Accused faces new rape charges



A Westland woman testified in a court hearing that the defendant raped her while her daughter, 11, was in the room. The defendant, who will be tried on that charge, is also accused of raping another woman twice within seven months.

A 28-year-old Inkster man has now been charged with three rapes — involving two women — during the last 11 months in Westland.

Rodney Jerome Robinson had been charged Aug. 19 with raping a 33-year-old woman on June 22 at her Westches-

ter residence, northwest of Palmer and Henry Ruff.

On Thursday, he was arraigned in 18th District Court on new charges that he raped a 31-year-old woman last October at her nearby Birchwood Street home and then returned seven months later to rape her again.

Westland police Sgt. Mark Stobbe

testified Thursday that Robinson made statements about the Birchwood rapes in jail, on the same day he had been arraigned in the Westchester case.

Robinson apparently became confused about which incident prompted the initial charges when he made statements to Stobbe that linked him to the Birchwood rapes, court testimony indicated.

Altogether, Robinson faces seven counts of first-degree criminal sexual conduct and three counts of breaking and entering. Pleas of not guilty have been entered on his behalf.

He remains jailed on a \$50,000 cash

bond. If convicted, he could face up to life in prison. Police have said all three rapes occurred between 4 a.m. and 6 a.m.

On Thursday, Robinson was ordered by Judge Gail McKnight to stand trial in Detroit Recorder's Court for the rape in the 1300 block of Westchester. That decision came after the woman testified during a hearing.

Another hearing has been scheduled this Thursday to determine whether Robinson should be tried for the Birchwood rapes.

Cable spot produces hot air in city hall

Watching some city council members review Mayor Robert Thomas' performance on Westland cable is like seeing movie critics Siskel and Ebert rate the latest "Friday the 13th" slasher film.

Two thumbs down.

Thomas may not be as blood-thirsty as Jason of "Friday the 13th" fame. But some council members have certainly accused him of political thirst — an accusation he denies with Brando flair.

The latest sequel emerged last week when Councilman Kenneth Mehl blasted the Thomas administration for comments made during a promo for the mayor's town hall meetings, televised on Channel 8.

Mehl became angry because the promo indicated that the council rushes through its televised meetings, without allowing the administration to respond

Defendant in sex case told not to return home

A Westland man charged with showing pornographic movies to two 11-year-old girls and masturbating in front of them may have violated the conditions that allowed him to remain free on bond, police said.

Richard Charles Quimby, 34, returned to his Woodcrest Villa apartment on Wayne Road between Cowan and Joy, despite a judge's order that he stay away from the residence, Police Sgt. Laura Moore reported to 18th District Court.

Quimby had been arraigned Aug. 21 in 18th District Court on a charge of indecent exposure, amid accusations he lured the girls to his apartment. If

found guilty during an impending trial in district court, he could be sentenced up to a year in prison and fined as much as \$500.

Quimby had been released from custody after posting \$1,000, or 10 percent, of a \$10,000 bond. But he had been ordered to stay away from his apartment.

Today's bond hearing emerged after police learned that Quimby may have returned to the apartment, in violation of the court order.

Judge C. Charles Bokos today could decide to increase Quimby's bond or revoke it and order him held in custody, pending the outcome of his trial, court administrator David Wiacek said.

Council vote chalks up an OK for pool hall

A Westland businessman has tried to soothe fears that a pool hall he plans to open will become a teen hangout and scare tenants away from a local strip mall.

In a 5-2 vote, the Westland City Council has approved a billiard parlor that longtime city resident George Albert Marvaso wants to open in Westland Plaza, northwest of the Wayne Road-Hunter intersection.

"I want to put people to work and help bring taxes to the city," Marvaso told the council Tuesday.

Marvaso has said his business reflects a resurgence of billiard parlors that — unlike stereotypical, dusty pool

halls — are drawing a more upscale clientele.

But some council members raised concerns about the project, prompting a 5-2 vote to approve it. That reversed a

decision in June to deny it.

"I personally don't think this type of business should be in a shopping center," Councilman Kenneth Mehl said.

Mehl predicted teens will loiter at the pool hall, creating a nuisance and possibly causing other strip mall tenants to move out.

Moreover, Mehl said the billiard hall trend worries him. "We're going to have a pool hall on every corner in the city."

But Marvaso stressed that his pool hall will have a dress code and strict rules that won't allow teens to congregate during school hours. That drew support from some council members.

"Because it is upscale, I'm going to vote yes," council member Sandra Cicirelli said during Tuesday's meeting. Cicirelli's support was echoed by

councilmembers Glenn Anderson, Thomas Brown, Charles Pickering and Terri Reighard-Johnson. Mehl was joined in his opposition by council member Sharon Scott.

Marvaso submitted signatures from other Detroit area mall tenants who said they haven't had any problems with their pool-room neighbors.

"It's going to be more than a teen hangout," he said.

In another development, Marvaso is expected to approach the council later this month to seek a liquor license for the pool hall. That proposal, however, is expected to encounter stiffer council opposition.

Mehl predicted: "My bet is you're going to end up in circuit court on this one."

Pay-to-play policy pops open pocketbooks

With students now required to pay to play, Livonia school district parents are opening their checkbooks. Although it's still early in the school year, the number of players in most fall sports is about equal to last year — better for some teams, according to officials for the district which includes the northern section of Westland.

The district operates Churchill High, for students in the northwest section of the city, and Franklin High, for the northeast section.

The turnout for girls tennis teams declined, however, for reasons related to the new pay rules, officials said.

It costs middle and high schoolers \$100-\$140 to participate in most non-credit, after-school activities, from marching band to football to forensics. Until this year, they were free.

School officials will tally the fall sports numbers later this month. About 4,900 students took part in extra-curricular activities last year.

Marching band is one of the largest after-school pro-

grams. Churchill's marching band had a better turnout — about 80 — last week than last year. But the band's director expressed concern about the new plan.

"I don't see how it can have a positive effect," said James Murphy, instrumental music teacher at Churchill and the Creative and Performing Arts program.

Under the school board-approved "pay-to-participate" requirement, middle schoolers pay \$100; high schoolers pay \$140 for sports and \$100 for debate, literary magazine and other activities.

Athletics officials prefer the plan to eliminating high school sports programs altogether, which was threatened last year.

"It's something I don't like, but it's necessary to offer the entire quality sports program," said Don Albertson, Churchill's athletic director. His colleagues at Franklin and Stevenson agreed.

The Livonia district is not alone. Athletes in Northville, Plymouth and Dearborn also pay.

"It's still the exception and not the rule, but a number of school districts have added (pay requirements) this year," said Kenneth Watson, director of secondary

education. The fee is meant to offset state aid cuts to the Livonia district.

Fewer tennis players tried out this fall at the three high schools. Cross country participation declined at Franklin and swimming at Stevenson.

"I had a few girls come out who wanted to know before they paid, 'Am I on varsity?'" said Bonnie Wood, Churchill tennis coach. She couldn't offer guarantees.

Last year, 15 freshmen tried out at Churchill. This year's total was three.

"That doesn't bode well for the future of the program," Wood said.

She said the low turnout may mean that people don't want to pay, especially casual players who would not make big matches. Also, after threats last year of cutting the program, "a lot of kids turned their attention elsewhere," Wood said.

Kenneth Watson, director of secondary education, and the three high schools' athletic directors said there was not an outcry from parents about the plan. But its effects may become more apparent as the year continues. An active student, for example, could run up a bill

of \$420 — or more over three teams.

"Where I think it could hurt is down the line, in the spring, when parents have paid for a sport or two, especially for players who are not starters," said Dan Freeman, Franklin's athletic director.

Band teacher Murphy agreed: "Kids involved in extra-curricular activity are usually involved in more than one extra-curricular activity."

Murphy noted that students in a high school play would pay the same \$100 whether they have the lead role or work on lighting or makeup.

Freeman said Livonia's "pay to participate" plan is consistent but added that "hockey at \$140 is a bargain. For cross country, on the other hand, it is not."

Murphy said his marching band at \$100 a head would raise \$8,000 — more than the stipend the band gets for expenses.

Watson emphasized that because the program is new, "we may have to make some modifications for the next school year or even for this school year."

"The scariest thing to happen would be if it would be successful. I don't think the board would ever go back" to not charging, said Murphy.

The Westchester street woman testified Thursday that she awoke on the morning of June 22 when she heard the purse in her bedroom being unzipped and zipped. When she screamed, the intruder jumped on her bed, covered her face with a cloth and raped her, she said. He also performed oral sex on her, she said.

The woman's 11-year-old daughter, who has been sleeping with her,

huddled in a dark corner of the room during the attack, she said.

"He told me if I didn't do what he said that he would kill me," the woman testified.

She said the intruder also told her, "Do what I say. My friend has a gun." But she said she never heard anyone else in the house.

After her attacker fled, the woman learned that her purse, television, videocassette recorder, jewelry and

radar detector had been taken from her home, and her car was missing from her driveway. The auto was later recovered.

The woman testified that the intruder apparently entered her house through a window that wouldn't lock properly.

She testified Thursday that she couldn't identify Robinson, but police have said that matching fingerprints were found at the Westches-

ter and Birchwood residences.

Following Thursday's testimony, Judge McKnight ordered Robinson to stand trial in Recorder's Court.

As the Westchester woman testified, the Birchwood woman sat in the court room, in a show of support. Her testimony is expected to come this Thursday, during a hearing in 18th District Court to determine if Robinson should stand trial for raping her.

The charge against Quimby is a high misdemeanor, and he will be tried in district court.

His arrest came after police received "numerous" telephone calls that a man living in Woodcrest had tried to lure children to his apartment, Moore said. All the children were believed to be girls.

Police learned that the 11-year-olds allegedly had been inside the apartment after their parents were told, prompting them to notify police.

he said, "we think people deserve that answer."

But Mehl grew angry over a statement in the promo that indicated council members try to "get in and get out" of their meetings quickly, without taking time to discuss reports.

"Every single one of us puts a lot of time into this job," Mehl said, adding that he considered the statement "a slap in the face to this whole council."

Mehl even suggested the council may have to "take action" to oversee what's shown on Channel 8.

Council President Charles Pickering said he has told Thomas that some cable programs are not infor-

mational and don't belong on the air. Some shows amount to the administration trying to report news, Pickering said, "and government should not be in the business of reporting."

But Thomas has defended his decision to discuss council-requested reports during on-the-air town hall meetings.

"We did that (promo) in a positive light. We didn't do that to bash council," he said.

Thomas said he wants to keep his promise to city residents to bring government to the people. Although he's been accused of council-bashing, the mayor said he believes some council members are bashing

his administration.

"We're not going to get drawn into that," he said.

Thomas said some council members want to restrict what's shown on cable because, "They really don't want people to know everything that goes on."

But, he added, "We want to communicate with people, because they have a right to know."

Thomas suggested that Westland may have the most open government in the state. "How anybody could be critical of that or say we're

doing something wrong just boggles my mind," he said.

Still, some council members believe the mayor is using cable television for political gain and to thwart any criticism that might come his way.

As Mehl put it: "Our worst fear is coming true."

With next year's mayoral race looming, it's unavoidable that tension between the mayor and his political foes will escalate in front of the camera.

Stay tuned.

Seniors take root in cultivating healthy hobby

The summer crop is ripe with fresh home-grown vegetables.

But seniors who rent lots to cultivate their own gardens are campaigning to keep the program going despite the county's plan to end it, said Jean Barr, seniors program greenhouse coordinator.

A petition has been filed with county officials to prevent the planned closing.

"Hopefully we will be able to stay open," she said.

Seniors who live in senior housing or apartments in Wayne County can rent a plot of land to cultivate their own garden. The lots, rented through the senior program for people 55 and older, are 50-by-50 feet.

There are 496 garden plots available each year, with 99 percent in use, Barr said.

"We provide water for them and have volunteers there to help with the actual garden," she said.

The lots are plowed in the spring by a tractor that is owned through the organization.

Located on the northeast corner of Michigan Avenue and Merriman, the plots are used by many seniors.

"The president of our organization, Ernest Rehberg, and 14 other seniors are from Dearborn, and 10 others from Dearborn Heights," she said.

"I have had a garden here for eight years. After retiring it gives me something to do," Rehberg said.

"I plant, weed, and can the tomatoes that I grow," he said.

"I am concerned with the garden plots. I want to make sure that they are plowed and properly staked," he said.

"I love working outside, and since I have been retired since 1982, what else am I going to do?"

He has been a Dearborn resident for 45 years, but his land is full of trees, so it's easier for him to have a garden plot elsewhere.

The organization has Barr and one other paid staffer. Others volunteer their time to work with the program.

"Right now there are a lot of volunteers from General Motors. They are younger and more able," she said.

"We also maintain the grounds in and around the greenhouse," she said.

"The poinsettias that are growing now are for Christmas. Raising them brings in money into the organization which is non-profit," she said.

"We have garden plants and annuals in the spring," she said.

The houseplants are grown all year long inside the greenhouse.

"We do everything that pertains to the gardening of all of the plants," she said.

Depending on the climate during the growing season of April through October, some seniors can harvest cold crops very late in the season.

"The cold crops have a good chance if there isn't a cold spell," she said.

The greenhouse is open to the public to purchase plants.

The gardening lots are a meeting place for seniors. Being retired and living in senior apts or condos, this gives them the opportunity to meet others. "It keeps them away from the doctors. It also keeps them going," she said.

Parents vent frustration over school busing plan

Police were summoned to the Livonia school district's Frost Middle School Friday by parents upset that bus engines were left idling as students got on and off.

The officers issued no tickets, and school officials pledged to keep the engines turned off. Still, the incident shows the bitterness some private school parents view the district's new bus transfer system. The parents believe the arrangement is unsafe and that school officials are ignoring their concerns.

On the other hand, school officials, whose district serves the northern section of Westland, believe a minority of parents are being unreasonable. The system started Wednesday and any problems are being ironed out, an administrator said.

At Frost, on Stark north of the Jeffries Freeway, 25 buses arrive after picking up the mostly-parochial school students at neighborhood stops. The students then change to the bus that will take them to their school.

"It's working even smoother now," said director of operations Charles Ritter Friday. "Everyone down there, with the exception of these five parents" is satisfied.

Parents have been calling school board trustees, and will attend the Monday's school board, said Kathy Blaharski, the mother of two St. Michael's students. An attorney is reviewing the matter, she said.

So far the district has refused to address their objections, she said.

"That doesn't set well," Blaharski said.

One concern is that buses were late last week, she

said. Another is safety because youngsters are in a parking lot with 25 buses and without adequate supervision, Blaharski said.

Also, students must cross busy roads to reach bus stops, she said.

Ritter has said that the safety of children is the district's top priority. The district buses about 1,100 private school students and another 7,000 public school students daily.

Ritter acknowledged that some buses ran late last week, which was the first week of public school, but vowed that would change. Drivers will start doing "load counts" this week, and planners will juggle routes where necessary to more evenly distribute students among buses.

"When you're transporting 8,000 students and have 95 buses, something is not going to be right," Ritter said. "It usually takes about 21 days to refine."

The Frost arrangement was developed for this year after Livonia Schools cut \$130,000 (equal to seven bus drivers) from the transportation budget. That cut followed reductions in state aid to the district.

Another St. Michael's parent, Debbie Muncy, said the Frost system is not the best way to save money. Consolidating routes would work better, she said. "Instead of figuring out the most sensible way to (save money) or the safest way, they did it the most irritating way," Muncy said.

School board trustee Kenneth Timmons said the district needs to give the setup more time before evaluating it.

The parents, he said, "have been in contact with me like you can't believe."

Restaurant's opening could provide 100 new jobs in city

Westland is expected to become the second Michigan city called home by Applebee's, a national restaurant chain that could hire as many as 125 local workers.

The chain, based in Kansas City, Mo., wants to build one of its neighborhood pub-type restaurants on the southeast corner of Warren Road and Central City Parkway.

Company officials are expected to propose a site plan to the Westland City Council in late October or early November, in hopes of starting construction early next year.

The chain has already asked the

city for a liquor license — a request the council has postponed until it receives the proposed site plan.

Council members don't appear opposed to the project, but most have agreed it would be premature to grant a liquor license until site plans are approved.

"It would be putting the cart before the horse," Councilman Kenneth Mehl said during Tuesday's council meeting. "Basically we would be giving a (liquor) license to a piece of dirt."

Company officials have agreed to return to the council this fall to seek approval for site plans and a liquor license.

"We won't build it without a liquor license," said John Carlin, a Detroit attorney representing Applebee's.

But council members haven't indicated there will be any hurdles once the appropriate site plans have been submitted.

Applebee's has expanded to 31 states, and Westland is the second Michigan city — Southgate is first — to be chosen as a site for the casual-dining restaurant, company spokeswoman Sue Carroll said.

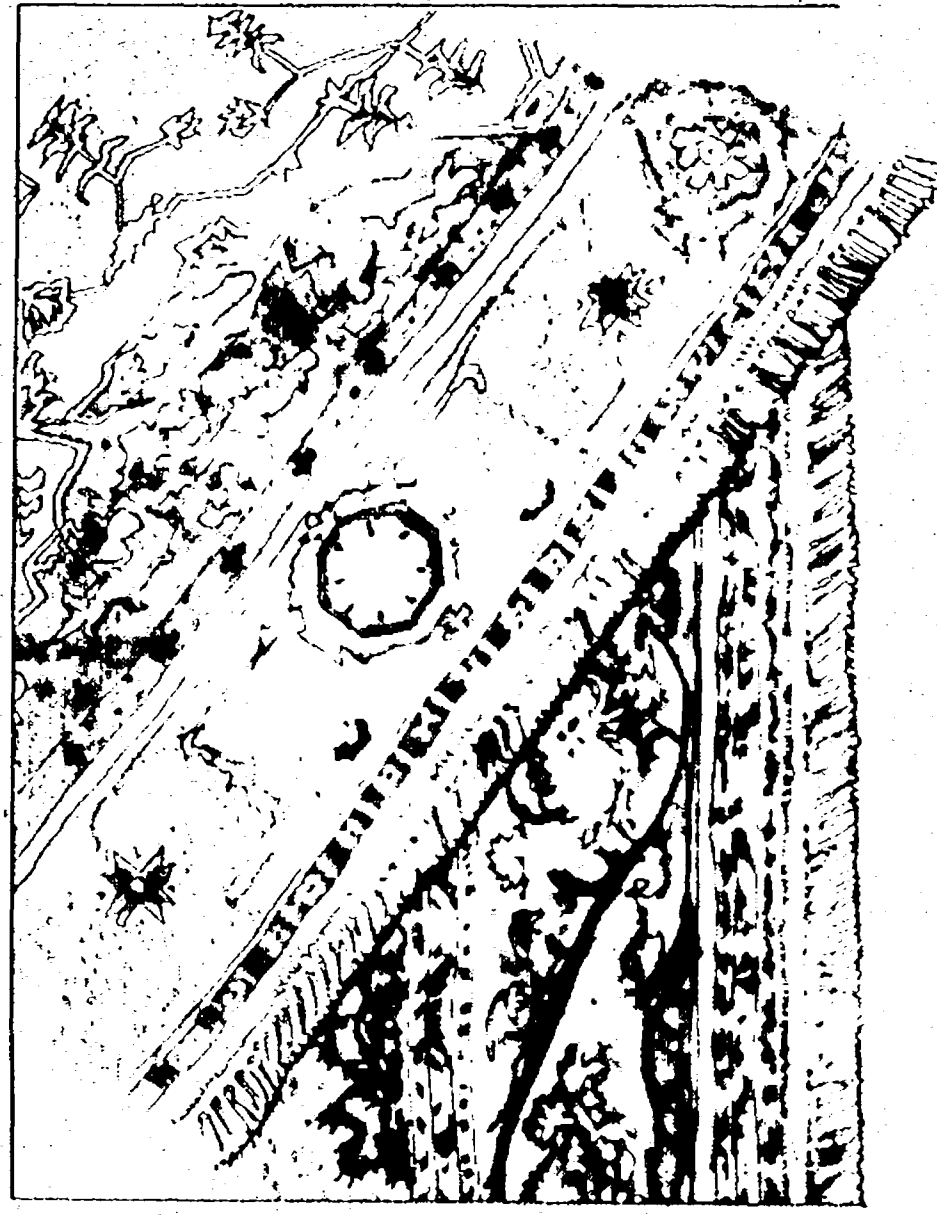
The restaurant could provide as many as 125 local jobs, she said. "We do hire a lot locally."

Driver faces assault, shoplifting charges

A 34-year-old Detroit driver has been charged with trying to run over a Westland Center police officer and smashing into another officer's patrol car during what police described as a successful escape from a Hudson's department store theft.

Claude Ernest Wilson has been ordered to stand trial in Detroit Recorder's Court on charges of felonious assault, retail fraud and malicious destruction of property.

The charges stem from a 4 p.m. Aug. 25 incident in which police said a man stuffed four men's suits in a garbage bag and walked from

Hudson's, prompting a pursuit by mall security. The suits were valued at more than \$2,000, Westland police Sgt. Steve Ryskamp said.

The man ran to his car in the Westland Center parking lot, but mall police officer Brian Aure managed to open a passenger door and grab the suits, Ryskamp said.

Seconds later, the man shifted his car into reverse and tried to run over another officer, Thomas Vallean, who was standing behind the car, Ryskamp said. Vallean managed to jump out of the car's path.

"Witnesses said (the thief) put the car in reverse and tried to hit him," the police sergeant said.

Seconds later, the thief smashed into a patrol car that had pulled up behind him, and then sped from the mall parking lot and escaped, Ryskamp said.

During a subsequent photo line-up at the police station, four of seven witnesses who saw the dramatic incident identified Wilson, and the Wayne County prosecutor's office issued a warrant for his arrest on Aug. 31, Ryskamp said.

He was arrested Sept. 2 by Detroit police and turned over to the Westland Police Department. A plea of not guilty was entered on his behalf during an arraignment in 18th District Court.

Dressed in a suit, Wilson

appeared Thursday before 18th District Judge Gail McKnight for a preliminary examination to determine if he should be tried on the charges. He waived the hearing, meaning he was automatically bound over for trial in Recorder's Court.

If convicted, Wilson could face up to four years in prison for felonious assault, four years for malicious destruction of property, and two years for retail fraud.

He has been released from the county jail after posting 10 percent of a \$20,000 bond. His next court appearance will be Sept. 24, when he will be arraigned on the charges in Recorder's Court.

Here comes the bride (looking for her dress)

A western Wayne County family and several hundred other customers of a financially strapped metro Detroit bridal chain have turned to consumer advocates for help after some were sartorially stranded at the altar.

Detroit's director of consumer affairs Esther Shapiro is investigating possible action against an attorney who owns the six bridal boutiques. The stores have come under fire for failing to deliver previously ordered wedding gowns to area brides-to-be.

Gary Gottschling owns Boulevard Bridal Salon, Today's Bride and Sue Gordon in Birmingham, Kitty Kelly locations in Troy and Dearborn, and a second Boulevard Bridal store.

Dr. Frances Darling of Livonia

said his daughter Kimberley was "strung along" until three days before her Aug. 15 wedding. The bride called Jacobson's for "an emergency bridal dress." The original gown, ordered in January from Today's Bride on Brown Street, had been expected within four months.

Similar customer complaints surfaced two weeks ago against Boulevard Bridal on Hunter Boulevard. Gottschling could not be reached for comment.

"I've had 200 calls from girls and the calls keep coming in," Shapiro said. "What's strange about this, though, is with all the picketing and all the publicity, people are still going in and putting money down."

The consumers affair department is compiling a list of dress manufacturers that have been dealing with Gottschling. Some suppliers agreed to send orders to brides who

intervene and others will only deal directly with Gottschling for bills unpaid, Shapiro said.

"I don't want to throw words like fraud around, but if you're taking money and not filling their orders there are laws to protect people," said Shapiro.

A store employee at Boulevard Bridal said the store is trying to fill orders, though some manufacturers have refused to deliver until they talk to Gottschling.

The employee said Gottschling has told them he plans to keep the stores open and won't file for bankruptcy. He also has been paying employees, she said.

"I don't know what his plans are,

but we just have to believe what he says," the employee said.

Another employee appeared less hopeful: "The checks were a week late and they're bouncing."

Four lawsuits against Boulevard Bridal are pending in Oakland County Circuit Court from manufacturers asking for payment of \$19,900 for dresses previously delivered.

No lawsuits have been filed in circuit court against Today's Bride since 1984.

"(Today's Bride) lied to us until the end," said Darling. "I can't believe they'd do that to someone getting married."

2 teens to be tried in beating at party

Two Westland teens have been accused of kicking and beating another teenager who decided he no longer wanted to belong to a group of young males that police described as "skinheads."

Chris Bugosh and Jamie Gates, both 18, have been ordered to stand trial in Detroit Recorder's Court amid charges they beat a former skinhead so severely that he spent four days in Garden City Hospital.

"His face was all swollen, and he had bruises everywhere," Westland police Sgt. Russell Nowaczek said.

The teens have been accused of beating the dissident skinhead during a party in the 38000 block of Avondale, northwest of Palmer and Newburgh roads. The victim was beaten in the basement and then driven to Van Buren Township, where he was dumped in a ditch, Nowaczek said.

The victim managed to stagger for help to a nearby house, where the residents telephoned his family, Nowaczek said.

"He just decided he didn't want to belong to the group anymore," the police sergeant said.

Skinheads have a reputation for being rowdy and unruly.

After a lengthy investigation into the March 6 incident, Westland police arrested Bugosh on Sept. 2, one day after they arrested Gates.

The teens appeared Thursday before 18th District Judge Gail McKnight for a preliminary examination to determine if they should stand trial on charges of assault with intent to do great bodily harm, less than murder.

Both teens waived the hearing, in a move that averted testimony Thursday and automatically sent the case to Recorder's Court for trial. If convicted, they could face a maximum penalty of 10 years in prison.

Pleas of not guilty have been entered for them.

Bugosh and Gates are scheduled to be arraigned on the charges Sept. 24 in Recorder's Court.

Bugosh remained in the county jail last week on a 10-percent, \$5,000 bond, meaning he could be released upon posting \$500, the county jail confirmed.

Nowaczek said Gates is free on a \$5,000 personal bond, which doesn't require any money to be posted as long as he stays out of trouble.

Commissioners compromise

McNamara agrees to single ballot question

The Wayne County Board of Commissioners is battling 500 on ballot proposals.

Having voted last month to put six proposals on the November ballot, commissioners were chagrined when county Executive Edward McNamara vetoed four of them.

In his veto statements, McNamara argued that the proposals were either illegal, superfluous or attempts to usurp his authority.

Then during a spirited discussion Thursday, the commission voted 13-1 to drop three of the vetoed proposals in exchange for McNamara letting the fourth one go on the November ballot.

Only commissioner, William O'Neil, D-Southgate, voted against compromising with McNamara. O'Neil argued that the board should vote to override the vetoes or challenge McNamara in court. "We should have been in court a week and a half ago," he said.

The proposal McNamara agreed to allow on the ballot would require the county executive to submit an executive department reorganization plan to the commission for approval within 90 days after taking office or getting re-elected.

That means, for example, that if McNamara gets re-elected in 1994 and wants to change the duties of one of his employees, he would have to get commission permission.

Even though he consented to letting this proposal on the ballot, McNamara called it "merely but another attempt to again intrude

and usurp the administrative authority of the executive branch."

Commissioner Bryan Amann, D-Canton, favors the proposal, but doesn't expect voters to approve it. He said voters probably won't understand the proposal and therefore will vote against it.

"It may be too esoteric for the voters to appreciate and understand," Amann said. "This proposal is fighting an uphill battle."

Commissioner Maurice Breen, R-Plymouth, agreed with Amann. "The inclination would be to vote no on something like that," he said.

Deputy county executive Mike Duggan called the proposal "crazy" and said McNamara will oppose it. "I don't think anyone will take it seriously," he said. "If this passes, then the legislative/executive bick-

ering could shut down county government."

Among the ballot proposals the commission withdrew Thursday was one that would have asked voters to permit the use of "the separation of powers concept to determine the meaning of the charter as to the relationship of the executive, judicial and legislative branches of county government."

In his veto statement, McNamara called that proposal "too vague and ambiguous" and said "the proposed language does nothing to clarify the matter."

The second withdrawn ballot proposal, put forth by Kay Beard, D-Westland, would have allowed the county's auditor general to audit all county agencies, including McNamara's office.

In his veto statement, McNamara

said Beard's proposal violates state law and is an attempt to "usurp the authority of the (executive)."

The third withdrawn proposal would have given the commission approval rights over the pay and benefits of all non-union executive branch employees.

McNamara said in his veto statement that executive branch employees are paid about the same as legislative branch employees, and so the proposed change is unnecessary.

Also to appear on the November ballot are two proposals that McNamara did not veto.

The first one will seem very familiar to voters because they voted it down by a 59-41 percent margin in the Aug. 4 primary. This proposal asks voters to tax themselves an additional half mill for 10 years to support health services and mental health services in the county.

Amann opposed putting the millage-increase question back on the ballot. "The action of the commission has been childish," he said. "It was disrespectful to the voters." McNamara also opposes this one, Duggan said.

The last proposal concerns a 1988, 10-year, one-mill tax. One-tenth of that money was supposed to be spent to build and operate a juvenile offender work/training institution. But that hasn't been done because of a shift in state policy.

So the proposal asks voters to allow the money raised with that 0.1 mill to be given back to Wayne County cities and townships to pay for local youth programs.

JOINT REPLACEMENTS
If you need both knees or both hips replaced because of advanced arthritis, the decision of which side to operate on first, rests with you. Which joint hurts the worse rather than which side x-ray shows as more advanced, determines the site of the initial operation.
In other cases of multiple joint replacement, professional judgement takes over. If your arthritis involves the hands and knees, and/or a hip and shoulder, the orthopedic surgeon decides which joint to replace first and the order to follow.
The general rule is that upper extremity replacement comes before lower extremity, with hand before shoulder and foot before knee before hip.
The reason relates to rehabilitation. A successful knee replacement depends on a program of progressive ambulation. Initially you must be able to use a walker. You need hands strong enough to grasp the walker and shoulders of sufficient strength to bear the weight of your body. If your hands or shoulders cannot accept this burden, they need repair, then you can undertake a knee operation.
In the lower extremities the same rule holds. Before you can walk, you must be able to stand in a stable manner. If your feet are deformed, they cannot take on the stress of maintaining a balanced stance. Therefore, foot surgery takes precedence over knee repair.

Perot rode in on a mood of national discontent

Early in 1990, at the height of a demagogue-dominated mob effort to suppress my egalitarian ideas and get me fired from the Rochester schools' assistant superintendency, I was quoted in an Observer & Eccentric newspaper as follows:

"Thank God our children are growing up in a democracy where no demagogue can legally close their door to free speech and critical inquiry. So let's not voluntarily close that door on their teachers and educational leaders with our own hands."

"If through ignorance and fear we do that, it's only a matter of time before a dictator does ride into national office, because our electorate will be too unschooled to understand what they'll be losing if they don't oppose him, and they'll become a non-electorate almost overnight."

Two years later came Ross Perot, the most-dangerous demagogue to emerge

in a democratic country since the days of Wisconsin Senator Joe McCarthy, or maybe even the days following the fall of Germany's Weimar Republic.

He was a candidate who spied on people, cloaked himself in the trappings of militarism, paid for his own monumental campaign — meant to further enrich the super-rich by cutting the capital gains tax — and wanted the Constitution changed so as president he could veto any appropriation passed by Congress that he didn't favor.

Even though perhaps he didn't realize it, he frighteningly resembled a presidential candidate for an autocracy rather than for a constitutional democracy.

Making Perot's candidacy even scarier was the fact that he rode in during an era of national discontent with an elitist Republican president who is sadly out of touch with the needs of ordinary Americans.

And while that president's Democratic challenger offers a progressive platform, he wasn't promptly forthcoming in responding to an allegation of philandering. In the end, his initial hesitancy in responding to that allegation still could cost Bill Clinton the presidency — even though it shouldn't. If their now well-documented womanizing had prevented the election

of George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Franklin Roosevelt, Dwight D. Eisenhower, Jack Kennedy and Lyndon Johnson, the United States would have suffered immeasurably.

I only wish that right off the bat Clinton had said of his accuser, "If she says we did it, I guess you'll have to draw whatever conclusions you wish. I'm too much a gentleman to contradict a lady. Now let's get back to the real issues regarding America's needs. Next question!"

Regrettably, he didn't say that — and although the topic has faded somewhat, count on the trailing Bush campaign to revive it now with a vengeance. Given the shortcomings of both Bush and Perot, such a revival could have proved doubly damaging had Perot remained viably in the race.

While Perot would have diluted Bush's votes, I doubt he'd have taken

enough from Clinton to win. That is, he probably wouldn't have unless — God forbid — our schools failed to educate a majority of voting Americans to recognize the traits of an autocrat.

Now that Perot has maneuvered himself safely out of contention, I'm even more confident that we'll choose the progressive, young Democrat rather than vote again for the Republican who's been sitting in the White House for four years — and who never did stand for much there except elitism.

- Bill Clinton . . . so he will stop grinning all the time and say something forceful.

- All Republicans . . . so they will stop blaming poor people for being poor.

- Vegetarians . . . so they will have enough energy to drive to the store and buy a steak.

- All politicians . . . so they will stop blaming their opponents and take a look at themselves. As one local wag put it when talking about a candidate: "He his a formidable opponent, himself."

blame their parents for everything. As my wife says, "the statute of limitations should be up" when it comes to blaming mom or dad.

- Gun nuts . . . so they will feel secure enough to live life without an AK-47 under the bed.

The list is endless, the word empowerment complex, but the whole thing is really pretty simple. It's time to quit whining, get off the couch and take out the trash.

And just think of it, our mothers and fathers knew what empowerment was when they asked us to clean our rooms when we were kids.

They just had a different name for it.

FINNISH UP

A good many visitors to Helsinki will arrive by boat, skimming into the deep South Harbor on one of the huge pleasure ships that cruise daily between Finland and Sweden, Germany, Poland and Estonia.

A few days — or even hours — later they will reboard and head for Russian waters. The traffic is about as heavy in the opposite direction.

Helsinki remains a little cousin to St. Petersburg in the minds — and travel patterns — of many foreigners.

Some won't even realize that Helsinki celebrates its 75th anniversary of independence in December; typically, the city has refrained from publicity that might be deemed immodest, provocative or overcommercial. But in the last century the Finnish capital has succeeded in honing an unusual Nordic-Baltic-European identity in its physical look as well as its spirit.

Remnants of Swedish (1550-1809) and Russian (1809-1917) domination now share center stage with Finland's own styles: National Romanticism (a hybrid of Jugendstil focusing on local materials and myths) and the Functionalism made famous by Alvar Aalto.

At this time of the year facades of all kinds are neutralized by flower beds and terrace restaurants filled with ultraviolet-ray-loving Finns, whose immediate priority is to soak in every last bit of light before the darkening of autumn.

Events

For a country of only 5 million people Finland's own musical talent is prodigious. A revival of the Finnish National Opera's production of Leevi Madetoja's "The Ostrobothnians" opened on Sept. 5. It also plays Sept. 16, 20 and Oct. 6. Tickets: from \$11 to \$40. The box office is at 34B Albertinkatu (129 255).

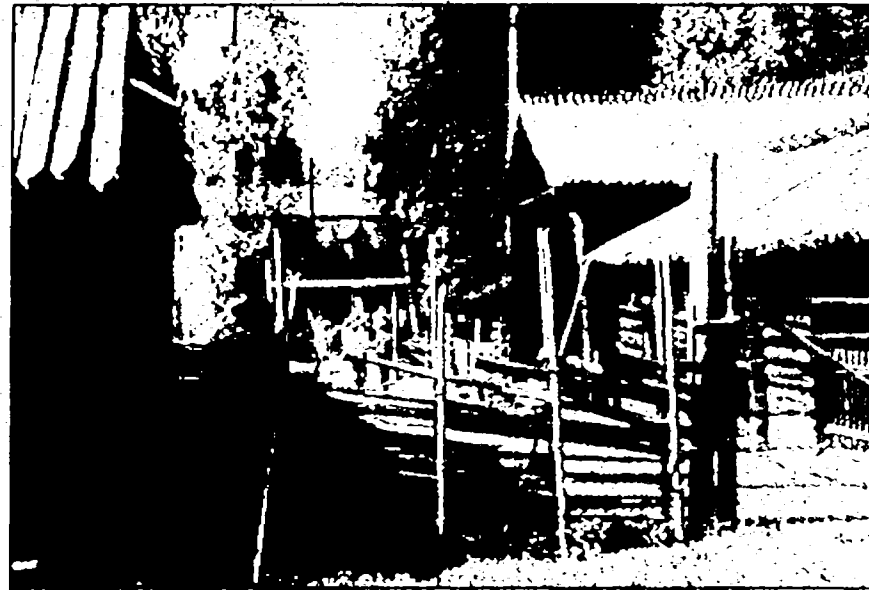
The Finnish Radio Symphony orchestra begins its regular season with the conductor Jukka-Pekka Saraste on Sept. 16, in Finlandia Hall. Frank Peter Zimmermann will perform Dvorak's Violin Concerto; also on the program are Debussy and Scriabin. Tickets: \$12.50, \$17.20 and \$20.

Just as the rains start to fall and the sun starts to beat its winter retreat, the Fifth Helsinki Film Festival — Love and Anarchy (446 428) — unrolls in six movie houses downtown. This year's festival, Sept. 25 to Oct. 1, will offer more than 100 screenings with emphasis on new Japanese cinema and a retrospective of David Cronenberg's work. Tickets: \$6, or 10 films for \$49.

Sightseeing

Finlandia Hall, built in 1971, is not just Helsinki's main concert site but the famous last work of Alvar Aalto, who designed everything from its facade to its furniture. Unfortunately, the white marble exterior has decayed drastically and must be changed.

Across the street stands a monument to the National Romantic style, the Finnish National Museum, 34 Mannerheimintie (40 501), built in 1906. Its architecture echoes various old Finnish churches and castles and the foyer is decorated with frescoes by the National Romantic artist Akseli Gallen-Kallela.

The unpretentious but pleasing permanent collection traces life in Finland from prehistoric times to the present. Open daily from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. (to 3 p.m. after Sept. 1); on Tuesday also 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. Admission: \$1.20 and \$2.40.

Also nearby, the Tempelliakio Church, 3 Lutherinkatu, was built di-

rectly into a rocky outcrop in 1969; its solar ceiling spreads from coiled copper into panes of glass that let in natural light.

In addition to Lutheran services the church holds fine chamber- and folk-music concerts. Hours for visiting change weekly, but it is usually open Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Call 494 698.

On nice days Helsinki's "tourist" islands are places to relax. Seurasaari, connected to the mainland by a wooden bridge 3 miles from the city center, has been turned into an open-air museum (484 712) strewn with old farmsteads and other buildings transplanted from different parts of Finland.

In September, partly open with no tours (but the guide booklets are very thorough), Mondays to Fridays 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.; Saturdays and Sundays 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. Admission: \$1.20 and \$2.40; Wednesdays, free.

The purchase of a Helsinki Card can be a worthwhile investment since it grants free passage on all metropolitan transport and free or reduced entrance to many sites.

The card can be bought from the Helsinki City Tourist Office, 19 Pohjoisesplanadi (169 3757), and at some hotels and travel agencies. Cost: \$18.40 for one day, \$26 for two days, \$31 for three days; for children ages 7 to 16, \$11 to \$16.

Where to stay

The Hotel Strand Inter-Continental, 4 John Stenbergin Ranta (39 351), is a world-class hotel with 200 rooms on the waterfront about five minutes from the downtown area. Request a room with a sea view. Doubles cost \$278 weekdays; \$139 weekends.

The venerable Hotel Seurahuone Sociis, 12 Kaivokatu (170 441), has 118 carefully appointed rooms, many of them quite large, right across from the beautiful Helsinki Railway Station. Downstairs is the city's most famous cafe, resplendent in high-ceilinged Jugendstil and open late into the night. Doubles cost \$222 weekdays; \$114 weekends.

Budget: Hotel Olympia, 2 Lantinen Brahenkatu (750 801), has 99 orderly rooms — many overlooking a tree-lined sports field — in a residential area about 15 minutes from downtown. Doubles cost \$95 all week.

The beds are a bit hard, but the Hotelli Helka, 23 Pohjoisen Rautatiekatu (440 581), has 161 decent rooms in the city center and is part of the Best Western chain. Doubles in the old part cost \$93 weekdays or \$68 weekends; in the new part, \$149 weekdays or \$107 weekends.

The Theater Inn Omaphoja, 3 Itäinen Teatterikuja (666 211), occupies part of a turn-of-the-century building behind the National Theater. Its reception area is truly dramatic, but the 15 bedrooms are austere. Doubles with private shower and toilet cost \$78, doubles with toilet \$63, doubles without either \$61.

Full-service hotels in Helsinki generally have sauna available, but bathtubs and double beds are less certain.

Special agents track down real deals

This summer's low airfares have been tempting — but often difficult to find.

The reason is simple: The airlines set aside a limited number of seats to sell at an advertised price.

With a computerized pricing system they can monitor, hour by hour, how many seats have been sold and how many are left. Often as the demand changes, so do the fares.

The number of such fare hikes is staggering — as many as 200,000 price shifts per day during the recent airfare wars.

What's a consumer to do? One recourse is to find a trained travel agent who is equipped with a travel computer network that keeps up, second by second, with the new rates. Preferably that would be a major computer-reservations system, such as American Airlines' Sabre or United Airlines' Apollo network.

In fact, more travelers are using the services of agents, according to statistics gathered by the American Society of Travel Agents (ASTA), which represents more than 20,000 agencies in 129 countries.

ASTA estimates that 80 percent of all air tickets are now booked by travel agents. So are 40 percent of all hotel reservations and 95 percent of all cruise reservations.

But choosing a travel agent can be difficult.

"You should choose a travel agent the same way you would pick a doctor or a lawyer — by asking friends and relatives to recommend one," says Emily Porter, a spokeswoman for ASTA.

"It's important to visit the agency and to ask questions. Equally important are the questions they ask you, to determine your interests, your budget, where you've been and where you'd like to go.

"Find out if they've been to the destination or taken the cruise line you're considering."

Travel agencies run the gamut from local mom-and-pop shops to well-equipped branches of major travel agencies such as American Express and Carlson Travel Net-

work. Some will book anything and everything; others are specialists, making reservations only, for example, on cruises.

"I always encourage people to speak with the owner or manager of a travel agency," says Brian Robb, vice president of retail-marketing for Carlson Travel Network, which has 1,300 branches across the United States.

"That first contact is the most important. That person should be able to steer you to the agent who can best help you, to the one who knows cruises, for example, or resorts.

"You don't want to find yourself speaking with an agent who only does business travel and can book a Hyatt or the shuttle, but has never done resorts before."

President's Detroit speech draws cheers and jeers

President George Bush's speech to the Detroit Economic Club last Thursday took hits from Democrats and was a hit with Republicans.

Trying to strike a conservative, anti-big-government pose, Bush promised tax and spending cuts in the first year of a second term if he should be re-elected. He didn't say which taxes he would reduce, but suggested he could cut the income tax by 1 percent, reduce the tax on small businesses by a third and cut the capital gains tax.

"I want to stimulate entrepreneurial capitalism, not punish it," he said. "I want to empower people to

make their own choices, not yoke them to new bureaucracies. I want a government that spends less, regulates less and taxes less."

Bush also said he would:
• Reduce the White House budget by one-third if Congress agrees to a one-third cut in its budget, too.

• Streamline the executive branch bureaucracy by merging or abolishing parts of it.

• Reduce the pay of federal employees making more than \$75,000/year by 5 percent.

About five hours after Bush's speech, U.S. Rep. Sander Levin, D-Southfield, whose district includes Redford Township, issued a one-

page press release criticizing it.

"Once again the president has demonstrated his inability to relate to the problems of ordinary Americans," Levin said. "He called for a renewed America, but dragged out the same tired, old ideas he's touted for four years, like an untargeted cut in the capital gains tax. He confirmed that another four years of a Bush administration would be simply more of the same."

U.S. Sen. Carl Levin, D-Michigan, panned the Bush speech in a press release, too. "Michigan has lost a quarter of a million manufacturing jobs since 1979, and it wasn't until this election rolled around that President Bush seemed to

care," he said. "He has done nothing to use the tools he's been given to reverse our painfully weak trade policy. As Ben Franklin said, 'Well done is better than well said.'"

State Sen. Bob Geake, R-Northville, who is running against incumbent Democrat William D. Ford in the 13th District, said he didn't hear Bush's speech to the economic club.

But on Bush's proposal to cut taxes, Geake said, "That sounds to me like a good program and I would support it." He also favored the

plans to cut White House and Congress budgets by one-third and to streamline the executive branch bureaucracy.

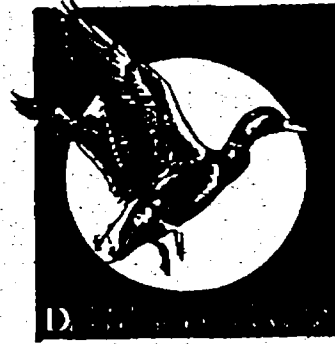
The new 13th District includes Plymouth, Plymouth Township, part of Livonia, Canton Township, Garden City and Westland.

Ford didn't like Bush's speech. "(Bush) seemed to string together a bunch of his old ideas that we've heard before," Ford said. "He didn't answer the concerns that the working people of our district express to me. They're worried about whether

their job will be there next year, how they're going to pay for a health emergency, or if they're going to be able to send their kids to college."

U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, R-Plymouth, heard Bush's speech on Thursday "and thought it was an excellent speech," according to Gary Cates, a Pursell aide. "It's good to see that they're moving forward with the Bush agenda rather than allowing the Democrats to set the pace." Pursell is not running for re-election.

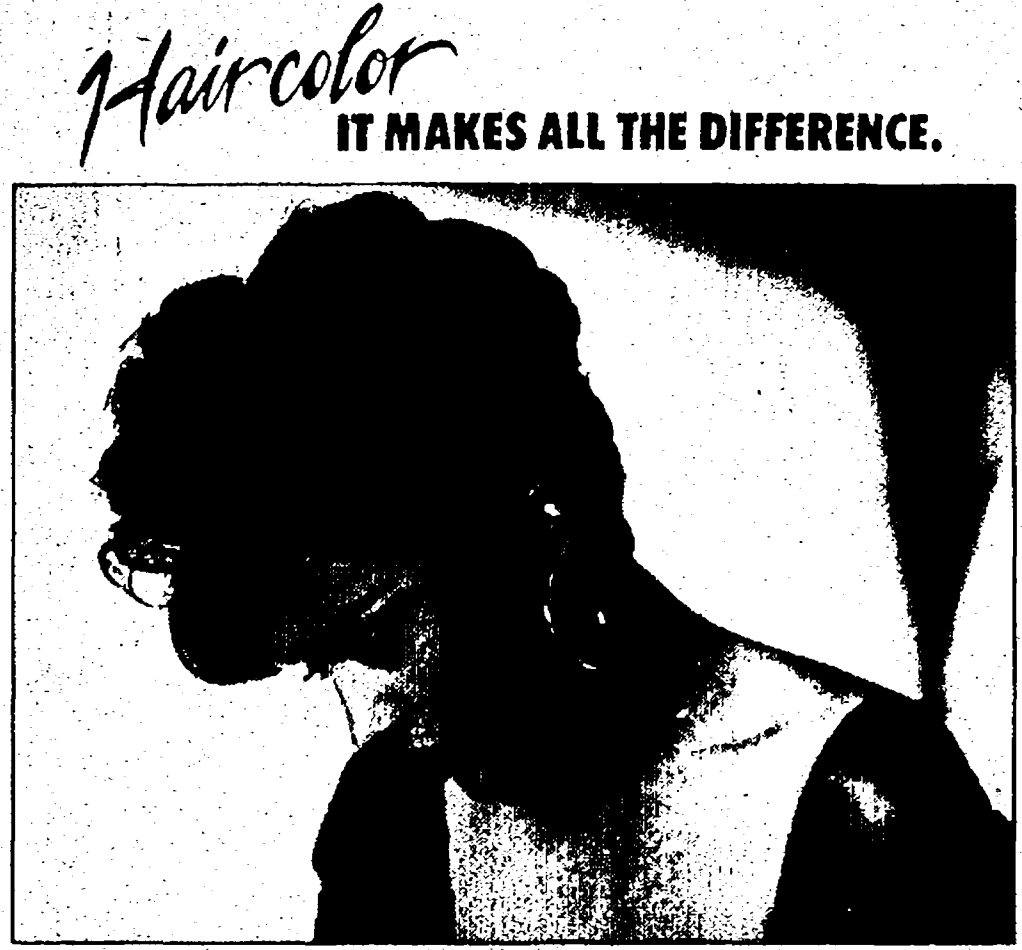

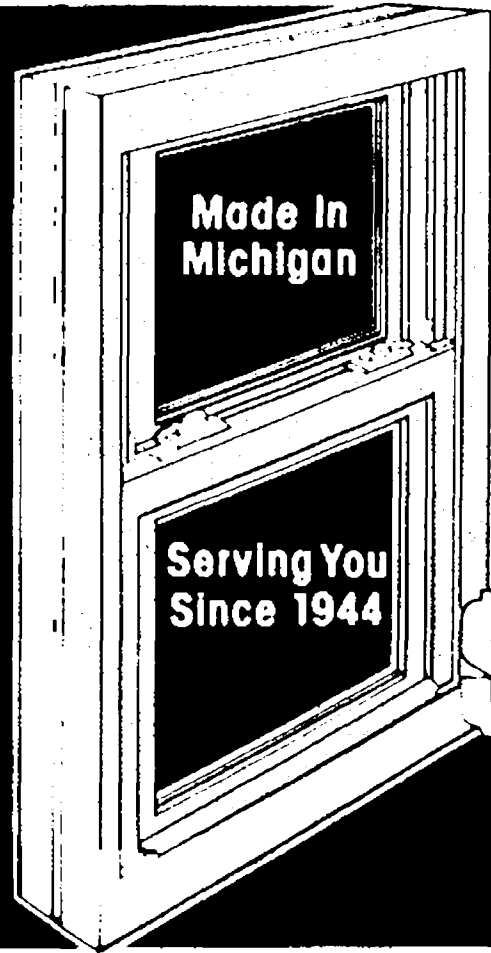

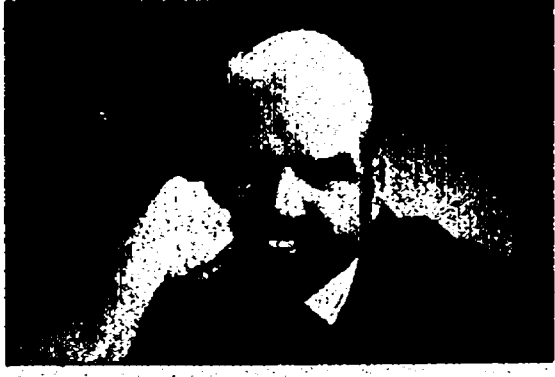

A little stuffing makes hefty vegetables a meal

Oh ye with garden, take heed! The very best summer vegetables are those picked in their infancy, tiny, tender, and still glistening with the fresh dew of morning.

But as summer wears on, the garden patch seems to explode, sometimes producing faster than we can harvest.

And when we return from vacations to find the inevitable zucchini that in our absence has grown to the size of a Volkswagen, look upon it as an opportunity to turn a liability into an asset with wonderful stuffed vegetable dishes.

Even those who don't toil to raise their own vegetables will always need to find uses for mature vegetables, since many farmers, choosing left over flavor, wait to pick their crops until they have reached maximum growth.

As a result, by the end of summer, markets and kitchen gardens alike are flooded with vegetables that are perfect for stuffing.

Stuffy vegetables

Vegetables most adapted to stuffing are artichokes, cabbage, tomatoes, zucchini, peppers, onions, eggplant, turnips and mushrooms. Many of these can be filled, cooked and served either hot or cold. Ah, but the most proficient by far is the lowly summer squash, which, because of their delicate flavors, are always ideal for stuffing.

Zucchini, crooked neck, pattypan and acorn squash, beg to be stuffed with the likes of a delicate poppyseed bread stuffing or, in contrast, a hearty stuffing comprised of chopped sausage, onion, garlic and tomato. Even a subtle mixture of both could only benefit their obscure flavor.

Momma's stuffing

Momma always prepared zucchini stuffed with a mixture of cottage cheese, Parmesan cheese, egg and pepper. Combining the latter, she would wack the giant zucchini lengthwise with a kitchen weapon we, as kids, called "the machete".

Using a wooden spoon that sometimes doubled as a disciplinary tool, she would scoop out the seeds with one firm stroke, something that to this day, she still accomplishes with skill.

Even though the filling was a simple mixture of dairy products, when momma now tries the same dish at my house, only prepared with farmer's cheese, fresh grated Romano cheese, Amish brown eggs and fresh ground pepper, she still secretly proclaims her recipe to still be the best (or so dad says.) But that's OK because momma's taste for the simple will never go out of style.

Momma not only excelled with stuffing a zucchini but also equally impressive was her ability to stuff one mean pepper and an occasional onion. The peppers weren't the typical Hungarian stuffed peppers, baked beyond recognition in canned tomato juice.

Her's were first roasted to remove the bitter skins, then stuffed with a three meat meatloaf-type mixture comprised of ground beef, pork and veal.

I can remember observing her open one of those tiny cans of mushrooms in gravy, a can of French fried onion rings and a can of Campbell's condensed cream of celery soup. Mix it all with a dice of onion (with hands, of course,) then scoop up just enough of the mixture to be stuffed into an awaiting shell.

Topped with just a splash of tomato juice, these stuffed peppers were right up there on the family's list of favorite requests when mealtime came around.

Outstanding onions

Onions are a Janes Gang favorite, especially when hollowed and filled with seasoned breadcrumbs and butter.

These are especially easy to create when wrapped in foil and tossed onto the grill or simply baked in a 350 degree oven. The same can go for pattypan squash.

This year's garden produced some succulent pattypan and a mixture of ground sausage, breadcrumbs, Parmesan cheese and a little red wine turned an otherwise bland and mundane vegetable into a meal-in-itself stuffed vegetable.

So if Mother Nature pulls a fast one on you and your garden, never underestimate what a little stuffing might do.

Don't forget to add "stuff it" to your vegetable repertoire of slice it, dice it, chop it, stir fry it, steam it, bake it, shake it, etc. What might have been a reject can become a star — with stuffing.

FIGHT snack attacks WITH CRISP

Apples



If you want to be healthy to the core, reduce the fat in your diet, and reach for an apple the next time you're hungry for a snack.

You've heard the saying — "an apple a day keeps the doctor away." Well, it's true, apples are good for you. The next time you're hungry for something crisp and sweet, reach for an apple.

Think apples when you're planning fall dinner menus, too. Wendy Schwartz of Birmingham, a registered dietitian and volunteer for the American Heart Association of Michigan created a healthy low fat, low cholesterol harvest dinner using apples.

The main course, Autumn Apple Chicken, (see recipe inside) features boneless chicken breasts with apple cider and apple wedges. She got the recipe from the "The Health Club Cooks," published by the Jewish Community Center of Metropolitan Detroit.

Autumn Apple Chicken is a variation of a dish in the "Silver Palate Cookbook," by Julee Rosso & Sheila Lukins. It was created by Davida Robinson, one of the JCC cookbook editors, and contains no added fat.

It has become a part of the Robinson Rosh Hashanah (Jewish New Year) meal. This year Rosh Hashanah begins on Monday, Sept. 28 and apples will be a part of many of those holiday menus.

September, besides being the start of the apple season, is National Cholesterol Awareness Month. It's a good time to start healthy habits like eating more fruits and vegetables and less fat. Some people like David Solomon of Southfield who recently had open heart surgery and angioplasty were forced to change their eating habits.

"I used to be a real nut as far as butter and cheeses," said Solomon who is in his middle 50s. "Now I stay away from fat. If I use low fat cheese in a meal, I don't use margarine."

Mary Cabaj of Royal Oak is in her 70s and had open heart surgery for a valve replacement in May. Now she bakes and broils foods instead of frying, and she selects low-fat desserts, skim milk and avoids cheeses.

When you're hungry for a snack, reach for an apple said Schwartz. They're a good source of dietary fiber

and high in complex carbohydrates which may lower the risk of cancer, heart disease and diabetes.

A medium apple contains about 80 calories, one gram of fat, and are sodium free. They provide 15 percent of the U.S.D.A., recommended daily requirement for vitamin C— more than a peach, pear or bunch of grapes. Apples are an important source of potassium and contain the trace mineral boron which helps the body use calcium and keep brain function alert.

Bring your apples to the Cranbrook Institute of Science Honey and Apples festival, 1-4:30 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 26 and Sunday, Sept. 27, and 1-4:30 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 3 and Sunday, Oct. 4. Visitors can blend their own brand of cider—the old-fashioned way by feeding

the hand-operated press as it produces apple juice. It takes about 1/2 bushel of apples to make a gallon of cider.

The activities are included in the regular museum admission of \$5 for adults, \$4 for children ages three to 17, and senior citizens, 65 and older.

To keep apples from turning brown once you've cut them, just dunk them in a 50/50 mixture of lemon juice and water. Extra apples freeze easily.

BARBECUED RIBS

2-4 pounds country-style spare ribs
1 bottle (18 ounces) thick and spicy barbecue sauce with honey
1/2 can (6 ounces) beer

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Rinse spare ribs and pat dry with paper towel.

Place in a shallow baking dish with bone side down. Pour in 1/2 can of beer and follow with enough barbecue sauce to cover the top of the meat.

Cover baking dish with foil and bake for 1 to 1 1/2 hours.

Ten minutes before serving, remove foil, add more barbecue sauce if needed, and place the baking dish under the broiler, leaving several inches between the meat and the heating element. Broil until meat begins to brown and sizzle. Serve on a plate or platter. Serves 4.

POTATO PANCAKES

1 cup mashed potatoes
1 medium raw potato, peeled and shredded
1 cup Bisquick
1/2 cup milk
1 egg
1 Tablespoon sugar
1 small onion, chopped

1-2 Tablespoons vegetable oil
Salt to taste

Combine all ingredients and beat with a fork until all are blended. Lightly coat the bottom of a large frying pan with the vegetable oil or use non-stick spray.

Spoon in batter, making pancakes about 2 to 3 inches in diameter and brown on both sides.

Repeat until all batter is used up. Serve with curried fruit spooned over top. Serves 4.

CURRIED FRUIT BAKE

1 can (16 ounces) pear halves
1 can (16 ounces) peach halves
5 maraschino cherries
3 Tablespoons butter or margarine
1/2 cup brown sugar
2 teaspoons curry powder

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Drain and dry fruits and cut into bite-sized pieces.

Melt butter or margarine in a small pan. Add brown sugar and curry powder. Place the fruit in an 8-inch by 8-inch baking dish. Spoon butter mixture over the top of the fruit. Bake uncovered for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Serve warm over pancakes.

Any leftovers of this delicious fruit dish can be frozen.

AUTUMN APPLE CHICKEN

- 8 boneless chicken breasts
- 2 cups apple cider
- 1 cup all purpose flour
- 1 Tablespoon ground ginger
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 3 Tablespoons brown sugar

2 apples, peeled, cored and cut in thin wedges

The night before serving, marinate chicken in apple cider. Remove chicken from apple cider, but reserve cider for later. Mix flour, ginger and cinnamon in a small bowl. Dredge the chicken with the flour mixture and place in a shallow baking pan. Bake chicken at 350 de-

grees for 40 minutes. Meanwhile, combine reserved cider, brown sugar and apple slices. Pour the marinade mixture over the chicken and bake 25 minutes more. Serves 8.

- 4 cups sliced peeled tart apples (about 4 medium)
- 1/3 cup brown sugar
- 1/4 cup flour

1/4 cup oatmeal
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
2 Tablespoons margarine, softened

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Lightly oil an 8-inch square baking pan. Place apple slices in pan. Mix remaining ingredients thoroughly. Sprinkle over apples.

Bake 30 minutes or until apples are tender and topping is golden brown. Serve warm, and if desired, with vanilla yogurt or yogurt dessert sauce. Serves 4-6.

- 1 cup cottage cheese
- 1 cup Parmesan Cheese

2 eggs
black pepper to taste
1 large zucchini, split lengthwise, seeds removed

Combine first 4 ingredients, mix well. Pour mixture into hollowed

out zucchini. Place on a nonstick baking sheet and bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes, uncovered.

ONIONS STUFFED WITH WILD RICE AND SAUSAGE

- 1/4 cup wild rice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 6 large yellow onions
- 1/2 cup butter
- 1 cup chopped mushrooms
- 1/2 cup bulk sausage

2 tablespoons fresh chopped parsley
1/2 teaspoon dried sage, crumbled
salt and pepper, to taste
beef or chicken broth

Wash rice in 3 to 4 changes of cold water and remove any foreign particles. Add salt to 3 cups boiling water. Gradually pour in rice so that water does not stop boiling.

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Generously butter a deep baking dish. With a sharp knife, cut out stem (top) of onion, leaving root intact. Remove any remaining skin from outside.

Cut out center, leaving shell 1/4-inch thick. Set shells in baking dish. Chop remaining onion, reserve 1/2 cup. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add onion and mushrooms. Sauté until golden. Crumble sausage and add to skillet.

Cook until sausage is browned. Transfer to bowl, add rice, parsley, sage, salt and pepper. Fill onions equally. Add enough broth to come halfway up the sides of the onions. Bake for 20 minutes. Spoon some of the broth over before serving.

Cider fondue cooks in microwave

AP — Since my family owns and operates an apple orchard, it shouldn't surprise you that I'm always on the prowl for great apple recipes. For fall's crisp, cool evenings, this fondue dinner, laced with freshly pressed cider and a sprinkling of spice, really hits the spot. By using your microwave oven, you can cook, serve and reheat the fondue all in the same dish. If it cools before you're finished, simply pop the fondue into the microwave oven and

reheat on 50 percent power (medium) for 1 to 2 minutes.

Serve the fondue with juicy apple or pear slices, cubed French or rye bread, steamed pearl onions, cauliflower flowerets, carrot slices, squash cubes, or other fall vegetable dippers.

CIDER-CHEESE FONDUE

- 2 cups shredded Muenster, Cheddar, or Swiss cheese (8 ounces)

- 1 tablespoon all-purpose flour
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg or dried dillweed
- 1/3 cup apple cider, juice, or dry white wine
- Bread cubes, or vegetable or fruit dippers

In a medium mixing bowl combine cheese, flour and nutmeg or dillweed; toss to coat. Set aside.

In a 1-quart microwave-safe casserole cook cider, juice, or wine, uncovered, on 100 percent power

(high) about 1 minute or until hot. Add cheese mixture to hot liquid.

Cook, uncovered, on 50 percent power (medium) for 3 to 5 minutes or until cheese is melted and mixture is hot, stirring every 2 minutes. Serve with bread cubes or vegetable or fruit dippers. Makes 4 servings.

this sandwich is filled with bologna, carrots, nuts and raisins.

Since most kids don't like surprises, you'll probably want to serve this for lunch before packing it in the lunch bag. Lunch isn't lunch, unless your child actually eats it!

LUNCH BOX BOLOGNA SAMMY

- 2 Tablespoons whipped light cream cheese

- 2 Tablespoons finely shredded carrot
- 2 teaspoons chopped raisins
- 2 teaspoons chopped walnuts
- 2 slices whole-wheat bread
- 1 spinach leaf
- 2 ounces sliced low-fat bologna

Combine cream cheese, carrot, raisins and walnuts. Spread equal

amounts on each slice of bread. Place spinach leaf on bottom slice of bread. Fold bologna slices in half, arrange over spinach. Close sandwich with remaining bread slice. Wrap tightly or placed in moisture- and vapor-proof material or container. Makes 1 sandwich.

Place tortillas on a flat surface. Spread each tortilla with 2 tablespoons peanut butter. Drizzle with 2 teaspoons honey. Arrange two slices of cheese over the honey. Top with a lettuce leaf. Roll up tightly, jellyroll-style. Secure with a tooth-

pick. Cut rolls crosswise in halves, then into 1-inch thick slices. Or wrap uncut rolls in plastic wrap; refrigerate up to 24 hours before serving. Makes 4 servings.

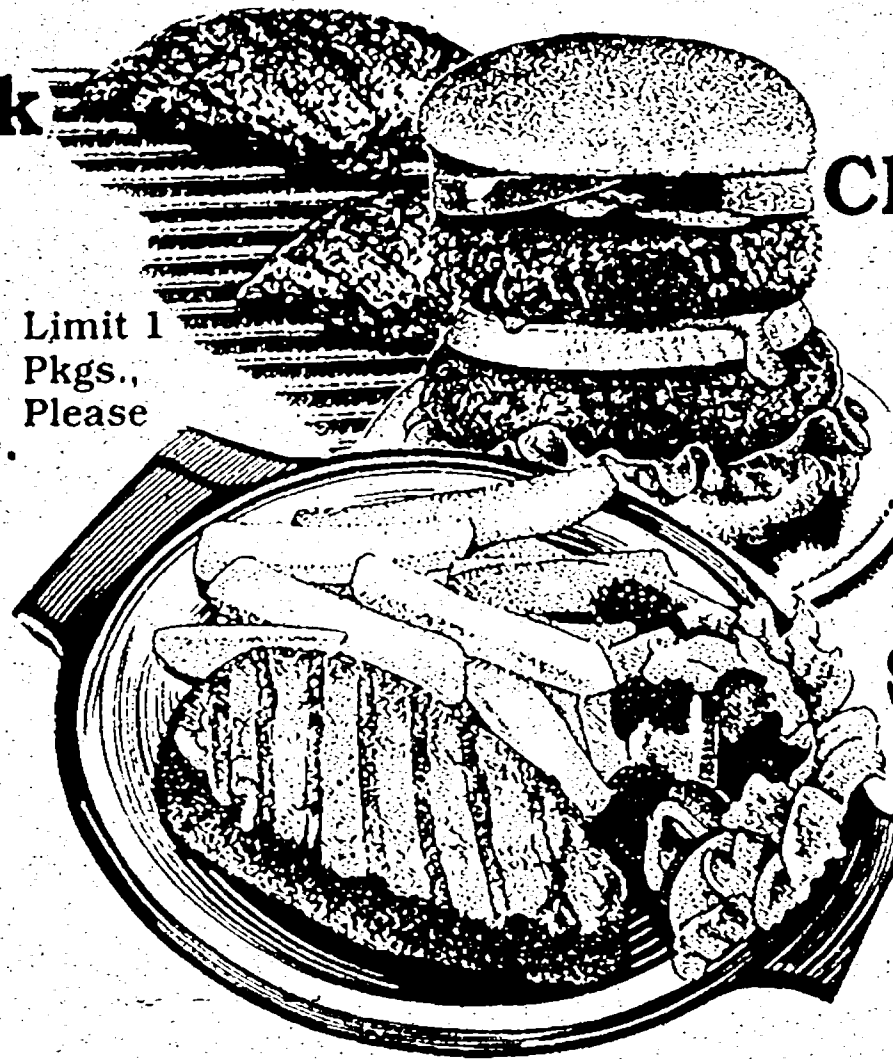

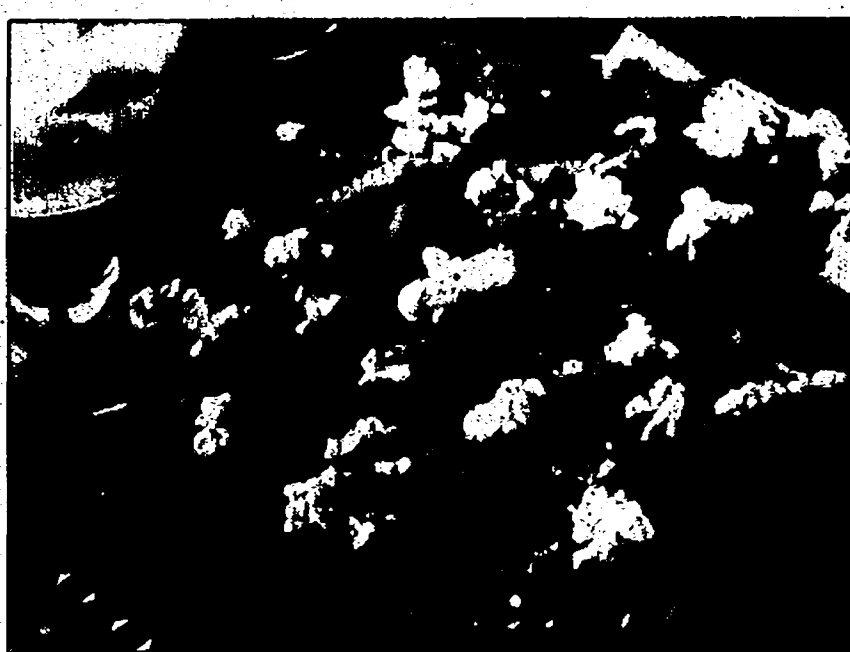

Stuffed sandwiches easy to fix and serve

AP — Come to my house and it's a sure bet you'll see dinners like these stuffed sandwiches on my table. They are both easy to fix and easy to serve (serve yourself, in fact). Single-serve rounds of refrigerated pizza dough are cooked in a skillet on your stovetop while the five-ingredient meat fillings simmers alongside.

GREEK-STYLE PIZZA POCKETS

- 1 pound lean ground beef or turkey
- One 1 1/2-ounce can stewed tomatoes
- 1/2 teaspoon ground allspice or cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- One 10-ounce package refrigerated pizza dough
- Non-stick spray coating
- 1/2 cup plain yogurt
- 2 tablespoons (thinly sliced) green onion
- Paprika (optional)

For filling, in a large saucepan cook beef or turkey until no longer pink. Drain off fat. Stir in un-

drained tomatoes, allspice or cinnamon, garlic salt and pepper. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 15 minutes, stirring often. Uncover and simmer for 10 minutes more or until most of the liquid has evaporated, stirring often.

Meanwhile, cut pizza dough crosswise into four equal portions. On a lightly floured surface, roll each piece into a 7-inch round from center to edge. Spray a cold large skillet with non-stick coating. Cook dough rounds, one at a time, over low heat for 2 minutes on each side or until light brown (they may shrink).

Stir together yogurt and green onion. Spoon meat filling onto each dough round. Top with yogurt mixture and paprika, if desired. Wrap and secure with toothpicks, if desired. Makes 4 main-dish servings.

Fall is like spring. It's a season of beginnings, and renewed commitment to achieving our true potential. For some people, that means cleaning windows, carpets and getting the house shipshape for the winter. For others, it means going back to school, maybe for the first time in years, and acting on goals and dreams.

I'm going to be turning over a new leaf by providing more low fat, low cholesterol recipes for readers. While researching the apple story on the Taste front, I visited the American Heart Association of Michigan office in Lathrup Village and met people like Tony Maher of Oak Park who were forced to change their eating habits and lifestyles after undergoing open heart surgery.

Their stories were a chilling reminder of the danger of an unhealthy diet.

Maher of Oak Park is only 39. He's a diabetic, who had open heart bypass surgery and an angioplasty. Changing his eating habits wasn't

easy, but Maher is making progress. Two years ago he weighed 360 pounds, now he weighs 220, and is still losing weight.

"I feel alive," he said. "I was always sluggish and tired, and never exercised."

The theme of the event is "Turn Down Your Fat-O-Stat!" Even if there isn't a participating grocery store in your neighborhood, you can still take the pledge and improve your health today.

"Some people will want to take

the pledge 'cold turkey,' doing all 12 things at once. We recommend that you take a step at a time so that these new habits can be more permanent," said Jean Friend, AHA volunteer and registered dietitian with the Offices of Services to the Aging.

Switch from whole milk to milk that's one percent fat or less. Read the labels on food you buy, noting the grams and kinds of fat. Switch from butter to a margarine that is no more than two grams of saturated fat per tablespoon, and use butter-flavored granules.

Switch to low-fat mayonnaise and use half as much as you normally do. Avoid fried foods whenever possible. Eat five or more fruits and vegetables a day.

Switch to low-fat or fat-free cheeses. Eat only lean cuts of red meat, remove the skin from poultry before it's cooked. Eat bread, cereal, rice and pasta. Eat low-fat breakfast items like English muffins, bagels and whole grain breads. Eat low-fat ice-milk, sherbet and other low-fat desserts. Switch to polyunsaturated and monounsaturated oils such as canola, corn, safflower, sesame, soybean, sunflower and olive oil and use non-stick vegeta-

ble cooking spray.

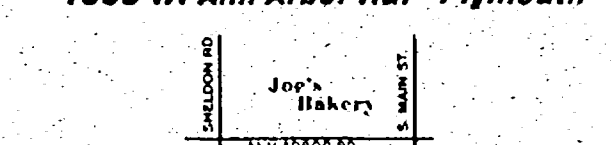

Save some tomatoes for sauce

AP — Cash in on this year's bumper crop of tomatoes with a cache of zesty homemade tomato sauce. Instead of pulling out the canning jars the way Grandma did, follow the recipe below for freezing.

Divide the sauce into handy portions for making your favorite recipes or for spooning over pasta, pizza, fish, or chicken.

The recipe calls for plum tomatoes, but you can use just about any kind of garden variety tomato, provided the tomatoes are firm and ripe.

FREEZER TOMATO SAUCE

- 6 pounds plum tomatoes or other tomatoes
- 1 1/2 cups chopped onion
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 3 large cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tablespoons olive oil or cooking oil
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- 1 to 2 teaspoons salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 fresh red cayenne chili pepper, seeded and finely chopped (1/2 teaspoon), or 1/4 teaspoon ground red pepper (optional)
- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh oregano or 2 teaspoons dried oregano, crushed
- 1 to 2 tablespoons snipped fresh thyme, or 1 to 2 teaspoons dried thyme, crushed

In a large kettle bring 4 inches of water to boiling. Immerse tomatoes in boiling water for 1 minute. Drain in a colander; peel, seed and chop tomatoes. You should have 10 cups.

In the same kettle cook onion, celery and garlic in hot oil about 5 minutes or until tender. Add tomatoes, sugar, salt, pepper and cayenne pepper, if desired. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer, uncovered, about 45 minutes or until desired consistency, stirring occasionally. Add oregano and thyme; simmer, uncovered, for 15 minutes more. Cool slightly.

In a food processor bowl process sauce, one fourth at a time, to desired texture. (Or, put sauce through a food mill.) Place sauce in a bowl set in ice water to cool quickly. Fill freezer containers; seal tightly, label and freeze.

To thaw one portion, remove from freezer container and place in a saucepan. Cook over medium heat until hot, stirring occasionally. (Or, in a 1-quart microwave-safe cas-

serole cook on 100 percent power (high) for 12 to 14 minutes, stirring occasionally.) Makes 3 to 4 pints.

'Trip' with U2 can cost plenty

U2 can make you sing. U2 can make you dance. U2 can also make you go broke.

Go to a concert as a consumer, as we did Wednesday when the Irish quartet rolled Zoo TV Outside Broadcast into the Pontiac Silverdome, and you end up being consumed in the vortex of pocket book plundering.

"I guess it's the price of love... you know it's not cheap," sings Bono on "Ultra Violet (Light My Way)." Neither is one of his shows. When you add the cost of tickets and ancillaries, such as parking, a T-shirt and something to eat, the damage assessment on the wallet can be in excess of \$60 for one person. And double that figure with a date.

The first jolt, obviously, is the ticket. Ours, like everyone's, was \$30 and bought from a friend who had an extra ducat.

That was only the beginning. Once our Ford Escort rolled into the Dome, preconcert anticipation was quickly brought down to reality. Parking was \$7, two bucks more than the going rate of \$5. For that price, we thought a car wash should be included.

Already, \$37 is spent and we haven't even plunked down in our seat yet.

Since dinner was missed in the mad dash to beat traffic jams en route to the monolithic structure, we stopped by the refreshment area. By stadium concession stand standards, the prices were rather reasonable. We bought a jumbo pretzel and a Diet Coke, which together cost \$3.75.

Another cha-ching, and we ha-

ven't made it to the souvenir stand yet.

The concert T-shirt is a badge of honor, the ultimate symbol that you came, you saw and you were there. A U2 tee has always been a highly sought possession among fans, stemming back to the days when the band's sleeveless black shirts with the white flag on the pocket in the "War" days were the rage.

This tour's clothing line was rather bland by comparison. The shirts come in the basic colors of white and black with a rather nondescript design on the front and tour dates on the back. The cost is \$23. (Outside some bootleg shirts — also 100 percent cotton but made in China — were going for \$10).

Other official merchandise, such as "Achtung Baby" baseball jerseys (\$40), baseball caps (\$20), tank tops (\$20), programs (\$13) and, of course, U2 condoms (\$2) was available.

We settle for a black Zoo TV Tour tee for \$23.

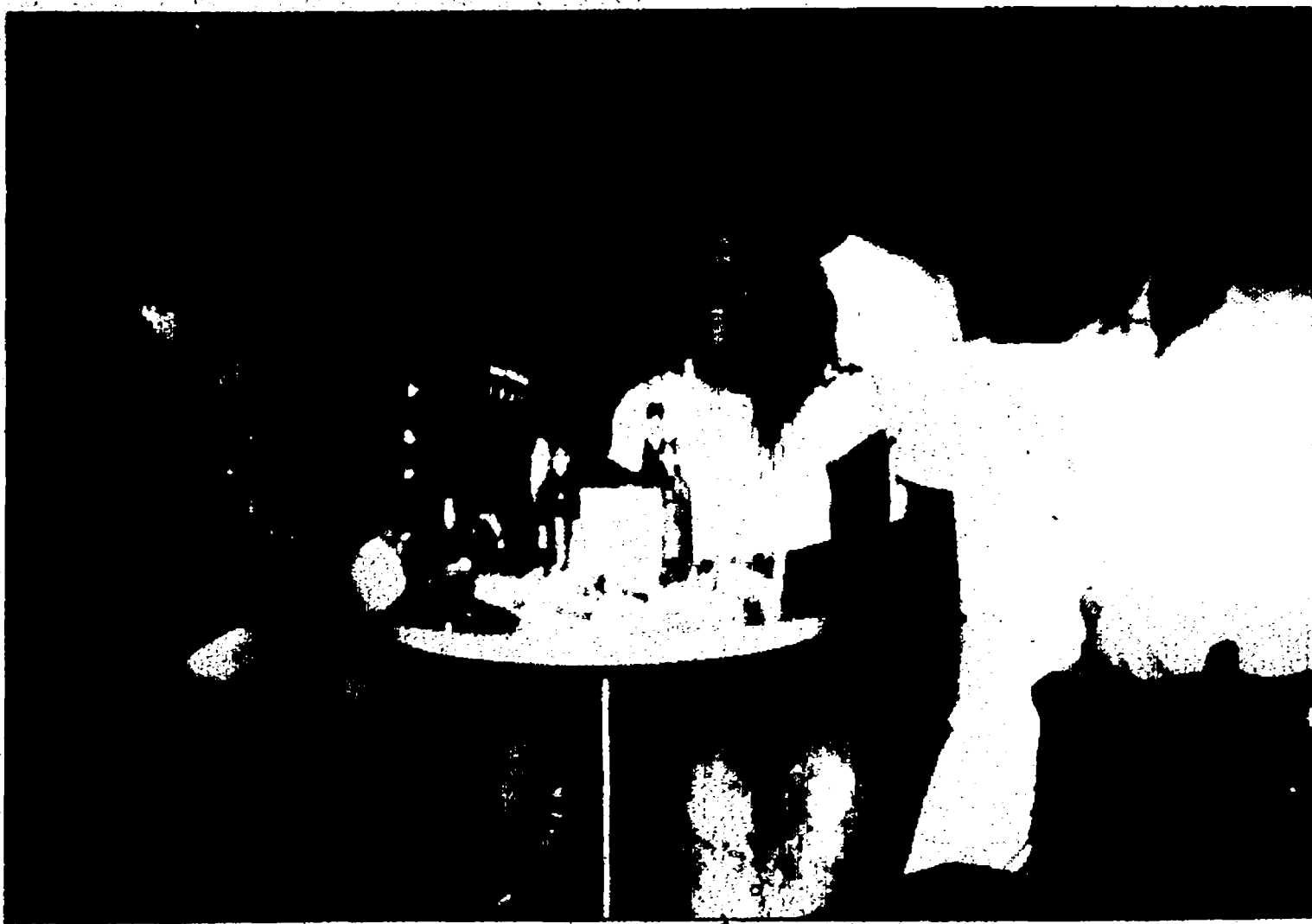
Our seats were on the main floor, but in the 78th row and 100 yards away from the proceedings. For the price of the ticket, we were treated to two opening acts Heroes of Hip-hop and Primus. However, due to the tin-can acoustics, both sounded like mud.

Once U2 hit the stage we were treated to a dazzling multi-media display and a host of great songs.

Of course, we were forced to stand on our \$30 seat for the duration of the two-hour show to get a glimpse of the actual performers onstage. Most of the time, we had to settle for watching Zoo TV on the monitors above the stage.

Was it worth it? Sure, if you're a rabid U2 fan.

Otherwise \$63.75 is a lot of money to watch TV.

Brown gives CIMX her best



She's been described as a not so typical dee jay because she's "very approachable," and rightly so. But Kelly Brown of CIMX-FM's morning show, who puts in as much as 70 hours a week for the "cutting edge" radio station, is wrangled at criticism that it isn't living up to its promises.

Kelly Brown is one half of CIMX-FM's morning tandem whose perky personality helps butter the toast and gets the coffee brewing. So imagine the surprise when the usually ebullient dee jay sounds a bit perturbed on the phone.

Caffeine backlash? A Tim Horton maple glaze not sit well?

Not quite. The 1981 Livonia Churchill graduate gets miffed by criticism the "cutting edge" station has not entirely fulfilled its promise of playing new music by airing enough local music. The co-host of the "Homeboy" show heard 11-11:30 p.m. Sundays hasn't taken some of the knocks to heart, the most recent of which were leveled in the August edition of Monthly Detroit.

"Actually, no I don't take it personally," said Brown, 29, after concluding her usual 6-10 a.m. shift on the air with Anglophile Mike Harrison. "I know I'm doing as much as I can... I work my butt off. Every day I'm working for these guys."

Brown does daily reports on what shows are taking place that evening. She's also been one of the most visible on the local scene, working exhaustive hours (she estimates sometimes up to 70 hours a week) by turning up at local gigs and station-sponsored promotions.

And, of course, there's the "Homeboy" show she hosts, which showcases a half-hour of music from local bands.

"In terms of dee jays, she's not the typical dee jay in that she's very approachable," said Art Lyzak, who operates Lili's in Hamtramck. "She truly loves local music."

The main beef against CIMX-FM has been it hasn't put many local artists (Goober & the Peas, See Dick Run as exceptions) into regular rotation. Instead, the majority of them have been relegated to the Sunday radio abyss.

But it begs the question: How much is enough?

There are those who grouse the station could do better than an obligatory half-hour (extended to one hour once a month for live remotes). Then

there are those who credit CIMX-FM as a catalyst in helping rejuvenate this area's alternative scene, which has been largely ignored by AOR stations in Detroit for years.

Undeniably, local music has become a passion for Brown, who started getting involved after seeing several shows at Lili's in Hamtramck.

"I'd go to Lili's and see bands and I thought they were really good," she said. "The Seattle scene wasn't happening yet and nothing has been happening in Detroit musically for a real long time."

Their struggles somewhat mirror her own. She worked as an administrative assistant for Shearson Lehman Hutton Inc., before deciding to chuck it in a daunting career change to radio.

After graduating from Specs Howard School of Broadcast, Brown worked as an intern at WRIF-FM. When Greg St. James moved over to CIMX-FM in 1990, he invited her join him in the undertaking of the format change.

Brown quickly went from performing administrative tasks to doing on-air reports from local shows at area clubs. Last year, she landed a full-time slot on the morning drive with St. James.

During her 60 to 70 hour work week, sleep is the most difficult spin to Brown's radio career. She said she often takes a nap for a few hours before heading out to a show. Despite that, she's keeps quite a cheerful outlook and is certainly grateful for her break in radio.

"There's people I went to school with who are still doing farm reports in Moose Breath, Ohio," she said.

Good looks: Whose responsibility is it?

Dear Readers, Some weeks ago, on just one day, there were three talk shows all with the same theme. The theme was the importance men attach to their wives' attractiveness. Two of these shows

had on husbands who were unhappy that their wives had lost their good looks by gaining weight. Three plastic surgeons who had operated extensively on their own wives were presented on the other show.

It was clear that all three presentations were meant to be supportive of the "victimized woman point of view." The husbands on the first two shows were pretty dorky guys, complaining that they had married beautiful "chicks" with gorgeous figures only to find themselves 10 years later with overweight matrons no longer resembling the Playboy centerfold.

The men said this made them feel disgusted, unloved and tricked. Why, they wondered in unison, had their wives been so meticulous about their appearance before they got married only to sink into decrepitude once the bond became harder to break. After all, they said, one of the main reasons they had chosen these particular women was because their looks "turned them on."

I was distressed because I knew that if I could ignore the sleazy impression these men made, their words made sense. If I buy an expensive dress and it goes limp after one cleaning, I, too, want my money back.

The wives were an unhappy, but

far more sympathetic lot. They all felt very bad about gaining weight and getting sloppy. But, sadly, they were not able to exercise the self-discipline necessary to change. They all believed that one of the factors most affecting their ability to discipline themselves was that their husbands do not love them.

The hosts and the audiences agreed. The collective myth they all tried to perpetuate was that, one, caring about how our spouse looks is superficial; two, if we lack self-discipline and pride in ourselves we still deserve sympathy, understanding and love; three, men who expect their wives to live up to the standard the wives had set before marriage are heartless and demanding; and four, without love we cannot have the self-esteem necessary to be a disciplined person.

I hope that when the issue is spelled out this way, it sounds as whiney to you as it does to me.

The audience on the show with the three plastic surgeons was also sympathetic to the women, even though these three women didn't need nor did they want any sympathy. They had requested and desired the various surgeries that had lifted, tightened and generally made them more youthful. A lot of the audience still wanted to vilify the doctors.

The audience, on this show as on the others, accused the men of being overinvested in their wives' appearance. The implication again was that women would not be so superficial about their loved ones. The women's own investment in their appearance was ignored.

SPECIAL WRITER

Mike Binder has always admired Woody Allen.

During his formative years in Birmingham, Binder would write scripts in the hope that he could follow in Allen's footsteps as a writer and director of feature films.

However, before making it in films, Woody Allen had to gain notoriety by working elsewhere in the entertainment industry.

"I knew he had started as a stand-up comedian," Binder said.

So, Binder left Birmingham and made his mark in comedy, doing "The Tonight Show," "Late Night with David Letterman" and a slew of HBO work — but only as a means to an end. His ultimate goal remained to write and produce his own films.

That goal has been reached with the weekend release of Binder's new film "Crossing the Bridge." While "Coupe De Ville" in 1990 was the first of his screenplays to be produced, "Crossing the Bridge" marks

the first time Binder has also occupied the director's chair.

Originally written in 1979 and entitled "The Bridge," it took a great deal of effort to bring Binder's semi-autobiographical story of three friends coming of age in mid-70s Detroit to the big screen. Binder produced the film independent of the major studios, so his vision could remain intact. After "The Bridge" was completed, the stumping for a distributor began, and a taker was found in a rather unusual place.

"We shopped around the studios and eventually sold it to Touchstone Pictures (a division of Disney)," said Binder last week while in town for the film's local premiere. "Jeffrey Katzenberg and Michael Eisner (the two heads who run the Disney studio) watched it, and once they had seen it, they loved it."

"Crossing the Bridge" stars Josh Charles, seen in "Dead Poets Society" and "Don't Tell Mom the Babysitter's Dead," in the role of Mort

Golden, a funny kid who writes TV and movie scripts, but spends most of his time hanging out with his two best friends, Stephen ("The Young Riders") Baldwin plays Denny Morgan, a former high school football hero with family problems, and Jason Gedrick is Tim Reese, a pugnacious rebel who rounds out the trio.

"The three friends spend most of their time cruising in the "War Wagon," an old beat-up Buick Electra. Among their favorite destinations are the strip clubs across the Ambassador Bridge in Canada and a clearing where they drink and smoke marijuana. Eventually, the boys are offered a proposition that involves drugs and another crossing of the bridge but with much higher stakes.

"It really was another time," Binder said about the prominence of alcohol and drugs in the film's plot. "I don't think the movie advocates drinking and drugs. It shows the characters walking away from all that. When you're 19-20 years

old, you don't realize how quickly you can screw up your life."

The movie features many shots of Detroit area landmarks, including the Ambassador Bridge, Tiger Stadium and Lafayette Coney Island. But the majority of the film, which is set in 1975, was shot around Minneapolis.

"It's really funny because I've worked on this film for so long," Binder said. "I told the producers 'Don't worry, I'll show you where every location is.' We got back here (to Birmingham and Royal Oak) and none of them were there anymore. Between all the strip malls and burger joints, it just didn't have the same feel anymore."

Binder is thrilled that his dream of making movies has become a reality and has no intention of returning to stand-up comedy work. He is currently on location in Ontario working on the follow-up to "Bridge," entitled "Tamakwa." The film is about a reunion of people who went to summer camp together as children.

er said, comparing moviemaking to stand-up comedy. "With comedy, you got your answer back immediately as to whether a joke is funny or not. With films, it can sometimes take years. But it's a lot more rewarding."

That they might pander to what the media thinks woman who are home in the morning want to hear is understandable. Also, beauty has become to much too great an extent the fulcrum upon which a woman's power rests.

It is understandable that women, including myself resent this. But it

is also true that women, like men, get angry when they feel tricked and we don't love the people we think tricked us.

It is also true that many women complain bitterly about making love to a fat man. The truth that supersedes all of these is that each of us must in the end take responsibility for ourselves, because it is a lie to pretend that someone else should or could take care of us. No

one can give us the discipline we need.

Too often I hear women talk about feeling victimized by men. However, when men say they have been victimized by women, they are cads. That is often not true.

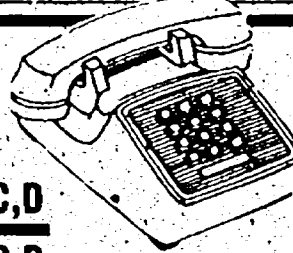





Franklin clips Stevenson, 13-3

"Coach V" got his second win of the young football season Friday, but he wasn't lighting any victory cigars.

Livonia Franklin roared out of the gate, but sputtered in the second half. It was enough, however, to topple host Livonia Stevenson, 13-3.

"We've got to get a lot tougher and eliminate mistakes," said Franklin coach Armand Vigna, whose 2-0 team awaits perennial Western Lakes power Farmington Harrison this Saturday. "Harrison is too opportunistic, and if you open the door, they come at you like gangbusters."

The Patriots appeared ready to take on Harrison, scoring on their opening two possessions against Stevenson.

Clemente Herrera picked off a Stevenson pass at the Spartan 39, just 1:21

into the opening period, and only five plays later, senior John Glenn scored on a 3-yard touchdown run. (Dave Little added the extra point.)

The Patriots then pinned Stevenson inside its own 10, forcing the Spartans to punt deep in their own territory.

With the ball at the Stevenson 40, Little, the senior quarterback who passed for over 200 yards in Franklin's 16-10 opening-game win last week over Lake Orion, quickly went to work. He hit tight end Jason Facione with a 21-yard pass to set up a 7-yard TD run by Eric Holmes.

Quick Franklin lead

It was 13-0 just like that. (Franklin missed the point-after kick.)

Franklin began marching again, driving down to the Stevenson 11, but Little's 28-yard field goal attempt was

blocked. Stevenson then started capitalizing on Franklin mistakes.

Mike Mitchell, who led Stevenson with nine solo tackles and five assists, pounced on a fumbled punt at the Franklin 37. (That came after teammate Pat Noone intercepted a Franklin pass earlier in the quarter.)

With quarterback J.J. Rarog scrambling around, the Spartans overcame a called back touchdown pass (holding penalty), getting three points on the board with only 33 seconds to go in the half.

Rami Khoury's 30-yarder hit the left up-right and bounced through, putting the Spartans behind by only 10 at intermission.

"The roll-out plays (by Rarog) killed us," Vigna said. "When he dropped straight back into the pocket we got more pressure, but we could not keep him outside the ends."

Halftime statistics

The Patriots had 159 yards total offense in the first half to Stevenson's 68. The Spartans felt they were still in

the ballgame.

"We were down so early and so quick, a lot of teams would have given up at that point," Stevenson coach Jack Reardon said. "Franklin really comes out and bangs you, but we didn't quit. We hung in there."

Stevenson actually enjoyed the statistical edge in the second half.

The Spartans had 109 total yards to Franklin's 52, but couldn't get on the board.

Stevenson, however, made things interesting to start the fourth quarter, driving 75 yards in 13 plays, only to be denied when Herrera picked off Rarog (for the second time) at the goal line with 9:15 remaining.

"They (Stevenson) played a tough second half," Vigna said. "Give them credit. They were tougher than heck. They were gutsy."

Holmes, a 5-foot-10, 180-pound senior, led Franklin in rushing with 69 yards in 11 carries. Glenn, a 5-9, 180-pound senior, added 56 yards in eight carries.

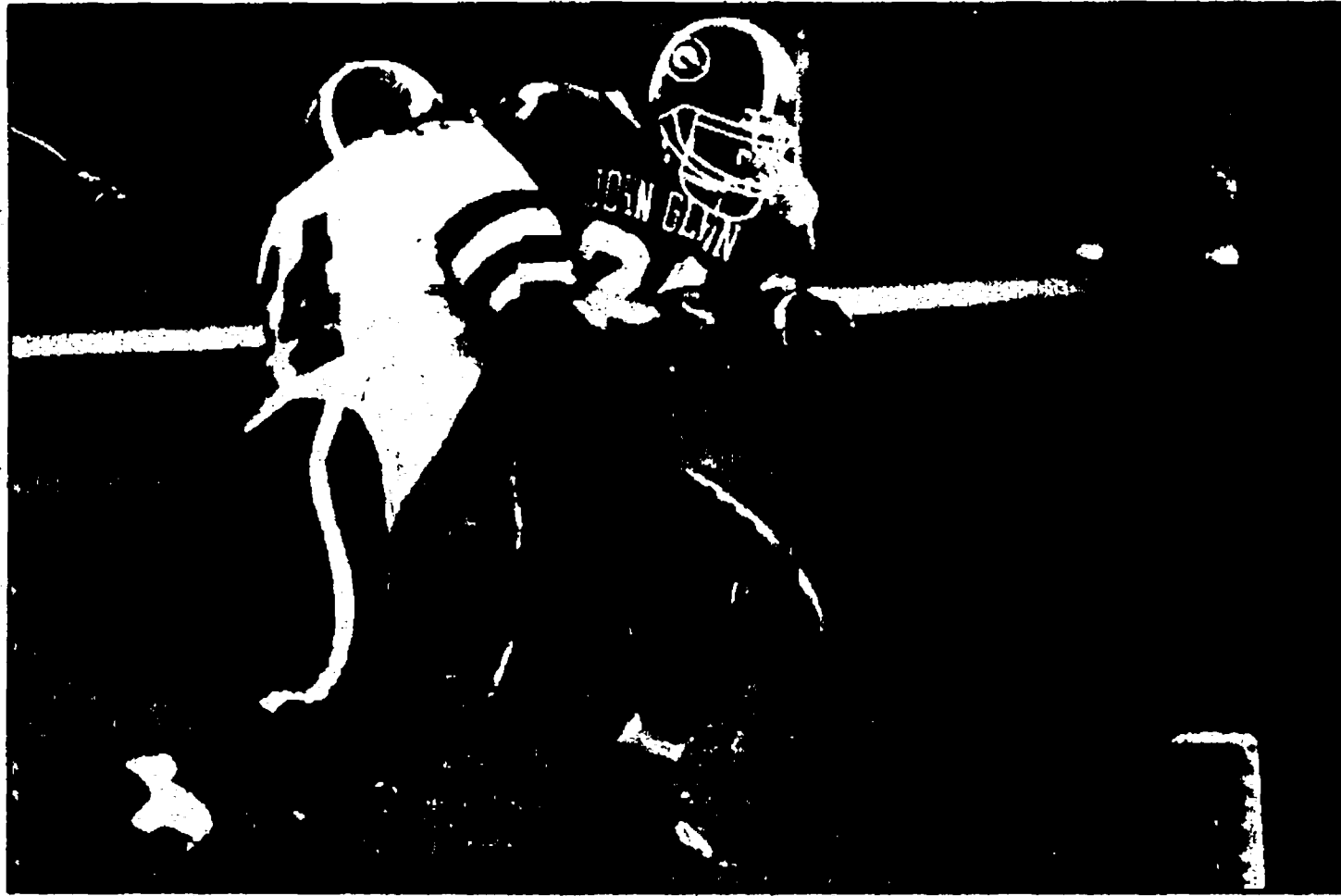

What is the cost to be sanctioned? It's only \$9 a year, or 25 cents a man per week.

What happens if you don't sanction? There was a league last year that voted not to sanction and they had their first ever 300 game. They wound up taking a collection to purchase a ring for the bowler.

Passing totals

Little was stymied through the air, completing five of 12 passes for 68 yards.

"Our passing was off tonight and they (Stevenson) banged him up (Little)," Vigna said.

Little's counterpart, Rarog, attempted 24 passes, connecting on 10 for 141 yards.

But the Spartans could only muster a net of 26 yards on the ground.

"Franklin has a big bunch of kids and we didn't move the ball like we wanted," Reardon said. "We had no offense in the first half. We wanted to throw on first and second down because we didn't want them to gang up on us, but they did anyway on first down."

Stevenson, however, was able to pressure the Franklin lefty (Little) in the second half.

"We were scared to death of letting him put the ball in the air, but our secondary played well and we were able to pressure him in the second half," Reardon said. "I think our young kids learned a great deal."

Vigna, meanwhile, hopes his

team can overcome the two turnovers and seven penalties (for 51 yards) the Patriots racked up against Stevenson.

"Twice we got penalized when we lost the chin strap on our head gear," said Vigna. "That's when things started going wrong in the second quarter."

Garden City loses heartbreaker in OT to Romulus

Sometimes, in order to reach a destination, a few detours must be endured.

At least that's the message Garden City football coach Bob Eisinger was trying to deliver to his Cougars after a heartbreaking 25-24 overtime loss Friday to visiting Romulus.

It won't be easy to convince them. This was a difficult defeat to absorb, made more painful after Garden City (now 1-1) rallied for 10 points in the fourth quarter to tie the game, then missed a 46-yard field goal on the final play of regulation, only to lose in OT.

Romulus (2-0) won the toss in overtime and elected to defend first (overtime procedure: each team gets the ball at the opponents' 10-yard line; the game doesn't end until one team scores and the other doesn't).

On first down, Garden City's Bill Bell picked his way for 7 yards off left tackle. Jeff Grace gained 2 more up the middle, and on third down quarterback Scott Latham sneaked the final yard for the touchdown. Michael Borg's extra point put the Cougars up 24-17.

Now it was Romulus' turn. Quarterback Bob Bergeron scrambled for 4 yards on first down, and on second Phillip Franklin — the Eagles'

most dangerous threat; he scored twice in regulation — was contained on a sweep to the left, gaining just a yard. Fullback Brian Helka plunged to within inches of the goal line on third down.

On fourth down, Bergeron powered into the end zone for the touchdown. Romulus coach Dan Henry then called time out, trying to decide whether to go for the one-point or two-point conversion.

"I wanted to ask the kids," Henry said later. "I know what I wanted to do — I wanted to go for two. But I wanted to hear what they wanted to do. They said 'Go for it.' They were confident."

On the two-point conversion, Henry had the officials spot the ball on the left hash mark. Twice during regulation, Franklin had swept around left end and reached the end zone, on runs of 30 yards (in the first quarter) and 15 yards (in the third).

This time he swept to the right. Although he was nursing a sore ankle (he carried the ball just nine times, gaining 94 yards), Franklin outraced the Cougar defenders to the right corner for the deciding points.

"He's a great player that no one's heard of," said Henry of Franklin, who's a junior. "I was just hoping our fullback (Helka) could block

their safety — just get a piece of him.

"This was a great win."

Eisinger and the Cougars were as disappointed as the Eagles were ebullient. The Garden City coach knew the game was ultimately decided on one play, and what the deciding factor was: "They used their speed," he said, in summary. "And you can't beat speed."

The Cougars deserved a better fate. In the opening quarter, Jason Workman picked off a Bergeron pass over the middle at the Romulus 38 and returned it to the 18. It took the Cougars two plays to reach the end zone: a 3-yard run by Grace and a pretty fade pass from Latham to Chris Sells. Borg's placement made it 7-0.

It took Romulus six plays to knot it. Franklin started it with a 19-yard run and finished it with his 30-yard gallop around left end. Jon Devereaux booted the extra point, tying it at 7-7.

It stayed that way until the third quarter, at least partially because of Franklin's sore ankle (he had just three first-half carries). A 16-yard punt by Mark McCloud put the Eagles in position, at Garden City's 48.

James Erquhart gained 15 yards, and on third-down-and-7 from the 30 Bergeron found Joe Kusibab for

12 yards and a first down at the 18. After a 3-yard gain by Helka, Franklin came back in for another sweep to paydirt.

Romulus extended its lead to 17-7 on the first play of the final quarter, with Devereaux drilling a 35-yard field goal. The six-play drive was sparked by Helka's 39-yard run to Garden City's 25.

That's when the comeback started. On their next possession, the Cougars faced a third-down-and-7 at their own 45. Latham drifted to his right searching for a receiver, then dumped the ball to Bell on the left side. Bell turned and started running, outracing defenders to the end zone on a 55-yard scoring play.

The Eagles were limited to one first down on their next possession, and Garden City got the ball back at their own 22. Three plays resulted in three first downs, but the drive stalled at the Romulus 10. With 3:32 left, Borg pumped through the game-tying field goal from 27 yards out.

The Cougars got one more shot after stopping Romulus again. A 14-yard punt return by Borg gave them possession at the Eagles' 36, and a pass interference penalty got them as close as the 29. But Borg's field goal attempt as the clock drained was short and right.
