Teacher pay issue holds up pact



The Wayne-Westland Education Association doesn't expect a salary raise settlement before teachers start the new school year next Monday. But union and school board negotiators are scheduled to meet three days this week in an effort to reach an agreement.

A union leader representing Wayne-Westland teachers is pessimistic about a possible pay raise settlement before school starts next week.

Negotiators remain at odds over a

salary increase, but they are expected to return to the bargaining table Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.

"We cannot report any progress," said Robert Kowalczyk, executive director for the 900-member Wayne-Westland Education Association. "I have

nothing positive to say."

Teachers are scheduled to report to work next Monday — one day before students return to class.

Barring a breakthrough in contract talks, the WWEA is expected to meet at 6:30 a.m. next Monday. But Kowalczyk refused to say whether the session might revolve around a possible strike.

"I have no comment," he said.

Kowalczyk denied rumors that union leaders have refused to budge from a salary increase of about 6 percent for

the current year, which marks the third year of a three-year contract.

"Your figures are incorrect," he said. Teachers received an 11.9-percent raise for the first two years of the contract, but third-year raises are to be negotiated. Insurance coverage for teacher legal fees also is being negotiated.

No bargaining sessions between WWEA leaders and school officials have been scheduled past Thursday.

Inkster man is charged in June rape

A 28-year-old Inkster man has been charged with raping a Westland woman June 22 in her Westchester Street home, northwest of Palmer and Henry Ruffroads.

Rodney Jerome Robinson, accused of breaking into the woman's home between 4 a.m. and 6 a.m. and raping her,

has been charged with three counts of first-degree criminal sexual conduct and one count of breaking and entering.

Westland police also are investigating whether Robinson may have raped two other women on nearby Birchwood

Street in the last 10 months, Sgt. Laura Moore said Thursday.

Police arrested Robinson following an investigation of a prowler at a Birchwood residence. His fingerprints matched those found in the woman's residence on Westchester, Moore said. The victim is in her 30s.

"We're convinced we have the right man," Moore said.

Robinson was arraigned on the charges Wednesday in 18th District Court. A plea of not guilty was entered on his behalf. He remained in the county jail Friday on a \$50,000 cash bond.

Robinson has been scheduled for an Aug. 27 preliminary examination to determine if he should stand trial in

2 Y staffers fired in aftermath of alleged assault

Three employees have been fired from the Wayne-Westland Family YMCA amid accusations that one of them assaulted a 3-year-old boy and

two others knew about the alleged incident but didn't report it.

The firings, stemming from an inter-

nal investigation by the YMCA of Metropolitan Detroit, were confirmed Friday by that organization's president, John Greenauer.

Early on, local Y officials, whose service area includes Garden City, had

said the incident resulted in employees being suspended with pay.

One of the workers, 44-year-old Cheryl Pence, will be tried in West-

Black panther sighted near court eludes police

Several employees of the Wayne County juvenile court building in south Westland reported seeing what they believed to be a black panther Thursday morning. Probation supervisor Wylene Jones said the animal roamed a field about 150 feet from the parking lot of the court — located on Henry Ruff Road near Michigan Avenue — and then disappeared into a nearby wooded area.

"It had to be a wild animal," she said. "The legs were too long, and it was way too big to be a domestic cat. Its tail was as long as its body. We are convinced it was a black panther."

Court workers, fearing the animal would wander into a residential area and possibly endanger someone, summoned Westland police after spotting the feline at about 10 a.m. Thursday. The animal wandered around for several minutes before it disappeared.

"It was just sitting there and then standing around for about 12 minutes," Jones said. "Then it just walked into the brush."

Westland police, assisted by Inkster and Wayne animal control officers, reported seeing what was described in a Westland police report as "a medium-size black domestic cat" that fled when officers tried to capture it. A search proved futile.

It wasn't immediately known if the animal seen by court workers was the same as the one seen by police.

Officers checked the grounds and storage buildings of the juvenile court, but couldn't find the animal.

"It was a beautiful, magnificent animal," Jones said. "But it was too big to be a domestic cat. It looked like something you would see in a zoo."

The feline appeared to be healthy, she

said. "It looked like it was well-fed."

During their search, animal control officers were armed with a loaded tranquilizer dart gun in case they needed to quickly subdue the animal. One officer was slightly injured when he pricked his finger with one of the darts.

Police and animal control officers were on the scene for about two hours, according to the police report. Police haven't received any subsequent reports about the animal.

land's 18th District Court on a charge of assault and battery, which carries a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail and a \$500 fine.

She was arrested amid accusations she slapped the 3-year-old boy, knocked him into a wall, grabbed him by the wrist and jerked him, Westland police Sgt. Laura Moore said.

The two other employees, who are not expected to be charged, knew of the alleged incident but didn't report it to Y officials, Greenauer said Friday.

They were fired, he said, because

"their job is to protect the children and report" any accusations of abuse.

"We can't take any chances here. That's what it comes down to," Greenauer said.

Y officials learned of the alleged assault on July 24, several days after it allegedly occurred.

The Y earlier had confirmed that two employees had been suspended. But Greenauer said Friday that three employees have now been fired.

"The YMCA's internal investigation disclosed that one of its day care employees had used a discipli-

nary technique that was inappropriate," he said in a prepared statement. "Two other day care employees were found to have failed to have properly abided by the YMCA policy and procedure guidelines related to child care."

"All three of these employees have been terminated," he added.

In court, a plea was entered for Pence when she was arraigned on Aug. 14. She remains free on a \$1,000 personal bond.

Greenauer said Friday the Y "will continue to take all steps necessary to maintain the high standards of its day care and other programs."

Detroit Recorder's Court. If convicted, he could face a maximum penalty of life in prison.

He has asked for a court-appointed attorney to represent him during the Aug. 27 hearing.

Robinson was arrested last Monday following a foot chase in Ink-

ster. Police had been searching for him after he was implicated in the prowling incident on Birchwood, Moore said.

"He was hiding from us," he said. "We're happy about the arrest."

Robinson's arrest could ease fears in the neighborhood where the Westchester Street woman and two

other women were raped, Moore said. The other rapes occurred in October, 1991, and on May 22.

Moore confirmed that Robinson "is being investigated" for those rapes, but she stressed that he has not been charged with committing them.

Man charged with indecent exposure

A Westland man has been charged with indecent exposure involving two 11-year-old girls.

Westland Police said the girls were lured to a man's apartment and shown pornographic movies and that the man masturbated in front of them.

On Friday, Richard Charles Quimby, a 34-year-old resident of Woodcrest Villa Apartments, was arraigned in Westland's 18th District Court on a high misdemeanor charge of indecent exposure, which carries a maximum penalty of one year in prison and a \$500 fine.

A plea of not guilty was entered on his behalf as he appeared before Judge C. Charles Bokos. He has been released from police custody after posting \$1,000, or 10 percent of a \$10,000 bond.

Because the charge is a mis-

demeanor, Quimby will be tried in district court. His trial has not yet been scheduled.

Quimby's arrest came after police received "numerous" telephone calls that a male resident at the apartment complex on Wayne Road, north of Cowan, had tried to lure children ages 8 to 11 into his apartment, Sgt. Laura Moore told the Observer.

All the children were believed to be girls, she said.

The two 11-year-olds had been brought to a man's apartment on several occasions in June, but one of their parents recently learned about the alleged incidents and notified the Westland Police Department, Moore said.

Police are hoping that any other children who may have been approached or lured to the apartment will come forward.

Police had heard word about acts


of indecent exposure for some time at Woodcrest Villa. But they hadn't been able to charge anyone until the parent came forward to make a formal complaint, Moore said.



Rep. Ford: Free trade pact is not a better idea

The proposed North American Free Trade Agreement will cost more jobs in southeast Michigan, U.S. Rep. William Ford, D-Ypsilanti Township, predicted at a suburban Rotary Club program Thursday.

He pointed out the problems of many companies shifting operations and jobs to a 60-mile-wide strip along the U.S.-Mexican border to improve profits.

An example is Ford Motor Co. shifting the production of its former Mercury Lynx model to Mexico where it now builds a more expensive model, called the Tracer. At the same time, the company continues to assemble its Escorts for a \$2,000-lower price tag at the Wayne plant on Michigan Ave. at Newburgh.

The shifting of jobs is to increase profits, not to hurt people, Ford said.

But he made it clear that he opposes the agreement that is designed to provide tariff-free products among the United States, Mexico and Canada.

"I cannot support any agreement which sanctions job flight south in pursuit of cheap labor and ignores the workers and communities left behind," he told the Westland Rotarians at its weekly luncheon meeting.

"I cannot support any agreement that doesn't include enforceable labor standards, health standards, environmental protection standards and public safety standards," said Ford, a 28-year House member seeking his 15th term Nov. 3.

There are 2,000 plants in the Maquiladora strip along the U.S.-Mexican border, with the

average wage of a worker being less than \$1 an hour with no union or pension rights, he said.

Typically, a worker in that area lives on a two-room shack without running water, electricity or car and has to work four days to buy a pair of blue jeans, he added.

That strip has 550,000 hourly workers, of which 75,000 work for auto companies, who have replaced people in the Midwest and

New England, said the congressman.

"I will do everything I can to oppose the (trade free) agreement," said Ford, adding that Gov. John Engler feels it will be good for Michigan.

Ford, whose district boundaries have changed under the redistricting required every 10 years, said he now has more auto plants under his district than any other in the House. There are 16 Ford plants and eight General Motors plants in his district, which includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, the Plymouth community, the southwest section of Livonia and stretches west to Ann Arbor.

On another economic issue, Ford said that economists have said that technically the country "is in a 'mild recovery,' but people here would have stoned me and thrown me out. They (people) just don't believe it."

Livonia schools lower drop-out rate

The Livonia school district is on track in its campaign to keep students in school and cut the dropout rate.

In the last school year, the district reported that its completion is up to 97.7 percent, up from 95.2 percent.

"Our goal is to reduce this (dropout) rate (of 2.3 percent) every year," said Superintendent Joseph Marinelli whose district serves the northern section of Westland.

"Is it possible to achieve 100 percent? That was hotly debated by the leadership team who put together our strategic plan.

"Some said we didn't have a low dropout rate to begin with, that we had gone about as far as we can go, and we should be honest and up front about that. They said the reality is that we won't get zero dropouts.

"Others said we should set high expectations, with the goal being no drop-outs and work each year toward it.

"We're obviously pleased that

we've reduced the rate. We're doing something in the schools to keep kids in school, and to make their education relevant."

At each grade level, the district has intensive programs in place geared toward keeping "at-risk" students in school.

"It's not just one strand, not one thing going on to make a difference," said Dean Schutz, coordinator of student services. "No one program makes a difference. They all work together to help 'at-risk' students."

In the three high schools, troubled students are helped through the student assistance program.

"We work with kids individually, in support groups and with parents, to deal with issues that are creating problems," Schutz said.

High schoolers who don't like the

traditional classroom setting also can attend the alternative "ALPHA" program, housed at Dickinson Center on Newburgh north of Six Mile, or the career center on Newburgh north of Joy.

An elective course, "skills for adolescence," can be taken by middle school students.

"It stresses communication, problem solving and goal setting," Schutz said.

Ninth graders also can take a course to build those skills needed to successfully complete high school.

"Students learn how to take tests, manage time, read textbooks," Schutz said.

Last year, the district also launched an elementary counseling program called Elementary Student Assistance and Family Education

Specialists, wherein a counselor is in each of the 22 elementaries. The counselors' goal is to teach students the social skills needed to be a successful high school student and adult.

Throughout this year's debate on the 1992-93 budget, this program has increasingly come under fire from residents and some school trustees who believe the financially troubled district can no longer afford this program and that the money could be better spent elsewhere.

The trustees will get an in-depth report on this program at 6 tonight at the school board office on 15125 Farmington Road, south of Five Mile. The report will be given by Kent Gage, director of elementary education.

School counselors, student support groups and the parent outreach program also helps troubled students and their families.

"The main reason for the decrease in our dropout rate in the last five years is that all of these programs were put in place at all levels to address the needs of at-risk students," Schutz said.

New literacy council chief wants to get message out

David Alexander wants western Wayne County communities to know that adult illiteracy is a problem.

To get the message out, the new executive director of the Western Wayne County Literacy Council plans to establish relationships with governmental agencies, churches, businesses and community groups.

"Literacy is everyone's business," said Alexander, a Redford Township resident whose organization is based in Garden City's Marquette adult education center.

"I want to promote the public's awareness of the problem and encourage help from different avenues," said the man who replaced Debra Hoffman, who left in late July for another position after serving three months as the council's first executive director.

Alexander, who comes to the private, non-profit council from a fund-raising position with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, said in an interview that money isn't the group's only need.

The council also needs more stu-

dents, volunteer tutors and a larger office.

Both donations of money and office space from local building owners are tax deductible.

Talking about potential students, Alexander said many non-reading adults "try to hide and get through life the best they can." If residents know of people having difficulty in reading, they should call the council at 427-6644.

"I want to make the (tutoring) environment comfortable and convenient," said Alexander, who also stressed that students' confidentiality is maintained.

The council, which marked its 10th anniversary this year, has about 50 volunteer tutors who put in a combined 2,700 hours last year working with 50 to 100 students.

The council hired its first executive director with the help of a state education department grant.

Alexander cited national studies that conclude that about 20 percent of adults are functionally illiterate. Also, adults can improve their reading scores by about one grade level after 35 to 45 hours of tutoring.

Studies show that children whose parents are functionally illiterate are twice as likely as their peers to also be functionally illiterate.

The council plans two upcoming workshops for tutors, Alexander said. The workshops are scheduled

for 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Sept. 12, 19 at the Canton Township Public Library, 1200 Canton Center Road, between Cherry Hill and Michigan Avenue.

A nominal fee will be charged to volunteer tutors to cover the cost of workshop materials, council membership and certification.

Volunteers should call the council office at 427-6644.

The new council executive director, who said he is "between 30 and 40," was born in Michigan and raised on Detroit's west side. He attended school in Virginia and Michigan and obtained a bachelor's degree in public affairs from Wayne State University in 1989.

Before working for the Detroit Symphony during the past year, Alexander also was a production assistant for Music Magazine, based in Hollywood, Calif.

His background includes being a writer and editorial assistant for Record Profile Magazine, based in Southfield, writing feature stories and editing a national music publication.

Alexander also worked as a volunteer tutor in Detroit, helping students with reading, writing and social studies.

More recently, he was a volunteer tutor in the Redford Union School District, helping junior high students with their reading.

Spat turns ugly; 2 hurt in bar fight

Several patrons of a Westland bar clashed amid flying beer bottles when a dispute between a former girlfriend and boyfriend escalated shortly before closing time early Friday morning.

Two bystanders who tried to break up the fight were treated at Annapolis Hospital in Wayne for minor injuries they received during the 1:40 a.m. melee at Graffiti, a nightclub on Merriman south of Cherry Hill, Westland police said.

Other lesser injuries also were reported.

The dispute started when the former couple began arguing and the ex-boyfriend, a 22-year-old Inkster man, threw a beer-filled glass at his 20-year-old former girlfriend from Livonia, police said.

Beer spilled on the woman, but the glass didn't hit her, police said. However, the ex-boyfriend then rushed toward the woman and began beating her on the head, witnesses told police.

Several bar patrons tried to break up the fight that escalated when "several glass bottles" were thrown, police reported.

One patron, a 20-year-old Farmington Hills man, tried to break up the fight but was "jumped" by a friend of the ex-boyfriend, police reports said. The Farmington Hills man told police he believed he was stabbed during the melee, but police said it didn't appear the wound on his arm was made by a knife.

Another bystander, a 24-year-old Canton Township man, also was injured as he tried to break up the fight. A beer bottle was broken over his head, causing lacerations. He was treated at Annapolis Hospital.

With a new school year set to begin soon, local students and their families again can count on Detroit Edison vehicles and crews for safe havens through the "Eyes and Ears" program.

Nearly 600 Detroit Edison field employes in radio-equipped vehicles will watch for situations that pose possible dangers to children walking to and from school, said

Robert Buckler, Edison's vice president/divisions.

The program was started by Detroit Edison and other local utilities in 1984 in response to a rash of assaults on students.

"The start of the school year is a

good time to remind people that the "Eyes and Ears" program can provide help in any number of emergency situations," Buckler said.

All vehicles involved in the program are marked with the Eyes and Ears logo — an eye and an ear accompanied by the program's name. The logo is intended to remind the public — and especially students — that employes operating the ve-

hicles are trained to ask for help from public safety authorities in the event of crimes, fires, accidents and other emergency situations.

"Our employes are advised not to attempt to apprehend anyone involved in an apparent crime," Buckler said. "The employes' role is to observe and report. But their vehicles can serve as temporary shelters until the proper authorities arrive."

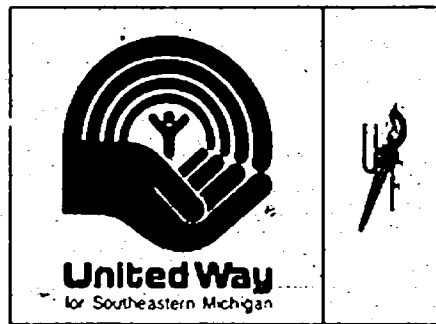

Goober survives switch from stage to 'Complete' CD

"The Complete Works of Goober & the Peas," Goober & the Peas: So much of what Goober & the Peas is about is visual: A lanky lead singer in a cowboy hat who looks like he's made up of spare parts kicking straw into the audience and backed up by his legion of cowpoke musicians searing mutated punk rock and country into our consciousness.

The joke is funny and we continue to howl.

Somewhat lost in all this has been the band's music, which has never really been held up for dissection. The release of "The Complete Works of Goober & the Peas" obviously changes all that.

Stripped away from all its hokey surroundings, Goober and the Peas' music is served on a musical plate unadorned. It's not bad and the guitar work, especially on the harder edged rock numbers, is brilliant. Yet the release misses the proper ambience at times.

Songs such as "Consider Me," which is sung in twangy reverence to Hank Williams Sr., have a stately grace about them while others like the usually scorching "Funky Cowboy" seems to lose some kick under the constraint of a studio. The crackle and spunk on the band's previously released EP was a far better showcase for anthems like "Hot Women (Cold Beer)."

The CD version of Goober and the Peas doesn't retain the charm. (Municipal Recordings, P.O. Box 20879, Detroit 48220)

"Death of Cool," Kitchens of Distinction: Sure, the Kitchens of Distinction owe their sound to a number of innovative 1980s bands — Joy Division, the Cure, Cocteau Twins and the Smiths to name a few. "Strange Free World," the band's 1991 debut on A&M, was still a captivating amalgamation of

welled up emotion, cloud bursts of guitar and shimmering textures that hinted at free jazz at times.

So the direction and mood of "Death of Cool" should come as little surprise. Patrick Fitzgerald, Julian Swales and Dan Goodwin tinker somewhat, experimenting with various guitar and vocal tracks and revealing a bit more of themselves through more introspective lyrics.

While retaining the radiant aspects of their music, Kitchens of Distinction come away sounding largely formulaic here. "Death of Cool" resembles the B-side of "Strange Free World."

The soft acoustic strumming and an easy rhythm may introduce a song such as "Mad as Snow." The glimmer of hope for any wholesale deviation is promptly squashed by the predictable crescendo of space-age pyrotechnic guitars, protracted to the point of sounding extraneous. (A&M)

"Stand So True," The Lovelings: This seven-song release is crafted in the best breezy heart-yearning pop intentions, the kind of stuff that made Elvis Costello a musical deity and Marshall Crenshaw a king of cool.

The Lovelings pursue this earnestly, revealing several strengths and betraying a few weaknesses along the way.

The sinuous, rhythm-infested guitar playing and the band's effervescent harmonies are the most endearing qualities of the Lovelings. Lyrically, the outfit also packs a good deal of punch while tackling the basest of emotions of love and unrest.

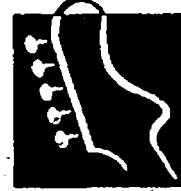
The frustration here is that these attributes never seem to fully reach fruition in the form of a simple, indelible pop song. "Melinda," featuring some great guitar work, is one of the catchier songs here as is the opening track "Lover's Lane."

The ingredients are there, but not always the right recipe. (The Lovelings, 7427 Middlesex, Dearborn 48126)

Hanifi tries again with Kiss Me



There's a self-inflicted sense of urgency at the center of Kiss Me Screaming. It comes from it's founder, Khalid Hanifi, who has started in on his first musical project since his former band, Map of the World, broke up in 1990. And this new four-man outfit isn't losing track of where its going.

Khalid Hanifi has already watched helplessly as one of his bands sank into the abyss. He's determined not to let happen again.

Such a self-inflicted urgency burns at the center of Kiss Me Screaming, which is Hanifi's first project since his former band Map of the World broke up in 1990. The four-man outfit features a frontal twin-guitar attack and a satchel of aggressive yet melodic songs.

For the singer/guitarist, the group is the musical equivalent to the Phoenix rising from the ashes of Map of the World, a band that carved its own niche in area music circles.

Map of the World, a progressive guitar pop band fronted by Hanifi and his sister Sofia, signed with Atlantic and recorded an LP. Before the album was released, though, the A&R person who signed the band had left the label.

The person replacing him didn't like the album nor the band, according to Khalid. Subsequently, Map of the World was unceremoniously dropped from the label.

"It certainly gave me a renewed distrust for the corporate mentality, not that I didn't have one before," Khalid said. "I saw it and I was a pawn in its grasp, and that's not fun. I was bitter for awhile but I learned from it."

When the band broke up, Hanifi was left pondering for nearly two years what went wrong. He has some ideas, but he's more concerned about getting on with his musical career at the moment.

In Kiss Me Screaming, Hanifi joins Map of the World alumni drummer Donn Deniston and bassist Tim Delaney along with guitarist Brian Delaney. Hanifi's sister Sofia didn't partake in this outfit ("It never came up," said Khalid, who shared songwriting duties with his sister).

As Tim's brother, Brian Delaney provides a sibling connection in Kiss Me Screaming. The former member of the Faithhealers and Scott Morgan Band also supplies a good deal of the verve as one of the band's two guitarists.

"He's found a unit that is able to come up

with songs," Brian Delaney said about Hanifi. "He comes up with a blue print and we can hammer it out pretty effectively."

Kiss Me Screaming's songs are more personal in scope than those of Map of the World, which intertwined political and social themes into melodic discourse. Khalid is in charge in the songwriting department of this band.

While numbers such as "Mutually Assured Destruction" would appear to fall into the neo-political realm, Khalid puts them more in personal perspective.

"I'm writing for myself as a performer," he said. "I wouldn't say it's more personal, but the person intended to sing the songs is me."

Kiss Me Screaming has performed a spate of the dates since April, including a gig at Lili's Aug. 14. There's talk of a CD being released sometime in six months to a year, but Hanifi is quick to add there's no hurry.

Unlike the past, Hanifi added he'll take more charge in the band's affairs instead of letting someone else do it for them.

"It's difficult," he said. "There's so many people doing this. When you step away for one or two years like a I did, nobody remembers what you did and they don't care. You are starting from scratch."

My husband and I have been married for two years. We are both happy and content. We are in our early 20s.

When we were dating, we made love all the time.

At least it seemed that way. We couldn't keep our hands off each other. It was an exciting time for both of us. Since our marriage, our sexual interest has declined. At first it was four times a week and then shrunk. Now we make love once a week.

I read many articles in women's magazines about this topic. They say two-three times a week is average. I am worried. Does my husband and my lack of sexual interest mean there is something wrong with our marriage or with one of us?

Probably because we do not want to be behind the national average, sometimes we try to make love more often. But truly, the joy is not there at those times — it really isn't any fun.

Thanks for taking time to answer this question.

Dear Muriel,

It is not normal to lose your sexual desire at such an early age; an age when many other women are just growing into their sexuality. Often women report that they do not even reach the ability to be fully expressive sexually until they are older and have been in a committed monogamous relationship for some time.

There is no material in your letter to explain what is going wrong in your marriage, but a couple's sexual interaction is revealing of their relationship. So, even though you state you are both "happy and content," the assumption is that there are some underlying problem of which neither of you is aware.

National averages are just that, averages, and cannot be applied to individuals. Your difficulty is not that you do not meet the average, but that you seem to have lost a sexual interest in each other.

Call a counselor who is experienced in sex therapy. If you cannot find one, send me your address and I will send you some names. Normally, through therapy couples change their relationship so that their natural desire will return.

GOP's 'clean House' drive targets Ford

HOUSTON — Many TV-watching Americans will need a civics lesson if E. Spencer Abraham and Guy VanderJagt are to succeed this year. The two Michiganians co-chair the National Republican Congressional Committee, and last week unveiled a list of 100 House seats they plan to make competitive.

"The anti-incumbent wind is not a breeze," said VanderJagt. "It's a hurricane, and I'm living proof that every incumbent is vulnerable." After 20 years in Congress, VanderJagt, once a vice-presidential possibility and convention keynoter in 1980, lost his primary to a first-time candidate.

The problem: Few Americans know that Democrats even control Congress. The trade magazine Editor & Publisher reported a survey showed that only 10 percent of young, TV-watching voters knew it, and only 56 percent of older, newspaper-reading voters were aware.

Abraham said their polls showed only two-thirds knew Democrats

control the House; only 11 percent came close to guessing they had controlled it 38 years; and very few knew "control" meant domination of committees and power to pick witnesses.

"That will be part of our generic advertising," said Tom Cole, their chief staff aide.

Abraham, a former Michigan GOP state chair, and VanderJagt, who as a lame duck plans to put all his time into the "change the Congress" campaign, unveiled their plans to the national press corps last week.

Their message is that Democrats have meant mismanagement, corruption, unbalanced budgets and obstruction of George Bush's programs in education, crime, jobs and movement toward a balanced federal budget.

Nine Michigan candidates are on their list of 100 districts that will be competitive this fall. Local contests:

11th District — Joe Knollenberg

seeking an open seat in the district which includes part of Livonia and Redford Township against Democrat Walter Briggs IV.

18th District — John Pappageorge seeking to unseat 10-year incumbent Democrat Sander Levin.

13th District — state Sen. Bob Geake seeking to unseat 28-year incumbent Democrat Bill Ford in the district which includes Garden City, Westland, Canton Township, Plymouth, Plymouth and part of Livonia.

9th District — newcomer Megan O'Neill taking on incumbent Democrat Dale Kildee.

Outstate contenders are Philip Ruppe, seeking his old Upper Peninsula seat; Peter Hoekstra, who bested VanderJagt Aug. 4; and state Rep. Keith Muxlow, seeking an open seat in the Thumb area; and Sen. Doug Carl, challenging Democratic whip David Bonior in Macomb County.

Left out were Republican incumbents and those with hopeless races

against such Democrats as John Dingell of Trenton, John Conyers Jr. and Barbara-Rose Collins of Detroit.

Abraham said the list could swell to 150 of the 435 House races. To be eligible, candidates had to win their primaries, raise \$15,000 or more on their own and be rated by other House Republicans as having a chance.

Each will get \$1,000 seed money, issue research, survey work and candidate training, Abraham said.

VanderJagt said the \$1,000 checks will be "a signal to PACs that these are serious candidates."

In some races, said Abraham, the amount could grow to \$58,000, the maximum permitted by law. They refused to predict how many, if any, seats they would win. "It's possible we could lose seats. It's possible we can elect a Republican majority. Jerry Ford predicted we could see 150 to 200 new faces in the House next year, said VanderJagt.

TMJ PAIN

TMJ pain refers to discomfort in the jaw joint anatomically called the Temporomandibular Joint. TMJ pain can travel down to the chin or up into the ear. The discomfort may be sharp, aching, intermittent or pulsating. You may have pain only while chewing, or the pain can be severe enough to wake you at night.

The differing features of TMJ pain depend on whether the jaw joint takes the brunt of the strain or if the muscles of chewing that surround the jaw are under the greatest stress.

In most cases the pain comes from a malocclusion of teeth or dentures. Another common source is from unconscious grinding of the teeth as a reaction to tension. These are the reasons why your physician, if he believes you have TMJ pain, will refer you initially to a dentist for evaluation.

However, TMJ discomfort can occur in rheumatoid arthritis, can be part of fibromyalgia, and may arise as a late reaction to a previous fracture or dislocation of the jaw.

Medical treatment may not be satisfactory. The anti-inflammatory drugs used for arthritis do not work well. Most physicians have little experience in TMJ injection and depend on dental colleagues for this procedure. Surgery, while possible, is the subject of controversy.

Fortunately in most cases, time and nature intervene, and the initial distracting discomfort resolves.

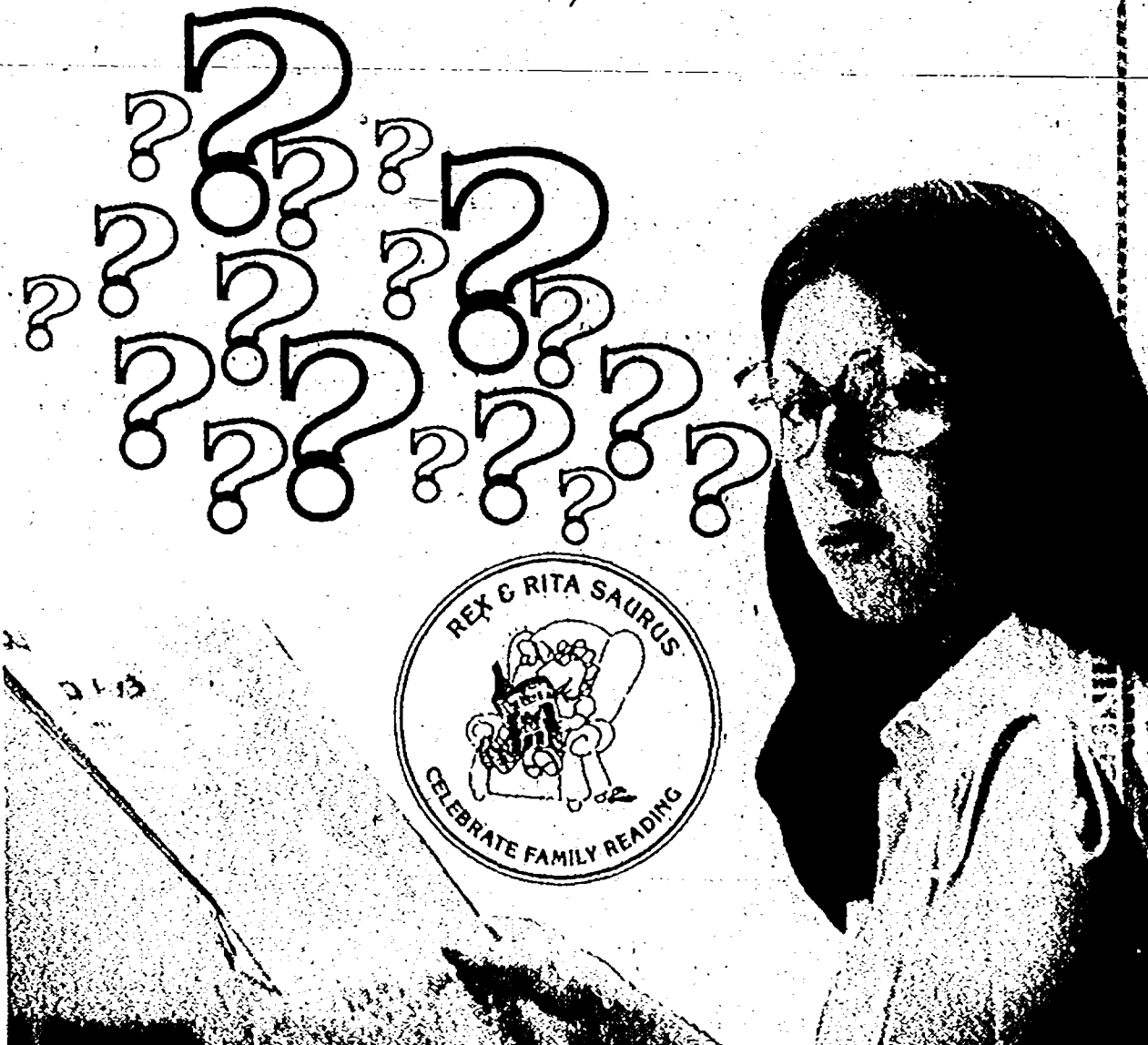

College aid improved

The Michigan college students, university administrators and others who had a role in the formation of the new Higher Education

Act can be proud of their contributions. Together, we have fashioned a five-year plan to lower the financial barriers to higher education for students from middle-income families, and provide access to job training for our work force.

In its first year — at the eight colleges and universities in the new 13th Congressional District — the new Higher Education Act will provide increased aid for more than 40,000 students and their parents; 8,850 of them will be newly eligible. We've made it possible for any student in Michigan, no matter what his status, to qualify for some federal education aid regardless of family income. We have removed the artificial barriers to college aid which were set up during the Reagan administration.

Michigan's campuses will also be the testing ground for an innovation: loans directly from the federal government to students — eliminating banks and their subsidies. If it works, as I believe it will, a full scale direct lending program could save up to \$1.5 billion a

year, and those savings could buy more education for more people.

It's important to note that these programs do not serve just students in traditional higher education. Of the \$20 billion available nationally to students each year — about one-third, or \$7 billion — goes to students in post-secondary occupational and vocational training programs. This makes the Higher Education Act the largest source of job training for Michigan's work force. In these times of high and rising unemployment we really need this help.

City's Scot festival spirit

Edinburgh tunes bagpipes for international event

In the mid-18th century, just before the city's Georgian New Town was built, more than 20,000 people lived in Edinburgh's old Town.

In the towering stone tenements lining the Royal Mile, the ancient street that slopes from Edinburgh Castle to the Palace of Holyroodhouse, the wealthiest occupied the middle stories so that they did not have too many steps to climb, but could be far enough away from the unsavory streets below.

Today only about 6,000 people live in the Old Town. Every summer, however, the 18th-century crowding is re-created — in a more convivial and salubrious fashion — when Edinburgh throws its arms open to the world for its three-week international festival, this year from Aug. 16 to Sept. 5. The festival attracts hundreds of thousands of people each year.

Like bursts of summer fireworks, the Edinburgh Festival and its wackier cousin, the Edinburgh Festival Fringe, set off explosions of color and sound that illuminate and enliven the cobble, winding streets.

Events

A myriad of dance, drama, opera, concerts, lectures and art exhibitions is planned for this year's

International Festival

Rembrandt, Vermeer, Hals and company feature in "Dutch Art and Scotland: A Reflection of Taste" at the National Gallery of Scotland until Oct. 18, while the sculptures of Joan Miro will be shown at the Royal Scottish Academy until Sept. 20. Admission \$6.

Tchaikovsky will figure largely in the festival this year (the centenary of his death is next year).

The Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra, conducted by Riccardo Chailly, will perform at Usher Hall at 8 p.m. on Aug. 31 (including works by Haydn and Beethoven) and at 7:30 p.m. on Sept. 1 (Beethoven and Tchaikovsky); tickets \$16 to \$44.

The plays of the Edwardian dramatist Harley Granville-Barker and of the Glaswegian playwright C.P. Taylor, who died in 1981, dominate the festival's drama schedule.

Festival schedules and tickets are available at the festival office (21 Market St., near Waverley Station; 225-5756), open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday and from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday.

A booth in the parking lot of the National Galleries of Scotland on

The Mound will sell some same-day tickets for half price from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. daily.

The 46th Edinburgh Festival Fringe, held during the same period as the International Festival, is bigger than ever: More than 1,100 different shows will be staged by some 8,500 performers from around the world.

The full Fringe program and tickets are available at the Fringe office (180 High St., on the Royal Mile; 226-5138), open daily from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m.; tickets from \$1 to \$74.

Sightseeing

Most visitors to Edinburgh stroll the Royal Mile. For a detour from the tartan-and-bagpipes trail, however, consider a walk along the Water of Leith, an 18-mile river, most of which snakes through the city.

For a leisurely three-hour meander start at the Scottish National Gallery of Modern Art (Belford Road; 556-8921), open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday to Saturday and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday; admission free.

The gallery owns works by Picasso, Hackney, Bacon and oth-

ers; the grounds are studded with Henry Moore sculpture. There is also a cafe with an outdoor patio where one can lunch at reasonable prices on homemade soups, quiches and cakes.

A sign behind the museum points the way to the leafy riverside path, which leads to Dean Village, a onetime center of grain-milling. The next stop is St. Bernard's Well, a Doric temple built in 1789 on the site of a mineral spring.

From there stroll to Stockbridge, a former industrial village that now, on St. Stephen Street, is home to some of Edinburgh's most interesting antiques shops.

For refreshment stop at Bert's Bar (2-4 Raeburn Place; 332-6345). A few minutes away is the west gate of the Royal Botanic Garden (no admission charge; 552-7171), a good final destination on a Water of Leith walk.

Stockbridge is on the northern edge of the New Town, a trove of Georgian houses and elegant crescents. Begin any New Town tour at the National Trusts Georgian House at 7 Charlotte Square (225-2160), designed in 1791 by Robert Adam.

The house is beautifully furnished, and there is a 20-minute video on Georgian architecture and the family that once lived in the house. It is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays and 2 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Sunday, April through October. Admission is \$4.80, \$2.40 for children.

Computer networks take byte out of travel costs

Computers are changing the way travelers decide where they want to go.

Home computer networks such as Prodigy, CompuServe and Delphi give people with a modem and a telephone access to detailed information that once was the exclusive domain of travel agents and other professionals.

Customers can get reports on hotels and motels, ski conditions, the weather, food in Chinese restaurants, political conditions and health advisories — for hundreds of domestic and foreign cities.

Many of the networks feature travel clubs whose subscribers can "talk" with other people in nearby or far-flung places. They can get a feeling for a political situation, a storm that just passed or a low-priced hotel.

The computer networks offer access to travel information as just one part of the service. Subscribers can also access financial reports, games, news stories, reference libraries, sports data and other resources.

And while the number of subscribers is still relatively low, interest remains high.

"I'd say about a quarter of our subscribers use our travel features heavily," says Steve Hein, a spokesperson for Prodigy, which now claims to have 1.5 million subscribers.

Among Prodigy's travel features are weather forecasts for 100 foreign and 250 domestic cities, "best" and "worst" guides for in 12 major cities and restaurant reviews from the Zagat series.

Prodigy's Travel Club is a feature that allows subscribers to communicate with each other. On a recent day some of the "talk" was about Los Angeles and how safe it was to go there in the wake of the devastating riots.

The start-up kit for Prodigy is \$49.95, but it's often sold at a discount price that includes a free month of use.

Thereafter, the monthly charge is \$12.95. That is good for 30 electronic messages per month. Additional messages are 25 cents each.

For further information contact Prodigy Services Co., 445 Hamilton Ave., White Plains, N.Y. 10601 or call (800) PRODIGY.

CompuServe, which has 980,000 members, also has a wide array of travel information, including the Eaasy Sabre service.

"Our Travel Forum is very popular," explains Debra Young, a CompuServe spokesperson.

"It's an on-line gathering place. If I'm going to Barbados, for example, I might send out a message asking about hotels and restaurants.

"I could easily get a response from a user in Barbados and even end up meeting that person when I get there. It's a worldwide service that can create computer pen pals."

Users have access to the latest U.S. State Department travel advisories. They can find out whether a visa is needed for a visit to a specific country.

The system also carries Worldspan Travelshopper, formerly known as PARS, the second most popular airline-reservations system.

The software and start-up kit for CompuServe cost \$39.95. Thereafter, users pay \$7.95 a month for the basic service or can elect a pay-as-you-go service and be billed just for on-line time plus a \$2 monthly fee.

Delphi, which does not release the number of subscribers to its service, also offers Eaasy Sabre, Worldspan Travelshopper and the O.A.G. Electronic Edition. Delphi features a premium service as well, the Travel-Plus V.I.P. Club.

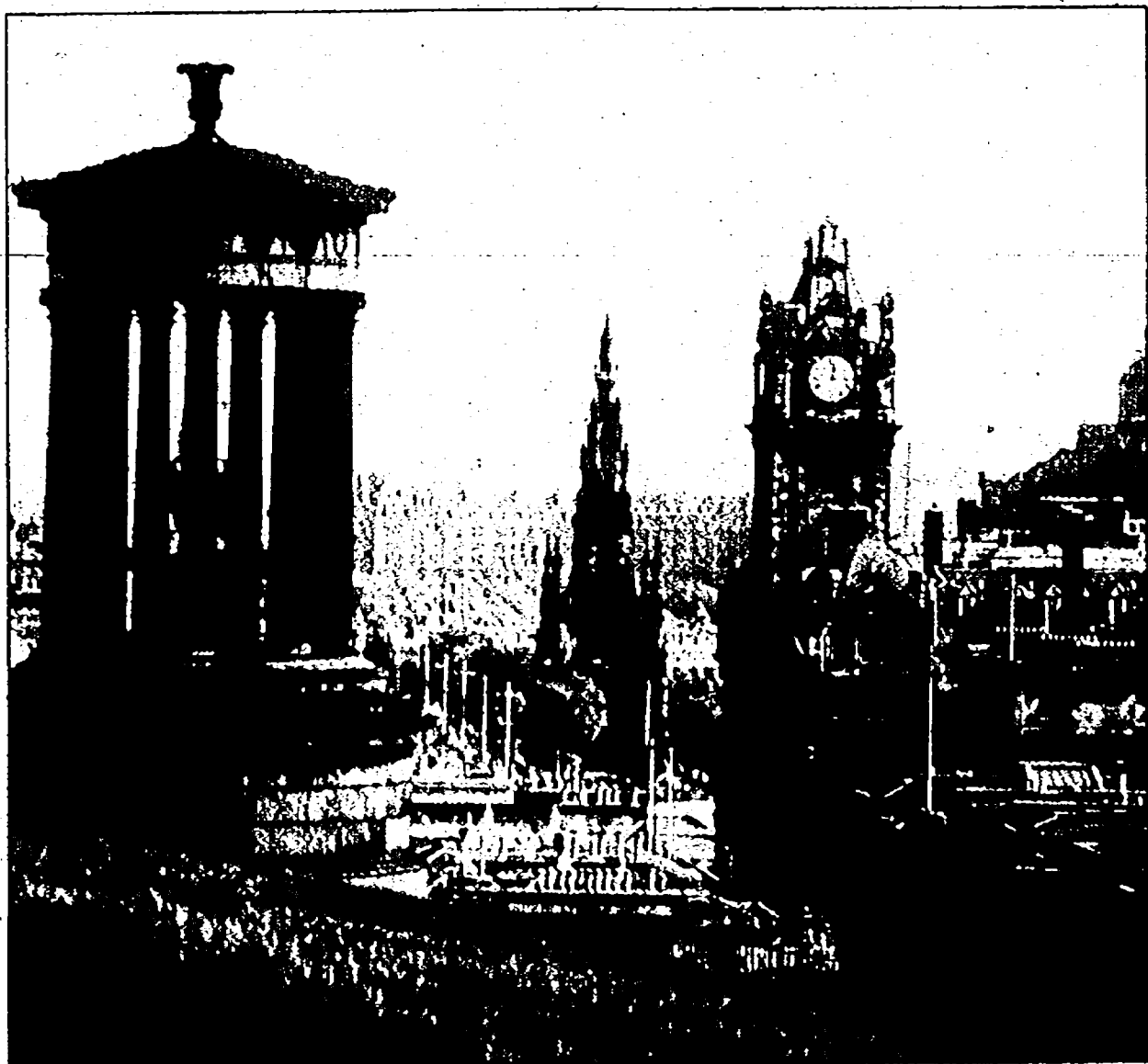

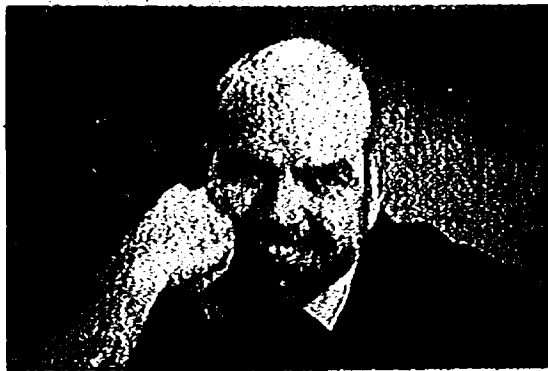

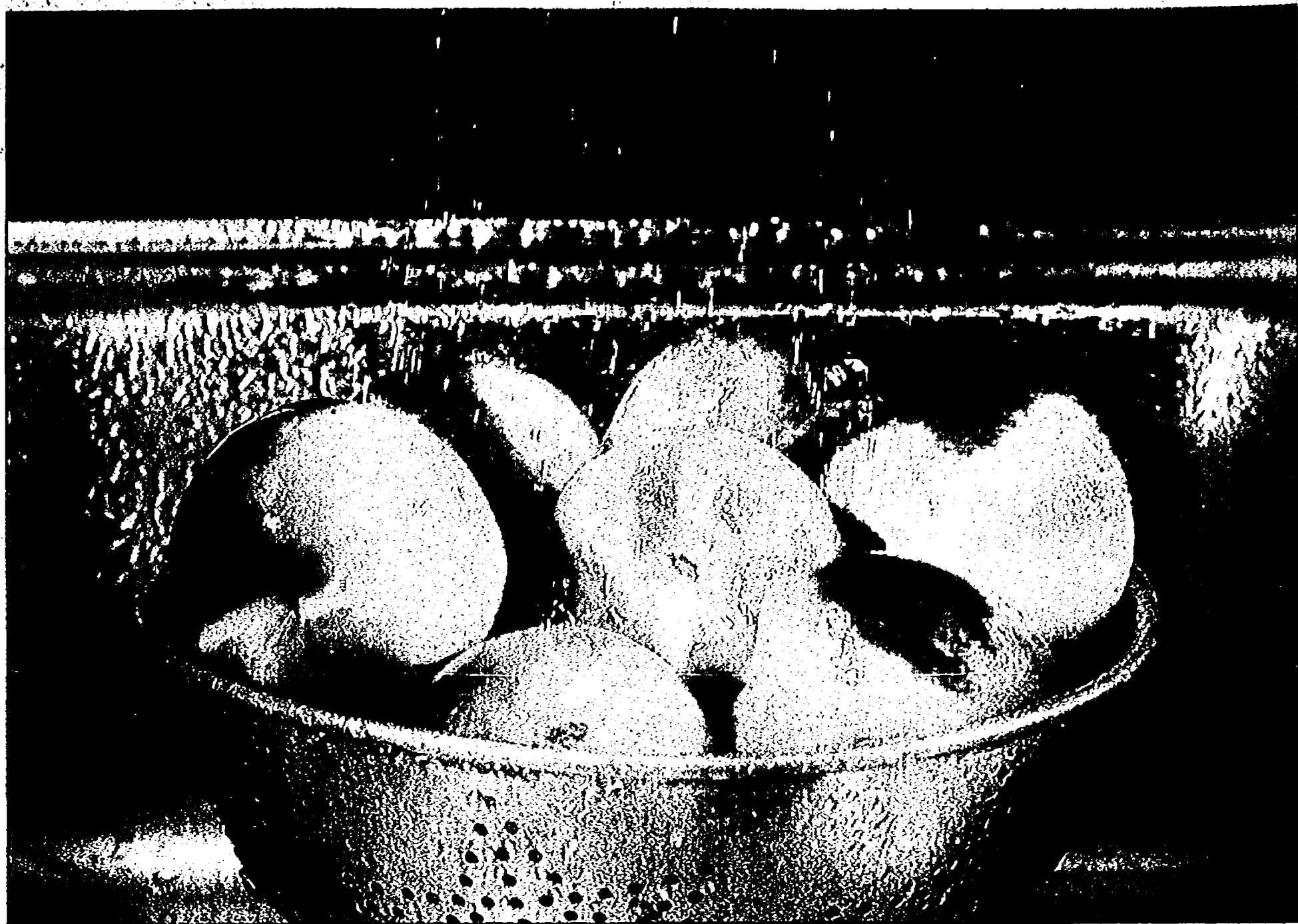
Collection available

"The Peaches are gorgeous this year," said Sharon Ashton of Ashton Orchards in Ortonville. "But the flavor is down a little. On a scale of 1 to 10, I'd say they're an eight or a nine."

If you like to can peaches, expect to spend a little more time preparing them this year. Because of the cool weather the pits are sticking. Ashton recommends canning quarters as opposed to halves.

Not all the farmers are feeling peachy keen. A May frost, hail storm and cool summer hurt the peach crop in some parts of the state. Some of the farmers I

talked to bought peaches from other farmers to sell at their markets.

Ashton has peaches for sale at Ashton Orchards, 3925 Seymour Lake Road, Ortonville, (313) 627-6671.

Juicy Red Haven peaches are available at The Strawberry Patch, 1 mile E. of Milford between Burns & Duck Lake Road, 2375 Wixon Trail, (313) 685-1393, and at Blake's Orchard 7 Cider Mill, 17985 Armada Center Road, three miles north and four miles east of Romeo, (313) 784-5343.

I found a couple of u-pick farms nearby for people who prefer to pick their

own fruit. Blake's Big Apple Orchard, N. Ave at 33 Mile Road, call (313) 784-9710; Brookwood Fruit Farm, north of Romeo on M-53, six miles, right on Bordman, 1/4 mile to apple storage building, (313) 798-8312, and Sylvan Orchard, one mile north of I-94 between Kalmbach Road, (exit 156) and Pierce Road (exit 157), on Cavanaugh Lake Road, (313) 475-1943.

Never buy soft peaches, said Ashton. Look for peaches that are yellow with a red of golden blush background color.

Avoid any that are extra hard or greenish, said Lois Thieleke extension

home economist for the Cooperative Extension Service, Oakland County office.

"Picked green peaches will just get soft and wither. Peaches don't become any sweeter after they are picked, but ripening makes mature fruit softer and juicier," said Thieleke.

To ripen peaches, Ashton recommends putting them in a paper bag or open air basket. Close the bag and check it every day. Peaches will ripen evenly in a paper bag.

"Peaches are fragile," said Ashton. "After they're ripe, refrigerate them. They'll last about a week. Buy them as you use them."

Peaches are second to apples in popularity in the United States. Peach season ends about mid September in Michigan. Early apple varieties like Paula Reds are now available at some farms including Blakes and Ashton Orchards.

FRESH TOMATO SAUCE AND PASTA

- 2 Tablespoons olive oil
- 1/2 cup onion, minced
- 4 cups (5-6 tomatoes) tomato pulp, chopped coarsely
- 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 imported bay leaf
- 1-2 large cloves garlic, pureed
- 6 fresh basil leaves, chopped
- salt
- fresh ground black pepper

Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Drop the tomatoes in, a few at a time, for 10-15 seconds. Remove, run under cold water, slip off skin. Cut each tomato in half and squeeze out the seeds. In large saucepan, saute onions in oil. Stir in tomatoes. Cover and cook on medium-low heat for several minutes. Add remaining ingredients and simmer until sauce is thickened. Serve over pasta of choice. Makes 2 1/4 cups of sauce.

ZUCCHINI PANCAKES

- 2 eggs, beaten
- 2 Tablespoons light mayonnaise
- 2 Tablespoons grated onion
- 1 1/2 cups grated Parmesan
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/4 teaspoon Italian herbs
- salt and ground pepper to taste
- 1/2 cup mozzarella

Grate unpeeled zucchini into a paper towel and squeeze out moisture. Combine ingredients and mix well. Form into 2-inch diameter pancakes and saute in oil on medi-

um high heat until browned on both sides. Arrange pancakes in a shallow, oven-proof pan and sprinkle lightly with grated mozzarella. Set in upper third of a 350 degree preheated oven. Bake until cheese is melted and lightly browned.

THE BEST BEAN SALAD

- 1 Jar, (24 ounces) cannellini or Great Northern beans, drained
- 1/2 can or 8 ounces garbanzo beans, drained
- 1/4 cup chopped celery
- 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
- 4 green onions, chopped
- Garlic powder to taste
- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup wine vinegar
- salt and pepper to taste

Combine ingredients in large bowl. Stir. Season to taste and refrigerate until served.

POTS DE CREME

- 1/4 cup milk, (whole milk preferred)
- 6 ounces semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 2 Tablespoons sugar
- pinch of salt
- whipped cream

Heat milk just to the boiling point. Place the other ingredients in a blender and add hot milk. Blend at low speed for one minute. Pour into four individual dessert glasses and chill for several hours. Top with a dollop of whipped cream.

CHEF BRIAN POLCYN'S WILD MUSHROOM TORTE

½ cup each of lobster, morel, chanterelles and shitake mushrooms
3 Tablespoons butter
¼ cup shallots
1 cup dry sherry
flour
cream
salt and pepper
phyllo dough
melted butter

Cut mushrooms into uniform size. Melt 3 tablespoons butter and add shallots and mushrooms and cook over medium heat until all

moisture has evaporated. Add sherry and cook until all moisture evaporates. Dust with flour and cook for one minute.

Add just a pinch of cream to thicken and season with salt and pepper to taste. Remove from stove and allow to cool. Lay one sheet of phyllo dough out on a towel. Brush with melted butter. Lay another sheet on top and repeat three times. Lengthwise, place mushrooms on dough and roll up. Seal ends and brush top with melted butter. Bake in a 375 degree oven for 20-30 minutes or until hot in the center and dough is brown. Slice and serve. Serves 10.

½ pound raw shrimp
½ pound raw salmon
3 egg whites
1½ cups heavy cream
salt and pepper to taste
3 Tablespoons chopped mixed fresh herbs

PEACH COBBLER

4 cups peeled and sliced ripe peaches
¾ cup plus 3 Tablespoons granulated sugar
1 teaspoon grated lemon zest
1 Tablespoon fresh lemon juice
¼ teaspoon almond extract
1½ cups unbleached all-purpose flour
1 Tablespoon baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
½ cup vegetable shortening
1 egg, lightly beaten
¼ cup milk

1 cup heavy cream, chilled
3 to 4 Tablespoons peach brandy or cordial

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Butter a 2-quart baking dish. Arrange peaches in baking dish. Sprinkle with ½ cup sugar, the lemon zest and juice, and almond extract. Bake for 20 minutes.

While peaches are baking, sift flour, 1 tablespoon of the remaining sugar, the baking powder and salt together into a bowl. Cut in shortening until mixture resembles cornmeal. Combine the beaten egg and milk and mix into dry ingredients until just combined.

Remove peaches from oven and quickly drop dough by large spoonfuls over surface. Sprinkle with remaining 2 tablespoons sugar. Return to the oven for 15 to 20 minutes, until top is firm and golden brown.

Whip cream to soft peaks. Flavor with peach brandy to taste. Serve cobbler warm, accompanied by whipped cream. (Four to six portions).

Lowly eggplant stars in Italian dish

AP — The lowly eggplant is much loved on the Italian island of Sicily. There it stars in caponata (pronounced kap-oh-NAH-tah), an antipasto that stands as the hallmark dish of the island — and the benchmark of cooking ability. The careful blending of garden-fresh vegetables with vinegar, olives and capers results in a marinated ensemble that is delightfully versatile.

For an appetizer, guests can spoon caponata onto toasted pita wedges or crusty sliced French bread. For a salad, you can arrange it on a bed of torn fresh greens. Or pass it around the table as a relish for grilled chicken or fish.

CAPONATA

1 medium onion, sliced and separated into rings
¼ cup sliced celery
1 Tablespoon olive oil or salad oil
¾ pound unpeeled eggplant, cut into ½-inch pieces
½ pound yellow summer squash, cut into ½-inch pieces
1 small tomato, peeled, seeded and chopped
2 Tablespoons halved pimiento-stuffed olives
2 Tablespoons red wine vinegar

1 Tablespoon capers, rinsed and drained
1 Tablespoon raisins (optional)
1 teaspoon sugar
1 tablespoon pine nuts or slivered almonds (optional)
Toasted pita bread triangles and/or French bread slices (optional)

In a large skillet cook onion and celery in hot oil until tender. Add eggplant, squash, tomato, olives, vinegar, capers, raisins (if desired) and sugar; stir to combine. Simmer, covered, for 8 to 10 minutes or until eggplant and squash are tender. Simmer, uncovered, for 5 to 10 minutes more or until most of the liq-

uid has evaporated. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Cool slightly.

Add nuts, if desired. Cool and serve at room temperature or cover and chill overnight. Let stand at room temperature before serving. To serve as an appetizer, spoon the mixture onto pita triangles and/or French bread slices. Makes about 3½ cups (8 to 10 appetizer servings).

You'll see more microwave convenience foods, refillable containers, and new products by familiar companies like Heinz, on your grocery shelves this fall and winter.

about \$5, contain everything you need to make a novelty birthday cake — mix, frosting, and reusable pan. Some of the choices are Garfield the cat, Miss Piggy, and Kermit the frog.

Astro low-fat yogurt is packaged with a stir-in granola topping. Heinz, well known for ketchup and vinegar, is introducing a vinegar cleaning solution in a spray bottle. Comet Cleanser is also introducing a new cleaning product in a spray bottle. Refills are available for both.

If you're a big kid and love Gummy Bears, but are embarrassed to

admit it, try the new Gummy Chevy's and Chevy Trucks. Another popular item at the show was the Crystal Pepsi, a clear cola.

USDA recommends adding 2 table-spoons bottled lemon juice or one-half citric acid to each quart of crushed, whole, halved or juiced tomatoes. Add directly to jars before filling them with tomatoes.

For pints use one Tablespoon bottled lemon juice or one-quarter teaspoon citric acid.

Do not forget to process all tomatoes according to the latest USDA recommendations. The Ball Blue Book 32nd has the latest recommendations and can be purchased at stores carrying canning supplies.

For more information, call 858-0904, weekdays, 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Betty Crocker tip of the week: When washing jars for canning and freezing fruits and vegetables, use nonabrasive sponges and cleaners so that the glass remains smooth and undamaged.

Get on a roll with pastry dough

AP — Tender, flaky pastry makes a perfect partner to any pie filling. Yet, the truth be known, even the best pie crust makers can run into a snag now and then. Fortunately, these problems are easily fixed, with a few tips from our test kitchen.

To make crumbly pastry easier to roll: Add more water, 1 teaspoon at a time. Toss the flour mixture and water together a few more times or just until evenly moistened.

To prevent tough pastry: Use a pastry blender to cut in the shortening or lard until well mixed. All of the mixture should resemble small peas. Use as little cold water as possible to moisten the flour mixture. Toss the flour mixture and water only until all of the flour mixture is moistened. Use less flour when rolling out the pastry.

To keep the crust from shrinking away from the sides: Roll the pastry to an even thickness. Mix in water only until evenly moistened. Don't stretch the pastry when transferring it to the pie plate.

To prevent the bottom crust from becoming soggy: Use a dull metal or glass pie plate, not a shiny metal pan that reflects heat. Patch any cracks in the pastry with a scrap of the pastry before adding the filling. Be sure the oven temperature is accurate. If the temperature is too low, the bottom crust will not bake quickly enough to seal out the moisture of the filling.

To keep the top crust from getting soggy: Make several cuts in the top before baking to allow the steam to escape.

To prevent the pastry from blistering excessively: Lightly press

a single-crust pastry into the pie plate so there are no air pockets underneath. Prick it with a fork. Make several cuts in the top crust.

To keep the crust from over-browning: Cover the edge of the unbaked pie with a 12-inch square of foil at the beginning of baking. Fold the foil in quarters and cut a quarter-circle off the folded corner (about 3 inches from the tip). Unfold the piece of foil and place it over the pie, slightly molding the foil over the edge. Remove the foil about halfway through the baking time.

To prevent the pie from bubbling over: Add less filling to the pie shell. Place a pizza pan or baking sheet under a double-crust fruit pie to catch any filling that does bubble over.

Tips make kitchen chores easier

Here's a couple of handy tips. To keep fruits and vegetables fresher longer in your refrigerator, line the vegetable bin with paper towels or dry sponges to absorb excess moisture.

Corn silk can be removed more

easily with the aid of a damp toothbrush.

Hard boiled eggs can be easier to peel if you plunge them into cold water, crack the shell and then roll the egg lightly between the palms of your hands.

Warriors embark on Metro Conference

Lutheran Westland's first season in the Metro Conference might be a struggle but coach Dennis Tuomi is still glad to belong.

Lutheran Westland, which opened its doors in 1987, played an independent schedule last year.

The Warriors will play in the West Division of the Metro along with Livonia Clarenceville, Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook, Detroit Lutheran Northwest and Detroit Lutheran West.

Tuomi coached years ago at Lutheran West and experienced success playing in the Metro Conference.

"It's great," said Tuomi, the only head coach Lutheran Westland has had. "We hope to be competitive. I don't know about this year but we should be in the future."

Tuomi expected big things from the Warriors last year but after a great start they finished a disappointing 4-5 over-

all. Lutheran Westland lost 14 starters off that team.

"Last year should have been our year," Tuomi said. "We had a senior team, this year we're very young. We haven't turned the corner yet. We lost some close games last year because we didn't believe."

Perhaps the game that summed up the season was a 7-6 loss to Litchfield. Lutheran Westland dominated the line of scrimmage, according to Tuomi, and Litchfield's only score came on an 89-yard fumble return.

This year's Warriors are small and only four can bench press more than 200 pounds. None of the Warriors can run a 40-yard dash in less than five seconds but that's nothing new to Tuomi since taking over as coach.

"I've never had a kid (at Lutheran Westland) in the four's," he said. "We just don't have wheels. Every game is going to be a challenge."

The leading returnee for the Warriors

is junior running back Steve Faith, a 5-foot-8, 159-pounder who was second on the team with 457 yards rushing. His 5.7 yards per carry was the most on the team.

"Steve doesn't have blinding speed but he's a tough kid and our best back," Tuomi said.

Others expected to play in the backfield include seniors Chad Olson (5-11, 165), Matt Russian (5-10, 164) and Ryan Sleszak (5-9, 164) and junior Kjel Skov (5-9, 141).

The quarterback is junior Apdy Manthei (5-7, 146), who has the edge on junior Jim Hoeft (5-8, 126).

The line will be anchored by senior Keith Nash (5-7, 172) and juniors John Caltabiano (5-6, 170) and Marty Hodge (5-8, 186). Senior guard Doug Drogorub (5-9, 174) and senior guard Troy Smith (6-2, 179) also will see action on the line.

The defense is led by linebacker Kent Wattleworth (6-1, 185), who last year led the team with 4½ sacks and was sixth with 30 tackles.

Heaton, Graham seeking to help heal Spartans' wounds

It wasn't supposed to happen like that.

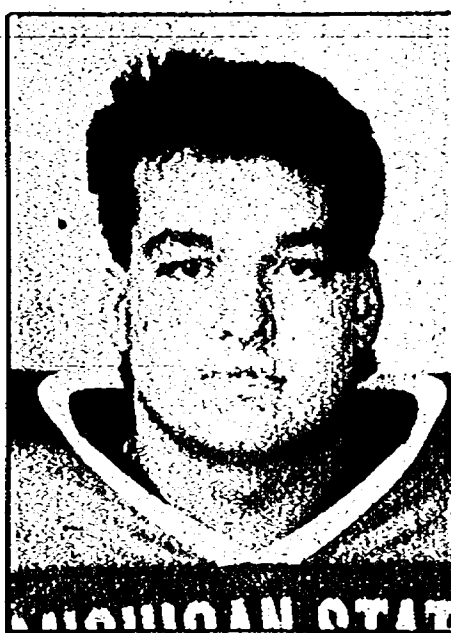
Michigan State's football team had established itself. The losing seasons were in the past, and were supposed to remain there. The Spartans had posted six winning records in a row and were coming off a Big Ten co-championship, their second title in four years.

With the number of player losses from that little team, another Big Ten crown wasn't expected in 1991. But MSU would still get its seven or eight wins and a fifth-straight bowl berth, right?

Wrong. The Spartans lost their first five games en route to a 3-8 season, including home-field defeats to Central Michigan, Rutgers and Michigan. They got beat by Northwestern, too.

Hardly a memorable campaign. With an unproven quarterback (the job went to UCLA transfer Bret Johnson at first, but Jim Miller took over in game No. 4) and a mostly inexperienced line, the offense sputtered. MSU scored just 20 points in its first four games.

Toby Heaton suffered through all of it. The Redford Catholic Central grad from Plymouth started all 11 games; he was one of the two offensive line start-

of experience, led by Heaton, an Academic All-Big Ten selection for three-straight years and honorable mention all-conference player last year.

As Heaton noted, experience is a must for a unit that has to work together to succeed. "If there's one mental breakdown, one miscommunication, one technique error on a play, a linebacker can bust through and it can be a two-yard loss," said Heaton.

Offensive linemen, it is often said, don't get noticed unless they fail. Since MSU's line struggled throughout '91, Heaton had to share in the frustrations.

"I'm not going to say I played great and I'm not going to say I played poorly," he said. "I thought I played consistently. That's the kind of player I am, the kind who plays consistently."

The line's troubles affected back-up center Jeff Graham, too, but by season's end he had other problems to tend to.

A Westland John Glenn graduate, Graham got in for 60 minutes of action in '91. Then he was diagnosed with Hodgkin's Disease, an ailment that can cause the enlargement of several organs.

Graham missed spring drills, lost 20 pounds and ended up having his spleen removed. Still, he's slated to battle sophomore Mark Birchmeier for the starting position.

Graham — who's back up to 291

pounds and said he "didn't have any problem putting (the weight) back on" — insists he feels no after-effects. "I lost some strength, and I still don't have all that back," he said. "But I feel fine."

And he never gave any thought to quitting. Quite the contrary.

"I want to play more now," Graham said. "For a while there I wasn't sure I'd get a chance. I saw the doctor last week and he took some chest x-rays and said I was OK."

Then he added, "I don't really care what they say. Unless they tell me I'm going to die, I'm going to play."

That kind of attitude, combined with his experience (like Heaton, Graham is a fifth-year senior), are reasons why MSU expects to rebound this season.

"I've been practicing. I've had enough practice — four years of it," said Graham. "I just want to stay away from injuries."

Bowl games and conference titles are not topics of conversation this year, which could be a benefit. As Heaton noted: "If everyone tries their hardest and we win a few football games, then whatever happens, happens."

Whatever does happen, both Heaton and Graham hope this year is more memorable than last year was.

CC's chances of returning to the state final, as always, will rely on a big offensive line (that averages 234 pounds) and a rugged defense. The Shamrocks lost several two-way starters to graduation including speedster Frank Yoakam, and backs Dan Gusoff, Jeff Tibaldi, Brett Walter and Matt Roney.

But the Shamrocks return nine players who bench press at least 300 pounds and one of the strongest players is senior quarterback Chris Barbara. The lefty completed 35 of 80 passes for 613 yards, threw six interceptions and three touchdowns.

"Before we started practice, the three Joes (Joe Suhajda, Joe Herman and Joe Lopez) and I got the

team together and talked about last year, but we decided that's not going to be our focus," said Barbara, who bench presses 355 pounds. "That's over and done with. I'm not worried about stats, I just want to prove to myself that I can be a better quarterback."

Barbara won't have a guy like Yoakam to throw to but he has a capable backfield. Senior Jason Krueger (5-11, 185) played some at fullback and will be No. 1 this fall. The tailback position will be filled by junior Fred Taylor (5-9, 160), senior John Raasch (5-8, 200) and senior Jon Wolfe (5-9, 175).

The leading receiver candidates are seniors Ken Rys, Brady Pankow and Chris O'Keefe, none of whom caught a pass in '91. Barbara's ex-

perience will be key, according to Mach.

"His leadership, control of the kids and his ability to think on his feet are good," Mach said.

The offensive line returns two starters, senior tackle Aaron Babicz

(6-0, 230) and senior guard Dan Liebau (6-2, 235). There is a battle for the starting center spot between senior Todd Lackey (5-10, 225) and junior Nick Kallas (6-3, 230), while the right side of the line will be manned by senior guard Tony Ranzazza (6-1, 230) and junior tackle Doug Brzezinski. Senior tackle Mike Grzywacz (6-1, 270) could challenge for a starting job, according to Mach.

Brzezinski is the most intriguing lineman at CC since Toby Heaton.

"At his age and development, he's the biggest kid I can remember having," Mach said. "Heaton was bigger as a senior but not a junior."

A stingy defense

The Shamrocks allowed only 133.3 yards per game last year and 97 points, an average of 7.6 points per game.

CC's 5-2 defense will be anchored by Suhajda (6-2, 245), who returns at tackle, and senior inside linebacker Joe Herman (6-0, 220). Herman was second on the team with 99 tackles, while Suhajda had 88½ tackles and 2½ sacks.

A newcomer expected to start at inside linebacker is junior Tate Dobbs (5-11, 200), who played last year at Livonia Stevenson.

Lopez and Krueger return as defensive end starters, while Babicz is the other starting down lineman. Lopez had six sacks a year ago and

Krueger had 5½. Depth will come from Paul Nemzec (6-0, 235), Kallas and Grzywacz.

Cornerback is a concern, with Roney and Walter leaving.

"They were two of the best we ever had," Mach said.

Cornerback candidates include Pankow, Dave Morelli (6-2, 175), O'Keefe and Scott Lingolani (6-0, 185). The safety will be Rys and the monster back is Jeff LaChapelle (6-1, 190).

The Shamrocks graduated reliable placekicker Kerry Zavagnin, but soccer player Adam Borchardt has been impressive in practice, reaching the end zone with kickoffs.

Senior Steve Gusfa has the edge at punter.

"Mercy is just a wonderful school. My friends supported me the whole year and I want to be around them," she said. "(Virginia) was a great experience and I learned a lot from it. At first, it was real hard and I wanted to come home, not because I didn't like swimming

but because I was homesick. I love it to my parents (Michael and Marlene)."

Gaza plans to compete on Mercy's swimming team this fall, but she knows her niche is as a synchronized swimmer. She started synchronized swimming at age 7 after watching her sister Beth in the sport.

Gaza would like to continue synchronized swimming in college and she hopes to attend Ohio State University, which has the sport.

"I want to try to make the Olympic team, but if not, make the first national team," Gaza said. "But first, I just want to survive college swimming."

Gaza said some people don't understand the struggles of a synchronized swimmer.

"A lot of people have misconceptions that synchronized swimmers just do shows and goof off," she said. "But it's very structural, we have to do 20 hours a week in the water, do aerobics, take dance lessons."

Is Mill a thrill

Harrison graduate Coleman finding niche as receiver

Funny, but George Perles has always — and probably always will — been known as a grind-it-out kind of football coach.

The running game suits his style: Pound it at your opponent and see who's toughest.

But since Perles has been coaching Michigan State, he has sent three top-notch receivers into the pros — in order, Mark Ingram (with the New York Giants), Andre Rison (Atlanta Falcons) and Courtney Hawkins (Tampa Bay Buccaneers).

Hawkins completed his reign as the No. 1 Spartan receiving threat last season, catching 47 passes. The question now is, who's next in line?

Perles believes it will be Mill Coleman. "He's very similar to Ingram and Hawkins," the MSU coach said. "I've seen enough to know that he'll go on to play pro-

fessional football."

High praise indeed, and in one way surprising. Not that Coleman is the recipient; since his freshman year playing high school football at Albion to the two Class B titles he later guided Farmington Harrison to, Coleman has proven himself to be an exceptional talent.

But at quarterback, not receiver.

And yet, it now seems his future is as a pass catcher, not thrower. Playing split end last year, Coleman caught 16 passes (tied for third on the team) for 156 yards and one touchdown. He also rushed 17 times for 76 yards and, yes, he passed the ball, too — four times, completing two for 28 yards.

Coleman's ability was utilized on kick returns as well (7.0 on punts, 14.9 on kicks) and will be again this year. Indeed, the Coleman qualities the MSU coaching

staff likes best are his versatility and intelligence. "He's got better hands than we thought, and he's smart," said Perles. Added offensive coordinator Morris Watts: "The most foolish

thing you can do is keep him off the field. Mill is an exceptional person. He's a leader, he's got a charisma about him.

"We're going to use all his talents. Anytime he gets his hands on the ball and he's behind the line of scrimmage, he's a double-threat. Yes, we will use him at quarterback in special situations, particularly at the goal line where we can utilize his speed."

Coleman's reaction to all this is, typically, to downplay it. "It's always good to be mentioned," he said. "Whatever they want me to do, I'll be happy to do it. I'll do whatever I can to help the team."

The Spartans will ask for a lot from a player who's small by college standards (just 5-foot-10 and 170 pounds) and lacking experience (sophomore eligibility).

Now that he's been at wide receiver — he'll switch to flanker

this season — for a year, how does he feel? "I feel a lot more comfortable," Coleman answered. "I've been working on it all summer."

And how about part-time duty at quarterback? "I'll be happy to do that," he replied.

The one thing Coleman wants no part of is another outcome like last year's. The Spartans suffered through a 3-8 campaign, their worst since Perles took control.

"It was a new experience," said Coleman, who suffered through more defeats in one season than in his three years quarterbacking Harrison. "But you've got to deal with the winning, and you've got to deal with the losing."

If Coleman can come close to living up to the lavish praise heaped upon him, his team won't have to worry about the latter.

Morrison wants to get everything right in '92

Steve Morrison hopes everything goes right for him this fall.

And it's not just because that, in the past when things seemed to be going so right, something went wrong. The thing is that when bad stuff happens, it happens on his left.

His left leg, to be precise.

Morrison is entering his third season as an inside linebacker for the University of Michigan. If the Birmingham Brother Rice product can get through the 12-game campaign (bowl game included), it'll be a first.

Morrison got into three games as a true freshman — ironically, because five others listed ahead of him on the depth chart were injured. He made six tackles against Michigan State, but missed the final seven games with an injured left calf.

Still, he won a starting position in spring drills prior to the 1991 season. He got off to a strong start, twice recording 11

tackles in a game (in wins over Boston College and Iowa) and intercepting three passes.

Then it happened again.

At Michigan State, Morrison gave chase on a screen pass. "The turf was wet," he recalled during Friday's media day in Ann Arbor, "and I took a helmet on my knee."

That the helmet belonged to a U-M teammate didn't matter, it broke his leg. His left leg, of course.

Is it just coincidence? If so, three times should be enough. In his junior year at Brother Rice, Morrison injured his left knee in the third game and missed the remainder of the season.

Such misfortune is frustrating. "It is, especially when the team is at an away game and you're sitting at home watching," Morrison said. "You don't feel like you're a part of the team."

So how did he react? "It got me really fired up to work out and get back in there," Morrison said. At least he got the chance

to prove he was a fast healer — Morrison missed just four weeks last season, returning for the final two Big Ten games and the Rose Bowl against Washington.

Of course, when you're playing for the Wolverines you're rarely guaranteed a position. "We've got so much quality depth here, you've got to work your butt off to get in, then if you get hurt and miss a week you might not get back in," Morrison said.

U-M coaches are hoping to get a full season out of Morrison this year. When he was in the lineup last year, he made things happen; he intercepted his fourth pass of the season against Washington, tying him for top honors on the team.

His weight is up 10 pounds, to 245, and he can still run a 4.9-4.0 yard dash. He has shown the ability, according to Herrmann, perhaps to play professionally.

But first, he has to stay healthy. "I try not to think about getting injured," Morrison said. "It can be psychological."

Mental anguish is something Morrison would rather deal with.

Notes: Morrison is one of four Brother Rice graduates on Michigan's roster. The others: Gannon Dudlar, a 6-foot-4, 265-pound junior defensive tackle; Paul Manning, a 6-4, 257-pound senior offensive lineman; and Marc Mila, a 6-3, 268-pound junior offensive lineman.

Dudlar has filled in at both defensive tackle and linebacker, and is listed as a top reserve at tackle on the depth chart. Mila is the first reserve at both guard and center, and Manning has seen action at several line positions the past two seasons, playing in 11 games.
