A Detroit Recorder's Court judge declared a mistrial Thursday for a former Westland man accused of setting his ex-wife on fire, prompting an emotional outburst from the distraught woman. "You can't do that!" screamed

Karen Janik, 30, after Judge Bruce Morrow declared a mistrial for Michael Janik, 41, charged with assault with intent to murder and arson.

Standing up in the courtroom, Karen Janik also turned to her exhusband's family members and lashed out at them.

"Why do you people want him off for?" she asked in tears, questioning why relatives want Michael Janik cleared of charges.

"Go ahead! Let him go! Let him go!" Karen Janik sobbed as authorities led her from the courtroom.

"What's wrong with you people?" Her outburst marked a dramatic

ending to the third day of a trial that Morrow has rescheduled for Jan. 8. The new trial will come one year and

ablaze, won a new trial Thursday in a courtroom ruling that enraged the woman. A judge said the prosecuting attorney went too far in questioning the defendant.

six days after Michael Janik, a former Garden City resident, is accused of trying to kill his ex-wife at his 455 S. Hawthorne residence.

Janik, a former Westland and Garden City resident now living in Can-Thursday with family members. He family posted \$7,000 of a \$70,000/10 percent bond.

The judge declared a mistrial Thursday after assistant Wayne County prosecutor Jerry Dorsey IV, trying to discredit Michael Janik's testimony from Wednesday, questioned him about statements he may have made to police after the Jan. 2 incident.

Prosecutor warned

Dorsey had implied in front of a ton Township, left the courtroom jury that the defendant fabricated a new version to aid in his defense, but has been free since Feb. 13, when his Morrow ruled that Dorsey's line of

questioning went too far and may have violated Michael Janik's rights.

There had been nothing on the court record about any prior statements made by Michael Janik, and Morrow's ruling stemmed from concerns that Dorsey exposed jury members to issues they shouldn't have heard.

Dorsey said in court that he wanted to impeach Michael Janik as a witness because of alleged inconsistencies in his statements. Morrow had warned Dorsey to approach the issue delicately.

Cop admits holding onto evidence

A veteran Canton Township police officer, testifying in his brother-inlaw's trial on an attempted murder charge, admitted having potential evidence in his possession that he never turned over to police.

But officer George C. Sharp, under intense questioning from a prosecutor, denied Wednesday that he meant to conceal evidence to protect Michael Janik, who is charged with trying to kill his wife, Karen, by setting her on fire.


Sharp testified that he was given Karen Janik's clothing when he and his wife, Candace, visited her at the University of Michigan Hospital on Jan. 2. That was the same day Karen Janik said her ex-husband doused her with lighter fluid and set her ablaze with a cigarette lighter at their former Westland residence.

Sharp, an 18-year Canton officer, said he was given Karen Janik's shoes, blue jeans, bra and panties. The shoes were damaged during the fire.

Sharp testified that he kept the clothing until after Michael Janik was arraigned Jan. 10 on charges of arson and assault with intent to murder. He said in court that he didn't think of the clothing as evidence.

When he did turn over the clothing, Sharp said he gave it not to Westland police or Wayne County prosecutors, but to defense attorney W. Otis Culpepper. Culpepper brought the items to court Wednesday.

Low bidders on library upset at city council

Some business executives are criticizing the Westland City Council for rejecting low bids for library work in favor of highercost union companies.

"I'm outraged, and I think the people of Westland should be, too," said Jim Sinn of Westland, chief estimator for McMurray Electric of Ferndale.

Jim Long, president of Long Mechanical Inc. of Northville, said, "It's unfortunate that the

integrity of the public bidding process has been denied due to the actions of the Westland City Council."

The two companies had been recommended by the construction manager and the city administration for work on the William P. Faust Public Library of Westland, to be built on Central City Parkway between Ford Road and Warren.

But the council, under pressure from some 30 skilled trades union workers who attended a meeting last week, rejected the low bidders. Council members said they believed the union companies would do a better job.

McMurray bid \$569,645 for electrical work on the library but lost to Gillis Electric Inc. of Livonia, which bid \$616,445.

Long Mechanical bid \$751,000 for plumbing and heating/air-conditioning work, but the council chose another company, Alpha, for \$787,606.

The two council-chosen bids

amounted to \$1,404,051, a difference of \$83.406 over the low bidders. The bids were in a package of five bids; the council chose the low bidder for three other jobs.

Robert McChesney, McMurray president, said the council "obviously" chose a higher bidder because of union pressure.

"I just wish they would have come out and said that," he said. "We're going to be following up with whatever legal recourse we have to deal with it," McChesney said.

Sinn said McMurray has been in business for 18 years, "and we are a good contractor."

The Livonia school district is among the company's customers.

Council comments that McMurray's work might not compare to Gillis are "just not true," Sinn said.

Long's firm also has a history of big jobs, including such customers as Wayne County, Long said. He said last week's developments appeared to be "set up," and he noted that council members

didn't even ask his firm any questions during the meeting.

Councilman Charles "Trav" Griffin last week had said the selected bidders would do a "tremendously better" job.

Councilman Glenn Anderson agreed and said the council had to look out for the best interests of this city."

Joe Hofman of Plumbers Local No. 98 summed up the union's stance this way: "The union way is not the only way; it's the best way."

2 youths held in purse snatching

The same charge is pending against a juvenile who is in custody of juvenile authorities, Fetner said.

The juvenile had been arrested for one of the earlier purse-snatching incidents, but had been released by juvenile authorities on a tether, Fetner said.

An intoxicated 16-year-old girl who fell asleep at a Westland party awoke nude in a nearby park, where she was being raped in a wooded area, a police sergeant said.

The Flat Rock girl told police that she was raped by one man while another stood by, refusing to help her early Wednesday morning in Dorsey Park, Westland police Sgt. Terry Donohue

said. When she awoke, the accused rapist began hitting her and then choked her until she was unconscious, Donohue said. The incident had ended when she awoke again at 1 a.m. to find herself alone, the sergeant said.

The girl was hospitalized overnight with severe bruising to her face, a chipped tooth and marks on her neck, Donohue said. "It was pretty brutal," he said.

The girl had consumed too

much alcohol and had fallen asleep on a porch in the 33000 block of Alcona Court. in the Norwayne neighborhood, Donohue said.

Two suspects haven't yet been charged. On Friday, police were still seeking the identity of one suspect.

The incident happened in Dorsey Park, on the east, side of Venoy near Glenwood, Donohue said.

The rape occurred in a Wayne section of the park, but Westland police are investigating the case becausé it began on Alcona Court.

The girl was able to identify one suspect, whom she had met at the party, Donohue said. That suspect was identified as a 25. year-old Westland resident.



Mistrial

Dorsey tried unsuccessfully Thursday to convince Morrow to continue the trial, which was nearly complete except for closing arguments by Dorsey and defense attorney W. Otis Culpepper.

Karen and Michael Janik gave conflicting testimony about what happened when Karen and the couple's 3-year-old twins went to the defendant's house to collect Christmas gifts bought by the defendant.

Karen Janik, who was starting a new life in Florida with the children, said her ex-husband begged her not to leave before he wrestled her to the floor, doused her with cigarette lighter fluid and set her on fire. She had already placed the children in her van and was making one last trip inside the house for toys, she said.

Michael Janik testified that he sprayed his ex-wife with lighter fluid in self-defense after she slashed him three times with a hunting knife, twice on the neck and once on the wrist. But he denies that he started the fire that injured Karen Janik and destroyed much of the house they once shared.

Karen Janik has scars on both of her hands.

Sharp said he never discussed the issue with his superiors at the Canton Township Police Department

"I discussed this with no one at my department, so that would mean that no one there knows," he testified Wednesday.

Under questioning from assistant Wayne County prosecutor Jerry Dorsey IV, Sharp conceded that police officers usually give Michael Janik admitted that he took a can of lighter fluid with. him when he left his burning house. He indicated that he wanted to prevent the flames from spreading, even though he said he never phoned the fire department for help in extinguishing it.

Michael Janik was missing for one week after the incident, until he was found slumped over the wheel of his brother's idling van in Livingston County. He has rejected authorities' claims that he was trying to commit suicide by breathing carbon monoxide in a van that had a faulty exhaust system.

Dorsey also raised questions about the knife wounds that Michael Janik says his wife made on his neck and wrist. Under questioning from Dorsey, Janik denied that the wounds were self-inflicted after he left the scene of the fire.

He testified that he didn't seek medical treatment for the cuts because he treated them himself with bandages found in his brother's vehicle.

Janik, a 19-year Ford Motor Co. employee, could face life in prison if convicted as charged. He and Karen Janik had been married just over six months when he was accused of trying to kill her.

As of yet, Sharp hasn't faced any charges.

Field trip

New Wayne-Westland teachers get tour of district

Wayne-Westland school bus 89 had a different load of passengers on a special "field trip" Wednesday afternoon.

Driver Sharon Conley bused some 25 passengers on what the "tour director" said would be a snapshot of the sprawling 66square mile district.

What the passengers, among the 48 new teachers hired by the district this summer, got was a wide-angle mural of the school system.

The bus tour, led by Greg Baracy, assistant superintendent for general administration. and Terry Wood, newly-appointed community relations director, was intended to give the new faculty members a sense of the size of the district, which takes in parts of five municipalities, and a window view of many of the schools.

The new teachers represented the largest number hired by the district since the early 1970s.

The new faculty members are a result of a retirement incentive program.of which 160 teachers and 21 administrators took advantage.

Some new teachers didn't take the bus tour because they had subbed in the district for several years and knew the school community.

But others who were familiar with the school system still took the tour and enjoyed it.

One, Laura Messer, said she is excited about her new assignment as an English teacher at John Glenn High and Marshall Middle School.

But she is no stranger to the High.




Field trip leader: School administrator Greg Baracy tells his 25 bus passengers about the Wayne-Westland school district during a tour Wednesday afternoon.

School bells ring for new Livonia teachers

The new school year starts today for all teachers in Livonia Public Schools, which serves the northern section of Westland.

But for the 50-plus new teachers just hired this year, school began Wednesday with a three-day orientation that included both walking and bus tours of the district.

In those three days, the district's newest teachers got to interact with the administrators who run the state's sixth largest district.

They got to hear "first-day-ofschool" stories and get advice from educators who've lived through many "first days."

During the two tours, the new teachers got to unravel some of the mysteries of a district which includes about 35 square miles in Livonia, plus the northern part of Westland.

And, on Friday, after two days of moving as a group, the newcomers split up and scattered to the school building where they've been assigned to spend their first vear as a district staffer.

For Jennifer Herman, it was off to Taylor Elementary, to teach art.


For Julie Ericson, it was on to Webster Elementary, to teach mentally impaired students.

David Adkins reported to Stevenson High, where he will teach industrial technology.

And Angela Hampel took up her post at Frost Middle School, where she will teach mathematics.

A large crop

This year's crop of new teachers is one of the largest in years, mainly because of the large number of teachers who retired in June.



"It's great to get new fresh blood in all the buildings," said Franklin principal Michael Fenchel after the new teachers ate lunch Wednesday in the school's new computerized library media center. "Livonia schools has a complex interview procedure, and for you to be here it's a credit to each one of you."

The interviews, complete with meetings with teachers the applicant would be working with, is what convinced Donna Kirk to join the school team.

"I left the interview saying, boy, this is where I want to work," said Kirk, a speech pathologist who will divide her time between Hull, Nankin Mills (in Westland) and Kennedy elementaries.

Alan Essenmacher taught electronics at Henry Ford Community College and Wayne-Westland's Ford VocTech Center before joining the staff at the Livonia Career/Technical Center.

Many of the teachers, though, are newly-minted, fresh from student and substitute teaching as ing degree into a job teaching bisignments.

In his stint as student teacher at Wayne-Westland's John Glenn High, Mark Parrish heard about a physics opening at Franklin High, which serves the northeast corner of Westland.

Todd Mai spent five years as a substitute teacher in the district before landing a 5th/6th grade. teaching job at Roosevelt.

Others, such as Stacy Mase and Leslie Brach, spent just a few months as a student teacher before snagging their first job. Mase will teach fourth/fifth grade at Hull; Brach will teach kindergarten at Coolidge. Brach also was named 1995 outstanding student teacher of the year by the Michigan Association of Teacher Educators.

Some new teachers have taken a circuitous route to becoming a teacher.

At the age of 45, Wayne Johnson is about to follow a life-long. talent and live a longtime dream. For years, Johnson climbed the ladder at one of the Big 3 auto companies, working his way into a good-paying job. Johnson this week begins his new career: teaching fine arts part-time to Stevenson students.

"I needed to do this for me," Johnson said. "The only thing scary about this are my lifestyle changes. I've been accustomed to a much higher income."

Rodney Foster parlayed a nursology, also at Stevenson.

Lisa Ehlert graduated magna cum laude from Kalamazoo College and planned a career in law. But before taking on more school work, she took off for Mexico to teach English for two years. It was here she got hooked on teaching.

"I never considered teaching as an option before that," said Ehlert, who will teach Spanish and government at Franklin High.

The challenge

In greeting new teachers Wednesday, Superintendent Ken Watson spelled out their new challenge: Carrying on the district's long tradition of giving a quality education to its students. "We recently celebrated our 50th year as a district and we want to maintain that same quality for the next 50 years," Watson said. "We're counting on you to deliver. While mechanics, printers and forklift drivers went about their jobs, the supervisors showed off their small part of the district that helps keep the schools running. They told the newcomers the main reason Livonia's 1,000member support staff exists -- to make the teachers' jobs easier.

Teachers benefit when buses run smoothly, maintenance work is done quickly, and supplies are on hand when needed, they said.

"We're here to help you do your work as teachers," said Whitefoot, standing next to his humming offset printers, "You don't have to spend hours at the Xerox machine. Let us do the printing, and you do the teaching."

Bus drivers Shannon Scott and Edith Bryant then whisked the new teachers off on two of the district's new 78-passenger buses for a quick tour of the district and a look at several schools,

"This whole day sets the tone for the school year," Young said. "It's an eye-opener for the teachers to see the support services we have. When Howard (Whitefoot) says 'don't stand at the Xerox machine,' he means it."







Longer runway not necessarily necessary — Duggan

Building an international tradeport at Willow Run Airport is not necessarily contingent on extending the northeast runway at the airport, said Wayne County Deputy Executive Mike Duggan.

"The runway extension is one possible project of the tradeport." but is not the only project, Duggan said, "The decision of the runway is under review right now and I think there will be a very. significant announcement in a few weeks," Duggan said.

Duggan said other aspects of the tradeport plan, such as improving the taxiways at the airport and making infrastructure improvements in the surrounding areas could be done without extending the runway.

The runway extension has run into strong opposition from residents in Canton Township as well as political opposition from Wayne County commissioners Thaddeus McCotter and Bruce Patterson.

McCotter represents the 10th District, which includes Plymouth, Plymouth Township and part of Livonia. Patterson represents the 11th commission District, which stretches from Canton to Huron townships and east to Wayne and Romulus.

Opposed to tradeport

McCotter and Patterson have vowed to fight the tradeport by involving concerned citizens in their districts. The plan is to circulate petitions, contact state officials and organize community groups against the tradeport.

McCotter said he is opposed to the tradeport, with or without the runway extension. He said approving the tradeport would less-

en control of future runway extensions.

"If we get baited into creating the tradeport now, we will have no defense should the tradeport's governing board decide to extend the runway," McCotter said.

He also doubted whether a tradeport could legally be established without a runway extension. The legislation allowing tradeports calls for a master plan that Bruce Patterson would be against (County Executive) Ed McNamara if he found a cure for cancer.'

claim that the tradeport would create jobs, especially without the extended runway. McCotter opposed the \$45,000

federally-funded study of the tradeport concept at a Wayne County Economic Development Committee meeting last Wednesday. The committee approved the study on a 3-2 vote, Patterson and McCotter voted against the study while Detroit commissioners Edna Bell, Robert Blackwell and Kenneth Cockrel supported the study, Commissioner Michelle Plawecki was not present. Commissioner Bernard Parker was excused from the meeting.

McCotter is chairman of that committee and Patterson is a member.



Final approval for the study must be given by the full commission. The vote is scheduled for Thursday, Aug. 91.

Duggan said he has been working closely with Canton Township Supervisor Thomas Yack and other officials to develop a revised tradeport plan.

An environmental study shows there would be a lot of noise impact for residents north of the airport if the runway was extended, Duggan said.

Yack confirmed his involvement in the discussions.

"At this point, I think the concept is one that my board is thinking about," Yack said. "The fact there will not be a runway extension is a real plus for our community," Yack said. But Yack said he was not com-

pletely sold on the tradeport plan.

"When somebody floats an idea, I want to know where it has been tried before and what success it has had. No one has really shared that with me," said Yack.


There is no guarantee that businesses will spring up at the tradeport, Yack said. The tradeport concept is based on the idea of "kind of building it and they will come," Yack said.

Thomas Fegan, of Washtenaw County and co-chair of the tradeport steering committee, said the tradeport concept was started in 1992 when General Motors closed a plant near the airport and 4,500 people lost their jobs.







The area, which includes about 6,700 acres on the border of Van Buren and Ypsilanti townships, has industrial potential because it has enough vacant land, a vacant factory and easy access to transportation, Fegan said. In addition to air transporta-

tion, two rail lines run through the airport and I-94 and I-275 are very close, Fegan said.

A successful tradeport could create 25,000 new jobs, Fegan said.

Patterson said although he has not been directly involved in the discussions, he understands that changes in the tradeport plan may add an extension of the airport's east-west runway rather than the northeast runway. "They're trying to find a compromise and have







Traveler abundance expected Labor Day

Sizzling summer weather and cheaper gas prices should make this the busiest Labor Day weekend for motorists in at least 11 years, according to the American Automobile Association.

AAA estimates 29.6 million motorists plan to vacation 100 miles or more from home during the holiday weekend, up 2 percent from 29 million a year ago.

Eighty-eight percent of all holiday travel will be by auto, light truck or recreational vehicle. Auto travel intentions are the highest since AAA began reporting on Labor Day travel in 1985.

The average price of self-serve regular unleaded gasoline has dropped 0.5 cent since the Fourth of July holiday and now stands at \$1.178 per gallon.

Another 4.1 million people are expected to take a trip by airplane, train or bus, a 2.5 percent increase from 4 million in 1994. This modest increase comes after last year's 11 percent jump in travel by air, train or bus.

Research data for Labor Day are based on a national telephone survey of 1,500 adults by the U.S. Travel Data Center, which conducts research for AAA.

The greatest volume of Labor Day auto travel will originate in the West with 7.3 million, followed by the Southeast with 6.3 million; Northeast, 5.8 million; Midwest, 5.5 million; and the Great Lakes, 4.7 million.

The most popular Labor Day. destination will be a trip to a city, where 24 percent of the travelers expect to visit; followed by town or rural area, 22 percent; ocean or beach, 18 percent; lake area, 15 percent; mountain area, 9 percent; state/national park, 4 percent; theme/amusement park, 3 percent; and other/undecided, 5 percent.

Of those traveling, 43 percent will stay overnight in a hotel or motel, while 27 percent intend to stay with friends or relatives. Other planned accommodations are: Camper/trailer/RV or tent, 12 percent; cabin/condo, 8 percent; boat/ship, 2 percent; bed & breakfast, 1 percent; and other, 1 percent. Six percent are undecided or aren't staying overnight.







Since that day, I can't get enough. Now that's certainly not to say that I'm a lover of Heinz pickles, and for the record, they do make a classic dill spear. Since that day, I've grown to love homemade pickles "put up" by someone who knows how to do it right.

Pickles have a taste and reputation all their own. Anyone who has ever ventured into a Jewish deli and savored a crisp "new" dill can appreciate what pickle nirvana is all about. Folks in western Wayne County who have ven-

tured into Getsie's Pub in downtown Northville might remember Dorothy, the evening waitress who used to make a dill pickle that tasted to me. what a prime steak must taste like to a cowboy. She was and always will be remembered as my pickle "queen."

But judging from my voice mail requests there are others of you out there who are also searching for the best pickle recipe. Good news folks. This is prime pickle season and have I got the recipes for you.

Pickling cucumbers planted with love and care in May blossomed abundantly during our humid and wet July and August bringing forth a bumper crop of some of the fattest cukes I have ever set my eyes upon. Now a good pickler knows that the smaller and less fat a pickling cuke is. the better it will taste, not to mention the fact that it will have fewer seeds.

If the thought of pickling makes you grimace with thoughts of simmering pots and boiling jars, especially during these dog days of summer, look for a pickling crock. Check out old hardware stores for the best deals, but if your garden is spewing forth pickles, and you need one fast, they are available at Kitchen Glamor Stores, Hertler's Farm and Garden in Ann Arbor (what a fun old store to browse through on a hazy summer day) and most antique shops. Couple the crocks with a cool basement and you'll be soon in pickle heaven.

Of course, those not willing to be patient and allow the pickles to ripen slowly in the pickling juices can take heed as we have even included recipes that can be made in days rather than weeks.

Anyone who has ever made pickles knows that if you make one jar, you might as well make a dozen. Any of our recipes will do either. The most difficult task when making pickles is sterilizing the jars and making sure the lids fit tightly.

The folks at Ball Jars and Kerr Glass both have very respectable books available for purchase at your local book store or gourmet shop. They are paperback, very inexpensive, and spell out everything the first time canner or pickler needs to know.

Canning pointers

I like to utilize a little trick I learned years back-when canning was something I thought I had to do. Sterilize your jars by running them through the rinse and drying cycle of your dishwasher (no soap, please!). You can also find everything you need to know about canning, pickling and food dehydration at your local library and through your county extension service.

The folks at Kerr Glass even have a Consumer Affairs Department that can answer your immediate canning and pickling questions during normal business hours. Their toll free phone number is 1-(800)-654-6249.

Children + cooking = mess. Children + cooking = fun and learning.

To most parents of young children, the first equation would come to mind first when thinking about mixing kids and cooking.

To those parents who give it a try and are willing to sit back and look at the experience as a whole, the outcome will certainly be fun and educational above all else.

Marilyn Romack of the New Morning School in Plymouth said she likes to combine cooking with class work whenever possible because it provides so many lessons. Math skills, science skills, early reading skills, small motor skills, following directions and teamwork should all be listed among the ingredients of any recipe, she says.

The key when starting out is be patient and don't worry about keeping the kitchen clean (maybe cook with the kids the day before cleaning day so you won't feel so stressed). Use aprons to protect clothing, use a large bowl to control spillage and let kids crack eggs in a separate bowl so shells don't get mixed in with the cookies.

Next, let the kids do the work. It's their lesson to learn and their project to feel good about.

Cooking foods that the family can eat is great. Lessons about making

healthy food choices can be incorporated in the mix. In the Feelin' Groovy summer class at New Morning School, teacher Ann Murray had

her students replace margarine with applesauce in a chocolate chip cook

recipe, and they made yogurt freezer pops as a good summer cooler.

Some foods, however, can be eaten selves. Romack recommends a recipe for bread sticks or pretzels that the

kids can whip up and then bend the dough into the shapes of letters or numbers. A good shortbread recipe could be used to make a puzzle for kids to work.

Interesting science lessons can be learned from mixing up a batch of gelatin in a large glass bowl, partially chilling it, and letting the kids drop in certain treats - marshmallows, fruit, raisins, etc. - to see which ones float and which ones sink. Finish chilling the gelatin for a family dessert.

Finally some kitchen/food activities are just great crafts that can be enjoyed together. In the Mish Mash Mania class this summer at New Morning School, teacher Ann Sufran had her 3- to 6-year-olds coat a sheet of construction paper with glue mixed with water and then sprinkled spices on top. The smelly collage was a lesson in the various scents produced by spices and how they blend. The resulting artwork is pretty interesting, too.

You might also try making edible necklaces out of cereals, pastas or other circular food.

Whatever the project, make it together and enjoy it together. Moms, dads, brothers, sisters, grandmas and grandpas, aunts and uncles can all get into the act for a great time that blends learning and fun with a little cooking on the side.

1 quart dill pickles (get them from a dell if you don't want to do your own) 21/2 cups sugar 1/2 cup white vinegar 11/2 teaspoon celery seed Drain pickles and place in a large



The Home Depot opens Michigan stores "10 and 11" on Aug. 31 - one at Webster and Southfield Rd. in Southfield, and the other in Grand Rapids on 28th St.

There is one additional store planned for the state, which is under construction in Saginaw. Each store includes a 28,000 square-foot greenhouse and garden center, for a total of 130,000 square feet of homerelated merchandise.

"We're especially pleased to be opening (these) stores in Michigan,' said Pedro Mendiguren, district manager. "We offer customers an enormous range of top-quality home improvement products . . . and a

level of service they've never experienced before."

Home Depot provides an easy-toshop layout showcasing approximately 40-50,000 different kinds of building materials, home improvement supplies, interior design-products, and plants and accessories for the lawn and garden. These products are sold to do-it-yourselfers, as well as home improvement, construction and building maintenance professionals.

The Home Depot stores also offer free do-it-yourself clinics and a nation-wide bridal registry service. The new stores feature a profes-

sionally staffed, centrally located,

design center which offers free consulting for home improvement projects ranging from lighting to computer-assisted design for kitchens and bathrooms.

Each store will employ approximately 150 employees, and provide a significant tax and property revenue - approximately \$2.3 million each in sales and property taxes annually, according to a company spokeswoman.

Founded in 1978, in Atlanta, GA, The Home Depot claims to be North America's largest home center retailer. It operates 372 warehousestyle home centers in 30 states, and 17 stores in three Canadian provinces. Gross sales for 1994 topped \$12.4 billion. Stock is traded on the New York Stock Exchange under the symbol "HD," and is included in the Standard and Poor's 500 Index. Home Depot expects to be operating approximately 850 stores by the end of fiscal 1998.

In March, Home Depot received a "most-admired retailer" rating from Fortune Magazine, due in part to a \$8 million philanthropic budget which is directed back to the communities Home Depot serves. Home Depot supports development of affordable housing and programs to benefit youth at risk.

Mendiguren said Home Depot expanded into Michigan last year because the states's demographica "are excellent. You have a good economy, a high percentage of ownership, and people who generally take great pride in improving their homes."

Competition for Michigan's home improvement dollars grows keen as other superstores such as Builders Square, Home Quarters, and Handy Andy (descendants of Forest City) open new stores and tout customer service.

Purcell, 39, explained that his crea-

I can't help but be influenced by the fashion silhouettes and de-, signs that are a part of my memories. I've updated these for the '90s and found a ready audience who also fondly recall these designs but have . no where else to buy them."

Back to cuff links. Neiman Marcus at the Somerset Collection, Troy, devotes an entire case to the oft-ignored fashion accessory. Jewelry designers John Hardy and David Yurman craft sterling silver into elegant cuff links. Yurman's are banded in 14K gold in his signature Cable pattern (from \$230).

Also notable are the white porcelain cuff links by Duchamp-London. Each in a pair is printed with the words Hot and Cold: Yes and No; or Thank You in about 10 different languages (\$65). 



It's nothing new. t's not a revelation. Westland John Glenn High's football team will be a contender again this year in the Western





Lady Crusaders optimistic about 1995 season

What Jerry Abraham doesn't want is a repeat.

Last season wasn't all that dismal for Madonna University's volleyball team, mind you. But it could have been better.



any lofty aspirations the Lady Crusaders may have entertained. Going into the season, their biggest concern was repluc-

ing setter Mazie Pi-Jerry Abraham lut, who had graduated. That changed by mid-season.

Madonna finished 30-21 last year, seeing its season end in the NAIA Great Lakes Regional semifinals. It was far short of expectations, which were high after the Crusaders' fifth-place finish in the '93 NAIA National Tournament.

As Abraham said after the season-ending loss to Mount St. Joseph's (Cincinnati), "It's been an inconsistent year for us."

¿Even though the losses seem. greater this year - gone are



Mo Paulin and starting outside hitter Julie Wood, both graduated, and Marci Laurencelle, Kate Dunning and Laura Fisher, who opted not to return — optimism is high.

The reason, at least in part, is the sobering effect a season that comes up short. "We do have experience in critical areas;" said Abraham, who has a 309-117 record in his eight years as coach.

That experience starts with juniors Julie Martin, 6-foot-2 from Livonia Stevenson, and Kelly McCausland, 5-11 from Redford Union. Both are entering their third year as starters for Madonna; they will anchor the middle-hitter position.

"Martin and McCausland are two of the best players in the country," said Abraham simply, "Both are All-American prospects."

Unfortunately, they were two of the reasons Madonna struggled last year - or, rather, the injuries they suffered were. At times, the Crusaders were without five starters last year.

With some better luck, that third-team NAIA All-American should change this year. The

team's only senior is 5-10 middlehitter Tiffaney Joseph.

Outside hitters Paulin and Wood, and setter Fisher, must be replaced. Meg Paris, who started at Ferris State before transferring to Mott Community College, will fill the void at setter. First, however, Paris must overcome a leg injury that sidelined her late last season.

Heather Steinhelper, a 5-10 junior, and 5-10 Erin Comment and 5-8 Erin Gregoire, both sophomores, all gained valuable experience last season, but only Gregoire survived without injury.

Vicki Toth, a 5-10 sophomore from Redford Union, will serve as back-up setter, and Emily Marlow, a 5-11 redshirt freshman, will add depth at middle-hitter.

Which leads to Abraham's promising recruiting class: 5-10 outside hitter Karen Sisung, one of the best players in Class B last year; 6.0 middle-hitter Jaclyn Deane (Livonia Franklin), whose size and strength makes her extremely promising ("She's a terminating-type of hitter"); and Jennifer Russell, a 5-8 outside hitter and defensive specialist.

"We have a lot of new faces in spots," said Abraham. "Our outside hitters are brand new. and that's a critical position for us. But we have some outside hitters who are going to be tremendous players, and we have a lot more depth than before. And we have pretty good size and balance."

The Crusaders also have a pretty good schedule -- "It's real, real, challenging," Abraham said - starting Friday at the Coca Cola Classic at Mesa State University in Grand Junction, Colo.

Writing a classified ad that gets results—whether it be for real estate, employment, the personals, transportation, or merchandise— is easy if you follow the guidelines below.




1. Give the reader specific information. Pretend you are someone reading the classifieds. What would you like to know about the item, service or job you are advertising? Be sure to add details such as color, size, condition, brand name, age, features and benefits. Be accurate! Don't embellish your ad with misleading information. Stick to the facts and reap the rewards!




2. Include the price. Don't waste your time or a potential buyer's time. If you advertise the price of the item or service you offer, the people who respond to your ad will be those who are genuinely interested. Surveys show that readers are more interested in those items and services they know are within their price range.



5. Avoid abbreviations. Don't make a potential customer work too hard! Although you may be tempted to cut down on the cost of your ad by using abbreviations, surveys indicate that many people don't understand such abbreviations as EIK (eat-in kitchen) or WSW (white side wall) tires and won't take the time to figure them out. A confused reader is a disinterested reader. Get the most for your money and use complete words.




4. Include phone number and specify hours. Be sure to let potential customers know when and where to call. Surveys show that even if a person is very interested in your item or service, he or she will not call back after the first attempt. Stay near the phone during the hours you indicate you will be available. Don't risk missing a sale!

5. Run on consecutive days. Your ad will not get results if people don't see it! Therefore, it is important to set up a consistent and consecutive ad schedule with your telephone salesperson or outside sales representative.


