Schools size up proposed policies



Wayne-Westland school administrators propose to prohibit sexual harassment and political activity by employees on school time or property. The board may act on those and other policies as early as May 24.

Sexual harassment of school employees and students won't be tolerated under a proposed policy that has drawn support from the Wayne-Westland school board.

The policy is one of several that could win board approval as early as next week. Other measures would: Tighten academic requirements for students who play sports or participate in other extracurricular activ-

Prohibit employees from campaigning for political candidates on school property.

Force employees to receive permis-

using the pupil in after-school political campaigns.

The latest measures have emerged as the seven-member board struggles to update its policies on issues that, in some cases, have sparked controversy in the 16,500-student district.

Some residents have long criticized the use of students in Wayne-Westland elections for tax increases.

Under the harassment policy school employees and students could be disciplined for "unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors or other verbal or physical conduct re-

or, national origin, age, religion, height, weight, marital status or han-

Such issues could not be raised as a condition of employment. In severe cases of sexual harassment, employees could be fired or students could be suspended, according to school board members.

Amid concerns that gays and lesbians could be harassed, board president Leonard Posey has suggested adding sexual orientation to the

Top cop has busy week

Donald Haigh solved a murder and on the Westland police depart ment's top award — all in one week.

Not bad for this 39-year-old detective sergeant who has climbed the ranks since he joined the department as a cadet in 1973, when he was only

Haigh was named Westland Police Officer of the Year during a ceremony Wednesday at the Friendship Center an award that marked a career milestone.

"The award was probably the highlight of my career," Haigh said. 'It was certainly unexpected, but very deeply appreciated.'

Haigh was selected by a committee of his peers, who know good police work when they see it. The award honors 20 years of exemplary work.

'He's always there when you need him, and he picks the cases up and runs with them," said police Chief Emery Price.

Haigh and his partner, detective Sgt. Marc Stobbe, handle some of the department's toughest cases, such as murders and armed robberies. Just last week, the two solved the stabbing death of a Westland man found in the

Blue Garden Apartments on Cherry Hill Road.

Haigh also was the chief officer bast year in a murder trial that led to convictions against three Westland teenagers accused in a nighttime killing behind Adams Junior High School.

Haigh's fellow officers say he has a calm, quiet demeanor that belies an inner toughness. The committee that chose him noted that he "goes about his daily assignments with the quiet confidence of a person with a definite goal in life."

Haigh lives with his wife, Sherry, in Superior Township. They have two daughters, ages 12 and 8, and one son,

Haigh joined the police department as a cadet in July 1973 and was promoted to officer within two years. He

Police officer remains in coma

A Westland police officer remained unconscious Friday at Detroit Receiving Hospital, four days after he was involved in a two-car collision on the Southfield Freeway in Detroit.

"We're all praying for the kid," po-

lice Lt. Al George said Friday.

Ken Warsow's accident occurred early Monday morning, just two days before he was to accept a Certificate of Merit during the Westland Police Department's annual awards ceremony at the city's Friendship Center.

"He's a very cooperative officer," Westland Police Chief Emery Price said last week. "He's always friendly and upbeat."

Although Warsow remained unconscious Friday in the hospital's intensive care unit, his condition had been upgraded from critical to stable, according to a hospital spokeswoman.

Warsow's peers remained hopeful that he would continue to improve. Early on, doctors had been worried about bleeding that was occurring in his brain because of a closed head in-

"The bleeding has stopped," George said Friday, but added that doctors are still trying to determine why Warsow remained unconscious.

Details of Warsow's accident were sketchy. But Price had obtained a re-

port from the Michigan State Police indicating that Warsow and another motorist apparently collided on the Southfield Freeway near Puritan.

Price said Warsow and the other driver apparently tried to get into the same lane simultaneously when their vehicles collided. The impact sent the cars veering out of control, and Warsow apparently hit a concrete wall or an abutment, Price said.

Warsow was alone in the car at the time. Price said. The vehicle he was driving was not a Westland patrol

A Detroit resident, Warsow has been a Westland officer since October of 1991, Price said. He previously worked for the Detroit police, Price

Warsow's peers remained hopeful Friday that he would soon regain consciousness, recover from his injuries and be able to return to his job.

Merging banks begin renovation

Customers at Comerica Bank will find a larger branch as well as familiar faces behind the teller windows next month when the bank completes a major expan-

A bank spokeswoman said the \$800,000 improvement will add 1,100 square feet to the branch on Wayne Road between Warren Road and Hunter, bringing its size to 5.400 square feet.

The renovation, scheduled to be completed by late June, is part of the merger of Comerica and Manufacturers Bank announced last July.

When the renovated and expanded Comerica branch opens June 26, the nearby Manufacturers branch, two blocks away, will close, said Kathy Pitton, Comerica spokeswoman.

The new manager will be vice president Gene Plaunt, with Comerica for 34 years. The current managers at the two branches will retire.

Pitton said as part of the consolidation, the expanded branch will have employees from both Comerica and the nearby Manufacturers branch.

"This will allow (Comerica and Manufacturers') customers to see familiar faces" after the consolidation of the branches, Pitton

The expansion will have more teller windows, additional management employees' desks, and more employees, she said.

While the Comerica branch is being renovated, the lobby is closed but the bank is maintaining its drive-through lanes, auto-

matic teller terminals and night deposit slots.

When the improvement is completed next month, there will be four drive-through lanes and a drive-through automatic teller lane. Pitton said.

Comerica is collecting information about potential buyers of the Manufacturers branch, to be closed June 25, although Comerica isn't aggressively marketing the building yet, Pitton added.

Both branches were opened in the mid-1960s.

Bike riding cops to chase down crime

Cops on bikes are about to become Westland's newest crime

Several police officers will pedal through residential neighborhoods and business districts this summer to combat street crimes, in what is being billed as The Bike Patrol.

Children riding their bicycles may even recognize the older bikers. The Bike Patrol will use officers from the Westland Police Department's DARE (Drug Awareness Resistance Education) unit, which teaches an anti-drug message in Wayne-Westland elementary schools.

The DARE officers are preparing to begin their new assignment when school lets out in mid-June.

neighborhood problems by being highly visible in various areas, Mayor Robert Thomas announced.

City officials hope the officers will reduce crime and make the streets safer for children, too.

'We have a lot of young couples who have decided to make Westland their home and are raising families here," Thomas said.
"Raising a family today can bedifficult at best. We have to keep an extra close eye on our youngsters while they are playing out-

"I hope this program will give these parents some peace of mind in that our police officers are near

at hand," he said.

City officials also hope that the presence of DARE officers will help senior citizens and other residents to "relax a little more, knowing they are being watched

Police Chief Emery Price called the program "proactive" and said the officers will try to prevent crime "instead of waiting for something to happen.'

When asked if the officers could be placed at risk on the street, Price said, "It is a possibil-

However, he added that they will have portable radios and will ride in teams.

The city had considered a foot patrol, but officials decided the bike patrol would allow officers to cover more territory in less time. The officers will wear specialized uniforms, though plainclothes officers may eventually join the ef-

'Many residents have complained that the police are not in their neighborhoods enough to see what goes on," Thomas said, adding that he hopes the new patrol will change that perception.

To help with the cost, Thomas has announced a program that he called "A Buck for a Bike." Citizens who want to donate are being urged to mail donations to Michael Gorman, treasurer, City of Westland, 36601 Ford, Westland

for health reasons.

Elf, a German shepherd used by the U.S. Customs Service for 10 years, made his last public appearance recently at a Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) program at the school, on Wildwood north of Cherry Hill.

An estimated 400 students watched Customs Service officer Bob Sparks and Elf demonstrate the dog's drug-sniffing abilities.

Sparks said that the dog has helped law enforcement agents seize more than \$20 million and 110 kilos of cocaine.

Elf is one of the top 24 dogs in the Customs Service and even has his own trading card with a picture.

Sparks brought Elf to the Detroit office of the federal agency 10 years ago. The dog has taken part in hundreds of drug raids with various law enforcement agencies.

One example of Elf's aggressiveness and nose for drugs, Sparks said, is the time he sniffed out \$9,000 in drugs during the search of an apartment conducted by the Internal Revenue Service.

The-dog, 13, will be adopted by a Detroit area family this month, when he starts his retirement.

"I would keep him, but I have cats and Elf hates cats," Sparks said. "I will have to visit."

Schools say victory for 'A' would defeat pay to play

Pay-to-participate will vanish in Livonia Public Schools next year if Proposal A wins in the June 2 special election.

The elimination of this highly unpopular way to pay for school sports and activities is part of the best-case budget scenario put together by school administrators and tentatively accepted last week by the Livonia Board of Education.

Even if voters approve Proposal A, the district would still face \$3 million in cuts in its 1993-94 budget.

The estimated \$100 million budget tentatively reached last week will change drastically and dramatically if Proposal A fails.

Under this worse-case scenario, the district faces up to \$12 million in cuts and most likely the restoration of the pay-to-participate program. Under this scenario, further cuts will be made in budget sessions June 7-9.

Some SAFE cuts

No matter what happens at the polls June 2, the district's elementary schools faces the loss of six SAFE positions next year. This reduction will drop the number of SAFE staff to 16, and means that classroom teache SAFE program.

The best-case budget tentatively accepted by the board last week also restores some music and support staff the administration had suggested be cut.

If Proposal A passes, the jobs of 4.6 elementary instrumental music teachers will be restored as well as the jobs of three high school learning specialists.

Board president Pat Sari and trustee Joe Laura

"The music program is helpful to kids, and the high school dropout rate will increase if the high school kids don't have academic support," Sari said.

The trustees took \$163,000 from the district's pro-

posed \$650,000 reserve fund for next year to restore the two programs. That leaves \$500,000 next year for the reserve day fund.

An attempt by trustee Ken Timmons to pinkslip 23 more teachers failed in a 4-3 vote. Pink slips (notification of possible lay-off) have gone out to 231 teachers.

The actual budget won't be approved until the end of June. Superintentent Joseph Marinelli had asked the trustees to reach consensus on a tentative, "if-Proposal A-is-successful" budget, partly so teachers could be recalled promptly on June 3 if the proposal

"We also need to be able to show residents the impact Proposal A will have on next year's budget," Marinelli said.

Two weeks to go

The district has just two weeks to get information about Proposal A into the hands of residents.

"It will be a difficult challenge because of the short time line and the complexity of the message," said administrator Jack Kirksey. "We only have a few days to communicate as effectively as we can. We are trying to put the proposal into simplistic

The fact that 1,300 absentee ballots have been taken out and few returned so far shows residents still have many unanswered questions about Proposal A, Kirksey said.

"Normally, they come back right away. It sounds as if people still have a lot of questions and are undecided."

The district is now putting together a worksheet to show how Proposal A will affect a variety of Livonia families. The worksheet should be available this week

Students have begun to see the reality of how many teachers will be lost under the district's worsecase scenario for next year.

Male boss to be tried in sex case

A Westland restaurant owner has been ordered to stand trial amid accusations he sexually molested a 20-year-old Garden City woman who worked for him as a waitress.

Sokol Ndrejaj, 25, of Livonia faces trial in Detroit Recorder's Court amid allegations he forced the waitress to perform oral sex on him while they were alone at his restaurant, Murphy's Coney Island, on the morning of April 7.

The trial was ordered by 18th District Judge C. Charles Bokos following a preliminary hearing Thursday in which the waitress testified that Ndrejaj sexually assaulted her.

Ndrejaj could face a maximum sentence of 15 years in prison if convicted of third-degree criminal sexual conduct. He has posted a \$10,000 cash bond and has been released from custody while he awaits

Ndrejaj has no intention of changing his plea of

not guilty, according to his attorney, Joseph Puzzuo-li.

"My client continues to maintain his innocence, and he is hopeful and optimistic that he will be proven innocent," Puzzuoli said Thursday.

The waitress has accused her former boss of pushing her to the floor of Murphy's and forcing her to perform oral sex on him. The incident allegedly occurred about 7 a.m. after she reported to work for the morning shift.

The woman has said that no customers had yet entered the restaurant, in Woodcrest Plaza on Wayne Road just south of Joy. Westland police Sgt. Laura Moore has said the waitress finished working her shift "because she was intimidated" by Ndrejaj.

However, the woman later heeded the advice of a co-worker and reported the alleged incident to Westland police. Moore said.

Ndrejaj has been ordered to appear in Recorder's Court on May 27 for an arraignment. A trial date will be set later.







ROLL CALL REPORT

Party lines hold on spending issue

Here's how Observer & Eccentric-area members of Congress were recorded on major roll call votes in the week ending April

Line-item Spending Issue: By a vote of 258 for and 157 against, the House sent the Senate a bill (HR 1578) bolstering presidential power to challenge line-item spending by Congress. Democratic sponsors touted the bill as a tool against waste. But Republicans denounced it as a weak imitation of the line-item veto long sought by fiscal conservatives (be-

The bill allows presidents to "veto" specific appropriations, with Congress required to vote to affirm the cuts before they can take effect. If Congress rebuffs the president, it can vote on its own cuts in the same accounts targeted by the president. If the congressional austerity bid also fails, the disputed spending would go forward as originally voted by Con-

Sponsor John Spratt, D-S.C., said the bill will "strengthen the budget process and the public's respect for how we spend their mon-

Opponent Gerald Solomon, R-N.Y., said "compared to a true line-item veto, this bill is little more than a wet noddle on a fast track to nowhere.

A yes vote supported the Democratic proposal. Area representatives voting yes were: Dale Kildee, D-Flint, Sander Levin, D-Southfield. Voting no: Bob Carr, D-Pontlac, Joseph Knollenberg, R-Birmingham and William Ford, D-Ypsilanti.

GOP Plan: The House rejected, 198 for and 219 against, the GOP line-item veto plan, which differed from the Democratic approach (above) by making it much easier for a president to cancel specific appropriations sought by

Republicans wanted presidential cuts to become law unless blocked by two-thirds majorities of both houses. The Democratic bill allows presidential cuts to be defeated by a simple majority of either house.

Supporter Steven Schiff, R-N.M., said "the president (in his campaign) said that he wanted the line-item veto. I think we should give it to him.

Opponent John Spratt, D-S.C., said "If you want a line-item veto, do it the right way, amend the Constitution. Don't pass a bill that won't pass constitutional muster."

line-item veto proposal. Area representatives voting yes were: Knollenberg. Voting no: Carr, Klidee, Levin and Ford.

Tax Breaks: By a vote of 257 for and 157 against, the House amended the GOP line-item veto measure (above) to give presidents power to cancel tax breaks as well as specific appropriations cleared by Congress. However, the authority was later rejected along with the overall Republican proposal.

A yes vote was to empower presidents to cancel special-interest tax breaks unless two-thirds majorities of both houses override the cancellation. Area representatives voting yes were: Carr and Knollenberg. Voting no: Kildee, Levin and Ford.

SENATE

Department of Environment: The Senate required the proposed Department of the Environment to include an assistant secretary for Indian land, An attempt to block the designation was defeated 16-79. The bill (S 171) elevating the Environment Protection Agency to Cabinet level remained in debate.

John Glenn, D-Ohio, said it was wrong for senators to "start dictating"the duties of the department's 12 assistant secretaries.

Sponsor John McCain, R-Ariz.. said his proposal would "give both hope and promise to the tribes that so badly need our help with environmental problems.

A yes vote was to keep Congress from requining an assistant secretary for Indian land in the proposed Department of the Environmenta Michigan Sens. Carl Levin, D, voted yes and Donald Riegle, D, voted no.

Regulatory Costs: By a vote of 70 for and 26 against, the Senate tabled (killed) an amendment requiring the government to offset the cost of new environmental regulations with corresponding cuts in the cost of existing measures such as the Clean Air Act. The vote occurred during debate on legislation establishing a Department of the Environment (S 171). Max Baucus, D-Mont., said the

amendment would virtually block the new department from imposing

Sponsor Omn Hatch, R-Utah, said his amendment "will prevent the pile-on mentality that small businesses, cities and counties have suffered" under environmental laws.

A yes vote was to kill the amendment. Levin and Riegie voted

Economists say Prop A would boost state economy

Proposal A, if adopted by voters Wednesday, June 2, would help Michigan's investment climate, two econo-

mists told a State Capitol seminar.

But by detting property taxes and raising the sales tax, Proposal A would make Michigan's tax structure more regressive, hitting lower incomes harder percentagewise than high incomes.

'To the extent that taxes fall on capital, capital will move. Capital is pretty mobile," said Paul N. Courant, professor of economics and public policy at the University of Michigan.

'Capital is more mobile locally. Taxes have some effect on location," Courant said at a seminar for legislators and the staff members.

Proposal A would cut school operating property taxes on all property, industrial, commercial, home and farm. The sales tax would fall entirely on consumers.

"Capital clearly is mobile," agreed state treasurer Douglas Roberts, a former economics professor himself and Gov.

Roberts argued that for 25 years — in good times and bad - Michigan's unemployment rate has exceeded the national average. Roberts blames high property

'A' regressive

Edward M. Gramlich, director of U-M's Institute of Public Policy Studies, said Michigan's overall tax structure is regressive, but less so than those of other

The reason is the current combination of local property taxes and the personal income tax, which give rebates to elderly people and people in high property tax

Proposal A, by cutting \$1.7 billion in school operating property taxes and re-placing much of it with a 2 cents increase in the sales tax, "will make Michigan as regressive as other states," Gramlich

Currently, Gramlich said, the lowest one-fifth of Michigan taxpayers pay a total of 7.7 percent of their incomes in

fifth pay 7.9; the third fifth pay 7.7 percent; the fourth, 8.0 percent; and the top 1 percent, 6.4 percent.

Economists generally favor income taxes, which also are deductible from income for federal tax purposes. But the U-M pair recognized "income tax" has been a dirty word in Michigan since 1983 when voters recalled two state senators and tried to recall then-Gov. James Blanc-

"Michigan is unique in its heavy reli-ance on local taxes," Gramlich said. Spending on public schools is closely related to the wealth of local people, he said, "But there's a great puzzle: It's hard to equate (academic) performance

to education spending.
"Proposal A will benefit (school) spending in two-thirds of the state," Gramlich said. It would provide a constitutionally guaranteed "foundation" grant of \$4,800 per pupil in every district.

Courant said Michigan's single business tax (SBT) is widely but incorrectly believed to fall entirely on business. Actually, SBT, largely a payroil tax, has a depressing effect on the wages of labor, he said.

On this point he was challenged by treasurer Roberts. "You go out and sell to the business community the idea that the SBT is paid by others," said Roberts, who was Engler's chief spokesman last year on failed Proposal C.

The seminar was arranged by Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek, chairman of the Senate Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee, and touted by

en. Lans Pollack, D-Ann Arbor. Said Schwarz: "God knows we need it."





In its 85th year, the venerable Crowlev-Milner Co. finds itself sailing through. choppy retail waters in a quest to reach a profit island.

Over the last few years, the company reported losses of \$5 million. Last year Crowley sales topped \$100 million, but this was still down from the previous year.

In November, Crowley's named a new president, Dennis Callahan, formerly of Hess's Dept. Stores.

Two weeks ago, Crowley's sold it's long-troubled Wildwood store in Westland to the Schottenstein Stores Corp. of Columbus, Ohio. Schottenstein is in the midst of a liquidation sale at Wildwood, estimated to run through June.

Crowley's also announced that it had lined up an \$8 million loan with a \$2 million cash advance that would be used to pay off debts. Crowley's will not confirm the source of the loan, but retail insiders hint it may have also come from the Schottenstein Corp.

"There is nothing but good from the sale of the Wildwood store," said Stan Siwula, a spokesman for Crowley's "We've secured new financing, got rid of a non-profitable store, set off in a new direction. It's never business-as-usual in the retail market.'

Yet it's Crowley's business-as-usual approach to retailing that has disappointed some shoppers.

Welcome to '90s


"We'd like to welcome Crowley's into the '90s," said Mark Tisdel of Rochester Hills. "Their stores look like something out of the '50s. They have decent merchandise, but the interiors need major refurbishing."

"I always think of Crowley's as the place my grandmother and mother shopped," said Corey Baker of West Bloomfield. "Over the years their merchandise selection has been poor. On several occasions I came out to their advertised shoe sales and they were not what I expected.'

But other shoppers said Crowley's lines are great bargains, especially during the annual Anniversary and Crowley Days Sales.

'If Crowley's wants to compete with Jacobson's or Hudson's, they will have to bring in more upscale merchandise at higher prices, and then they wouldn't be Crowley's anymore," said Linda DePietro of Bloomfield Township. "I shop at Crowley's during their sales because I shop, for value.'

Crowley's return policy is what keeps Nira Eev of Southfield coming back.

Speedy European train to visit Wayne County

Local travelers one day may speed from Detroit to Chicago at more than 135 mph on a European-style X-2000 train.

State transportation director Patrick Nowak said the European "Tilt Train" will come to Michigan June 22-24 to operate in display service along the Detroit-Chicago corridor

The train is expected to be on. public exhibition, where it can be touched and toured at locations to be announced within the next two weeks, Nowak's office said. Public rides will not be available because of limited seating.

The train will run tracks from western to eastern Michigan carrying government and industry representatives this summer but will be limited to the standard 80 mph speed. In Europe the train travels at speeds in excess 150 mph which cannot be handled by local signaling devices.

"This train represents state-ofthe-art high-speed rail technology specifically designed to operate at increased speeds along conventional railway lines," the former Oakland County deputy executive

"This type of train will offer travelers more options when going between Detroit and Chicago. I commend Congressmen (Fred) Upton, R-St. Joseph, and (John) Dingell, D-Trenton, for their efforts with me to obtain the highspeed rail designation."

"This new and effective service will be good for travelers and good for Michigan because it means added investment and jobs for our state," said Gov. John Engler.

The X-2000 is on loan to Amtrak from the Swedish State Railways where it has been operating for about two years, Since arrival in the U.S., the X-2000 has been operating in test and demonstraion service between Washington, D.C., New York City and Boston for the last six months.

AmTrack has been testing the X-2000 and other trains to develop specifications for a new nationally consistent train fleet, according the Scott Hercik, acting director of the Michigan Department, of Transportations inter-city passenger program.

AmTrack will learn from this and develop its own train. What we may see is something very similar to this in the future, but it won't be the same train," he

ems call for controls on privatizing services

was, to use Yogi Berra's simile, "like deja vu all over again."

Democratic state legislators sounded like free market economists last week as they denounced the Engler Administration's work in deinstitutionalizing mental patients and placing them in privately-operated group

The occasion was an investigative series in The Detroit News by Sheila Gruber and John Wark on abuse and financial exploitation by adult care home operators. It seems many operators underfed and mistreated their charges while treating themselves to foreign luxury cars.

Wark, as many know, is a cohort of mine on the Michigan Freedom of Information Committee.

· A month earlier, I chaired a panel discussion before a Women In Communications Inc. convention in Trov. Our topic was "Privatization: Impact on Public Access." A Wark colleague observed that when government awards contracts to private business to do gov-

ernmental work, contractors hide what they're doing as if it were, well, private.

Then came the guru of privatization in Michigan - economist Charles Van Eaton of Hillsdale College. Van Eaton writes tracts for the Mackinac Center about how Detroit would be better off peddling Cobo Center because it's such a drain on the municipal coffers.

'You folks need to really birddog these guys," Van Eaton told us media types. "Don't let them get away with (claims the business) is private. It's always public.

Van Eaton's advice:

■ Proposed contracts should be studied carefully by the public and media before they are awarded.

■ Government must have excellent staffers monitoring contractors' performance. That was the whole point of the Gruber-Wark series.

And so liberal Democratic senators sounded exactly like the free market guru last week as they denounced group home operators and Engler.
"There's no accountability," said

Sen. Jim Berryman, D-Adrian. "We need a program of-proper licensing and monitoring.

"Deinstitutionalization has its

place. It's how the program has been implemented," added Senate minority floor leader John Cherry, D-Clio.

Though hopelessly outnumbered 22 to 16, Senate minority leader Art Miller. D-Warren, established a Democratic task force on mental health. chaired by Berryman, "to bring accountability, responsibility and decency into mental health service delivery in the community."

Rep. Pat Gagliardi, D-Drummond Island, said the House Oversight and Ethics Committee would hold hearings: "on the appalling treatment of mentally ill and developmentally disabled citizens in the mental health system,' adding, "This is a textbook example of privatization gone awry.

Even Republican Sen. Robert Geake of Northville repeated the lesson: "We need to put more time and effort into monitoring contracts.

There was a double irony. Democrats not only were talking like Van Eaton, but were praising a newspaper that for years had editorially blistered their

progovernment propensities.

Democrats talked as if Gov. John Engler invented privatization of mental care. In truth, the movement started in the late 1970s with Gov. William Milliken, a moderate Republican, and was cheerfully, although quietly, continued in the '80s by Gov. James Blanchard, a moderate Democrat. Engler's contribution was to make an ideological point of it.

I take dim views of both socialism (government in business) and privatization (business in government). There's room for government to contract with businesses to pave roads and perform maintenance functions. But conducting elections, supervising prisons, caring for the mentally ill, protecting natural resources and administering justice are governmental jobs.

boys are thinking seltzer water and scotch not pin curlers and hair dryers, which they end up with.


Men, being direct creatures who don't sweat the details as women do, wouldn't think to ask any more about the business. A saloon is a saloon, and it's a good place to be.

The new buses replace another 58 which had reached or passed their retirement age of 12 years. SMART officials say this is another sign that southeastern Michigan's largest public transit company is turning things around.

"Right now, SMART is probably running more smoothly and efficiently than ever," said SMART interim general manager Michael Duggan. "The only thing we have left to do is get people to realize that and increase our ridership.

The announcement comes on the heels of ones made earlier this week that SMART has become the first bus company in America to offer a 100 percent money back guarantee on its service and plans to provide tax-free vouchers to commuters to encourage ridership. Other recent announcements include a new \$1.50 anywhere fare, and the launching of SMART's first-ever TV advertising campaign

One year ago, SMART faced the possibility of shutting down due to a projected \$12 million deficit. After streamlining costs, SMART has trimmed the deficit to approximately \$3.2 mil-

"We're running leaner, but at the same time better," said Duggan. "If you take a ride in one of these new buses and compare it to anything D-DOT is running, you'll see how far we've come. If you talk with one of our employees, you will see friendliness is important to us.

The new buses cost \$179,000 each plus additional spare parts, bringing the total contract to \$10.9 million. The new buses will make SMART's fleet 100 percent wheelchair accessible. Other features include air conditioning, internal and external PA systems and visual stop request signs for sight- and hearing-impaired

houette, however, will put in an appearance, as the moon eclipses (covers) the sun. How much of the sun

is covered depends on your loca-

tion on the earth. In the metro Detroit area a whopping 2.4 percent of the sun will be eclipsed at 9 a.m. In other words: yawn! People living farther west will see a greater percent eclipsed. We're not talking about farther west as in Ann Arbor or Lansing; try Seattle (whose weather rivals our own) where 40 percent of the sun will be eclipsed. (CAUTION: NEVER STARE DIRECTLY AT THE

It could be possible to spot Mercury in the evening sky on the 22nd, albeit with some difficulty:

it will be only two degrees above the west northwest horizon. The one-day old waxing (growing) crescent moon will be eight degrees above and to the left of Mercury. Try looking for Mercury around 9:30 p.m. but don't get frustrated if you can't find it; the situation will improve with time.

On the evening of the 24th, the crescent moon will be in Gemini. The star located 12 degrees above the moon will be Pollux (PAWL lux), one of the heads of the twins. The head of his twin brother, marked by the star Castor, will be just to the right of Pollux. On the following night the moon will be 12 degrees to the left of Pollux.

The distance from Jupiter to Eta Vir (we can use a more casual name for our old friend Eta now) will be down to one-tenth of one degree on the evening of the 26th. Most people will not be able to see both objects with the nakedeye; Jupiter will be 300 times brighter than Eta Vir, and that contrast will all but make the star invisible, unless a telescope or binoculars are used.

Both objects will be visible with optical aid; in fact, Jupiter's four brightest moons will be spotted too! You will be able to distinguish between the moons and Eta Vir by intensity; the star will be brighter than the moons.

Notice the moon on the evening of the 27th. It will be located six degrees below Regulus (REG you lus), the "heart" of Leo the lion. Mars will be 13 degrees below and to the right of Regulus, forming a triangle with that star and the moon. Still moving eastward about one-half of a degree per day, Mars will pass Regulus in 26

First quarter moon will be at 2:21 p.m. on May 28. The moon will have completed the first quarter of its orbit around the earth. It will be found in the south at sunset, and will set after midnight.

May 29 is THE evening, Jupiter and Eta Vir have their rendezyous! The two objects will be less than one-tenth of a degree apart. While you may think this is about as exciting as May's solar eclipse, it is not often that a bright planet appears so close to a reasonably bright star, and that makes it worthy of attention. Alas, the moon will be 11 degrees to the left of Jupiter, and its scattered light will add to Jupiter's own. (Remember to use binoculars to spot

On the evening of the 30th the moon will be six degrees below Jupiter, and on the 31st the moon

will be two degrees below Spica. The evening of the 31st is also an excellent time to look for Mercury in the west northwest. It will be six degrees (12 full-moon diameters) above the horizon, looking like a star in the glow of evening twilight. Mercury will be favorably placed for spotting well into June!

An excellent aid for learning constellations and keeping up to date with the sky is the monthly "Sky Calendar." A one-year subscription is \$6 and is available from the Abrams Planetarium, Michigan State University, East Lansing, 48824.

Keep your kitchen cool, cook turkey on the grill

hanksgiving is still six months away, but this rash of great weather we've been experiencing has prompted me to fire up the grill far earlier than in years past.

Usually I begin with the traditional burgers, but I couldn't resist arroffer from my local turkey farm when I noticed they were selling birds at half off. I thanked myself for putting the grill away clean last fall, a definite change from prior years when I had to spend a good part of the day scrubbing off all of last summer's build-up.

For the uninitiated, all you need is a covered grill to roast a bird. The main difference from a traditional Thanksgiving turkey is that when grilling a bird, it's best left unstuffed.

Grilling turkey

A 12 to 14 pound turkey is best for grilling. Simply remove the giblets and neck, rinse and pat dry. Since the stuffing is best left out, you can fill the cavity of the bird with garlic, herbs and aromatic vegetables - like onions and celery.

If you are a turkey purist, you will probably want to make a stock for the turkey gravy while the bird is roasting by placing the neck, chopped, of course, in a saucepan with the giblets and then

To the stock I like to add a small chopped onion, carrots and a few ribs of chopped celery and then cover with about five cups of cold water. Bring to a boil, then reduce the heat to a simmer for about three hours, just enough time to roast the bird.

Preparing coals

The most important aspect of grilling a turkey is heat control. As in other methods of cooking turkey, moderate heat makes for the best results. For my standard Weber grill, I started with about five pounds of coals and let them burn down until they were uniformly covered with white ash.

A little trick you might choose to remember for grilling is that when you can hold your open palm over the coals at cooking height for two seconds, the fire is too hot, but when you can tolerate four seconds, the heat is moderate. Anything more than six seconds and the fire is at low tempera-

Indirect heating is best for whole turkeys. After the coals have reached the moderate stage, I push them aside and center a flameproof drip pan, disposable aluminum or heavy foil molded into the shape of a drip pan, on the lower rack. The white ash covered briquettes are then arranged around the sides of the drip pan to prevent flare-

Since this year's turkey was of the non-self basting varieties, I made up a little baste with melted butter, some turkey stock from the simmering giblets, and a generous douse of white wine. The only problem encountered here was the fact that every 20 minutes or so I had to lift the lid to slather on the baste. This allowed much needed heat to escape and I found myself adding a few more coals while the bird cooked.

.It's always better to add a few coals occasionally than allow the fire to burn out.

If I had purchased one of those Butterballs, I would have started the bird breast side down and allowed that to cook for at least 11/2 hours before turning the bird right side up for the remaining

If you're cooking on a gas grill, it's best simply to turn off one side of the grill completely and cook your turkey on the unlighted side.

In the event your gas grill does not have dual controls, cover one side with heavy foil and proceed as directed.

Completely thawed turkeys or similar birds should be cooked at the rate of 10-15 minutes per pound on charcoal and gas grills.

Judging from this and past experience, especially since I was lifting the lid every 20 minutes or so to baste, I would suggest the longer of cooking times. Although, to be perfectly honest, I wouldn't even think of doing a whole bird or roast without the use of a trusty instant read meat thermometer. available locally at kitchen shops for about \$12.

There's nothing worse than carving into a pink bird when the potatoes and vegetables are already on the table. Internal temperatures taken at the thickest part of the bird (the breast right over the leg) should be at least 170 degrees. For optimum slicing results, allow the bird to stand 15 minutes before carving.

From start to finish, my 12-pound-plus bird cooked on the covered grill for a little under four

"I wanted to be a banker," Harris said. "But it was during the Depression and there were no jobs. I went to work for Standard Brands in Battle Creek as sales manager of grocery products.'

There, he met Bill Knapp, who would later open a chain of restau-

Bill Knapp was transferred to the Detroit office of Standard Brands, and was a real help," Elaine said. "He used to say, 'Harris is fighting for us, and you and I are going to fight for him.' I stayed with it. He'd help out two or three days a week.

Then Harris was reported missing in action for 11 months. "I was wounded in the desert in North Africa," Harris said. "In all defense of the Germans, they saved my life."

Harris escaped and was recaptured. Elaine was never notified.

Creation of Alsace wines is a finely tuned craft. The wines are not blends; they stand alone as single grape varieties with the multitude of Alsace soil types determining the character of individual wines, so clearly distinguished in the taste.

Soil differences among vineyards growing the same grape offer an exceptional variety of tastes within the same varietal.

Alsace producers recognized the importance of vineyard location and soil types properly matched to grape varieties in 1935, but the ravages of two world wars left them without a legally organized system of appellations until 1975.

This is a Machus recipe from the 1940s

STUFFED CABBAGE WITH TOMATO SAUCE

- teaspoon Worcestershire
- sauce 14 cup onion, finely chopped
- 34 cup milk 1 pound hamburger, raw
- 34 cup rice, cooked 6 cabbage leaves, large 1 cup sauerkraut

1/3 cup water

Mix all ingredients together. Divide ingredients among 6 cabbage leaves. Roll in cabbage leaves. Spread 1 cup sauerkraut over hottom of baking pan. Lay cabbage rolls, seam side down, on sauerkraut. Add 1 cup water. Cover and bake in 325 degree oven for 1 to 11/4 hours. Serve with tomato sauce.

CHICKEN A LA KING

- 1/2 cup margarine
- 1/2 cup flour
- 2 cups milk I cup turkey broth
- 4 cup pimento 1 cup mushrooms, sliced

over cooked rice or puff pastry shell.

1/2 cup sour cream

3/3 cup sugar

- 1/2 cup shortening
- 1 ¼ cup cake flour 11/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 eggs
- 2 ounces chocolate chips

Combine all ingredients except eggs and chocolate chips. Mix well. Add 1 egg and mix. Add the other egg and mix slowly for 5 minutes Pour 1/2 of batter into greased 8- by

2-inch round pan. Spread evenly. Sprinkle 1/2 chocolate chips on batter. Add remaining batter. Spread evenly. Add remaining chocolate thips. Bake at 350 degrees in upper haif of oven for 40-45 minutes. Remove from oven. Cool. Dust with powdered sugar.

QUICHE LORRAINE

- 1/4 pound bacon, (cut into 1/4inch pieces)
- 34 cup onion, (chopped)

4 ounces Gravere cheese or Swiss cheese (shredded)

- 4 eggs (slightly beaten)
- 1 1/2 cup half and half
- 4 teaspoon salt
- Dash pepper Dash nutmeg
- I pie shell (9-inch unbaked)

Cook bacon in heavy skillet until half done; add onions and saute until onions are soft and yellow. Remove from heat and drain. Cool. Combine eggs, half and half, salt and pepper.

Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Bake pie shell (weighted down with another pie pan on top) for 10 minutes. Remove from oven and cool. Spread bacon and onion mixture over bottom of baked pie shell.

Top with shredded cheese. Pour custard mix over all. Sprinkle with nutmeg. Reduce oven heat to 350 degrees and bake for 30-35 minutes until custard is set and puffed and crust is golden.

Let cool at least 10 minutes before cutting.

POACHED ATLANTIC SALMON WITH ROSE PETALS AND MINT BALSAMIC VINAIGRETTE

To poach salmon

- Four 4-ounce skinned and deboned fresh salmon fillets
- 4 cup raspberry vinaigrett
- ¼ cup clam juice 4 cup white Zinfandel
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper 11/2 teaspoons chopped garlic

Place the 4 pieces of salmon in a large stainless steel pan. Pour all the liquid ingredients over the fish. Then add salt and pepper, slowly bring up the heat until the posching liquid is just at the boiling point. Do not let it boil. Continue to poach for about 8 minutes or until done. Then allow to cool in the liquid slightly. Carefully remove to paper

MINT BALSAMIC VINAIGRETTE

Juice of 1 orange Juice of 1 lemon Juice of 1/2 lime

¼ cup chopped mint I tablespoon chopped shallots

1 teaspoon chopped garlic 11/2 tablespoon honey 4 cup White Zinfandel 1 teaspoon tarragon 1/2 cup Balsamic vinegar Salt and pepper to taste I cup olive oil

Combine all ingredients except the olive oil. Slowly drizzle in olive oil while whipping with wire whisk. The dressing should emulsify. Salt and pepper to taste.

Fresh mint To assemble salad, divide the mix greens between chilled plates. Decorate with oranges, strawberries, rose petals and mint. Place the slightly cooled salmon fillet over the greens and dress with the balsamic mint vinaigrette. Serves 4.

Unlike Bill Knapp, who was lifelong friend, Harris Machus, after opening a restaurant in the Lansing area, which was later sold, decided not to expand far beyond Bir-

mingham. 'It took too much time supervising people," he said. Birmingham was growing and we didn't have to move all over. I felt that if we grew and gave the staff possibilities for advancement, that was enough. I was a hands-on operator. I visited every store and restaurant. Everyone knew the boss."

That tradition continues and

the Machus family has been fortunate to draw some outstanding chefs, including certified master chef Leopold Schaeli, now an instructor at Schoolcraft College in Livonia, Richard Mack, executive chef of the Palace of Auburn Hills Grille, and Martin Singer, executive chef of Machus Sly Fox

and Red Fox. Robert Machus said the family has no plans to open any new restaurants, but there have been some changes. An outdoor dining deck was added to Machus Sly Fox last summer, and a new menu includes

heart-healthy entrees. Chef Singer recently planted a small garden at Sly Fox that includes herbs and flowers. Pansies and nasturtiums are growing in pots that hang outside on the deck.

Although Chef Singer can't grow enough in the small space to keep up with the demand. the freshly picked flowers and herbs make beautiful garnishes. It's a small touch, but it's important. Little touches, and attention to detail, are what have made Machus special for all these years.



Collard greens are served with buttermilk curds for a traditional Ethiopian stew, while in Brazil cooked kale or collards are a national dish. These greens are rich in beta carotene, vitamin C, and a good source of fiber. They can be eaten raw when young and tender, but as they mature their flavors become stronger and will taste better cooked.

Collard greens are a member of

Potherbs are colthe cabbage family, and has a flalard greens, danvor somewhere between cabbage delion greens, and kale. Choose bunches of crisp, green leaves with tender mustard greens, Swiss chard, turstems and use as soon as possible. Wash well before cooking. If any of the greens are dirty, wash in warm water to loosen any dirt, bugs or worms.

Don't worry, washing really works to get rid of bugs and dirt, then rinse well in cold water until they are clean. Collards are an excellent source of calcium, they are also high in vitamins A and C. potassium, iron, niacin and protein besides being low in sodium and calories. Collards greens can be used as wrappers in place of cabbage leaves in recipes like stuffed

Mustard greens

Mustard greens are also a relative of the cabbage and have a more pungent flavor. Choose small, young, crisp leaves with a deep green color and no insect holes or seed heads. Seed heads are a sign of over maturity. Store for three days in the refrigerator in a plastic bag. Wash well and remove any tough stems before cooking.

Mustard greens are low in calories, rich in vitamins A and C, potassium, calcium, protein and

Swiss chard can be substituted for spinach in most recipes. Chard is a milder flavor green and can even be used for filling for ravioli. Because the ribs take longer to cook, trim away from leaves and cook separately, combine before serving. Keep chard refrigerated in plastic and use within a few days. Before cooking wash well, steam in a saucepan using just the water that clings to the

Chard is very high in vitamin A

and is a good source of potassium, iron, calcium and protein. Chard is fairly high in sodium so cook with out salt to prevent discolora-

Dandelion greens come from the common lawn weed, which is a member of the sunflower family. Before going out into the yard or stopping on the road side to pick dandelions, be sure the area has not been treated with weed killer or fungicides.

When dandelions are young, they are delicious in salads, especially with a hot bacon dressing. As they get older, they do become bitter and then need to be cooked.

Turnip greens are slightly sweet, a highly nutritious relative of the cabbage family. As they age, they have a strong flavor and will need to be cooked to tame that taste. Turnip greens are rich. in vitamins A and C, calcium,

iron and protein. Choose crisp, fresh looking leaves, refrigerate and use within a couple days.

Kale is a member of the cabbage family, and one of the more nutritious, rich in vitamins A and C, potassium, protein and iron. Avoid buying limp, wilted or yellow leaves. For wilted tired. greens, dip in hot water, then in ice water with a dash of vinegar. Shake the excess water from them and chill in the refrigerator for about an hour.

Storing greens


Rusting of lettuce and greens is caused by the way they are stored. Store away from all fruits and keep in a plastic bag with a couple paper towels to help absorb the excess moisture

Do not wash greens until you are ready to cook them. Cook greens quickly to help preserve color and nutrients. Greens can be steamed, boiled, microwaved or blanched. If the greens are too bland for your taste, add some, marjoram or rosemary to the cooking water. Topping with poppy seed or sesame seed before serving will add another flavor the greens. To raw greens, add anise, basil, chervil, caraway or savory.

Chopped greens can be used in stuffing for other vegetables such as green peppers or add themato bread stuffing for poultry or figh. Torn greens can be added to soups, brown rice, mashed poratoes, or layered into pasta casseroles. Try to use potherbs (greens) for meals for a new flavor treat and for the nutritional benefits they can provide.

It's Sunday, the one day of the week when most of us have the luxury of starting the day slowly and spending time with family or over a relaxed break-

Use either quick or old-fashioned oats, whichever you happen to have on hand, Both contribute wholesome goodness to this lighttextured coffeecake. By using reduced-fat sour cream and egg whites in place of whole eggs, you'll trim both fat and cholester-

If you prefer to make breakfast a more substantial meal by adding a berry-topped bowl of oatmeal or an omelet to the menu, choose a breakfast bread that benefits from being baked ahead. Banana Orange Date Loaf-will slice more easily and have a more developed flavor if it's allowed to cool completely, wrapped and stored overnight.

Good-for-you oats replace part of the flour in this moist breakfast bread, and the combination of fruits gives it a tropical flavor. The simple orange glaze is op-

The coffee (or tea) and juice that no Sunday breakfast can be without also deserve to be dressed up. Try an oversized oup of cafe au lait (strong coffee and steamed milk), foam-topped cappuccino, brewed spiced tea or cafe mocha (strong coffee and hot chocolate). Freshly squeezed orange juice is always a winner, but don't overlook more exotic juices like guava and mango or a juice blend. Then sit back and enjoy the morning and each other.





The life-sized pig (\$59.99) and goose (\$34.99) are new offerings, but this spring you'll see a range of affable rabbits, dogs, lions, cherubs and gargoyles on more than a few lawns and porches. Adorning our surroundings with statuary is nothing new, but we haven't seen so many yard decorations since the 1930s, says Brewer, who believes the current trend is for nostalgia's sake.

The Royal Oak Music Theatre is set to reopen Friday, offering its first weekend dance club nights titled 'Fourth Street Asylum." It will also

host concerts and private parties.


With the new layout, we are flexible as to the types of programming we can accommodate. We can host a dance party, a dinner party, or offer concert events with reserved seating," said Bob Fox, president of Brass Ring. The company owns the Royal Oak Music Theater and books shows into others like the Fox, Joe Louis Arena, Meadow Brook Music Festival.

The project began in May 1992 but has been planned for 10 years. Fox put the project on hold, however, to help Olympia Arenas, Inc.'s Mike Ilitch with the renovation of the Fox Theatre.

The Royal Oak theater's new look offers a sort of history lesson into the venue. The lobby is a recreation of the original, when the theater opened on March 6, 1928. The Ukrainian-style stencils were repainted over the wooden cabinets which will house works by rock 'n' roll artist Gary Grimshaw. The box office was recreated from its 1920s concept.

"It was a painstaking process in the interior," Fox said.

The theater itself has a modern look with aqua, black and burgundy carpet, and black, gray and charcoal art deco bars. The dance floor is two tiered with a "wall of lights," lasers Intellebeams, and strobe lights overhead and floor level.

Bad rap tracks 'Posse' to the big screen

Some critics branded "The Unorgiven" a revisionist Western because it redefined the basic haracter of the cowboy hero and rillain. Wait'll they get a load of

Independent director Mario Van Peebles contends that African-American cowboys and outaws made up a large percentage of the pioneer population in the West, much more than the history books and movies lead us to be-

And while it would be great to say that the ambitious "Posse" is a landmark film, it adds up to little more than an excuse for rap singers to pose in Western duds.

Van Peebles the director also stars as Jessie Lee, the black-clad hero who says little and smiles even less. He's out to avenge the murder of his preacher father, lynched by white townspeople for his belief that education is free-

With Jessie rides a rag-tag band of outlaws, including gambler Father Time (Big Daddy Kane) and Weezie (Charles Lane). In an appropriate switch, there's a token white posse member played by Stephen Baldwin

(yes, Alec has yet another brother.)

Western cliche might seem a bit of an oxymoron, but Van Peebles mines every overused line and camera trick, from horses trotting off into the sunset to deep-focus showdowns in the street. He directs as if his audience has never seen a Western before, which may be true for the young audience the movie is aimed at.

The script does present a message, placing the sensibilities of South Central Los Angeles into the saloons and dusty streets of a traditional Western town. The familiar plot device of greedy landgrabbing railroad speculators now becomes a metaphor for urban gentrification.

This town may still be standing in a year," Jessie says to the townspeople of Freemanville, a black settlement in the path of the iron horse. "But I guarantee you there won't be a black face in

Also at odds are the philosophies of Martin Luther King and Malcolm X, Characters who profess turning the other cheek end up either two-faced or dead. "Posis first and foremost about kicking butt, especially when it belongs to an evil white man.

The action scenes are lumbering and noisy. The MTV-style camera movement only promotes headache while the climactic showdown between Jessie Lee and his Custer-like Colonel Graham (Billy Zane) couldn't have turned out more predictably.

Handsome Van Peebles does make a striking action hero, the African-American answer to Clint Eastwood's "Man With No Name." His supporting cast, meanwhile, blends independent black film pioneers with rappers and even professional wrestlers.

Pam Grier, who played "Foxy Brown" in the '70s, only gets to fire off a round or two as one of the fed-up townspeople. Melvin Van Peebles (Mario's father and a maverick black director in his own right) plays a wise old guy, a mentor of sorts for Jessie Lee.

Tone Loc, the raspy-voiced rapper of the short-lived megahit "Wild Thing", gets killed off early on. Too bad the same can't be said for Charles Lane, whose bespectacled opportunist Weezie is just as cloying and irritating as

Lane's directorial debut in "Sidewalk Stories."

"Posse" professes historical accuracy, but some of its scenes border on the absurb. The Bessie Smith-style saloon singer doesn't pound out some lurid torch number; she warbles like Anita Baker in Dolby Stereo. The dialogue too often sounds like left-over lines

from Van Peeble's overrated gangster epic "New Jack City."

Forget masterpiece for a moment. It would be great to simply say that "Posse" is a wild good time. It's not. Each decade someone tries to resurrect the Western genre for modern audiences. Movies like "Young Guns" and now "Posse" make us realize

that most good Westerns truly are
