're closer as a team," said senior center fielder John Ward, whose two-run homer off CC ace Scott Kapla in the fifth inning provided the final margin of victory.

Now in his 27th season as Glenn's varsity coach, Hoenes may well savor the semifinal victory over CC for quite some time.

"I remember when we were ranked No. 1 in the state back in '87 and CC

came in and knocked us off in the district at Garden City Park," Hoenes said of the 9-8 defeat. "I remember the reverse feeling, so we said to ourselves, 'Why can't we do the same to them this time?' It meant a lot to us because CC is an excellent ballclub and if you beat them it means you're doing OK."

The Shamrocks found themselves down 3-0 after the top of the first when the Eastern Michigan University-bound Kapla, who was drafted Wednesday by the Detroit Tigers (in the 42nd round), got into a jam after walking three of Glenn's first five hitters.

With two out, Glenn's Jamie-Murphy beat out a routine grounder, scoring Scheffer, and sophomore Mike Bint made CC pay for its mental mistake when he delivered a two-run single.

"It hurts when you're down 3-0, plus I think it gave them (Glenn) some confidence," Catholic Central coach John Salter said. "Kapla was a little wild, but we had the groundout."

"He threw 82 pitches in the first four innings and that's more than normal."

Ward delivers

Kapla did not survive the fifth after Ward's two-run homer. Reliever Dan

Gusoff came on and blanked Glenn over the final three innings, but the damage had been done.

Scheffer, meanwhile, cruised through the first four innings before suffering a wild spell of his own in the bottom of the fifth.

He walked three batters and hit two more. CC pushed across four runs with the benefit of only one hit, an infield single by Brian Justice. (Kapla collected CC's other three hits.)

But somehow, some way, Scheffer regrouped and kept CC off the board the rest of the way. He got DH Aaron Rumberger to line out to Besco at short, stranding Kapla on second base, to end the game.

"We hit two balls hard (in the fifth) with the bases loaded and could have tied it up," said Salter, whose team is 23-4 overall. "The kid (Scheffer) pitched a good game. He hung in there."

Glenn's one-run win over Lincoln Park (20-5) was somewhat anticlimactic, but just as important.

Kirkey wins nightcap

Senior right-hander Chris Kirkey ran his record to 6-0 by holding the Rail-splitters to just two hits and three

walks in going the distance.

"Kirkey pitched well all year," Hoenes said. "He's not as flashy as Aaron, but he's always around the plate. And if they hit the ball off him, it's usually not too hard. And he doesn't lose his composure."

Glenn got a run off Lincoln Park lefty Jeff Muntean in the first when Besco's infield single scored Tamas.

Lincoln Park responded with a run in the third, but Kirkey helped his own cause when he picked off Jason Maher at second base.

"We've practiced that play all year, but this is the first time it's worked," Hoenes said.

The Rockets tallied what proved to be the game-winner in the fourth on Tamas' RBI sacrifice fly. Ward, Besco and catcher Martin Potter each contributed two hits as the Rockets outhit Lincoln Park 8-2.

Kirkey, bolstered by the solid infield play of Tamas (third base), Besco (shortstop), Scheffer (second base) and Tayo Farley (first), retired the final 10 Lincoln Park hitters in order.

"Once we brought the 10th-grader (Besco) up, everything fell into place," Hoenes said. "It's solidified our infield and we've been on a roll ever since."

Charger run ends, 7-1

Sophomore Karen Jose pitched for Churchill, striking out six and walking three. The Chargers lost 5-0 and 8-6 to Canton during the regular season.

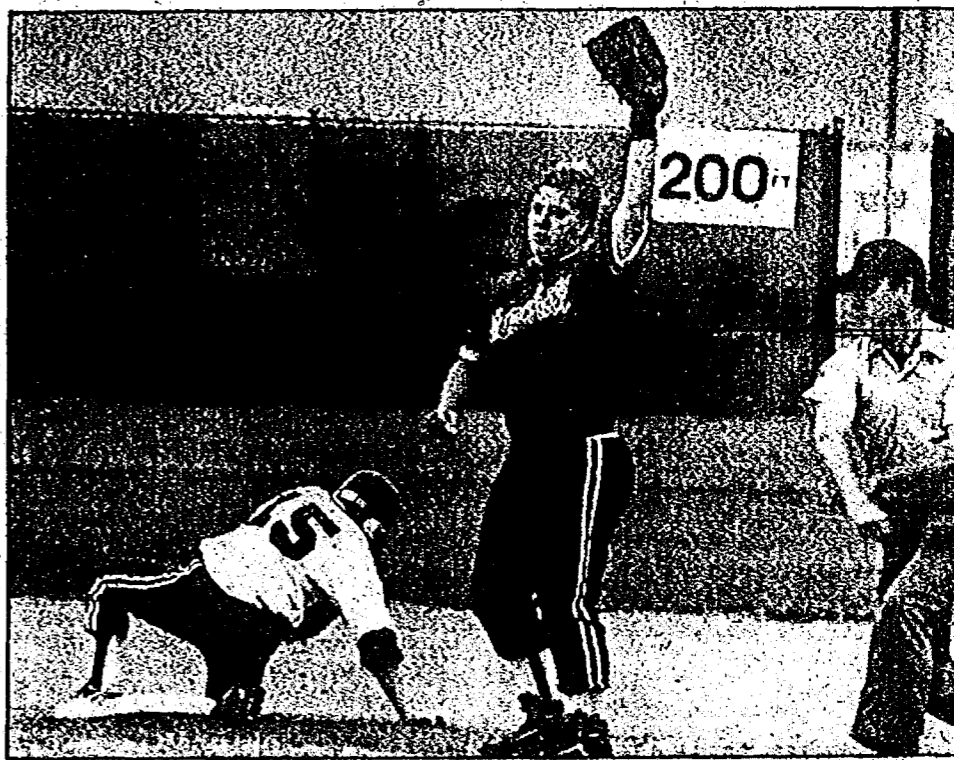

"I've always had inclinations toward it (being an athletic director)," Freeman said. "I've always had it in the back of my mind."

"I know there's going to be a lot of on-the-job training. There are some big shoes to fill because George (Lovich) ran a classy program."

"Nobody can be George Lovich. I'll just be myself

and try to run as classy a program as George ran."

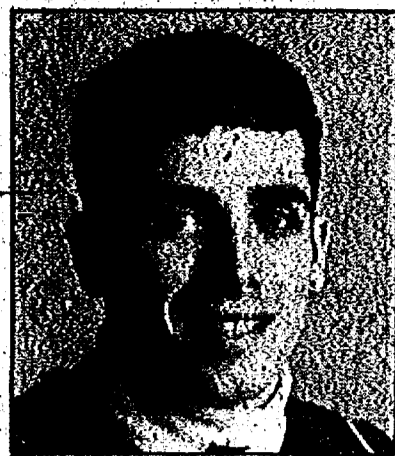
Freeman has gained notoriety not only as a coach, but as a teacher.

He was selected Livonia Middle School Teacher of the Year (1988-89) and was twice named "Who's Who in American Teaching." Freeman also has been nominated 12 times for the "Teacher Who Makes a Difference" award by the National Merit Scholar Candidates.

"We're going to lose an excellent girls basketball coach and a master teacher in the classroom," Fenchel said.

It's called the "dry bar." In fact, the only thing about T-Bird Dry that sets it apart from other bars is the coffee and pop that are served in place of liquor.

T-Bird Dry, which opened in November, is the newest innovation on the bowling scene. Joe Stahl, the building manager, was instrumental in the project.

He recently quit drinking, and asked himself, "Where do you go from here?"

After consulting with Alcoholics Anonymous, he realized there were no AA clubs in the vicinity. Here was a seldom-used room, and the idea came to reality in a very short time.

Once the dry bar opened, its popularity increased steadily. It is now getting recognition from people outside Thunderbird Lanes.

Just recently, T-Bird Dry was awarded a \$2,500 grant from the Troy community coalition for the prevention of drug and alcohol abuse. T-Bird Dry is not an exclusive club, anyone can come in, as long as they are at least 16 or accompanied by an adult and are not under the influence of alcohol, and do not bring drinks in from the other areas of the bowling center.

The funds from the grant will allow them to spiffy up the room and replace the donated tables and chairs. Stahl is not sure as to what extent the traffic through the bowling center will increase due to the exposure, but since the dry bar opened, two sober T-Bird Dry teams have been added to the bowling center. Maybe this is a sign of things to come.

CC, Churchill show well on Observer team

Athletes from Redford Catholic Central, Livonia Churchill and the city of Farmington highlight the boys track All-Area first team for 1992.

CC, which had a Class A state champion in the 3,200 meter relay, also has the Observer's 1992 coach of the year, Tony Magni. On several occasions this year, Magni made changes in his relays and the Shamrocks usually benefited.

CC won the Observerland Relays as well as the Catholic League and the Operation Friendship meet against the Detroit Public School League. The Shamrocks were the first Catholic team to ever win the Operation Friendship.

Farmington Hills Harrison, the third place team in the Western Lakes Activities Association, had the top three runners in the 100-meter dash. Two Harrison relays were first team and two boys runners made the first team.

Churchill was strong in the field events and it shows with a pair of first team nominations. Farmington also had a pair of boys field event nominations.

Chris Pelczar, discus, Churchill: Pelczar placed fifth in the Class A regional with a toss of 135.7 and was runner-up in the Western Lakes Activities Association; seven inches behind the winner. Pelczar's best throw was 144.10 in the last dual meet of the season. The junior was a member of the shot and discus relay teams that placed second at the Observerland Relays.

"This is only his second year working in these events and we feel that his best years are ahead of him," Price said. "Chris is a hard worker and very focused on the goals he set for himself."

captain and was a very consistent jumper.

Jason Tucker, high jump, Farmington: Tucker's best clearance of 6-feet, 6 inches set a new record for juniors at Farmington. He was a WLAA, regional, Observerland and city champion in the high jump. The senior also placed second in the Oakland County Meet and third in the long jump.

"Jason performed well in the pressure meets and worked hard at his event," Farmington coach Dave Catherman said.

Chris Marting, pole vault, Farmington: Marting, a senior, was a Class A regional (12-feet, 10 inches) and Observerland (12-6) champion. He also placed third in the Oakland County meet (12-3) and had a best leap of 12-11. He missed 3½ weeks because of injuries suffered in practice. Marting also was a key relay runner.

"When he was hurt this year it really affected our relays," Catherman said. "He was a very good sprinter and his versatility in a lot of these events would have been real helpful. He was able to collect good composure toward the end of the year and make outstanding heights."

RUNNING EVENTS

Marc Eden, 110-meter hurdles, Redford CC: Eden finished eighth in the Class A tournament (15.1) and supplied coach Tony Magni with several points each time the Shamrocks competed. He won the Catholic League 110-meter hurdles championship (14.7) and also had the same time in winning the Observerland and regional crowns. The junior was first at Oxford (14.8) and second at Jackson (15.0). Eden also was a member of the 1,600-meter relay team that set a new school record (3:25.4).

"Marc was the heart and soul of our team and I am very happy that his hard work has paid off," coach Tony Magni said. "Marc is extremely versatile, competing in the high hurdles, 300 intermediates, long jump and three relays."

Nathan Loosie, 300 hurdles, Churchill: The three-year letterwinner was a team MVP as a junior and one of four captains in '92. His best 110 high hurdles time was 15.2. Loosie placed fourth in the regional, fourth in the WLAA meet and third at Observerland. His best 300 intermediate time was 40.7 at the WLAA meet where he finished second. He ran a leg of the 1,600 meter relay team that took second at the WLAA (51.7).

"Nathan's success is a result of his dedication and hard work in the hurdles," Price said. "He has been a great example to our young hurdlers this year."

Duante Anderson, 100 dash, Harrison: Anderson, headed to Bowling Green on a football scholarship; was a WLAA (10.8) and regional champion and anchored the Hawks' record-breaking 400 relay team.

The senior also finished third in the Oakland County meet and sixth at the state Class A meet.

Eric McKeon, 200, Redford CC: With a year remaining in his high school career, McKeon owns or has tied four school records. He tied the 200-meter dash school record (22.0) and has the new school record for the 400 meter dash (49.3). He also was a member of the 1,600 and 3,200 relay teams that set school records. The 3,200 relay team won the state meet.

The junior was second in the Catholic League meet, third at Oxford and second at Jackson.

"Eric is a very aggressive runner, was willing to run just about any race that I asked him to," Magni said. "Eric is not only being a fine sprinter/middle distance runner, he was one of the top five cross country runner this last fall."

Warren Provencal, 400, Lutheran Westland: Provencal, who placed second in the Class C state meet in the 400 meters, leaves Lutheran Westland with school records in the 200 (23.0) and 400 (49.5) events. He was a Michigan Inde-

pendent Athletic Conference champion in the 200 and 400 races as well as the 800 and 1,600 relays. The senior was undefeated in all dual meets. The 1,600 relay team he ran with placed fourth in the state meet.

"After placing sixth in last year's state meet, Warren dedicated himself to be state champion this season and came up just short," Lutheran Westland coach Mike Unger said. "Warren had the confidence to believe he was going to win any race in which he entered."

Brandon Dalziel, 800, Redford CC: Dalziel didn't win any major Invitationals but was a model of consistency for the Shamrocks. He placed second in the CC Invitational (2:00.4) and Oxford Invitational (2:00.9). The junior also placed third in the Jackson Invitational (2:01.9) and fourth in the Operation Friendship meet (2:02.1). He was a member of the state champion 3,200 relay team.

"Brandon is an excellent example of how hard work and dedication helps you reach your goals in life," Magni said. "Brandon is talented on the track as well as in the classroom where he maintains a 4.0 grade point average."

Steve Witek, 1,600 meter run, Redford CC: A member of the state champion 3,200 meter relay team, Witek's best finish came in the Catholic League meet where he was second (4:29.1). He placed third at regional (4:27.1) and Operation Friendship (4:31.3) and ninth in the Class A final (4:26.2). He also ran the 800 meters in a personal best time of 1:57.8.

"Steve provided steady senior leadership," Magni said. "He dedicated himself to the sport this year. Steve is a confident runner who strives on competition. He has great ambition and determination."

Jason Zdyrski, 3,200 meter run, Harrison: Zdyrski, headed for the University of Michigan in the fall, was a WLAA champion and placed ninth in the state meet. His best time in the 3,200 was 9:46.3 and he had a personal best of 4:26.4 in the 1,600.

400-meter (Duante Anderson, Roy Granger, Scott Gurke and Jason Dreyer), Harrison: The Hawks' 400 relay team won the WLAA crown in record time (43.7) and also won the regional and placed 10th in the Class A meet. Coach Rich Esker called the foursome the best he's ever coached.

800-meter (Roy Granger, Jason Dreyer, Gil Chavez and Duante Anderson), Harrison: Esker used this foursome in selected meets and they didn't disappoint. Their best time was 1:32.7. Three of the four will graduate this month and the lone underclassman, Chavez, is a freshman.

"We didn't use this team in too many meets, but every time we did, they won," Esker said.

1,600-meter (Aaron Sheposh, T.J. Kitchen, Marc Eden, Eric McKeon), Redford CC: The quartet won the Catholic League, Elks and Observerland events and holds a new school record (3:25.4). They were third in the state meet and regional and third in the Operation Friendship.

"Aaron's performance in the leadoff spot, to put us in the lead came through hard work and dedication," Magni said. "T.J. did an excellent job running his best time at the regional. Marc runs the relays as he does the hurdles — all out. Eric would go after the leaders in a conservative, but aggressive manner."

3,200 relay (Aaron Sheposh, Brandon Dalziel, Eric McKeon and Steve Witek), Redford CC: These four were perfect in '92, winning the state championship with a school record time (7:58.0) to go with six other major titles. They also won the Catholic League, regional, Oxford, Elks, Observerland and Jackson Invitationals.

"Aaron, as he did last year, got us into position for a competitive race," Magni said. "Brandon, concentrating on our position, would run with the leaders. Eric, a very competitive runner, would either put us into the lead or not lose contact with the leaders. Steve is a very intelligent runner who would hold off any opponent or go after the leaders to win."



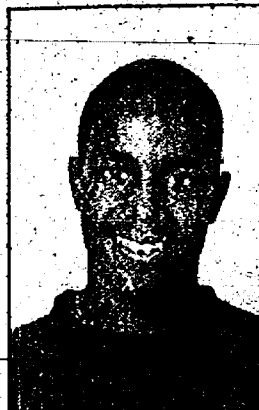

Fishing trip becomes an adventure

Little Yellow Stone flies, Blue Wing Olives, March Browns No. 12, fly leaders and tip-pets sounds like terminology one might hear on a tour of the Cranbrook Nature Center, not a weekend fishing trip with high school buddies. To the accomplished fly fishing person these are as common terms as night crawlers and Labatts to the bait caster.

Ol' Rochester Adams buddies Jon Moyer and Tim Grant took me along with them to North Central, Pennsylvania for an introduction to surface hatches and hip waders, in a fly fishing crash course. Tim being the same guy who tried to teach me to windsurf on Lake Michigan in two foot waves, I should have known I was in for an adventure. The trophy trout streams named Cedar Run and Slate Run would be my training ground.

For the avid fly fishing person part of the art of catching trout is identifying the surface hatches of insects as they ascend from the stream bottom as nymphs and hatch on the surface into flying bugs... aka trout food. This is where choosing the correct fly to fish becomes important.

FISHING

So once Tim or Jon did the first process for me, I figured all I had to do was cast the fly out onto the stream and reel in the fish.

"Presenting" the fly to the natural, unstocked, brook trout I could see swimming not more than 10 feet away made the first step seem simple. The trees and weeds that lined the small stream, however, became the first thing I caught. After losing the first two flies before they ever touched water Tim and Jon made sure I knew how to attach a fly to the near invisible line called the Tippet.

After two days of fishing for trophy trout unsuccessfully, we finally convinced Tim that we should take one last stab on the much larger Pine Creek where the dreaded bait casters were reeling in fish all weekend. "Cheaters" Tim would grumble, along with other things I can't print.

But it didn't take long for Tim to catch his first fish. Not long after I actually got a bite and finally caught my first fish on a fly.

In my excitement to catch more of these suckers, I ventured further and further across the river with the

water reaching up near the top of my hip waders. Soon I found I didn't need trees or weeds to snap off flies and as dusk approached I lost the last one in mid-cast. The fish were laughing at me now, so the time was right to call it quits.

Just to make sure the fish got their money's worth from this out-of-towner I slipped on the bottom crossing back. As my waders filled with the rushing waters of the Pine Creek I frantically moved to the shore and arrived back at the car so Tim and Jon could share in the laughter as I gumbled something unprintable about fly fishing.

On the bright side, the scenery was beautiful, and yes, I will probably go again, if only for that reason. However when I attend Tim's wedding this Saturday in Grand Rapids and he wants to go fly fishing I will definitely take along a dozen crawlers and an icy cold frosty Labatts.
