Teen faces trial in killing



A witness testified in court that he was only five feet away from Kirk Taylor who was shot to death Aug. 3 while trying to break up a fight between two youths in the middle of a Norwayne street. An 18-year-old was bound over for trial on first-degree murder.

"The shooter shot him," was the way Danny Halcomb Thursday described the shooting of Kirk Taylor, trying to break up a fight among youths in the middle of a Norwayne

neighborhood the week before. He was about five feet away from Taylor and Shawn Earl Nepsey, 18, of Wayne, charged with first-degree murder and felony firearms. Halcomb testified Thursday in a preliminary examination held in the Westland

District Court of Judge Gail McKnight.

Halcomb testified that Taylor, 30, was trying to break up a fight between two youths in the middle of Alcona Court, near Merriman and Glenwood.

At one point, 15 to 20 youths, many armed with baseball bats, approached Taylor before Nepsey reportedly pulled out a gun and shot the victim four times.

Another witness, Michael Polgar, 13, testified that Nepsey gave him the gun after the shooting with both fleeing the scene. He admitted that while

he heard the gunshots, he didn't see the defendant shoot Taylor.

The youth said that Nepsey passed the gun to him shortly after the shooting with the gun eventually hid on the side of a neighbor's house after unloading its bullets, wiping off his own prints and later putting it in a bush.

The youngster later led police to the gun's location.

After the preliminary examination, McKnight bound Nepsey over for trial in Recorder's Court, in which he

Teachers plan middle school changes

Big changes in Wayne-Westland schools are keeping teachers hopping and hoping to make students' transition from a junior high system to a middle school system as smooth as possible.

In an effort to ease sixth-, seventh- and eighth-graders into this new educational environment, teaching teams have been assembled and a workshop is being planned.

"These children are used to an environment where they have one teacher at a time and the rules are all the same," said Charlotte Sherman, coordinator of the summer workshops.

"The teams will be working together to come up with common rules making things easier for the students."

As examples, Sherman said they could come up with common headings for papers, classroom rules, common term paper topics, etc.

Job training program helps special ed pupils

A job training program for Wayne-Westland School District special education students is so popular that some employers want it expanded to include general education high school students.

The program, Community Based Instruction, has been revised and toughened to require special education students to spend at least six months at a work site to qualify for a high school diploma and graduate.

Those were two key points of the program presented by school officials at last week's Westland Chamber of Commerce membership luncheon program.

CBI will start with its new thrust in the fall when ninth-graders are moved to the senior highs from the former junior highs.

John Fulton, work study coordinator at Wayne Memorial High School, and Dan Burka, his counterpart at John Glenn High, said that some 27 businesses in Westland and Wayne have committed to the program and accepting special education students as temporary employees. Fulton noted that the program is important because a study shows that 70 percent of new jobs will be entry-level positions in the service industry. Burka added that ninth-graders entering the CBI program next term will learn universal work skills, socialization and how to get along with others in the workplace. Author to sign books at Garden City store

Naomi Clark, owner of a Garden City book and tape business, believes strongly in self-improvement.

To demonstrate that, Clark will welcome Yu-ling Ching, author of the biography "Master of Love and Mercy: Cheng Yen" to her Tales and Tapes Bookstore, in Sheridan Square, on Ford between Middlebelt and Henry Ruff, Garden City, from 5-8 p.m. Friday, Aug. 18.

Clark said Ching's book, the life story of Dharma Master Cheng Yen, a Buddhist nun who's been called the "Mother Teresa of Asia," serves as inspiration to all. Yen, who directs a program to bring medical services to Taiwan and relief to needy all over the world, has been nominated for a Nobel Peace Prize.

"Recently, she was awarded the Eisenhower Medallion for her contributions to world peace.

"It's a very inspirational book, and the book signing gives people more of an understanding of the book and the author," said Clark, who's a bit of an inspiration herself. Clark purchased the bookstore 1 1/2 years ago at the age of 78.

"I have a real desire to help people. A lot of people need help at this time. They're searching for ways to improve their lives and are going in for ways of helping themselves. A lot of people come in just to browse. What they buy depends on where they're at."

Yen is into helping the less fortunate.

Beginning with her childhood, Ching traces the forces that inspired Yen to search for a form of Buddhism reflective of her compassion and inner strength.

Yen presides over a small Buddhist temple in Taiwan as

well as the Buddhist Compassion Relief Tzu-Chi Foundation and its three million followers.

She and her disciples have provided medical, clothing and housing assistance directly to people in need all over the world.

They've established hospitals, colleges and research centers in Taiwan, revitalizing educational, social and cultural programs.

Through interviews with Yen's followers, Ching relays stories about the lives Yen has touched, and the ones changed dramatically.

The northern Michigan author said of Yen, "It has never been so easy for me to admire anyone." That's why Ching's donating all royalties from the book to the Tzu-Chi Foundation.

Born in Qingdao, China, Ching and her family moved to Taiwan after World War II.

The 278-page hardcover published by Blue Dolphin Publishing is Ching's fifth book.

It was while living in Taiwan that she began to write. Ching is now one of the leading Chinese authors of Southeast Asia with 15 books in Chinese.

Today, she is also a well-known writer in English with the novels "Children of Pearl," "Temple of the Moon," "On Wings of Destiny," and "River of Lanterns" to her credit.

No stranger to publishing,

Ching translated American novels into Chinese for a Taiwanese publishing house after graduating from law school in Taiwan.

Now in her late 50s and still writing, Ching lives in Bark River in the Upper Peninsula with her husband, four cats and a dog.

Self-help and inspirational books are the only ones that Clark stocks at Tales and Tapes Bookstore.

From "Life After Divorce" to "How to Talk so Kids will Listen," each book aims to help a variety of people ranging from battered wives to molested children as well as those simply seeking a greater sense of self-esteem. Cassette tapes, for rent and sale, offer the opportunity to better yourself while driving in your car.

Book topics such as herbs, aromatherapy, and homeopathy are meant to move readers toward a total healthy lifestyle: spiritually, mentally and physically.

In addition to Ching's book signing, Clark is offering several workshops starting in September including ones on self-esteem, meditation, and pro-natal loss being held in conjunction with St. John Hospital. For information, call 421-5544.

Group aims to fight substance abuse

In the tradition of MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving), Peter Narsisan says it's time for fathers to take up the fight.

The retired autoworker is spearheading a new organization he calls DAADD (Dads Against Alcohol and Drug Destruction).

"Mothers have already been doing their part and it's time for fathers to wake up and play a role in protecting children from alcohol and tobacco companies, and from drug dealers," said Narsisan, a Westland resident.

Father to grown children, Narsisan became especially concerned about the issue of substance abuse among young people when he heard Dearborn Heights resident and MADD advocate Bob Totten talk about his experiences when his son was killed by a drunken driver.

"I feel fortunate that my children were not victims of alcohol

and tobacco peddlers," he said. "I think I can do something about this."

Narsisan has championed several causes in recent years and has won some success. He led an effort called Noah's Ark in June. He gathered various farm animals and cash and took them to Haiti to encourage development of that island's farm economy.

He also started the group Michigan Humane Society for Children, which pushed for father's rights in cases of divorce.

As leader of this new group, Narsisan hopes to gather fathers who want to play a role in combatting the influence alcohol, tobacco and drugs play in the lives of young people. He hopes DAADD will focus attention on the need to regulate further advertisements aimed at children glamorizing substance abuse of all kinds.

"MADD is doing a great job of working directly in the classroom,

I think the fathers should stick with working with legislators to limit advertisements," he said. "We must help younger generation from getting sucked into alcoholism."

If interested in joining DAADD, which Narsisan said in the process of filing for non-profit, tax exempt status — persons may call him at 421-1966.

Man is sentenced in traffic fatality

A Westland man was sentenced to 5-15 years in prison for driving drunk and causing the death of a Lincoln Park man.

Christopher Cohterro, 27, pleaded guilty last month before Detroit Recorder's Court Judge Leonard Townsend.

Cohterro was driving on Warren Road, just west of Wayne Road, on Nov. 8 when he struck a car driven by 23-year-old David Hartley. The Lincoln Park man suffered multiple head injuries and

died eight days later at the University of Michigan Hospital.

Westland police officer Dan Karrick said the defendant had a blood-alcohol level of .21, more than twice the legal limit.

On the day Cohterro's trial was set to begin, he pleaded guilty to the charge.

Cohterro was remanded to Jackson State Prison, where officials will determine where he will serve out his sentence.

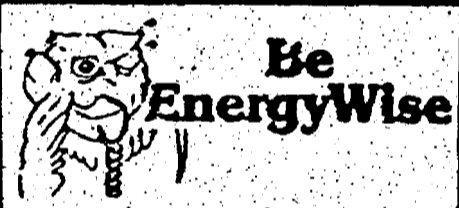

Hamilton sticking here — official

Ownership of Alexander Hamilton Life may have gone south, but the company and its 390 jobs are staying in Farmington Hills for the "indefinite future."

At least that's what one company official promised following news Thursday that Alexander Hamilton Life and its individual life and annuity business had been acquired by the Jefferson-Pilot Corp. of Greensboro, N.C. for \$575 million.

Thomas Ritter, vice president of government affairs and public relations for Household International of Prospect Heights, Ill., the present owner, called the the sale "positive news."

"We're being purchased by a company... whose primary function is the insurance business," said Ritter, a Farmington Hills resident.

With the acquisition, Jefferson-Pilot will become a \$14 billion company and be one of the top 20 companies dealing in insurance and annuities in the nation, Ritter said.

As far as the Farmington Hills facility — that red brick colonial edifice on 12 Mile Road, east of Farmington Road — staying occupied by almost 400 employees, Ritter said the future looks good.

"Yes," he said, "it does for the indefinite future... at least for a year, possibly two years. The issue of human resources has yet to be examined."

Alexander Hamilton, the 12th largest taxpayer in Farmington Hills, had a positive presence in the community under the leadership of Richard Headlee, the company's president until his retirement earlier this year.

Headlee, an unsuccessful candidate for governor, took an interest in local civic affairs as well.

The annual State of the Cities Breakfast, featuring talks by the city managers and school superintendent, has been held in the Alexander Hamilton dining room recent years.

"Alexander Hamilton has been a supporter of the Chamber of Commerce and the community since... well, since before I came here," said Jody Soronen, director of the Farmington/Farmington Hills Chamber of Commerce.

"Everyone I've ever worked with who had anything to do with Hamilton has been friendly and fun to work with," she added. "I hope some of those individuals stay in place."

The Alexander Hamilton Life Insurance Co. of America received its state insurance charter in 1964 and in 26 years was ranked in the top 100 life insurance companies in North America.

At 25th anniversary ceremonies on May 5, 1989, an 11-foot bronze statue of Alexander Hamilton, the company's namesake and the first treasurer of the United States, was unveiled in the building courtyard, as numerous community leaders watched.

Terry Sever, then mayor of Farmington Hills, read a proclamation that said in part:

'Alexander Hamilton Life's motto, 'Someone in Here Cares,' philosophically identifies its personal connection to the community, to the people it services and to its employees, and reflects its commitment to the high ideals and virtues that strengthen our society.'

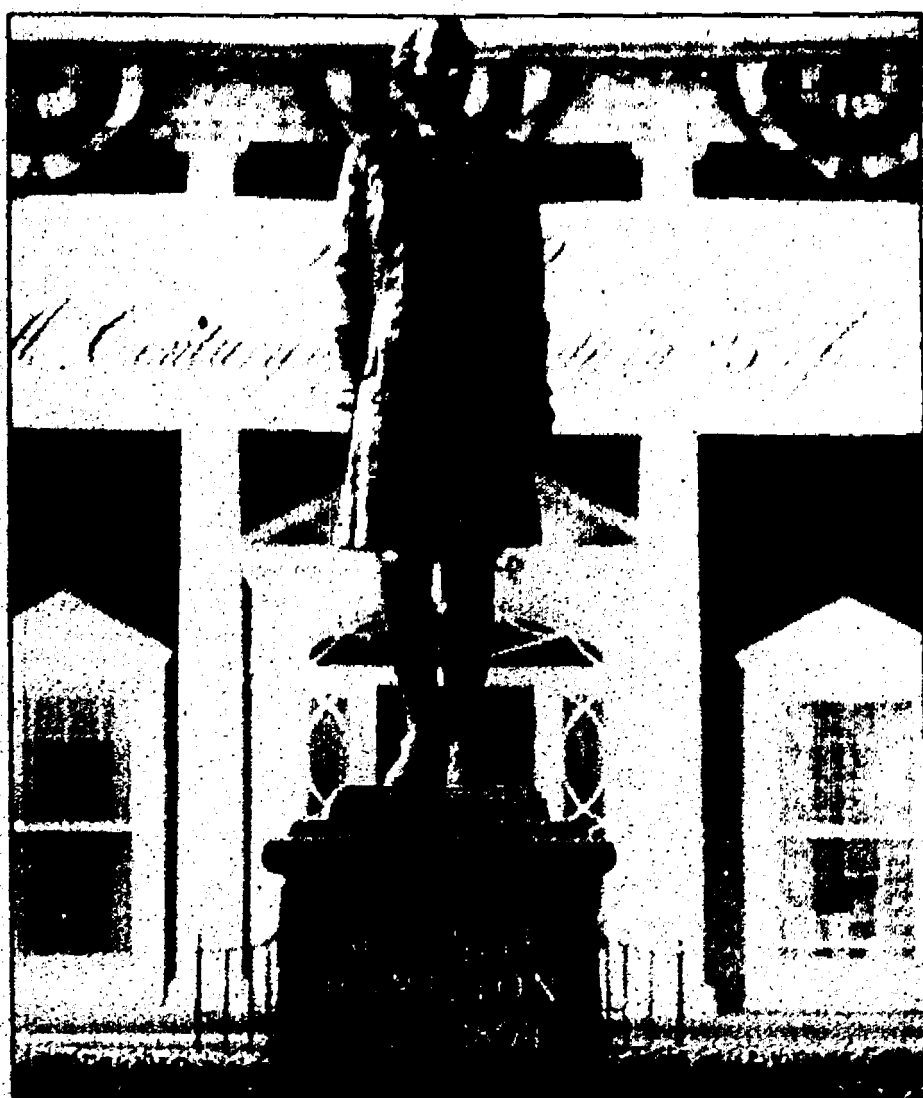
For current Alexander Hamilton policy holders — 330,000 nationwide and 30,000 in Michigan — "the transaction will be virtually unnoticeable," said Lawrence Bangs, Alexander Hamilton's president and CEO.

"All policy holder assets will be preserved and due to the financial strength of Jefferson-Pilot, policy protection will be strengthened," Bangs added.

According to company officials, the purchase of Alexander Hamilton enables Jefferson-Pilot to strengthen its presence in the Midwest, North and Northeastern United States, as well as broaden its base distribution channels throughout the country.

Jefferson-Pilot is already widely recognized for its activity in the South and Southeastern regions of the U.S.

Household International, owner of Alexander Hamilton since 1977, is a provider of finance and banking services in the U.S., Canada and the United Kingdom. According to William Aldinger, president and CEO, the decision to sell Alexander Hamilton was part of an effort to focus Household International's in the consumer lending area, its main interest.

Intriguing 'Suspects' keeps you guessing until the end

From the beginning you know it's gone way wrong. On the boat where a heist has just taken place, a mysterious figure douses the deck with gasoline while another man, injured, looks on. A flick of a match and the ship turns into an inferno.

How the caper crumbles is at the heart of "The Usual Suspects," a complicated thriller about five guys who unite for a fateful bit of larceny. It opens Friday for an exclusive run at the Maple and Main Art Theatres.

Flashback several days earlier. Five guys, small and big time hoodlums, get dragged into a New York police station on suspicion of hijacking a truckload of guns. Most are strangers to each other, but by the time they're sprung, they've hatched a plan that takes them to the West Coast.

Giving away the twists and turns that follow wouldn't be fair, but the boys do get involved with the legendary Keyser Soze. Some say he's the devil; others are skeptical that he even exists.

Gabriel Byrne, who specializes in downbeat characters, plays

Keaton, the most notorious of these hoodlums. Verbal Kint (Kevin Spacey), the quick-talking brains of the outfit and a cripple, sees little of the coldblooded killer that the police insist Keaton is.

As sole survivor of the failed boat heist, Verbal is dragged in for questioning by a relentless police inspector (Chazz Palminteri) and it's in this sparring, with two stage-trained actors, that the performances in "The Usual Suspects" really shine.

Byrne can play this kind of part in his sleep and appears to do so on several occasions. The others (including Stephen, least talented of the busy Baldwin brothers) don't have enough personality quirks or background to make them stand out from the crowd.

Producer/director Bryan Singer, a recent winner at Sundance, approaches the movie with a certain amount of flair. He uses slow zooms in the interrogation scenes

and places his actors at the edge of the frame, as if he's afraid that he'll lose his audience if his shots grow too static.

Maybe I've been spoiled by the films of Quentin Tarantino, but Christopher McQuarrie's dialogue doesn't read all that cleverly. Sure it's hardboiled and hot-headed, with well-placed profanity, but often self-consciously so.

With its intentionally confusing narrative structure, "The Usual Suspects" certainly keeps an audience on its toes. But at the heart it's really no better than a superior episode of one of TV's current crime dramas.

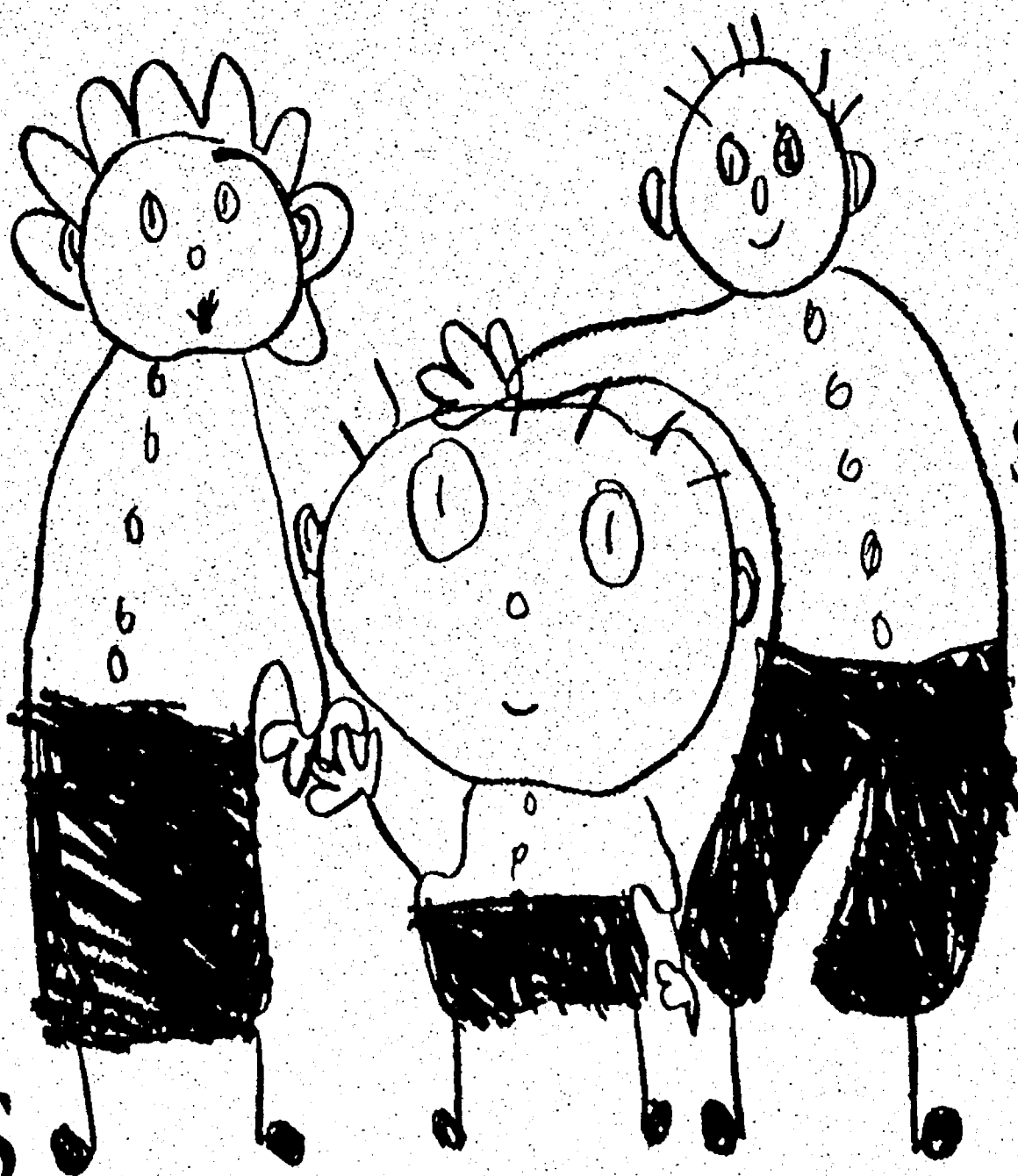

Tricky Lyme Disease diagnosis spurs hearing

Tired. Achy. Feverish. The symptoms followed the Troy eighth grader into high school. "I was always fatigued and had aching joints. I kept thinking I was getting the flu all the time," said Angela Beyer, now 17 and starting her senior year later this month at Troy High School.

Beyer saw 10 different doctors before being treated for a diagnosis of Lyme Disease, a bacterial infection spread by the bite of an infected tick.

A stumbling block to physicians finding the cause of her ailments is the disease's mimic ability; it is frequently misdiagnosed in its later stages as lupus, multiple sclerosis, chronic fatigue syn-

drome/Epstein-Barr, arthritis or syphilis.

Yet even in its early stages, Lyme Disease is tricky to identify.

"It's really tough to diagnose, especially after the red ring (bull's-eye) goes away. And sometimes there's not much of a rash (or ring), or it's in a place on the body that the patient can't see," explained Dr. Dean Dalbec, medical director of the emergency department at Crittenton Hospital.

The rash, often resembling a bull's-eye ring, isn't always present on the skin either. For fair-skinned people, it's common only 60 percent of the time, and for some people the early sign of the disease appears as a bruise.

"You don't feel the tick crawling or biting, and it's only poppyseed-size. The ticks really love

to be on the ground in a shady, humid area, and you can find those conditions anywhere," said Tom Forschner, executive director of the Lyme Disease Foundation in Hartford, Conn.

Not every tick carries the infection agent, *Borrelia burgdorferi* (Bb).

But for people who become infected, early detection and antibiotic treatment curbs the progress of Lyme's effects.

Since 1980, the U.S. has recorded 71,373 cases of Lyme Disease, according to Lyme Disease Foundation statistics. The highest case numbers are New York (27,461), Connecticut (9,731) and New Jersey (6,952). Michigan had 528 cases as of June 1995.

Critics of the statistics believe the number of Lyme Disease cases is considerably higher.

The possibility of under-reporting of Lyme Disease prompted Republican state Reps. Penny Crissman of Rochester and John

Jamian of Bloomfield Township to organize public hearings to examine how Lyme Disease is tracked and reported.

Oakland County Executive L. Brooks Patterson is slated to join the state lawmakers at one hearing. His daughter was diagnosed with Lyme Disease at age 17 after battling fatigue and extreme weight loss.

The hearings are from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 22, at the Rochester High School Auditorium, 180 South Livernois, Rochester Hills; and from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 24, at the Willard Harris Auditorium, Genesee County Administrative Building, Third Floor, 1101 Beach Street, Flint.

People wishing to give statements or testimony should provide that in writing (in advance of meetings) to Miti Curry, administrative assistant to Rep. Crissman, State Capitol, Lansing, MI 48913.

"If Lyme Disease is under-reported, it's going to be underfunded in terms of research," said Forschner, who heads the only national voluntary health organization dedicated to Lyme Disease education, advocacy and research. Beyer will be among the expected 200 people to attend the special hearing in Rochester. She said she hopes one out-

come resulting from the hearings will prompt more doctors to look for Lyme Disease.

Local residents wanting more information on Lyme Disease can attend monthly Lyme support group meetings the first Thursday of each month (7 to 8:30 p.m.) at the Troy Public Library, or call the Lyme Disease hotline at 800-886-LYME.

A SIMPLE EXTRACTION
When an erupted tooth must be removed by the process of simple extraction, the dentist will first desensitize the area with an injection of local anesthetic. Then, it is usually a matter of loosening the tooth in its socket by gently rocking it back and forth with forceps and lifting it with elevators. These instruments loosen the hold that the periodontal ligament has upon the tooth and stretch the remaining alveolar bone of the tooth socket. Once it is loose, the tooth is removed in one piece. After the socket is cleared of any debris, inflamed tissue, or cyst, bleeding is controlled to the point where blood will coagulate to form a clot which must remain undisturbed while healing progresses.





Reader wants to get started on sourdough

Juliette May of Troy called to request a recipe for sourdough starter. Making starter is a two-step process. First, you need to create the base starter. Then you need to feed it for a few days. Rye flour is one of the best starters to make because rye flour is highly responsive to the fermentation process. Here's the basic recipe. Regular all purpose flour can be used, but organic stone ground is preferable.

RYE SOURDOUGH STARTER

- 1/2 cup water (spring or bottled is best)
- 2/3 cup rye flour
- 1 teaspoon dry yeast

In a tall 2-3 quart plastic container with a tight-fitting lid, stir together the water, flour and yeast. Scrape down the sides with a rubber spatula. Cover tightly and place in a moderate (74-84 degree) room for 24 hours. Do not stir with anything metal. On days 2, 3 and 4, stir in 1/2 cup of water and 2/3 cup of flour on each day. Stir with a wooden spoon or rubber spatula until well mixed. After the fourth day, the basic starter will be ready to use.

If not using starter immediately, refrigerate for up to three days. If you wish to continue, add 1/2 cup water and 2/3 cup flour every three days. Makes 6-7 cups starter.

■ An anonymous reader called requesting information on how to take a basic baked recipe and make it in a different size.

If you begin with a muffin recipe, it can easily be made into loaves or bundts. Decrease the temperature of all loaf or cake recipes to 350 degrees F. Decrease the liquid (water or milk) by 1/4 for making muffins in a loaf pan. You will also have to increase the cooking time significantly. For best results use a cake tester or long wooden toothpick or skewer to test for doneness.

For a bundt pan, you can easily double a standard recipe for 12 muffins, and of course, cooking time varies. For best results, the bundt should be tested for doneness in the same fashion mentioned above. Be careful; if a recipe calls for preparation in an 8-inch square pan, and you decide to make it in a 9 by 13-inch pan, the resulting product will be dried, crisp, and possibly burnt.

■ Bob DeMarco of Southfield needs a basic vanilla ice cream recipe. It can't get much more basic than this Bob. Stir in fresh fruits just before the churning stops, if desired.

BASIC VANILLA ICE CREAM IN A CHURN

- 4 cups heavy cream, divided
- 3/4 cup sugar
- Pinch salt
- 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla (or the seeds scraped from a 2-inch piece of vanilla bean)

Scald, but do not boil, 1 cup of heavy cream. Remove from the heat and stir in, until dissolved, sugar and salt. Chill. Stir in vanilla and add remaining 3 cups of heavy cream.

Pour into a churn and freeze according to manufacturer's directions. Makes about 5 cups, approximately 9 - 1/2 cup servings.

Chef's secret: a few drops of rose water, some crushed peppermint stick or chocolate are great additions.

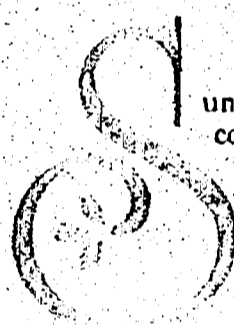

SIMPLE PORCH SUPPER
SUMMERTIME JOY

Summertime, when the cooking is easy. At least it should be, especially if you want to spend less time in the kitchen and more time on your porch.

Betty and Bob Ryan of Plymouth know there's something special about a big, old-fashioned front porch and a summer breeze that makes food taste better. Their new front porch, completed in June, has become their favorite place for morning coffee and casual entertaining.

"It's also great to watch thunder and lightning storms from," said Betty.

The Ryans, busy parents of 11 and 13 year old girls, like to keep their get-togethers with friends simple. When asked her idea of the perfect porch supper to serve guests, Betty said "I'd probably make hot and sexy potato salad and a fresh fruit salad. I'd stick to something like cold chicken drumsticks. Finger food."

Betty's sexy potato salad recipe comes from Audubon, Pennsylvania, their former home state. Although it requires taking your stove out of its summer hibernation for 30 minutes, the results are worth it.

"It's warm and it's good," said Bob. "It's a real nice combination, not overly spicy."

Rob Fisher of Bloomfield Hills, an agricultural consultant, doesn't mind a little spice in the summer, especially when it comes from his garden. He likes it even better when his wife Marcy makes her famous Grilled Herb Chicken and serves it in their large, breezy screened in back porch.

It's all part of a porch lifestyle, according to Rob. "Sitting on the porch you see dirt, so you put in a garden. Marcy cooks from the garden, so she makes all kinds of recipes," he said.

Marcy, a writer of children's books, is creatively random about her choice of herbs. "Because I just go out in the garden, pick whatever herbs are there and throw them on the chicken," she said. "Sometimes I'll put basil pesto on the chicken or rosemary and thyme or oregano." She uses the same herbs on salmon steaks with the same delicious results.

Because of Rob's profession, the Fishers are homebound in the summer. They don't mind, since they consider their porch the equivalent of a summer home. With four children, ages 9 to 15, plus family and friends who like to visit, there's always lots of activity, and lots of good food.

"A typical porch dinner would be gazpacho, grilled chicken with whatever herbs I have that night, and vegetables - eggplant, zucchini, summer squash or red peppers," said Marcy.

She suggests brushing the vegetables with teriyaki sauce and sprinkling them with a little kosher salt before grilling. And unless you don't mind losing a veggie or two to the hot coals, always grill them on a non-stick tray. "Vegetables are done when they appear translucent," she said.

Roberta Grandier doesn't quite have a porch on the Birmingham home she shares with husband Bob and their three small children, ages nine months to five years. She has a Florida room. However, she does have a porch mentality when it comes to entertaining and loves serving guests in her backyard. Her specialty is desserts, and she likes them simple and fruity.

Of her blueberry tart recipe, she said "It's very homemade, delicious, not something you would find in a bakery or grocery store. It goes with anything or it's good by itself. I make it often, two a week in the summertime. One for us and one to give away."

Grandier, who recently attended a porch desserts cooking class at the Community House in Birmingham, said her recipe is an heirloom. "It's family recipe. It was published years ago in some Cleveland cookbook. It's my mom's. She's the best cook I know."

When asked if she had any plans of building a porch, perhaps one day giving her blueberry tart a proper summer home, Grandier said "Absolutely. My husband has high hopes for that Florida room. We have plans to change that room into something airy."

Friendship blossoms with flavorful vinegars

Barbara Klaserner and Julie Stumbaugh were ahead of the times 10 years ago when they started Jabars Complements, a line of fruit-flavored wine vinegars.

Now, flavored vinegars are very popular, even trendy, and their business is growing.

The two Milford women create and manufacture their products from a commercial kitchen in Walled Lake making Jabars another blossoming "Made in Michigan" food industry. To their line of vinegars, they have added marinades and sauces, dip mixes, seasonings and even barbecue sauces to offer a complete, flavorful complement to dinner tables.

"We feel we've been really guided by God in this effort," Klaserner said. "Neither of really used vinegars much in cooking, but it just felt like a good thing to try."

The ladies met each other in a career orientation class. Both were in the middle of divorces and trying to get their lives on track. They gravitated to one another immediately and have been friends ever since.

"We were the only 'old' people in the class and we both liked to cook and had cooked for our families," Stumbaugh said.

"We really didn't have a lot of other skills so we wanted to find something we felt comfortable with."

Klaserner and Stumbaugh have definitely found their niche here. Jabars vinegars are made with all natural ingredients, including a "goodly" helping of real wine.

"The vinegars you buy in the store don't really make use of wine," Stumbaugh said.

Beautiful to look at, the bottles are filled with the liquid vinegar as well as the fruit flavoring. The lemon lime vinaigrette has slices of lemon and lime and whole herb stems. The peach vinaigrette has slices of the fruit resting on the bottom of the bottle.

Attractively presented, the dressings are also tasty and versatile. Their best sellers, the lemon lime vinaigrette, peach wine vinaigrette and raspberry wine vinaigrette, are great on fresh greens, fruits and pastas. They also work as delicious marinades for ham, chicken, duck, beef and pork when mixed with a little oil.

When they decided to expand their business, they experimented with dried ingredients to create "rubs" for meats, poultry and fish, and mixes that could easily be made into dips for fruit, vegetables or crackers.

They purchase their ingredients locally and they are mixed and packaged in Walled Lake.

Their marinades are sold under the label Pepper Tree Square; and their newest effort, barbecue sauce, should be available soon under the label Road Kill Roy.

Currently Jabars Complements are sold at Vic's World Class Market in Novi and Beverly Hills, Papa Joe's in Rochester, Strawberry Hills in Farmington Hills and Jacobson's department stores.

Baby okra, and other reader-requested recipes

An anonymous caller requested information on okra — a lovely, tender, sweet tasting vegetable that is slippery and slimy. It can be found year-round, but is most abundant during the summer.

Pick okra in the its baby stage. The torpedo-shaped pods vary in length, between 2-4 inches for best taste. Purchase it with no signs of spotting or moldling. Check for dryness or flabbiness. Okra keeps poorly and should be used within a day or two. It can be steamed, boiled, pickled, sauteed, deep-fried, braised or made into a soup or salad.

The tiniest, baby fresh okra, if you're growing it, should be

blanched and served like asparagus. Sliced and added to soups during the last 10 minutes of cooking, okra will thicken with remarkable power.

Here's a tasty recipe.

OKRA, TOMATOES AND ONIONS

5 ounces bacon, cut into a small dice
1 large onion, cut into a medium dice
1 pound young okra, rinsed and patted dry
1 pound plum tomatoes, peeled, seeded and chopped (about 6)
½ cup water
Pepper to taste
Minced parsley for garnish

Gently cook bacon in a heavy skillet or flameproof casserole until well browned. Skim out pieces with a slotted spoon and reserve. Add onion to fat, drain off a little fat, if desired, and cook until onion is soft, about 7-8 minutes.

Trim off caps of okra and cut okra into ¼-inch slices. Add onions to tomatoes and water in non-reactive saucepan. Bring to a simmer. Stir in okra. Cook, partially covered, over moderate heat until okra is tender, about 10 minutes. Toss with the bacon and add pepper to taste. Sprinkle with parsley and serve hot. Serves 4.

MELBA SAUCE

1 package frozen raspberries (not packed in syrup)
½ cup currant jelly
¼ cup sugar
1 tablespoon cornstarch
Pinch of salt

Combine all ingredients in a stainless saucepan. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and stir with a wire whisk while simmering for 8 minutes. Strain mixture through a fine sieve and chill for at least 1 hour before serving. Makes about 2 cups of sauce.

Looking for an incredibly easy dinner on one of these "dog days of summer" eve? This recipe can be made while camping, and the kids will love it too!

CHEESE FONDUE

2 cups Swiss cheese, cut into small cubes
12 ounces beer, dry white wine, chicken broth or apple juice

1 clove garlic, chopped or 1 teaspoon chopped garlic
3 tablespoons flour or cornstarch
Salt and pepper to taste
Vegetables and bread for dipping

Place liquid in a heavy saucepan and bring to a boil. Reduce to a simmer and stir in garlic. Sprinkle chopped cheese with flour or cornstarch. Stir into simmering liquid. Stir over low heat for 4-5 minutes.

Serve with vegetables — broccoli, cauliflower, carrots, zucchini, mushrooms, pepper strips, etc., and a good, crusty bakery style bread cut into cubes. Serves 4.

BETTY'S HOT AND SEXY POTATO SALAD

6 medium potatoes
1 can (10 ¾ ounces) cream of celery soup, undiluted
1 cup (8 ounces) sour cream
1 cup (4 ounces) shredded mild cheddar cheese
½ cup chopped celery
4 hard-cooked eggs, chopped

1 small onion, chopped
¼ pound bacon, fried, drained, and crumbled into bits

Scrub potatoes and boil in water for 30 minutes. Drain and cool slightly. Peel and cut into cubes. Combine soup, sour cream and cheese in bowl and mix well. Add potatoes, celery, eggs, onion and mix until blended. Spoon mixture into a 13-by-9-by-2-inch baking dish. Sprinkle with bacon bits.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Approximately 8 servings.

BAZIL-PARSLEY HERB PASTE

2 tablespoons walnuts
4 tablespoons olive oil
10-12 fresh basil leaves
3-4 sprigs Italian parsley
1 clove garlic

Thoroughly wash and dry basil and parsley. In a food processor,

chop walnuts, olive oil, basil, parsley and garlic. Spread mixture on chicken or salmon and grill. Garnish with fresh basil leaves.

ROSEMARY-THYME SAUCE

4-6 branches fresh rosemary (set aside a branch)
2-4 branches of thyme
2 tablespoons olive oil
2 tablespoons Teriyaki sauce
1 clove garlic
Paprika and black pepper to taste

Baste chicken or salmon with Teriyaki sauce. For a more intense flavor, marinate for several hours. Pull leaves off rosemary and thyme branches and chop with garlic. Add to oil. Brush chicken with herb mixture.

Sprinkle with paprika and pepper. Grill chicken or salmon. Sprinkle whole rosemary leaves on chicken or salmon while grilling for more intense flavor.

LEMON-DILL MARINADE

Juice of one whole lemon
2 tablespoons olive oil
4 sprigs dill, chopped
1 clove garlic
Salt and pepper to taste

Marinate chicken or salmon in lemon juice and oil for several hours. Spread garlic and dill on chicken or salmon and grill.

ROBERTA'S AND RITA'S BLUEBERRY TART

Tart crust:
1 cup sifted flour
2 tablespoons sugar
Dash of salt
½ cup butter (1 stick)
1 tablespoon white vinegar
Fruit Mixture:
1 cup sugar (or less according to taste)
2 tablespoons flour
Dash of cinnamon and nutmeg
4 cups blueberries (or a mixture of blueberries, raspberries, and blackberries)

To make tart crust — mix flour, sugar and salt. Blend butter into flour mixture using a fork or pastry blender until mixture resembles coarse meal. Add vinegar. Pat dough into a 9-inch springform pan, spreading dough 1-inch up sides of pan. Refrigerate until ready.

To make Fruit mixture: Mix sugar, flour and spices. Toss with 2 cups of blueberries. Place in springform pan. Bake at 400 degrees F. for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Remove from oven and immediately place remaining two cups of berries on top. Sprinkle with powdered sugar.

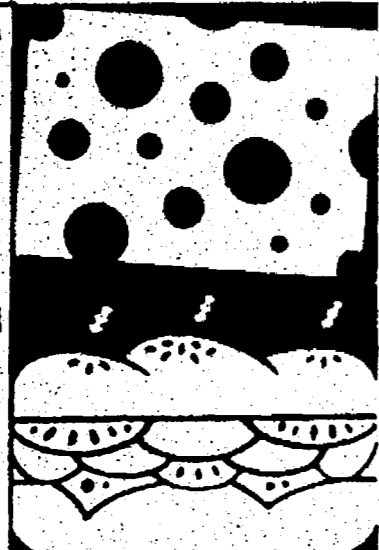

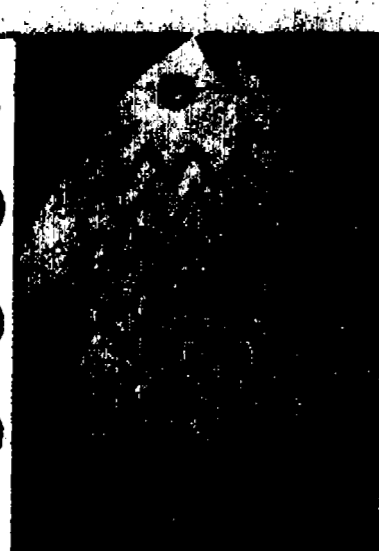

While not as vitamin-packed as their winter counterparts, summer squash like zucchini contain healthy amounts of vitamin C and A as well as other vitamins and minerals. They are very low in calories and sodium. That (coupled with almost excessive availability) is why you'll want to include lots of zucchini in your menu planning.

Serve it simply steamed or broiled with a bit of butter, celery salt and grated Parmesan cheese. Try the classic French ratatouille to use zucchini with eggplant, tomatoes, green peppers and onions, seasoned with garlic, thyme and basil. Slice young zucchini with cucumbers and romaine lettuce in a salad with a light vinaigrette dressing. Or make a goulash of zucchini, onion, mushrooms, lean ground beef, minced green pepper and peeled, ripe tomatoes, seasoned with paprika, basil and parsley.

Grated zucchini is an excellent add-on to baked goods such as muffins, breads, cakes or cookies. The zucchini makes them moist, delicious, and more nutritious, and few will ever guess the secret ingredient.

Don't overlook zucchini as an add-on to your favorite ethnic dishes. Use it as a pizza topping, in a stir-fry recipe, or as filling for enchiladas or crepes. Include shredded zucchini in a frittata or in pancakes — puree it and use in a variety of casseroles and soups. It's great for making relish or pickles as well.

When zucchini grows too large for other uses, stuff it with some of your favorite foods. Simply parboil it until tender, scoop out and discard the pithy part and seeds. Then fill the cavity with diced vegetables, stir-fries, Spanish rice — whatever you'd like. Here's a recipe from the American Institute for Cancer Research.

ZUCCHINI AND TOMATOES

1 small zucchini, sliced 1/4-inch thick
1 small onion, sliced into 1/4-inch wedges
Vegetable oil spray
1 tablespoon water
2 small tomatoes (or 1 large

tomato), cut into small wedges
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
1/4 teaspoon pepper
4 oz. cooked pasta (optional)

Using a 9-inch skillet sprayed with vegetable oil, cook the zucchini and onion over medium heat. Add

water as the zucchini and onion start to stick to the pan. Add the remaining ingredients and cook on low heat for 3 minutes or until the zucchini has reached a desired tenderness. Stir constantly to prevent sticking. Serve over cooked pasta. Serves 2, each serving contains 52 calories and 1 gram of fat.

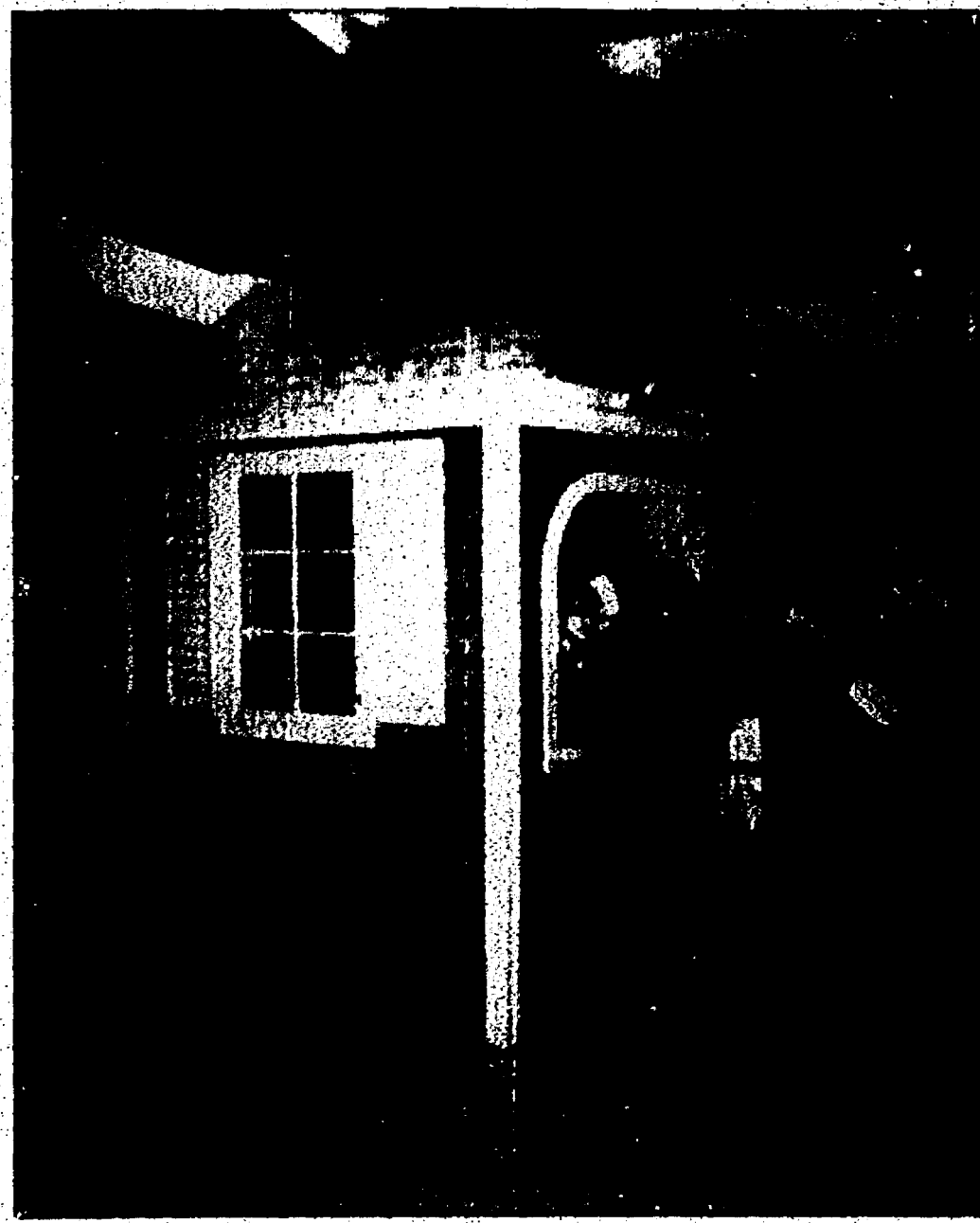
Casual chic

New mall program benefits education



Lakeside, Twelve Oaks and Fairlane shopping centers have a program that turns customer purchases into dollars for education. The malls expect to donate about \$250,000 in supplies and materials to schools around the state.

Because they know how hard educators and PTAs already work, and because they know how tight funds for education can be, and because they want you to shop at their centers exclusively, three shopping malls have come up with a program to benefit local schools.

Called "Be True To Your School," the program runs Monday, Aug. 21, through March 31, 1996, at Lakeside in Sterling Heights, Twelve Oaks in Novi, and Fairlane Town Center in Dearborn. Shoppers simply look for the red schoolhouse booths strategically placed throughout the malls and show their store receipts for credits toward educational materials for the school of their choice.

The "schoolhouses" will be staffed by mall personnel during regular mall hours. Shoppers' receipts will be stamped, returned to them, and applied to their school's running tally. All administrative details will be handled by the shopping centers. Receipts are totaled daily and computer-tabulated reports of credits earned are sent monthly to participating schools.

When "Be True To Your School" ends in March, schools can use their credits to purchase materials from the most-respected educational vendors in the country — National Geographic, PBS Video and Follett Library, to name a few.

"The receipts can come from anything you buy at the mall," explained Ava Demonja of Fairlane. "Like a cup of coffee from the Coffee Beanery, a refrigerator from Sears, a movie ticket from the mall's cinema. The only requirement is that the purchase be made between Aug. 21, 1995, and March 31, 1996." Receipts do not need to be credited the same day of the shopping trip.

Demonja said the "Be True To Your School" program was piloted in both Washington, D.C., and Baltimore for several years before being adopted for the metro Detroit area. She estimated that schools earn a \$1 credit for every \$200 spent, and the amount accumulates quickly since the program runs during the most-shopped months of the year, fall through the holidays.

"We see the youth of today as the

Tel-Twelve welcomes its Media Play

Media Play is open at Tel-Twelve Mall in Southfield with a "concept that's so right for the '90s," according to manager Tom Klein.

"Where else can you go for one-stop entertainment shopping?" he asked. "We've got everything from books to music to computer software to films — thousands of titles all under one roof for everyone in the family."

The Tel-Twelve store is the second Media Play in metro Detroit. The first opened in July on Telegraph in Pontiac across from Summit Place Mall. Two more Media Plays are about to open in Roseville and Utica. The Southfield store completes the

build-out of Tel-Twelve Mall and assures "a whole new population of mall traffic," according to mall manager Richard Fair. "Media Play anchors the south side of the center," he said. At the Tel-Twelve Mall store, the second floor holds the books and children's department, while the lower level houses videos, compact discs, tapes, computer software, motion-picture memorabilia, and a Euro-style cafe.

Media Play offers 40 percent off hardcovers on the current New York Times list of best sellers. In the music department Billboard's Top 25 selections are also discounted every day.

Interactive displays in each department allow shoppers to sample music and preview films and video games.

Media Play plans craft and story hours for children, book signings and poetry readings for adults.

Spokeswoman Kathleen Davies said customers spend an average of 1 1/2 hours in the store during their first visit. "And they buy," she said. "Sales in the 13 Media Play units opened in 1994 averaged \$9.2 million."

Media Play encourages shoppers to linger with comfortable seating and well-marked departments that lead into one another.

"No one pulls entertainment together like we do," Klein said. "We're just so right for the '90s. With approximately 50,000 square feet of sales floor and an inventory of 200,000 stock-keeping units, (SKUs) we're like the rage of retail these days, the superstores."

customers of tomorrow," she continued. "We believe in their education. We want to build a positive relationship with the communities that support us. If all goes well, we hope to continue this program for many years."

Elaine Kah of Twelve Oaks said that during informal discussions about the program with educators and mall merchants, their response was "overwhelming and enthusiastic."

"We knew we had a good thing going," she said with a smile. "Now we hope shoppers think so too. The program was made easy for both educators and shoppers."

The malls are doing all the work! The shoppers just have to shop, and the teachers just have to pick out learning materials in the spring."

Receipts can be applied to any school in Michigan, public or private, grades kindergarten through 12. The schools are expected to order videos, CD-ROMS, computer software, books and other reference materials from the credits earned by their supporters.

Another thrill for Mill — Lions TD

Mill Coleman was on familiar turf again Thursday, contributing a touchdown to a Detroit Lions preseason victory.

When he played for Harrison High School, Mill Coleman threw touchdown passes in the Silverdome but probably never thought he would catch one there.

Coleman, now a free-agent rookie trying to make the Detroit Lions team, was finally on the receiving end Thursday night.

The former Michigan State wide receiver caught his first professional touchdown pass in the Lions 19-3 preseason victory over the Jacksonville Jaguars.

"It was nice to catch my first TD here in front of my family and friends," said Coleman, who knew where to find his parents in the crowd of some 44,000. "When I came back to the sideline, I saw my mom waving to me."

"Obviously, the high school and pro ranks are two different levels, but when you score a TD you still get the same type of feeling inside."

It was Coleman's first game in the Silverdome since he guided the Hawks to a last-minute, comeback win over DeWitt in the Class B championship game six years ago.

Coleman played in three consecutive state finals as the Harrison quarterback (1987-89) and led the Hawks to back-to-back titles as a junior and senior.

"I was joking with my roommate (fellow rookie/wide receiver Kez McCorvey from Florida State) and telling him I worked my magic here in high school," Coleman said. "I told him I made a move at this spot on the field."

The circumstances are different for Coleman now. He isn't the All-American quarterback and star player.

Instead he's trying to impress the Lions coaches with the goal of just making the team.

"All I can do is come out and work hard, do the things the coaches ask me to do and hope they like it," Coleman said. "I try to stay alert and not make mental errors; I just try to do the right things."

"I think I've been having a good camp, but there's no report card or evaluation on how I played. I don't ask (the coaches) 'How am I doing?'"

Coleman was asked if his performance Thursday — two receptions for 22 yards and two punt returns for 14 yards — will make it hard for the Lions to not keep him around.

"You'll have to ask coach (Wayne) Fontes that," he said, "but that's what I'm trying to do."

"I'm trying to make it hard for him to keep me off the team. I've been busting my butt all summer just to

did something college rules had prohibited. He spiked the ball.

"I said to myself 'Hey, I can spike this ball. I'm not in college anymore.'"

"I was really happy; I was on Cloud Nine, but I came back down to earth and put it back in perspective when I got to the sideline."

Coleman reminded himself that it was only a preseason game and, with several still to go, he can't afford to get too comfortable.

"But he does hope results like that register with the Lions coaches."

"It's all about getting out there and showing the coaches something and convincing them I'm capable of being on this team," he said.

"I've been picking things up and working hard. I just want to see my name on that final roster list when the preseason camp is over."

Of the first six plays, Coleman ran his pass routes while the ball went to someone else (five passes/one run). Then came the 7-yard TD toss from backup quarterback Don Majkowski.

On third down, Coleman cut across the middle of the end zone and was

suddenly wide open. He raised his hands to draw attention, but it seemed like forever before Majkowski spotted him.

"The ball seemed like it was coming to me in slow motion," Coleman said.

"I wasn't his primary read. I think he got flushed out of the pocket. He was stepping up to avoid the rush, and I came into his field of vision. I just wanted to make sure I caught it."

After scoring the TD, Coleman, always reserved and never a showboat,

Roberts: Drug tests for preps not likely

Jack Roberts, director of the Michigan High School Athletic Association, recently discussed current sports issues with members of the Observer & Eccentric sports staff.

The two sides covered a variety of topics which will have impact on the 1995-96 school year.

Here are the questions put to Roberts and his responses.

Q: What's the MHSAA's official stand on the national drug policy recently acted upon by the U.S. Supreme Court, which allows school districts to test student-athletes?

A: "Due to the expense involved of testing, no one thinks it's going to become pervasive in the schools. Also, because of the lack of justification of for doing so. There is no evidence that athletes abuse drugs more than other students. In fact, the evidence suggests otherwise; so why would we be testing a group of students who use less? It would be a bit out of perspective."

Q: Lacrosse has become an increasingly popular sport (in certain areas). Is there a possibility it will become a state-sanctioned sport over the next couple of years?

A: "There are between 40 and 50

(lacrosse) teams identified with schools, but fewer than 12 are sponsored by a school. Only when the number reaches 70 or more does the MHSAA sponsor a tournament.

That's only 10 percent, and we're a long way away. Forty or 50 reflects growth, but a dozen is a pretty flat number.

"Long before lacrosse is boys volleyball. There are 100 to 200 schools ready to go. Boys want to play, but

schools may be reluctant to sponsor because they have attained equality in the number of sports between boys and girls.

"There are close to 70 (boys volleyball) teams identified with schools, but not officially sponsored by schools. Nineteen are actually sponsored."

"From time to time, boys want to demonstrate they can play on girls teams. We all remember the time four

boys won the girls (state) bowling championship in Illinois. Hence, the policy in boys are not permitted on girls teams in tournaments."

Q: Most schools in the area and a number of other counties already employ mega conferences or they are looking into them. Is this a trend that the MHSAA is alarmed

Western CC's Ray Bolo state's top PGA senior

Western Golf & Country Club (Redford Township) head professional Ray Bolo made a Jack Nicklaus-like charge in the last two holes to win his second-straight Michigan PGA Seniors Tournament Championship last month at Silver Lake Country Club in Rockford.

Bolo, 62, saved par after a poor tee shot on the 17th hole and eagled the 18th hole to finish the 36-hole tournament with a 2-under-par 142 (70-72). Bolo, the 1994 Michigan Seniors Player of the Year, earned a first-place check of \$2,400.

Bolo, who also won the Michigan PGA in 1988, was one shot better than Johnny Molenda, 58, the head pro at Knollwood Country Club in West Bloomfield.

The way Bolo overcame adversity must have reminded the gallery of some comebacks made famous by Nicklaus, one of golf's all-time greats.

Molenda sank a wedge shot to eagle the par-4, 375-yard 17th hole and take a two-shot lead on Bolo with one hole remaining.

Bolo was fortunate to be only two shots down, considering his tee shot on 17 ended up off the fairway next to a tree about 95 yards shy of the green. Rather than taking an extra stroke, the

right-handed Bolo turned his 9-iron upside down and hit the ball left-handed.

His shot landed short of the green, but a chip got him close and the ensuing putt gave him par.

"God was with us on that (left-handed shot)," Bolo said.

Being two shots down with one hole to play, it appeared Bolo's best hope was to force a playoff hole.

For that, Bolo needed to eagle the par-5, 510-yard 18th hole and have Molenda settle for a par.

Bolo got his eagle, but Melinda lost a stroke after hitting a shot in the water to bogey 18 and lose the tournament by one stroke.

Bolo's tee shot, meanwhile, landed 270 yards straightaway down the fairway. Using a 3-iron, Bolo put his second shot three feet from the cup and he buried his putt for an eagle and the championship.

Bolo said he can adapt to hazards because he plays all the time at Western, which he believes is one of the toughest private courses in the state.

"If you can play this course, you can play almost any," Bolo said. "It has small greens, is long enough, but tight enough off the

When the bowling leagues all take to the lanes again this fall, it will mark the 100th anniversary year of the American Bowling Congress.

It was back in 1895 that those interested parties convened to set the wheels in motion for future generations.

The rules were decided on, bowling lane dimensions, equipment limitations and many other points were settled on, and the die was cast for those of us who came along later.

It did not happen overnight, or really with any haste, but had been hashed over and over for years until the elected officials could come to an agreement.

What it took was strong leadership, and that was exactly what came along in the form of Mr. Moses Benzinger, the president of Brunswick Balke Callender Co., which boasted plenty of skilled craftsmen and woodworkers.

This came about from building wagon wheels, later on pool tables, and eventually bowling equipment.

Probably a piece of hardwood from a tree trunk, turned on a lathe, sanded smooth, followed by a finger hole drilled into it.

At least they had something to work with, a weight limitation and a set of dimensions to work within.

So it was Moses who led us out of the wilderness, and this is the year ABC celebrates its 100th year. The ABC has grown to become the largest sports organization in the world.

It was not easy, as everybody seemed to have ideas of their own as to how this games should go, but under the strong leadership of Benzinger, the game has enjoyed

stability, and perhaps most important of all, they kept it simple, they kept it basic.

A glance back over the years shows that so very little has changed with the exception of ball materials and balances. Sixty feet to the head pin from foul line, remains, along with the 16-pound maximum weight per ball.

So for the first 100 years, ABC should be lauded for keeping everything basically the same.

Women can now join the previously all-male ABC. Why do they do this? I think merely to step up to another level of competition for those like Tamika Glenn (of Farmington Hills), who demonstrates an amazing ability to compete with anyone at any level of play.

So nothing much has changed in 100 years, the official kick-off of the season takes place on Monday, Aug. 21, with the John Gavis Tournament at Thunderbolt Lanes in Allen Park.

about? Or, is it really of no concern as long as the teams are in some kind of alignment?

A: "It makes for fewer, but better thought-out proposals (coming to the MHSAA) because of the diversity and the different size schools within a (mega) conference. There's a better debate before it even reaches the MHSAA."

Q: "There are 38 schools now in the Ottawa-Kent (OK) Conference and 31 in the Macomb-Area Conference."

A: "Because of sub-divisions in mega conferences, same size schools and schools with the same caliber of play are more able to fill out and complete schedules."

Q: "We have no authority for conference realignment. Administrators determine the advantages."

A: "These large conferences may lobby for a point of view, but if they represent a larger group of schools they represent a more reasoned point of view than in the past."

Q: "How does the MHSAA view the state wrestling tournament. The state and individual tournaments seem to greatly conflict with one another. At the (team) district and regional levels at state, it's kind of a joke with teams forfeiting all together and certain individuals saving themselves for the individual tournament. Is there a problem as far as the MHSAA is concerned?"

A: "The problem is no greater than in the sport of baseball. We see schools not showing for district tournaments with less reason than they might have in wrestling."

Q: "If a coach treats it that way (withholding individuals), it's unfortunate because it sends a terrible message that some individuals are greater than the team. Some of the things we try to teach are contradicted by certain practices or actions."

A: "It's up to the coaches to promote their sport. The team wrestling tournament was part of an effort to rejuvenate the sport at a time when the numbers were going down. A coach is absolutely right to be critical

of another coach (when he doesn't send his best kids out on the mat or voids matches.)

Q: "My favorite two hours in high school sports are the semifinals of the team wrestling tournament (at Battle Creek's Kellogg Arena). It's speaks volumes because of its competitiveness. Of all that we have going on, I try not to miss those semifinals of the team tournament. It's terrific."

A: "Has the MHSAA considered holding separate tournaments for public and non-public schools? Has anyone considered changing the transfer rule from sitting out one semester to a whole year?"

A: "I don't think separate tournaments are in our best interest. We strive to accommodate public and non-public schools and make the playing field as level as possible."

Q: "Does the MHSAA need added staff to handle complaints regarding allegations about recruiting and undue influence of student-athletes?"

A: "If you have statewide schools of choice, in effect you're going to have recruiting."

Q: "When you give aid based on academic need and academic performance, it's difficult to investigate, but the MHSAA's Representative Council has added one more requirement to the investigative procedure."

A: "If there is a pattern of disproportionality, all documentation needs to be completed when it comes to providing financial aid records."

Q: "It bothers me when allegations are made, but there's not time to investigate that. It's up to the principals to report themselves."

A: "You really can't devote much time to do it. I get involved personally when the staff is already taxed. When I get a sense of that, I get involved myself."

Q: "Do you think the MHSAA would ever support switching girls basketball to a winter sport or volleyball to the fall?"

A: "We have the best situation with two seasons. There is some discontent in the volley-

ball community, but it would be tremendously divisive if we were to make that change. Probably the majority of our members would be angry about it. I can't imagine why we would make a change that's not in the majority opinion."

Q: "Our girls are the most recruited in the country, because their sports are in season at a different time of year (as opposed to most of the nation). College coaches have more time to devote to Michigan when those sports are in season."

A: "Every year we learn a little more. Late in the year it's better to play on Saturday. It's better to have two games Saturday (at one site) instead of one Friday and one Saturday."

Q: "We won't be doing away with the regions (in favor of a seeding format). It was proposed we award eight more points for beating a AA team, but that was defeated. The more point divisions you have the more pressure you put on conferences."

Q: "Is there any plan to expand the state tennis tournaments to a 4-4 format (four singles and four doubles flights)?"

A: "It was defeated again; it comes up almost annually. One objection is the rich would get richer, and it would be even more difficult for a Lansing-Eastern to compete with an East Lansing type of thing."

A: "There's some thought the regionals are too big and too long now."

Q: "What are some of the MHSAA's goals and concerns for the 1995-96 school year?"

A: "Sportsmanship is always a concern of mine and is always important to me. We've gone forward with the anti-taunting rule that we've picked up and adopted from the National Federation's sports code."

A: "We're also planning to do extra work with officials. We're trying to find a way to improve our support services to officials' associations and the assigners (athletic directors)."

Hines Park 2nd in NABF tilt

Hines Park Lincoln-Mercury hitters experienced a revival of sorts, helping coach Dave Carroll's team to a second-place showing at the National Amateur Baseball Federation Tournament in Georgetown, Ky.

Hines Park, mired in a hitting slump during the Livonia Collegiate Baseball League playoffs, won four of six games to take second place.

Hines Park was eliminated in the championship game by St. Louis Denny's, 8-3.

Denny's opened up a 6-0 lead, highlighted by a three-run home run, against Hines Park losing pitcher Bryan Besco (Westland John Glenn/University of Michigan).

Hines Park split two earlier games against Denny's. Hines Park opened the tourna-

MHSAA announces new rule changes

The Michigan High School Athletic Association has announced several major rule changes, which were recently passed by the National Federation.

In basketball, bonus free throws will continue to begin on the seventh foul of each half, but the opposing team will now shoot

two free throws instead of a one-and-one on the 10th.

Second, no field goal try will be counted if there is three-tenths of a second remaining or less. A tip-in off an inbounds pass would be permitted, but does not apply unless the clock displays tenths of a second.

In football, the two-minute drill has been given a boost. It will allow a quarterback to spike the ball immediately after the snap from center to stop the clock.

In soccer, teams can start a contest with seven uniformed players instead of the previous rule of 11.

County hires Floridian to run troubled youth home

Leonard Dixon, 40, has been appointed director of the Wayne County Juvenile Detention Facility after a yearlong national search. He was chosen from a number of applicants suggested by the federal government.

"The county's children need so many things," said Dixon. "There's no way around it. What we're finding out is what people already knew, over 60 percent of the crimes are being committed by juveniles — and since we neglected them for so long — all of the negative stuff is coming out."

Dixon's appointment was critical to the county because the state threatened to take away its accreditation and the U.S. Department of Justice has threatened to sue the county and appoint a federal overseer if conditions at the youth home noted in a 1994 federal study were not satisfactorily addressed. The youth home is located in Detroit.

A Department of Justice investigation of the youth home was conducted in 1994. Federal authorities released a report in December with accounts of physical

abuse, overcrowding and food containing worms, roaches and rocks.

The youth home's 101,000-square-foot detention facility, built in 1960, currently houses about 178 youths age 12-17 in 200 bedrooms.

A native of Florida, Dixon previously worked in Miami as program operations administrator for detention, non-residential and residential service for Dade and Monroe counties from 1990 until leaving for Wayne County last June. In that role, Dixon supervised 297 employees with a budget of \$12.5 million a year.

Dixon has worked more than 14 years in the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services in the Children, Youth and Families component of the agency.

Dixon has an associate's degree in education from State Fair Community College (Sedalia, Mo.), a bachelor's degree in sociology/psychology from Southwest Baptist University (Bolivar, Mo.) and a master's degree in child and youth care administration from Nova University (Ft. Lauderdale,

Fla.).

"We looked on the national scene for an administrator," said Warren Evans, assistant county executive of the Department of Community Justice. "What we looked for were administrators who were thought highly of and who could do the job. Mr. Dixon's name was on the top of that list."

"My biggest impression of him, so far, is he's a hands-on person," said Evans. "He has a true and sincere concern for kids and he has an institutional background. A number of the other applicants had the educational background, but did not have the experience. Dixon has both."

"I think I can make a difference," Dixon said, "because I'm a child care provider. I'm an advocate for children. I have a very strong determination to help all children, especially African American children because they make up a great proportion of the population who are beneficiaries of the juvenile corrective services."

"In addition, I've been in the business for 20 years. I've seen us move from punishment to a child-caring emphasis. Today, what we

should do is aspire to treat kids in a humane, caring and professional way."

But treating kids in a professional way has proved to be Dixon's first major challenge.

"The challenges I've seen have become more professional," he said. "As an administrator, I'm

asking the question, 'What does it take to help the community we serve?'"

The answers, county officials say, have not always been as simple as the questions.

"When I first got here," he said, "I realized that there were a lot of changes in store for the Juvenile Detention Facility. More organization has to go toward service. From the time the kid comes here until the time he or she leaves, there has to be some type of structure in place; and that is, accountability, consistency, and community protection."

"More than that," Dixon added, "if you're going to work in juvenile corrections you have to know a little social work, a little psychiatry, a little law, a little growth and human development, and a little law enforcement."

Yet with all the changes and trends, Dixon said, has come the same bureaucratic red tape.

"I've worked at the Department of Juvenile Justice in Miami for 16 years," he said, "and what I've discovered is this: Detroit is no different than most cities in that there is a lack of funding and

awareness afforded to children — and that is coming back to haunt us."

"We have to teach our community that government is not going to clean our houses. It's not going to mow our lawns, and it's definitely not going to raise our children because government doesn't have enough money."

But Dixon has some plans for Wayne County's juvenile detention.

"I hope to bring some professionalism to the JDF, a knowledge of juvenile justice, consistency and motivation," he said.

"Motivation for people to get involved. I mean real community awareness: the need for them to be involved with raising our children. Also, some manhood development programs are required — some female development programs, too."

"I will institute a better trained staff, a more professional staff. I want the Wayne County Juvenile Detention Facility to be one of the national models."

The Wayne County Juvenile Detention Facility is located on 13333 E. Forest in Detroit.

Indy racing car stolen

The race car of Robbie Buhl, the 1995 Detroit Grand Prix Indy Lights winner, was reportedly stolen the night of Sunday, Aug. 6, as it sat at a trailer rental company in Detroit.

Buhl's Indy Lights display car, painted in bright red, blue and yellow was being stored in a specially made 22-foot-long black, enclosed Haulmark trailer.

Both car and trailer were parked at Shores Trailer Rental on Nine Mile and I-94 in east Detroit.

"I don't think they knew that there was a race car inside the trailer," said Buhl in a press release. "My guess is that they just wanted the trailer and, now, might not know what to do with the Indy Lights car. If they want a suggestion for what to do with it, I know that we'd love to get the car back."

Buhl currently uses the race car as a promotional display tool for his sponsors and for his Racing For Kids charity.

Racing For Kids was created at the Children's Hospital of Michigan and consists of worldwide visits to Children's Hospitals where Buhl races.

Pfeiffer movie about tough school based on real life

Based on a real life story, "Dangerous Minds," now playing at metro Detroit movie theaters, stars Michelle Pfeiffer as former Marine LouAnne Johnson, who leaves an officer's commission and nine-year military career to pursue her dream of becoming an English teacher.

But while earning her teaching credentials at a Northern California high school, she is assigned to a group of students who change her life forever. And she changes theirs.

As their new instructor, Ms. Johnson defies all the rules, creates her own curriculum and instructs the class of tough, inner-city teenagers from college-level texts.

Frustrated that her students, whose standardized scores range from average to excellent, have

come to accept failure as a way of life, she cajoles and tricks them into learning. More important, she loves them and helps them believe in themselves.

One teacher's account of the education crisis in America, and her effort to make a difference, "Dangerous Minds" is a Hollywood Pictures presentation of a Don Simpson/Jerry Bruckheimer production. The screenplay by Ronald Bass is based upon "My Posse Don't Do Homework" by LouAnne Johnson. Buena Vista Pictures distributes.

"This is a picture about one teacher and how she goes about getting her students' attention so they can learn," said Simpson. "She helps them understand the

importance of knowledge and the ultimate power an education affords everyone in our society."

Bruckheimer agrees. "Our school systems are under-financed and under-staffed and as a result we are losing a generation of kids. Don and I would like to make teachers heroes again. We wanted to show their struggle with the system, with the kids, and with the environment in which the kids grow up — which many times is their biggest deterrent — and demonstrate that these teachers really are significant role models."

To prepare for the role Pfeiffer spent time with Johnson, read a variety of reports and studies outlining and comparing educational systems throughout the world, and for some practical suggestions, contacted two friends who

are both dedicated teachers.

"It can be more difficult to portray a real person because one feels a certain responsibility to that individual," said Pfeiffer. "In a few situations where artistic license needed to be taken and we needed to alter something in some slight way, I always felt that I had to stay within the truth of LouAnne's character and not compromise the story."

Outside the classroom, LouAnne's primary relationships revolve around three of her students: Emilio, played by Wade Dominguez whose first professional audition was with Michelle Pfeiffer; Callie, played by Bruklin Harris who, although she has appeared in two other films, was found in an open call out of hundreds of applicants; and Raul, played by Renoly Santiago who

has dreamt of being on the big stage for as long as he can remember.

Mixing nonprofessionals with experienced actors is director John N. Smith's trademark. The chemistry such pairing inspires leads to an exciting dynamic on

set and on the screen.

"I've done a lot of work with nonprofessional actors, so I feel very comfortable introducing new film elements to people who are not experienced with film," he explains.

"Dangerous Minds" is rated R.

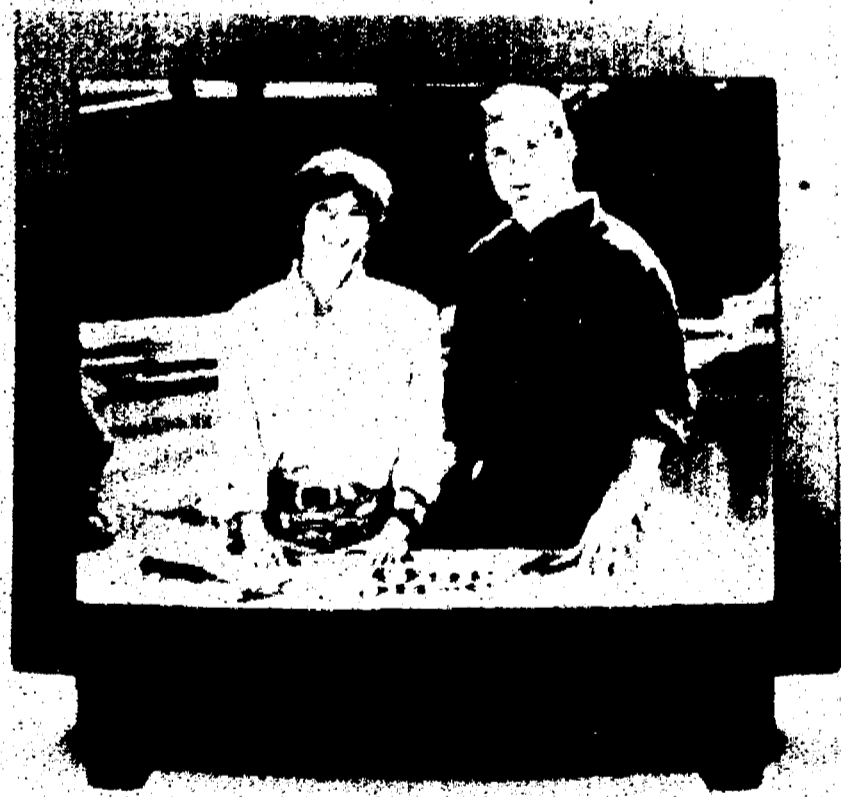

Ladbroke DRC reduces races

Michigan's only thoroughbred horse racetrack will cut its racing days from five to four days per week.

Ladbroke DRC has been granted permission by the Office of the Racing Commissioner to race four days a week rather than five for the rest of the 1995 season. The racetrack, which did operate Wednesday through Sunday, will be closed on Thursdays, effective Thursday, Aug. 17.

Ladbroke DRC, scheduled to end its 1995 season in November, cited a dwindling supply of horses as its reason for the reduction. "Michigan horse racing has been under a cloud of uncertainty for so long that many of our horse owners and breeders are going to other states," said John Long, president and chief operating officer, Ladbroke Racing Corporation. "Reducing our race days is the only way we can fill as many races as possible while maintaining some standard of quality."

Long said DRC is working with other industry leaders to

revise state legislation to permit electronic gaming. In June, Gov. John Engler indicated he would not support electronic gaming at Michigan's eight racetracks as part of the industry's House Bill 4526. However, he said he would support increasing the amount of simulcasting and a reduction in state tax on tracks, the highest in the country.

Long said the possibility of a 1996 season also depends on available horses and the outcome of negotiations to develop new legislation. "There are no easy answers," said Long. "The new race schedule is necessary while we investigate short-term solutions like tax reductions and full-card simulcasting. We had to change our game plan until we're able to look at long-term solutions like electronic gaming."

Michigan's \$1-billion horse racing industry supports more than 42,000 jobs throughout the state, with more than 37,000 of those dedicated to agriculture, according to a study by Public Sector Consultants in Lansing.

Avalon gives Toyota strong roots in U.S.

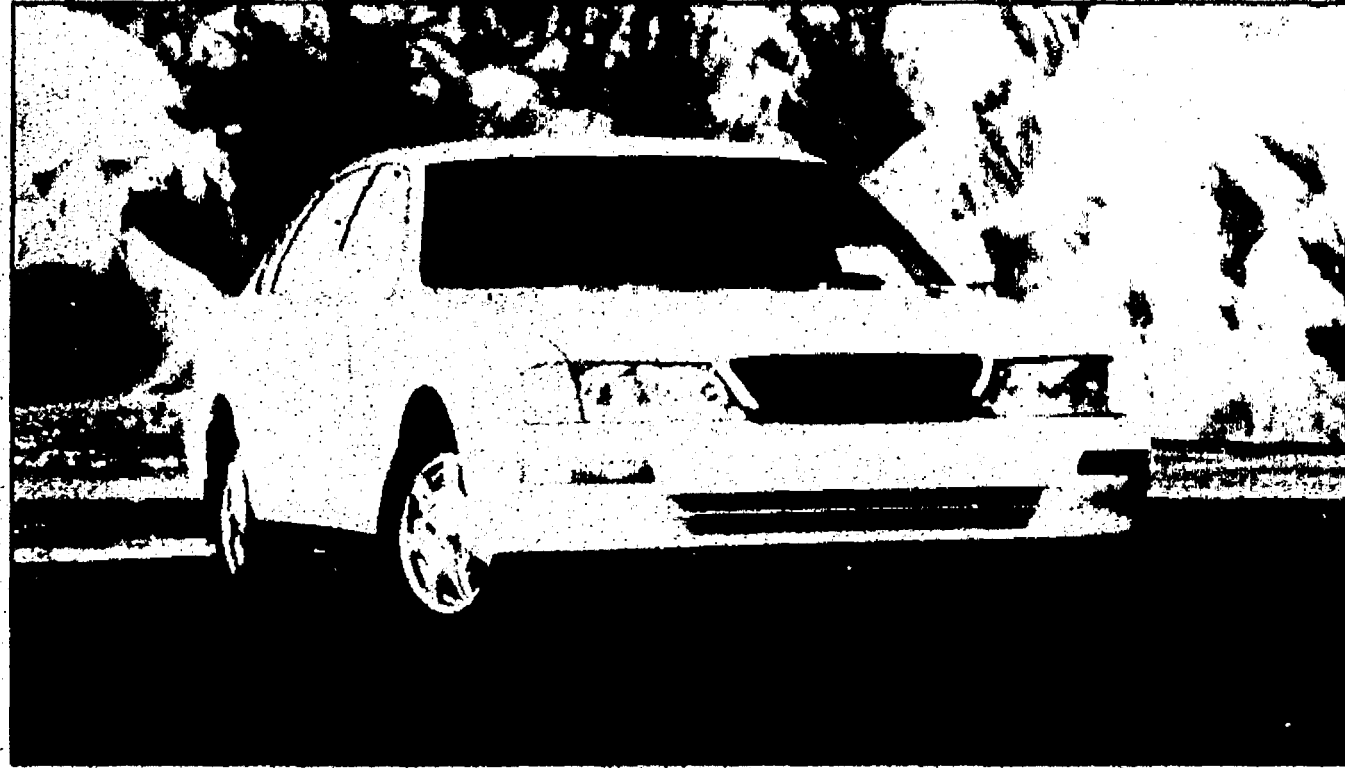

GEORGETOWN, Ky. -- There may soon come a time when Toyota is synonymous with America.

Toyota Motor Manufacturing U.S.A. is already an American company with American holdings, building and selling U.S.-made vehicles.

Now, with the addition of Avalon, the newest flagship of the Toyota nameplate, it means more than half of the Toyotas sold in America will be built in the U.S. Right now, Toyota builds its Camry coupe, wagon and sedan, Corolla and Toyota truck on U.S. soil.

The 1995 Avalon is built in Georgetown at the Toyota Motor Manufacturing facility, the same facility that builds the Camry sedan, wagon and coupe and the right-hand-drive Camry for export, as well as more than 206,000 four-cylinder engines every year. Last year, nearly

235,000 Camrys were built here at this 7.65 million-square-foot plant.

Toyota doubled the facility's size during the past year to accommodate production of the Avalon, pumping another \$903 million into the Kentucky economy. Total production capacity at the plant is now 400,000 vehicles and 500,000 engines per year. The plant's operations include a

stamping die shop, body weld, paint, powertrain and assembly.

Exports of the U.S.-built Toyotas and a Toyota-badged version of the Chevrolet Cavalier to Japan, Taiwan and other markets will increase to about 80,000 units per year, said Shinji Sakai, president and chief executive officer of Toyota Motor Sales U.S.A.

Toyota's largest sedan, the Avalon will have more than 75 percent American parts in addition to it being exclusively built at the Georgetown facility. Most of the parts were designed in the U.S. as well. Michigan's Toyota Technical Center in Ann Arbor worked closely with U.S. suppliers on the design of those parts.

At a large gathering of

Toyota workers at the plant, Shinji commended the teamwork and commitment of the Georgetown workforce for Toyota's success.

"Toyota's growing Americanization would not be possible without your commitment to excellent craftsmanship and attention to detail," he said.

The Avalon will be the roomiest sedan ever offered by a Japanese nameplate and the first to offer six-passenger seating with an optional power split-bench front seat.

"It will be the roomiest, most-sophisticated, best-equipped sedan ever offered by Toyota," said Dave Illingworth, Toyota's group vice president, during an interview in Detroit earlier this year. "Positioned above Camry, it will be the flagship

of our lineup and a key element of our commitment to the U.S. It contains more American thinking and creativity than any previous Toyota product."

The interior passenger volume is 120.9 cubic feet -- 9 cubic feet larger than Camry and 19 cubic feet larger than its predecessor, the Cressida.

Built on a stretched Camry platform, the Avalon is outfitted with a 3.0-liter six-cylinder four-cam 24-valve multi-point fuel injected all-aluminum engine that produces 192 horsepower.

The Avalon has a host of safety equipment, including driver- and passenger-side airbags, front and rear three-point shoulder belts for all passengers, rear head restraints, optional anti-lock brakes, child protector rear door locks, front and rear crumple zones and side impact beams.

Offered in two grade levels, the standard XL and top-of-the-line XLS, standard equipment on the Avalon includes a four-speed electronically controlled automatic transmission, four-wheel disc brakes, power windows, side-view mirrors and door locks and bucket seats with center console-mounted shift lever.

Optional equipment includes a leather-trimmed interior, anti-lock brakes, a power sunroof, power split-bench seat, automatic climate

control, theft-deterrent system, keyless entry and a choice of stereo systems.

Attention to detail for driver and passengers' comfort was a prime concern when designing the Avalon, Illingworth said. Four-wheel independent MacPherson strut, a stabilizer bar, gas-filled shock absorbers and an anti-vibration subframe were incorporated in the vehicle to produce superb handling and ride characteristics seen on a luxury-based sedan.

"Americans say 'quality time is more important than quantity time,'" said Illingworth. "If there is a design philosophy in Avalon, it 'quality time.' We have designed the ride, the handling, the ergonomics and the interior of the car to provide the 'highest quality road time' of any Toyota product."

"We're confident that anyone who drives an Avalon will receive the message we're sending."
