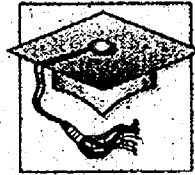

## Schools to levy full tax rate



Despite a plea for a reduced tax levy to help homeowners, the Wayne-Westland school board approved the full rate of 7.75 mills, an increase endorsed by voters last June. Board member Fred Warmbier wanted the rate reduced a bit to reflect the recession.

Amid concerns about job losses and stagnant family incomes, a Wayne-Westland school board member has suggested easing the burden on school district taxpayers by cutting their property taxes.

...But the board, in a 6-1 vote, balked at board member Fred Warmbier's suggestion and decided to stall any potential tax rate cuts for at least six months. The board chose to give Superintendent-elect Larry Thomas a chance to study the district's finances.

Warmbier warned that family incomes aren't stretching as far as they did in past years and that unemployment will increase if General Motors Corp. closes the Willow Run plant in Ypsilanti.

"There are a lot of people who are just overly burdened with taxes," he said, adding later, "I think we have to show some empathy for these people." But other board members, citing con-

cerns about potential state aid cuts, decided to accept a request from Thomas to postpone any potential tax cuts for six months.

"At this time I feel it's premature for us to decide on the (tax) reduction," Thomas said.

A sometimes-heated dispute arose Monday as the board set a general operating tax rate of 47.1 mills, meaning homeowners would pay \$47.10 in school taxes for each \$1,000 of state equalized valuation.

The decision came immediately after the board approved an \$83.7-million general fund budget that marked a 3.8-percent increase over last year's budget.

Warmbier cast the lone dissenting vote against the budget and the tax rate. He had opposed a two-year, 7.75-

mill tax increase that voters approved last June, and he wanted to cut the tax rate Monday.

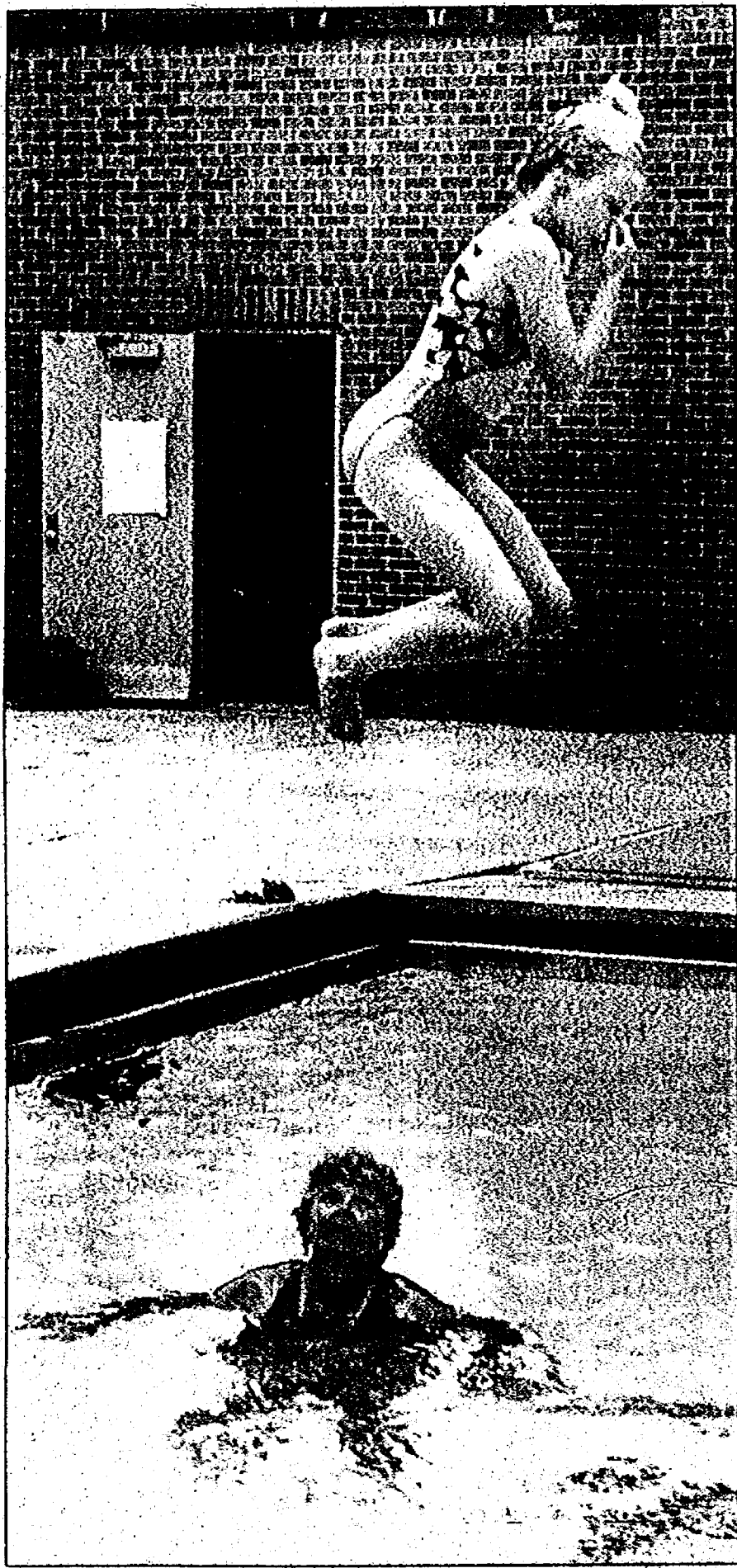
Warmbier suggested the tax increase wasn't needed last year because the district had a general fund balance of \$4.4 million. The surplus has increased to about \$9.9 million this year, though the board has placed \$3 million of that in a special contingency fund for instructional programs and building improvements. That leaves a \$6.9-million fund balance.

"If we didn't need it (the 7.75-mill increase) last year, we certainly don't need it this year," Warmbier said.

But other school officials noted that the fund balance is not exorbitant considering that the district has an \$83-

## 3 schools officials bid district farewell

Amid hugs, smiles, tears and applause, two highly controversial Wayne-Westland school board members and a longtime administrator parted ceremoniously Monday from a wounded district bound for new leadership.

The departure of veteran board members Kathleen Chorbagan and Sylvia Kozorosky-Wiacek and Deputy Superintendent Thomas Svitkovich signaled a crossroads in a district struggling through an era of dramatic change.

They will officially leave their positions at month's end, but Monday marked their last school board meeting. Chorbagan didn't seek re-election, and

Kozorosky-Wiacek lost her bid for a new term June 8.

Svitkovich, who rose from the teaching ranks to assume the district's top post, has accepted a new job in Flint.

"I've been battered and bruised a lot, but I really feel that I have done an ethical job," Chorbagan said in her farewell address Monday.

A 10-year board member, she had come under heavy fire for supporting teacher salary increases amid a budget crunch that had threatened deep cuts in school programs for students. But she recently survived a botched recall campaign by her political foes and decided on her own to step down.

## Cops: Man broke into house, raped woman

A Westland woman was raped by an intruder who broke into her house in the Henry Ruff-Palmer area early Monday morning, Westland police said.

The incident remained under investigation Tuesday, and few details were available before press time.

No arrest had been made.

The woman, whose age wasn't immediately known, reported that a man broke into her house on Westchester and raped her about 4:45 a.m. Monday, Westland police Sgt. Laura Moore said.

The rape was confirmed by police,

though many details about the incident weren't known, Moore said.

"Everything is so sketchy right now," Moore said. "Until I can investigate it more, that's really all I can say."

Moore talked briefly with the victim.

"She's been so upset that I haven't been able to get all of the information (about the incident)," Moore said.

Moore did confirm that the woman was not alone in the house when the intruder broke into the house and raped her.

Moore expected to learn more about the incident this week.

## Shoppers say it's good to be back Krogering

But the couple resumed a 30-year shopping tradition Monday — elated by a strike settlement between the grocery chain and its workers.

The Therriens shopped elsewhere

during the 10-week dispute, but they missed buying their groceries at the Westland Kroger at Warren Road and Nankin Boulevard.

"We have a Kroger right across the street from us in Detroit, but it gets so crowded there," Mary Therrien said.

"I really like this store. Their meat is just great," she said, standing outside of the Warren Road store. "I missed the

## Organizers hope sun shines on summer fest

The Westland Summer Festival committee is hoping for sunny weather during the annual event, which will be launched Saturday night with a pageant to pick a festival queen.

Ed Wager is chairman of the committee which annually plans contests for children and adults, free entertainment and other events for the Fourth of July week.

Other than Saturday's pageant, festival events will be held in the Civic Center, on the south side of Ford between Wayne Road and Newburgh.

The pageant will start at 7 p.m. Saturday in the east court of Westland Center. The event, for which the entry deadline was last week, was open to local unmarried women between 17 and 23.

## Enter your tots in fest contests

The Westland Civitan Club and the Westland Festival committee will hold "Baby of the Year" and "Toddler of the Year" contests during the upcoming Westland Summer Festival.

Applications are available at the Bailey Recreation Center, City Hall, and Westland Chamber of Commerce. Applications are due no later than 4 p.m. Monday, June 29, at the same locations. "I'm just glad that I got to make the decision," she said.

Kozorosky-Wiacek, a seven-year board member, easily fought off a similar recall effort, but her re-election bid crumbled.

"The vote tally says I am a loser, but I don't feel like one," she said Monday. "I at least had the courage of my convictions and put my name on the ballot for the voters to accept or reject."

Kozorosky-Wiacek marveled over a path that led her from a small Pennsylvania town to Wayne-Westland, where she became school board president of a 16,000-student district. In what she called "the single biggest highlight" of her board tenure, she recently addressed the graduating classes of the district's two high schools.

"It was hard for me to imagine that a girl from a small town in the hills of Pennsylvania, whose graduating class was 25 people, could

have the honor of addressing thousands of people at the Crisler Arena" in Ann Arbor, she said.

Svitkovich, a 28 1/2-year district employee, said Wayne-Westland "has always been a class act," but he said "it's time to move on."

Svitkovich assumed the duties of ousted Superintendent Dennis O'Neill in November. But he will begin his Flint job next Thursday and be replaced by Superintendent-elect Larry Thomas.

Chorbagian commended Svitkovich and said he "has been doing

the work of three or four people."

Chorbagian and Kozorosky-Wiacek also drew praise from their colleagues.

Calling Chorbagian "a friend," board member Andrew Spisak commended her for "an excellent job" and described her as "the epitome of a board member."

Kozorosky-Wiacek's re-election bid sparked a bitter attack from her opponents. Some were angry that she and board members Laurel Raisanen, Vicki Welty and Fred

Warmbier pressured O'Neill to step down last year.

On Monday, Raisanen commended Kozorosky-Wiacek and said, "You listened to the public outcry for change, and you led us through that change."

Raisanen later told Kozorosky-Wiacek, "You may not have won the last attacks when you lost your bid for re-election, but you won the war."

Warmbier specifically criticized O'Neill for a letter he sent to newspapers to criticize Kozorosky-Wiacek's re-election bid.

"It was a very unmanly thing to do," Warmbier said.

But Warmbier held out hope that, as the battle debris clears, the district will begin to improve with a new superintendent and a seven-member board that has now seen five new members since last June.

"I think we see daylight at the end of the tunnel," he said.

shopping here."

The Therriens, married for 50 years, were among many longtime Kroger shoppers who returned to their favorite grocery chain, in the wake of the strike settlement.

Kroger workers who had been waving anti-Kroger placards and encouraging customers to shop at competing grocery chains have returned to their jobs, punching cash register keys and greeting customers.

Dan Gracey, who lives near the Warren Road store, said he's glad the strike is over.

"This store is so close for me, and I like the prices and the meats," he said. "You might save a penny, or you might pay a little more on some things, but it's a good store."

Gracey also pointed out that the strike settlement came as good

news for the many senior citizens who live near the Warren Road store.

"They have to eat, too," he said.

Gracey described the Kroger workers as "nice" and said he's glad they're back on the job.

"I like the people here," he said. "I'm glad the strike's over. Nobody likes a strike, but sometimes you have to do it."

Some Kroger shoppers continued to shop at local Kroger stores during the strike, but they appeared relieved that now they won't have to cross a picket line to buy groceries.

Karen Wolf of Canton Township said she continued to shop at Kroger during the labor dispute.

"I think times have changed as far as the unions go," she said. "The unions are not as effective as they used to be."

A Wayne-Westland school district resident Monday questioned whether officials exaggerated the district's financial plight last year to win voter approval of a 7.75-mill tax increase.

Jerry Mercier, noting that the district had a \$4.4-million surplus last June, accused school officials of earlier predicting the district would be virtually broke.

Mercier, saying the district's financial plight was exaggerated before voters approved the tax increase in June 1991, renewed his concerns Monday as the board decided to levy the 7.75-mill increase for a second year.

The board will have to win voter approval next June to continue to levy the 7.75 mills.

Despite the \$4.4-million surplus, the district needed the tax increase to continue a full instructional program, transportation, athletics and other programs and services, Deputy Superintendent Thomas Svitkovich told Mercier.

Board member Leonard Posey also pointed out that the tax increase helped pay for nearly \$1 million that the district has spent on new textbooks, "and we still feel there's much to be done in this area."

But Mercier told school officials they were missing his point. He said he doesn't oppose the instructional program, but merely wanted to point out that he believed the district's financial woes had been exaggerated to win support for the tax increase.

Board member Laurel Raisanen told Mercier she agreed that the public had received some wrong impressions.

But board member Kathleen Chorbagian said she never recalled predictions that the district would be "flat broke" — as Mercier said he had been told. And she indicated that Mercier had misconstrued what officials had said.

That sparked a response from another audience member, Rosemary Miller of Wayne, who said she was

million budget.

Board member Kathleen Chorbagian warned Warmbier that his suggestion would hinder Thomas, who wants to thoroughly study the district's finances before recommending any tax cut.

"You voted for him," Chorbagian told Warmbier, referring to Warmbier's support for Thomas for the superintendency. "Now you want to tie his hands behind his back."

Warmbier told Thomas that he could understand his viewpoint, but Warmbier indicated he had to remain consistent in his opposition to the 7.75-mill tax hike.

"appalled" at board members "attacking" audience members, namely Mercier.

Miller also accused school officials of misleading the public on the tax issue and said "we hope it's going to end tonight."

Board member Laurel Raisanen also had opposed the 7.75-mill plan last year, but she said Monday she could agree to give Thomas six months to study finances.

However, she did note that taxpayers would receive a slight tax break this year because of a 1.2-mill reduction in debt retirement that will come automatically, because the district has retired some of its debt.

A homeowner with a \$65,000 house can expect only a \$40 tax cut, school officials said.

"It's not huge, but it's something," Raisanen said.

Another district resident, Delores Low, told the board that taxpayers are hurting.

"Do you people understand that people are up against the wall?" she asked. "They cannot afford these high school taxes."

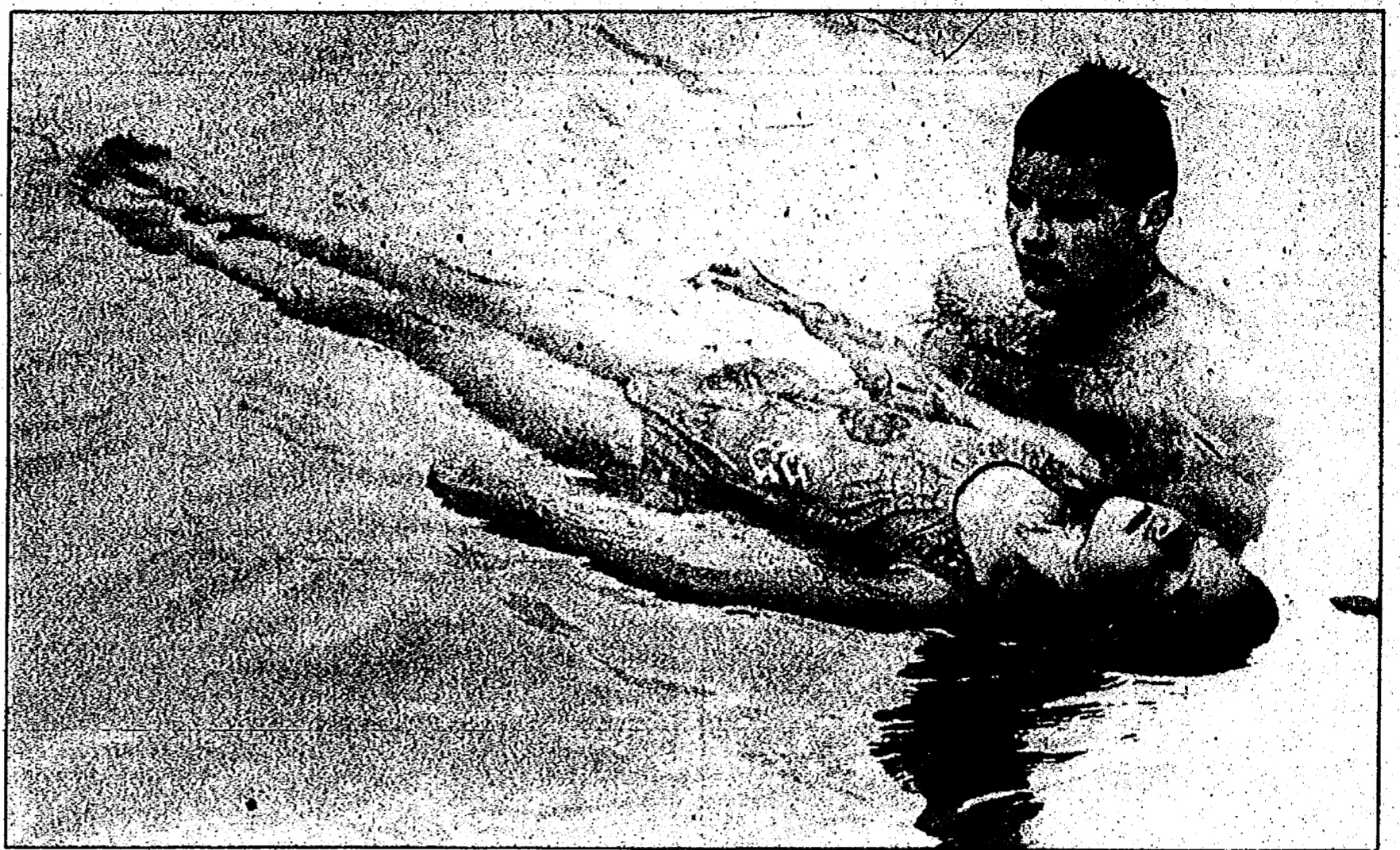

# County air show features aerobatic team

The Italian National Aerobatic Team, Frece Tricolori, brings a new form of military jet formation demonstration to Willow Run Airport for the July 4-5 Air-Michigan festivities.

It's the world's largest military jet team with 10 Aermacchi MB-339 trainers in formation.

Unlike American jet teams, Italian team members stay on assignment for more than a few years. Current team commander, Col. Alberto Moretti, started as third right wingman in 1981. Team leader Col. Gianluigi Zanovello began his assignment as third left wingman in 1983.

Frece Tricolori is a descendant of Italy's first aerobatic

school, established at Campformido in 1930, linked to Col. Rino Corso Fougier.

Fougier convinced the Italian Air Staff that a military pilot had to first be a sportsman if he was going to fly a plane in war assignments with maximum efficiency. Subsequently, Fougier started a five man aerobatic formation team.

Italian Air Force Aerobatic Teams achieved maximum fame — and travel — in the '30s, going all over Europe and South America. Its first and only U.S. trip to date was in 1986.

After the war years, two national teams existed, one to participate and one in reserve to

plan for demonstrations the following year.

Frece Tricolori was founded in 1960 as the one and only Italian Aerobatic Team with permanent headquarters at Rivolto del Friuli Airport. The name means Tricolored Arrows after the colors of the Italian flag.

The demonstrations will feature 10 ship formation flying and also solo demonstrations of the Aermacchi, a two seat trainer used for aerobatic flying and operational close air support missions against tanks and helicopters.

The formation breaks down into the leader, three left wingmen, three right wingmen, two

slot pilots and a solo pilot.

Its support group includes a C-130 cargo plane from the 46th Air Brigade and Atlantique anti submarine aircraft, plus two spare MB-339s.

The appearance of Frece Tricolori highlights a large card of performances and demonstrations at AirMichigan.

Advance tickets are available at the air show office at \$9 for adults and \$6 for children and reserved box seats are priced at \$15. At the gate, general admission tickets are \$12 for adults and \$9 for children.

## Leaders agree schools of future need retooling

Reactions to Dr. Willard Daggett's speech on changing the school curriculum for the world of work:

Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City: "We are facing in this state a dropout rate of 24 percent, which is intolerable. We have a lot of our students going out into the world who don't have appreciable technical skills. We are going to have to adjust if we are going to compete, or resign ourselves to the fact we are not going to be a world-class nation."

Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-Livonia: "If you're a youngster in a middle school in the U.S., your parents are going to encourage you to go to college. But if you want to go into vocational education, it's not thought of with the same pride. Only 20 percent of people who start in community colleges finish, and only 40-50 percent in state universities finish."

Dorothy Beardmore, of Rochester, president of the State Board of Education: The Ferndale School District in Oakland County already is making the connection between school and the workplace. "They've focused on a great deal on preparing for the workplace and the needs of the workplace. It's been a long time coming."

## Educator urges curriculum overhaul

Michigan schools are teaching better and better — but it's the same old stuff, says an internationally known educator.

And grandpa's curriculum won't help high school graduates in the international economy where "one-third of all new jobs are technological and technological repair," said Willard Daggett, head of the International Center for Leadership in Education.

We're teaching:

- Algebra — when we should be teaching statistics, logic, probability and measurement systems.

- Reading of novels and newspapers — instead of technical manual reading.

- Biology, chemistry and physics — instead of applied physics. American educators inflicted the biology-chemistry-physics sequence

in 1912 by following alphabetical order.

"All technology is applied physics, but we teach it last. Only 18 percent of Michigan high school graduates take any physics. The others fall off the science ladder before they get there," Daggett said.

Most European and Asian nations require two to four years of physics, but "Michigan doesn't require a day of physics," he said.

"Japan decides what skills will be needed in the year 2000 — that becomes non-negotiable — and builds back from that," said Daggett, who served on national commissions for both Japan and Russia.

"The U.S. is fixated on the present institutional boxes. You make very slow, gradual, incremental improvements, but societal changes are occurring four or five times as fast.

Declaring "I hope I have made

you very, very uncomfortable," Daggett almost mocked President Bush's boast that the U.S. would be first in math and science by the year 2000.

### Humble origins

A one-time typing teacher, Daggett rose to head New York State's occupational education office before taking his international job last August.

Rep. William Keith, D-Garden City, chair of the House Education Committee, brought him to Lansing June 10. In the audience were educators, lawmakers and Acting Gov. Connie Binsfeld.

Keith and Rep. Lyn Bankes, R-

Livonia, are among lawmakers who have traveled to Germany to study its vocational high schools, where students spend half their time on jobs and must command a foreign language to graduate.

House leaders also are pushing a drastic revision of Michigan's adult education system, because present workers will provide 80 percent of the year 2000's workforce.

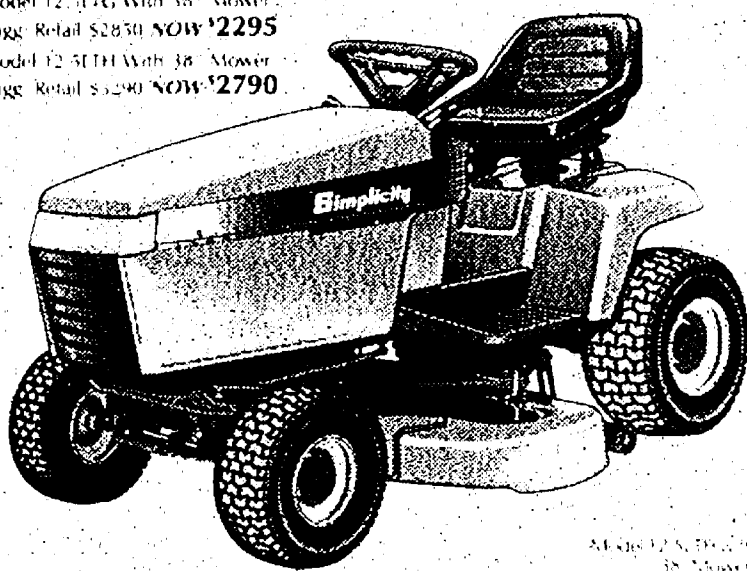
Keith ran into much suburban flak at a public hearing last winter when he offered House Bill 4165 to set up a voc-tech system in high schools based on the German model. Chief problem: Suburban parents want their kids to go to college, and educators prefer to protect the existing curriculum.

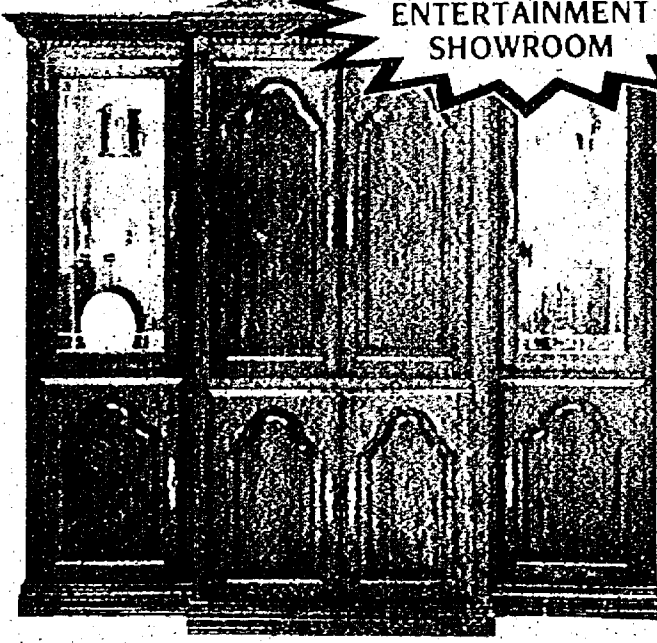

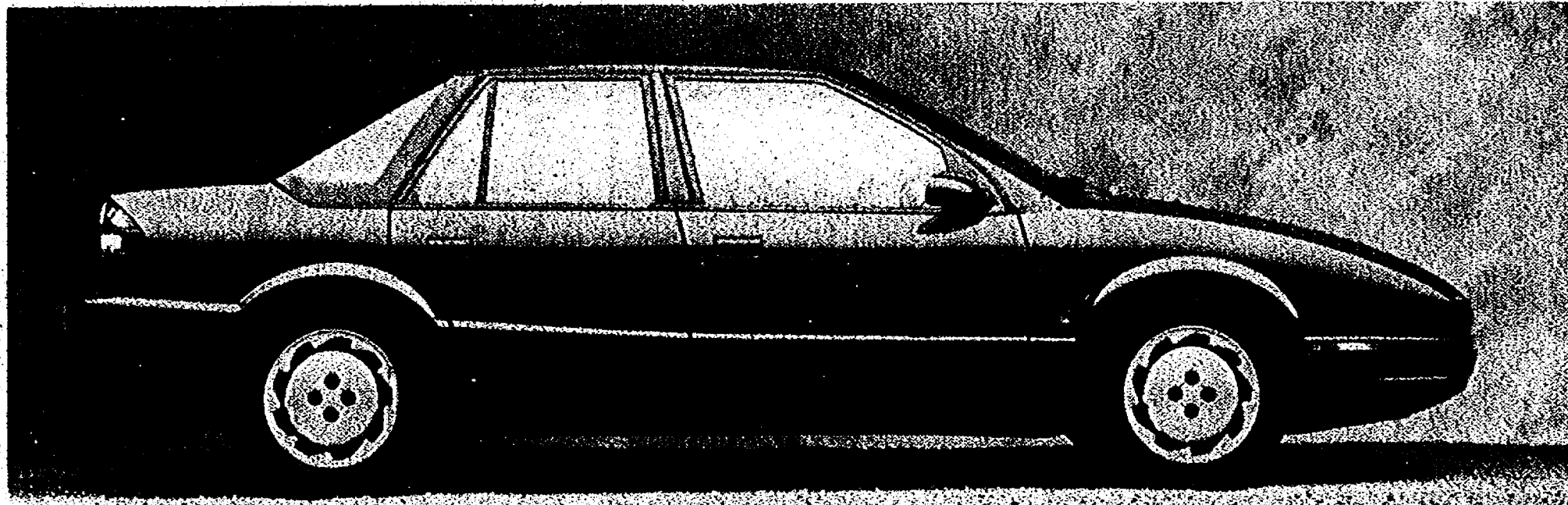

# Local host families needed now for summer exchange students

Area host families are needed now to host 48 French and Spanish boys arriving in the metro area July 1.

The students will spend four weeks in Michigan. Families need not speak a foreign language to host. Students have had from four to eight years of English language study.

The 48 boys without families are part of the 160 French and Spanish exchange students and chaperons scheduled to arrive next week. In addition, another 41 boys and 36 girls are unplaced from the group of French, Spanish and German students and chaperons arriving in Michigan at the end of July.

The teens have a variety of interests including tennis and other sports, water activities, computers, camping and music.

Some American families take their guests on trips. Others share their everyday lifestyle. The students ages 14-18, bring spending money and their parents pay for their transportation and insurances. Teacher chaperones accompany the teenagers.

"Our recruitment of host families is in full swing, but we still need many more families," says Evelyn Prince. "After 16 years we still love letting families know that it is not

too late to add excitement and learning to their summer and to do a wonderful service at the same time," she said. "What happiness when families discover which European son of daughter will be theirs for a month."

Hosts must supply three-family references and are asked to provide the guests access to other teenagers. Children of host families get preferred acceptance as exchange students for the Nacel reciprocal programs to France, Spain, Germany and the Ivory Coast in future summers.

Nacel Cultural Exchange, a non-profit organization, is the largest summer homestay program between Europe and the United States. Nationally more than 94,000 students and families have been served since 1969, while locally there have been more than 3,800 participants since 1980 when the Princes first brought the program to Michigan.

"Everybody says 'change the schools but not me,'" said Daggett. Keith and Bankes have videotaped copies of Daggett's hour-long presentation.

## Advocates longer day

Daggett also advocated extensive teacher retraining to put a new world-of-work curriculum in place and then a longer school day and year.

"You've gotta put up the money to retrain them," he said, proposing 20-30 days a year for teacher retraining. New York made a partial step in that direction by cutting classroom days from 180 to 170 and negotiating five more days from

teachers unions — a net of 15 days of retraining a year.

"We got the money by buying no new equipment," he added.

Once a more balanced curriculum is in place, then we can lengthen the school day and year, he said.

At the end of World War II, the U.S. had the longest school day and year in the world — 180 days, 5 1/2 hours — while Japan had 120 days and 3 1/4 hours.

Today the U.S. is still at 180 days and 5 1/2 hours while Japan is at 243 days and 8 1/2 hours and next year will go to 257 days and 9 1/4 hours; Korea is at 270 days and 10 hours.

"It's not a case of longer; it's a case of different," Daggett said, noting manufacturing workers today use automated technology, technical manuals, and statistical numerical control systems rather than

hammers, pliers and screwdrivers.

His favorite attention-getting story is a Carnegie Foundation study of who can most quickly link a VCR to a television set and program it to videotape a future show.

Kids aged 10-12 did best; high school dropouts did better than high school graduates; college graduates fared the poorest. Why?

"Reading a newspaper or novel is a different cognitive process than reading a VCR manual. The VCR manual is short passages, response, short passages, response. Newspapers and novels demand broad conceptualization.

"If you develop one skill (conceptualization) and not the other, you retard the other," he said.

Audience question: Should Michigan schools eliminate reading of novels and newspapers?

"American schools have an obligation for balance. Most of what you have in the curriculum has some value — for a citizen and family member," Daggett said. "You're in the third wave of school reform — business-pushed reform. You've got to look at the employment model to see what we have to do to schools . . . but not throw everything else out in the meantime."

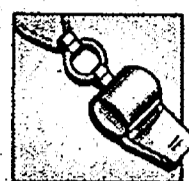
YMCA day camps

Livonia board studies pay-to-play



If a "pay-to-play" policy is adopted by the Livonia board of education, students and their parents will have to come up with money if the teens want to take part in sports or other extra-curricular activities.

A "share the pain" philosophy emerged Monday as Livonia school district officials wrestled with restoring sports and other high school activities cut from its 1992-93 budget.

Instead of keeping some high school sports and activities and cutting others, as the new budget now does, some Livonia board of education members want to restore all cut sports programs and charge all students who participate in extracurricular activities a fee.

The activity fee, if adopted by the school board which serves the northern section of Westland, also would apply to students playing football and basketball — varsity sports not cut in the new budget.

The pay-to-participate plan passed the scrutiny of the board's finance committee Monday, but still faces a vote of the full board.

The trustees asked Ken Watson, director of secondary education, to determine what the across-the-board activity fee would be. It could run as high as \$130 per activity, Watson said Monday.

A decision must be made soon so that teams get scheduled for fall games.

Numerous parents appeared before the trustees to ask that a fee system be launched to save their child's sport or activity.

"I have no problem paying," said Donna Miller. "Parents will bend over backwards to pay that fee."

High school sports cut in the 1992-93 budget include varsity baseball and

softball, tennis, cheerleading, hockey and golf.

Besides football and basketball, high school sports spared in the budget include wrestling, swimming, track and soccer.

To lower the cost of a fee, trustees briefly considered spreading it across all high school students, but then discarded the idea.

Under this plan, each student would pay a fee of about \$40, considerably less than the higher fee imposed on sports participants.

Parents and school officials alike said it might be tough collecting a fee from students who don't participate in after-school sports and activities.

Watson called it a bookkeeping nightmare. "We'd have no leverage to collect this money."

John Rennels, assistant superintendent for personnel and an attorney, said levying a fee is legal as long as it's not levied for a required class or for a class where credit is given, and as long as

families who can't pay the fee are treated in a confidential manner.

The trustees also asked Watson to recommend how middle school sports cut in the new budget can also be brought back. The trustees said they will consider both programs separately.

The fee would keep sports and such other activities as debate and stage band intact at least for another year.

"This gives us time," said trustee Patricia Sari. "By then we will know what happens at the state level, and have time to see how this works."

If the fee program doesn't work, warned Sari and trustee-elect Kenneth Timmons, the district might not have sports programs in 1993-94.

"We must make that point, so that residents continue to write their lawmakers," Sari said.

Because of a loss of money due mainly to state school aid policy, the district recently chopped \$7.2 million from its 1992-93 budget of \$101 million.

3 school unions say no to contract reopeners

Livonia school district officials didn't get far in asking three unions to make concessions to help solve the district's financial crisis.

Because there was no reopener clause in their contracts, none of the three unions were under any obligation to talk about a possible wage freeze or give-backs.

But, while struggling to balance its budget earlier this year, the board of education, which serves the northern section of Westland, decided to take the step and ask the unions to see what their response would be.

As was probably expected, the answer came back a resounding no.

"We'll have to put this on the back

burner for now, but I fully expect that the issue won't go away," said board president Richard McKnight. "The bottom line is, they didn't have to do this if they didn't want to. And they don't want to. But we'll look at it again next year, if we have to pursue another round of cuts."

The three unions without reopener clauses are the teachers' union, the Livonia Education Association (LEA); the administrators' union, the Livonia Educational Administrators and Supervisors (LEAdS); and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees-AFL-CIO (AFSCME).

Concession talks with three other unions that do have reopener clauses are still underway, said John Rennels, assistant superintendent for personnel.

These are: Supervisory Employees' Association (SEALS); Livonia Secretarial Association (LSA); and the Livonia Paraprofessionals Association (LPA).

Joan Renie, spokeswoman for the LPA, recently came before the board to ask if administrators also will be asked to make concessions.

"If we ask for sacrifice, it will be across the board and apply to all employees," McKnight said. "The administrators will step up to the line."

The "whole area of benefits" will be looked at when contracts expire for the three unions that don't have a reopener clause, Rennels said. The LEAdS contract expires in 1993; the LEA and AFSCME contracts expire in 1994.

Rose Williams, AFSCME president, said the only way her union would con-

sider concessions if it is "100 percent across the board, including administrators."

"It has to come from the top down," Williams said.

Steve Smith, LEAdS president, said his union will take its cue from what the teachers' union does.

Steve Naumcheff, LEA president, said the teachers already made a sacrifice earlier this year by linking their pay raise to the number of teachers who retire this year with a \$20,000 one-time-only retirement bonus.

The teachers got a 6.41 percent pay increase in 1992-1993 and 1993-1994.

The district will be able to replace the 70 retirees with entry-level teachers who earn substantially less, Naumcheff said.

# TV drains imagination from kids' summer play

 The raging controversy over the recent spate of drive-by super soakings may not seem to have much to do with the auto business, but somehow a conversation that started out with how the super squirt guns got banned in Boston quickly drifted to the broader issue of what kids do with their time today.

I hate to admit it, but I spent a considerable portion of my childhood before TV — well, not exactly before the invention of the tube, but at a time when only one family on the block had a television set, and it wasn't mine.

This meant that there were lots of kids running around all summer with an average of five and a half hours a day (now devoted to watching television) with nothing much to do but figure out ways to get into trouble. I mean, seek out creative activities.

Which is how we got the idea to build the tank. The tank was the logical extension of the war with the kids on the next block. (Creative ac-

tivities always seemed to end up with a war with the kids on the next block.)

We had started with squirt guns and had escalated to water balloons, then buckets of water, and finally had taken up defensive positions with a garden hose. In this carnage, a super soaker would have seemed like a mild case of the sweats.

The tank was the ultimate — a fully canvas-covered monstrosity built of scrap lumber, with numerous gun ports and hatches for water pistols and water balloons — the idea being a way of attacking without getting wet. Nobody had told us

about the Magnot line.

The tank ended up brutally heavy, with no wheels, so we had to carry it around the block to launch the assault. When we got there, the other kids spent about a half hour dumping water on the idiots trapped inside, who never got a shot off and couldn't run or move it very fast.

Anyway, the tank was followed by a series of scooters made from peach crates, perched on top of your sister's roller skates — the kind made of metal that could be taken apart, a thoughtful piece of engineering that obviously was meant to let you use your sister's roller skate

wheels for higher purposes.

Like the tank, pushing the scooters around was a lot tougher than walking, but it seemed like a good idea at the time. In fact, I remember a considerable portion of my childhood spent sitting around with other mildly demented types scheming up another fort, scooter, or raft to be built out of some box or packing crate dragged home to be used as raw materials.

For some reason, adults seemed tolerant of all that junk, although maybe they mainly appreciated the silence when we were plotting. It seemed like most of these projects never got finished, or when they

were they really didn't work very well.

Still, at least a few of us went on to make more stuff, and a few even ended up as engineers making cars. I figure the guys who worked on the tank ended up at Cadillac.


Anyway, with store-bought toys and television, where are the kids today scheming and dreaming about the ultimate machine?

I get the odd feeling that today's kid looks at an old pair of roller skates, and all that comes to mind is to throw them away.

## Council feud Cable-TV panel overreaching

**T**he Westland City Council missed the point in its debate last week over the number of members on the cable-TV commission.

Based on the city ordinance creating the commission nearly 12 years ago, the power of the commission is fairly limited to a few non-policy areas — and all in an advisory capacity.

But the real problem seems to be that the commissioners have a wider view of their powers than what's written in the ordinance.

The larger problem may be that the commission seems to see itself as the immediate supervisor and overall lord of the city's cable-TV contractor and programming services.

But the reality is that Diane Abbott of Abbott Productions is a private contractor whose duties are spelled out in a contract reviewed and approved by the city council and administered by the mayor and/or his representative.

Under the ordinance, the commission's powers are largely limited to handling subscribers' complaints and advising the city council on policies related to the cable services and the use of public channels to ensure diverse programs and services to subscribers.

The commission is also required to hold public hearings on rate increases and conduct evaluations of the systems every two years.

The ordinance concludes that the commis-

sion may get into other areas as directed by the mayor or the city council.

But the commission seems to be more interested in being involved with the cable contractor, either Abbott or her predecessor, Dennis Fasset, than in what the ordinance directs it to do.

For example, the commission has been reviewing the cable contractor's budget for many years — an area that is clearly up to the contractor and the city administration during budget preparations early every year and up to the city council in the spring when it sets the spending priorities.

The commission was also quiet each year when Continental Cablevision Co. announced its annual rate increases for subscribers. Most public opposition was from the mayor's office or council members. In any case, the city has no control over rates, anyway, with or without commission input.

The Observer suggests that the commission go back to the ordinance to find out what its powers are and avoid getting into areas which are off base.

Like all other commissions, the cable panel is purely an advisory group with no powers of any kind under the ordinance.

Let's keep it that way.

## Aid in curtailing spouse abuse

**M**ost police officers will tell you that spouse abuse, or "family trouble" calls, are among the most common and the most dangerously unpredictable they handle. Conversely, arrests and full-scale prosecution in such cases are about as rare as the calls are routine.

That paradox isn't just a "women's issue," and the State Legislature may be about to recognize it, none too soon.

A series of bills on domestic violence is winding its way through the Legislature. Taken as a whole, the proposed legislation places greater responsibility on police departments, prosecutors and judges in pursuing spouse abuse cases.

The bills propose these major changes:

- Easier arrest warrants, requiring a judge or magistrate to act on information from police — with or without the victim's consent to press charges.
- Stricter sentencing guidelines — cutting the number of "second chances" for a convicted spouse abuser from two to one before jail time could be assigned.
- Mandatory sharing of information between police and judges on previous assault convictions before sentencing.
- Allowing probate courts to order an adult out of a home where a child has been abused.

One of the bills even addresses the money needed to pay for the changes by bumping marriage license fees from \$20 to \$30 and allocating the difference to domestic violence shelters. That still leaves unanswered, however, where funding will come from for training of police, prosecutors and judges that should be a part of the package.

And additional time spent on pursuing these cases will increase costs even further, but that's money well spent in a humane society.

We are uneasy over increasing unilateral power of government agencies and would prefer to see changes in this package that would make it easier for battered spouses to press charges.

Still, the new bills would go a long way toward shifting the burden for pursuing with these crimes away from the helpless victim and onto more socially aware and trained government agencies where it rightfully belongs.

The built-in disadvantages in the current system put victims, particularly women, at a loss. Many legitimate cases never see the light of a courtroom due to threats of additional violence. Many victims learn to "live with it" because removing a bread-winner from the home just isn't practical for financial reasons, or even possible because there is no place to go.

Spouse abuse crosses all racial, ethnic and economic strata. It could involve your neighbor, it could involve you. Remember, there are times when it is appropriate to be your brother's keeper.

## Kmart's attitude wrongs kids

**C**ensorship under any guise is a danger to our communities.

But all that changed when Johnson announced that he tested HIV positive — the precursor to a fully developed case of AIDS.

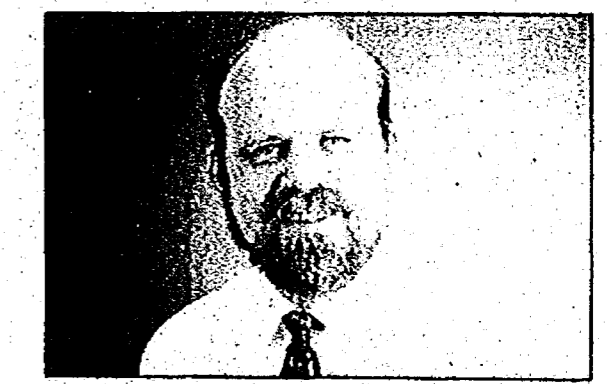
Young people around our nation were crushed. Johnson, more than anyone else, represented hope to millions of youngsters who otherwise had none. They admired and listened to Johnson because he had defied the odds, overcome racial and class barriers.

He was the American dream.

Now, short of a miracle cure, which all experts agree isn't even peaking over the horizon, Johnson will die of AIDS.

All the money, fame and fortune won't save him.

But kids still listen to Magic Johnson, and

now it's corporate America's obligation to carry his very important and lifesaving message.

This message may not be as colorful or as profitable, but it is more important than any other Johnson has ever carried to his fans.

Johnson's book has been endorsed by several very credible organizations, including the American Medical Association, the Children's Defense Fund and the Pediatric AIDS Foundation, among others.

Other retail outlets, including Kmart's Waldenbooks subsidiary, carry the book.

Kmart executives need to remove their eyes from the bottom line and take a look at all the children in their stores. They, and their parents, deserve to have the message made available to them.

AIDS is a disease out of control. The number of victims increase and the only way, absolutely the only way to stem the tide of this modern-day plague, is education.

Kmart and other retailers who have decided to yank Johnson's book from their shelves should give it another chance. It could be one of their children who are saved from the death sentence offered up by AIDS.

# State maps improving but are still found lacking

**P**at Nowak wasn't just trumpeting bureaucratic air when he said Michigan's 1992 transportation map is improved.

The boss of the state Department of Transportation said there are more than 300 changes, and pointed out a few. But his press release didn't point out the biggest change of all:

No picture of the governor. For the first time in a generation, at least, MDOT's map has no color photo of the chief executive. The Great Lake State is rare if not alone in the nation in that regard.

John Engler often accused his predecessor, Jim Blanchard, of using state publications to trumpet himself. There's a puffy message about our 11,000 lakes and 3,200 miles of shoreline with Engler's scrawl, and that's all.

The big news is that Michigan has turned the corner in admitting we have

a treasure in our 2.7 million acres of National Forests.

Until 1962, our maps showed the National Forests in a green tint; then they mysteriously disappeared. For a dozen years I griped about it. The bureaucracy gave conflicting reasons for eliminating them.

Nearly all states I have visited and studied show National Forests on their maps. Colorado would be nothing without them. Even Indiana and Illinois show them.

Michigan's four National Forests — Ottawa and Hiawatha in the UP, Manistee and Huron in the northern lower — have 80 campgrounds that are, on average, better maintained than State Forest campgrounds. But for 30 years, state government has refused to admit the existence of National Forests. Our freeway welcome centers at Monroe, Quincy and New Buffalo carry no literature about National Forests.

Nowak's regime has made a partial improvement. The map text has two paragraphs on the forests and where to write for information.

I still want them shown on the map. There would be no "clutter," as the bureaucracy says — just a green tint. The map is, in Nowak's own words, "the mainstay of the travel industry."

For the first time, MDOT's map shows the locations of nine sunken

ships off our coastlines. Nice touch. But I'll warrant thousands more families visit the National Forest campgrounds than dive to see sunken ships.

MDOT's chart of state parks — locations and facilities — is improved by slightly larger type.

A major change is more inset maps of cities. Mount Pleasant, Adrian and Traverse City appear for the first time. And there's an inset map of downtown Detroit showing streets, convention halls and the People Mover route.

That's understandable. Before ascending to his lofty post in Lansing, the cherubic Nowak was deputy Oakland County executive and chair of the suburban public transit board. Unlike traditional highway men, Nowak appreciates non-auto transportation modes.

MDOT's new map also shows the route of car ferry across Lake Michigan from Ludington to Manitowoc. Unlike maps you buy in the gas sta-

tion, MDOT's map is distributed free. Some two million copies have been printed for \$430,000, equal to the salaries of 10 state legislators and a much better deal.

Average cost is 21.5 cents apiece. For the first time, MDOT's map is printed on recycled paper.

I've come across travel books and calendars about Michigan that were printed on other continents. Not the MDOT map. Once again, the printer is Michigan Litho Inc., of Grand Rapids.

# 'Super foods' may just be a government cover-up

**I**'m keeping a real close eye on my vegetable garden this year. And I'd advise all of you other home gardeners to do the same.

You see, I've been reading about these new "super foods," the ones that are "genetically engineered." And I'm starting to get just a little bit nervous about what might be growing behind the garage.

When I read the first story about tomatoes that could be ripened on the vine and still shipped out to supermarkets without any danger of rotting, I thought that was pretty neat.

And I thought all the worrywarts who were babbling about the lack of government testing and controls were just doomsayers who had nothing better to do. After all, hybridization — splicing a piece of one plant onto another to produce a variety that is tastier or sturdier or prettier than the originals — has been around for a long time. So what is so different about genetic engineering?

"We have turned off the gene responsible for rotting."

That's how a spokesman for Calgene Inc., the California biotechnology company that got government approval to market the super tomato (called Flavr Savr), explained the process that is supposed to get red, juicy, tasty tomatoes from the vine to the dinner table — even in the middle of winter — without spoiling or rotting.

Turned off the gene. That's how it works. Scientists have found a way to get into the chromosomes of plants and manipulate the genes (the basic stuff of life) to produce varieties that won't spoil, that will resist disease and that will even kill insects.

And what's really bizarre about this whole process is that they're combining plant genes with animal genes to produce strange new species.

Monsanto has taken a gene from a bacterium and inserted it into corn, potato and cotton plants to produce varieties that can kill insects but — so the geneticists say — cause no harm to humans or animals. Other cross-species breeding includes potatoes containing silk moth genes, corn with fire-

fly genes and tomatoes with flounder genes.

If all this isn't weird enough, scientists at Michigan State University and James Madison University in Virginia have developed a plant that can produce plastic. And others in Princeton, N.J., are trying to develop a low-cholesterol pig.

If they really used their imagination, they could combine pig genes with genes from chickens and potatoes and come up with a creature that would produce bacon and eggs with hash-browns on the side.)

All of this conjures up images of bearded scientists working in dark laboratories pouring bubbling potions from one test tube to another with the help of assistants named Igor.

While some people worry about the medical and religious implications of such experiments, I keep wondering if that movie about "The Attack of the Killer Tomatoes" or the song about "The Eggplant That Ate Chicago" were as far-fetched as they seemed at the time.

When Paul Zindel wrote a play called "The Effect of Gamma Rays on

Man-in-the-Moon Marigolds," maybe he was trying to tell us something. And anyone who saw Charlton Heston in "Soylent Green" knows that the futuristic foodstuff in that tale wasn't really made from soybeans and lentils. That was just a government cover story.

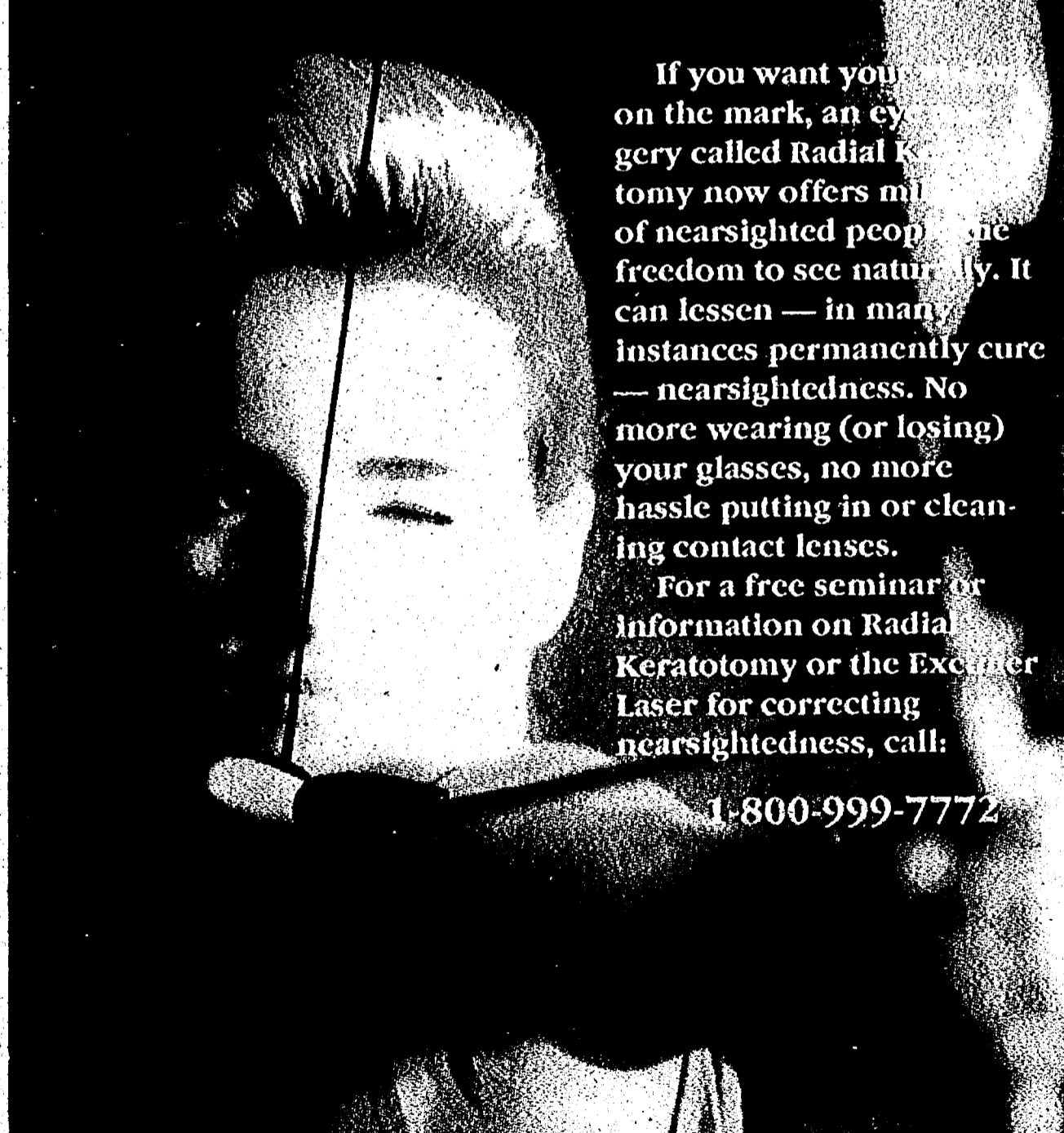
So what happens when those ears of corn with the firefly genes start flashing at me as I'm about to plopp them into a pot of boiling water?

Are the tomatoes with the flounder genes going to swim away instead of cooking down into spaghetti sauce? Will those potatoes with the silk moth genes sprout wings and flutter off as soon as I dig them up?

When plants can fight off disease and insects without the help of dusts and sprays, how can I be sure that what's growing behind the garage doesn't turn out to be some kind of RoboCrop?

I don't know, but I'm keeping a close eye on my garden this year . . . from my kitchen window . . . through binoculars.

# Judge orders state to pay cost of trial court operation

State government may have to pay local units hundreds of millions to operate trial courts if the Michigan Supreme Court upholds a lower court ruling.

Ingham Circuit Judge James Giddings, sitting as the court of claims, ruled last week the state must pay the costs of circuit, probate and district courts — estimated at \$1 billion by winning attorney Douglas Van Essen of Grand Rapids.

"We'd love to have the state pay the whole thing," said Larry Crake, R-Waterford, chairman of the Oakland County Board of Commissioners. "The attorneys will negotiate. It will not be \$1 billion, and it will not be zero," he predicted.

Local units in Wayne and Oakland County, and Livingston County government, joined the class action suit in 1989. They could be reimbursed their court costs back to 1986.

Units that didn't join the class action — including Wayne and Oakland county governments —

could file claims and collect one year back.

## Local claimants

Wayne County units that joined are the cities of Garden City, Livonia and Westland and the townships of Redford and Northville. Van Essen said Northville Township tried to opt out but failed to meet an Aug. 19, 1989, deadline.

The city of Northville, the two Plymouths and Canton Township opted out of the case. They see their 35th District Court as a money-maker, not a cost burden.

Judges have estimated the cost of running trial courts statewide at \$250 million to \$400 million. That cost, on top of Michigan's \$800 million in budget cuts over the last two years, could break the state budget.

Van Essen's initial claim said the state owes Oakland County \$16 million and Ann Arbor \$1.1 million.

Van Essen has pursued the case for three years on behalf of 76 counties, 44 cities, 11 townships and a village. He said appeals could take one to two years at the Court of

Appeals level and additional time at the Supreme Court level.

Supreme Court justices already are on record as demanding full state financing of the courts.

The late G. Mennen Williams, chief justice until he retired in 1986, advocated full state financing.

## State funding sought

So did Dorothy Comstock Riley as chief justice in 1987. Riley, who is still on the bench, asked the state to pay not only for trial courts but juror and witness fees, court-appointed defense lawyers, appellate counsel and transcripts.

Legislators have said no to full state financing.

As part of its 1980 enforced reorganization of Wayne County, the state agreed to pick up costs of operating trial courts.

It started with Wayne Circuit

Court, Detroit Recorders and Detroit District Court. But there the reform effort stopped.

All other 82 counties pay their local costs. So do Wayne County suburbs.

Van Essen said even Wayne County could be "the biggest winner" — \$30 million for attorney fees for indigents. Wayne County Probate Court also has not been state financed.

Van Essen said the 1980 law "was enforceable as creating a monetary entitlement for those units of local government which fund trial courts."

"The Legislature had to offer some funding to the rest of the state. It passed a schedule to gradually reimburse the locals from 1983-88."

The schedule called for state reimbursement of 20 percent in 1983 up to 100 percent after 1988.

Because of the statute of limitations, the local units may collect only up to 80 percent going back to 1987, plus 10 percent interest.

Attorney General Frank Kelley contends the 1980 legislature cannot bind future legislatures.

And when state officials claim the cost is "devastating," Van Essen argues "there's a devastating effect on local government," which, he

pointed out, is hurt by a property tax freeze this year.

Another part of Van Essen's suit asked that courts be audited by the state.

Courts are considered exempt from the budget and accounting act. In some areas, judges insist local units appropriate a lump sum that they can spend as they wish, with no line items.



## Pay-to-play plan schools' last resort

If all goes as planned, Livonia Stevenson athletic director Roger Frayer can start searching for a new baseball and hockey coach July 9.

A month ago, baseball coach Dick DeVries retired and hockey coach Paul Ferguson resigned — and at the time no replacements were necessary. Not only were the Spartans losing coaches, they were losing baseball, hockey, tennis, golf, junior varsity soccer and cheerleading because of budget cuts in the Livonia school system.

But on Monday night, a pay-to-play policy passed the scrutiny of the Livonia Board of Education's finance committee and now faces a vote of the full board.

The board will vote July 8 on the pay-to-play plan. If the plan is ratified, Frayer, an avid golfer, will begin looking for coaches instead of trying to find his golf ball (in the woods?) the next afternoon.

Frayer is willing to sacrifice vacation time as long as it means Livonia schools can keep a full slate of athletics and other extracurricular activities. If pay-to-play is adopted, Frayer said, each student will have to pay an estimated \$100 per sport at both the middle- and high-school levels.

"I truly believe that the tenor of everybody is we don't want pay-to-play, but as a last resort, to save athletics, it's worth a shot," said Frayer after attending a meeting with school officials Wednesday. "I think at this point in time, there is greater odds they will accept it than reject it. If we don't move and do something it'll be too late."

"I've had a lot of kids inquire to see if their sport was going to go. Cheerleaders asking if they're going to cheer, hockey players asking, 'What are we going to do?' I've even had parents from other school districts wanting to move to the Stevenson district because of the soccer program but wondering if we're going to have JV soccer."

Frayer has been involved in Livonia schools as a student, teacher, coach and administrator since 1955. After graduating from Franklin in 1965 and from Alma College in '69, Frayer coached at taught at Churchill from 1969 to 1978. He has been Stevenson's AD since '78.

Most of those years money and extracurricular programs have been abundant. So it's hard to comprehend the changes.

"Gosh, in my career, every school I went to was new that fall and now we have to cut things," Frayer said. "It's the most difficult time I've seen in Livonia in my life. Everybody's kind of got a long face."

Stevenson has a strong booster club and in the future such clubs will be more important than ever, predicted Frayer. He has modeled the Stevenson booster club after the ones run by friend Bob Atkins, a former Redford Union athletic director who is now in the same capacity in the Walled Lake schools.

"Like Atkins once told me, 'You do what you have to do,'" Frayer said. "He got involved in so many pancake breakfast fund-raisers, I'm sure he got sore wrists."

Stevenson draws students from wealthier communities than Churchill and Franklin, but that doesn't mean the Spartans will get more athletes in the pay-to-play plan, according to Frayer.

"You've got to remember, I grew up in the south end and those people are just as concerned as those in the north about their kids," Frayer said. "Parents in all of Livonia will do whatever is in their power to give their kids the best."

## Payne wins Jr. heavyweight belt

Craig Payne still weighs more than he'd like but for the time being he owns a belt that fits just right.

Payne won the World Junior Heavyweight Championship Friday with a six-round knockout of Canadian champion Conroy Nelson in London, Ontario. Payne, who weighed in at 284 pounds, came home to Livonia wearing the new belt and fashioning a 6-1-1 record as a professional.

"I wanted to get the belt," said Payne, 30. "It's really nice looking."

Payne still has a long way to go before he can even think about fighting World Heavyweight champion Evander Holy-

field or any well-knowns like Larry Holmes or George Foreman, but the new belt has some meaning.

Payne's professional comeback, which began last year after nearly a five-year layoff, is well ahead of schedule.

"It's the next step up before I get Holyfield," said Payne, who beat Mike Tyson when the two were amateurs in the early '80s. "When the time comes I'm going to get it, but I'm not going to rush. You have to crawl before you can walk. Right now I'm still crawling."

(Trainer) Paul (Soucy) has been with me 13 years and I thank him and look forward to doing a lot more great things with him."

What made Payne's knockout even more impressive was he didn't know the fight would go on until two days prior when promoter Brandon Dunlop called Soucy and said the Canadian Boxing Commission would sanction the bout.

There was talk the Canadian commission wouldn't sanction the fight because none of Payne's previous professional fights lasted longer than four rounds.

The fight was scheduled for 10 rounds but Payne needed only three before he knocked Nelson down to one knee with a shot to the body.

Payne knocked Nelson down for the eighth count in Round 4 and finished the veteran fighter off in the sixth with a right hook. Nelson, who in 1985 was KO'd in two rounds by Tyson, fell to 20-18 as a professional.

"I think Craig's body shots are what did it," Soucy said. "Nelson changed his defensive style in the sixth round,

Craig picked it up, stalked him and waited for the (time to throw the) hook. Craig hit him with a beautiful shot."

Payne, who lost his only professional fight last month to Chicago's Ty Evans in a decision at the Palace, said he was in good shape for Friday's bout.

"They told me (the week before) the fight was off (canceled) but I was still ready," Payne said. "I just took the fight like I was supposed to. I kept the heat on and hit him with everything I had. I fought like 'The old Craig Payne.'"

Soucy said Payne might have to defend the World Junior Heavyweight title every three months but up next is a tournament put on by Pay Per View Television which starts in late July. If Payne wins all four bouts, bigger pay-days are guaranteed.

"I'm going to win Pay Per View," Payne said.

## ALL-AREA FIRST TEAM

Characters in the Livonia-Redford Theatre Guild's "Albertine in Five Times" remind one of a fine crystal that has fractured into ugly deformed pieces of glass.

As we learn about each piece, their rough edges seem softer. Indeed, the crystal slowly appears to become whole again. Not perfect to be sure. Stress cracks remain permanently etched. There is, however, beauty in understanding the life of a woman who has endured more than her share of pain. It is a show not to be missed.

Five actresses play Albertine at five different times in her life. Director, Jeffrey Nahan, does a fine job of staging playwright, Michael Tremblay's, challenging script. His cast interacts naturally as five visions of one personality. We see them as Albertine's memories, just after she enters a home for the elderly.

Shirley Hulet is marvelous as Albertine at 70. One moment she's a wise, smiling silvery-haired woman; the next she's conflicted with tearful, painful memories. At long last she has reached the age of understanding.

As crises develop, she tries to advise those playing herself in earlier years. As has been the case for centuries, they never listen.

Barbara Coven scores as a youthful Albertine of 30, whose natural optimism has been tempered by a wayward

husband and troubled children. Unable to communicate, she takes out her frustration by nearly beating her daughter to death over a sexual encounter.

Cheryl Roy gives a mesmerizing performance as a bitter, joyless Albertine at 40. Her husband foolishly gotten himself killed; her daughter's a tramp, her son is mentally impaired. All she ever wanted was to be loved. To be understood. Instead life dealt her a deck of losing cards. No wonder she is an empty shell of a woman, full of rage, with a perpetual sarcastic smile.

Pat Varga very effectively shows another side of Albertine at 50. She chooses to set herself free. Her attitude: if you don't like something, make up a new past. She places her son in a home. Gets a job as a waitress, but there are memories, always memories.

Maureen Cook is most sympathetic as Albertine at 60. By now she is a pill-popping, bedridden recluse. Memories linger on. And she fears that one night the guilt will be too much — and she will take one too many pills. Mary Vinette is very good as an age-

less sister, Madeleine. She is a common thread in this tapestry of Albertine's life. Somehow, she married right, had lovely children, and endured few hardships — except jealousy. Albertine would have given anything to have Madeleine's ability to communicate.

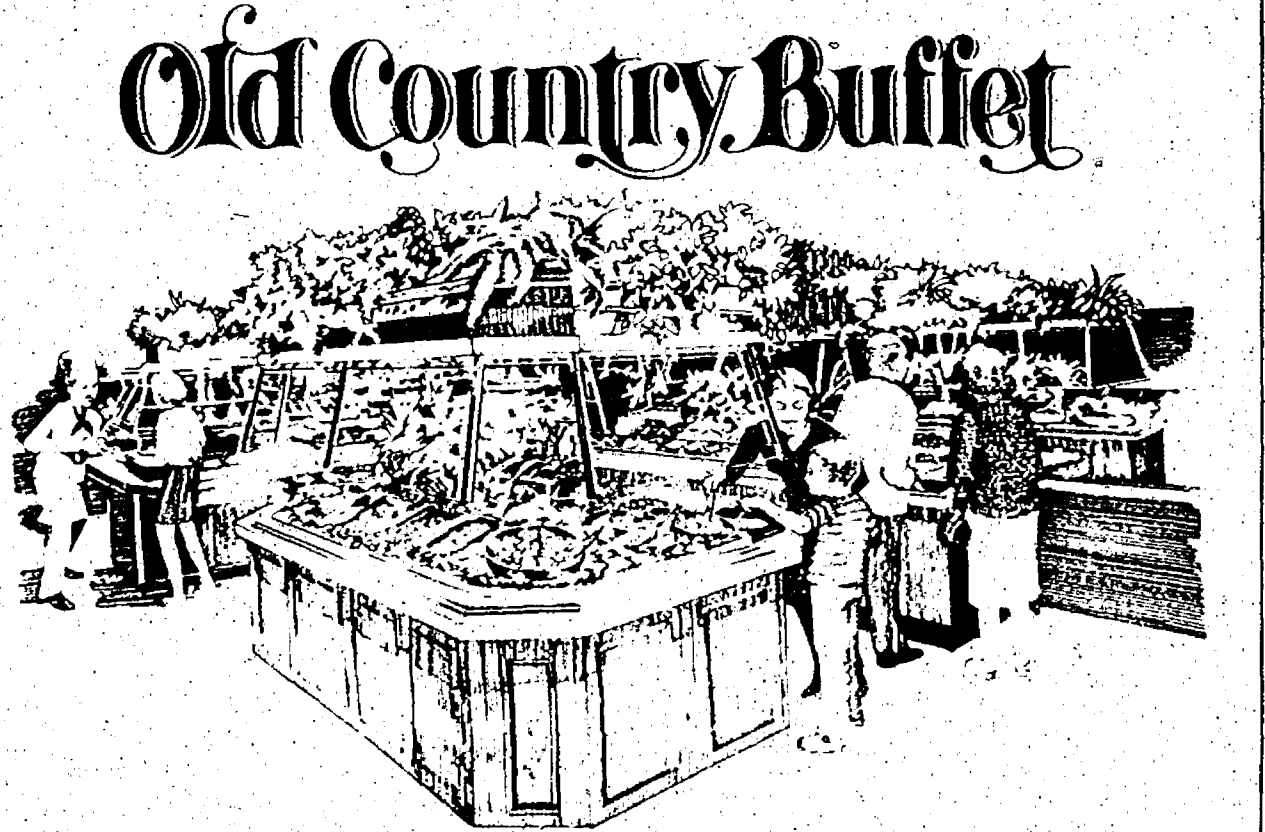

# Passion, raw energy in Stratford's 'Romeo and Juliet'

The Stratford Festival's production of "Romeo and Juliet" has all the youth, passion and raw energy that Shakespeare intended and the stage rarely delivers.

This production, which runs in repertory through Nov. 15 at the

Ontario theater's Festival Stage, has two lovers who actually look the part of giddy teenagers and yet handle the magic of Shakespeare's language with insight, intelligence and clarity. Here are two leads that bring the youth of Franco Zeffirelli's famous film version but handle the language with more vitality and understanding.

Megan Porter Follows, star of television's "Anne of Green Gables," is a young woman in her 20s who easily passes for the 14-year-old Juliet. She brings to the

part the flushed look of a girl enraptured by the latest pop star, which is exactly the intensity Shakespeare had in mind for a love that is more girlish rapture than profound attraction. Follows moves comfortably and speaks the lilting verse with ease. She is Juliet and is well matched by her Romeo.

Antoni Cimolino has the larger role and has more opportunity to lose the thread, but he rarely does. Here is the perfect Romeo, not a wimpy, love-struck sap but a boisterous young man looking for love

and adventure wherever he can find it. Cimolino handles the language with skill and gives vibrance to the impassioned speeches, but he is equally believable carousing and jesting with his buddies.

"Romeo and Juliet" is not so much about the triumph of love over death as it is about the foolishness of adults who allow the young to suffer for their quarrels. The "love" of Romeo and Juliet is an ardent but superficial passion brought to boiling by the rivalry of their families.

Director Richard Monette suggests this theme by doing the props and costumes in the style of 1930s fascist Italy. The idea of political tension and impending war is made but never forced and Monette doesn't make the mistake of altering the text or making obvious references to that period. Debra Hanson's props and costumes are brilliant from the playboy whites to the brown shirt uniforms to Juliet's soft girlish fashion. The clothes and props are close enough to our own time to emphasize the timelessness of Shakespeare's poetry and wisdom.

Barbara Bryne is funny as Juliet's garrulous and doting nurse, making every comment hilariously clear. Colm Feore, who a few years back played Romeo on the Stratford thrust stage, is an appropriately rowdy and bitter Mercutio, Romeo's ill-fated friend. Lorne Kennedy is a tempestuous Tybalt proudly strutting in his Mussolini garb. Bernard Hopkins as Friar Lawrence brings sympathy to his role of a peacemaker who sees his plan go tragically awry.

The best thing about this production is that it offers a perfect introduction to Shakespeare for young and old alike.

they overlook potential income sources, he said.

The National Governors Association estimates that allowing states to collect sales taxes on goods bought via direct mail would raise more than \$70 million a year for Michigan. Industry shakeout.

Steve Simons, president of Group SAA Limited, a Farmington Hills-based company specializing in the production and distribution of mail-order catalogs, said those who argue for new legislation may be missing a more subtle point.

"A lot of Michigan retailers are non-mail order and could care less if the industry succeeds or not," he said. Everyone should be concerned, however, because most mail order companies are small businesses, and it is the small business that truly drives the economy.

The level playing field traditional retailers are calling for would be a less populated one, he argued.

"What it will do is shrink the industry by 40 to 50 percent," he said.

While that might please larger mail-order companies that can cope with the new requirements and the traditional retailers, it would be bad news for consumers and entrepreneurs.

As corporate America continues to downsize, the government should encourage, not discourage entrepreneurs. Much of the mail-order industry's growth can be attributed to the ability of entrepreneurs to

start and maintain businesses with low overhead.

"This means less competition and higher prices for the consumer," he said. Not a windfall.

Chet Dalzell, spokesman for the national Direct Marketing Association, said the notion that mail order companies collecting taxes would result in substantial revenues for states is just wrong.

Most of the figures he has heard — \$70 million in additional tax revenues to the states — are from a 1987 update of a 1984 study by the Advisory Commission on Intergovernmental Relations.

Those figures are unadjusted and actually include revenue that is already being collected by direct marketers who have a presence in the state.

The figures are also wrong because they fail to factor in that a large segment of the direct-marketing industry is tax exempt (sales of insurance and investments) or largely exempt (sales of magazines, foods and pharmaceuticals), he said.

Dalzell said mail-order companies already collect taxes in states where they have a physical presence, but asking companies — the vast majority of which are small businesses — to keep track of 46 sales taxes and an untold number of local taxing districts is unfair.

**Catalog merchants confident of a win**

So begins the legislative tussle. Just because the Supreme Court has tossed the political football to Congress doesn't mean that lawmakers will choose to run with it.

In one corner, retail associations and some state governments have already begun lobbying legislators to enact laws to amend the interstate commerce laws. In the other corner, direct marketers are already making plans to bombard the Congressmen should a proposal be made.

Chet Dalzell, spokesman for the Direct Marketing Association, said he believes the prospect that Congress will change the law and ask mail order companies to begin collecting and forwarding taxes to states and taxing bodies is remote.

"A bill proposing that was killed on its lack of merit two years ago," Dalzell said.

In 1989, Congress reviewed interstate commerce regulations and decided against any changes at the time, he said. "Any legislation is likely to be defeated until we have a uniform tax code — which isn't very likely."

If all states collected the same sales tax, then mail order companies would be able to collect sales taxes more easily, he said. Mail or-

der companies would still be burdened by the task of transmitting the taxes to the respective taxing bodies, he said.

Steven Simons, president of Group SAA Limited, a Farmington Hills-based company specializing in the production and distribution of mail order catalogues, said those who argue for the tax collection as a way to tap new revenue sources might be surprised.

In order to collect the taxes, those same governments that see a potential windfall would be forced to set up an elaborate system to audit and monitor thousands of mail order companies.

"Most of those companies are probably making revenues of \$1 million to \$10 million," he said. Any revenues gained by the states would likely be eaten away by the bureaucratic system created to monitor it, he said.

"If they were to pass the law tomorrow, it would be better (to focus) on the larger companies."

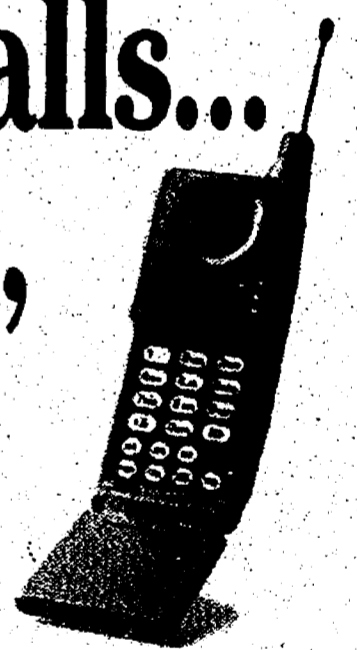
Simons suggested that an exemption should be made for smaller companies. The government already distinguishes between small and large companies for other purposes, such as employment regulation and taxes.

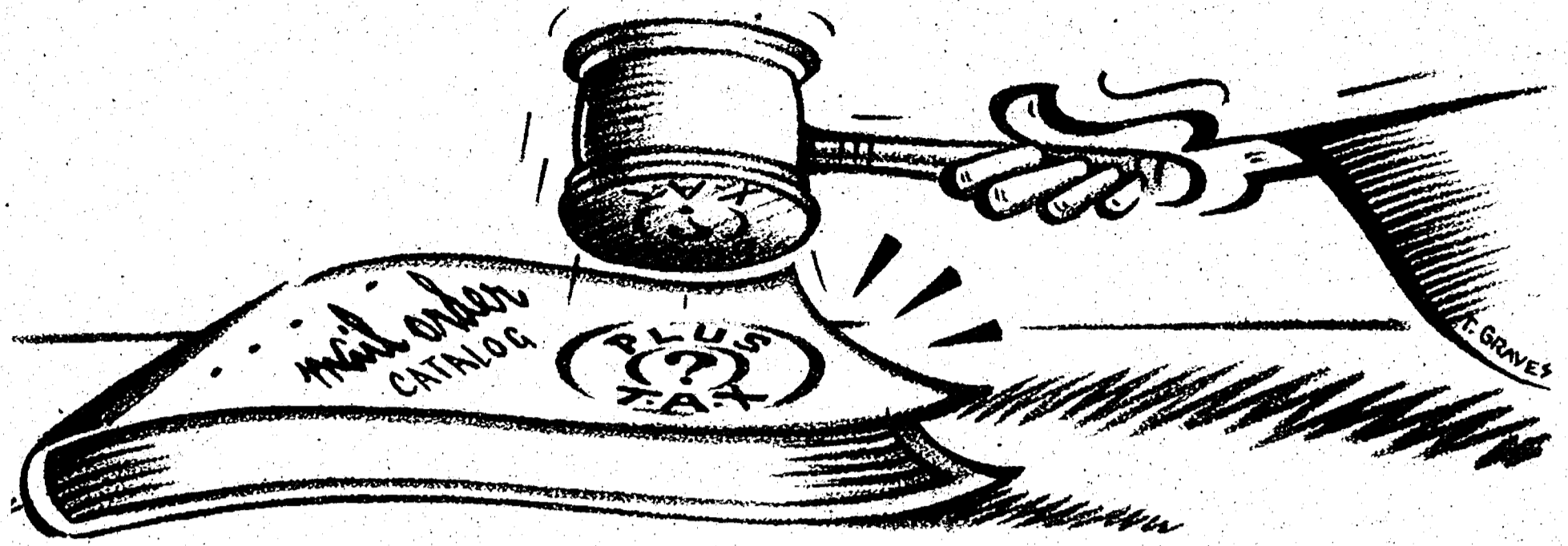

## Direct marketers face tax challenge

Individual states can't compel mail-order companies to collect sales tax from customers and forward the money to the various capitals, the U.S. Supreme Court has ruled. But Congress can. The battle lines are drawn and consumers are in the middle.

For anyone who's ever bought something from a mail-order company, take notice — conventional retailers hope to set into motion legislation that would hamper direct marketers' way of doing business.

Recently, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled 8-1 in the case of Quill Corporation vs. North Dakota Department of Revenue that state laws charging mail order companies with the responsibility of collecting state taxes on merchandise sold and then transferring those taxes to the buyer's state are unconstitutional.

What sounds like a victory for mail-order companies, however, holds serious overtones for the industry. In its decision, the court advised that Congress, if

it chooses to do so, can pass legislation requiring the collection.

Retailers and some state governments are lining up behind proposals to urge Congress to do just that.

Direct marketers are urging Congress to maintain existing laws.

Jeff Freedman, president of the Canton Township-based mail-order electronics distributor Planet Electronics, said requiring companies like his to collect taxes would be a burden — perhaps not an insurmountable burden, but it would surely create a hardship.

With the right computer equipment and software — and with constant updates — a mail order company could conceivably collect taxes from each of its customers and transmit them back to the respective state, but the result could mean some companies that are

unable to cope with the changes would be forced out of business, he said.

Freedman said it's common practice for mail-order firms to inform customers they still have an obligation to pay a use tax — which is equivalent to a sales tax — to their state. "The consumer has the chance to tell the truth or not (on the yearly tax form)."

Regardless of the legalities of the issue, Freedman said the argument for a level playing field just doesn't stand up. "People don't buy from us because they hope to avoid paying sales tax; they buy because we sell products you can't get from a local store."

People also buy from mail-order houses for convenience' sake, he said. "It (avoiding sales tax) may be an added plus, but it's not the reason mail-order businesses succeed. Level playing field."

James P. Hallan, president and chief operating officer of the Michigan Association of Retailers, said the association of more than 3,400 small retailers is merely seeking a more level playing

field. "This is an issue of equity, of parity."

"If you have a small businessman in Michigan who has invested in the community and he is competing with a company advertising heavily in this area, why should (the small business) have to (collect) a sales tax and not the other guy?"

Calling the lack of sales tax for catalog and other direct-market merchandisers a "\$3 billion a year tax loophole which enables out-of-state catalog and other direct-marketing firms to avoid collecting state taxes on the goods they sell," the Michigan Association of Retailers is urging Michigan's congressional delegation to enact and support legislation compelling mail-order houses to collect sales taxes.

Hallan said it is also an issue of revenue. In a time when many states are strapped for cash, they are remiss if

## Restaurant chain competes for part of breakfast market

As the backbone of a new campaign to generate more revenues at its non-mall restaurants, Troy-based Olga's Kitchen, Inc. has opened its doors to the highly competitive morning crowd.

Olga's breakfast menu is geared to heart-smart diners: smoked turkey hash, fresh fruit platters, natural granola cereal, a yogurt cooler with protein powder and three-egg omelettes prepared with a non-cholesterol alternative.

"Since we were traditionally open for lunch and dinner, the morning represented idle time for us, so it was a natural evolution to open for breakfast," said Michael Sadofsky, vice president of marketing and advertising for Olga's, which opened its first restaurant in 1970 in downtown Birmingham.

"But knowing the level of competition out there, from fast food to sit-down diners, we felt the only way to compete was to offer something different. That means fresh ingredients cooked to order in under five minutes."

### Strategy questioned

Still, even healthy food served in a wisp of time doesn't guarantee success.

Jeff Gabriel, a chef and instructor within the culinary arts program at Schoolcraft College in Livonia, said if given a choice, he would never go into the breakfast market.

"A restaurant which opens for breakfast is basically breaking even," said Gabriel. "How many dollars can you bring in when the average customer spends only \$3 or \$4? If you have 100 customers each morning, that's \$300 to \$400."

"If you have six or seven employees making \$5 to \$8 an hour, you may make a little bit of money. Personally, I would never go into the breakfast market. The dinner market is where you make your money, because there people are spending \$18 to \$20 a piece."

Because Olga's already has an established lunch and dinner crowd,

up-marketing

offering breakfast isn't likely to make or break the company. Last year, Olga's reported \$50 million in revenues from 53 restaurants across the nation, 20 of which are in Metro Detroit.

What's more, since the morning represents idle time at Olga's, a break-even breakfast campaign could help boost its profit margin if the new money coming in is enough to pay the respective share of rent and utilities, which are costs generated whether a restaurant is open or not.

But Olga's doesn't plan on breaking even. To lead the breakfast campaign, which began in February, the chain brought aboard William Pickett, former executive chef and co-founder of the Beverly Hills Grill as well as executive chef at the Richard & Reiss Restaurant, both of which are located in Birmingham.

### The game plan

"We didn't want to do just an omelette wrapped in a piece of Olga bread and call it breakfast," said Pickett, who left the former restaurant last December due to time constraints. "Knowing the level of competition we were up against, we had to make a statement and set ourselves apart from fast food and the \$1.99 breakfast served at places like Denny's."

Enter the smoked turkey hash, which Pickett said was a healthier alternative to corned beef hash, which is often prepared from the fatty portion of a brisket. The chef also created a cinnamon coffee, fritters, muffins, french toast, Belgian waffles and a yogurt cooler made with honey, bananas, orange juice and strawberries.

Still, there are deep pockets to

challenge. From the beginning, fast-food competitors like McDonald's and Burger King have offered breakfast with convenience and taste in mind, with little thought for nutritional value. The strategy has worked out well.

Breakfast brings in about 20 cents of every dollar McDonald's cash registers ring up, even as a recent issue of Consumer Reports found that fast-food egg sandwiches with cheese and meat like McDonald's Egg McMuffin and Burger King's Croissan'wich pack between 700 to 850 calories per serving. The Croissan'wich contains 40 grams of fat, close to two-thirds of a day's fat quota.

While convenience has always been high on the list of breakfast eaters on the go, only recently, with the advent of healthier diets, has nutrition been a consideration.

Pickett said his biggest challenges in bringing breakfast to Olga's was creating a healthier menu while working out time, logistic and training factors. Prices were also kept low.

"In preparing the menu, most of my time was spent measuring how long it took to prepare, cook and serve an item," said Pickett.

While Sadofsky declined to reveal how much Olga's spent bringing the breakfast campaign up to speed, he said the company hired over two dozen new employees to complement existing staffs. To date, breakfast is available 7 to 11 a.m. every day except Sunday, when hours are 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Only the Birmingham, Lathrup Villages and West Bloomfield restaurants serve breakfast, though Sadofsky said the chain will expand portions of the menu to most of its outlets over the next few years.

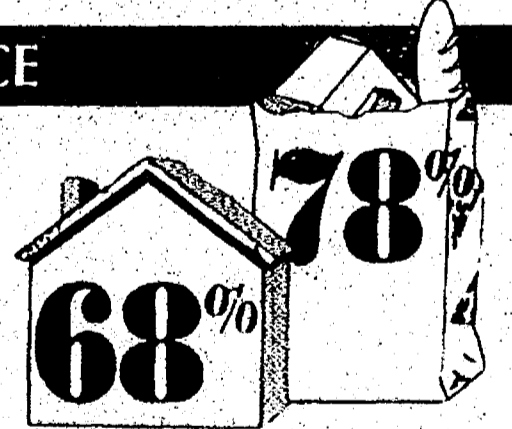

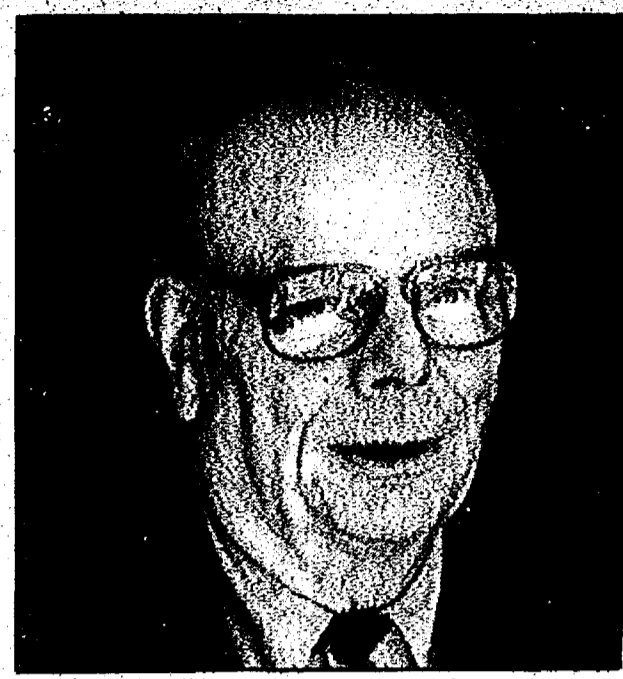

## FLAP takes on scales of justice

The legal system can be a scary proposition, if you've never had contact with it. But attorneys from throughout the metropolitan area are making it user friendly for the victims of domestic violence through a new program offered by First Step, western Wayne's domestic violence program.

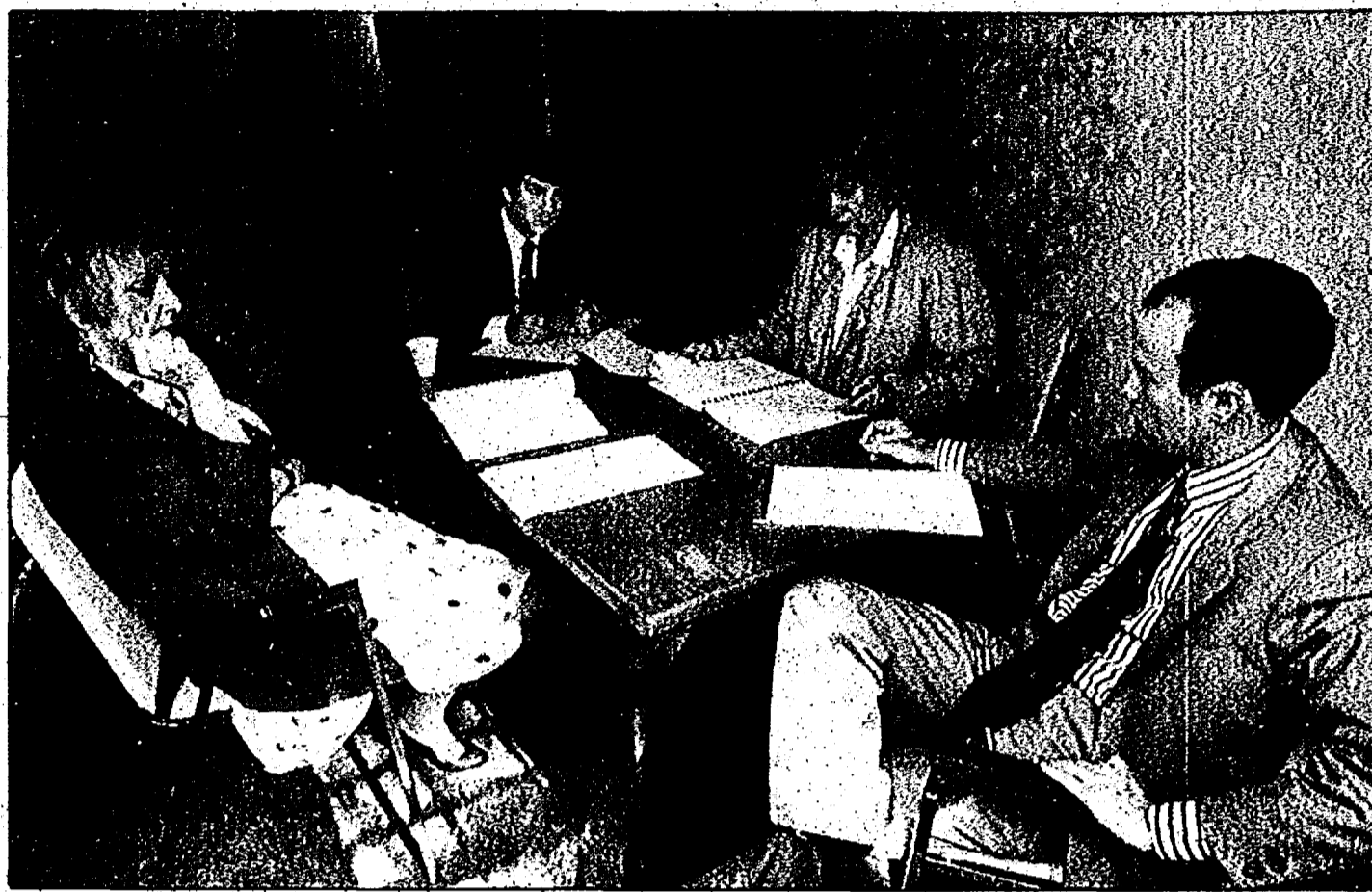
Judy Ellis doesn't mind creating a FLAP. Neither does Gerard Mantese. In fact, they've found a number of attorneys in the metropolitan area that are of the same opinion.

FLAP, according to Noah Webster, is to become excited or confused. Ellis, Mantese and company are excited, but forget the confusion. There's none of that when it comes to the First Step Legal Advocacy Program, better known as FLAP.

Ellis is executive director of First Step, First Step, western Wayne County's project on domestic violence; Mantese is an attorney with the firm of Honigman, Miller, Schwarz and Cohn. Together with Kelly Machado, an attorney and president of First Step's board of directors, and advocate Kisa Kunitz, they came up with a three-phase program to provide legal assistance for battered women.

The program addresses an issue that surfaced in study by the Michigan Supreme Court two years ago. Women don't have equal representation in the courtroom.

"We've known for years that the victims coming to us need care and support in the legal system," Ellis said. "A

lot of women don't know their rights; a lot only know what they hear from others.

"And let's face it, the criminal justice system is frightening in and of itself."

By placing ads in several legal journals, including the Michigan Bar Journal, Mantese, as the FLAP coordinator, lined up 53 attorneys from 33 law firms throughout Wayne and Oakland counties to provide pro bono (free) services to clients of First Step.

### Overwhelming response

"The response was overwhelming," Mantese said. "Attorneys from small and large firms signed up. Most don't practice in the area, but wanted to help."

An expertise in family law wasn't a requirement to join the program; in fact, the attorneys' backgrounds are as varied as the areas they come from. Mantese, for example, specializes on

commercial litigation, Machado in immigration and labor law.

Working with attorneys Rosanne Less and David Brown who are experts in family law, Mantese developed a training seminar for the volunteer attorneys to prepare them for the work. There also are 3-4 family law practitioners available to serve as mentors for the volunteers.

## Gift worth singing about

It's not hard to tell that Brenda Key is proud of her daughter. It shows up in her words and gestures, in the way she talks about the good times and the bad times that weave a fine thread through their lives.

And it's not hard to tell the Redford Township family is a strong believer in God's goodness. The mention of God surfaces many times in her talk about Lorra who just graduated from Thurston High School.

As Key sees it, God deserves the credit for Lorra's "wonderful gift." You see Lorra's gift is her voice, a voice that doctors some 18 years ago said might never sound right. Lorra was born with a cleft palate involving both the hard and soft palates of her mouth.

"It was like taking my heart out, throwing it on the ground and stomping on it," said Key of being told by doctors of her daughter's problems. "But the Lord has taken something so painful and turned it into such a wonderful gift."

"The end result is what we look at and it far outweighs what we went through."

Lorra underwent six major operations to slowly close the gaping hole in the roof of her mouth and a like number of operations to close a hole in her eardrum. Much of her early childhood was spent recuperating from operations or receiving speech therapy.

Today, without the benefit of voice lessons, Lorra sings Christian music in a middle to alto soprano range.

### An early start

She started sing at age 8 at Bethel Missionary Assembly of God Church in Livonia and has gone on to perform in musicals and at school. She has collected a variety of singing awards, including recent first places in district and state competition for a duet she did with her cousin Jaci Reid.

And it is her voice that Lorra wants to use to bring God's message to others. It's her goal to pursue a Christian music ministry — to be a Christian gospel singer, music teacher and choir director.

She'll get a chance to experience the life of a Christian singer this fall. She has been picked to tour with The Continentals, a traveling Christian music troupe.

"Lorra is totally motivated to singing," her mother said. "She told me that 'I want to sing first to the Lord and through the Lord to the people.'"

It was through her church that Lorra heard about The Continentals. The minister's son suggested she audition for the troupe.

Lorra sent in an application, a tape of her singing "I'll Talk to My Father for You" and "Via de la Rosa" and a testimonial as to why she wanted to be in The Continentals. Within two weeks' time, she got word that she had been picked to perform for three months this fall.

"We never tried to push Lorra; she just developed and blossomed with people's help," her mother said. "Even though she won a lot of awards at school, it was the church that brought her along more than anything else. I believe the church recognized her real gift."

The Continentals is a non-denominational Christian group that began touring 17 years ago. Specializing in upbeat contemporary Christian music, the group has grown to 14 troupes of 25 singers and 12-14 musicians that tour throughout the United States and the world.

### On the road

Lorra will receive a copy of the group's music in August to begin rehearsing at home. She will leave Sept. 14 for Denver, Colo., where she will go immediately to a two-week rehearsal camp before the troupe does the first of more than 30 concerts in the United States, Switzerland, Germany and Holland.

The concert schedule includes four stops in Michigan — Ypsilanti, Lansing, Newberry and Ann Arbor — Oct. 11-14 and the Keys are planning to take in as many of the ones closest to their Redford Township home as possible.

According to Key, the group members stay in private homes, affording the opportunity to meet a lot of new people. However, the trip still will cost Lorra \$5,000. She has gotten "an overwhelming response" financially from church people and family members in raising money for it.

"It's so neat that so many people who were a part of our lives since she was a baby have so much joy and are excited for her," Key said. "Many of the well-known Christian artists started out with The Continentals, like Wayne Watson, Sandi Patti and Scott Wesley Brown."

here in Oakland County," he said, in a recent interview at the Birmingham office of the Observer & Eccentric. "There are 23 (public) bridge clubs in Oakland County. They run afternoon and evening bridge games almost every day."

Crouse is a gregarious guy with a big voice to match his size. He said, "I have been playing bridge since my mother taught me in 1935, and I've been playing seriously for the last 15 years."

"At various times, Crouse has written bridge columns for the Oakland Press, Royal Oak Daily Tribune, Grosse Pointe News and the Macomb Daily. In his column for the O&E, he will concentrate on local players, talking primarily about games he has played with them."

in 1945 after spending three years with the U.S. Army — two and a half of those years serving with the 1st Infantry Regiment in the Pacific. In the advertising business, he worked more than five years at Campbell-Ewald and 18 years at BBD&O, where he produced TV commercials for major network shows. Purposes of his new column are threefold: "To have fun, to teach bridge and to relate to good players who play the game. Two-thirds of the columns are personalized, to just your readership players."

According to Crouse, there are 35 million active bridge players in North America. Although bridge clubs are growing, 75 percent of bridge players play at home with friends, neighbors and family.

"The attorneys are sensitive to issue of domestic violence and their training is to help them understand what survivors have been through and what they face," Mantese said.

"We want the attorneys to identify with First Step; we want them to know our goals and believe what we are doing and what the staff is doing," Ellis added.

Volunteers are asked to work a minimum of 10 hours a year. Cases are assigned on a rotating basis and volunteers work one case at a time.

### In phases

In anticipation of a flood of requests from First Step clients for legal assistance, FLAP is being phased in. The first phase involved the set-up of walk-in clinics the first and third Thursdays of the month at the Church of the Holy Spirit in Livonia and First Step's office in Southgate.

Currently, the attorney provide legal counseling and help clients obtain restraining orders, injunctions and simple divorces — no children. Saturday they will meet to discuss the start of the second phase — handling more complicated divorces, custody cases and related matters. Mantese would like to be in the position to assign more complex cases beginning in July.

The third phase is to work on changing the institutions and systems which deal with battering and rape to increase the effectiveness of the criminal justice system's response to those crimes.

Anywhere from 5-10 women show up at the clinics on a given evening and the questions they field are "extremely varied," Mantese said.

"They point out the basic lack of information women have about their rights," he said. "They come in feeling powerless, but with the clinics they can ask questions with-

out fear. They get solid information, feel they've been heard and empowered.

"And the legal knowledge they get from the clinic carries over into their lives. They feel more in control of their destiny."

Ellis and Mantese agree that business will boom with the start of the second phase and are hoping to attract more attorneys and financial support for FLAP. Currently, the program is absorbing the costs of such things and court filings and depositions.

### Support needed

First Step has written some grant requests and the amount of money FLAP attracts will "determine how quickly and heavily we jump into the more complex cases," Ellis said. Ideally, she would like to have enough money to hire a staffer to schedule the clinics, track cases and recruit even more attorneys.

A step in that direction is coming from the State Bar, which has provided plenty of advice and guidance. The Bar is looking at FLAP as a model for similar programs in the state and is about to certify it as a pro bono association, Ellis said.

"This can be exciting for an attorney because you can help change a person's life and broaden your knowledge," Mantese said. "It's a way of having an impact, especially if you're looking for important litigation where you can get involved."

"I handle my first restraining order for the program and for me, it was very rewarding."

Attorneys interested in helping the First Step Legal Advocacy Program can call Ellis at 525-2230 or Mantese at 256-7705. And they'll get something in return.

"We can promise them a rewarding experience," Ellis said.

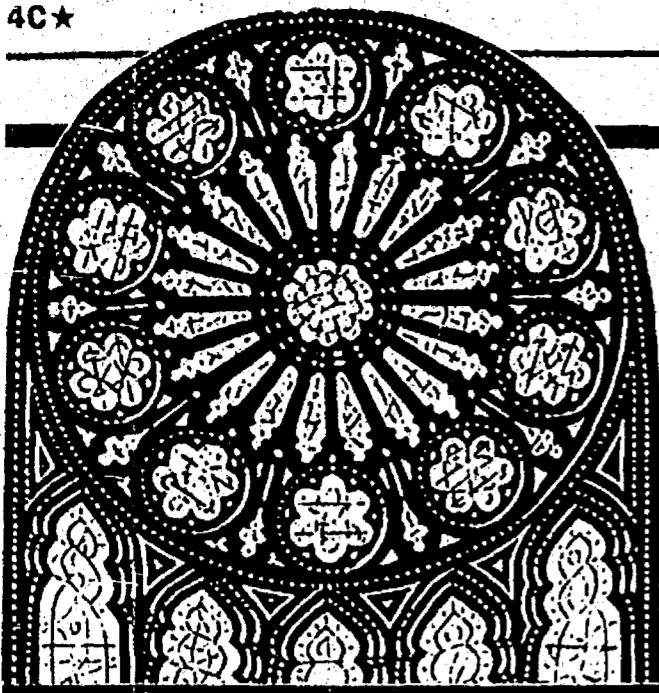

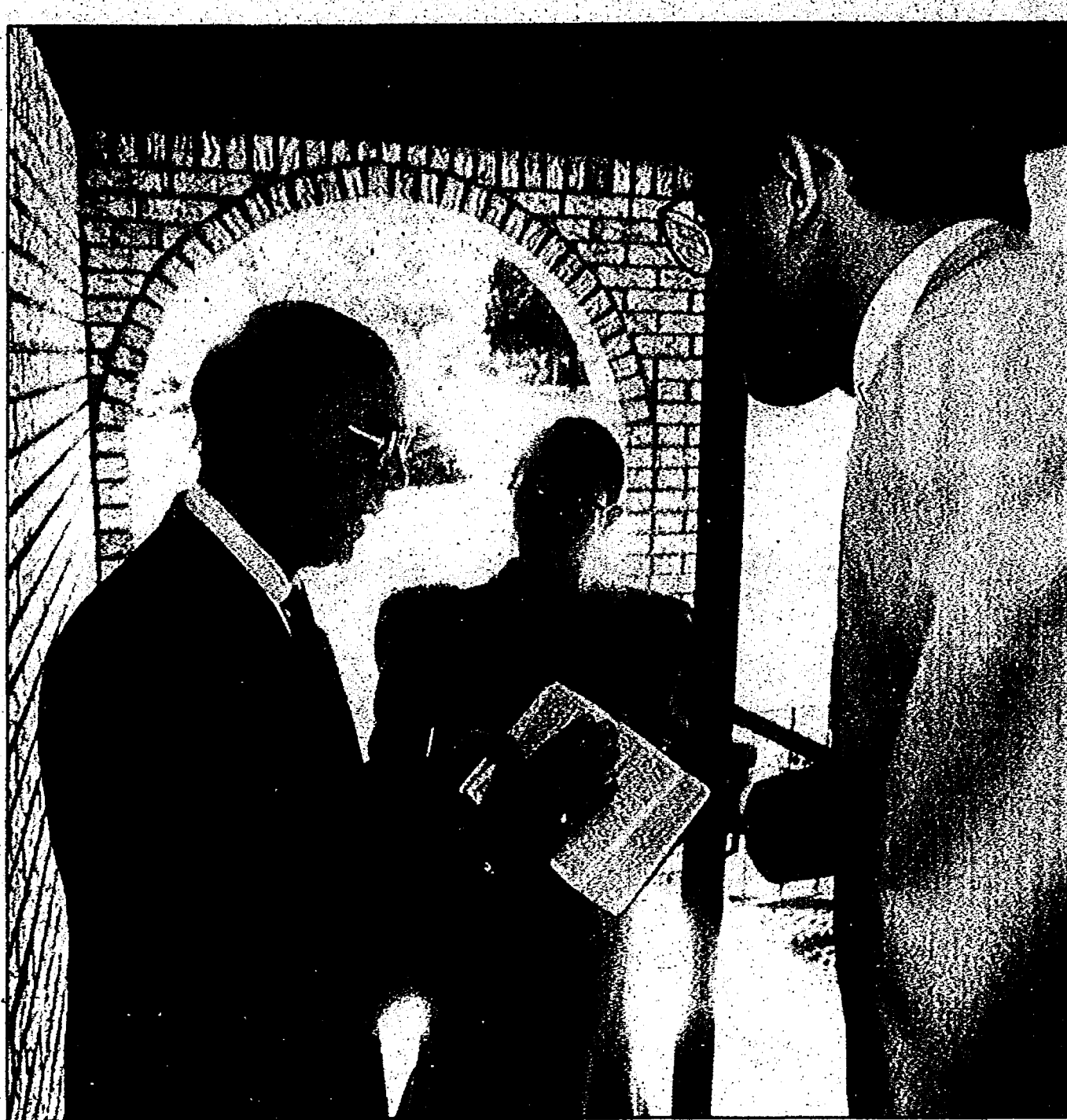

# Taking God's word door-to-door

When door-to-door salespeople are bluntly told "we're not interested," they probably avoid returning to that house.

But Jehovah's Witnesses are not dissuaded by a polite "no thanks," or even by a door in the face.

"A lot of people who aren't interested always wonder why we keep coming back to the door," said Lisa Barton, a Jehovah's Witness from Westland.

"We come back because the situation might have changed. Somebody might have died or somebody might have lost their job — that affects the way people respond," she said. Then there's another possibility. New people might live at the address.

Witnesses might even approach a house with a sign requesting that proselytizers stay away.

"I would probably knock on the door and ask if the sign is directed towards a particular religion," said Tom Kayfes, the presiding overseer of the Plymouth congregation.

Jehovah's Witnesses make up a religious order which derives its philosophy from biblical prophecies that the world will one day become a single kingdom ruled by God.

"God's kingdom is going to do away with all earthly kingdoms," said Ernie DeCarlo, an elder in the West Livonia congregation.

"Yes, there are some forms of government that are better than others but there are a lot of shortcomings."

### Bearing witness

According to DeCarlo, the Jehovah's Witnesses religion was formed in the 1890s in Pittsburgh. The world headquarters have since moved to Brooklyn, N.Y., and the membership has grown to about 4.5 million people worldwide, about two million of whom live in the United States.

Jehovah's Witnesses are forbidden from heavy-drinking, smoking, promiscuity and using profanity.

They participate in five meetings per week, which take place on three different days. Four of the meetings occur entirely in the Jehovah's Witnesses' place of worship, the Kingdom Hall. Members break into small groups for the fifth meeting.

None of the members of the order are paid, and all must participate in "door-to-door ministry," in which Jehovah's Witnesses at-

tempt to educate people about the Bible.

Although gaining converts is a possible long-term result of the visitations, Witnesses insist that their goals are purely educational.

"We don't solicit membership, but what we try to do is encourage people to learn about the Bible," said Glenn Wilson of the Garden City congregation.

"It's because we follow the acts of the apostles — they all went door-to-door."

### Some opposition

Witnesses frequently meet people who are unwilling to listen, and occasionally encounter outright opposition.

"Some of them are very abrupt and rude. All we can do is go to the next door," said Wilson.

Barton has even experienced physical confrontation though not while going door-to-door.

"Sometimes we'll (approach) people when they are coming out of the grocery store and they will intentionally hit us with their carts or their bags," she said.

Despite the opposition, Wit-

nesses report meeting a lot of willing listeners.

"You need to involve them in a conversation and find out what they think the (world's) problems are, and see if they think that man will be able to solve the problems or whether there will have to be divine intervention," said Kafes. "When you go with that kind of a message to the people, they are willing to talk."

Barton reports finding more attentive listeners in poorer neighborhoods than in wealthier ones.

"If you are working in an affluent town, some people may not be as interested because they already have what they need in life," she said. "They don't have to worry about violence, or drug dealers, or some of the other atrocities."

Although Witnesses are persistent in returning to houses, they say that they do not pressure people to listen to their message.

A Westland resident, who asked not to be identified and who has had numerous experiences with Witnesses knocking on her door, agreed. "I'd prefer they didn't keep coming back," she said. "They are very polite, they are not difficult, but they just do this."

According to local community representatives, Jehovah's Witnesses are allowed to go door-to-door as long as they are not soliciting money, and as long as they heed residents' requests to leave when asked.

# What's the truth about Columbus?

Five hundred years ago, Europeans discovered the American continents. Specialty shops are creating all kinds of items to commemorate this event in 1492. Books and articles are being written about Christopher Co-

lumbus. What is our moral perspective upon all of this?

As children, we learned about Columbus. He was a man of adventure. He was the one, we were told, who made it possible for us to be here in this land of opportunity and plenty. Only now is the whole truth being revealed.

In reality, it was a very nasty business. Today's parallel would be a story of space invaders who came to this planet and said "We have arrived. Everything belongs to us, including all you earth beings. The laws of our empire allow us to do anything we wish with you on the planet earth."

Let's face it, 1492 was a business venture. It was also a desire for em-

pire. The two went together. Money was invested in Columbus' voyage and the investors expected a large return.

Gold and silver were discovered among the peoples of the Americas. Soon African slaves were brought from Spain and north Africa to work in the mines. This was especially significant because Africans were resistant to several fatal diseases of European origin. These diseases, such as smallpox, killed a majority of the native peoples of the Americas.

As we know, slaves of color were brought to the sugar industry, and later to cotton production. The Portuguese, Spanish and English were the main benefactors of the slave trade. According to one account, the profit was often more than 100 percent on each trip of the slave ships.

The state churches paid no attention to this evil. First Quakers and then Mennonites opposed slavery. One hundred years later, in 1780, American Methodists opposed all forms of slavery as "contrary to the laws of God, of man, and of nature." John Wesley's anti-slavery manifesto of 1774, "Thoughts Upon Slavery," was inspired by a Quaker, Anthony Benezet.

What is our moral perspective upon the 500th anniversary of Columbus' arrival in the Americas? We must reflect upon this terrible chapter in our history. It is a story of slavery extending from 1500 until the 1830s and 1860s. We must ask ourselves what is the continued impact of this long and terrible history upon our society? What is its impact upon the lives of Native Americans and blacks? Asking this question connects us with the current struggles we see among blacks and Native Americans in our society.

We must speak the truth about 1492 and the agony that followed. We must be thankful for those who in the past and in the present speak and act on behalf of those who experience this injustice.

Today there are persons who would claim high office in our na-

tion. They speak in high moral tones. Yet morality has no truth unless it addresses the contradictions of economics and justice. We must seek this truth in our leaders.

Observing the awful results of slavery, John Wesley stated "Better no trade than trade procured by villainy. It is far better to have no wealth than to gain wealth at the expense of virtue. Better is honest poverty, than all the riches bought by the tears, and sweat, and blood of our fellow creatures." This must be the truth today.

We must listen to the struggles of our brothers and sisters who are still seen as secondary to economics. They still live out the sad results of the Europeans who claimed to own the lands and peoples of the Americas.

The celebration of 1492 will be a sham unless there is a sensitive, critical reflection upon justice and the sins of the past. Above all, we must not trust those who would want to make our society an economic machine, disrobed of its moral justice and mercy.

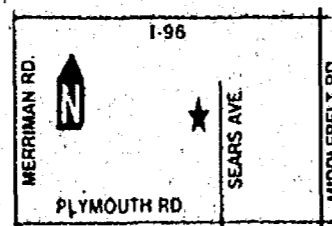

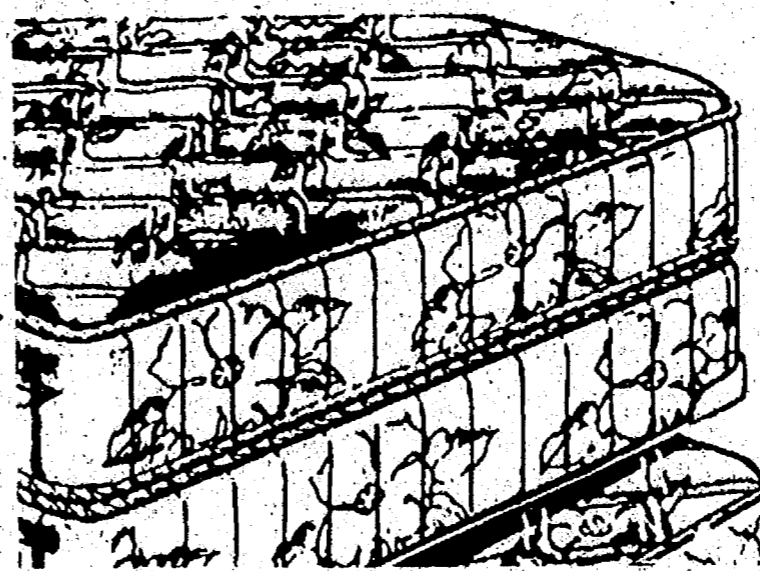

## He finds new career doing scenic artistry

**H**e never met star Jack Nicholson. But no matter. Livonia artist David Messing relished the scenic art he did over eight weeks during Detroit filming for the Danny DeVito flick, "Hoffa."

A fine artist and sculptor for 25 years, Messing teamed with Aaron Dytniak of Wayne about a year ago in a new venture: scenic art. They create sets for fashion shows, art shows, special exhibits and TV commercials. "Hoffa" was their first movie.

"Scenic art's a lot of fun. It's real creative," says Messing, who owns and teaches at Art Store & More in the Pierson Professional Center on Seven Mile.

For example, scenic artists buy inexpensive wood, then paint it to look like walnut. To age fake brick, they dirty it. To age a warehouse door, they add rust stains. To age fresh paint, they work in cracks.

Much of what Messing and Dytniak did in "Hoffa" involved making objects look older so they reflect a desired time period.

Messing headed a crew of artists that helped create two key sets: the U.S. Senate chamber in the Detroit Public Library and the Hoffa residence in Indian Village, both 1930s vintage.

In Indian Village, the crew focused on four rooms in a large, old house — wood-graining the stairways, archways and hearth as well as furniture bought at the Salvation Army. "We had to make things look a deep, rich cherry wood," Messing said.

The crew made fake leaded windows by staining rope caulking on regular glass.

Outside, Messing said, they "dressed or dirtied up anything that might otherwise look funny on camera."

Just before filming, the powers that be decided to give the fake blacktop driveway, created from painted plywood laid over the lawn, a cement look. "We basically had one hour to match the tones on the nearby cement walk," Messing said, "but we managed to pull it off."

### Crowning moment

Messing was proudest of the recreated U.S. Senate chamber on the third floor of the Detroit Public Library. Commercial artist Dino Polisena of Utica provided a big boost.

In the hallway, Messing's crew painted masonite panels to look like marble, then stapled them over the archways and wall murals. They wood-grained the two huge doors leading to the chamber to look like aged oak.

Inside the chamber, sculptor David Kozlowski of Redford Township plastered over the archways and wall murals and scored joint seams on the plaster. Scenic artists stained the plaster to look like the existing limestone and marble walls.

"Matching the limestone and marble was very difficult," Messing said. "But during teardown, the workers had a hard time finding the fake walls from the real walls. I found that a real compliment."

Scenic artists also helped design the Senate chair. "We carved two big eagles out of Styrofoam, attached them at either end and wood-grained them to look like dark cherry wood," Messing said.

Along the side of the chair, they scrolled ornate leaf patterns. In the middle, they attached a big, wood-strained Styrofoam crest.

### Met Danny DeVito

Watch for "Hoffa" next winter. Messing said he saw a lot of Danny DeVito "checking out the sets before the camera rolled. But we never saw Jack Nicholson because we were always working a scene ahead of him."

Messing likes movies, but he's more into commercials — designing backgrounds, making props, creating special effects.

"In commercials, you paint just what the camera will see," he said. "But in movies, you paint everything because you don't know until he gets there if the director will change the scene."

In May, Messing and Dytniak considered an offer from Disney's Fall Line Productions to do scenic art for the new movie, "Aspen." But they were working on an Elias Brothers Big Boy commercial so had to say no.

Says Messing: "I was glad they approached us. I can't believe we turned down Disney!"

Meanwhile, the Detroit Historical Museum has hired the duo to do background scenes and set aging for a major new exhibit, "Outpost Industry," tracing industry development in Detroit since 1701. "A lot of stuff I do gets destroyed within days of filming," Messing said. "This is a 10-year display so we'll have something up a long, long time."

Messing still enjoys teaching at Art Store & More, but scenic art definitely has captured his fancy. "I'm the happiest I've ever been," he said. "There's plenty of work. It's never boring. I'm just having a ball."

### CLASSY CAR

If you like classic cars, stop by the Plymouth Historical Museum to see the Alter Motor Car. More than 1,000 Alters were made in 1916 and 1918 in the Alter Motor Car Co. factory on Farmer Street in Plymouth, but few have surfaced over the years.

The 20-hp 1916 model that's on display boasts four cylinders and got 20 miles to the gallon. At the peak of production in 1916, the company

employed 100 men and produced 25 cars per week. The 1916 model sold for \$865, had a 27-hp motor, a 12-gallon fuel tank under the cowl and a wheelbase of 108 inches.

"It had the classy look and finish of the higher-priced cars," according to The Plymouth Mail on March 3, 1916.

Clarence Alter of Manitowoc, Wis., designed the sleek car, made of component parts shipped here by rail and assembled at the factory. Success was short-lived. By 1917, the company had gone into receivership.

The Plymouth Historical Museum is at 155 S. Main in downtown Plymouth.

Moore has worked as a technician for Michigan Bell 28 years. She paints to relax. "When I paint, time just stops totally. I'm having fun with it and that's what it's all about."

After working in oil for 15 years, Moore switched to watercolor four years ago. "I like the softness, the transparency of watercolor. I like how they merge when you put the pink next to the blue," Moore said.

"With watercolor, there's always surprises. You never know what's going to happen."

During the last 19 years, Moore has taken adult education classes in art and studied with Farmington Hills watercolorists Edee Joppich and Nita Engles.

"My morning glories, even though they're real, it's fantasy. I don't want them to be photographic. In art, you can be just as factual as you want or as imaginary as you like," Moore said.

Greenmead Historical Village, Saturday, June 27. Proceeds will be earmarked for the Alexander Blue House restoration.

From 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, ticket holders will be treated to Dr. Hardie's woodland sights and sounds along with six other gardens in Livonia, including the gardens at Greenmead.

Grounds of pink, white and red impatiens in Dr. Hardie's garden add color to the miniature forest, more than two decades in the making.

"It's an evolving design. In the last 22 years, I've re-landscaped it three or four times," said Dr. Hardie, principal of Dearborn's Snow Elementary. "I'm trying to pattern it after a forest, so there's different sizes of trees at various stages of development."

Dr. Hardie worked 2 1/2 days this spring planting 65 flats of annuals and half a dozen pink and white dogwood trees. Annuals compose 2/3 of the garden, perennials 1/3.

"It's a tamed wilderness because it's a combination of woods and suburban garden — a mixture of evergreens, annuals, wildflowers, red bud, ferns as well as perennials," Dr. Hardie said.

At the entrance, a cement rabbit greets guests to the forest in the city. The focal point, a solitary red Japanese maple, accents the green-blue spruce drawing the visitors attention.

"It's nice at 5 a.m. in the morning," Dr. Hardie said. "There's a lot of birds and a decoy in the pool on occasion attracts wild ducks."

Goldfish swim in a pond built by Dr. Hardie. A smaller pool above it provides a spring-like waterfall into the pond. "I've had lake fish, blue gills and minnows swimming in there," he said.

"I'm trying to move toward a Victorian look with the goldfish pond, Victorian lamp post and lattice railing."

The forest is constantly evolving. In April, dirt was trucked in to create a hillside covered with flowers and rocks.

"He changes it all the time. The neighbors say they know it's spring when they see the truck hauling dirt down the street," said Lois Hardy, a second grade teacher at Howard Elementary in Dearborn.

Pots of pink impatiens, Lois' handiwork, hang from the gazebo's framework. Lois planted all of the pots and redwood boxes

gracing the deck and gazebo.

"We eat breakfast out here a lot; it's so peaceful. It gives me an on-vacation feeling like I'm away but I'm still home," Lois said.

Snow-on-the-Mountain, Pachysandra and Vinca Vines cover the grounds alongside woodland favorites like May Apples, Trillium and Jack-in-the-Pulpit.

"Once it's all growing after the end of June, there's very little maintenance because the plants are very thick," Dr. Hardie said.

Six of the seven gardens on the walk are new this summer.

Highlights include a weeping Siberian pea tree, herb and vegetable gardens, roses and old-fashioned hollyhocks, cantebury bells, foxglove, lupine, honeysuckle, hibiscus, a dahlia garden, terraced gardens on Bell Creek, decks, gazebos, fish ponds and fountains.

"A lot of people go on the walk to get ideas for their gardens," said Jan Bennett, Friends of Greenmead president.

Rudy Fedus' rock gardens will delight visitors again with more than 100 ornamental trees, 40 varieties of lilac, 35 different hosta and many varieties of iris and daylily as well as exotic plants.

Fedus is a volunteer gardener at Greenmead where he created the formal herb garden. He also gardened at Cranbrook 17 years. "Rudy is just a perennial. He has plants from all over the world," Bennett said. "He's so knowledgeable about plants. If people want to know about botany or the Latin name of a plant, they just have to ask Rudy."

Last year, 700 tickets were sold for the garden walk. Proceeds from the sales were used to buy a new furnace and make other improvements at the Alexander Blue House.

The 142-year-old Blue House was once home to a Livonia civic leader and is Greenmead's only example of Italianate architecture. The Livonia Historical Society hopes to see the Blue House used not only as a conference and meeting center but also a reception hall for Newburg Church at Greenmead.

Garden tour tickets are available at Greenmead's Cranston-Hinbern House, Eight and Newburgh; Livonia City Hall Community Resources Department, Farmington Road and Five Mile; and all Livonia libraries. Tickets are \$5 in advance. They will sell for \$8 at Greenmead only the day of the walk.

# Self-timers save portraits

## FOCUS ON PHOTOGRAPHY

Did you get back from Yosemite last summer only to discover that the friendly stranger who shot you and your spouse in front of Yosemite Falls "chopped off" your heads and the falls are tumbling at a hard-to-believe 45-degree angle?

Or did you just return from Europe to find that your tour guide had the jitters and all of the pictures he took of the two of you in front of the famous landmarks are blurry?

There's a lesson to be learned here. You can't always trust that eager-to-help stranger or your tour guide to get the shots you want.

Solution: Take the pictures your-

self by using your camera's self-timer.

You'll need a tripod or solid ledge to do the trick. Just mount your camera on the tripod or set it firmly on a ledge or wall. Place your spouse in the viewfinder and allow your spouse in the picture for yourself. If you're tall, give plenty of room at the top so that you don't "lose your head" when you see the final results.

As in all good photography, check your backgrounds to include subjects you want and to eliminate things you don't.

If the distant mountain makes a fine backdrop, make sure your aperture is small enough to capture it in the depth-of-field. Or if you want to zero in on just the two of you, use a wide aperture to blur an unwanted background.

Once your exposure and composition are set, you're ready to go. Set your self-timer, trip the shutter and start moving into position. You'll

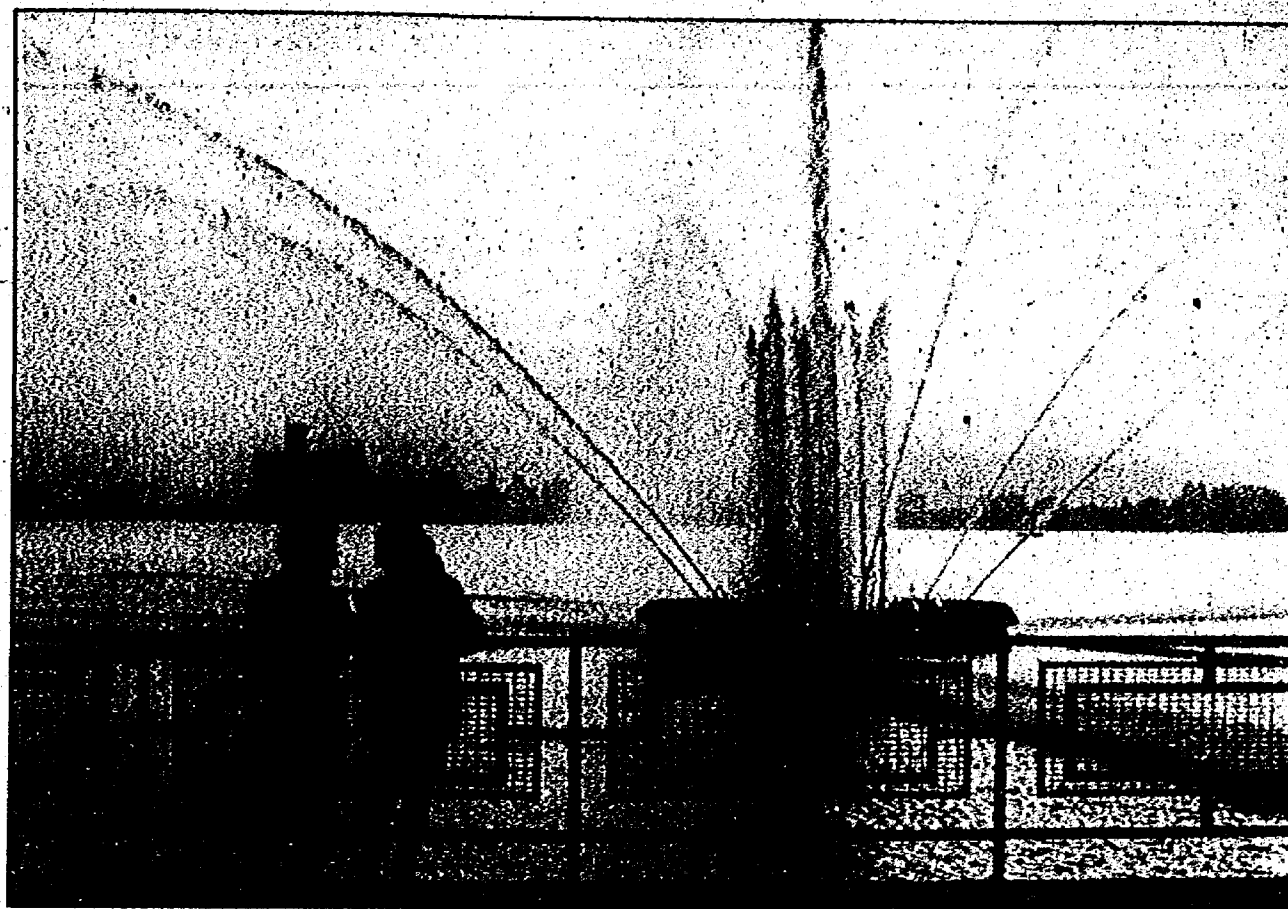
usually have 10 seconds to get yourself situated. Count down the seconds silently so you'll know just when to spread that smile across your face. You'll hear and see the shutter trip so you'll know when the shot is over.

Another use for a camera's self-timer is when you forget to bring your cable release for that scenic picture you're steadying on a tripod. The self-timer will assure a sharp, crisp picture.

Also, many new cameras don't have provisions for a cable release. Here, again, your self-timer will get you the shot.

Don't always trust your photography to the potential errors of a stranger or to a camera that may not have a cable release. Proper use of your camera's self-timer will guarantee you'll bring home the photographs you want.

# Travel, history influence French cubist's palette

The influences in Marcel Mouly's paintings are geographic and historic.

Geographic in that the artist's travels around the world inspire his colors. Historic in that he was born

in Paris in 1918, when the artistic masters of the 20th century were living there. Picasso, Matisse and Braque were among those who inspired Mouly.

Works by Mouly, one of France's most important living cubist painters, are exhibited at Park West Gal-

lery, 29469 Northwestern Highway in Southfield, through Saturday, June 27.

The show features 52 paintings and 39 hand-signed lithographs, including two paintings previously shown at an invitational, "The Salon of Comparisons," that took place at the Grand Palace of Paris in January. It is the largest and most comprehensive exhibition of his work in North America.

"I am influenced by all the masters who have painted before me," Mouly said at Park West, speaking through an interpreter.

In his art, Mouly features the vivid, powerful and exaggerated colors of fauvism, as well as the geometric and angular architectural structure of cubism. His paintings show flat planes of color, and wide and thin colored lines, arranged so they overlap and jostle each other on the canvas.

Mouly is a traditional painter but looks toward the future, he said. He adds his own touches. His think

outlines and even the subjects themselves — a stringed instrument, fruit — look like the work of Picasso, but Mouly's glowing colors are his own signature. Sometimes, as in his sea scenes, Mouly makes images out of broad strokes of color. This can intensify the action, or bathe objects in a still scene in tinted light.

"I like the vibrancy and life. He's so full of life. His vibrancy shows in everything," said the gallery's Pepper Whitelaw.

Mouly's subjects vary, from an arrangement on a table, to a house in a forest, to boats at a dock, to a boat riding waves.

"I like to go from one subject to another. My art works out better in the big paintings. The small paintings prepare me for the bigger ones."

Mouly has traveled extensively in foreign lands, including Morocco, India, Africa and China. A journey can result in different colors, depending on his feelings when he

travels and the different light.

"The country itself influences the future paintings."

Different colors came out of Mouly's trips to the United States, to New York and Las Vegas as well as to Southfield in the fall.

"When a painter travels, it comes into his focus. A painter takes in everything."

Mouly enjoys visiting the United States. When he was in Southfield for the opening of his exhibition recently, he said he planned to see all the museums.

"I'm very happy with the enthusiasm of the American public. They appreciate my paintings."

Inspiration and work are easy for Mouly.

"I don't see life without painting. It comes easily, without effort."

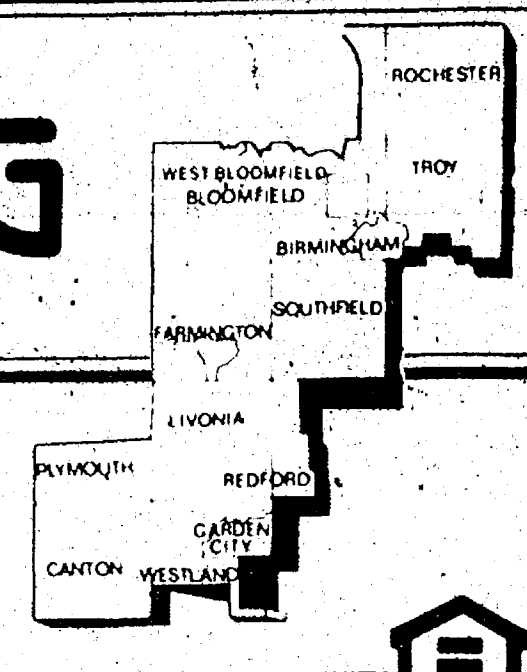

Down payment biggest obstacle to home ownership

(AP) — For many Americans, owning their own home is so important they'd commute an extra hour a day. Or take a second job. Or even put off retirement.

By a 3-1 margin, Americans would rather own a home than rent 10 years early, according to a survey conducted by the Federal National Mortgage Association, or Fannie Mae.

By a 4-1 margin they would rather own a home some distance from work than rent within easy commuting distance.

By a 4-1 margin they would rather own a home than take a bet-

ter job in a city in which they could afford only to rent, the poll found. And, by a greater than 2-1 margin, they believe owning a home is worth taking a second job, if that's what's necessary.

Still, the Census Bureau says Americans were less likely to own a home at the end of the 1980s than they were a decade ago. A study shows 63.9 percent of households owned their homes in 1989, down from 65.6 percent in 1980.

The Fannie Mae survey found the biggest barrier to home ownership is affordable housing. Seven out of eight respondents identified affor-

ability as a serious problem. In fact, the survey added, by a 3-1 margin they identify it as one of the two or three most serious problems facing the United States.

The major stumbling block is the inability to make the down payment and pay the closing costs, the survey showed. And that stumbling block was higher for minorities than for whites.

While 47 percent of whites identify having enough to make the down payment and closing costs as a major impediment, that figure is 66 for blacks and 59 percent for Hispanics," the survey found.

Respondents said income, credit worthiness and job security were other barriers to home ownership.

The Census Bureau said that the median mortgage in 1990 was \$737 a month, up 26.9 percent from 1980, when adjusted for inflation. At the same time, the median household income totaled \$30,056 a year in 1989, down 18.5 percent from a decade earlier.

The median means that half of the mortgages cost more and half less, or that half of the households earned more and half less.

Despite the overwhelming desire to own a home, the Fannie Mae sur-

vey showed there were some risks that most Americans would not take.

By a 4-1 margin, Americans say it is not worth it to financially overextend themselves to own a home," it found. Only one in three thought it was worth it to place a young child in day care so the mother could work, even if this was a necessary step to become a homeowner.

The more unlikely a person was to have sufficient funds, the greater the desire for home ownership, the survey showed.

While owning your own home was considered one of their most

important long-term goals by 60 percent of those in the lowest income brackets, it was declared as such by only 31 percent of those in the highest," it said.

Blacks are more willing than either whites or Hispanics to make certain major concessions to become homeowners," it found. They are more prepared to take a second job or put a young child in day care, if that's what it takes.

The survey showed that 80 percent of Americans identify the traditional single-family detached home with a yard as the ideal place to live.

Uncooperative boater undermines board

We have a co-owner in our dockominium who always parks his boat in the wrong dock. We have written him various letters but can't seem to get his cooperation. The restrictions give us various remedies, but the board is reluctant to do anything because we are "weekend friends." What do you suggest?

If you have a professional management company, have the management company write a letter, presumably in accordance with the bylaw enforcement policy, which the association has implemented, with respect to this violation. Have the management company advise the co-owner that he is not only violating the documents, but infringing upon the rights of his neighbors, which can only create ill will for him and the rest of the community.

Advise him of the association's legal remedies and remind him that the association will turn the matter over to legal counsel should that be-

come necessary. If you do not have a management company, either have the board sign the letter or run it over to your attorney immediately. You should not allow this co-owner to continue to impinge upon the rights of other co-owners because it will undermine the ability of the board to effectively administer the condominium project.

We just bought a home that was inspected by FHA and have found a number of electrical and other problems. Do we have any recourse?

You may have recourse against the seller, the real estate agent and

the FHA inspector, depending on who it was. In the event that these defects were known or should have been known by the seller or were covered up, I would suggest that you contact an attorney to advise you of your rights.

Refinancing trims late house payments

(AP) — The percentage of Americans falling behind in their mortgage payments fell from January through March for the third straight quarter as homeowners found more jobs and income and lower interest rates, according to a new survey.

The Mortgage Bankers Association of America said that the proportion of homeowners at least 30 days late on their pay-

ments was a seasonally adjusted 4.52 percent in the first quarter, down from 4.78 percent in the final three months of 1991.

The decline resulted from an improved "job and income picture," and to the incredible refinancing boom and lower adjustable mortgage rates that pushed monthly payments down, said Warren Lasko, executive vice president of the association.

## Check every single detail, victim urges

**W**e've all heard the horror stories. Dr. Leonard Martin has lived one. In 1985, he and his wife, Dr. Ruth S. Martin, contracted to have a home built in suburban Cleveland, Ohio. More than a year later, the two moved in. That's when the trouble began.

Their story was related in the book he researched and co-authored with his wife, "And They Built A Crooked House."

Problems resulted in a lawsuit that wasn't heard until October 1988. The judgment? The court ordered the builder to buy the home back for the price the couple paid — a rare phenomenon, he said.

That was the good news. The bad news was twofold; the price paid for the home could no longer buy a similar home in a market where housing prices had climbed, meaning they would have had to buy a smaller house; and legal fees rose above \$100,000.

The response to their book has been an eye opener, Martin said — so much so they are writing a second book "Crumbling Dreams: What You Must Know Before Building or Buying a New House or Condo."

"Ours is not a unique experience," Leonard Martin said, adding that he and his wife have become a veritable clearing house for home-buying horror stories from all over the country.

That led them to review protections for home buyers. They found that although the house buyer is afforded the normal protections of contract law, with the exception of North Carolina, protections specifically for homebuyers do not exist.

In the new book, the Martins explain ways for home buyers to protect themselves. It begins with the cautionary preamble, "Unless you protect yourself ahead of time you can only lose if your house is built defectively."

In brief, those rules are:

- Check out everyone: builder, developer, architect. Inspect, don't look at, other houses and property developed, built, or designed by anyone involved in your proposed construction. Talk to people living in the houses. If the builder balks, walk.
- Make sure they are insured; they are anyone who signs a contract — the builder, architect or developer. The insurance should cover defects after the house buyer moves in.
- Hire a good real estate lawyer and inform him or her you want to be fully protected from the worst: totally defective construction.
- Insist on the tightest contract feasible for your circumstances. Every contract should be written as if you will end up in court. Never accept a standard contract offered by the builder. Include a statement involving financial solvency signers. Make the title transfer contingent on satisfactory and independent review by an architect and/or engineer hired by you.

## Monster digs haunt buyers



The great majority of purchasers are delighted with their new houses. Occasionally, however, problems develop and battles rage between owners and builders. It may surprise people to learn that builders are just as concerned about shoddy building as house buyers.

The American dream shattered. Owning a house. People spend their lives saving money, planning, and dreaming about the day they can afford a new house.

Thousands of people every year buy houses and find their happily ever afters.

But sometimes, something goes wrong.

Buyers do all the right things. When they walk into that new house, it's not the American dream, but a nightmare.

Problems arise. Sometimes large problems, sometimes small — but, then, all problems are large if you've invested your life savings into a house that's poorly built.

A cursory glance at disciplinary reports of the state board of licensing and regulation, a division of the Michigan Department of Commerce, shows that there are a lot of unhappy buyers out there.

Royce Wills, acting director of enforcement for the department, said complaints against builders far outnumber complaints against other professionals. "We (investigators) will

carry upwards of 500 open complaints a year — half of them are against builders."

The state board of licensing and regulation investigates complaints against builders and other professionals who are licensed by the state. Valid complaints can result in fines, restitution orders and even the revocation of a builder's license.

Builders are quick to point out that despite the horror stories that people hear, the number of houses that are defective compared to the number of houses built is actually very small.

Which isn't to say that even good builders with good reputations won't have problems. Any number of things can go wrong with a project as complicated as building a house.

Mike Garfalo, a partner at Cornerstone Building Inc. in Novi, said it's an inescapable fact of life that people make mistakes.

"In an imperfect world, you are going to have problems," Garfalo said. "If he comes back and fixes the house, then he's a stand-up guy and a good businessman."

Most builders, he said, are good people who are genuinely concerned about doing a good job. "What's im-



portant is that the builder returns to fix any problems."

Every builder has had his share of problems, and most people have heard stories about houses with serious problems, he said.

Building a house is a complex task. There are hundreds of things that can go wrong with a house, he said.

"It's not always that clear cut," Garfalo said. "We are a product of our subcontractors."

By that, Garfalo means that sometimes the people hired by the builder — or even the people hired by the people hired by the builder — are the underlying cause of many problems.

Garfalo said he advises patience and practicality. He has had buyers complain about things they requested, but later decided they didn't like, and then blamed it on the builder.

## Recourse available through state board

People who have bought a defective house can bypass the courtroom to get justice. The state board of licensing and regulation, a division of the Michigan Department of Commerce, can sometimes assist an unhappy buyer.

The procedure for filing a complaint is fairly straightforward, said Royce Wills, acting director of enforcement for the department.

### COMPLAINTS

First, the home must have been built in the last 18 months and it must have been built by a licensed builder. Call 1-517-373-0678 to verify that a builder is licensed.

The 18-month limit is necessary to determine that for which a builder is responsible and what is wear and tear created by the owner.

The licensing requirement is necessary because revoking a builder's license is the state's biggest hammer.

After determining licensing and the structure's age, Wills said, a homeowner needs to call the local municipal building department for a complaint form and a building inspection report, and fill them out.

The state requires a building official report to verify a complaint, he said.

"Then we'll ask for a copy of closing statement, building contract, (and other

relevant documentation like the owner's pre-walk through punch list) — these reports are helpful in determining what the builder promised to provide and what he didn't," Wills said.

The homeowner, he continued, must do most of the leg work because the state lacks sufficient staff to investigate complaints.

Once all the documents have been collected, the complaint can take one of two courses — mediation or a hearing before the builders board of the licensing and regulation department.

Mediation is the preferred course because it's quicker and has been found to work better, Wills said. "If a case is mediated, it could be resolved in 30 to 60 days."

Getting the builder and homeowner together with a professional mediator is successful because a third, neutral person can objectively view all the circumstances of a case and help resolve any conflicts, Wills said.

The department has actually used mediation for many years, he said, but the practice had dropped off until four years ago. Mediation cases have increased because cuts in state government have slowed the processing of complaints.

If mediation fails — or if the parties elect not to pursue mediation — the builder will be formally charged. "Then we're in for the long haul — it can take up to two years," Wills said.

At this point the builder has several options:

- A settlement conference in which the builder attempts to resolve the matter with a licensing department investigator.

- A compliance conference in which the builder tries to convince an investigator that no violation exists.

- A formal hearing before an admin-

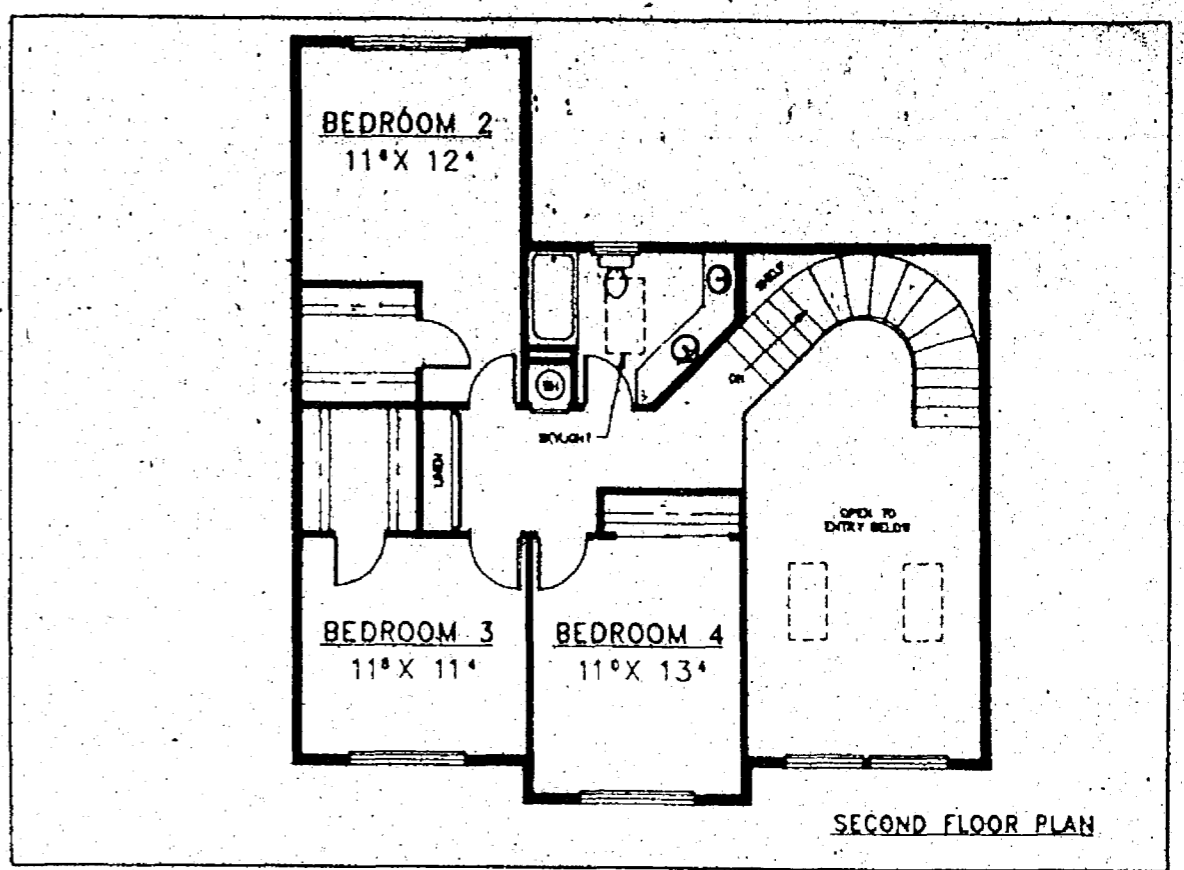
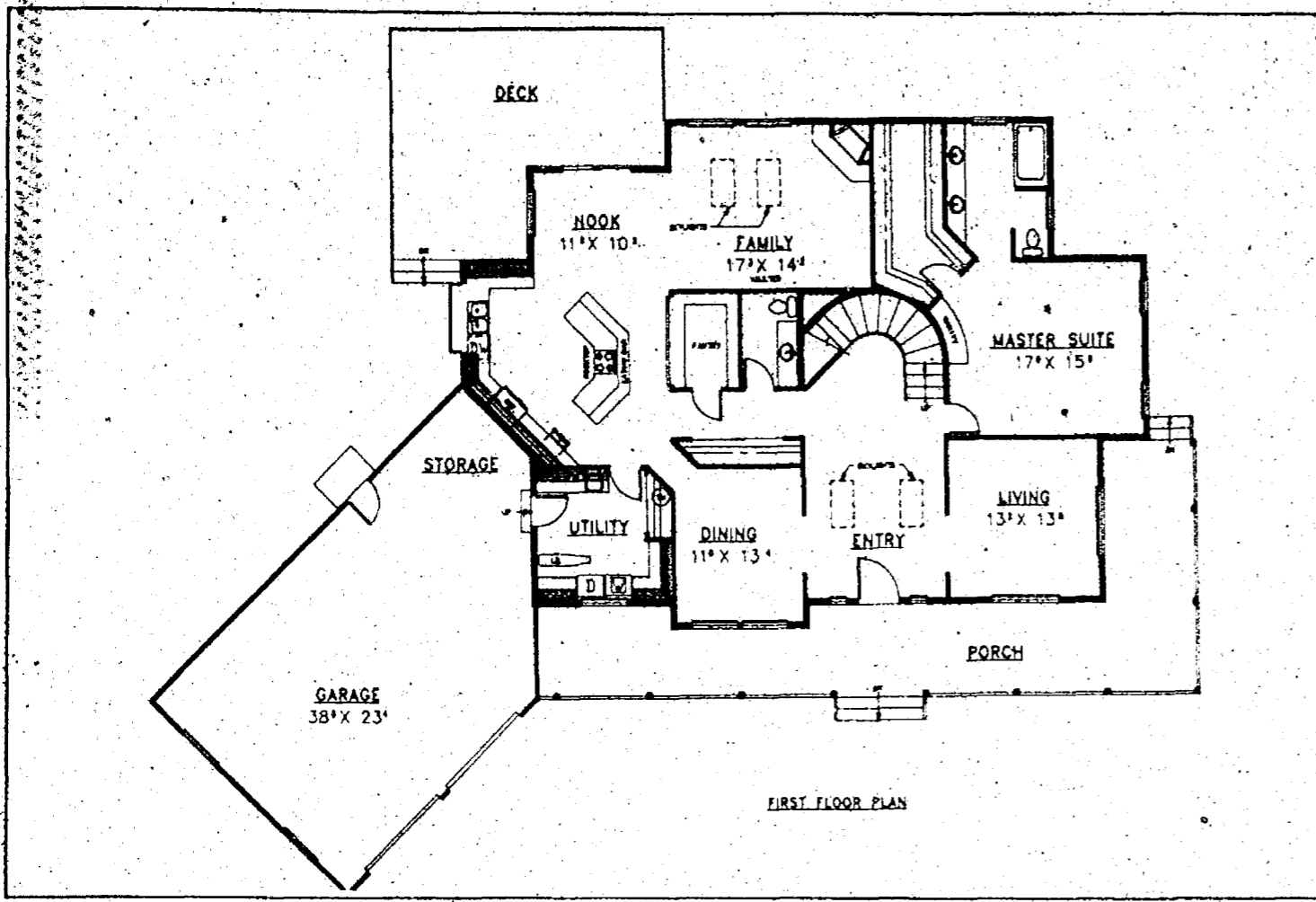

# House belies appearances

From outside, the Duchess looks like a basic country-style home, a little on the large side. But a closer look at the exterior, and a glance inside the lofty skylit foyer, tells you that this is no old-fashioned farmhouse.

The wrap-around front porch is country, but the wide custom door isn't. It's flanked by sidelights and crowned on the second floor level by a huge half-round window.

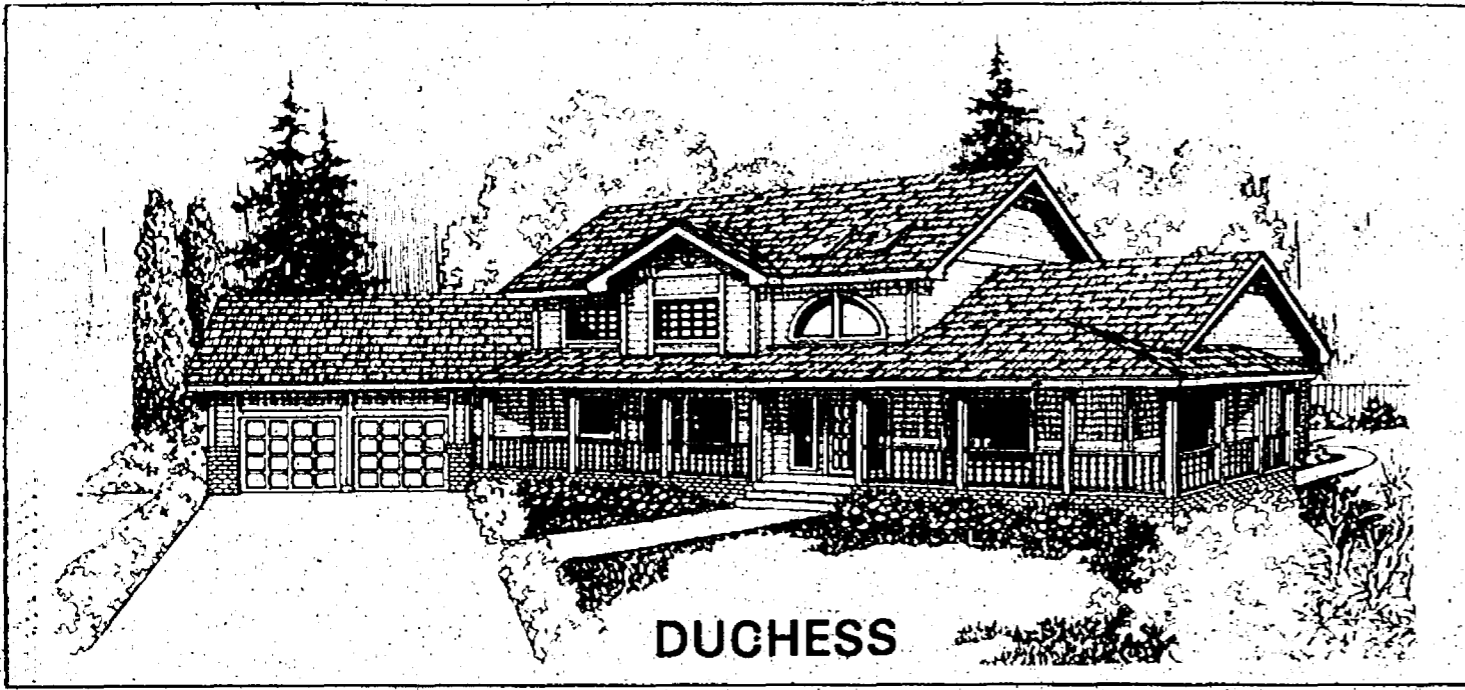

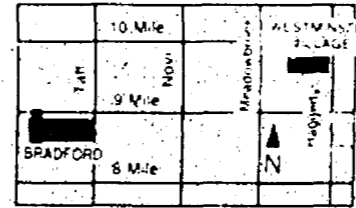

"Unless you practice a little reality, you are never going to be satisfied," he said.

He once had a customer who was upset about the flashing on the house's roof at the skylights. "The (the skylights) were 100 percent right. There were no deficiencies (in workmanship, materials or design)."

In that case, there are only two options — live with the flashing or forget the skylights, he said. The customer would accept neither op-

tion. Garfalo suggested that people who have questions should seek a second opinion if they are unhappy or have concerns.

Garfalo said he doesn't want to imply that all builders are good builders — indeed, some builders may even be bad builders.

"It's incumbent upon the home-builder (the customer) to make sure the builder is qualified to build a home," he said.

Is the builder well-established?

Does he have a place of business? Does he have a track record? A license? These are all questions the buyer should ask.

"I tell everyone who buys a home from me to take the contract to an attorney before they sign it," he said.

Bernard Glibberman, president of the Builders Association of Southeastern Michigan, said it's not surprising that the number of lawsuits and complaints filed against builders is so high. Buying

a house, he said, is a very emotional issue.

If something goes wrong, people are naturally going to be upset about it, he said.

The key for any person who has a problem with a house, he said, is to remain calm.

Builders have systems in place to deal with construction problems. Pre-closing walk-throughs, follow-up visits, post-sale questionnaires — "we're asking people to be critical."

Above all, Glibberman said, try not to become hostile. He has had people come in screaming at the top of their lungs without even giving him a chance to fix any problems.

"If a person bought a bad house, the first thing they should do is send a letter explaining the problem," he said. With most builders, that's all it takes.

Too often, the first response of some people is to threaten a lawsuit — that leads to hostilities between

the builder and buyer, he said.

Glibberman said there's no need to threaten lawsuits or become hostile; a calm, businesslike letter should get the results the homeowner wishes.

"Lawsuits are the expensive way to go — I don't think suing someone is the best solution," he said. "I've always believed that two adults, when they sit down together in a calm manner — they can work out their problems."

Administrative law judge who will issue a report.

If the builder is still found to be at fault, a report from the law judge or investigator will be forwarded to the state Residential Builders and Maintenance and Alteration board — a commission made up of builders, building officials, state officials and regular people — who will render a judgment.

Judgment can result in dismis-

sing the complaint, fining the builder or ordering restitution to the complainant in the form of money, or suspending or revoking the builder's license.

Fines assessed against the builders can be as high as \$10,000; restitution orders have no limits.

J.W. Eiserman, discipline action coordinator with the department enforcement division, said most builders comply with the orders.

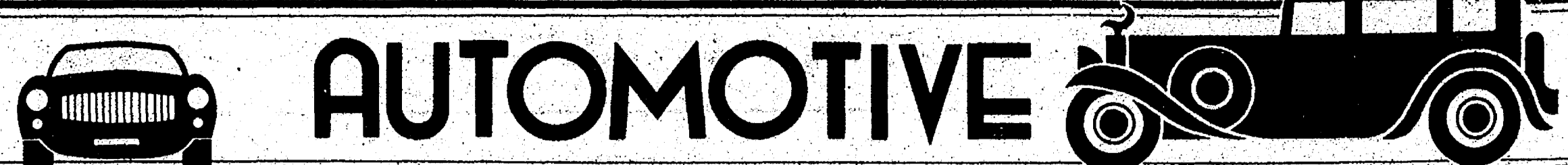

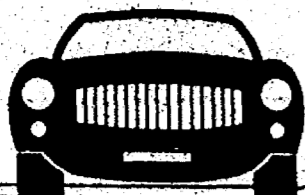

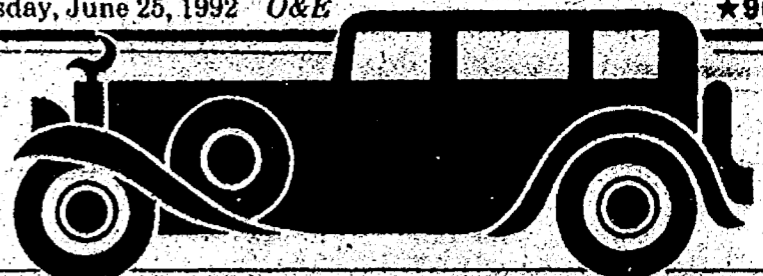
