

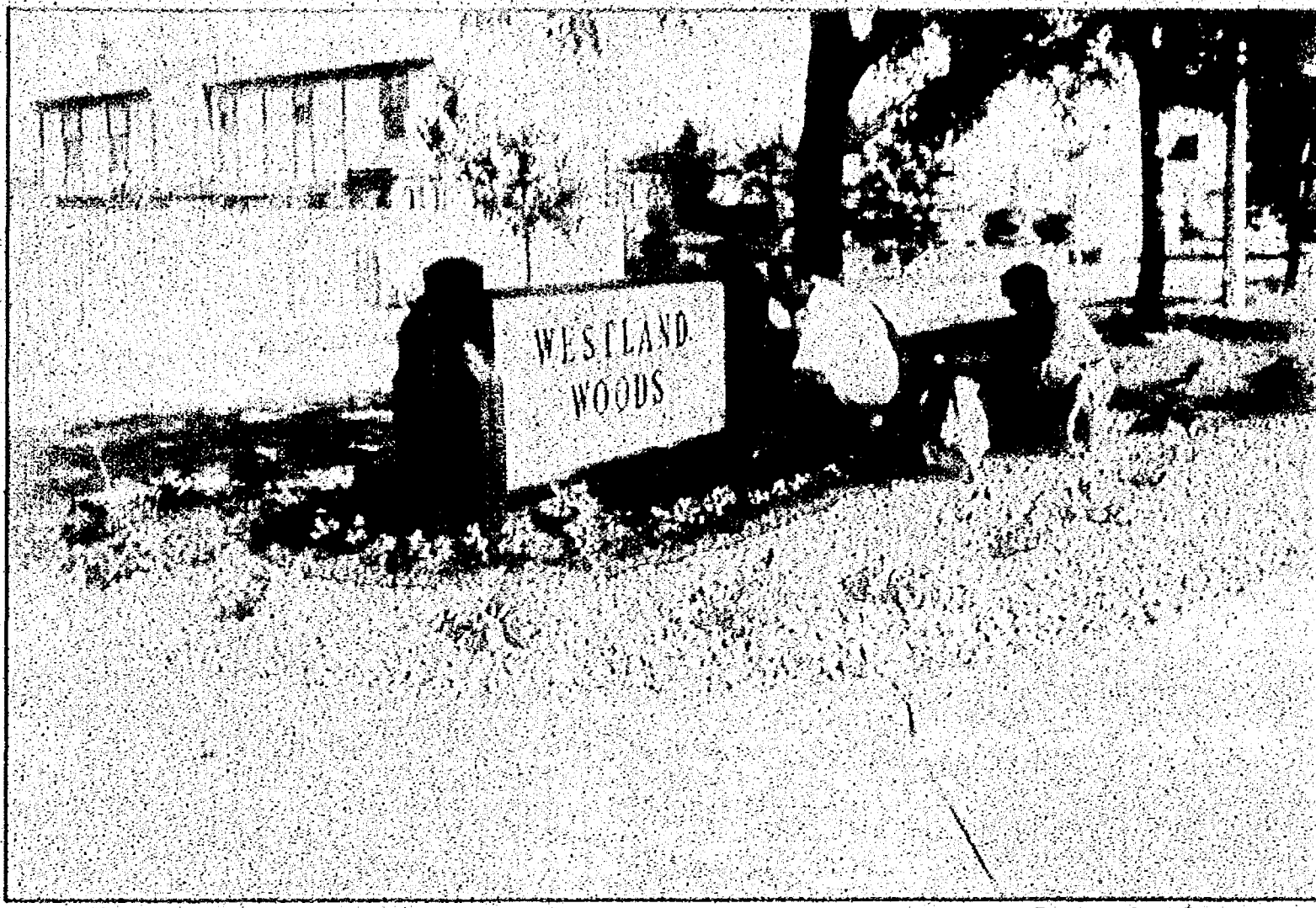

## Neighbors create flowery oasis

You drive westbound on Cherry Hill between Wayne and Newburgh in Westland and your vision is assaulted by busted up concrete, dirt mounds and heavy-duty back hoes and bulldozers as work crews labor to widen the road.

Out of the corner of your eye you catch a glimpse of color. Some reds, purples, yellows and greens. The contrast is striking. You look closer. It is the entrance island to the Westland Woods subdivision and it has been freshly landscaped.

The strip is about 30 yards long and divides the entrance and exit lanes to the sub. It is lined with six thin trees. On each end are beds of river rocks patched with hosta, geranium, mums, petunias and burning bush. Each tree is encircled with wood chips and assorted flowers.

It is an oasis in a desert of road work and it is the work of Bob and Rhonda Osterman.

"Basically, we just got tired of looking at the island as it was before," said Bob, who works at Northwest Airlines and lives in Westland Woods with Rhonda

Bob and Rhonda, whose home won the Mayor's Home Landscape Beautification

Award last year, asked the 155 households in the sub for a small donation up to \$10. About 75 people responded with roughly \$500 in donations.

"We had about 13 people come out and help, including a lot of the kids who helped pull weeds," Bob said. "Our neigh-

bor, Greg Thompson, painted the sign. In all, I think it took something like 25 hours to get it done. We finished on July 4. It turned out well. We've gotten a lot of thanks and a lot of compliments."

Like this one, from neighbor Lisa Thompson.

"Talking about doing something and actually doing it are two different things," she said. "Bob and Rhonda have done it. Our entrance looks great. It shows you what neighbors can do when somebody gets the ball rolling."

Landscaping is a passion Bob inherited from his father growing up in Detroit.

"Every Saturday, the first thing we would do is go to Frank's Nursery and get flowers or bushes or whatever," Bob said. "I would have to cut the grass this way, then go back and cut the other way and always with a push mower. It was something my dad loved and I picked it up from him."

The residents of Westland Woods are certainly glad he did.

## Youth given probation for shaking baby

A Westland baby-sitter who severely shook a 1-year-old baby boy, leaving him paralyzed on the right side, has been placed on probation for three years.

The only other penalty imposed on Brian Spencer Sant, 17, was a fine of \$495 for court costs, said a Detroit Recorder's Court clerk.

The sentencing, announced Wednesday by Judge Leonard Townsend, came as a disappointment to police, who had hoped that Sant would serve at least some time in jail.

Sant was convicted of second-degree child abuse during a bench trial in May before Townsend. The judge ruled that Sant was responsible for violently shaking baby Damon Evans while baby-sitting him on the afternoon of Dec. 15.

Doctors had to perform surgery on the baby to remove a life-threatening blood clot from the baby's head.

Sant could have faced a maximum four-year prison term, assistant Wayne County

prosecutor Dan Less said, but Townsend chose to place the defendant on probation.

Police testified that Sant admitted forcibly shaking the crying baby, who suffered "shaken baby syndrome." The child is permanently paralyzed on the right side, said Westland police Sgt. Laura Moore.

In an interview with Moore, Sant said he initially rocked the 16-pound baby playfully before the crying erupted, Moore has testified in court. But Sant began shaking the baby "considerably harder" as the child's head "was shaking back and forth," Moore has testified.

The baby's foster mother, Sandra Thom of Westland, testified that Sant occasionally cared for her children for 1½ years. At the time of the incident, Thom had three adopted children and three foster children ranging in age from 5 months to 7 years.

The three foster children have since been taken away from Thom, Moore has said. Thom also has lost her foster-care license, Moore said.

## Police confiscate cocaine, marijuana

Police seized just over half an ounce of cocaine and multiple ounces of marijuana after executing a search warrant at a Garden City home Wednesday.

Officers from the Western Wayne Narcotics Enforcement Team conducted the raid at the home in the 7000 block of Lathers.

Six people, including a Westland woman, a Livonia man and a Plymouth man, who were present at the home were detained and issued citations for loitering. All were released pending further investigation.

Separate charges of possession of cocaine and marijuana with intent to deliver will be sought against two residents of the home, brothers 39 and 35, said an officer handling the case.

The brothers were the main target of the investigation, the officer said, which stemmed from information received from concerned citizens. Scales and four guns, one handgun and three long guns, were also confiscated in the raid.

Narcotics officers are expected to seek a warrant against the men later this week.

## Former chiropractor heads to Vegas for 'last hurrah'

Ah, the lure of Las Vegas. The city in the sun tugs at the heartstrings of fun worshipers everywhere, even those in the twilight of their lives.

On Wednesday, Stephan Grace of Westland packed his bags at the Angela Hospice in Livonia and headed for the airport. There, accompanied by daughter Janet Gidley of Westland and a nurse's aid from the hospice, the 82-year-old retired chiropractor from Old Redford boarded a flight to spend three days in the famous Nevada city.

Nothing unusual here, except that Grace, suffering from colon cancer that has spread to his liver, spends his days at the hospice because he knows he has only a short time to live.

"If I'm well enough to manage one more big splash, I will call it my 'last hurrah,'" Grace said before taking off for the airport.

Grace is not a lifelong gambler. In fact, he never set foot into a Las Vegas casino until about 10 years ago, after his eyesight failed him and doctors declared him legally blind.

"When I lost my eyesight, I couldn't bowl, I couldn't read. But I had to have something to do for excitement, so this is where I landed. I play the slot machines. It doesn't take much eyesight to find the slot to put money into."

A friend told him of the fun he had in Las Vegas and, after going there, Grace found himself hooked. In the last decade, he has flown there about 10 times, often going to break the tension of caring for his wife of 53 years, Mildred, who is in a nursing home suffering from Alzheimer's disease. Sadly, she has never accompanied her husband on his Las Vegas trips.

When his cancer became terminal two months ago, Grace moved into Angela Hospice, 14100 Newburgh north of

Schoolcraft, which is owned and operated by the Felician Sisters of Livonia. Once there, his health perked up and he gained weight. So he began planning this one last trip to sun city.

To see if he had enough stamina, he recently crossed the Canadian border to play the slot machines at the newly opened Windsor Casino. He decided he

could make the trip if attended by a nurse's aid, and hospice employee Pricilla Murdock agreed to accompany him.

In Las Vegas, Grace planned to stay at one of his favorite spots, the posh Flamingo Hilton. It's his favorite casino because he's won money there at least three times. "Most everyone likes to go where they've won before."

Repeat sex offender faces trial

A Westland man was ordered bound over for trial on a charge of being a sexual delinquent after waiving his preliminary examination in 21st District Court last week.

Leroy Rothwell, 32, of Westland is being prosecuted under a state statute that allows enhanced penalties for habitual sex offenders. If convicted, the law allows an indeterminate sentence of one day up to life in prison.

Rothwell was charged with exposing himself to a youngster at United Christian School on March 30.

At the time of the incident, Rothwell was already on probation for seven 1993 convictions in Garden City including indecent exposures and indecent and improper conducts, all involving young children. One of the conditions of his probation was that he not go around schools

and playgrounds. An incident exposure charge filed under city ordinance, with a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail, was dropped and a substitute charge was filed under state law. That charge is also a misdemeanor but carries a penalty of up to one year in prison.

Since Rothwell is also being prosecuted under the sexual delinquent statute, the state misdemeanor will be tried in Detroit Recorder's Court. If convicted, the next hearing would be regarding the enhanced penalties for felony sentencing.

With his first conviction for indecent exposure in Romulus during 1980, Rothwell has had a number of criminal convictions in Wayne and Washtenaw counties including larceny, receiving stolen property, indecent exposure, and robbery, which was a plea bargain down from the original armed robbery charge.

CITY OF GARDEN CITY ORDINANCE NO. 84-692

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SUBSECTIONS 181.603 AND 181.639 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GARDEN CITY.

THE CITY OF GARDEN CITY HEREBY ORDAINS: That the following three definitions be added to Subsection 181.603 of the Code of the City of Garden City.

1. FENCE MATERIAL: A low barrier of natural or artificial materials located near the perimeter of a residential lot. Artificial materials commonly include but not limited to construction material such as wood, wire, metal, or any other material or combination of materials commonly used in fence construction. Natural materials commonly used for erection of a border treatment include deciduous and evergreen shrubs.

2. FINISHED APPEARANCE: Because of the design or construction, one side of the fence has a more finished appearance than the other, the side of the fence with more finished appearance shall face the exterior of the lot with the following exceptions:

a. When a fence is approved for construction under a joint permit as provided for in this subsection, the joint permit holder shall determine the preferred location of the more finished side of the fence along the common property line of the joint permit holders.

b. In the case of an existing property with a fence, the more finished side of a fence shall be attached to the perimeter of the property with the fence which was constructed most recently.

3. CONSTRUCTION TO THE USE OF ADJACENT PROPERTY: No fence shall be erected where it would prevent or unreasonably obstruct the use of adjacent property, nor shall a fence be erected where it would obstruct or prevent the unobstructed use of an existing driveway or other means of access to adjacent property.

4. FENCE MAINTENANCE: Fences shall be maintained in good condition. Rotten or broken components shall be replaced, repaired, or removed. An applicant, owner, or person in charge of maintenance shall be responsible for the repair and maintenance of the fence and provide an attractive finish.

5. CONSTRUCTION TO THE USE OF ADJACENT PROPERTY: No fence shall be erected where it would prevent or unreasonably obstruct the use of adjacent property, nor shall a fence be erected where it would obstruct or prevent the unobstructed use of an existing driveway or other means of access to adjacent property.

6. FENCE LOCATION: Fences shall be constructed within the setbacks prescribed in this section.

7. FENCE HEIGHT: Fences shall be constructed within the height restrictions prescribed in this section.

# Candidates won't rule out Social Security cuts

Two candidates for the 13th District U.S. House seat told a group of senior citizens last week that Social Security and Medicare ought to be considered for cuts to eliminate the federal deficit.

Cynthia Wilbanks, an Ypsilanti Township Republican, and Fulton Eaglin, an Ypsilanti Democrat, appeared Wednesday at the Canton Place senior citizen apartment house along with all but one of the other candidates for the seat being vacated by William Ford. (Belleville cable company businessman Dennis Fassett, a Republican candidate, was absent.)

The 13th District includes Canton and Plymouth townships, Plymouth, Westland, Garden City, and the southeast quadrant of Livonia.

One of three questions asked of all the candidates concerned So-

cial Security and Medicare.

Eaglin, an attorney and former paratrooper, said that budget cuts to eliminate the deficit "can't just come from defense. It has to come from every existing program. You've got to take something from everybody. The reality is that it's got to come from us all."

Wilbanks, who worked for former U.S. Rep. Carl Pursell, noted that entitlement programs account for more than 50 percent of federal spending. "Our children are going to be faced with increasing difficulty if we are not able to look at entitlements," she said.

The other candidates seemed to oppose cuts in entitlement programs.

"If it wasn't for Social Security my mother would have relied on her six children," said David Gelsa, a Wayne Democrat and longtime chief of staff for Rep. Ford. "What we should do cut is federal government waste in the

Pentagon."

Lynn Rivera, an Ann Arbor Democrat and state representative, answered that health care should become an additional federal entitlement program. "We should have a system that cares for all citizens," she said. "You should be able to move from job to job and retain your coverage."

John Schall, a Wayne Republican and former PTA president, said that health care "should be for everyone," but he opposes a Canadian-style system. "We should do a little more research and get something everybody can take advantage of," he said.

John Schall, an Ann Arbor Republican, said that Social Security and Medicare are untouchable. "We need to be protecting Social Security and Medicare," he said.

Another question asked candidates what their top priority would be as a representative.

Wilbanks said spending con-

cerns her most. "Government spending is out of control. We can't afford to pass on massive amounts of debt to our children and grandchildren."

Kassel said spending is his highest priority, too. "We can't spend more than what we're getting."

Schall said his priority is to "get the economy moving and create jobs. That means bringing spending down. The time has come for real fiscal discipline."

Rivera said she wants to "help our community re-establish trust in government. We're there to serve the community, not to serve ourselves."

Gelsa said, "Education is a primary necessity," but he also mentioned financial responsibility. Every U.S. representative, he said, should cut an equal share of the federal deficit from spending

in his or her district.

Eaglin said reducing the federal deficit is his top concern. "Until we can get rid of it, we can't argue about social programs. We can't argue about defense."

The candidates were also asked what they view as the most pressing foreign policy issue.

Schall said the United States needs an overarching philosophy governing its relations with other countries.

Kassel said U.S. military forces shouldn't be used where they're not welcome. He used the United States' involvement in Somalia as an example. "The United States of America comes first," he said.

Wilbanks said the U.S. needs a foreign policy "framework," but has none. "The president and his advisers are not doing us any favors by giving us a vacillating policy."

Eaglin said, "The No. 1 issue is, 'Where do we fit in the global economy?'" Eaglin also praised the North American Free Trade Agreement. "NAFTA has been shown to be a good thing for our country."

Rivera said, "We're still investing far too heavily in the Defense Department." She also said she opposes U.S. intervention in foreign affairs. "I don't think that role (of world cop) has served us well," she said. "I don't think we should pick it up again."

Gelsa tended to agree. "We have to really watch where we put our big food and big mouth, or we might wind up with our foot in our mouth," he said.

The primary elections will be held Aug. 2. Wilbanks, Schall, Kassel and Fassett are seeking the Republican nomination. Gelsa, Eaglin and Rivera are running for the Democratic nomination.

## Candidates warned on sign placement

The Michigan Department of Transportation is worried about the safety hazard campaign signs can create.

MDOT is asking for the cooperation of candidates in ensuring safety is not compromised when placing campaign signs.

The driver's view of traffic and pedestrians can be obstructed by signs of any type.

To protect public safety and property, MDOT has established criteria for the placement of those temporary signs along state trunklines.

Signs outside the right of way must comply with the Highway Advertising Act. Copies of MDOT criteria and the Highway Advertising Act are available from MDOT. Call (617) 373-7683.

Permits through the appropriate city, village or township are required to place banners over state trunklines.

Signs removed by MDOT from state trunkline right of way will be held for the candidate and may be claimed within seven days from MDOT.

## Ann Arbor fairs draw top talent

What's hot in the world of art? Find out at the festival filled with fun, music, entertainment, and of course art.

The Ann Arbor Art Fairs roll in Wednesday through Saturday, July 20-23, offering nearly 1,000 exhibitors working in an array of mediums from painting, drawing, sculpture, ceramic and printmaking to photography, glass, metal, jewelry, mixed media, wood and fiber.

If you're into one-of-a-kind clothing you'll find plenty of hand spun, woven and painted wearables at the four-day art extravaganza drawing 500,000 visitors annually.

The fair is actually three separate fairs in one — the Ann Arbor Street Fair, State Street Art Fair, and Summer Art Fair sponsored by the Michigan Guild of Artists and Artisans.

"The Ann Arbor Street Art Fair is known to select those artists, emerging as well as established, on the cutting edge," said Susan Froelich, coordinator.

Judith Fitzpatrick specializes in fine jewelry with an elegant edge. Mixing metals and semi-precious stones, the Bloomfield Hills jeweler designs and crafts contemporary rings, earrings and pins with geometric and architectural influences. She brings her wares to Booth No. A189 on East University at the Ann Arbor Street Art Fair, now celebrating its 35th year.

"Out of 22 jewelers in the fair, Judith is the only one from Michigan. That in itself speaks very highly of her work," Froelich said. "Her rings are very unusual in shape, asymmetrical. It's a very clean, contemporary perspective."

Fitzpatrick, who does wholesale and retail jewelry shows around the country, works primarily in 14K and 18K gold as well as sterling silver to craft limited production pieces. For those who desire something that's customized, she creates work in all of the above metals plus 22K gold and platinum.

Mixing metals is the wave of the future, said Fitzpatrick who frequently combines gold and silver in the same piece of jewelry. Consumers have grown tired of rigid standard forbidding the wearing of silver and gold together.

"Today, people are more interested in two metals, different combinations of metals. Colored gemstones have been gaining in popularity all along."

With an eye to the future, Fitzpatrick's latest series of conforming rings allow the wearer to mix, match and stack rings with simple, but elegant lines. A popular seller is her matching wedding rings.

"There's a lot of couples out there getting married and they're looking for something out-of-the-ordinary, something that says they're love is special."

Fitzpatrick's customers buy more yellow gold than white. Rings and earrings are her most popular sellers. When designing a piece, she takes into consideration all of these elements along with what the market will bear. What trends, if any, does she see in future jewelry sales?

"People are more oriented to yellow gold, but it's an individual preference," she said. "In general, people don't invest a lot of money in fashion trends. They want a piece of jewelry that's somewhat timeless."

Fitzpatrick's designs reveal a quiet elegance. For

Going to a Jimmy Buffett concert isn't as easy as buying a ticket. It takes a tropical wardrobe and spirit.

The brightly dressed fans make his shows a spectacle with their brightly colored wear, plastic lobster, shark-finned hats and flying beach balls. They clasp their hands over their heads in the form of a shark fin during Buffett's song "Fin."

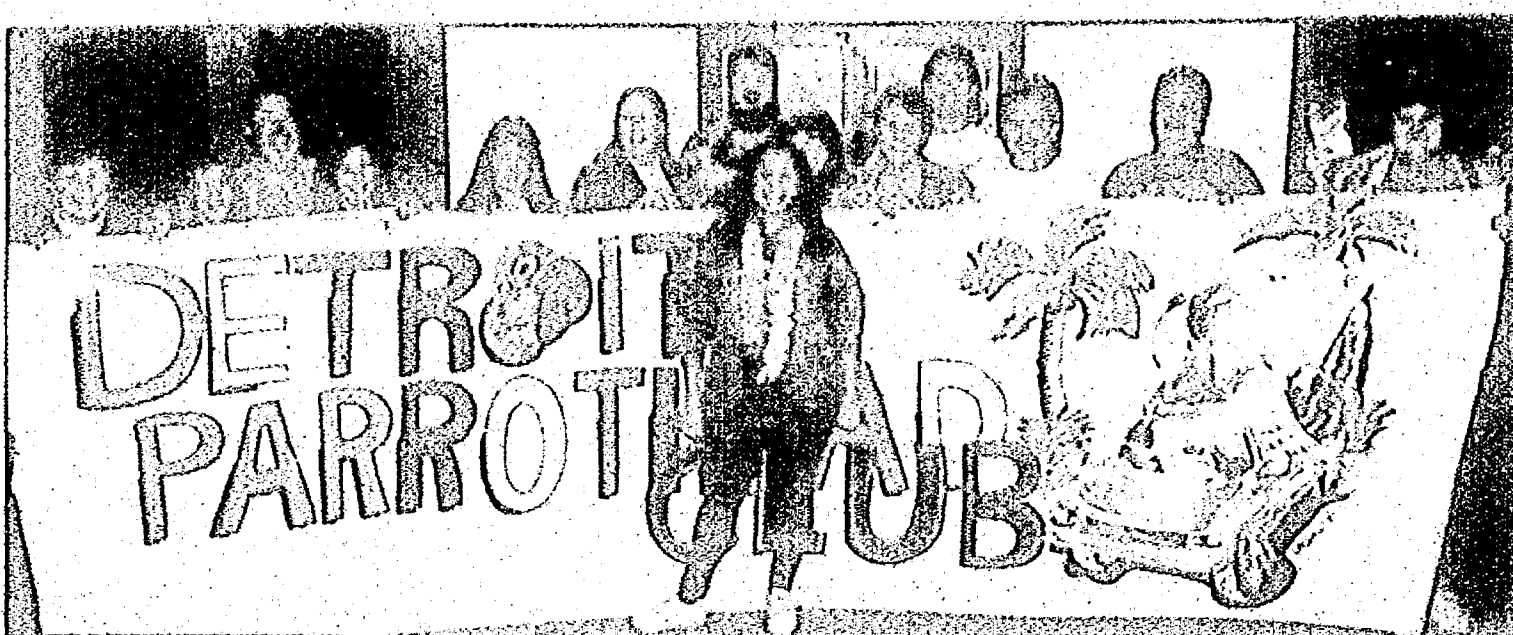
Marlene Buffa will decorate her car to make sure that Buffett fans know how serious she is about her admiration for the singer. Along with being the Midwest Tropical Appreciation Society/Detroit Parrothead Club president, she's also a fan. Her car will bear fliers and posters complete with tear-off information about her club while she dons the group's T-shirt to help advertise it. The organization's banner will be flying above several other member's cars.

Club member Paul Saloka of Sterling Heights has found no better way to honor his musical hero than to dress up as a human volcano, modeled after the Buffett song by the same name. The costume, which consumed 5 1/2 feet of his 5-foot 8-inch body, was constructed from cardboard and was complete with flowing lava made from plaster mold compound, he said.

"More than likely, I will wear it to the concert. When Buffett comes to town, you know you can go crazy for awhile," Saloka said.

This fun-loving spirit doesn't end with Buffett's shows, however. In the case of Buffa and the 165 members of her group, Buffett's fun-loving spirit is celebrated year-round.

"We like the way his music makes us feel. It's pure escapism and fanaticism and it's fun," said Buffa,

whose resemblance to the singer's name is purely coincidental.

Buffett's shows, which come to Pine Knob Music Theatre in Independence Township July 19-20, are so important to his fans that they have been known to schedule events around Buffett's shows. Buffa, for example, scheduled her wedding to John Schwendler of Phoenix a month before Buffett's shows so as not to interfere.

The appreciation society is one of 28 Buffett fan organizations scattered around North America and one of two in Michigan. (Buffa, former president of MENSA, sure has appreciated Buffett. She has only missed one of his shows since 1979.) She said her group has a different twist to it. Buffett is known for focusing attention on ecological awareness, but the local organization is more socially conscious.

In less than two years of its existence the Appreciation Society has donated canned food and raised \$1,200 for the Gleaners Food Bank through fund-raisers.

Member Tom Wikol of Birmingham said being a Parrothead has allowed him to grow socially.

"It makes you a more well-rounded person not only personally, but socially because you can be around so many people young and old," said Wikol who is a member along with his wife Debbie.

For fun the organization has monthly beach parties at Carlos Murphy's restaurant in Southfield and other locations in Southeastern Michigan. The social focus is what persuaded David McDade of Flint to join the organization.

"I think I joined because of Buffett's music, but Buffett is as active in the community it comes out in a group," said McDade, the club's 30-year-old vice president.

Despite that, it's the music that's drawn the group together. Buffett is known for his easy-going calypso/reggae-based storytelling about simple topics such as drinking a blended tequila cocktail ("Margarita-villa"), eating America's most popular tailgating cuisine ("Cheeseburger in Paradise") and one of the most unpopular days of the week ("Come Monday").

"I like the songs," explains Highland resident Judy Culbertson, 49. "His songs tell stories. It's not the stuff you can't understand. It's good music."

As for Buffett's new album "Fruit Cake," Buffa views the 23rd release as a mix of the past re-packaged for today.

"It's more of a mixture of styles," said Buffa who bought "Fruit Cake" a few days after it was released. "Some stuff on this one sounds like old Buffett, some sounds like new Buffett and some stuff sounds like

'80s Buffett."

"Old Buffett tends to be more acoustic and mid-'80s Buffett tends to be more electric. The new Buffett sounds like he has a 50-piece band even though he doesn't, but it sounds more calypso."

The Appreciation Society's Parrotheads are scattered throughout the state with the largest population centered in the metro Detroit area. Membership also extends into Ohio, California, Arizona and Wisconsin and southern Ontario, Canada, with ages ranging from pre-teen to 60.

"It's unusual for one genre for music to attract such an age span. Most (musical) groups focus on one span of the music market. (Buffett) never intended to be a family show, he's said over and over," said Buffa, who also operates her own tailor-made Hawaiian shirt business called Tropical Tailor.

"All I want is for people to have fun and good clean fun and enjoy themselves and if we can help others in the process that's great."

### "Platinum on Black" various artists

During the past few years, house music as an art form has evolved from its beginning basic synthetic keyboard notes and drum machine-programmed pounding into what can be referred to today as possibly a state of being.

"Platinum on Black" (Irr, 1993) exposes this musical essence by not only compiling the latest European dance hits, but providing substantial evidence of a musical evolution.

The 14-track compilation straddles a fine line between what can be referred to as cutting edge and possibly monotonous and on the other side, providing energetic and fun house music. Each song is appealing in its own dance club ways starting with the gospel gyrating "Love, Peace & Happiness" by Soul Solution, the frenzy marching band symphony of The Goodmen's "Give It Up" and the delicious jerky remix of Gabrielle's "Dreams."

More compelling re-mixes of club veterans Utah Saints ("What Can



You Do For Me") and New Order ("World") are more confusing and much harsher than the original non-dance club remix versions.

"Platinum on Black" represents a wide perspective of musical energy, names and aspects under one solid title and is pushed to its limits with action and strength.

Unfortunately, this release is neither substantial nor compelling, but is jammed packed with empty melodies. When you get right down to it, who cares.

### "Vauxhall and I" Morrissey

Performers are easy targets for scrutiny and Steven Patrick Morrissey shouldn't be naive to this. Since the beginning of his career, the former frontman for the 1980s post-punk band The Smiths has been the focus of allegations about his band's break up, his sexual orientation, and his non-enthusiastic outlook of life — just to name a few.

Now with the release of his fifth solo album, "Vauxhall and I," (Sire Records, 1994) Morrissey states what exactly is on his mind and in essence slaps listeners in the face with his jocular charm.

In the past, Morrissey has demanded that critics examine his works and allow it to stand alone. This time around he exposes more of his thoughts and morbid sense of humor through his typical storytelling-mannered lyrics placed over mid-tempo acoustic arrangements.

In previous releases his royal depression-ness had a way of keeping listeners' attention with creative phrases, but as soon as you think you comprehend his unusual realm of reality,

he hits with an obscure idea thrusting followers into dazed confusion. In "I Am Hated For Loving," Morrissey explains, "I am hated for loving, anonymous call, poison pen, brick in the small of the back again, I still don't belong to anyone — I am mine. I am hated for loving, I am haunted for wanting..." Now who exactly should feel sorry for him? He professes a no-holds barred policy of desire toward an unknown loved one by demanding, "... I am now a central part of your mind's landscape, whether you care or do not. Yeah, I've made up your mind..." In his recent hit single "The More You Ignore Me, the Closer I Get," clever lyrics for someone who demands he has never loved before.

In "Hold On To Your Friends" Morrissey takes a stab at self-rationalization by expressing, "... But now you only call me when you're feeling depressed, when you feel happy I'm so far from your mind, my patience is stretched, my loyalty vexed..." just bear in mind; there just might come a time when you need some friends." Perhaps that lends some insight into "the real" Morrissey?

versatility, some of the earrings have removable drops.

"My design ideas come from all types of external influences: out of nature, architecture, geometric forms. I take into consideration shape and form, and function: I think about scale and proportion and how a piece will look on a certain person."

Unlike many jewelers, Fitzpatrick does not design around a

stone. She begins with the metal. "I use simplistic stones set in a circle or a square. It works in two different methods -- hand-fabricated using a variety of techniques, and by the lost wax casting process."

Fitzpatrick first became interested in jewelry while studying art with George Landino at Groves High School in Birmingham. It was during the two years she

spent in the sculpture department at the University of Michigan, she realized it would be wise to choose a medium with a stable economic future. A year of studies in England honed her technical skills before Fitzpatrick returned home to finish her fine arts degree at Tyler School of Art in Philadelphia. Her professional experience included stints at two Southfield jewelry studios -- Morris Bednarsh Jewelry Design, and Mi-

chael S. Wiegler. Jewelry allows her the best of all worlds.

"I knew I wanted to be in art, but didn't want to be a starving artist. Jewelry is working in a sculptural sort of influence. Europe gave me more of a disciplined and technically oriented approach that was less creative. I came back here to incorporate knowledge, training and creativity. I knew, I wanted to create my

own line of jewelry and sell it." Fitzpatrick's line of Judith Yvonne Jewelry can be found in more than a dozen galleries in

New York and throughout the East Coast. Art Fair hours are 9 a.m.-9 p.m. Wednesday through Friday.

## Just grab and go with tiny purses

**M**y Mom visited from Louisiana last week and accompanied me on this assignment — a quest for the newest mini-bags and clever "wallets-on-a-string."

Now, Mother has always carried traditional handbags, large enough to easily accommodate a makeup case with the requisite compact and lipstick, a checkbook, bulging wallet, photo album and other various paraphernalia. Her purses swung from her forearm until a few years ago when she finally switched to shoulderbags. Mom never has strayed far from a basic Liz Claiborne pocketbook with a good sturdy clasp.

### Prim and proper

It's funny how we can actually remember some of our mother's handbags. Innocuous as they were, I still envision the hard-edged, boxy navy blue number with a handle so small it could only be gripped in the palm of the hand, and the trendy little pink Grace Kelly bag that I borrowed on prom night.

But most of Mom's purses looked alike — lady-like. A good, practical bag might be purchased in white for summer, brown for fall, black for winter and navy for spring. I don't recall seeing an unusual shape, a sophisticated clutch, a sporty basket or a drawstring pouch. I really hadn't stopped to

ponder my mother's purse preferences until we went shopping for miniatures for this column. To my surprise, Mom discarded some of her long-held notions about roomy shoulderbags and grabbed a soft leather "triple zip" from the counter at Jacobson's. The "triple zip" (\$22) is a tiny, flat pouch with three separate zippered pockets. "One for my keys, one for change, and the other for my lipstick and a credit card," reasoned Mom. Moreover, this little reticule drapes across the body, a look entirely foreign to my mother, but one that she embraced immediately.

"It's much more comfortable than a fanny pack," she exclaimed, "and just as practical for long walks or sightseeing tours." Plus, she felt her possessions were more secure when attached to a strap across her chest, than when they dangled from her shoulder. This particular bag is even flat enough to hide beneath a blazer or jacket.

### String-a-long

Mini-bags run the gamut from dainty Chanel hat boxes and bejeweled Judith Leiber to actual wallets attached to long straps. Box & Sherm, 6536 Telegraph Road in Bloomfield Hills, displays a huge selection of "wallets-on-a-string." Some are square, some oblong, and most hold a standard checkbook, credit cards, photos, a pen, keys and currency. Some have pockets for other essentials. They range in price from \$28-\$68. The larger versions are zippered organizers or agendas that go from office to the grocery store to dinner (\$70-\$98). Box & Sherm's most popular mini is a

black crochet pouch with a fold-over flap (\$35), and their most exclusive lines include the supple natural leathers of H. Blonsie, the trend-setting Japanese porter bags (\$52) and sculptured Vincenzas.

Other notable and fashionable tiny handbags include the Coach wallet-on-a-string (\$98) and Dooney & Bourke's mini-pouch (\$150) from Saks at Fairlane. Dooney & Bourke also offers an oblong style that holds a checkbook, pen and credit cards (\$165 at Jacobson's). Paloma Picasso designs a distinctive wallet-style bag with three roomy pouches (\$120) and Liz Claiborne's version features a minor, deep snap pockets and a pen holder (\$38). Gail Labelle's mini-backpack is black nylon with a shiny gold closure — very chic (\$96) all from Jacobson's.

— photographed to music and set on dramatically lit stages which tell each fashion's story. The show takes a year of preparation, beginning in April when designers present their fall collection in New York.

JoAnn Young, of the Dayton-Hudson Corporation, based in Minneapolis, directs the show which is also presented to the Minneapolis market.

"People who appreciate the structure and detail of garments from the '40s will really like what's on the runways this fall," she predicted. "Lots of plaids, tweeds, and suits with collar details."



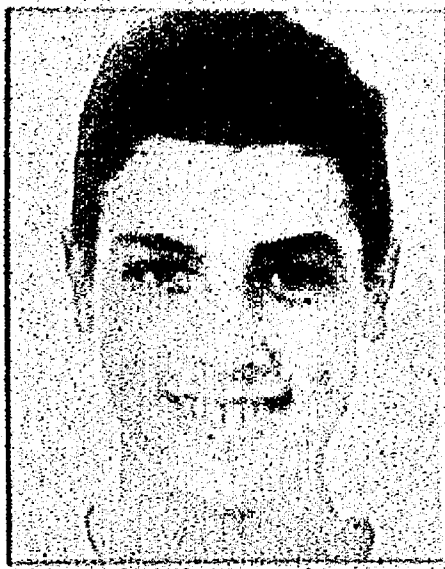


# Host families needed

# Westland City Council makes appointments to library board

Westland library board appointments, which stirred controversy last month, have been resolved with three remaining members being chosen for the new five-member board.

Mayor Robert Thomas said the appointments of Sharon Clark, Richard LeBlanc and Albert Wagner will allow the board to begin planning its first budget as the city moves to build its first-ever public library.

The council had delayed confirming Clark and LeBlanc for the posts last month, citing a potential conflict of interest. But the council confirmed the appointments during a meeting last week.

In Clark's case, some council members questioned whether she should be confirmed because her husband, Carl Clark, is director of the city's public services department. Concerns about LeBlanc emerged because he sits on the Wayne-Westland school board and the city's cable commission.

The mayor nominated Wagner after the council last month rejected the nomination of former council

member Thomas Artley.

A legal opinion from city attorney Angelo Plakas has cleared Sharon Clark of any conflict of interest. LeBlanc could remain on the school board but, under the city charter, would have to step down from the cable commission, Plakas ruled.

LeBlanc has already submitted his resignation from the cable commission. He had to quit that position to serve on the library board because of a city ordinance that forbids members of a legislative body from sitting on the cable commission.

In his opinion, Plakas said he believes the library board would be legally construed to be a legislative branch.

Wagner, meanwhile, replaced Artley as the mayor's choice after the council rejected Artley. Councilman David Cox had argued last month that "no one's political friends or allies" should be appointed to the library board.

The mayor criticized the council for rejecting Artley and called the decision "100-percent politics."

Clark has been appointed to the board for four years, LeBlanc for two years and Wagner for one.

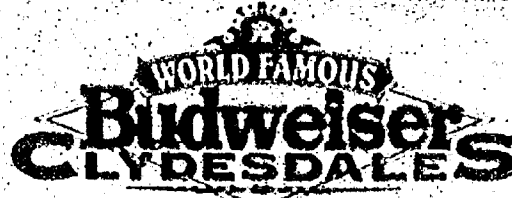

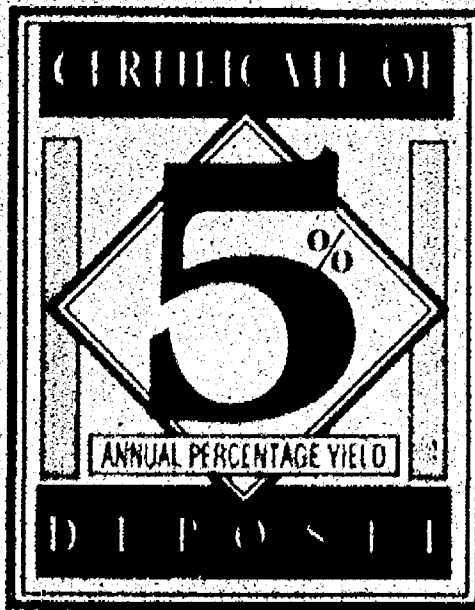

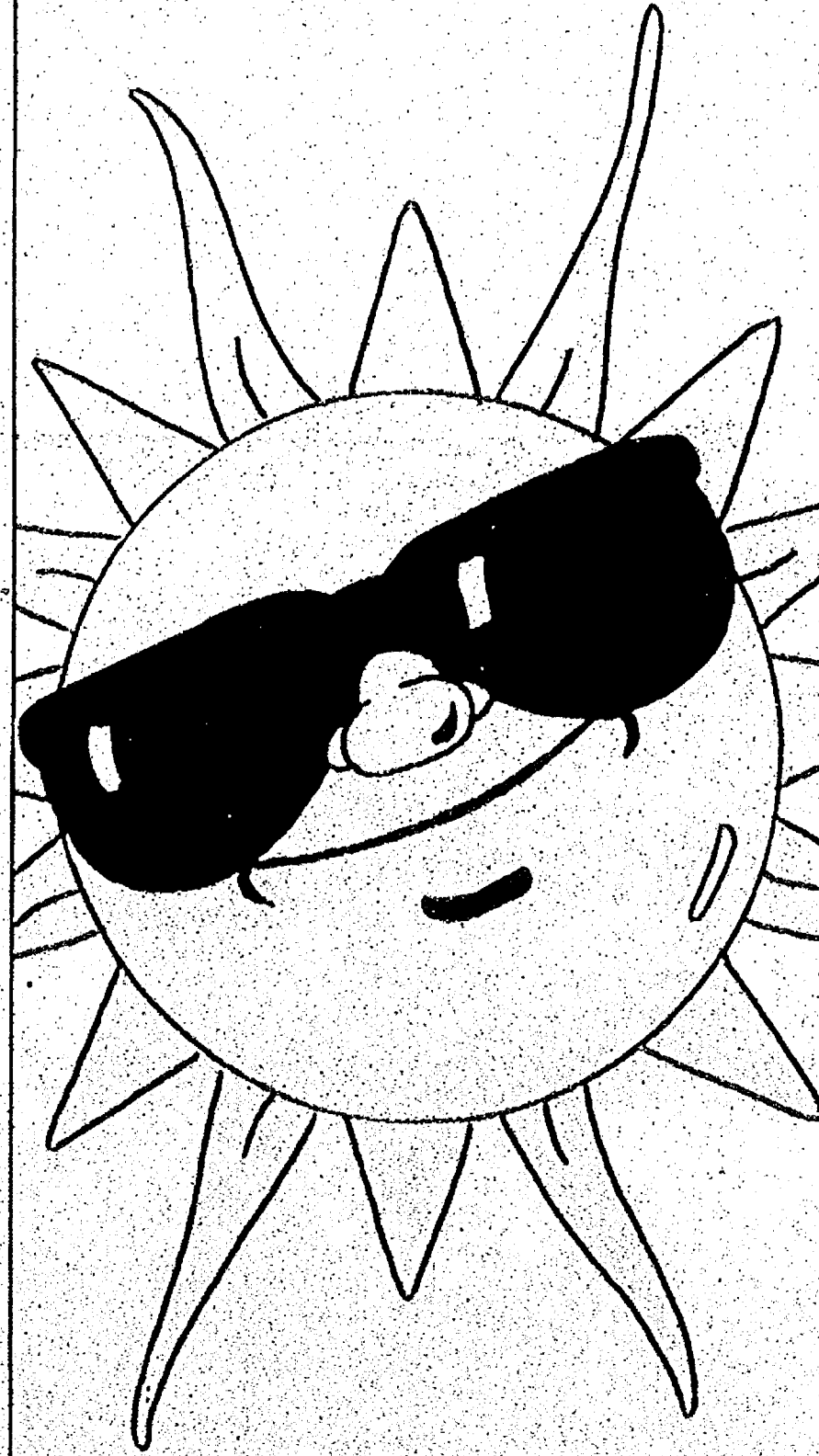

## Holland Grill lights my fire for barbecuing

I love it when I'm proven wrong. Shortly after I flew the coop in Wyandotte, and moved into my own digs, I bought a classic - a shiny new black Weber kettle grill. The sun rose and set around that grill. I was known as the "charcoal king" at the local grocery store.

In the fall, I cleaned, wrapped and carefully stored it away. In the spring I polished it and brought it back to the deck. In the summer I used it, sometimes days in and days out. Many a summer night dinner was delayed waiting patiently for the coals to get that "gray ashen" cover. Never in a million years I thought, would I ever choose to own a gas grill.

They flare up, just like my kettle grill, they need maintenance just like my kettle grill, and I could never understand the love of tasting propane-scented ribs on a muggy July night. But I was wrong.

### Converting to gas

You have to understand that I'm a gadget freak. I walk into a store and pick up pot scrapers, measuring cups and key chains with lights on them. Supermarket check-out aisles with all their kitchy gadgets and doodads are to me what a candy shop is to a kid. So when I walked into Denny Wright's HWI Hardware store in Livonia this spring to get a screen repaired, the last thing I ever thought I'd do was walk out with a gas grill.

Not just any grill, mind you, but a shiny new state-of-the-art Holland Grill. I fell victim to Denny's "try-it-you'll like it" offer of ownership. When I told him all the reasons I never wanted a gas grill, he assured me the Holland Grill was different.

Brad Holland, owner of the made-in-America Holland Grill, guarantees no more flare ups. Denny even said "the folks at Holland would buy back the grill if I didn't love it."

The Holland Grill is remarkable - it grills, it roasts, it steams, it fries, it smokes - it's the best gas grill I've ever used. Granted, it's the only gas grill I've ever used. What makes this grill a winner in my book is that secret, patented Holland System drip pan that enhances flavor and eliminates flare-ups.

My love affair with the Holland Grill didn't start as rosy as Denny and the folks at Holland would have liked. The Holland Grill takes a little getting used to.

Since the unit has a drip pan covering the burner unit to eliminate flare-ups, all of the cooking must be done with the lid closed.

As Brad Holland says in his cookbook, "when you're lookin' the food's not cookin'." The inside temperature is preset at around 400 degrees which makes the grill very suitable for cooking steaks and burgers, potatoes, casseroles, biscuits and pastries.

### Indoor oven

I like to think of the grill as an outdoor oven. My first attempt at grilling steaks took a lot longer than anticipated because like most folks, I never read the instructions. I cooked with the lid open. My second attempt at roasting a whole turkey was nothing short of spectacular. Even momma praised the Holland.

With a suggested retail price of over \$600, the Holland Grill shouldn't be one of those impromptu purchases. Wright's Hardware in Livonia, and This Is It Bar-B-Que on Orchard Lake in West Bloomfield are selling their stocks of Holland Grills on sale, and have lowered the price to the \$460 range. But is the Holland Grill really as good as the competition?

I was pondering this question at a party at my Uncle Earl's when I spotted his unused, unopened Father's Day gift - a top-of-the-line Weber Genesis gas grill. I begged Uncle Earl for the opportunity to "break in" his new grill.

While I must honestly say that the Weber performed admirably, my ribs were tinged from the grease flare-up until I realized how to cook them in directly on the grill with one of the burners shut off.

The Janes Gang family doctor, Gilbert Roe of Canton, wondered if the Holland was as good as his Ducano gas grill. After borrowing a Ducano from a friendly neighbor, I found the cooking surface small, and there were frequent flare-ups.

The best way to buy any new gas grill, is to carefully watch a demonstration, ask loads of questions, and if possible, try cooking on it yourself. If you're used to cooking on a charcoal grill, a gas grill will definitely be something that takes a little getting used to.

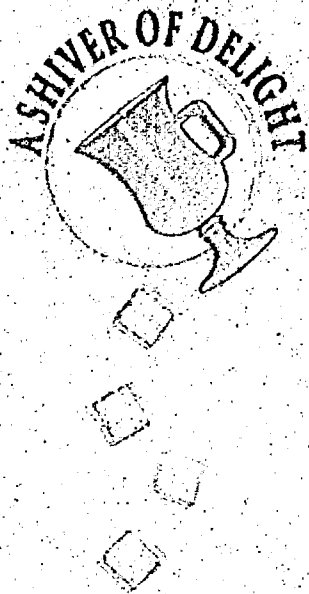

Quench your thirst for something different, yet refreshing with iced coffee. It's this summer's hottest sip. Start with a fresh pot of coffee, then put it in the refrigerator to get cold. Add ice cream, cocoa and other flavorings, whirl in the blender, and enjoy.

As temperatures climb, so does the demand for iced coffees. And with this mandate, as well as an increasing interest in specialty coffees, comes the birth of trendy coffeehouses.

"Iced coffee is a popular alternative to other drinks, such as sodas and alcoholic beverages," said Tom Corey, a manager at Grand Cafe in Farmington.

"Because of the popularity of iced coffee, we offer six different versions of the drink, including two specialties - Iced Caramel Apple and Orange Mint Sipper. These two drinks, created by Grand Cafe employees, can be made at home with regular brewed coffee. Our other iced coffee drinks use cappuccino as the base."

According to Corey, the secret to a good iced coffee is taking the time to let the coffee cool naturally. "Start by brewing a fresh pot of coffee, then put it in the refrigerator to get cold. If you pour hot coffee over ice, it melts the ice and you get too much water in the drink."

Drinking iced coffee is one thing, for many "hip" area resi-

dents, it is also important where you drink this beverage.

The Grand Cafe, which is owned by brothers Bob and Dennis Sakuta, attracts a steady clientele seeking not only its iced coffees, but also its 30 different hot coffees and teas. This in-town, basement-level coffee shop also offers a fairly extensive sandwich, salad and pastry menu.

Kay Laberge of Farmington Hills sampled iced coffee for the first time at Grand Cafe, and was inspired to try it herself at home.

"I went out and bought a cappuccino machine so that we can enjoy this frothy drink cold on hot summer days," she said. Laberge now ices regular brew coffee for another cool taste treat. "I sometimes add different liqueurs to iced coffee when we entertain," she said.

While sipping or munching goodies at the Grand Cafe, patrons can enjoy the various "coffee artwork" - reproductions of famous paintings with a coffee theme added by local artist Janisse Larson. On the peach-colored walls are sayings to ponder while you sip - "No man is lonely while drinking coffee with his friends," and

"Friendship is like money - easier made than kept."

If reading material is what coffee drinkers want, then the Lonestar Coffee Co. could well be the place for them.

Reminiscent of a comfortable home library, this six-month-old downtown Birmingham establishment has 2,000 books lining shelves on the walls. "Our customers are invited to read these volumes while they are here," said Ryan Rosett, who owns the Lonestar with his brother, Jay.

"We are offering a lot more than just a cozy atmosphere and the only coffee roaster in the area. Our store features a full line of iced coffees for the summer, including our newest creations of fat free iced mocha drinks.

"These icy creations are like frozen blender drinks. In California people stand in line for these mocha beverages," said Ryan Rosett.

Lonestar also carries 16 flavors of Stucchi's ice cream and yogurt, as well as fresh squeezed orange juice and lemonade. Low fat and fat free pastries are also offered.

"When we opened the Lonestar we set as our goal to not only offer the best cup of coffee around, but also to provide coffee drinkers with a pleasant atmosphere and social environment."

Atmosphere, Atmosphere.

Atmosphere. Creating a good atmosphere was also the aim of Dominic Ercolani, owner of Espresso Thyself, a new coffee house in Keego Harbor.

"I wanted to combine good food and beverages with old world Italian charm. With the help of local store designer Ron Rea, we have been able to give our patrons a hint of Italy," Ercolani said.

Espresso Thyself serves gourmet coffees and teas - as well as pastries from a number of Detroit area bakeries. It also offers Italian candies, fresh squeezed and nectar juices and homemade Italian soups.

This Oakland County coffeehouse with a "catchy" name is mostly known for its 26 flavors of cappuccino, which can be served hot or iced. It is also known for its entertainment and poetry readings on weekends and selected weekdays.

"Cappuccino doesn't have to be strong to retain its taste when served over ice," said Ercolani. "It just has to be good."

Entertainment, including classical music presentations, is another appeal of most of the area's coffeehouses.

According to some of the owners, their businesses are the bars of the 1990s, and they wanted to create social environments similar to bars. Entertainment has helped them accomplish this.

but you can also use it on chicken, pork chops or baked beans.

# Give meats the brush-up when they're nearly done

The key to great barbecues is knowing when to apply the sauce. "Traditional tomato-and molasses-based sauces can burn if brushed on too early," said barbecue expert Rich Davis.

Even this season's new non-red sauces with honey mustard and honey teriyaki blends need to be

applied during the last few minutes of cooking, unless you're marinating food first.

To ensure great barbecue flavor next time you "put on the sauce," here are some tips from K.C. Masterpiece.

Barbecue meats — (cooked indirectly) — brush with barbecue

sauce during the last hour of cooking.

Smoked meats — brush with barbecue sauce during the last 30 to 45 minutes of cooking.

Grilled chicken — brush with barbecue sauce during the last 10 minutes of grilling, turning once.

Fish — brush with barbecue

sauce during the last 5 to 10 minutes of grilling.

Hot dogs and sausage — brush with barbecue sauce the last 5 to 6 minutes of grilling.

Grilled steaks and chops — brush with sauce during the last 3 minutes of grilling (after the meat has been turned for the last time).

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 6 cloves garlic, crushed

Clean and set aside ribs. Combine remaining ingredients and mix well. Add ribs, cover tightly and refrigerate 6 hours, turning frequently. Grill ribs as desired. Brush on your favorite barbecue sauce just before removing ribs from the grill. Serves 4-6.

Use freshly brewed coffee, preferably double-strength. (Use two times more coffee than usual for the same amount of water.) The coffee should be prepared no more than three hours in advance. Allow the coffee to cool before using it. It can be stored, covered, in the refrigerator.  
To keep the ice cubes from diluting iced coffee, make creamy coffee cubes. Stir in half-and-half or milk into leftover coffee; pour into ice-cube trays and freeze.

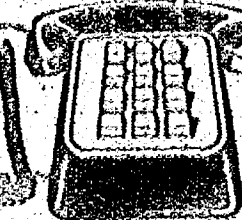

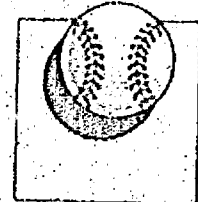

## Crusader coach locates talent

It still seems like Jerry Abraham is playing catch-up.

Who can blame him? He no sooner finishes a banner season of coaching Madonna University's volleyball team to the NAIA Tournament — its first-ever appearance — than he is forced by necessity to step in as coach of Madonna University's softball team, which he also guides to the NAIA Tournament — its first-ever appearance.

A remarkable pair of achievements, without doubt. His reward? No dillydallying — now he must recruit for two teams. And make no mistake: As impressive as his teams' performances were, they are in the past.

Cook is an over-and-done-with. Like Abraham said, "If you're doing your job right, you should always be up there."

Translation: No rebuilding, just re-stocking.

And if anyone thinks Abraham is struggling as he tries to coach two programs, they'd best reconsider. The Lady Crusaders' softball team (40-11 in '94) lost four very important starters: pitcher Dawn Terrasi, who does have one semester of eligibility remaining; second baseman Mndi Armstrong and third baseman Jill Burt, both four-year starters; and catcher/outfielder Ronnie Ronco.

Another starter, left-fielder Holly Jondro, can return but her future is somewhat in doubt.

#### Tough to replace

"Those are four players we'll miss a lot," said Abraham, hoping Jondro won't make it five.

And yet, with the help of a strong supporting cast — assistant softball coach Al White and Brian McClain, whose official title is volleyball AAU director — Abraham has put together a top-notch recruiting class.

"It's time to reload," said Abraham. "We've had a nice recruiting class. Basically, we got everybody I wanted."

To help offset the loss of Terrasi (who won 32 games last season), the Crusaders have signed Shanna Strong out of Tiffin Mohawk High School in Sycamore, Ohio, and Angie Van Doren from Royal Oak Dondero. Besides possessing exceptional athletic skills, both boast better than 3.6 grade-point averages.

Strong was all-state in her division, which is the smallest of three in Ohio. She was ranked the top player from her area; she guided Tiffin to the state finals this season, where it lost 3-2 in eight innings.

"She doesn't have the speed of Terrasi, but she has a variety of pitches, a great change-up and good game

sense," said Abraham. "She's more of a finesse pitcher."

Van Doren was scouted by White. "She throws hard right now," said Abraham. "She's big and strong — we're excited about her." At present, Abraham projects returnee Lynda Welch (8-1 last season) as his first-string pitcher, with Strong and Van Doren next in line.

#### Catching up

Another of Abraham's bigger concerns was at catcher. He's found ample possibilities: Sophia Pappas, who played for Abraham at Taylor Center High School; Julie Wood, a volleyball player for Abraham at Madonna who starred at Harper Woods Lutheran East High School; and perhaps Jamie Cook, an all-Observer selection from Westland John Glenn.

Pappas never missed a game in four years at Center. She was all-Tri-River League twice and all-Mega Conference this season, hitting .475. Her career average was .419. "She was one of the best players downriver," said Abraham. "She's an excellent all-around catcher. She'll compete for a starting position."

Wood, entering her senior year at Madonna, was all-state at Lutheran East. She wanted to play last season for Abraham but couldn't squeeze softball into her schedule. "I can tell you she competes hard at everything she does," said Abraham.

Cook was first-team all-Observer at catcher, but Abraham expects her to switch to either second or third base, or possibly the outfield. Cook hit .350 this season, driving in 18 runs, and she struck out just eight times in 100 at-bats.

"She'll fill one of the starting positions at second or third," Abraham predicted. "I compare her with (short-stop Michelle) Birchmeyer, the way she attacks the ball offensively. I like her arm, and I like her versatility. I think we got a prize in her."

In Erin Comment, from Monroe St. Mary's, Abraham has a two-sport recruit. She was recruited for softball, but decided to play volleyball, too. "She'll bid for a starting outfield spot," said Abraham. "She needs to improve her hitting, but her speed on the bases, her range in the outfield and her glove are all good. She brings a lot of options with her."

Another of White's recruits is first baseman Courtney Senger, from Marine City. In winning four letters, Senger compiled a .300 career batting average. Her all-around athleticism makes her valuable. "She has a great game sense, good defense, and a good on-base percentage," said Abraham. "And she makes contact."

With his loss of so much experience, Abraham is concerned with his team's hitting ability. "You just can't replace four-year starters like Mandi and Jill Burt," said Abraham.

Perhaps not, but he's made a strong effort to.

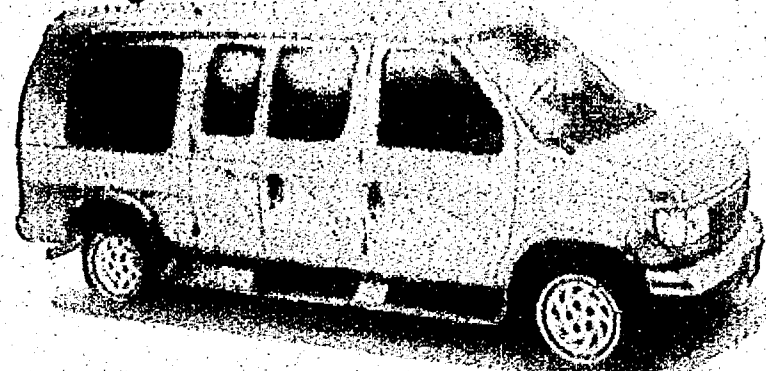

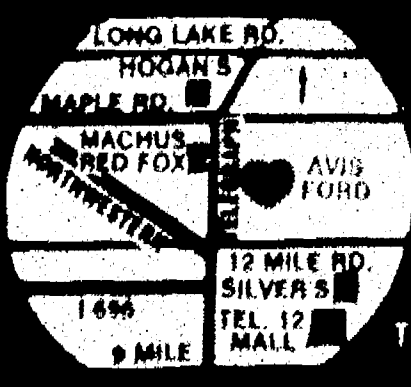


