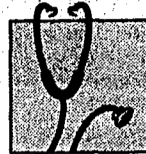

Gift of life lifts her spirits



With a donated heart beating in her, Tina Bertschinger returned home last week and hopes to be back to work as a police officer later this year. She's happy to receive get well cards from across the country.

With her spirits high following a life-saving heart transplant in Pittsburgh, Tina Bertschinger returned home to Westland last week. "I'm thinking very positive about it," the 28-year-old Westland police

officer said Thursday during a telephone interview.

Bertschinger came home in time for a birthday party for her goddaughter, Elaina, who will be 4 Thursday.

The former Garden City resident also plans to attend a benefit party on her behalf that friends and family

have scheduled for 7:30 p.m. Friday at Westland's Bailey Center, behind city hall on Ford east of Newburgh.

Party organizers are asking for \$10 donations at the door. Raffle tickets will be sold three for \$1, with drawings every hour. Beer, pop and pizza also will be sold.

Bertschinger has been told by doctors that the heart transplant, alone, will cost \$200,000 to \$300,000. That doesn't include a month-long hospital stay.

The police officer has insurance

coverage through the Westland Police Department, but it won't cover the entire costs. She could still be faced with tens of thousands of dollars in medical bills.

A fund also has been established at the National Bank of Detroit branch at 35050 Ford Road in Westland.

Bertschinger had waited 19 days in Pittsburgh's Presbyterian University Hospital before a female donor was found for a heart transplant that required nine hours of surgery. She

Former principal heads school board

Francis "Bud" Winter, a former Wayne Memorial High School principal, is the new Wayne-Westland school board president.

He was elected by his colleagues in a split 5-2 vote Thursday night to head the board which faces critical money problems in the upcoming months.



Winter

Winter, elected to the board just a year ago, was selected president at the board's annual organization at which officers are picked and other procedural issues are handled.

He replaced Leonard Posey.

At the same meeting, June 14 election winners Mathew McCusker and Patricia Brown were formally sworn in and seated for their first board meeting of the new school year.

Actually, McCusker is returning to the board on which he served for 8½ years before being defeated for reelection two years ago. In the recent election, he was the top vote-getter.

Brown is also no stranger to the

board or board meetings, having been a Westland Eagle reporter and news editor for several years and having covered the school district.

McCusker and Brown replace Sharon Felan, who was appointed to a board vacancy last summer and lost her bid for a full term, and Fred Warmbier, 18-year board member who didn't run for a new term.

Group's goal: Save extracurricular activities

A new Wayne-Westland citizens committee could begin trying to raise community money as early as this week amid hopes of rescuing extracurricular student activities from a

school board budget ax, a leader said Thursday.

The new group, Community Support for a Complete Education (CSCE), could launch its ambitious money-raising plan this week by starting to seek private-sector dona-

tions, said CSCE member Fredric Hagelthorn.

The committee also has proposed sponsoring telethons, raffles, lotteries, dances, auctions and other activities to raise money to keep extracurricular activities in place this fall.

In its kickoff meeting June 28 at Westland's Bailey Center, committee leaders received a mostly warm reception from about 60 citizens who seemed eager to join the challenging

Jaycee campaign helps fight adult illiteracy

Local residents can support the campaign for literacy with a fundraiser sponsored this month by the Westland Jaycees.

Supporters can buy a "firecracker for literacy" card at local businesses and taverns. Proceeds will benefit the Metropolitan Literacy Council, which was based for many years in Garden City before moving to the Wayne-Westland school district's adult education center.

The fund-raiser will have the local Jaycees follow the national organization's focus on literacy this year.

Modeled after their annual "Shamrocks For MDA (Muscular Dystrophy Association)" campaign, the Jaycees hope to help the private, non-profit literacy council overcome a \$20,000 shortfall prompted by a cutback in state funds.

Under the direction of fundraising campaign coordinators Cheryl Bates, Jaycee vice president for community development, and David Alexander, MLC director, volunteers from both organizations

are distributing firecracker cards to neighborhood businesses. Patrons donate \$1 per "firecracker" with businesses displaying the signed cards.

The cards were available at the Jaycees booth during the annual Westland Summer Festival which was held during the Fourth of July weekend.

Since 1982, MLC has contributed significantly to the effort in combating adult illiteracy throughout Wayne County. By providing free one-to-one tutoring, MLC has assisted hundreds of adults who either cannot read or want to improve their reading skills level.

Citing the increasing need for the services the literacy council provides, Alexander noted the not uncommon case of a parent with school-aged children who contacted MLC's office.

"My kids are always asking me to help them with their homework," the parent explained, "but I'm always making up excuses why I can't help them. You name the excuse, and I've used it! The

truth is, I can barely read or write and I'm tired of trying to cover up this problem. I'd like to get some help."

Another example of a person reaching out for help was a retired senior citizen, who simply stated, "I'm coming up on my golden wedding anniversary, and I'd just like to be able to go to the store and pick out a card for my wife and know what it says."

The U.S. Department of Education estimates that one in five American adults is functionally illiterate, Alexander said. Those persons don't have the basic reading and writing skills necessary to function in society. Given the national statistic, MLC estimates there are approximately 400,000 adults in Wayne County who could directly benefit from the literacy program, he said.

The council plans to use donations secured from the "Firecrackers For Literacy" fund-raiser to continue a salary for its director, sponsor tutor training workshops, purchase adult new-reader materials, and maintain daily operations.

The new board officers lead the district at a critical time in its history. Voters, on April 5 overwhelmingly rejected a millage rate renewal, forcing the administration to draft a list of \$12 million in program cuts.

Winter, 64, who retired as Wayne principal in 1989, said he was scheduled to meet with school officials Friday afternoon to draft a letter inviting community leaders and students to convene for discussion of a planned millage rate increase election. No date has been set.

In his first comments as president, Winter said he will decide issues on the question "will it help children" and be directed by the district's mission statement and five goals.

But trustee Laurel Raisanen, who voted against Winter's election along with Vicki Welty, urged the new board head to continue the close working relationship with Superintendent Larry Thomas, starting his second year on the job.

She said he wants to "make sure that communications and trust are there" and that Winter "gets beyond the things said in the papers," referring to his critical published comments made in recent months.

In addressing the audience, Winter also admitted that there will be challenges in the upcoming school year.

In other officer elections Thurs-

day, McCusker was named vice president on a 6-1 vote, Richard LeBlanc secretary, and Brown treasurer.

The board also accepted Thomas' recommendation that the board designate the Observer and the Associated Newspapers as its official newspapers to improve communications with residents, a practice started last year.

McCusker tried to have Associated named the sole official paper with the Observer used when necessary. He also suggested that negotiations with Associated may lead to a better advertising price. But the board split 3-3 with Raisanen (an employee of The Observer & Eccentric Newspapers) abstaining and McCusker's amendment failing.

Teens sought in chemical spray

Westland police are looking for a group of teens who provided Kmart shoppers with more than a blue light special Friday afternoon. Several dozen patrons at the store and a Dearborn strip mall were treated for nausea and burning eyes after a caustic, disabling gas was sprayed in the businesses.

The incident at the Kmart store on Wayne Road at Cherry Hill was reported late Friday afternoon. Affected shoppers and em-

ployees were treated at and released from Annapolis Hospital Wayne.

Police said the chemical sprayed in the store might have been Mace or pepper gas. The Dearborn stores sprayed earlier were a Toys R Us toy store and a Chuck E. Cheese restaurant on Michigan near Telegraph, Dearborn.

Dearborn police said that five teens were seen spraying a chemi-

cal in the aisles of the toy store.

Officers are looking for five teens wearing baseball caps. The five were seen driving away from the Dearborn businesses in a white Ford Tempo.

Mace is legal in certain concentrations and causes no permanent side effects.

Thirty-eight persons were treated, 22 at Garden City Hospital, 12 at Annapolis and four at Oakwood Hospital, Dearborn.

Fest time

Five-day event offers fun for all

There was a little of bit of everything for everyone during the five-day Westland Summer Festival which closed its books Monday night for another year.

The annual event had carnival rides, colorful parade, food booth, beer booth, children's and adult games, and free entertainment.

A few sprinkles during Wednesday night's parade foreshadowed thunderstorms later in the week.

But the wet weather didn't dampen the enthusiasm of festival-goers for the next five days.

The traditional fireworks was held Sunday night with the carnival itself continuing Monday.

During the parade, which opened the festival, there were decorated floats, marchers and Jaycees passing out 10,000 Hostess cupcakes, with baseball cards, to parade-watchers along the one-mile Ford Road route.

Other parade participants were the Spirters dance school, Ms. Helen's Dance School, American Dance Academy, Syrena Dance

Ensemble, two calliopes, decorated horses, Franklin High School pom-pom squad, Hamilton and Schweitzer School Girl Scouts, as well as military units.

Adding a special touch to the parade were convertibles carrying local queens. One was Terri Clark, Wayne-Westland Young Woman of the Year who later won the Michigan title. In the other, ragtop was festival queen Jennifer Soronen, accompanied by first runner-up Jennifer Jeckewicz and second runner-up Amber Audritsh.

The festival had its origins in late 1970 when then Mayor Gene McKinney announced the formation of a spring festival committee to create a sense of community among the city's residents and provide holiday fun. For several years, the festival was held during the Memorial Day weekend. Years later, it was moved to the Fourth of July weekend.

The festival is planned by a private, non-profit committee headed by Ed Wager.

Video store's customers dismayed to see owners go

Local customers of a video business are upset about what they feel is losing "a member of the family."

Several called the Observer to complain that Patt Guido, who is co-owner and manager of Videoville Westland on Warren Road just east of Merriman, will close her doors Saturday, July 31.

One, Kim James, said she and about 30 others are combining efforts to plan a boycott of the new Joy Video store opening early next month.

But David Kahan, of Premier Realty, Troy, which owns the strip mall on the Westland-Garden City boundary, said it was strictly a business decision.

"We're sorry" about the closing of Guido's business, he said but added the financial reality is that Guido leased 1,200 square feet of space and the new video business will rent 5,000 square feet in the strip mall.

Kahan also noted that he worked with Guido who was sometimes late with monthly rent payments. Guido admitted that some payments were late, but stressed that eventually they were paid.

"It's nice of the neighbors to feel so close" to Guido, Kahan said. "It's a beautiful relationship, but there wasn't enough business volume to make it successful. We have no ulterior motives."

"I wish them the best of luck," he said of the Guidos who are looking for a new location.

'Family' relationship

James said the Guidos were "part and an extension of my family," citing cards or flowers Patt sent her during her two pregnancies and two back operations in the past four years.

"She was also always there for me," James said.

James and other Videoville members told of Patt Guido's frequent trips to deliver videotapes to members who were ill and couldn't get to the store in person.

The members and Guido, who owns the business with husband

Richard, said in separate interviews that there was a "family" relationship that had been developed since the business opened six years ago.

One aspect of that special relationship is that she mails cards to members who are ill or having a baby, she said.

Mrs. Guido, who lives with her husband and daughter, 22, in Garden City, said she understands the business decision made by Premier Realty.

To replace Videoville Westland will be a larger video business which will pay a higher rent than the Guidos.

Mrs. Guido told the Observer that she is looking for a new location, preferably in the Garden City-Westland area.

She described how she and her husband got involved in the business — their first — after Mr. Guido, a construction worker, was injured on the job. After completing a retraining program, he entered the sales field.

At the same time, Mrs. Guido lost her job with a Dearborn metallurgical company when it relocated to Chicago.

Business start cited

After buying a video store franchise, Mrs. Guido asked her-

self: "I'm a video store owner. What do I do now?"

"I wanted to do things that larger video stores won't do."

One thing was to have larger promotional posters displayed and then give them away to customers when no longer needed.

Another general attitude she wanted was to provide a safe and welcome atmosphere for everyone, including children and handicapped youngsters.

There are also many group home residents who come to the store and are made welcome.

Mrs. Guido, 51, was diagnosed with breast cancer. Several customers, one in particular, did most of the driving to get her to doctor appointments and chemotherapy treatments. Later, she had a double mastectomy.

She worked part time for that period before returning to the business full time about six weeks ago.

"When customers found out, they came into the store to just talk or give me a hug."

"I also received get-well cards from all over the country. Those cards kept me going."

After the surgery, she lost use of both arms. Now she has regained 75 percent of the use of both hands, she said.

Mrs. Novotny died June 28 in Annapolis Hospital, Wayne. Born Nov. 29, 1909, she was a homemaker.

received her new heart June 8. The transplant became a matter of life and death after doctors at St. Joseph Hospital in Pontiac removed a peach-sized malignant tumor from her old heart in April.

Doctors in Pontiac had successfully removed 95 percent of the tumor during open heart surgery, and the remaining cancer was removed in Pittsburgh.

Bertschinger had undergone three biopsies and was allowed to return home late last week.

"Things are going really well," she said Thursday. She spent 44 days in Pittsburgh, including 20 days in the hospital's intensive care unit. "The doctors are real happy with my progress."

The 5-foot-8, 170-pound officer had been working for the Westland Police Department for three months in March when she began coughing and having breathing problems. Then she learned she had the malignant tumor attached to her heart.

Bertschinger asked that she be

allowed to thank the many community residents who have sent some 150 cards to her. Some even wrote letters.

One local woman, whose husband is suffering from colon cancer, sent \$5 to the hospital so Bertschinger could buy newspapers and other reading materials to help pass the time. The woman and others have responded to newspaper reports about Bertschinger.

The police officer also has heard from former classmates at

Wayne Memorial High School, where she received her diploma in 1983.

"People have been great," she said. "Everybody has let me know that I was in their prayers. It worked."

Bertschinger hopes to be able to return to work in September — at least for some sort of desk job. The officer would like to be back on the road in October or November, though she's not yet sure if that will be possible.

effort. The leaders had hoped for a larger turnout, but public parking at Bailey Center was severely limited because carnival workers were setting up for Westland's annual summer festival.

CSCE's first meeting showed some progress, however, as a 16-member board of directors was formed to oversee the non-profit foundation that wants to raise money for activities ranging from sports to marching band.

Action needed

"We don't see our schools getting a whole lot better unless we start taking some action," CSCE president Donald Mead told the audience.

The Wayne-Westland school board had proposed eliminating all extracurricular activities this fall to combat a projected \$14-million budget deficit. However,

the board has now appointed a task force to recommend a possible pay-to-play plan for some activities.

The cost per student could be as high as \$350, officials have estimated. But CSCE hopes to raise at least some money before this fall to help offset some of the cost.

Coaches also have indicated they will perform their extracurricular duties this fall for no pay, if the teachers union that represents them will agree to a contract amendment.

Moreover, CSCE hopes in coming years to raise enough money in the community to completely pay for extracurricular activities. The tab for all such activities is about \$850,000 a year.

CSCE leaders hope that their efforts eventually could ease the district's persistent budget problems, reduce the local tax burden for extracurricular activities,

eliminate the need for pay-to-play, and provide permanent funding for sports, marching band and other programs.

The school board would still oversee the programs; CSCE would only help raise money for them.

Some parents who attended last week's meeting said they are worried that the committee's focus may be primarily on sports and that it may be too late to rescue some activities, such as marching band. Some teachers, such as band leaders, already have been laid off.

More than sports

Although CSCE organizers are involved in youth sports, they tried to reassure parents that they also want to help pay for other extracurricular activities.

"This is not an athletic organization," Mead said.

Some parents also voiced concerns that CSCE's plan could detract from efforts to pass a school tax increase that still would be needed to restore many academic programs and other cuts, such as busing for junior high and high school students.

Former Wayne-Westland school board member Kathleen Chorbagian told committee leaders that some district residents may not bother to support a tax increase if they believe CSCE will pay for programs.

Meanwhile, CSCE's newly formed board of directors plans to meet Wednesday to complete its bylaws and corporate paperwork and to form specific committees for assignments.

Hagelthorn noted that letters are virtually ready to be mailed to the private sector, seeking money for school activities.

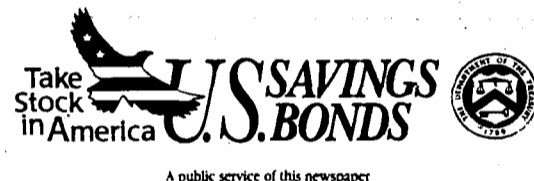

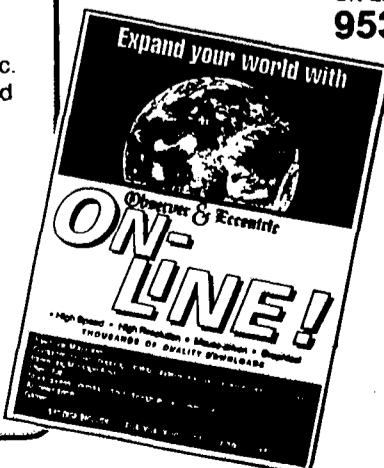

Great skate!

S'craft goes 'skatecraft' with new class

It's the Ninja Turtles of recreational sports. In-line skating, developed in 1980 by two brothers in Minnesota looking for an economical way to play hockey in the summer, has soared in popularity. The sport is the newest way to get into shape and has grown into an international recreation.

Keying in on the popularity of in-line skating, and recognizing a need for training and safety habits in the sport, Schoolcraft College is offering a four-week instructional course through continuing education from 6-9 p.m. Wednesdays beginning July 14. The fee is \$45 per person.

The class is open to everyone. "I've had people age 2 to age 80 on skates; no one is too young, no one is too old to learn," said Chris Johnson, instructor.

"I'd encourage anybody who has the slightest desire (to learn in-line skating) to try it. You're going to have a good time."

Johnson is a certified instructor with International In-Line Skating Association and a sales rep for Roller Blade, an in-line skating industry leader. He says the popularity of the sport has grown steadily since 1980.

Johnson and his assistant, John Pump, work with skaters at

all levels, teaching in-line techniques to experienced skaters, and starting from the beginning with novice skaters.

For those who have never skated, Johnson starts them walking on the grass, getting used to the feel of the skates and the protective gear, then moves on to teaching the skating motion. He doesn't guarantee skaters will be graceful when the class is over, but they will have the necessary skills to skate, and he says it takes practice.

The novice as well as the experienced skater may have a fall or two, and that's why Johnson stresses the importance of always wearing safety equipment. Skates and protective gear - helmet, knee, elbow and wrist guards - are provided in the class.

The Schoolcraft class stresses the fundamentals, safety and rules of the road for in-line skating.

Students are taught how to start, stop, turn and maneuver on skates. The class covers the importance of wearing safety gear, where to skate and skating etiquette.

When Johnson first approached the college about teaching the course, Marv Gans, assistant dean of continuing education, was

eager for a class in the area.

"Most people buy the skates and don't get instruction," said Gans. "I live in Northville and see kids and adults skating in town not wearing any protective gear," said Gans.

He saw Johnson's offer as an excellent opportunity to provide instruction in the sport and inform participants of the necessary safety precautions.

Some of the students in the class now under way had been interested in in-line skating and were looking for a place to learn.

Mary Perva and Dena Gawthrop are mother and daughter from Canton Township who signed up for the first class.

"I didn't want to come by myself, so I made my daughter come," said Perva, who says it's a good way to lose weight and get in shape. "It looked like more fun than walking or jogging."

Gawthrop had roller-skating experience but was surprised that in-line skating is more like ice skating.

Denny Behrendsen of Livonia had been out skating with his buddies, who were teaching him some skills. But when he picked up a flier on the class, he decided to enroll and learn from a professional instructor.

"I feel a lot more confident," said Behrendsen, who skates on the street in his subdivision and in a park after work.

skaters. Most are safety and courtesy guidelines that will make skating more enjoyable.

At the top of the list is to always wear safety equipment - helmet, knee, elbow and wrist guards. Johnson said a bicycle helmet can be used for in-line skating.

Stay alert and always be courteous, obeying traffic rules (stop signs, traffic lights, etc.), always

stay out of heavy traffic areas and control your speed.

Control is a difficult task to accomplish when tearing to skate. Johnson suggests using an empty parking lot or the sidewalk at home, until you've learned to control speed. The sidewalk is good because skaters can usually get to the grass if they get in trouble and need to regain control. It's also

better to fall on grass rather than cement.

Skate on the right of a path, pass on the left and always yield to pedestrians.

Johnson warns that in-line skating is not like roller skating or ice skating.

"There is no toe pick to stop you," said Johnson. Depending on how fast a skater

is traveling, it can take up to 40 feet to stop.

"Of course it doesn't take that long if you're skating slow."

Getting fitted with the right gear is necessary for safety and comfort in the sport. Johnson said a skate should fit like a tennis shoe and have a strap around the ankle for support.

He recommends a quality skate for support and comfort, especial-

ly for those who want to skate a couple times a week.

Getting outfitted for the sport can cost up to \$250, for skates and safety gear. Some sporting goods stores rent the equipment. A more cost efficient way for those who aren't sure if in-line skating is for them, and want to try the sport before making an investment.

Check with local retailers for rental opportunities.

Plant some art in your garden

With some apprehension, I approached my towering delphinium last week and snipped their blue and lavender stalks. Though beautiful to behold through my dining room window, I longed to have them fill my glass cobalt pitcher and grace the center of the table. I worried that they wouldn't generate new stalks, but I can see tiny buds already.

Summer gardens are such pleasures. They provide fragrant outdoor living rooms as well as an abundance of fresh bouquets to brighten our interiors. Now that the garden is alive with impatiens, petunias, geraniums and snapdragons, you might want to consider embellishing nature with some garden sculpture or other ornamentation.

Area galleries and boutiques offer numerous examples of one-of-a-kind outdoor art. The bunny pictured (\$12) peeks through the phlox in one of my beds. He is one of a large selection of "Made in Michigan" statuary available at Folkways Trading Co., 838 Penniman in Plymouth.

Proprietor Diane Jouppi has a long list of clientele who seek out her natural-look forest animals, cherubs, religious figures, planters, benches and birdbaths. "They are not only aesthetically pleasing," she says, "but they are meticulously finished so that there is no pitting in the cement."

Joining the garden bunny in the picture is a whimsical insect which sits on a metal stake. Ariana Gallery, 386 E. Maple in Birmingham, includes this critter in its "Art for the Garden" collection. Look for grasshoppers, hummingbirds and dragonflies, all in a verdigris finish with copper eyes and tentacles (\$44). Sure to put a buzz in your flowerpot.

Sculpture celebrations

To inject your outdoor space with a fun-loving spirit, add one of Fred Myers' steel creations to the landscape. Myers' studio recreates ancient Indian petroglyphs and pictographs in ironwork sculptures. The delightful designs include occasional tables and freestanding figures, as well as murals and benches. "Hands Up" is a joyful interpretation of a cave dweller (\$1500). "Mimbras Quail" is the artist's perception of the southwest New Mexico bird that provided a food source to the Indians (\$600), and the "Zuni Flute Player" is a recognizable Indian kachina (\$750). My favorite is the intricately carved table that tells a story through the shapes and drawings of past civilizations (\$2600). See them all at Ariana Gallery.

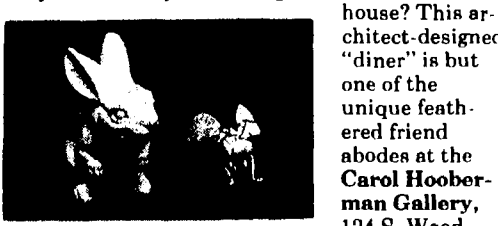
Objects of Art, 6243 Orchard Lake Road, West Bloomfield, in Sugar Tree Square, displays selected works of local and out-of-state artists. This month the gallery is filled with outdoor creations. Scott Brazeau of Birmingham exhibits his abstract metal furniture. He uses found objects, including twigs, pitchforks and tractor seats in his imaginative designs.

Wildlife surprises

Washington sculptor Tom Torrens fashions contemporary fountains and birdfeeders from simple industrial materials, especially copper. The multi-shaped birdfeeder dominates the gallery's front window and is an eye-catching work-of-art (\$800).

Other notable originals at Objects of Art include Craig Easter's freestanding fish ponds and bowls (\$86-\$300) and aluminum Wind Petals, stylized butterflies, feathers, bugs and fish that animate your garden as they rock and pivot, changing shape with the slightest breeze.

Delight in all of these works at a sidewalk sale July 8-10. Finally, what's a garden without a birdhouse? This architect-designed "diner" is but one of the unique feathered friend abodes at the Carol Hooberman Gallery, 124 S. Wood-



ward, Birmingham, one of the "Shops at the Top" of the stairs. The enamel-finished wood will provide your favorite songsters with years of fine dining. All that's missing is the neon.

And now all your garden needs is you. Sit back, relax and enjoy.

POINTS OF VIEW

More than ever black, white and 'red' all over

The rules of the journalism profession are not black and white. It is a profession where shades of gray are the rule and not the exception.

Whom to interview, what stories to cover, which story line to take, and where that story should run are all judgment calls which most try to make as fairly as they can.

But even given that lead, the recent phone call(s) to a juror in the Malice Green case trial by a Detroit News intern against the dictates of the trial judge leaves more than one inkblot on our profession.

No, the intern should not have contacted the juror against the judges orders.

Even more important, the intern should not have been made the scapegoat for that situation. (It is curious that the News would have put an in-

tern on such a critical story, a story that most professional reporters would have given a lot to have even a small part in.)

He was an intern, after all, serving a stint at the News to learn the profession — during which mistakes, even big ones, are part of the learning process. And you would presume he was working with at least one seasoned reporter and under at least one seasoned editor.

One of those professional journalists should have stepped forward to assume responsibility for the episode and taken the forthcoming punishment.

Part of that punishment, by the way, was out of line. The judge should not have ordered the sentenced person to sit through the trial in prison garb, shifting the spotlight from crucial trial issues.

I can't help remembering the high

esteem in which the news profession was held following Watergate, when two Washington Post reporters, through painstaking investigation and reportage, exposed the abuse of power of a presidency.

Young people were turned on by that kind of work and they flocked to college newspapers and journalism programs

to learn the skills to become the Woodwards and Bernsteins of the future.

Not so today.

Journalism was embarrassed when NBC News faked the explosion of a General Motors pick-up truck; when USA Today forced Arthur Ashe to acknowledge he had AIDS; most recently by the erroneous New York Post story about singer Whitney Houston's supposed drug overdose. And, closer to home, the press in its zeal to get the story failed to respect the intense pressure the students from Cranbrook/Kingswood were under as they waited for word of their classmates lost in the Great Smokies.

Journalism classes to which I have spoken are full of young people going into public relations and advertising, dutifully fulfilling their news writing requirement.

I feel sad about that. And it can only

hurt further that a Wayne State University journalism student is left to take the rap for those who know the news business as opposed to one who's still learning it.

We who are lucky enough to be part of the journalism profession have a responsibility to those who will come after us to get back to our basics.

We must report the news, not make it. We must interview others on the critical issues of the day, not ourselves. Just as we publicize our awards, we must acknowledge our mistakes. And we must leave the profession on a higher plane than the one on which it is resting today.

And that is black and white.

Cultural diversity forms suburban traffic patterns

During a recent conversation, a poet lamented that the world was breaking down into tribes. That's how he explained the mess with the Serbs and the Croats. It's cultural diversity in overdrive. He's probably right, but when you're an eighth generation redneck like myself, you can't tell a Serb from a Croat to save your four-wheel drive vehicle.

But then I thought of it in suburban Detroit terms. One friend contends that suburban Detroit people only want to know two things about you. "Where you live and what kind of car you drive."

He's probably right. Those two pieces of information define the tribe to which you belong. And put into those terms, the sage is right. Although I

can't tell a Croat from a Serb or for that matter a Greek, I can tell a Birmingham resident from one who parks his mini van in Canton at night.

First of all there's the gold trim line. It runs down Eight Mile, with cars falling to the north going for the gold. Those gold trimmed beauties also come with car phones.

The gold trim serves more of a purpose than identifying the owner as having bad taste, it allows them to identify each other when in Traverse City during August, as if the boat shoes and Izod shirts weren't enough. But we shouldn't feel guilty about the gold markings, native Americans used such markings on their bodies so they would be able to identify fellow tribe members.

Then there's the Lite beer and white wine line. It's rarely crossed by any in the suburbs, which allows the natives in northern Michigan to identify a tourist on the spot. Going native there means drinking bourbon or brandy with your un-lite draft beer.

My own tribe of Livonia residents can be identified by their mini vans. I have trouble finding my own during visits to the happy hunting ground at Builders' Square. A neighbor owns one the same color as mine and there have been times I couldn't tell the difference until finding out the key didn't fit.

My wife violated a Livonia tribal law by lamenting at a neighborhood party that there wasn't a good corner bar that offered cheeseburgers and beer. My wife has since been banished to the tribe of those who are recovering from some sort of addiction.

Then there's the Grosse Pointe tribe which engages in the strange custom of not wearing socks, even in January.

But even though we've got our own tribes, there is a big difference between

us and the Serbs and Croats. We don't kill each other with any regularity.

There's no militia in my Livonia neighborhood prepared to halt the invasion of birkenstock wearing, Volvo driving Farmington residents. And there's a reason. We've still got the idea in this country that we're more alike than different.

Celebrating our cultural differences is fine, but too much of it divides us into tribes. And when that happens we become suspicious of those driving Volvos.



Children learn a lot helping you in kitchen

I'm a self-professed cookbook freak. I have books on Russian cooking, South African cuisine, ice cream, holiday cooking, creative appetizers and a whole slew of children's cookbooks. When it comes to cooking alongside children, I have come to realize that the old Betty Crocker cookbook that taught us how to turn French toast into smiley faces with blueberries and bananas just doesn't cut mustard. Have you ever watched a child paging through a cookbook to find the perfect accompaniment to fish sticks?

Learning by doing

Children learn by doing, and even though you might not think they're learning anything by opening a can of spaghetti, they are. They learn how to choose right pot to fit the burner, kitchen and fire safety, how to use utensils, and recycle by cooking just one little can of spaghetti.

Children can learn a lot helping in the kitchen. You might not realize it, but you incorporate math into cooking every time you count eggs for a cake. Too simple, you say? How about a lesson in fractions every time you mix one-quarter cup of sugar into three-quarters of a cup of flour?

Science lessons

The simple art of making bread can be a lesson in doubling (in bulk, as the dough rises). Speaking of dough, there's a lesson to be learned about how yeast interacts with flour and warm liquids to create a gas that causes the dough to rise.

A microwave oven and bag of popcorn can be the impetus to a whole lesson on how microwave energy works. Energy can be explored by explaining the difference between gas and electric stoves, microwave ovens and even incorporating propane grills and gas-fired camp stoves.

A personal favorite of mine is exploring the geographical aspects of cooking. What foods grow best where and why? Can anyone explain why the French call it a crepe, the Poles call it a polichinka, the Chinese call it an egg roll wrapper and the Greeks call it phyllo?

It might be a little thicker or thinner, and they all start with flour and a liquid and all end up getting rolled around some sort of food. They all, in essence, do the same thing and come from the same source.

My kids don't realize it, but they also learn a very important lesson in sanitation and food safety when they cook. This goes far beyond a simple hand washing.

The Janes Gang have found bugs in flour and seen the results of what happens when a little sugar is inadvertently spilled on the kitchen floor. What treasures lurk behind the stove or refrigerator and why is it necessary to pull them out every now and then to do a basic cleaning? Have you ever thought about what happens to a soggy dish towel when you leave it in the sink after an overnight excursion to Cedar Point?

Grocery shopping

These are just a few of the things that my kids learn when they're home during the summer helping me cook. I would bet that if you ask any parent who has ever taken a kid to the grocery store if the trip was educational, they would laugh in your face. Between the questions of "can I have?" and the "I wants," I send the children off searching for frozen grape juice and refried beans all the while knowing that I'm teaching them reading skills.

My soon-to-be-a-fourth-grader adores the game we play about finding out costs and comparison shopping between brands. She thinks it's fun; I think it's great that I'm saving money. My second-grader reads coupons and makes up the shopping lists. Even if "bred" is spelled without an "a," he's learning something.

Most important, I think my kids are getting some sort of understanding about just how much money it costs to go grocery shopping these days and why I get upset when the peanut butter is left uncovered or when the milk is left out of the refrigerator.

I think my outlook on getting kids involved in the kitchen is a little different than that of Betty Crocker. Anyone who has ever seen my kids knows that they love to eat as much as I do but instead of making smiley faces on French toast to make it fun to eat, my kids are learning those little lessons in life that will allow them to be self-sufficient as the years go by.

What it all boils down to folks is that if you get kids involved in the cooking process as a whole, they will learn to try different things simply because they're involved in the process.

My kids get as excited when they make a batch of tacos as they did when they learned how to tie their shoes. My only wish is that if you have kids, you will instill in them the importance of food and cooking. Bon Appetit!

SMART SNACKERS MUNCH ON NUTRITIOUS nibbles

■ Kick the junk food habit and develop a plan to snack smart. Substitute dried and fresh fruit, pretzels, popcorn and juice for candy, chips and pop.

There's nothing wrong with snacking. What's wrong are our choices — candy, cookies and ice cream. According to research conducted by Quaker Oats Co., Americans spend more than \$31 billion on snack food compared to just over \$16 billion on fruit. Candy takes the largest share of the snack food market (25.4 percent) with cookies and crackers coming in second (23.6 percent).

Snacks account for 18 percent of the day's total calories and 16 percent of the day's total fat intake for children. For active, growing teens, snacks can account for up to one-fourth of the day's total calories.

Don't let your kids take a summer vacation from good nutrition, take advantage of the bounty of fresh fruits and vegetables to develop a snack smart plan.

Lisa Kay Allen noticed a big difference in her son, Andrew, 6½, a student at Oakland Steiner School in Bloomfield Township, when she substituted dried fruits and fruit juice for candy and pop. "He's a calmer, happier boy," she said. "Give him a candy bar and he'll get real hyper."

Making the switch to more natural foods wasn't hard. "More grocery stores have healthy food sections," she said. "I find everything I need at the L & L Spartan Store at Adams and Wattles in Rochester Hills," she said.

CHEF'S SECRETS

Down-to-earth chef likes food that's real

You won't find any bottles of lemon juice or cans of apples on the shelves in the kitchen at Bonnie's Patisserie, 29229 Northwestern Highway, Southfield. Owner Bonnie Fishman is appalled by processed foods.

"I'm just really down to earth. I have old-fashioned values. I like food that's real. I've not cut any corners in 13 years. We bone our own turkeys, make our own stock, juice lemons, peel our own apples and garlic," Fishman said. "We buy direct and use the freshest, finest ingredients."

Trained at Cordon Bleu Cookery School in London, England, Fishman, who studied anthropology in college, has developed a successful business doing what she likes best: cooking and teaching others how to cook.

She packs a lot into her oasis on busy Northwestern Highway. It's not a big place. There are 16 seats inside and 12 outside, but the atmosphere is friendly and relaxing. Bonnie's borders a tree-lined, natural spring-fed brook. You can hear the stream babbling over the din of cars.

Customers come for the fresh, homemade soups, salads and sandwiches plus daily specials like Chicken Orange Salad, Szechwan Beef and Wild Rice and Turkey Salad, pastries, tarts, cookies and cakes.

Fishman offers custom-catering and teaches cooking classes from mid-September to mid-May. "We do an amazing variety in a small place, and we have high standards," she said.

There's a mirror above the kitchen window so students in her cooking classes can see exactly what she's doing. "I've been teaching for 15 years," she said. "I learn from my students and my students learn from me. The nicest compliment I ever received was, 'You inspired me to cook again.'"

Her classes are informal and there's something

for everyone. One class might be on low-fat cooking, another on chicken. "I test all my recipes," she said. "I get ideas usually when I'm driving. I'm like a chemist. I know what will work and what won't."

Who taught you how to cook?

"My mom. She was an excellent cook; she was really before her time. Carolyn Haskin (former executive chef of the Townsend Hotel in Birmingham) was a great source of inspiration. She's a remarkable talent. She's not a snob. I met her at the Money Tree (in Detroit)."

Family.

Fishman lives in West Bloomfield. She is married to Robert Ketai and they have two children, Ben, 11, and Hanna, 6. Like her mother, Fishman said she involves her children in cooking. "Ben can cook any breakfast. My daughter has helped me since she was 2. Young children can scrub vegetables and shuck corn."

When did you decide to open your own business?

"I cooked in high school, but everyone went to college so I did too. I studied anthropology because I liked it and worked at food places. After my junior year, I went to London and loved it. In the fall of my senior year, I went to Cordon Bleu. On the plane on the way home from Europe, I wrote in my journal, 'small pastry shop like in France.' I wanted to cater too." Fishman worked at a variety of restaurants and was general manager of the Money Tree in Detroit. She moved to the Bay area of California to sharpen her baking skills and moved back to the Detroit area after a year and a half. She was 27 when she opened Bonnie's.

Bonnie's will be closed Monday-Tuesday, July 5-6, for summer vacation. She will reopen Wednesday, July 7. Call 357-4540.

Oakland Steiner School learn a lot about nutrition. "People are what they eat. It affects learning," said Nancy Sheffield of Bloomfield Hills, whose daughter, Laura, 7, attends the school. "We constantly serve unbuttered, unsalted popcorn. We try to serve foods that are as close to their natural state as possible. We make a lot of muffins and add seeds, nuts and dried fruits. Kids love them." Smoothies — a blended mixture of fruits, yogurt or milk — and juice are a year-round favorite at the Sheffield house. Leftovers are poured into ice cube trays. Insert a toothpick and you've got a refreshing snack. Or just put the frozen smoothie cubes into a cup and wait for them to thaw a little. Sheffield cautions parents to read labels. "Make sure you buy real fruit juice. Juice cocktails contain a little juice and a lot of sugar." When Laura's hungry for a

crunchy snack, she'll reach for the carrots and celery sticks her mom keeps in the refrigerator. Pea pods are another favorite. "I buy unsalted sunflower seeds, dried fruits and nuts in bulk and mix them together. It's a nutritionally complete snack," Sheffield said. "Unsalted pretzels and tortilla chips, and string cheese, are good snacks too." Learning how to prepare snacks is part of the learning that goes on at the Oakland Steiner School, named after Rudolf Steiner who founded the Waldorf School movement in Europe. Waldorf schools like Oakland Steiner, stress self-discovery. Children learn about food by preparing it. Part of the morning routine at Oakland Steiner is preparing a snack. "Children as young as 3 can help wash and scrub vegetables," said Kathy Knoebel, who teaches kindergarten. "Children ages 6 and 7 can peel, slice and chop

fruits and vegetables with supervision. They love to do that." Knoebel encourages parents to develop a rhythm and routine with their children. Serve snacks at the same time every day. Introduce them to unusual fruits like kiwi. Grains are not just for cereals and side dishes, they make great snacks too. A favorite snack at the school is cooked barley with cut up fruit mixed with a little honey or milk. Preparing snacks helps children develop small motor skills like cutting. They learn how to share equipment, and to socialize. While making Muesli, a mixture of chopped oats, fruits, nuts and soy milk, Raffi Schaffa, 6 1/2, his sister Deborah, 4, Lauren Hooten, 6, and Andrew Allen, 6 1/2, grated nuts, sliced strawberries and stirred the mixture with a wooden spoon. "Put the food processor away and let the children grate. Give

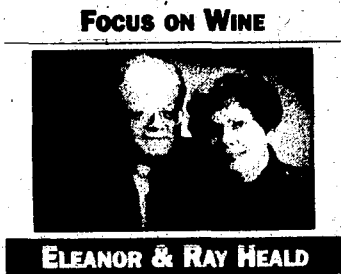

'Rhone rangers' chart success in California wineries

California wineries have experienced success with production of wines from grape varieties indigenous to France's Rhone Valley. About 10 years ago, the lead was taken by head "Rhone Ranger" Bonny Doon Vineyard's creative winemaker Randall Graham. Today, in California, from northern Sonoma County south to Santa Barbara, winemakers have charted success on the course of Rhone varietal production and the Rhone Rangers are legion.

Among them is Michigan State University grad and St. Clair Shores native Doug Danielak, winemaker at Jade Mountain winery in northern Sonoma County. Danielak's ride into winemaking is circuitous, but interesting.

"My wife and I sort of hung out in Burgundy during our honeymoon in 1983," he said. Upon his return to the United States he sold wine for Detroit Metro area distributor Chip Delsener until the end of 1985 when he pulled up stakes to work and attend grape-growing and winemaking school in Beaune, the heart of Burgundy. Fluency in French helped Danielak, although he was unable to land a job as winemaker for a Burgundy producer. Traditions

ran too deep for this!

He returned to the U.S. in 1987 to work harvest at Saintsbury winery in California's Carneros region. In 1988, Jade Mountain winery needed a winemaker and Danielak was hired. In the last five years, he has engineered conversion of the winery's Cloverdale vineyards from riesling, sauvignon blanc and cabernet sauvignon to 31 acres of the Rhone varietals syrah, marsanne and a small percentage of mourvedre.

Jade Mountain's owner James Paras acquired a second property of 22-acres on Mount Veeder in Napa Valley and Danielak uprooted Bordeaux varieties and planted Rhone varietals — more syrah and mourvedre, plus viognier, grenache and cinsault.

Jade Mountain's first release of a Rhone-style wine was 1988, a varietal mourvedre made from purchased grapes. Today, Jade Mountain's wine portfolio includes a varietal mourvedre and syrah, two proprietary wines, La Provencale (a blend of Southern Rhone varietals and Les Jumeaux (a blend of cabernet sauvignon and mourvedre sourced from 60-year-old vines). If your French isn't as strong as Danielak's, we'll explain that Les Jumeaux is translated as "the twins."

This innovation puts Jade Mountain in the annals of California wine history and gives California red blends a new definition. Danielak explains the twinning.

"When California cabernet sauvignon is picked at prime ripeness, it's lush, delicious and chocolatey," he says. "In Les Jumeaux, I try to express full cabernet sauvignon flavors with mourvedre softening the tannic impression." It works, because this wine is absolutely delicious.

Tasting Jade Mountain wines

Jade Mountain's production is miniscule compared to that of the

industry's giants. They may not be available in every wine shop, but they are definitely worth searching out.

Jade Mountain Grenache (\$10) is not made each year. The current release was made from a blend of 1990 California and Washington State grapes. Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms regulations require that as such, it must be labeled "American" and may not be vintage dated. It is a perfect summer barbecue or picnic wine.

1991 La Provencale (\$13), a blend of syrah, mourvedre, grenache and carignane, sports solid fruit and is delicious, full and round with a powerful finish. 1990 Les Jumeaux (\$13) has the distinct aroma of mourvedre with complementary peppery spice and black truffles making it complementary to red meat and heartier dishes.

Two versions of the 1990 Mourvedre (\$14) are available. One was filtered and the other was not. The label indicates the difference and they are slightly dissimilar when tasted.

Our preference is the unfiltered, which seems to showcase each characteristic of the 60 to 120-

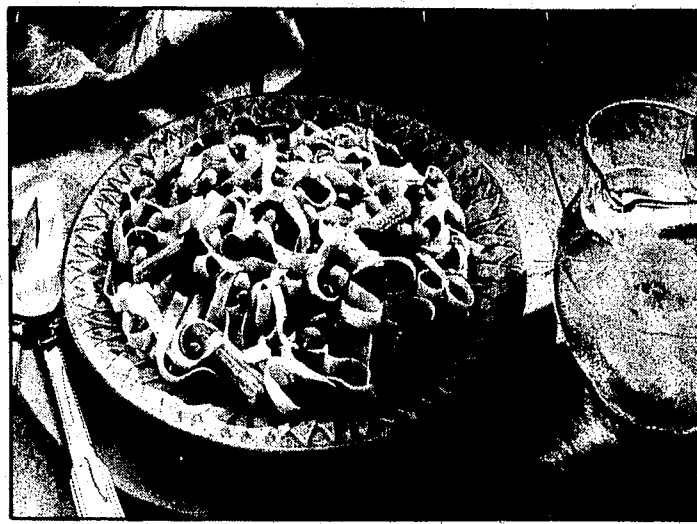

- ¼ teaspoon garlic powder
- ¼ teaspoon cumin
- ½ teaspoon salt

dash cayenne pepper

In a saucepan, cook onion in butter till golden. Combine remaining ingredients and lower heat to a simmer and cook for 5 minutes.

Heat taco shells or tortillas in the oven for 5 minutes. Stuff with meat mixture and top with cheese and lettuce, if desired.

Chef's secret: My kids aren't big onion lovers so I put the onion and green chilies in a blender or processor and process until smooth and then proceed with the cooking so that they never even see those bits and pieces in there!

- 4 whole skinless, boneless chicken breasts
- 4 stalks celery, sliced thin on the diagonal
- 3 scallions, sliced thin on the diagonal
- 4 Navel oranges
- 2 cups red seedless grapes
- ½ cup toasted sliced almonds

Place chicken breasts in a large skillet. Season with salt and pepper. Barely cover with any combination of chicken stock, white wine, or water. Bring to a boil; turn down to a simmer. Poach the chicken for about 10-12 minutes, turning once. Cool in liquid.

Dinosaur Jr., Primus join Lollapalooza

■ You won't find Dinosaur Jr. watching "Jurassic Park." This group has more important things to do. And ditto for Primus. The two bands are among the groups that are traversing the country with the Lollapalooza Festival.

Dinosaur Jr. guitarist Murph never paid much attention to the Lollapalooza Festival. This year his band is one of the main stage "big buzz" groups of the festival, which comes to the Milan Dragway in Milan Friday.

It was one of those things that MTV advertised and I never take MTV very seriously," Murph said during a Lollapalooza stop in San Francisco.

Only a few gigs into the tour, it hasn't really hit him that he's playing something he never much cared for in the past.

"I'm not really aware that I'm playing Lollapalooza; I don't hang out in the village or anything," he said. "I'm more aware of playing in the summer, in the daylight, of only having 45 minutes. It's really easy."

It's easy compared to the two-month headlining tour the group did earlier this year to promote its fifth album "Where You Been?" (The Dinosaur Jr.'s April 7 show at Detroit's St. Andrew's Hall sold out in a few days.) The promotion also got tiring — especially the recent Spin magazine cover which declared lead singer J Mascis "God."

"I thought it was really lame," he said. "I also think it's not our doing. It's a sign of the times and the media. I'm down on the whole MTV and media thing. That just reinforced it."

"But if people are lame enough to believe it... If they think J is God, then they're totally lost."

Although he's a "pretty unaffected guy about this whole music thing," Murph admits to liking a few Lollapalooza bands.

"I like to watch a few. They (Rage Against The Machine, Primus, and the Babes in Toyland) are pretty good."

As for Primus, he gets a kick out of the behavior of that band's devout fans.

"It's been insane everywhere. I'm into that kind of stuff."

That and the cool vibe of Lollapalooza is why Larry Lalonde, gui-

tarist for Primus — the other hyped band — is excited about doing the tour.

"Every year that it's happened I thought that would be cool to be on it," Lalonde said from his Berkeley, Calif., home prior to the tour's start.

Primus is touring with Lollapalooza to promote its latest release "Pork Soda," which once again incorporates Les Claypool's off-the-wall vocals and unorthodox bass playing.

"It's just a record of a bunch of noise," explained Lalonde who, like the rest of the band, is obsessed with fishing.

Ironically, in the band's formative years, it almost went without Claypool. He auditioned for Metallica.

"Kirk (Hammett, Metallica's guitarist) was a friend of his from high school. They auditioned tons of people. His (Claypool's) hair was about an inch long and it was orange. I don't think he was anything near what they were looking for," Lalonde explained with a laugh.

But despite Claypool's reputation, Lalonde doesn't see a lot of strangeness in his bandmate.

"Les? Nah, he's a normal guy... to me he is."

Aside from the mainstage acts — which also include Rage Against the Machine, Babes in Toyland, Front 242, Arrested Development, and Alice in Chains — the music will also include bands on the side stage. So far Tool, whose hit "Sobriety" gets airplay on CIMX 89X, along with Unrest, Royal Trux and Paul K and the Weathermen, have been announced. Tool, the side stage headliners in

Lollapalooza will be held at the Milan Speedway in Milan noon midnight Friday, July 9. The parking lot opens at 7 a.m. Tickets are \$28.50; parking \$7. To get to the dragway take US-23 south to Exit 25 (Plank Road), turn right and go four miles to Milan Dragway.

"We get to play the main stage and side stage," said drummer Danny Carey.

The band will play the main stage when Babes in Toyland drops off the tour on July 15. That opportunity was enough to convince the band, which also includes guitarist Adam Jones of Scottville, to turn down tours with Depeche Mode, Def Leopard and Guns 'N Roses.

"We want to be true to our fans," said Carey, a veteran of Green Jelly and Carole King's band. "We thought it would be a slap in the face to those who move in the underground scene. We thought, 'Why prostitute yourself?'"

For the most part, the band is pleased with Lollapalooza.

"It totally feels justified. It's perfect for our band."

'Speed Racer Show' races into the Magic Bag Theater

He's more than just a badly animated memory from the late '60s. "Speed Racer's" cult status, most alive in TV-aholics age 25-35, roars into the Magic Bag Theater on July 9-10 with three original half-hour episodes compiled by "Speed" freak Jerry Beck.

The brainchild of comic book artist Tatsuo Yoshida, Speed and his Mach 5 debuted on Japanese television in April 1967. The 52 episodes, syndicated stateside by Trans-Lux Productions, went underground in the late '70s when stricter standards for children's programming objected to the show's violence.

Beck, who distributes vintage and current Japanimation through California-based Streamline Pictures, tracked down the original 35mm negatives for "The

Speed Racer Show." He notes that "it's still the same animation that you see on TV, but it's really crisp and clear and looks like it was shot yesterday."

"The Car Hater" and the two-part "Race Against the Mammoth Car" made it into this compilation because, according to Beck, "we showed episodes to groups in L.A. and 'Car Hater' got the best audience response. It also has an explanation of all the gimmicks of the Mach 5."

Special buttons on the steering wheel enable Speed to leap over obstacles (with the help of "auto-jacks") or to engage special "belt tires" to grip steep terrain at top speeds. Rotating sawblades unfold to cut down heavy off-road brush and trees while a watertight

transparent canopy protects him from bullets.

"Mammoth Car," perhaps the best-remembered of the original episodes, features mysterious Racer X, the black-clad rival driver who helps Speed out of sticky situations. TV viewers know that he is really Rex Racer, Speed's brother, who left home years ago after arguing with their dad, Pops.

The program also unearths "The Treacherous Pirate," a Colonel Bleep short from 1956. The cartoons, produced in Miami, Fla., were the first made for television in color.

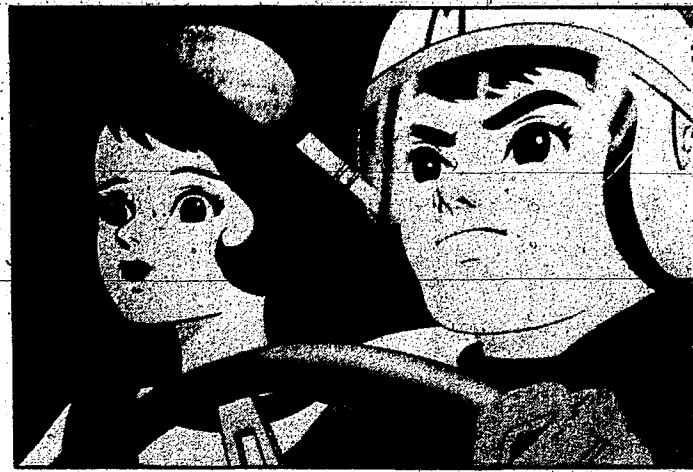
"It's an obscure cartoon show that I really love," says Beck. "So does the creator of 'Ren and Stimpy,' John K, who says it's one of his major influences in terms of style. It's an offbeat story about a space character with that '50s futuristic look that's so cool and campy

now." Vintage kid commercials appear between cartoons. Rocky and Bullwinkle peddle a long-lost cereal called Sugar Jets. Casper the Ghost lectures about traffic safety, an odd concept according to Beck, because "basically you have this dead kid telling you how to cross the street."

What keeps the "Speed" cartoons so popular?

"I can't quite figure it out," says Beck. "I think because it was off the air for such a long time that a lot of kids from that time have fond memories of it today."

'Year of Comet:' As good as fine wine

You don't need to be a connoisseur of fine wines to appreciate the romantic comedy "Year of the Comet" which ostensibly is about efforts to keep hold of a \$1 million bottle of wine.

Penelope Ann Miller plays a young woman who knows a great deal about wine, a subject that excites her tremendously. She dreams of working with collections of rare vintages but instead is stuck with pouring and cleaning up at wine tastings for her father's London wine business.

After a bit of struggle with her father and lumpy half-brother, Miller is sent off on the relatively simple task of cataloging the wine cellar at a Scottish estate. The job gets a bit more complicated, however, after she finds the rare bottle in the dirty cellar.

Naturally, the kindly looking landlady listens in on Miller's call home and finds out about the wine. The old lady sends her thug son to take the wine with an eye on a comfortable retirement.

Then there is the bunch who are holed up inside the supposedly empty mansion. Veteran French actor Louis Jourdan answers the door in a butler's rig but that's only an interruption from his main focus — torturing a for-

mer associate to find out where some secret formula has been hidden.

A man Miller met at the wine tasting and remembered for his intentional lowbrow behavior, played by Timothy Daly, has been dispatched to Scotland to retrieve the bottle of wine for his multi-millionaire boss.

After the initial bumpy start, Miller and Daly find romance while trying to keep or retrieve the wine. The chase really gets ignited after they find the hapless torture victim stuffed in the wine cellar.

Miller and Daly make a very good romantic couple. Their early

relationship doesn't get into the mean-spirited posturing some films rely on before getting their couple together. Both are characters you'd like to know, smart and funny.

There is a lot of humor in the film, some from unexpected bits like one of Jourdan's cronies trying to convince the couple he's a Scottish police inspector but speaking with a bad Swedish accent.

A rival bad guy, in the process of stealing the wine, pauses to flirt with Miller before boarding

his get-away plane. And Daly can't hear Miller yelling for help because the French chiropractor treating him has country music blaring.

Veteran director Peter Yates and writer William Goldman know how to keep the story moving with a light comedic touch. A rather good-natured quite enjoyable picture.

Think long, hard before slashing extracurriculars

The surgeons will survive. Those skilled with a scalpel will be there to slice up society — the doctors, lawyers, accountants, etc.

But who will guide them? From where will the judgment come? Who will tell them where to cut, and when?

More importantly, who will tell them not to? When school boards decide science and math are more important than developing social skills, they are misguided. But it will forever be that way; no one will argue to keep the marching band instead of chemistry. Even those who back the band wouldn't.

They want both, not one over the other. When backed into a corner and forced to choose, academics always wins. But when you sever a school's extracurricular activities, you cut away its heart, its soul. The fiber that bonds a school goes with any such amputation.

The classes that teach kids the composition of a cell and the capitol of Bangladesh and how to determine square roots will be intact. But the places where a kid can learn how to use those skills will be missing.

At Monday's Plymouth-Canton school board meeting at Salem HS, University of Michigan football coach Gary Moeller put it in terms everyone can identify.

"We have the greatest anti-drug tool around," he told a crowd estimated at well over 2,000. "If the federal government invested all those millions and millions of dollars in extracurricular activities

The Plymouth-Canton district is one of many facing major budget cuts. It is one of many searching for a solution.

What will happen?

While the problem — no money — is the same in many districts, the possible solutions are numerous. In the Observerland area, the Farmington and Garden City districts are intact, for now. Garden City ensured that prep sports will be around in the fall by passing its millage last month. But its position remains tenuous.

"Hopefully, we'll have all of our sports and everything will be the same as last year," said Garden City HS athletic director Bob Dropp. "Hopefully, it bought us a little time to allow the state to come up with a formula."

The state. Since Proposal A fell in the last election, school districts have been scrambling to find short-term funding. A year's worth, that's all, they say.

The Redford district has just such a solution in place. Forced to reduce the budget by \$3.5 million, the extracurricular activities funds were trimmed.

But the programs were not lost. A combination of fund-raising efforts, pay-to-participate and budget cuts has saved them. Students will pay \$50 to participate in as many activities as they wish, with a maximum of \$100 per family for each school.

You can hear the questions already: Why don't they do that every year?

The answer, courtesy of RU's athletic director, Jim Gibbons: "There's no way. It's really hard... we could do this for two years, maybe. And the (fund-raising) well's going to dry up sometime because everyone's doing it."

"Something's got to give. We've got to start putting the kids first."

Uncertain status

Like Plymouth-Canton, the Livonia and Wayne-Westland districts don't know their futures. Plymouth-Canton did agree to another millage proposal August 17; if it fails, say good-bye to extracurricular activities. No pay-to-participate plan is currently in the works.

In Wayne-Westland, a task force is being formed by the school board to study several plans, one of which includes complete funding by outside sources of school sports in the future. With two new board members just taking office, nothing is moving quickly. Another millage proposal is almost certain, but it may not come until October. A return to pay-to-participate is also under scrutiny.

Livonia, according to Stevenson AD Roger Frayer, is considering three options: pay-to-participate; ask for a millage specifically aimed at extracurricular activities; or cancellation. With a millage proposal already nixed once by the school board, the pay-to-participate option seems the only recourse.

But with no financial support at all from the school district, Frayer estimated the cost per student — which was \$140 last year — could more than triple. "If there is no funding, I doubt enough parents would pay \$450 per kid per sport for us to field any teams," said Frayer.

"People don't believe Livonia is in these dire straits, but we are. We really are."

C'ville coach injured in wreck

Livonia Clarenceville football coach Chuck Donaldson remained in critical condition Friday afternoon at the University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Arbor, where he was being treated for injuries sustained in an auto accident last month in Canton.

Donaldson, 25, suffered a broken neck, fracture in his skull, broken arm and broken leg after being involved in a two-car accident at the intersection of Ford and Haggerty roads at about 3 a.m. Sunday, June 27.

The other driver involved, a Canton police officer who was driving a patrol car, was released from the hospital Thursday. Canton police, who would not identify the officer, are investigating the accident.

Donaldson was appointed last month as the new Clarenceville foot-

ball coach, taking over for Russ McKenzie, who left to accept the football and wrestling coaching jobs at Ypsilanti Lincoln.

Donaldson, a 1985 Livonia Stevenson graduate, also is employed as a physical education instructor at Clarenceville Middle School.

"Chuck's a great person and has done an absolutely super job," said Clarenceville superintendent David Kamish, who was the principal at Grandview elementary where Donaldson did his student teaching. "The kids thoroughly love him, he'd volunteer to work with them on his own. We're in great shock and just praying and hoping everything works out well."

Donaldson coached the Clarenceville junior varsity team in 1992, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 record. He also has been a junior varsity football

coach at Stevenson High School and has coached wrestling and basketball and Clarenceville Middle School.

"Coaching is Chucky's life," said Debbie Cole, Donaldson's sister. "That was it, him and kids. My kids, anybody's kids. Chucky thrives on making kids succeed."

"The only thing that's not broken is Chucky's heart. I want to believe that. He's a fighter. He's going to live but what's going to happen after that no one knows."

Donaldson majored in physical education and minored in psychology at Central Michigan University, where he graduated in 1991.

Vic Nettie, a 1985 Stevenson graduate, said he has known Donaldson since kindergarten. Nettie, who helped Donaldson move into a condominium last month in Canton, was saddened and shocked by the news of

the accident.

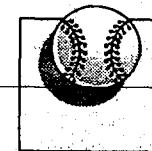
"His sister called me from the hospital, saying Chuck's been in a bad accident," Nettie said. "I said, 'Wait a minute, slow down, I just talked to him Friday night at his condo.' He was hooking up his stereo, just moved into his new place. The guy had everything together."

"He saved his money, had the coaching position, the teacher's job, the whole nine yards. He was doing everything right. For this to happen is just crazy. He has a hell of a fight ahead of him. If anyone can do it, he can."

Nettie and Donaldson spent one year coaching together at Stevenson.

"He took the kids and made them a total team," Nettie said. "The kids totally looked up to him. He had so much fire, he put it into the kids and they gave him 110 percent."

It was another benchmark year for Observerland baseball teams.

The 1993 campaign marked the final season for Garden City coach Bob Dropp, who retired after 28 seasons. Dropp compiled an overall record of 406-227. His 1993 team reached the 20-win plateau for the first time in his career.

Westland John Glenn finished 27-5 overall, reaching the state Class A semifinals for the second consecutive year, the third appearance for coach Norm Hoenes. The Rockets also won the Lakes Division title in the Western Lakes Activities Association.

Other area league champions included Plymouth Canton (WLAA playoff and Western Division), Redford Catholic Central (Central Division/Catholic League), Redford Thurston (Tri-River) and Redford Union (Northwest Suburban).

District champions included John Glenn, CC, Plymouth Salem, RU, Thurston (Class B) and Livonia Clarenceville (Class C).

RU, under the leadership of coaches of the year Rick Berryman and Shawn McGowan, was one of the area's biggest surprises in 1993.

The Panthers finished 20-15 overall before losing to Class A semifinalist Rochester Adams, 1-0, in the regional.

The future looks bright for RU, which returns 13 of 18 players, including its top three pitchers.

Berryman credits his staff, which also includes wife June and Barrie Lincoln.

"She (June) is the team's statistician, scorekeeper, batting coach and bench disciplinarian and self-proclaimed Mother Theresa," said Rick Berryman, who played baseball at Eastern Michigan under Ron Oestrike from 1966-69. "The four work well together as a team. We couldn't do it without them."

Berryman, a 22-year employee of the RU school district, teaches in self-contained learning disabilities. McGowan, a University of Michigan and Birmingham Brother Rice High product, has been the school's head football coach and physical education/computer teacher for four years.

FIRST TEAM

Aaron Scheffer, pitcher/infielder, Westland Glenn: The senior, who is reportedly leaning toward Henry Ford Community College, is the only repeat performer on this year's first team. He won a total of 20 games for the Rockets in three years.

The right-handed pitcher went 8-2 this season with a 1.29 earned run average. He struck out 79 and walked only 14 in 73 innings, allowing just 13 earned runs.

When the all-Western Lakes Activities Association pick wasn't pitching, he played the infield (first or second base).

Scheffer batted .495 (51 for 103) with eight doubles and 25 RBI. He scored 30 runs.

"Aaron could play a lot of places and is an excellent fielder with a good feel for the game," Glenn coach Norm Hoenes said. "He pitched in all the tough games. We're really going to miss him."

Mark Rutherford, pitcher/infielder, Liv. Churchill: The senior right-hander, headed for Eastern Michigan University, was voted East Team MVP in the Michigan High School Baseball Coaches Association All-Star Game at Tiger Stadium.

Rutherford started all four years for the Chargers, winning 13 games with 149 career strikeouts.

This season, Rutherford finished 6-2 with an ERA of 0.79. He struck out 63 in 53 innings and walked only 13.

Offensively, the All-WLAA pick batted .350 (21 for 60) with 18 runs scored. He struck out only two times.

Rutherford also showed his versatility by playing all four infield positions as well as center field.

"Mark is so solid all the way around," Churchill coach Herb Osterland said. "He can do so many things. He bunts and runs, even hits left-handed. He's very easy to coach. I can't say enough good things about him."

Brian Paluk, pitcher/outfielder, Redford CC: The 6-foot-5 senior right-hander became the ace of Catholic Central's staff.

Paluk, drafted by the Kansas City Royals in the 51st round, finished 10-3 his senior year with an ERA of 1.30. He struck out 109 in 80 1/3 innings, giving up only 15 earned runs and 29 walks.

The first-team All-Catholic pick also played the outfield, batting .275 in the fifth spot.

"It's a surprise somebody his size to be that well-coordinated," CC coach John Selter said.

Paluk will play basketball and baseball at Saginaw Valley State.

"Brian's a good athlete and he'll do well in college," Selter said. "He came on his senior year and I'm pleased with his season. He's a good two-sport athlete who will do well in college. He's very coachable, listens and wants to learn."

Mike Stafford, infielder/pitcher, Ply. Canton: The senior switch-hitting first baseman, bound for Ohio State, hit .489 (37 for 76) with four homers and 27 RBI.

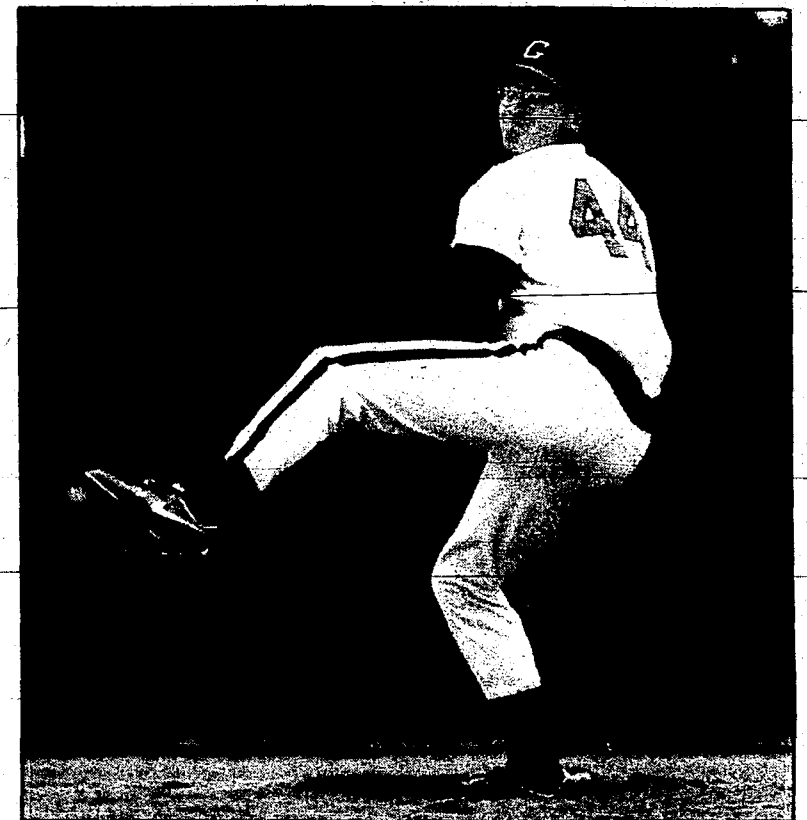
He is the son of former New York Yankees and Kansas City A's pitcher Bill Stafford, who pitched in two World Series.

Defensively, Stafford made only one error (.958 fielding percentage).

As a pitcher, the Canton lefty went 6-1 with an 0.30 ERA. He struck out 47 in 47 innings, allowing only four walks and two earned runs.

"Mike is the finest first baseman ever to play at Canton High School," coach Mark LaPointe said. "He's one of the most coachable players to work with."

"I've been around every Canton team but one, and he's in a class with Brian Stemberger, Scott Collins, John Young and Scott Kennedy. He's the best I've coached in any

Defensively, Tapp boasted a fielding



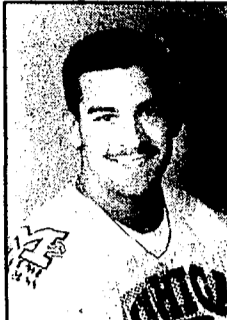

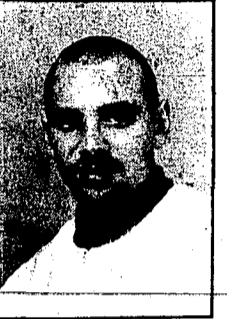

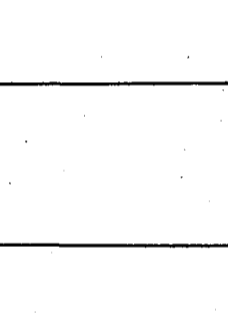

Consequences

So, apparently, are a lot of people. By next fall, the Western Lakes Activities Association could be down to six teams, instead of 12. The new Mega Conference, a 22-school behemoth, could shrink by seven before the first football is tossed. Even schools that retain sports could face massive scheduling problems due to cancellations.

"I can't imagine not having athletics or activities in Livonia," said Frayer. "But it might happen."

How can it be avoided? A bit of understanding could help. The public perception is that extracurricular activities benefit a few and cost a lot. Untrue — estimates from school sources estimate that 50 percent of the student body takes part in some extracurricular activity.

The cost: Less than one percent of the school's operating budget. Indeed, most systems don't come close to one percent.

Here's another possible solution: Use the Garden City method of getting a millage passed. A common complaint among voters who turn down millages has nothing to do with the expense of extracurricular programs; rather, they say teachers are overpaid.

It's obvious no millage will pass while teachers are getting pay increases. Garden City teachers cut their pay raise in half; the millage passed.

Redford teachers have refused to defer their pay raises, but Plymouth-Canton, Livonia and Wayne-Westland teachers reportedly have not been formally asked about possible adjustments in

their contracts.

Again, this would be a short-term solution. And while fund-raising can be a vital supplement, it couldn't be the sole source of income — not if every school was doing the same thing.

Privatizing prep sports? Go ahead — but don't expect it to lower taxes. It won't. Participation will drop, too. It won't take long for all youth sports to fold.

And our schools — where our children go not just to develop mentally, but socially and physically — will provide just one-third of what they were intended to provide.
