## Youth counseling takes off



The new Westland Youth Assistance Program will offer free, confidential counseling to youths with behavior problems. Key to the program is the use of volunteer mentors who meet weekly with youngsters. The program also offers free parenting skills classes.

Westland youths and their parents now have a tool to help the youngsters get out of trouble.

The tool is the city's newly organized Youth Assistance Program, a free, confidential counseling program

aimed at youths between 6 and 17 having behavioral problems.

Purpose of the program is to improve the youths' behavior and have them take responsibility for their actions.

The program, proposed by councilwoman Sandra Cicirelli several years

ago, was launched at the beginning of this month with the hiring of director Ronalee Bowman and program assistant Carol Germain. Both were in the same positions in the Garden City program for the past several years.

City funds will account for most of the program's cost with a portion coming from the city's share of federal Block Grant dollars.

"The staff is anxious to get the program off the ground," said Bowman and Germain. They said a drive will begin in January to recruit volunteer mentors who will work with juveniles

after completing training. "The Westland Youth Assistance Program will offer a variety of free and confidential services to families in the city, such as mentoring for youths between 7 and 16, life-skills classes, community work-service, tutoring for adolescent youths in the program and parenting skills classes for parents of the youths in the program," they said.

The program will get under way after the volunteer mentors are inter-

## Jefferson kids space out in class

Jefferson Elementary School students recently got a taste of space exploration — thanks to a Living Science project.

Each class had a 45-minute presentation which introduced them to the concepts of astronomy, space science and space exploration, said Jefferson Principal Susan Dorenkamp.

To prepare for the program, Jefferson teachers and students decorated the school's hallways with different planets, stars, asteroid belts and even a full-sized astronaut. The two-day project included hands-on contact with materials and equipment as well as a video.

The assembly was financed through a grant from the Wayne-Westland Community Schools' Foundation as well as money from the Jefferson School's PTA chapter.

Science wasn't the only thing on the minds of Jefferson students, teachers and parents that week.

The PTA donated \$150 for the school's first RIF (Reading is Fundamental) project, which had \$550 worth of paperback books donated to third- and fourth-graders, to encourage recreational reading. The balance of the cost was borne by the school district.

## SADD group active at holidays

The membership of the John Glenn/Wayne Memorial high schools chapter of Students Against Driving Drunk has grown from a dozen members to 158 in the past five years.

The schools' chapter is affiliated with the state and national organizations.

Its major goals are to increase student awareness of the risks and costs of driving drunk or of riding with a drunken driver. It also provides students with activities at which drinking will not be a temptation.

Since most of Glenn's students are bused, only two meetings a year are held after school. All activities are arranged by committees and the membership informed by a newsletter. Each member participates at a level and time that he or she determines.

Some SADD activities include distributing Contracts for Life, an agreement between students and their parents or others, in which each promises to pick up the other in the event that one is in a position where he or she is likely to drive drunk or ride with a drunk.

SADD members also distribute red ribbons during the holidays to remind people not to drive while intoxicated. The organization also fosters the development and growth of the SADD chapters at the junior high schools that feed Glenn and at Wayne Memorial. SADD members also work with local police and with MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Drivers) to provide information to students and the community.

An annual "Last Chance Dance" is held just before the report cards for the first semester are sent home.

## EMS bolsters arsenal

Westland residents will benefit from better emergency medical services starting Friday, said the city administration.

"We are in the business of life safety and very pleased to offer to the public a greater chance of survival

during a medical emergency, said Michael Reddy, assistant fire chief in charge of fire suppression and emergency medical service.

"According to the American Red Cross, one out of every two deaths in the U.S. is due to cardiovascular disease. Coronary heart disease claims a half million Americans each year, with the majority being sudden deaths. The increase in our level of medical care will help those citizens of Westland, with cardiovascular disease survive" said Reddy.

The Westland Fire Department, which has run a basic emergency medical service since 1980, with every member certified as an emergency medical technician, has all its members get extensive training in the use of automatic defibrillation equipment during the past three months, which helps patients with cardiac problems.

Use of that equipment will start Friday, said the department.

They were also trained on sophisticated equipment that provides for quick and more improved and faster air passageway treatment. That equipment will be put into use shortly afterwards.

The training was provided by Crystal Forbush, of Emergency Education Inc., Westland.

Under direct medical supervision of Annapolis Hospital, the department is now prepared to use the equipment.

Time is the most critical factor in combatting cardiac arrest, the department said in announcing the EMS improvements.

"Even seconds are precious," it said. "It is vital that people in Westland be aware of the signs of heart attack. The faster they call for emergency medical services, the greater the victim's chance of survival."

"It has always been my policy to provide the best public safety, that we as a community can afford," said Mayor Robert Thomas. "Offering a higher level of emergency medical service will give many citizens of our city the chance of recovery from a medical service."

Bailey Recreation Center will be open 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. today, closed Friday and open from 9 a.m. to 10 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

The Westland Sports Arena will be closed Thursday and Friday but will have open skating

1-2:45 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

Local banks will be open Thursday but have an early closing.

# Youth program staffers have varied backgrounds

Who are the staff leaders of the new Westland Youth Assistance Program.

Director Ronaele Bowman and program assistance Carol Germain have a variety of professional experiences as well as community service backgrounds.

Bowman, a Livonia resident, was Garden City's Youth Assistance Program director nearly two years, being responsible for training volunteer mentors, raising funds, making community presentations and coordinating parent classes.

Before the Garden City position, Bowman was a trianer for the Michigan Training and Resource Center, which developed and presented training sessions for other Youth Assistance Programs in the county.

Bowman was also a Out-Wayne County Human Services staffer, Mary Kay Cosmetics sales direc-

tor, social worker, and a teacher for the Papal Volunteers to South America, a Peace Corps-type program.

She is president of the Active Friends of the Homeless board of directors; secretary of the Homes for Black Children board of directors; Livonia League of Women Voters second vice president; Livonia Stevenson High School Band Parents Association; volunteer mentor with the Livonia Youth Assistance Program, volunteer for the Livonia Recycling Center; American Cancer Society volunteer, and member of the Garden City Business and Professional Women's Club and American Association of University Women.

She received a bachelor's degree from Marquette University, Milwaukee, and a master's of public administration degree from Eastern Michigan University, Ypsilanti.

Germain, a Garden City resident, graduated with academic honors from Madonna University, Livonia, with a bachelor's degree in social work.

In the Garden City Youth Assistance Program, Germain was program assistant for most of this year, taking part in volunteer mentor training sessions.

In her family life, Germain is Garden City Figure Skating Club board of governors member and public relations chairperson; Garden City Youth Athletic Association varsity cheerleading squad head coach; member of the Specialized Foster Parent with the Orchards Children's Services; and is a member of the U.S. Figure Skating Association, Michigan Association of Adoptive Parents, Michigan Citizens Lobby, National Association of Social Workers, Garden City Youth Athletic Association, and Sane/Freeze.

# Ice festival draws Europeans

The 11th annual Plymouth International Ice Sculpture Spectacular, featuring the work of professional ice carvers from as far away as Russia and Switzerland, will take place Jan. 13-18 in downtown Plymouth.

An estimated half-million people are expected to attend the show, which will see more than 400,000 pounds of block ice transformed into displays guaranteed to delight and dazzle.

Creating one-of-a-kind sculptures in a festive outdoor setting will be some of America's finest ice artisans. Student and foreign carvers also will enter the competition, vying for thousands of dollars in prize money.

Winners of the contest, sanctioned by the National Ice Carvers Association, will advance to the National Ice Carving Classic in May.

This year's program will include the Bud Light evening light show, which promises to turn the ice sculptures and downtown Plymouth into a winter

wonderland.

First of America Bank will sponsor "Plymouth's Voyage Under the Sea," an aquatic fantasy land to be set up in the Gathering in Kellogg Park. The weeklong display will showcase theatrical lighting by Stefan Graff of Fantasy Lighting.

MCI Telecommunications Corp. will be on-site to give festival-goers a chance to make three-minute phone calls to destinations anywhere in the world.

Also featured will be cooking demonstrations at Sideways on Forest Avenue and a gingerbread house competition and display at Westchester Mall.

Again this year, hundreds of ice sculptures will line the streets of Plymouth. Kellogg Park will be the centerpiece of the festival as carvers create "art for the moment."

More than 150 Plymouth-area retailers and restaurateurs will welcome visitors looking for a few moments of warmth and diversion.

viewed, screened and trained."

The two are housed on the second floor of the Bailey Recreation Center, on Ford east of Newburgh, directly behind City Hall.

## Objectives cited

Program objectives are to reduce youths' behavior problems; improve the youngsters' feeling of self-worth; boost their coping skills when dealing with peer pressure; and become self-determined when considering future goals, they said.

Bowman and Germain said that youths who may be delinquent or "pre-delinquent" can benefit from the program if they have problems such as school truancy, vandalism, shoplifting, behavioral problems at home or school or anti-social behavior.

Referrals are expected to come from local schools, police department, juvenile court, the family as well as "walk-ins."

When a referral is made, the youth and family visit the program staff which collects information and asks the youngster to complete a self-appraisal form.

Then the problems and poten-

tial solutions are discussed.

At a second visit, the youth and family meet a volunteer mentor.

"The youngster may be encouraged or required to participate in a positive type of recreation, a tutoring program or work-service in the community," they said.

"In addition, youths 13 and older will be required to attend eight Project Impact sessions, presented by the assistance program, to improve positive life skills."

Among the program's services are the one-to-one volunteer mentoring, recreation, parent effectiveness training, parent support groups, special programs and field trips as well as potential referrals to professionals.

Key to the program is the volunteer mentor, who spends one or more hours a week with a youth in the program.

"All volunteers are screened and interviewed before acceptance into the program," the staffers said. "Volunteers should be at least 20 years old and have no police record."

## Volunteer training

"Volunteers receive 15 hours of

formal training before they are assigned to a youth. They also receive on-going training through special sessions."

The benefit of being a volunteer is that the person makes a difference in someone's life, said Bowman and Germain. Other benefits are preventing violence and substance abuse in the community; sharing your interests with a youngster and getting free training in learning how to relate to young people and learning "one-to-one" skills.

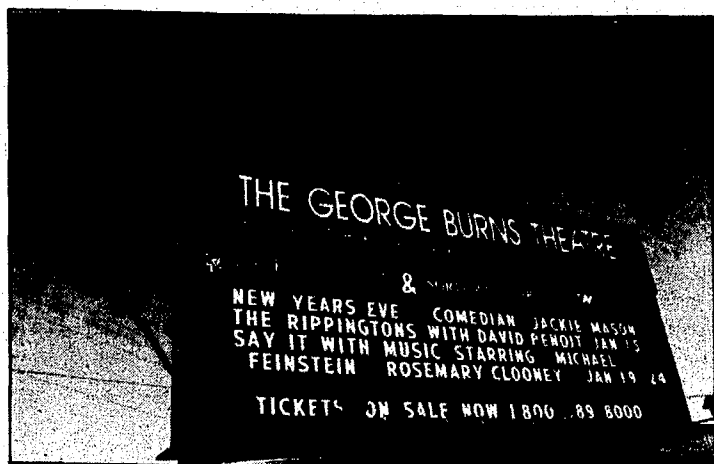

## If you drink a bit too much, don't drive — call for a ride

Have a safe New Year's Eve. If you drink too much and need a ride home, there's a way. And if you decide to have a party and you want to keep your guests sober, there's a way.

Volunteers from the Wayne and Oakland chapters of Mothers Against Drunk Driving will provide rides to people on New Year's Eve. And there is no charge for LifeRide.

"It's only for those who have no rides home," according to Kathleen Kennedy, MADD administrative assistant. "We encourage people to assign a designated driver or make arrangements to have a party."

Last year MADD volunteers gave 663 New Year's Eve revellers rides in Wayne and Oakland counties. That was 29 percent more rides than the year before.

Call the MADD office at 422-6233 for more information.

Some area police departments will offer rides to those who can't drive home safely. For instance, Redford Township police will drive home people who need a ride in Redford and surrounding communities. However, Redford Township Police Chief Dave Parker says the department doesn't have the resources to drive people 30 miles or farther.

Livonia police will drive people who can't drive and need ride from a Livonia location to another Livonia location. But they won't travel out of the city limits.

Westland Police won't provide a ride but will call a cab for folks unable to drive.

Tammie Colling, information officer with Canton Township Police, said: "If you're out drinking and driving in Canton, police will offer you a ride to the police department — through the back door." She added: "We suggest you be responsible and have a designated driver."

Realizing you're drunk is the first and best step. A lot of people

who are legally drunk think they're fine, because their mental image of someone who had too much to drink is throwing up or passing out, according to John Farrar, executive director of Livonia Counseling Center, Westland Counseling Center and Northville Counseling Center.

"One of the things I've learned is the bottom line is it takes a heck of a lot less to be legally intoxicated than people realize," he said. "People don't know how many drinks it takes to be legally intoxicated or how long you have to wait. Once they get busted and come to see me they learn the hard way."

Pointing to a 20 percent reduction in drinking and driving accidents, Farrar said, that's a great start, but there's still too many people dying as the result of an alcohol related accidents.

If you don't want to worry about your guests leaving your party and driving home drunk, have them spend the night or save yourself the trouble and consider serving non-alcoholic drinks.

Michigan AAA holds an annual contest for best non-alcoholic

drinks. The first place winner this year is Janet Mast Boerema of Kentwood with "Sparkling Pear Tree Punch."

To make the punch use:

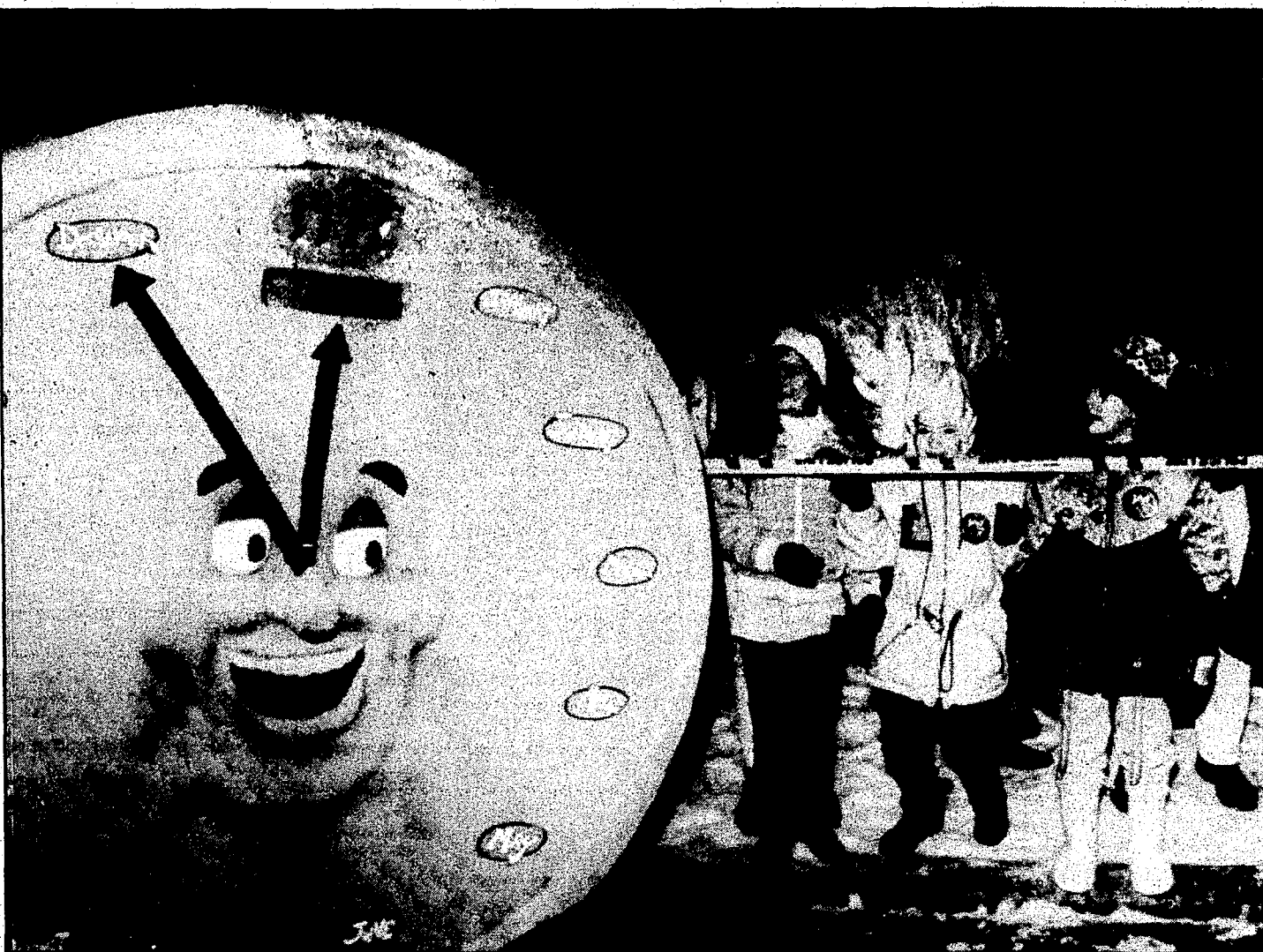
- 4 ounces white sparkling grape juice, well-chilled;
- 2 ounces pear syrup (drained from canned pears in heavy syrup);
- splash of tonic water;
- one jigger of grenadine;
- raw pear, cored and thinly sliced;
- mint sprig;
- crushed ice;

Coat the rim of a margarita glass with sugar; fill glass with crushed ice. Lightly shake sparkling grape juice, pear syrup and tonic water; pour over ice. Add a jigger of grenadine to center of drink. Garnish with several pear slices and a mint sprig.

The second place winner of the AAA contest is Carol Kormash of Ypsilanti with "Razzle Dazz Berri Wassail."

- 3 ounces raspberry flavored gelatin (Jello brand only);
- 2 cups boiling water;
- 1 cup sugar;
- 12 raspberries;
- 12 strawberries;
- 12 blueberries;
- 4 Tbs. lemon juice;
- 3 Tbs. lime juice;
- 1 quart apple juice;
- 2 liters Vernors ginger ale;

Bring first three ingredients to a boil. Cool to room temperature for punch base. Put berries, lemon and lime juice in blender with half cup of apple juice. Put through sieve to remove seeds. Add rest of color ginger ale ice cubes. Add remainder of apple juice to punch base and blend in blender. Add ginger ale when ready to serve. Freeze ice cubes with ginger ale and small amount of berries mixture to color. Full recipe serves five eight ounce servings.

of people go out to dinner and go to a movie. Most movies are out by midnight and they can be home before midnight. And you can buy the ticket at noon and walk in at night."

More than 50 southwest Detroit youngsters will get four months of special tutoring, starting next month — thanks to a suburban program spotlighted as a Point of Light by President George Bush.

On Jan. 16, Arabic, Black, Caucasian, Hispanic and Romanian youngsters in elementary school will meet at Detroit's O.W. Holmes School to get extra instruction in math and English.

The tutors come from throughout the suburban Detroit area, and are led by Sr. Mary Martinez, director of the office of multicultural affairs at Madonna University, Livonia. The tutors range from college students to retirees to corporate engineers and managers. Only the college students are paid.

The series of classes starting next month marks the second year the tutors and students have met weekly at Holmes and the sixth year the tutoring team of

Livonia has taught at-risk students in southwest Detroit.

On Tuesday, calling team members the "996th Daily Point of Light for the Nation," President George Bush saluted Martinez, co-leaders Jose Lopez of Royal Oak and Ricardo Campos of Southgate, both Michigan Bell employees, and the 40 tutor volunteers who took part in last year's program.

"The President salutes the volunteers of the tutoring team for exemplifying his belief that, 'from now on in America, any definition of a successful life must include serving others,'" reads the statement from the White House Press Secretary.

The Bush administration praised the tutors for "fostering a positive attitude toward education" among the mostly poor and minority students living in the area of Detroit near the Ambassador Bridge.

### Preventing dropouts

"The program originally was for

Hispanics, but now we teach anyone who signs up," Martinez said. "The students are at-risk for several reasons. They can't do the work at their school level. For many, English is not the first language in the family. And they are happy to get the extra attention."

The crux of the program, Martinez said, is to give on-one students the extra, one-on-one help they need so they don't become high school dropouts. "We strongly believe, the younger we can do something, the better."

Frank Novel of Livonia, a Ford Motor Co. employee, recently got a phone call from a third grader, one of the five students he tutored at Holmes last winter.

"He wanted me to know he was doing better in school. Our goal was to give the students the feeling that someone is interested in them. And we need patience when the kids get frustrated because they don't know an answer. We make sure we pat them on the back when they succeed."

Karyn O'Connell of Troy, a

nursing student at Madonna, recalled Travis, the seven-year-old boy she tutored last year who told her he "wanted to learn." Travis was frustrated because he was seven and still in first grade.

O'Connell called her sessions at Holmes an "eye-opening experience."

"I learned that these kids have so many other obstacles that keep them from learning, like being hungry."

Salvador Bricio of Southfield, a retired engineer, remembered Gilbert, a fourth-grader who spoke "beautiful Spanish" but little English.

Bricio's ability to speak fluent Spanish helped his own career, and he was fearful Gilberto would forget Spanish as he learned his new language.

"I knew he had to learn English but I didn't want him to lose his Spanish."

And last winter, Daniel De La Garza of Canton, a Ford employee, tutored seven youngsters.

"I think we made a difference.

At first they would push us away, because they didn't understand. But we made it a game kind of thing. It was exciting to see when 'they caught it.'"

Martinez, who went every Saturday to Holmes to supervise the weekly three-hour sessions, remembered the boy who came and unexpectedly brought along his sister and brother. The program tries to limit the number of students attending to the number of tutors on hand.

Martinez was perplexed because she didn't know where to put the two extra youngsters.

"She was a cute, dirty little girl. I told her she didn't need to come, but she said she had nothing to do at home. She asked if she could tutor. She took a test, and did well."

"There was a first grade boy who couldn't read and couldn't concentrate, so we asked her if she wanted to help Dwayne. She worked well with him and did a great job. It was a win-win situation for both."

### Special praise

Martinez praised Campos and Lopez for keeping the program afloat when it looked like it would die.

The original program started six years ago with a government grant. When the grant expired, Martinez said she was willing to let the program go. But Campos and Lopez went to bat for it, suggesting they seek corporate sponsors.

Last year, the program survived with donations from Michigan Bell, Southfield attorney Myron Leven, New Detroit and UAW Local 262.

Holmes' teachers identify students who need extra help and send information on the students to the tutors. Martinez matches student and tutor.

"Most of the time, they're made for each other."

Martinez is now considering starting a similar Saturday program for high school students.

## Houses sell out at Millpointe

Millpointe subdivision in Westland will sell its last home next month, completing what has been one of Crosswinds Community's most successful new subdivisions in recent history.

"There was a pent-up demand for new homes in this price range," said Bernard Gliberman, president of Crosswinds Community and builder of Millpointe. "The secret of our success is giving home buyers the design and amenities of much more expensive homes."

Sales at Millpointe started in 1990 and in two years, over 300 homes have been sold. Home prices there start at just under \$80,000.

The subdivision in the city's southwest corner will have 332 homes when it is completed in the spring of 1993.

"Home buyers have found that it is cheaper to own than to rent with the low interest rates available," explained Gliberman. Based on an 8.25 percent mortgage, a home buyer would make a monthly payment of \$778 which would provide \$217 of tax savings or a net monthly cash outflow of \$560. Also equity in the home would be building up instead of rent payments to a landlord estimated at \$600 per month.

Millpointe is located on Glenwood, east of Newburgh Road and north of Michigan Avenue in Westland.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 92-015

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 91.045 OF CHAPTER 91 OF TITLE IX OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GARDEN CITY.

THE CITY OF GARDEN CITY HEREBY ORDAINS:

That Section 91.045 entitled "Fire Prevention Code" of Chapter 91 of Title IX of said Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 91.045 ADOPTION OF NATIONAL FIRE CODE BY REFERENCE

However, they met, fell in love, and revealed their true feelings toward one another as they sang a duet, "I Could Be Happy With You." The entire cast joined the happy couple for a reprise on a song and dance routine of "The Boy Friend" which brought to a close a very fast-moving first act which was full of the vibrant sounds of our musical past.

NOTICE OF HEARING ON PROPOSED ORDINANCE

The following Ordinances (known as the Municipal Refuse Waste Water Flow Control Ordinance) amending the Code of the City of Garden City, to add Chapter 55 of Title V has been proposed. A public hearing has been scheduled for January 4, 1993, at 7:15 P.M., in the Council Chambers of the City Hall, 6000 Middlebelt Road, to provide Public Comments on the proposed ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GARDEN CITY BY ADDING A NEW CHAPTER WHICH NEW CHAPTER SHALL BE DESIGNATED AS CHAPTER 55 OF TITLE V OF SAID CODE.

The City of Garden City hereby ordains:

That Title V of the Garden City Code be amended by adding a new chapter, which new chapter shall be designated as Chapter 55 of Title V for the purpose of regulating the collection and disposal of solid waste in the City of Garden City, providing for the promulgation of rules and regulations relating thereto, and prescribing penalties for the violation thereof, and shall read as follows:

Section 55.01 Intent and Purpose.

The City of Garden City is one of the constituent members of the Central Wayne County Sanitation Authority (the "Authority"). The Authority owns and operates an incinerator that is located in the City of Dearborn Heights and that disposes of solid waste originating within the territorial limits of its constituent members.

The City and the Authority have entered into a Solid Waste Disposal and Service Agreement (the "Agreement") which prescribes their respective rights and obligations with respect to solid waste disposal services to be performed by the Authority and to assure an adequate supply of solid waste to the incinerator, all in furtherance of the purpose of protecting the public health and the general welfare of the people in the City as required and authorized by the Constitution and Act No. 641, Public Acts of Michigan, 1978, as amended. Pursuant to the Agreement, the City has agreed to deliver or cause to be delivered to the Authority's incinerator substantially all solid waste originating within its territorial limits and to pay or cause to be paid to the Authority for disposal thereof certain rates which the Authority estimates will be sufficient to pay the expenses of the operation, maintenance, and administration of the incinerator and all other facilities of the Authority and the principal and interest requirements on all outstanding bonds of the Authority. Pursuant to the Agreement, the City is obligated to enact an ordinance regulating the collection and disposal of solid waste originating within its territorial limits.

Section 55.02 Definitions.

1. As used in this Ordinance, the words and phrases listed below shall have the following meanings:

(a) "Act 641" means Act No. 641 of the Public Acts of Michigan, 1978, as amended.

(b) "Act 641 Plan" means the Central Wayne County Solid Waste Management Plan approved by the Wayne County Board of Commissioners, by two-thirds of the cities, villages and townships in Wayne County and by the Director of the MDNR, pursuant to the requirements and provisions of Act 641, and any updates thereof and any amendments thereto adopted in accordance with Act 641.

(c) "Agreement" means the Solid Waste Disposal and Service Agreement entered into between the Authority and the City as of the 1st day of April, 1992.

(d) "Authority" means the Central Wayne County Sanitation Authority, a Michigan public corporation organized and existing under Act No. 174, Public Acts of Michigan, 1947, as amended.

(e) "City" means the City of Garden City.

(f) "Construction/Demolition Debris" means non-hazardous wastes generated from construction and demolition activities, including but not limited to concrete, asphalt, wood, metal and plaster.

(g) "Disposal Fee" means the fee or fees established by the Authority pursuant to the Agreement for receiving, storing, processing and/or disposing of Solid Waste at the Plant.

(h) "Hazardous Waste" means any material or substance which by reason of its composition or characteristics is: (1) hazardous waste as defined in the Solid Waste Disposal Act, 42 USC Section 6901, et seq., as amended, replaced or superseded, and the regulations implementing the same, or (2) material the disposal of which is regulated by the Toxic Substances Control Act, 15 USC Section 2601, et seq., as amended, replaced or superseded, and the regulations implementing the same, or (3) special nuclear or by-product material within the meaning of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 or (4) hazardous waste as defined in Act No. 64 of the Public Acts of Michigan, 1978, as amended, and as identified in administrative rules promulgated from time to time pursuant to the provisions of said Act by the Director of the Department of Natural Resources.

(i) "Industrial Special Waste" means non-hazardous wastes generated by (1) industrial users, which due to their size or composition, require special handling and/or disposal procedures, including but not limited to foundry sand, incinerator/boiler bottom ash, fly ash, sludges, scrap pellets and other wastes from manufacturing processes which require special handling and/or disposal procedures, or (2) industrial facilities that (A) are owned at the date of adoption of this ordinance or at any time thereafter by Persons that own a landfill licensed under Act 641 or Act No. 64, Public Acts of Michigan, 1978, as amended, (B) are in Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) major group codes 20 through 39 and (C) manufacture, process or otherwise use a toxic chemical listed pursuant to Title III of the Superfund Amendments and the Reauthorization Act of 1980 (SARA), Section 313 (49 CFR Part 373).

(j) "Non-Burnable Rubbish" means material which due to its nature or use, cannot be economically processed by the Plant and shall include all cans, drums or similar containers used for paint, oil, lacquers, turpentine, cleaning fluids and the like; ashes, cinders, sand, earth, discarded metal furniture, pipe, structural steel, stoves, refrigerators, automobile parts, explosives, chemicals, radioactive material and similar material; highly combustible materials such as gasoline, kerosene, paint thinners, asphalt or tar as well as products impregnated with the above and similar types of liquids or compounds; and materials such as lumber, scrap wood, cartons, crates, tree trimmings and other combustible materials in lengths over 3 feet.

(k) "Person" means any individual, firm, public or private corporation, partnership, trust, public or private agency or any other entity, or any group of such persons.

(l) "Plant" means the incinerator plant of the Authority and the site therefor and all other properties (as the same may from time to time exist) used or useful in connection therewith.

(m) "Premises" means any area used for residential, commercial, or industrial purposes, separately or in combination to which a separate street address, postal address or box, fax toll description, or similar identification has been assigned or is in use by a Person having control of the area.

(n) "Recyclable Materials" means the following commingled and/or pre-sorted materials that are sepa-

rated from solid waste prior to the collection of solid waste from a site of generation and left at the site of generation, or at a drop-off center for collection: high grade paper, glass, metal, plastic, aluminum, newspaper, corrugated paper and yard clippings.

(o) "Regulations" means the rules and regulations concerning the collection and processing or disposal of Solid Waste which are adopted by the City Council of the City pursuant to Section 55.05 (2) of this Ordinance.

(p) "Site of Generation" means any Premises in the City in or on which Solid Waste is generated by a Person.

(q) "Solid Waste" means garbage, rubbish, ashes, street cleanings, solid commercial and solid industrial waste, and animal waste provided, however, that this definition shall not include Hazardous Waste, Recyclable Materials, Industrial Special Waste, Construction/Demolition Debris, Non-Burnable Rubbish, lead acid batteries, municipal sludges, human body waste, liquid or other waste regulated by statute, ferrous or non-ferrous scrap directed to a scrap metal processor or to a reuser or ferrous or non-ferrous products, slag or slag products directed to a slag processor or to a reuser of slag or slag products, sludges and ashes managed as recycled or nondeleterious materials appropriate for agricultural or non-agricultural use pursuant to a plan approved by the Director of the MDNR, materials approved for emergency disposal by the Director of the MDNR and fly ash or other ash produced from the combustion of coal when used as set forth in Section 7(1) of Act 641.

(r) "Solid Waste Hauler License" means a license issued to a Waste Hauler pursuant to the provisions of Section 55.05 of this Ordinance.

(s) "Waste Hauler" means any Person other than the City engaged in the business of collecting and transporting, delivering and disposing of Solid Waste originating within the City.

(t) "Yard Clippings" means fallen leaves, cut grass, lake weeds or other organic debris that can be converted to humus.

Section 55.03 Generators of Solid Waste.

All Solid Waste from any Site of Generation intended for collection shall be stored and placed for pick-up and collection at the times and in the manner provided in the Regulations.

Section 55.04 Collection and Disposal of Solid Waste.

(1) No Person shall dispose of any Solid Waste originating within the City other than by means of the City or a Waste Hauler duly licensed by the City for such purposes.

(2) Commencing on April 1, 1993 all Solid Waste originating within the City shall be collected and delivered to the Plant or other facility designated from time to time by the City consistent with the direction of the Authority pursuant to the Agreement.

(3) Unless the contract between the Waste Hauler and the City or the license from the City provides that the City shall pay Disposal Fees directly, a Waste Hauler shall pay the Disposal Fee established by the Authority in accordance with the Agreement. Except as otherwise permitted by the Authority, a Waste Hauler shall be required to maintain a credit balance in its account with the Authority sufficient to cover Disposal fees for any Solid Waste delivered to the Plant or elsewhere in accordance with the Agreement. The obligation to pay the Disposal Fee pursuant to this Ordinance shall be absolute and unconditional, whether or not the delivered Solid Waste is processed or disposed of, in whole or in part, at the Plant or elsewhere.

(4) No person shall engage in the business of collecting, transporting, delivering, or disposing of Solid Waste originating within the City without first obtaining a Solid Waste Hauler License. Solid Waste Hauler Licenses shall be issued upon application to the Clerk, on forms provided thereto and upon payment of the required fees as may be established by resolution of the City Council from time to time. It shall be an express condition of each Solid Waste Hauler License that the Waste Hauler shall comply with all provisions of this Ordinance and all applicable provisions of other ordinances or resolutions adopted by the City.

(5) Waste Haulers shall comply with the Act 641 Plan and all applicable federal and state laws, statutes, rules and regulations (including but not limited to Act 641 and administrative rules promulgated pursuant to Act 641) in the collection, transportation, delivery, and disposal of Solid Waste. Waste Haulers shall also comply with all rules and regulations adopted from time to time by the Authority for the administration and operation of the Plant and other facilities.

(6) A Waste Hauler shall not knowingly collect or deliver Hazardous Waste to the Plant or any other facility designated from time to time by the City consistent with the direction of the Authority pursuant to the Agreement.

Section 55.05 Miscellaneous.

(1) Penalties. Any Person who shall violate a provision of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by imprisonment not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both such fine and imprisonment. Each day that a violation occurs or continues shall be deemed a separate offense. Three or more violations of this Ordinance by a Waste Hauler shall be cause for suspension or revocation of a Solid Waste Hauler License.

(2) Regulations. The City Council of the City shall adopt by ordinance or, to the extent permitted by law, by resolution, reasonable regulations and guidelines contemplated by this Ordinance or in addition to the manner, days, and times for the collection of Solid Waste, or as otherwise required by the terms hereof. Except in an emergency situation, such regulations shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation within the City at least thirty (30) days prior to their proposed effective date.

(3) Severability. If any section, sentence, or any other part of this Ordinance is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid, such judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance and shall be confined in its effect to the section, sentence, or other part of this Ordinance directly involved in the controversy in which judgment shall be rendered.

(4) Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication as provided by law.

These pitchmen misuse quotes by physicians like Dr. Art Ulene, or writers on medical matters, such as Jane Brody. These experts speak in favor of water therapy but not as a substitute for medication, as promoters by using partial quotes, imply. Inevitably the price of this substitute therapy is high. The cost is brushed aside by the salesman's contention that medical science is too arrogant to admit the "commonsense" approach being sold to you is superior to "highfalutin" science.

Before accepting a claim about the benefit of water therapy, or any therapy presented as different and better, check with your doctor or this area's Arthritis Foundation Chapter, phone number: 350-3030.

#### BRAISED LAMB SHANKS

- 5 lamb (or veal) shanks (7-8 pounds)
- Seasoned flour for dredging the lamb
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 3/4 cup garlic cloves, coarsely chopped
- 6 onions, each cut into eighths
- 1 cup dry red wine
- 1/2 cup dry white wine
- 1/2 cup chicken broth
- 6-8 new potatoes, peeled and halved
- 4-6 carrots, peeled and cut into thirds

Dredge the lamb shanks in the flour, shaking off the excess. In a large skillet, heat the oil over moderately high heat until it is hot but not smoking. Brown the lamb shanks in the oil, transferring them as they are browned to paper towels to drain.

Add the garlic and the onions and cook the mixture over moderate heat, stirring until the onions are softened and begin to turn a golden color.

Return the lamb to the skillet, add the wines, the broth, salt and pepper to taste, and bring the liquid to a boil. Simmer the shanks, covered, stirring occasionally, for 1 1/2 hours and then add carrots and new potatoes.

Continue cooking for an additional 1 1/2 to 2 hours, or until meat is tender. Serves 6.

#### TOSSED VEGETABLE SALAD

- 1 red pepper, diced

#### 1 can artichoke hearts, quartered (13 ounces)

- 1 can hearts of palm, sliced (14 ounces)
- 1-2 tomatoes, diced
- 1 can water chestnuts, sliced (8 ounces)
- 8-10 black olives, sliced
- 3-4 leaves fresh basil, chopped
- Salt to taste
- Freshly ground black pepper to taste
- Olive oil
- Balsamic vinegar

Prepare the vegetables and combine in a bowl. Drizzle a small amount of olive oil over the vegetables so that they are very lightly coated and then add a splash of balsamic vinegar. Toss gently and season with salt and freshly ground pepper to taste.

#### HENRY'S CHEESECAKE

- 1 1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs
- 2 cups sugar, divided
- 1/4 cup butter, softened
- 3 pounds cream cheese, softened to room temperature
- 9 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- juice of one lemon
- 1 1/2 cup sour cream

Make crust by mixing together graham cracker crumbs, 1/4 cup sugar and softened butter. Lightly butter 10-inch round cake pan that is 3

of Mothers Against Drunk Driving, Oakland County Chapter, said MADD isn't against people drinking, just drinking and driving.

"We work in conjunction with First Night in Birmingham, and AAA to try to advocate alternate outings on New Year's Eve. Make it a family outing, and set an example by not drinking. Have a theme party and make non-alcoholic drinks. Add a candy cane to the glass so people won't feel like they're missing something. Make drinks exciting."

First Night in Birmingham is an alcohol-free festival of the arts the whole family can enjoy on New Year's Eve. It begins at 4 p.m. and ends at 11:30 p.m. with a midnight celebration in Shain Park.

First Night admission buttons are \$7 and allow you access to First Night Entertainment sites. Children under 5 are free. For information, call 540-6688.

If you do plan to drink on New Year's Eve, McNeil encourages people to make arrangements for a designated driver. "People need to look ahead and consider the consequences of drinking and driving. If you do drink and haven't made arrangements for a driver, you can call our hot line for a free cab ride. It will be operating 9 p.m. New Year's Eve to 5 a.m. New Year's Day. Call 353-1993."

"Last year 11 people were killed in 11 crashes in Michigan during the Christmas and New Year's period," said Jerry Basch, AAA Michigan Community Safety Services manager. "Half of those fatal crashes involved alcohol."

If you're hosting a New Year's Eve party, or going to one, here are some things to consider.

When you are at a party, know what you are drinking. Holiday punches and egg nog often have a higher alcohol content than beer or wine.

Offer plenty of foods high in protein and carbohydrates, such as cheese, cookies, pastry, pasta, and nuts which help retard the absorption of alcohol into the bloodstream.

Serve alternative beverages such as non-alcoholic beers, non-alcoholic champagnes, and wines, fruit juices, and mineral water.

Fruity frozen ice cubes add a festive touch to drinks and punches. Freeze pieces of fruit in ice cube trays with water or fruit juice and add as special holiday gems to "on-the-rocks" beverages. Stop serving alcohol at least an hour before the party is to end.

inches high (not a springform pan.) Press crumb mixture into bottom of pan and shake on sides to coat.

With an electric mixer, beat cream cheese with remaining sugar until smooth. Add eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition. Add vanilla, lemon juice and sour cream, beating until mixture is smooth. Four cream cheese mixture over crust. Place cake pan in another large, deep pan. Pour water around cake pan to a depth of about 1 1/2 inches. Bake in a 300 degree oven for 2 hours or until center is set.

When cake is baked, chill several hours or overnight in refrigerator. To remove cake from pan, place cake on a burner that has been heated and turned off, for one minute. Carefully turn cake out onto a 10-inch plate and then turn it right-side-up onto serving plate.

"Through the modern miracles of television, everybody gets a share of us on New Year's," says bassist Dana Strum with a chuckle.

Everybody meaning fans at Harpo's in Detroit and those watching Dick Clark's annual New Year's Eve special. The October taping of the TV show crushed Strum's preconceived notions of "making it big."

■ Trash Brats, Mother Superior, Objects in the Mirror, Elan Bane, and Glamour Puss perform at the Marquee, 8139 E. Seven Mile (one block east of Van Dyke) in Detroit.

■ Sweet Teaze, Heaven's Wish, Killing Floor, Sage, The Heat and Children of the Revolution play during a Z-Rock live broadcast from the Ritz in Roseville. DJ "The Sharkman" hosts the evening.

## Death and departure doesn't keep Generals from playing

The Generals' Tony Cole will always remember Aug. 17, 1991, as the day his bassist Flip Cherven died in a car accident.

Ask Cole about the death and he'll make sure you remember it.

"Let's see," he says. He pushes his shirt down around his shoulder to reveal a tattoo with Cherven's name and date of death inscribed. "Aug. 17, 1991," he says. He fixes his shirt. Case closed.

Cherven will never be out of mind, however. Cole and the other members of The Generals have remembered Cherven while trying to march on.

"The first couple gigs without him were tough. (But) once things started, we were really rocking," Cole said.

The death is one in a long line of setbacks for the Ferndale-based band. Since its inception in 1986, The Generals have also gone through five lead guitarists and a handful of vans. Although Cherven's death devastated the band, The Generals decided to stay together in honor of the late bassist. Drummer Matt Washburn says there's one other basic reason.

"What it comes down to is we're the best rock band in Detroit and we can't deny ourselves or anybody else of that," he says with a grin.

Believing the group was back on track, The Generals released a self-titled tape in mid-1992 on Chaos Network/Eastlawn. The excitement over the release was soon hampered, however, when the group's then-lead guitarist John Liccardello quit. The next guitarist lasted one gig. Now with Lenny Pops on lead guitar, the group's foundation is solidly, yet cautiously, planted.

"We wrote songs that we can do without (a lead guitarist) if someone dies or bails," says Washburn.

Cole says the changes delve much deeper. "More than before, we're emphasizing vocals and melodies," he said. "It was more of a decision of what we like and what we think will work for us."

The Generals also collaborated with outside songwriters for the first time — Jimmy Doom from the Almighty Lumberjacks of Death, and guitarist/vocalist Kevin James' cousin from New York, Zudhi K.

"We've selected help from all (musical) sides to put the best possible songs on stage and on tape," Cole said.

But they wouldn't have the opportunity if The Generals hadn't mustered the courage to go on after each mishap.

"After each setback I've found there's a healing process," Cole said. "After awhile you get this urge. Even if it's in the basement. Eventually it leads to the stage."

# 'Lover' offers sex without substance

She leans over the ferry railing, a floppy-brimmed fedora shading her eyes, her mother's oversized dress clinging in the heat of the summer afternoon. From a shiny black limousine, a rich man watches the girl, struck by her innocent beauty, and approaches her shyly and cautiously.

"The Lover," which has plenty of foreplay like this and even more explicit sex, gives us the structure and satisfaction of a porno movie but without the cheap lighting and camera work. I suppose there are worse ways to spend a winter evening than between the sheets in a steamy Saigon bachelor's room.

The film is based on a novel by Marguerite Duras, the popular French writer responsible for, among other things, the screenplay for "Hiroshima, Mon Amour" (1960). But "The Lover," her best-selling and partially autobiographical novel first pub-

lished in 1984, is amazingly hackneyed. The people populating the film are referred to only by their place in the story, not by name. So the young English girl in 1929 Vietnam is simply The Young Girl. Her lover is The Chinese Man. The impersonality makes a valid point about the characters and their inability to relate outside the bedroom, but it doesn't help audience's empathy with their situation.

English model-turned-actress Jane March is a bit older than the film's girl of 15 and she plays the part fairly effectively. But in the movies, where a new nymphette sizzles on screen every couple of years or so, she is simply this year's model.

In a film where surface emotion and surface texture is everything, she looks fabulous. So does Tony Leung as the title character, who impresses the girl so much because he has virtually no responsibilities in life except to make love and eventually marry a wealthy Chinese virgin.

Director Jean-Jacques Annaud previously brought us the laughable "The Bear" and has similar trouble here getting expression

from his lead performers. The love scenes are indeed steamy, but there is always the sense of lumbering manipulation, as if he's again trying to move bear (here bare) meat into proper position.

The movie does provide, some emotional dynamics in a scene where the girl's mother and brother meet the man for dinner and take leering advantage of his hospitality. They don't approve because he is Chinese; they know that he is more than just a friend. Still, they exercise varying degrees of denial when it comes to stopping the gravy train.

"The Lover" is also beautiful to look at. Cinematographer Robert Fraisse shows us the muddy expanse of the Mekong River during ferry crossings. The scenes in the man's bachelor's room (the place wealthy men take their mistresses) are dimly lit, with bustling peasant shadows cast against wooden blinds. Street noise clatters just outside.

"The Lover" was made by a French director and producer in English for MGM. They have obviously seen the box-office receipts generated from erotic epics like Japan's "In the Realm of the

Senses." Here, they can deliver the goods in a European package without all those annoying subtleties.

At least a quarter of the film (the press kit boasts one-third) is either sex or preparation for sex. There is a detailed depiction of the girl losing her virginity; a scene of unbridled, can't-even-make-it-over-to-the-bed lust and a rape, where the girl clenches her teeth and then asks the man how much this act would have cost him in a brothel.

Fortunately, we are spared another potential rape scene with the girl's creepy brother, which always seems to loom on the horizon. Violent and opium-addicted, he is the most interesting character in the film, yet he, like the other family members, is only handled peripherally.

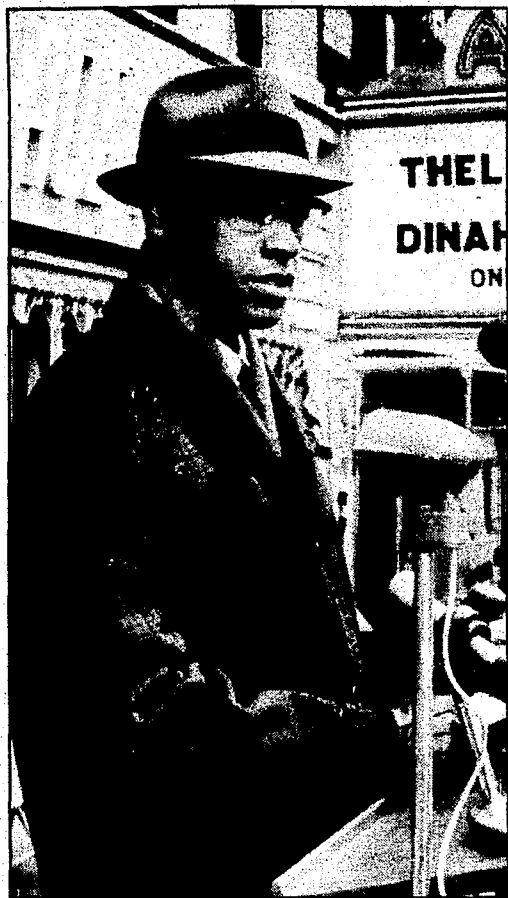

# Guns change response for coming of age in the '90s

Dear Readers, Often, when someone learns that I am an advice columnist, they have a question, ready and waiting for me.

That happened this week. I had been at a meeting and when it was over the man next to me asked, "What is it you write?" I answered and he immediately told me the following story. After you hear it you will understand the subject's importance and why I have included it in this column.

The man who requested advice has a 15-year-old stepson who was recently threatened by a boy at school. The boy doing the

threatening says he owns, and is well known, to have a gun. Worried, the stepfather and his wife went to see the principal who told them that while he is aware of the problem he cannot do anything about it. He said that in other interactions with the family of the boy with the gun, he found them to be mistrustful of everyone but their son and supportive of the boy's attempt to "protect himself."

I asked the man with this problem if he understood how his stepson had gotten into this mess. He said that his stepson fought with another boy about some inconsequential matter and that when he won the loser engaged the boy with the gun to help him get revenge.

When he told his stepson to ignore any further attempts to in-

volve him, his stepson said that would make him look and feel like a coward; he couldn't run away and feel good about himself.

The questioner said he feels even greater concern because he knows his stepson has a big mouth and that his birth father supports him in his belief that only by fighting back can he "be a man." So, my now friend wanted to know, "What should he do?"

(This is a story that took place in a suburban school not in the city where there is less surprise about young boys using guns.)

I am puzzled as to how to answer the concerned stepfather. One reason is that as women, my friends and I have not had this typical boys' experience of being bullied. As women, we have not had to learn how to react in these situations because they do not come up for us.

As I understand, many boys encounter the experience with a bully and their parents do not know

how to help them because of this new entity in our culture, the presence of a gun in the hands of children.

In the "old days" the advice usually given to a young boy was that he should not run away from the bully. Running away merely increased the bully's victimizing the "sissy." Often, when the boy refused to be intimidated by the bully and would fight back, the bully would not pick on him anymore and would look for a new victim.

Such a scenario would allow the boy to gain confidence in himself and in his feelings of maleness. This could be overdone in cultures where being macho was very important. It even turned out that sometimes the former "sissy" became a bully.

With the presence of guns, giving advice to stand and fight can be foolhardy, if not fatal. America has become a violent culture with the possession of hand guns proli-

ferating at a rapid rate. The United States has the highest rate of violent crimes in the industrialized world.

I do think that the school system has the responsibility to do something about banning the possession of guns in school but that won't protect this young man outside of school.

The government also has a responsibility in this major problem. When Thomas Jefferson wrote the Declaration of Independence he based it on the belief that individuals should learn to control themselves, using values, such as the 10 Commandments and the New and Old Testaments. He felt that in a democracy the government should step in to handle those individuals who are incapable of governing themselves.

To me, our government agencies, schools, legislature and executives need to more seriously ad-

dress this problem of gun control. Until this happens, parents need to become more involved. They need to take a more active role to protect their children from dangers that can lead to the death of young boys.

It is no longer safe for boys to go through the rites of passage that had, before now, been a part of their identities as men. We no longer live in a society in which normal aggressiveness can be worked through. It is important to work to make our world a safe one again.

## No holiday cheer for sad S'craft

**T**is the season to be jolly . . . Honest. It is. To be painfully accurate, these could indeed be the final days of joy for Dave Bogataj, as pitiful as they seem.

It takes a long step away from conventional understanding to describe what Bogataj has endured thus far this basketball season as joyous. His Schoolcraft College men's team is, in his own terminology, "O-for-December."

If you're mathematical, that adds up to seven losses in seven December games. Merry Christmas.

The Ocelots are 3-10 overall (they've lost eight-straight, going back to November). They are 0-4 in the Eastern Conference.

Unless something very dramatic happens very quickly, they will finish this season as they have the last four under Bogataj's direction: with a losing record, a non-threat in the playoffs.

In heartless, but precise, terms — a patsy. How can this team start so optimistically each season, then fold up? Said Bogataj, showing his frustration: "Every year, it's something different."

There is one similarity in the last 4½ years of losing, however, and it happens every January. Which also tells you how things can get even worse this year. Because January is here.

### Time to pay dues

Anyone remotely familiar with SC men's basketball knows what happens the first week of January. First-semester grades are posted.

Every year, that has cost Bogataj players. And on a team that rarely possesses the talent to compete in the Eastern Conference, the loss of any player hurts.

A couple of seasons ago, Bogataj lost so many players at the semester break, he had to recruit the guy working as his scorekeeper — Lee Hunt, a soccer player at SC — to join the team.

Believe me, it was a pitiful sight. No slight to Hunt — he wasn't a bad ballplayer. Before joining the SC varsity, he used to play with a bunch of us old guys on Thursday mornings, and he was easily as good as any of us.

But, somehow, I don't think many in that group would fare too well against Eastern Conference-caliber talent.

Nor is this a slam at Bogataj. His position borders on impossible. Academic standards are higher at SC than at most other NJCAA schools in the state, the enrollment is lower, and administration support and interest is, at best, mediocre.

So — a nightmare without an end, right?

### Worse times ahead

The situation is deteriorating. Bogataj started pre-season practice with 14 players on his roster. Eight remain.

Two (Quincy Mitchell and Jon Fitzpatrick) were casualties before the season opened. Jerome Carter played a couple of games, then tore up his knee. He's out for the year.

Frank McCray played several games, but a series of family tragedies forced him to leave. Craig Bowdry and John Lathan each had a disagreement with their coach and were suspended, for what Bogataj said were "disciplinary reasons."

Of the eight remaining, only one — center Jarvis Murray — played at SC last year. Now the question is, how many will be around when SC returns to action Jan. 9 at home against Alpena CC.

If Bogataj loses just two players — and that would match SC's previous best performance since he's been coaching — he would be left with six.

Who would play? Well, one guy has been added: Dan Stevens, a 6-foot guard from Plymouth Salem. Problem is, Stevens never played for Salem's varsity.

The Ocelots have been unable to win with a full team. How will they win with even less? Bogataj will tell you, they play 30 to 35 minutes of solid basketball a game, but for five minutes they go vacationing and it costs them.

"I don't know what it is," said Bogataj. "You can go back every game to a point where we go four or five or six minutes without scoring. It's perplexing."

It's worse than that, really. It's shameful. This team has talent, with Murray, Courtney Williamson, Steve Whitlow, Bryant Markowicz, Mohammed Abdrabbah and Vincent Turner. Those guys can all play.

Problem is, they never show up at the same time. They certainly never did during December. Consistency is lacking.

How Bogataj maintains an upbeat attitude — and he does — amazes me. It will amaze me even more if everyone on the team makes grades, injuries subside, and there's a team-wide winning attitude implant.

Then, maybe, SC can turn this thing around. But that's a big maybe.

# All-Area '83: 10 years after



Ten years ago they were the brightest stars on the Observerland basketball scene. They left the area for various colleges and universities, each armed with an athletic scholarship and a dream.

One is a pilot. Another is a successful auto executive who spends his off hours counseling high school kids. One is still chasing a dream of playing in the NBA. One has forsaken all sports except hunting. Another is still trying to find and forge a career path.

Ten years ago, they were the brightest stars on the Observerland basketball scene. Mike Maleske of Redford Catholic Central, Lewis Scott of Redford Bishop Borgess, Tom Domako of Livonia Stevenson, Dave Houle of Plymouth Salem and George Sibel of Redford Thurston comprised the 1982-1983 Observer All-Area team.

"This is good," said Scott. "I always wondered what paths all these guys chose. I'll bet we've gone in all different directions."

Yes and no. All five went to college with athletic scholarships. Four of the five endured injuries at some point along the way. Three of the five left athletics somewhat bitter or disappointed. Four of the five are married but none have children. Some made a smooth transition from athletics to the real world. Others struggled. All seem to be living happy and productive lives.

Here, then, is a 10th anniversary look at the 1982-1983 All-Area basketball team — where have they been and where are they going.

### MIKE MALESKE

The 17.5 points and 13 rebounds per game he averaged during his senior year at CC proved to be his peak production, thanks to a host of injuries, most notably a surgically re-

paired knee that all but ruined his four-year career at Bowling Green.

"I knew right then that my basketball career was pretty much over," Maleske said of the surgery in his sophomore year. "When the mind wants you to do something and your body won't do it, it's time to go."

The problem wasn't so much the sudden ending of his basketball career but the uncertainty of what to do next.

"I kind of foundered a bit," he said. "I figured I would just play ball in Europe or someplace and postpone getting a real job for as long as I could. Luckily, I found aviation."

He found aviation the hard way. He left Bowling Green without a degree and took a job as a ramp laborer at Detroit Metropolitan Airport.

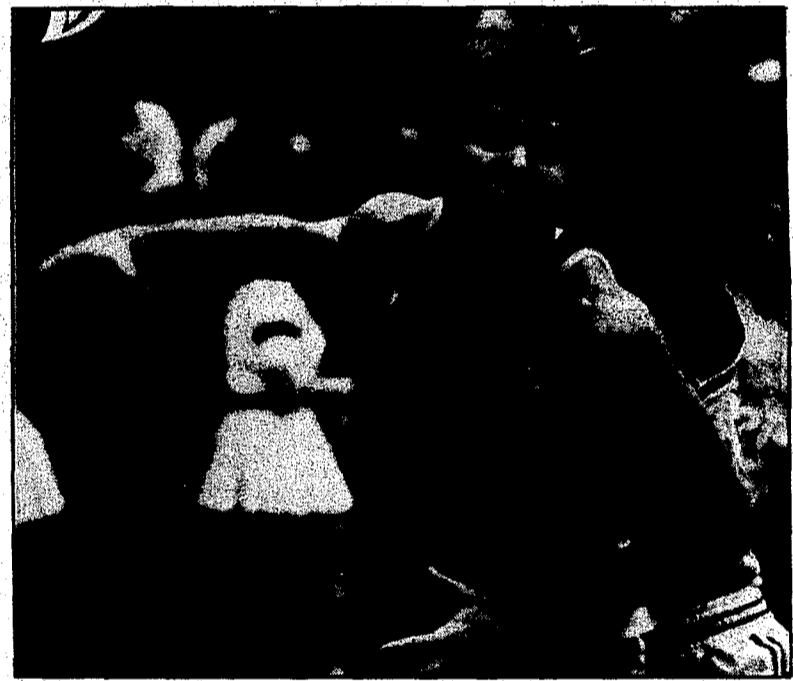
"I would be out there busting my butt and I would look up and see those pilots," he said. "I said to myself, 'I can do that.'"

He saved his money and enrolled in flight school in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He learned his lessons so well that he became a flight instructor. He got a job with a commuter airline in Miami flying shuttles to the Bahamas and Key West. But the airline, Bar Harbor, went out of business two years ago.

"The major airlines require their pilots to have a four-year degree, so I had to go back to Bowling Green and finish up," he said.

Maleske, who has been commuting back and forth from Bowling Green to southern Florida where his parents and his girlfriend of four years live, will have a degree in aeronautic technology in May.

"I'm doing real well right now," he

said. "Once I get the degree out of the way, I'll be back on track. You might want to put in the article that I'm available and looking for work."

### LEWIS SCOTT

In the All-Area story 10 years ago, Borgess coach Mike Fusco was quoted as saying that Scott was totally focused in two areas: basketball and books. And now, after a highly successful basketball and academic career at Eastern Michigan University, Scott is coming back to his old stomping grounds as living proof that

basketball is only a means to success, not the end itself.

"Myself and Joe Gregory (another basketball standout from Borgess) come back to the school about once a month to talk to the kids. We are trying to establish a mentor program," said Scott, who is 18th on Eastern's all-time scoring list with 1,014 points. "We try to let them know that they don't have to play ball to do OK for themselves. We have to get these kids to realize that academics and basketball are related. We

## Mercy grad living out dream as Irish walk-on

Please, what ever you do, don't pinch Susie Atchinson. Because if this is all a dream, she does not want to wake up. Not yet.

There she was Monday night, in a Notre Dame basketball uniform, sitting on the bench. It was late in the first half. Notre Dame was losing to Georgia and its top two shooting guards were in foul trouble. Suddenly, Irish coach Muffet McGraw looks down the bench.

"Susie, go in for Sherri," she says.

Just that quickly, Atchinson is in the game. In the game. Not garbage time, mind you. We're talking quality minutes here. Quality Division I women's basketball minutes.

"Sometimes I wake up in the morning and I can't even believe this is happening," said Atchinson.

Believe it.

Atchinson was a solid, over-achieving shooting guard at Farmington Hills Mercy from 1988 to 1991. She

was a tireless worker and a dangerous perimeter shooter. But she was not what you would classify as a hot Division I prospect. In fact, the only scholarship offers she got were from small, far away Division III schools.

"I had a fine high school career. I played four sports and I really enjoyed it," said Atchinson, who is from Plymouth. "But I figured that was the end of it."

She went to Notre Dame, figuring to put her academic skills (she was salutatorian at Mercy, carrying a 4.0 grade point average) to work. But basketball wouldn't leave her alone. She played nearly every day at The Rock, Notre Dame's intramural facility.

"Sitting out that year made me realize how much I loved playing basketball," she said. "I played against some of the girls from the team at The Rock and they kept telling me I should try out for the varsity. It was something that was always in the back of my mind, wondering whether or not I could make it. I just decided

that I would rather have somebody tell me that I couldn't play. I needed to prove to myself, either I could or I couldn't. Really, I had nothing to lose."

So, last fall, she and 12 other non-scholarship players showed up for varsity practice all hoping to win the one open spot on the team. The selection process was grueling, both mentally and physically.

"It was so crazy, nobody would tell you anything," she said. "Every day I would check the list for my name. I told myself, if it was there, fine; if not, well, at least I tried."

The list shrank to eight, then to four, then to two — but Atchinson's name was always there.

"One day I showed up to practice and I was the only one there," she said. "The manager started asking me what shoe size I wore and I said, 'Does this mean I made it?' She said, 'Oh, yeah, didn't anybody tell you? Congratulations.'"

Atchinson has never been told why

she was chosen over the 11 other women.

"I don't think it had much to do with talent," she said. "I think it had more to do with desire and attitude. I wanted it so bad that I would do anything to make it. I wasn't frightened by the amount of time it took or by all the hard work and I think the coaches picked up on that."

What the Notre Dame coaches saw in Atchinson were the same qualities that Coach Larry Baker marveled at and applauded her for at Mercy.

"She is a terrific self-made player," Baker said. "When we first saw her, we were impressed by her quickness. But she broke her leg and had to sit out her entire freshman season. And the quickness was gone. She had to re-create her style of play. As coaches, we really appreciated her attitude and dedication to the sport. And I am sure she impressed the Notre Dame coaches with what she will bring to

have to get them to look at and prepare for life after basketball."

Scott is the perfect role model. After graduating from Eastern with a degree in business communication, he took a job with Pepsi. He worked his way up the ladder there for three years before landing a job as district manager for the Chrysler Corp. He is currently in charge of the largest sales district in the Metro Detroit area. He was married last August and lives in Southfield.

"I hope they can look at me and see that I'm doing real well without playing basketball," Scott said. "I want them to know that the lessons they learned in sports relate to the real world. The things that make you great in business are hard work, the ability to work with people and be a part of a team. That's what these companies are looking for."

"I was lucky that when I was at Eastern I had people who helped me keep focused on academics. When I was done playing, I still had two credit hours left before I could graduate. I chose to come back and finish school. Who knows, if I didn't, I might still be chasing that NBA dream."

## TOM DOMAKO

The dream still burns for Domako, but it is starting to flicker.

"I'm kind of at a crossroads right now," said the 26-year-old, who left Stevenson and became somewhat of a folk hero at Montana State University. "I'm getting on in years as far as basketball goes. There are so many things I want to do with my life. I want to go back and get my degree. I want to raise a family. I don't want to be 55 years old and have a kid in high school, you know?"

But "But I still think there is a lot of good basketball left in me."

Fate has intervened to give Domako some time to weigh all his options. He was playing in the top professional league in Belgium and averaging 22.5 points per game. But last week his step-mother died and he wanted to come home to be with his father. The Belgium officials wouldn't let him leave. He came home anyway and he was cut

from the team. "This would be a good time to change course in my life," he said. "If I decide I want to change course."

He's certainly traveled a long and exhausting road since leaving Stevenson. He was a star at Montana State, averaging better than 21 points per game his junior and senior seasons. He was first team all-Big Sky both years and was the league's most valuable player his junior year. "I scored 27 points in my first college game and from then on people started giving me all kinds of nicknames," he said. "They called me Downtown Domako. They called my three-pointers Livonia Layups. They called me Instant Offense."

He played a year in France before the Houston Rockets came calling before the 1989-1990 season and gave him a guaranteed contract.

"That was my one legitimate shot at it," he said.

But he wound up a victim of the numbers game and was the last person cut from the team. Since then, he's been a basketball vagabond, traveling throughout the Continental Basketball Association, making stops at Cedar Rapids, Columbus and Rockford, before heading out to Belgium.

Domako's production has steadily decreased over the years, largely due to a bum knee.

"I knew I needed surgery, but I couldn't afford to miss the games," he said. "Time is money."

He finally had surgery to repair the knee last fall and his game has shown a marked improvement.

"I wish I would have had it done years ago," he said. "I can't remember when it has felt this good."

So, maybe he'll return to the CBA and give it one more shot. Or, perhaps he and his wife of four years, Vicki, will move back to Montana where he'll return to school and pursue a degree in computer science. But for the time being, he's going to stay home and be with his father.

"I told my agent not to do anything until after the holidays," he said. "Then I'll see what's next."

## DAVE HOULE

Sometimes it ends too quickly

and you don't get time to shift gears and chart a new course. Houle was at the top of his game one minute, down and out the next.

"It was hard," said Houle, who went from being a 215-pound basketball star at Salem to a rugged 275-pound offensive lineman at Michigan State. "When you are in a lifestyle as structured as sports, and then all of a sudden you are working and you're married — it's just not the same thing. It's tough."

Houle became the starting right tackle on one of the best offensive lines in Big Ten history. He, along with Tony Mandarich, Bob Kula and Pat Shurmer, anchored a line that propelled Michigan State to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl victory in 1987. Behind that line, the Spartans averaged close to 300 yards rushing per game and Lorenzo White amassed 1,572 yards and 16 touchdowns.

He was drafted by the New York Giants and then the spotlight was shut off. First, a series of shoulder injuries forced him out of pro football. Then came allegations that Houle, Mandarich and other Spartans took steroids; allegations that Houle vehemently denied, allegations that were never proven.

"The way everything ended left a bad taste in my mouth," Houle said. "I don't play sports anymore and I don't watch football on television. I haven't been back to East Lansing. It hurts too much. When it's over, it's over."

Don't misunderstand. Houle isn't unhappy with his life. Like everyone, he just has some bad memories. But the future, he says, is bright.

"I've got a good job (he's the safety director at Harlan Electronics in Southfield), a nice wife (Michelle) and nice home in Plymouth," he said. "Things are real good for me now."

## GEORGE SIBEL

Speaking of bad memories. Sibel, after averaging 22.5

points per game and leading Thurston to its first Northwest Suburban League title in 20 years, had a brief and unhappy college career at Siena Heights.

"I didn't really enjoy it," Sibel said. "I ran into some biased coaching."

After spending a season on the junior varsity, Sibel became a starting guard for Coach Ben Braun (now at Eastern). He played well, but when a couple of other players rejoined the team after sitting out academic suspensions, Sibel was relegated to the bench. He didn't return to Siena for his junior season.

"Everything is politics," he said. "I've learned that no matter what you do, no matter how good you are, you are expendable. There's no loyalty."

Sibel finished his education at Madonna University, getting a degree in criminal justice. But he has yet to settle on a career path. He's currently a security officer working the afternoon shift at the Ford Rouge Plant.

"I am keeping my eyes open," said Sibel, who married the former Julie Hultquist of Redford. "It's hard to find an occupation where there are jobs. I'm looking at a bunch of things. You are very lucky if you can do in life what you really want to."

He thinks he might like to try robotics. He may return to school and study computer science or seek a master's degree in corporate law. He is looking into a job as a probation officer.

"My life is moving full-speed ahead," he said.

As for athletics, Sibel is the scourge of the area's recreation leagues.

"My brother (Jim) and I kill," he said. "We played in this four-on-four league and I averaged 52 points per game. My game is better now that it was in high school."

He has put on about 30 pounds of muscle mass since his high school days and he has developed an inside game.

"I can still dunk," he said. "Not bad for a 27-year-old."

be better in any way I can," she said. "If I can help in a game, great. If not, then I will help in practice. I'm not even thinking about next year. I still can't get over all that's happened this year."
