# Residents jump to escape fire



Bravery, acts of heroism and well-trained firefighters helped to save lives during a raging fire that heavily damaged a Westland apartment building. No one was killed, though several residents had close calls.

A 76-year-old Westland woman who climbed stairs to alert her neighbors to a fire in her first-floor apartment is in critical condition in the burn unit of the University of Michi-

gan Hospital in Ann Arbor, a fire official said today (Monday).

Loretta Wayne suffered burns on her face, chest, arms and back as she climbed a stairwell to warn others to try to escape the fire that raged through a three-story apartment

building at 3 a.m. Sunday, said George Riley, assistant Westland fire chief.

The fire at Westland Plaza Apartments has been ruled accidental, Riley said. It started in the living room of an apartment occupied by Wayne and her sister, but details about how it started are under investigation.

The apartment complex is located on the north side of Warren Road, just east of Middlebelt.

The blaze gutted five apartments, and seven others suffered heavy

smoke and water damages, Riley said. None of the residents had renter's insurance, he said.

Several residents were trapped inside the building as the flames spread, Riley said.

"It was a rapidly expanding fire," he said.

One man dropped his 10-month-old baby from a third-floor apartment to a bean bag chair that another resident had placed on the ground. The baby wasn't injured, Riley said.

# Students learn about physical handicaps

Genora Leachsky of Westland wants people to be more sensitive to people with disabilities.

With her efforts, she persuaded her daughter's neighborhood school, Madison Elementary, to start a program to teach this lesson.

Leachsky wants to make sure that her daughter, Karajean Welberg, isn't considered to be the target of

children's teasing because of her spina bifida.

During the sensitivity program earlier this month, students at the school in Oakway learned about spina bifida and how it affects people. The program was presented by Leachsky and her daughter, Karajean, who has spina bifida.

Leachsky said her daughter is a

healthy, vibrant, 8-year-old student. She was born with a birth defect called spina bifida, a neural tube defect in which the spinal cord doesn't develop properly.

"Later in development, pieces of bone fail to close over the defective area of the spinal cord and there is a protrusion on each side of the spine that makes her look like a single eye

in the middle, hence the term spina bifida.

"Normally, Karajean is like most other children her age. Physically, she does her very best to keep up with others. I can't express the greatness of pride I have along with the deep love and concern for her.

# New Arbor Drugs rejected by council

Drawing applause from citizens, the Westland City Council has refused to let Arbor Drugs build another store along the Wayne Road commercial corridor.

The seven-member council last

week unanimously rejected a proposed site plan for a 10,922-square-foot drugstore on the northwest corner of Oakwood and Wayne Road.

The council followed the advice of residents such as Betty Talmadge, who urged elected officials to "use some good judgment and vote no."

The new Arbor Drugs would have been built little more than a mile north of an existing company store on the northeast corner of Glenwood and Wayne Road.

Arbor also has a Wayne Road store at the Hunter intersection, among several other stores in other parts of

the city.

Residents opposed to the plan noted that several smaller drugstores exist near the proposed Wayne-Oakwood location.

"It's not fair to have some big cor-

# Livonia schools to survey residents

In November, Livonia Public Schools will launch two efforts to get feedback from district residents on how well the district is performing.

Both efforts — a telephone survey and a back-to-school visit by residents — are part of the district's long-term goal of building strong partnerships in the district, which includes the northern section of West-

land, and building a better understanding of how the district is run.

The 60-question telephone survey of 395 registered voters will take place from 5:30-9:30 p.m. over a four-day period during American Education

Week, Nov. 13-16.

During the survey, volunteers will query residents on a whole range of school-related topics, from finances

# Stottlemeyer gets new life as preschool

The former Stottlemeyer Elementary School, one of four buildings closed last June because of declining enrollments and problems, has been given a new life for 800 preschoolers and their parents.

To show off the varied programs for children 5 and under, the newly named Stottlemeyer Early Childhood and Family Development Center will hold an open house for the community 6-8 p.m. Tuesday in the building

on Marquette, just east of Wayne Road.

Ronald Barratt, director of preschool services and Stottlemeyer principal, is hoping to make the center a "lighthouse building and a leader and to be a magnet in our field."

■ To show off the varied programs for children 5 and under, the newly named Stottlemeyer Early Childhood and Family Development Center will hold an open house for the community 6-8 p.m. Tuesday.

Many in the Wayne-Westland school district "don't know we exist. Many parents have preschoolers with problems and don't know where to go for help."

Barratt pointed out that his center, which has nearly 100 professional

and non-certified employees, has a wide range of services and programs for parents as well as the youngsters.

Those adult services include free baby-sitting for parents who want to spend time in their child's classroom as well as nutrition and exercise program for parents who want advice and information for themselves.

"There is a lot of evening information, support and activities for parents," Barratt said.

# Mother pleads no contest in child neglect case

A 2 1/2-year-old Westland boy, who disappeared for 26 hours in the woods of Oscoda Township while camping with his parents, will remain in a foster home following a court hearing Friday.

Dalton Alan Smith, the subject of a widespread hunt in early September, will remain under the temporary jurisdiction of Iosco County Probate Court after his

mother, Cynthia Louise Rock, pleaded no contest Friday to child neglect allegations, Detective Alan MacGregor said.

The issue of whether Rock, 29, will lose permanent custody of the child is expected to be decided during another hearing scheduled for Nov. 22, assistant Iosco County prosecutor Gary Rapp said Friday.

No criminal charges have been lodged against the boy's mother or 34-year-old stepfather, William

Edward Rock, although MacGregor said charges are still possible. "The investigation is still open, and we're talking with a lot of people," he said. "But we're dealing with the custody issue first."

MacGregor added that "the main goal" is to keep the child away from the Rocks on a permanent basis.

"We're one hearing away from that now," he said Friday. Oscoda Township police believe

that Dalton may have been abandoned Sept. 2 in a wooded area. He was found 26 hours later following an exhaustive search by law enforcement agencies, tracking dogs and many volunteers.

A couple that spends the summer months in the area found Dalton and took him to a special police command post that had been set up in the woods. He was found three miles from his parents' campsite.

Police at one point were searching for a possible grave, based on information that was allegedly provided by the mother. But Dalton was found after receiving minor scratches and other injuries in the woods.

The parents now say that the boy wandered away from the campsite.

Meanwhile in Westland 18th District Court, William Rock pleaded guilty Wednesday to assaulting Cynthia Rock and to

driving while impaired. He is scheduled for sentencing Nov. 27, a court officer said.

At the time of the incident in Oscoda Township, William Rock was under orders from 18th District Judge C. Charles Bokos not to have contact with Cynthia Rock.

Following an earlier spouse abuse charge in April, William Rock was placed on probation for one year.

poration come out and take all of their business," resident Lydia Sugg told the council during an Oct. 16 meeting.

The council denied the project because Arbor officials wanted to use Oakwood, a private street, for access to and from the store.

Planning director Tod Kilroy also spoke critically of Arbor's landscaping plans, saying the project would eliminate 47 trees.

Councilman David Cox chastised Arbor representatives for failing to alter their plans following an earlier 3 1/2-hour meeting in which concerns were outlined for the company.

The meeting apparently was a waste of time, Cox said.

Arbor developer Steve Silk said the concerns had been explained to company officials. He said the driveway onto Oakwood would be

built at an angle toward Wayne Road, discouraging left turns onto the private street.

Council members indicated that the plans fell far short of what would be acceptable at the site.

In a memo to the council, the Westland Planning Commission recommended that the project be denied.

"As Oakwood is an unimproved private street, it cannot be used for commercial traffic access by the proposed Arbor Drug store without right-of-way dedication and subsequent paving by the developer of the site," the Planning Commission concluded.

Arbor representatives didn't immediately indicate whether they will revise their plans and submit a new proposal.

# Another trial ordered in traffic chase

A second Inkster woman has been ordered to stand trial in the traffic death of Crystal Deyampert, who slammed into a tractor-trailer while she and a friend were being chased at 80 miles per hour through Westland.

Wendy Smith, 23, was ordered Thursday to stand trial for vehicular manslaughter and fleeing the scene, even though she was only a passenger in the car that was chasing Deyampert when she was killed Sept. 19 at Inkster Road and Van Born.

Smith's defense attorney had argued that she shouldn't be tried on the same charges as driver Nicole Gibson, a 21-year-old Inkster woman who was ordered to stand trial after she waived a preliminary hearing on Oct. 5.

Following arguments from defense and prosecuting attorneys, Westland 18th District Judge C. Charles Bokos refused to reduce the charges on Thursday as Smith was bound over for trial in Detroit Recorder's Court.

Smith and Gibson are accused of chasing Deyampert, 22, and her passenger friend, 22-year-old Sharon Edwards, following a verbal dispute outside of the Side Pocket bar on Inkster Road near Cherry Hill.

Deyampert was thrown from her 1995 Toyota Camry and killed when she ran a red light at Inkster and Van Born and slammed into a tractor-trailer driven by David Crider.

Deyampert was driving south on Inkster; Crider was headed west on Van Born.

Edwards suffered a broken jaw and other injuries, but she is recovering.

Bokos ruled on Smith's charges after reviewing previous cases cited by attorneys. Defense attorney Mary Ellen O'Connell had argued during an Oct. 5 hearing that Smith had no control over Gibson's car and in no way caused Deyampert's death.

Edwards has testified that the dispute started outside of the Side Pocket when Smith mistakenly believed that Deyampert was laughing at her.

The dispute escalated when Deyampert and Edwards were chased for 2.7 miles on Inkster Road, until Deyampert hit Crider's truck. Crider wasn't injured.

Westland police officer James Dexter has testified that Smith

admitted drinking alcohol with Gibson prior to the chase.

Pending trial, Smith remains jailed in lieu of a \$50,000 cash bond. Gibson is free on a \$10,000 personal bond.

Bokos set a higher bond for Smith because, according to Dexter, she tried to flee when police went to arrest her. Smith also

to curriculum to the condition of school buildings.

"It's another way of getting input from the community," said Jay Young, director of community services.

Stottlemeyer was a kindergarten through sixth grade school for more than 30 years before the Wayne-Westland school board, in a massive budget cutting move last year, approved the closing of that and three other elementary schools to save money and reflect changing enrollment patterns.

Those programs include Head Start, a federally funded program for low-income families; Sparkey, which is a tuition-based program; Kids Plus, a no-fee program offered by the Michigan Department of Education for children identified to be at risk; and the no-fee Early Intervention/Pre-Primary Impaired, for children with one or more handicaps.

"This little girl has been through so much. At 12 hours of age, she had surgery to repair the opening in her spine."

The mother said that KaraJean had a shunt placed to drain cerebral fluid when she was only eight days old.

Due to shunt malfunctions, she has had to have four other shunt revisions during her first two years of age.

At the age of 4, KaraJean had a tethered spinal cord, in which

the spinal cord protrudes through the vertebrae and attached to her back, Laskosky said.

That required spinal surgery to repair. Two years ago, she had hip surgery to make a hip socket for her leg to be more stable.

"Since birth, I had been taking KaraJean to the neuro-muscular clinic at Beaumont Hospital in Royal Oak. Last October, I received word from her

orthopedic doctor that recent results indicated that her hip surgery did not work and her hip was again dislocated. He told me to bring her back when she was 15 and he would fuse her leg to her pelvis.

"Once again, I would stop at nothing."

The mother said she promised her daughter that "I would do anything to help make her comfortable. I refused to take this doctor's advice of making her go the next eight years with a dislocated hip.

"After a month and a half, I struck gold at the University of Michigan Hospital," she said.

Last January 17, a doctor did extensive hip surgery on Kara-

Jean, who was in a body cast until until March.

For another four to five months, the girl was in a wheelchair and not allowed to put weight on her legs.

She went from the wheelchair to using a walker.

"KaraJean is now doing well with the use of leg braces and a specially made shoe. Occasionally she used a walker or forearm crutches when her legs get tired. She also has the help of her 2-year-old sister, Stefany.

The mother credited the Wayne-Westland School District and school nurse Sandy Walker for meeting her needs at Madison.

## Father objects to signing school liability waiver

A Livonia School District father drove his daughter to the Detroit Zoo Friday because he refused to sign a waiver school officials insisted he sign in order for his daughter to attend the outing, sponsored by the preschool day program at Jackson School.

Greg Edgecomb Monday told the Livonia Board of Education, which represents the northern section of Westland, that he would take the day off from work and chaperon his daughter rather than sign a waiver absolving the district from all liability if, through negligence by a district employee, some harm befell her on the outing.

Edgecomb urged the trustees to delete the negligence clause from the waiver.

"I'll happily sign to hold the district harmless from liability, but not when it is from their own negligence," Edgecomb said. "A 3-year-old child does not know how to take care of herself at the zoo. They depend on us to be responsible for them. This is serious, when I'm told I have to relieve the district from liability because of someone else's negligence."

John Rennels, assistant superintendent for business, said the district couldn't sponsor outings in non-K-12 programs if it had to worry about being slapped with a lawsuit and had to pay a huge liability award. Preschool programs are not funded through the district's general operating fund, but from income generated by the programs themselves.

The district wouldn't be able to field volunteers for the outings if

volunteers had to worry about being involved in a lawsuit, he said.

"We need to encourage volunteers and protect them," Rennels said. "If we don't, there's no field trip."

Outings in non-K-12 programs need the special waiver because they don't carry the same broad immunity the state gives K-12 programs, Rennels said.

"Because of the waiver, no suits have been filed," Rennels said.

Over the years, some parents have refused to sign the waiver, he said. These parents are given the choice of having their child attend an alternate activity at the school when the outing takes place, or be transported to the outing by a family member.

Because of the broad legal protection given by the state, outings in K-12 programs don't require the waiver, Rennels said.

## Nominations still sought for First Citizen award

The deadline is just two days away to nominate people for the 10th annual First Citizen of Westland community service award.

The recognition program, co-sponsored by the Westland Observer and the Westland Chamber of Commerce, has a deadline of 5 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 25.

Nominees will be considered by a panel of judges, to be named later this month, on the basis of their community service activities and the impact those activities have had on the city or a segment of its residents.

# Condo developer's problems still haunting him

A developer's troubles with residents of one Westland condominium complex are haunting him as he seeks a new site plan for another development.

Residents of Quail Run condominiums on Hunter, west of Wayne Road, are accusing builder Randy Morris of failing to make repairs that they say he promised. But Morris says residents ap-

pear impossible to satisfy, even though he has made numerous repairs in an effort to address their concerns.

The ongoing dispute arose again during an Oct. 16 Westland City Council meeting when Morris sought approval for a revised site plan for RavenCrest, a new condominium development on Newburgh south of Marquette.

The Quail Run problems caused concern among council members who voted to postpone

for two weeks a decision on the RavenCrest site plan.

Robert Fritz, Westland building director, defended Morris and said the developer has addressed a long list of concerns earlier identified by Quail Run residents.

"The contractor in my opinion has really worked to go back and do the repairs," Fritz said, adding later that "some responsibility has to fall upon the homeowners."

Quail Run residents in August cited persistent problems with furnaces, leaky roofs and improper landscaping.

Though many problems have been addressed, some residents said during the latest council meeting that Morris has ignored their problems.

Homeowner Peg Vickers said her roof began leaking recently and that Morris' company hasn't kept a promise to fix the problem. "Had I known that their word

was trash, I would not have closed on my unit," Vickers said.

Morris said that residents' complaints "appear to be never-ending" and that he has reached the point of wanting an arbitrator to decide which repairs should be covered by warranty.

Morris had prepared a lengthy list of repairs that he made to Quail Run units, and the condominium association had been asked to sign the document confirming the repairs.

However, association president Ron Thompson refused to sign the document because some residents still aren't satisfied with Morris' response to problems.

"That's a big concern to me," Councilman Glenn Anderson said during the council meeting.

Anderson's colleagues approved his motion to postpone the RavenCrest site plan for two weeks, until issues in dispute can be studied.

# School board caucus offers scholarships

All students in the 1995-96 program who maintain established standards will be renewed for scholarships for 1996-97.

# Teacher certification

## New rules will allow 'experts' to teach

Charter schools — like the Nah Tah Wahsh and El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz public school academies — would be able to set their own standards for professional teacher orientation under new "alternative teaching certificate" rules approved by the State Board of Education.

The board gave the controversial rules 5-3 approval Oct. 18 and forwarded them to the Legislature for approval under the Administrative Procedures Act.

The rules are designed to allow experts in their fields to teach in public schools without going through the lengthy teacher certification process — college courses in education, student teaching under a mentor and provisional certification.

Under current rules, say those who want change, Lee Iacocca couldn't teach business, U.S. Sen. Carl Levin and Spence Abraham couldn't teach civics,

and filmmaker Ken Burns couldn't teach Civil War history in Michigan public schools.

Nah Tah Wahsh is a Potawatomi culture and language academy in Menominee, and El-Hajj Malik El-Shabazz offers a "holistic, Afrocentric curriculum" in Lansing, according to the Michigan Partnership for New Education's report to the State Board. They are among 37 charter schools. Charter schools would have broad powers to set standards and request "expert in residence" teaching permits under the new rules (see sidebar).

"Exert great caution," Jerry Robbins, dean of Eastern Michigan University's College of Education, warned the board, citing his experience in Georgia.

"Some (alternately certified teachers) were very good, but it was a disaster in other cases," Robbins went on. While teachers recruited from as far away as Germany to teach science, math and foreign languages knew their sub-

jects, they didn't know classroom management and how to motivate kids.

"There was enormous turnover. Many didn't survive the first semester. It was a wasted year for the kids," Robbins said.

Said Paula Wood, dean of Wayne State University's College of Education: "There's a consistent, positive relationship between student achievement in science and teachers' background in both education courses and science courses. Best student performance in math results from teachers who had higher numbers of math methods courses."

Wood said teachers who haven't taken courses in how to teach don't know curriculum development, don't know a variety of teaching methods, don't know cooperative learning, don't know about different learning styles and don't know classroom management.

Board president Clark Durant, however, urged immediate board

approval over protests from some members and the two university deans that the document had been kept under wraps until a few days before the meeting.

Voting yes were Republicans Durant of Grosse Pointe, Marilyn Lundy of Detroit, Gary Wolfram of Hillsdale, Sharon Wise of Owosso and Ruth Braun of Saginaw.

Voting no were Republican Dorothy Beardmore of Rochester Hills and Democrats Kathleen Straus of Detroit and Barbara Roberts Mason of Lansing.

The split is becoming a familiar one. Durant's group disdains the advice and input of educators and praises the marketplace as it junks "rules and regulations" that impede parental decisions.

Durant attempted to ridicule teacher certification standards by saying a Farmington School District principal recently rejected EMU's Dean Robbins as a math

## Split state board adopts new rules

Currently, a Michigan public school teacher must have earned a bachelor's degree and taken teacher preparation courses from a State Board-approved college; passed tests on basic skills, specific skills in the academic area; and teach in a classroom supervised by an experienced mentor.

Under new State Board of Education rules, two new kinds of teaching certificates for public

schools would be added:

1. **Experienced Individuals** teaching certificate for secondary schools. It would be valid five years and be renewable. The person must:

- Have at least a bachelor's degree from "an accredited" or State Board-approved college.

- Have five years of work experience in the area where he or she is to teach. Military and Peace Corps experience can be counted.

(Opponents noted that the applicant isn't required to have been successful in his/her work.)

- Passed basic skills and subject area tests.

- Meet requirements of "an education profession orientation program provided by a local school district, a public school academy, an intermediate school district, or a State Board-approved" college, or other entity approved by the State Board.

2. **Expert in Residence** teaching permit.

A person need not meet academic requirements but must have demonstrated talent, knowledge or experience as "requested by a local school district, public school academy or intermediate school district."

The certificate is requested by the district or academy and is valid only in that school and only in the subject area. It may be revoked.

# County puts local road projects on hold

Wayne County roads officials claim that as many as 31 of its federally-aided road improvement projects scheduled for 1996 and 1997 may be postponed for several years because of action taken by Gov. John Engler.

County officials are speaking out after the governor's announcement last Wednesday that the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) plans to keep \$192 million in federal road funds from coming to cities and counties over three years so MDOT can pay for several of its new highway projects.

County officials said the road improvement projects in jeopardy will affect county roads in nearly every Wayne County community.

"By this unconscionable action, Gov. Engler has in effect canceled 31 significant road improvements on our road system alone," said Russ Gronewelt, Wayne County's director of public services.

"The roads that pass in front of our houses and businesses are being sacrificed to MDOT can build new freeways," added Gronewelt.

Engler's plan calls for completion of the new Haggerty Con-

struction of Canton Center Road. ■ Garden City — resurfacing of Cherry Hill Road. ■ Livonia — reconstruction of Seven Mile and Eight Mile roads. ■ Plymouth Township — resurfacing of Haggerty and Plymouth roads. ■ Westland — Resurfacing of Van Born Road through Westland and Romulus. ■ Wayne — Resurfacing of Venoy Road.

Nearly 300 municipalities, road commissions, county boards of commissioners and statewide groups such as the Michigan Municipal League (MML), the Michigan Association of Counties (MAC) and the Michigan Townships Association (MTA), have sent resolutions to the Michigan Legislature decrying the condition of all Michigan roads and calling for a hike in the Michigan gasoline tax which has not been increased in almost 12 years.

Michigan ranks 49th in the percentage of roads under state jurisdiction and 30th in state highway mileage. Historically, local governments in Michigan have received more money because they are responsi-

ble for a much larger road system. The action to cut local construction funds in half follows on the heels of the soon to be felt impacts of the phase-out of Build Michigan monies which many locals used to supplement operating revenues.

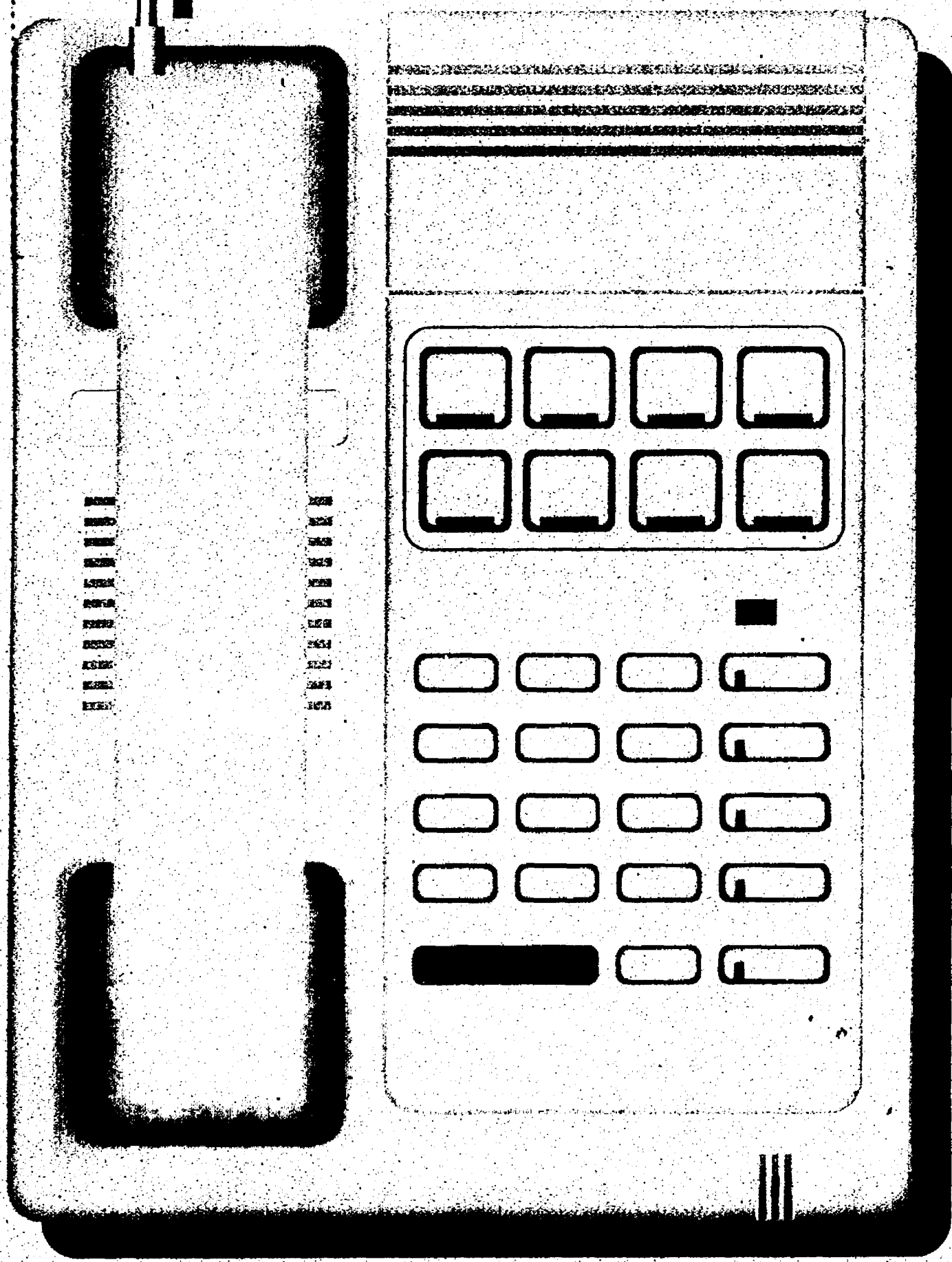

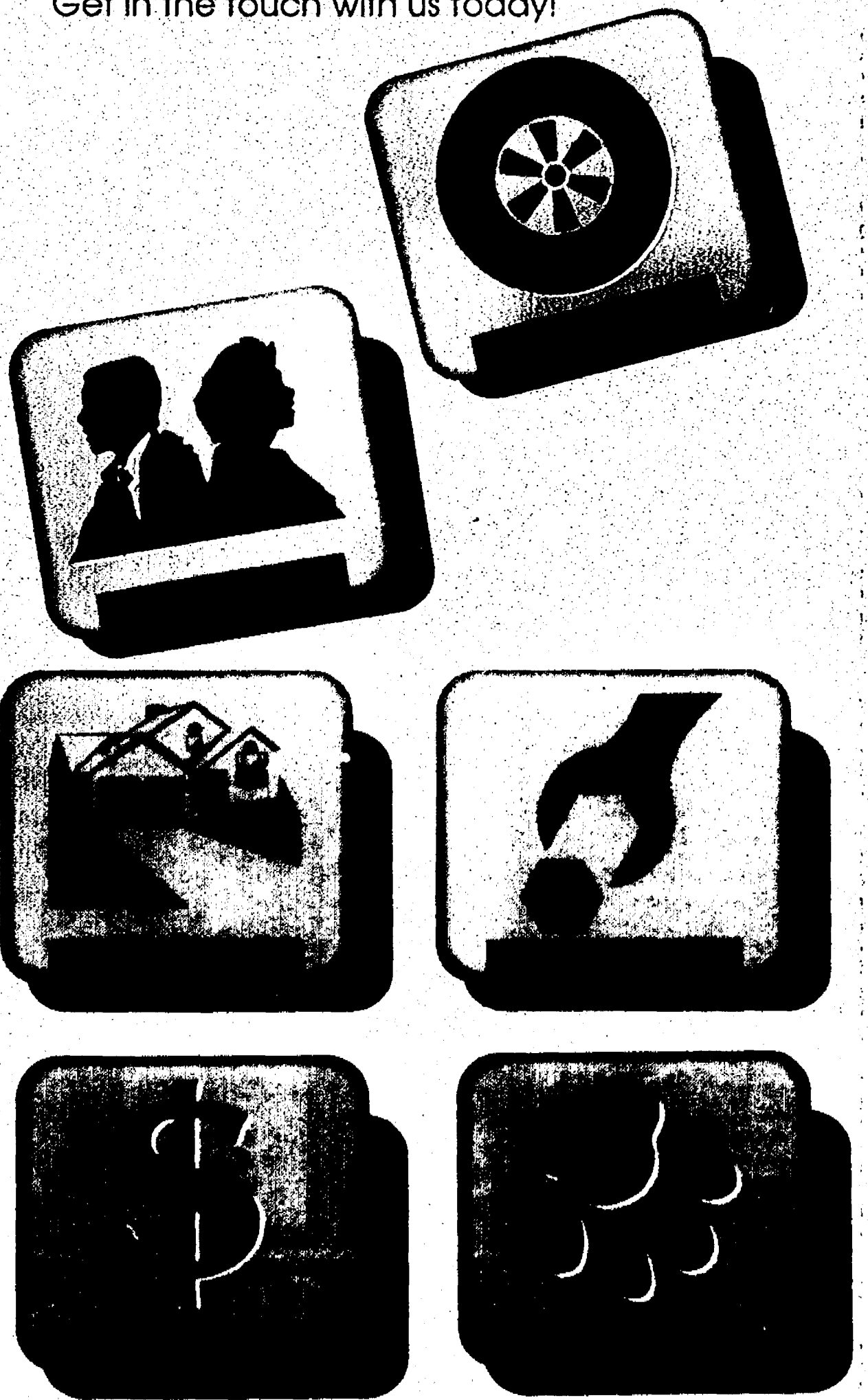

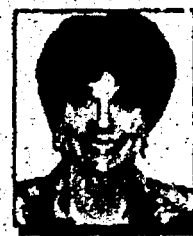

Vehicles are marked with the program logo — an eye and an ear with the program's name. The logo is intended to remind the public — and especially students — that employees operating the vehicles have communications equipment and can provide a safe respite.

"The employees' role is to observe and report," Taylor said. "They are advised not to attempt to apprehend anyone involved in an apparent crime. But their vehicles can serve as havens until the proper authorities arrive."

# Priest to discuss welfare that works

Welfare, a subject hotly debated in Washington, D.C., will be the topic of a luncheon address by the founder and president of The Acton Institute for the Study of Religion and Liberty Wednesday, Oct. 25.

The Rev. Robert Sirico will speak on "Welfare that Works" at the noon luncheon at the Detroit Athletic Club, 241 Madison, Detroit. Tickets cost \$20 and reservations are necessary.

A Catholic priest and full-time pastor, Sirico founded the Grand Rapids-based institute, a nonprofit think tank, to expose future religious leaders of all faiths to free-market ideas.

Sirico points out that without a change in the current welfare state, the condition of the poor will remain the same. The whole system discourages productivity and discourages giving on the part of the private sector, he said.

Sirico has proposed that government take less of a role and allow people to keep their charitable dollars. The Christian obligation to help others, he said, "would be more readily apparent and easier to carry out."

"The private sector is not being asked to duplicate the welfare state," he said. "Private charities need not spend what the government now spends on welfare. A third of the welfare budget is

as P.A. Hayek's "The Road to Serfdom," Milton Friedman's "Capitalism and Freedom" and Ludwig von Mises' "Socialism and Human Action."

Those works had a profound effect on him and convinced him that the unfettered free market served mankind's material needs and promoted freedom better than the socialism he had promoted. They introduced him to natural-law thinking, led him back to the Catholic church of his youth and eventually to the priesthood.

But while in the seminary, Sirico found his views weren't shared by many of those teaching there, so he founded the Acton Institute, named for British historian Lord Acton, best known for his warning that power corrupts and "absolute power corrupts absolutely."

The institute publishes a newsletter, "Religion & Liberty," and sponsors intensive three-day seminars to bring those entering the pulpit together with free-market scholars. It also sponsors a series of seminars for business leaders.

"The market fosters a number of positive virtues, such as thrift and hard work," Sirico has said. "In a truly free market, no one can make money without doing someone some good."

three times the amount needed to raise all poor people above the poverty line.

With a country that has grown dependent on government aid, Sirico believes that block grants, money channeled from the federal to state level for governors to dispense, represent a move in the right direction.

But, as Sirico sees it, the most

positive thing is people are working with alternatives and thinking of solutions that could bring an end to the current welfare system.

"We know of organizations which are successful at serving the needy without government funding," Sirico said. "It is our task to make these groups known to the wider community, including our legislators, because their way works better."

The ideas he spouts now are in sharp contrast to his earlier beliefs. At one time a left-wing political activist, he helped get Tom Hayden elected to office in California. His ideas, however, changed after reading such works

teacher for an experiment.

But Robbins embarrassed Durant by replying: "The principal at Farmington was right. My credentials are from other states and have expired." Robbins quoted the unnamed Farmington principal as saying, "Look at whose interests are to be served" — not the would-be teacher's but the students'.

"Success for kids is a three-legged stool: (the teacher's) knowledge of the subject matter, the ability to impart that knowledge to kids, and the hiring and placement. A person qualified to teach first grade may be a disaster with sixth-graders," Robbins said.

"Don't throw out the research we know exists. Read the research," said WSU's Wood during the audience participation part of the meeting.

Durant's assistant, Michael Warren, led a formal presentation on existing and proposed rules with three favorable witnesses — a procedure board member Straus criticized as stacked toward one point of view.

Pete Sinclair, of the Michigan Association of School Boards, said, "I can teach firefighting (in state-run courses) but not in the public schools. My daughter is a CPA (certified public accountant) and can teach accounting in a community college but not in a public school."

Jack Bliddle, of the Michigan Association of Secondary Schools Principals, said his group could support the state board plan "with safeguards." He added, "Schools have had real problems hiring so-called professionals as coaches . . . Being successful in business does not guarantee one's teaching ability."

Ward Staffield, a 17-year staffer with Ingham Circuit Court, said he'd like to make a mid-career switch to teach history and coach.

But he said he can't get night courses in universities to complete his education course requirements, and couldn't spare 14 weeks away from his job to do student teaching.

## Auto activity accounts for recent business slide

The Detroit Area Business Activity Index compiled by Comerica Bank registered 163 in September, sliding back eight points from August's 14-point economic surge.

In August the index stood at 171, while in July it registered 157.

"At a level of 163 in September, Detroit's economy was operating 2 percent above year-ago levels, and for the first three quarters of 1995, the index was up 2 percent over last year," said Comerica Bank economist David L. Littmann.

"In the third quarter alone, Detroit's economy was up a robust

5.5 percent from the third quarter of 1994.

"August's surge represented an unusual burst of activity, stemming from the auto changeover in July," Littmann said, adding that September's decline showed:

- Continuing deceleration in the automotive sector.

- Slippage in electric power sales and aggregate financial activity.

### Some foods are better without a grain of salt

**W**e discarded the salt shaker long ago at our house and mainly keep a box of Morton's handy for when it comes time to clean a wooden salad bowl.

But I would be lying if I told you the Janes Gang cooks without a grain of salt.

You don't need a salt shaker to add salt to foods. I was shocked when I read the label on my favorite canned chicken broth and learned it is loaded with sodium. Then there's the fat-free salad dressing mix, the package of taco seasoning, the ketchup bottle, and of course, fast-food burgers to which we do occasionally succumb.

But as Gomer Pyle would say, "Surprise, surprise, surprise!" There are some foods that actually taste better without the addition of salt. Take a garden fresh salad.

Dress it with good olive oil, a splash of lemon juice, and a hint of chopped garlic, toss it and you get the flavor Mother Nature intended it to have. Freshness, and the lack of salt, make for greater tasting vegetables, especially when steamed, boiled or stir-fried and dressed only with a splash of fresh lemon.

Contrary to popular belief, the pasta you usually add a handful of salt to while boiling will not taste insipid without the addition of salt. There are also a number of intriguing salt-free sauces that are available.

Homemade salt-free mayonnaise is enlivened with a healthy tablespoon or two of plain yogurt. Meat, fish and poultry need not be encased in salt, and really will cook better and retain more of their juices without the shake of salt before roasting, baking or pan frying.

But what is today's health conscious cook supposed to replace salt with? Are there any magical jars of secret condiments that can actually do what salt does — make your food taste better?

Yours truly enjoys a prepackaged product called "Mrs. Dash Table Blend," which is a blend of herbs and spices that actually replaces flavor. But to be perfectly honest, it can't even come close to replacing the needed salt in a tabbouleh salad, homemade gravy or french fries.

### Flavor enhancers

Researchers say that the best substitute for salt is fresh lemon. Not the reconstituted bottled version, but the real stuff, freshly squeezed. They say it tends to bring out natural flavors, especially in meat, fish and poultry. Lemon, of course, is paramount in the broiling of fish.

Vinegar and wine also have the ability to add flavor. Pork responds remarkably well to vinegar and does even better when brushed with a mustard-honey glaze to counteract the bitterness of the vinegar during the last 45 minutes of cooking.

A sprig of rosemary tucked innocently inside a pork roast will offer a scent you will remember in the kitchen and not just a great new taste.

Many dishes are immediately associated with a specific herb. A lamb roast awakens at the touch of mint or rosemary. Saltimbocca, the specialty of Rome, is subtly scented with sage.

A good steak or roast, rubbed with a split clove of garlic, can do you no wrong. Basil loves noodles (i.e. pesto), and a good bay leaf can do wonders to a stew. Always right, parsley is a must have when making a fresh vinaigrette, even something made up in a Good Seasons cruet, while oregano works wonders when coupled with anything in a tomato base.

### Spices

Ditto for spices. The classic French blend quatre spices (four spices) contains five tablespoons of ground cloves and three tablespoons each of ginger, nutmeg and pepper. This blend is used generously in the making of hearty soups, rich sauces, meats, and even fruits.

You say bechamel and I say the white sauce for macaroni and cheese would be absolutely nothing without a fresh grating of nutmeg.

Nutmeg also gives a touch of the unusual to the humble meatloaf or meatball or the classic cheese and spinach pie. The list is endless.

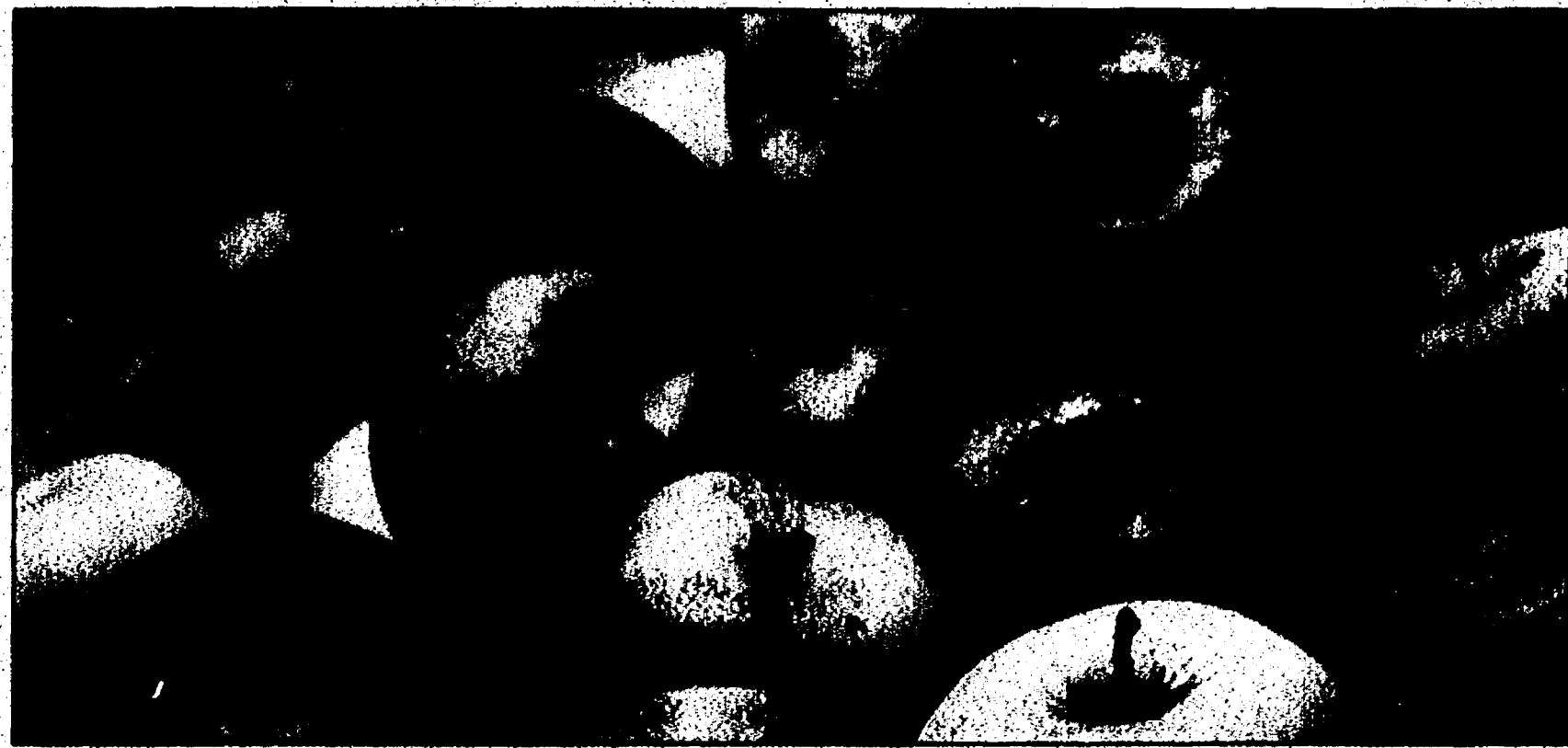
Many of you are like me and are looking to modify your daily intake of salt. That's what food police are warning us to do, but be advised — cheese, prepared sauces such as soy, Worcestershire, mustard and pickles all contain excessive amounts of salt.

# 50ifty things to do with apples

- Grate apples and low-fat cheese for a filling for an omelette.
- Add diced apples to a spinach salad.
- Mix and puree diced apples, frozen strawberries, frozen concentrated fruit punch and low-fat plain yogurt for a creamy drink.
- Toss cubed turkey, plain yogurt, chopped apples and walnuts together; serve as a salad or in pita bread.
- Add diced apples and raisins to rice cooked in apple cider for delicious rice pilaf.
- Apples make great "dippers." Try dipping slices in spreadable cheese or peanut butter. Thin the peanut butter with applesauce for smoother dipping.
- Saute julienne-style apples and carrots; sprinkle with herbs.
- Mix applesauce with wine and lemon juice; serve over baked chicken breast.
- Add apple slices and apple cider to melted butter and chopped onions; pour mixture over baking fish, such as haddock or cod.
- Stir sherry into applesauce; serve with ham or pork entree as a garnish.
- Mix apple chunks or applesauce into low-fat plain or vanilla yogurt and season with a dash of cinnamon.
- Turn a peanut butter & jelly sandwich into a peanut butter & apple sandwich. Substitute apple slices for jelly on peanut butter sandwiches.
- Mix apple chunks into oatmeal or put on top of pancakes to energize your breakfast.
- Apples and cheese are a great combination for a dessert tray. Gouda, Swiss, Monterey Jack and Cheddar go well with apples.
- Toss apple chunks in a chicken and vegetable stir-fry. Coat with a sauce made from 1/2 cup apple cider, 2 tablespoons teriyaki sauce and 2 teaspoons cornstarch. Cook until sauce is thickened.
- Layer classic Reuben ingredients on caraway rye bread. Add apple slices before placing cheese slices on sandwich.
- Grill chickens with a sauce made from applesauce, lemon juice and tomato sauce. Or pour the sauce over chicken breasts and bake.
- For a quick dessert, microwave whole or pared apples in cider until tender. Sprinkle Grape Nuts cereal on top for added crunch.
- Freeze individual serving containers of apple juice or applesauce and put in a lunch bag to keep other foods cool. It will thaw by lunchtime, yet still be cold.
- Core an apple. Cut it in half and carve out some of the flesh. Fill the cavities of both halves with tuna, ham or chicken salad or peanut butter and raisins. Place the two halves together and you have a portable, totally edible package.
- For each quart of hot mulled apple cider, add 1 cinnamon stick, 1/2 teaspoon whole cloves, 1/2 cup brown sugar, 1/4 teaspoon allspice and thin orange wedges dotted with cloves. Bring to a boil, then simmer for 10 minutes.
- Add canned apples slices to prepared granola. Serve as a topping for French toast, pancakes, and waffles.
- Fill 4 cored apples with a mixture of 1 cup chopped cranberries, 1/4 cup sugar, 1/4 cup apple cider, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, and 1/2 cup chopped nut meats. Bake, cool slightly, then serve with a spoonful of whipped topping.
- Combine apple juice and instant tea, and add a cinnamon stick.
- Combine chopped, canned apple slices with pancake batter; serve with warmed maple syrup mixed with applesauce.
- Make apple butter. Combine 5 pounds of peeled and sliced apples, 2 cups apple cider, 2 teaspoons cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon each allspice, cloves and nutmeg. Cook until apples are soft, then add 2 cups brown sugar. Cook slowly for several hours until thickened and smooth.
- Add diced apples to chicken salad made with yogurt. Sprinkle with hulled sunflower seeds.
- Combine cooked sliced apples, vanilla and cinnamon and add to low-fat yogurt.
- Place tuna salad mixture on toasted whole wheat bread. Top with sliced apples, raisins and bean sprouts.
- Use apples in baking a spicy coffee cake.
- Warm up Halloween parties with an "Apple Brandy Sizzler." Mix 2 ounces brandy, 6 ounces of apple cider, 1/2 ounce lime juice, 1 cinnamon stick and 2 cloves. Heat, but do not boil. Remove from heat, and add 1 teaspoon dark rum and a slice of lime.
- Try apple butter on roast beef, ham or roast chick sandwiches. Spread between slices to keep bread from getting soggy.
- Mix freshly chopped fresh apple and chopped walnuts into cranberry sauce.
- Prepare the Thanksgiving turkey with apple-walnut stuffing, and garnish with decoratively sliced apples.
- Decorate a room with baskets of fresh apples and whole nuts. Use a light coating of mayonnaise to give apples a holiday glow.
- Create fancy carved apple garnishes for hors d'oeuvre trays.
- Serve canapes and cheese slices on apple disks, slices or wedges instead of crackers.
- Top apple slices with pate, cheese, sour cream or sausage rounds.
- Put round apple slices on one side of the chop-and-dip plate for a healthful alternative to chips.
- Apple candle holders: Select a large, round, squatly apple, core from the stem end, but don't puncture through the blossom end of the apple insert candle. Decorate with side pieces of greenery.
- Mix vanilla yogurt and applesauce together and freeze for a frozen.
- Spread applesauce over hot oatmeal, ice cream or pudding or mix in granola for a sweet crunch.
- Make Jell-O with apple juice instead of water for an extra tasty snack or dessert.
- Mix chopped apples and peanut butter and spread on celery sticks.
- Stir together crunchy peanut butter and applesauce. You can mix raisins or toasted wheat germ. Keep this easy-to-spread mixture in the fridge for quick snacks. Spread it on bread or crackers or use as a healthy and delicious dip.
- Spoon canned, precooked apples over sliced ham. Sprinkle the ham with ground cloves and the apples with ground cinnamon. Broil, and serve as a main dish.
- Combine canned apples with complementary foods, such as prepared carrots or sweet potatoes.
- Fill the cavities of one halved acorn or butternut squash with canned apple slices. Sprinkle with brown sugar and a pinch of cinnamon. Dot with butter, if desired. Cover and bake 10-12 minutes on high in the microwave until tender.
- Toast slices of bakery pound cake, top with heated canned apple slices, then pour on a sauce made of vanilla yogurt thinned slightly with milk.
- Just pick up an apple and bite it!

## Michigan's harvest, one of the best

October is National Apple Month, when we celebrate America's favorite fruit.

There are about 7,500 varieties of apples grown worldwide and 2,500 varieties grown in the United States. About 250 varieties are grown in Michigan, but only about 12 major types for retail.

"This has been the greatest year ever for Michigan apples," said Patrick O'Connor, spokesman for the Michigan Apple Commission. "We're looking at a record 28.8 million bushels, an increase over 1993, when we also had a record crop."

"The weather that was detrimental to so many other agricultural products was perfect for producing big, juicy apples. The recent weather — cool nights and warm days — is just what we need to develop flavor and color."

Michigan ranks second nationally in apple production, exporting apples to South America, Europe, and even Saudi Arabia.

Unlike so many other industries, most of our state's 1,400 apple growers are still "Mom and Pop" businesses, with orchards of 50 acres or less.

One of these family-owned orchards is Davies Orchard and Cider Mill, in Salem Township. Co-owner (with husband and in-laws) Judy Davies has been growing Paula Red; McIntosh; Jonathan; Empire; Red and Yellow Delicious; Ida Red; Winesap, and Rome apples from 2,000 trees on a 20-acre farm for just over 20 years. They recently added Gala and Jonagold varieties.

The Davies have a retail store in the barn where they also sell cider and honey, and doughnuts on weekends when business is brisk. They also have a thriving u-pick business.

"We keep the trees sized down so people can pick their apples without ladders," said Davies. The Davies' customers receive a fact sheet that includes several methods for putting apples by.

"The important thing is that there's a steady temperature, between 32 and 40 degrees,"

said Davies. "A temperature fluctuation is bad for apples; One of the best ways to store them is to put them in a plastic bag and keep them in an extra fridge in the garage or the basement."

"Some people wrap apples individually in newspaper and store in the attic in a Styrofoam container. An attic is better than a garage because it gets a little heat leak from the rest of the house. A detached garage is a little too cold, depending on the severity of the winter, of course, but in an attached garage you can store them against the inside wall, as I do. I had an aunt who used to put them in plastic bags and store them in the attic under a pile of blankets."

Davies has been in the apple business for 23 years, and she still loves apples. "There are so many varieties, and each has a different flavor, how could I get tired of them?" "I have hundreds of apple recipes on file, but my favorite is still good old American apple pie."

Apples are a good source of vitamins A and C, and minerals. A medium apple provides 4 grams of dietary fiber. The soluble fiber in apples, called pectin, is similar to that in oat bran and can be a factor in cholesterol reduction. An average apple has just 80 calories, contains 170 mg. of potassium, is high in complex carbohydrates, and has no sodium or cholesterol.

A recent Michigan State University study revealed that apple eaters had fewer respiratory infections and tension-related complaints. Additionally, a USDA study found that the mineral boron in apples makes bones stronger and may help prevent osteoporosis.

It's true what they say, an apple a day keeps the doctor away.

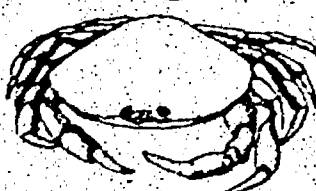

# Onion, vinegar, cloves enliven saltless chicken

CHICKEN SALOME

- 2 frying chickens, cut up (about 4 pounds)
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 1/4 cup white vinegar
- 7 whole cloves tied in cheesecloth or placed in a tea ball
- 1 teaspoon prepared mustard
- 1 teaspoon tomato paste

Place chicken, skin side down, in a large heavy skillet (it doesn't matter if pieces overlap).

Add onion, vinegar and cloves. Cover and cook over low heat until tender, about 40 minutes, turning and basting several times during cooking.

Combine mustard with tomato paste. Skim as much fat as possible

from the chicken. Stir in mustard tomato mixture until well blended with chicken and the broth.

Continue cooking uncovered over medium low heat for 20 minutes. Discard cloves before serving. Serves 6-8.

Chef's secret: Make this a healthy low cal dish by skinning the chicken first!

BUET GARNI

- 3-4 good sized sprigs of parsley
- 1 bay leaf
- 2 sprigs fresh thyme or 1 teaspoon dried
- 1 large clove garlic
- 6 peppercorns
- 3 large celery leaves or 1 teaspoon coriander

Blend ingredients. Use in homemade soups and stocks.

HOMEMADE CHILI POWDER

- 3 tablespoons paprika
- 1 tablespoon turmeric
- 1/4 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 large cloves garlic, finely minced or smashed

Combine all ingredients and mix well. Simmer the chili at least 15 minutes after combining this seasoning for optimum results. Makes about 1/2 cup.

Here's the basics for your next batch of rich gravy!

GREMOLATA

- 2 tablespoons finely chopped parsley
  - 1 clove garlic, minced very fine
  - 1/2 teaspoon grated lemon rind
- Sprinkle this mixture on a homemade gravy during the last 5 minutes of cooking. Simmer, covered, over very low heat so the flavors can be absorbed. Makes about 2 1/2 tablespoons.

CHUNKY CIDER APPLESAUCE

- 6 large apples (about 3 pounds) any variety
- 1/2 cup apple cider or apple juice
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- Spices to taste — ground cinnamon, ginger, cloves, allspice or mace

Peel and core apples. Cut into chunks. Put apples into a 3-quart saucepan with apple cider or apple juice. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, cover and simmer about 20 minutes, until apples are tender.

Stir in sugar and spices. Cook 2 minutes longer. Mash with potato masher until chunky. Let cool. Pack in clean jars. Refrigerate up to 2 weeks.

To make baked apples, use Cortland (slightly tart); Golden Delicious (sweet and tangy); Granny Smith (Tart); Pippin (mildly tart); or Rome Beauty (slightly tart).

BAKED APPLES

- 4 large baking apples (about 1 1/4 pound)
- Desired filling (see below)
- 1/2 cup apple juice, cider, or dry white wine
- Sweetened whipped cream, vanilla yogurt, light cream, or frozen vanilla yogurt
- Ground nutmeg to taste

Prepare desired filling. Core apples, but do not cut through the other end. Turn corer or peeler to loosen the upper part of the core. Remove and discard core. Enlarge hold slightly at the top of the apple for filling.

Using a vegetable peeler or paring knife, remove the peel from the top half of each apple. If desired, with the tines of a fork, score the peeled apple.

Place apples in an 8 by 8 by 2-inch baking dish. Spoon filling into center of each apple. Add cider, juice, or wine to the dish and bake, covered, in a 350-degree F. oven

about 45 minutes, or until fork-tender. Transfer apples to dessert dishes, spoon liquid in dish over apples and serve warm with whipped cream, yogurt, cream, or frozen yogurt. Sprinkle with nutmeg.

Apple Fillings

- Dried fruit. Combine 1/2 cup raisins, currants, or mixed dried fruit bits, 2 tablespoons brown sugar and 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon.
- Ginger-almond: Stir together 1 tablespoon chopped crystallized ginger, 1/4 cup slivered almonds or pine nuts, and 2 tablespoons apricot preserves.
- Orange macaroon: Toss 1/2 cup crumbled soft coconut macaroon cookies with 2 tablespoons orange marmalade.
- Peanut butter: Mix 1/2 cup coconut with 1/4 cup chunky peanut butter.
- Apple-walnut: In a bowl blend 1/2 cup apple butter with 1/4 cup chopped walnuts.

# Indian dessert stars carrots

AP — "There is no other time of the year when carrots are bigger, oranger, sweeter or more plentiful," writes Sharon Parquette Nimitz in the September-October issue of her newsletter, "CookSpeak."

Nimitz has adapted Madhur Jaffrey's recipe for carrot halva, which is flavored with shelled, unsalted pistachios and golden raisins. (Halva usually consists of a paste made of ground sesame seeds and nuts mixed with honey.) "I love this Indian dessert," Nimitz says. "This is utterly unlike carrots, yet their true expression." Eat it in little spoonfuls, with or without cream.

CARROT HALVA

(Adapted from Madhur Jaffrey's "Indian Cooking")

- 6 medium carrots
- 3 cups whole milk
- 8 whole cardamom pods
- 5 tablespoons vegetable oil or ghee
- 5 tablespoons sugar
- 1 or 2 tablespoons golden raisins
- 1 tablespoon shelled, unsalted pistachios, lightly crushed
- 1 1/4 cups heavy cream, lightly whipped, optional

Peel and grate the carrots; put them with the milk and cardamom into a heavy-bottomed pot. Bring to a boil, turn heat to medium and cook, stirring now and then, until milk has been absorbed, 30 minutes to one hour, usually, depending on the size of the pot.

Heat the oil in a wide frying pan over a medium-low heat.

Put the carrot mixture into it; stir and fry until the carrots acquire a rich, reddish sheen, about 20 to 30 minutes.

Add the sugar, raisins and pistachios; stir and fry for another few minutes. Serve warm or at room temperature with a slat of the cream, or without. Makes 4 servings.

Note: To make ghee, or clarified butter, melt 1 stick of butter until the solids fall to the bottom, then carefully pour off the clear oil from them. # Flash-in-the-pan skillet supper

AP — With the school and weeknight dinner routine back in full swing again, quick-to-fix dinners are necessary after the casual summertime approach to eating.

The following recipe is an under-30 minutes meat and potatoes dish. It calls for just a handful of ingredients, is easy to assemble and is loaded with flavor. Cut the fat by using reduced-fat smoked sausage. Serve with a salad of mixed greens and some crusty French bread.

FLASH-IN-THE-PAN SKILLET SUPPER

Preparation time: 10 minutes

Cooking time: 20 minutes

- 1 cup (about 1 1/2 ounces) dried tomato halves, snipped in half
- 1 1/2 pounds (4 medium) potatoes, sliced
- 1 tablespoon vegetable oil
- 12 ounces reduced-fat smoked sausage, sliced 1/4-inch thick
- 1/4 cup sliced green onions
- 1/2 cup prepared honey-Dijon barbecue sauce

In a bowl cover tomatoes with hot water; set aside 10 minutes. Place potatoes in microwave-safe bowl; cover, venting one corner. Cook on high (100 percent power) about 8

minutes, just until tender.

Meanwhile, heat oil in large non-stick skillet. Add sausage; cook and toss over medium-high heat 5 minutes. Add potatoes; cook and toss 6 minutes. Drain and add tomatoes, then onions and barbecue sauce. Cook and toss 2 to 3 minutes until heated through. Makes 4 servings.

Note: Microwave cooking times are based on 700-watt microwave oven. Adjust cooking times to your own oven.

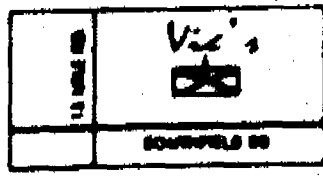
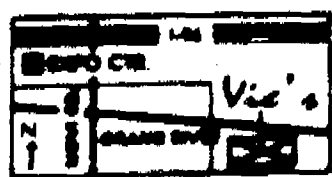

# Survey shows snackers showing sense

- 1 medium red onion (about 5 ounces), peeled and sliced into paper-thin rounds
- 7 large, well-ripened plum tomatoes (about 1 1/4 pounds), washed, ends trimmed, and sliced into 1/4-inch rounds
- 2 teaspoons extra-virgin olive oil
- 1/2 teaspoon coarse salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly milled black pepper
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh oregano or 1 teaspoon dried oregano

Adjust oven rack to center of oven; preheat to 350 degrees F.

Lightly grease a 9- by 13- by 2-inch ovenproof baking dish with olive oil cooking spray.

Arrange half of the turnips in an overlapping pattern in prepared baking dish. Scatter half the onion slices over the top. Arrange half of the plum tomatoes in a single layer over onions. Brush surface of tomatoes with half of the olive oil.

Sprinkle half of the salt, pepper and oregano over top. Arrange second layer the same as first with remaining ingredients. Cover with foil and bake in preheated oven 350-degree F oven until turnips are tender when tested with the tip of a knife, about 65 to 60 minutes. Remove from oven and discard foil.

Adjust oven rack to 4 inches from heat source and preheat to broil setting.

Return turnips to oven and broil until a light crust forms on surface of tomatoes, about 3 to 4 minutes. Serve hot or at room temperature. Makes 6 servings.

Hot items this year are vintage Colonial-style tapestry and velvet waistcoats inspired by Interview With A Vampire. Also look for Confederate uni-

forms; Southern belle hoop skirts; wild '60s flower child halters, vests and bell bottoms; and jaunty sailor suits. Boxes of accessories will spark your imagination. Dig through piles of hats, veils, shawls and Cleopatra collars.

Costume sales are expected to top \$400 million this year, according to University of Detroit Mercy marketing professor Michael Bernacchi, J.D. In his newsletter, The Mike-rescope, Bernacchi shares his haunting research.

Speaking of treats, Jacobson's has a corner on goodies. I found candy corn in decorative tins (\$5.95) and Bright Fright votives (\$8.95). Tall bewitching cans hold mini chocolate chip cookies (\$9.95). Pumpkins are filled with jellybeans and chocolate jack-o-lanterns (\$4.95). There's even witch's brew (\$3.95), spider cookie dough mix (\$9.95) and table accessories to ensure a perfect party.

If you're really into weird stuff, call 800-231-6000 for a Brainstorms catalog, the best of the bizarre. Besides the biggest selection of spooky skeletons, you'll find mechanical fleshy hands, gelatin-shaped body parts and a Face Mask Magnifier with instructions on how to make hundreds of wacky faces. There's professional-style Ninja suits, groovy glasses with flashing lights, even a Doggie Bones costume for Fido. It's an amazing accumulation of oddities. Finally, to ward away the goblins, the folks at Four Seasons Garden Center in Oak Park recommend a Pumpkin Head Scarecrow. With cornucopia nose and cucumber



eyes, he's sure to frighten evil spirits while he charms fairy princesses and all other good little trick-or-treaters.

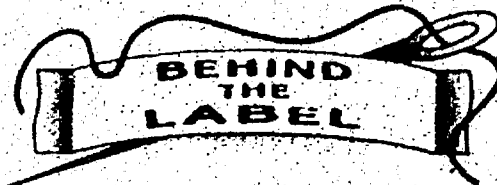
There is chocolate and then there's Jerbeau Chocolate.

past three years, sales have increased by 40-percent.

"I began managing my parents' retail chocolate manufacturing business in 1977," she said. "By 1982, I decided to separate the wholesale operations to produce a superior line of American chocolates made with American ingredients, no added preservatives, waxes or fillers. I wanted a clean product."

"From time to time, we had to lower our profit margins, but I'm proud to say, we never lowered our product standards."

Born in Budapest, Hungary,

Coburn emigrated to the U.S. with her family at age 13. She graduated from University of Southern California where she studied medicine. Her father's illness brought her into the business.

Coburn and her husband are raising three children in Agoura, Ca. With homefront help from her mother, too, she's able to cross the country a few times each month, representing Jerbeau Chocolates.

"The name Jerbeau came from combining my family name, Jambor, and the name of the Hungarian chef whose recipes launched the firm, Gerbeaud," she explained. "Our staff numbers between 60 and 110, depending on

the time of year. We make three kinds of chocolates — American-style (honeycombs, strawberry cremes, toffees and peanut butters), European-style (hazelnuts, nugats, fruits and marzipans), and Truffles.

"My children got their first 'taste' of the business this summer when I paid them \$2 an hour to fold boxes. They did very well. By the end of the summer, they earned a raise!"

Coburn described herself as "driven" and "focused." She said she thinks and worries endlessly about the business.

"To relax, I run four times a week, or my husband and I go rock climbing. You can't think of anything else while climbing, it

requires all your attention. This helps me."

Coburn works with three charities that are close to her heart: Pediatric AIDS, Special Olympics, and Planned Parenthood. Customers will soon see a new Jerbeau product on the shelves, a high-energy "health" bar inspired by the need for sustenance while rock climbing and the long, away-from-home, hours required of families today.

"Watch for my power bar," she said. "Fuel food. Complex carbohydrates. And it'll taste good, too. I promise."

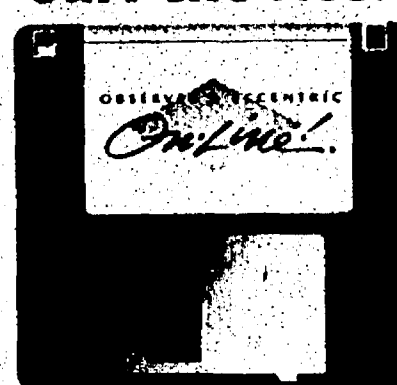
At the turn of the century, Marshall Field's was the largest wholesale and retail dry-goods establishment in the world.

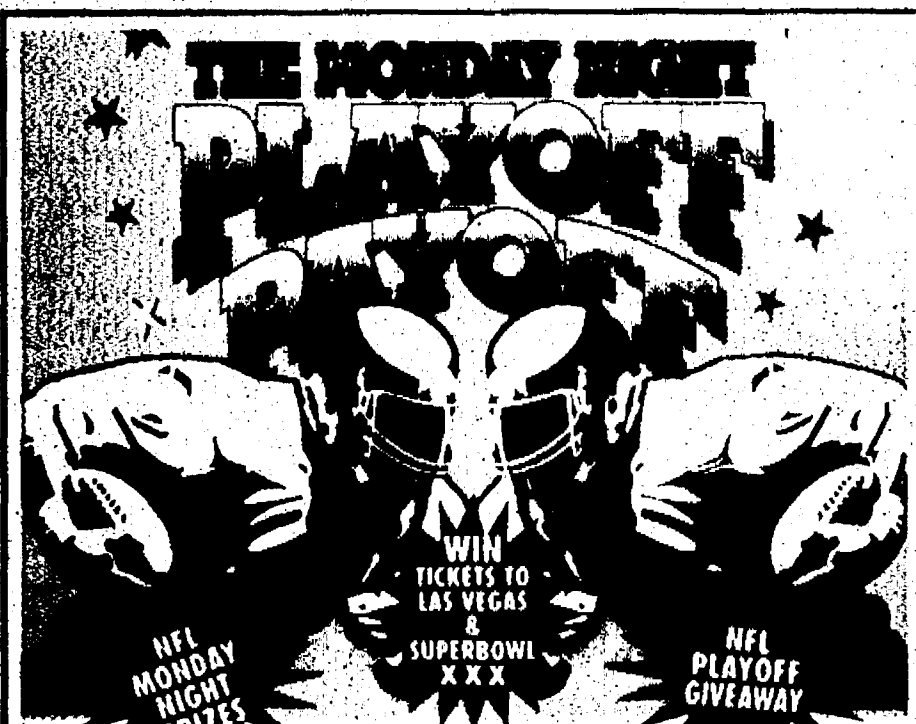

# 'Mallrats' fails to capture rude edge

Four years ago Kevin Smith sold his comic book collection to help fund his \$23,000 debut feature, "Clerks." Not only has he probably been able to buy it back; he's snagged Marvel Comics legend Stan Lee for a cameo in his sophomore effort, "Mallrats."

The new film should be a similar dream come true for fans of Smith's rude, raw brand of humor. But while "Mallrats" tries hard to recapture that edge, the gags fall mostly flat.

Brodie and T.S. are a pair of twentysomething lads about who live at the local shopping mall, buying comic books, eating at the food court, and pondering the meaning of life. Coincidentally they've just been dumped by their girlfriends and spend the rest of the film trying to win them back.

Played by skateboard champ Jason Lee and "Dazed and Confused" star Jeremy London, these are extensions of Dante and Randy, the convenience store employees from "Clerks." Brodie, whose latest invention is a "stink hand" handshake, walks a thin line between offensive sociopath and oddly endearing social critic.

They enlist the help of Jay and Silent Bob, a pair of obnoxious, slightly menacing drug dealers from the previous film. Wearing the same backwards baseball caps and rock T-shirts, they devise elaborate Wile E. Coyote-style plans to destroy a live television taping.

Their bungling leads to some of the film's funniest moments. Chased by security guards and trapped in a dead end corridor, the dynamic duo shoots a Bat-hook into the rafters and jetsions

to safety. Meanwhile, Silent Bob (played by director Smith) believes he can move objects with his mind.

One of the girlfriends is played by Shannen Doherty, enjoying her first big screen opportunity since leaving the cast of "Beverly Hills 90210." Though hardly a career-saving part, she's not bad, though Smith can't help but plant an inside joke when someone recognizes her as Brenda.

Mostly the movie suffers from overkill. Stan Lee almost embarrasses himself in a much-too-lengthy cameo where he talks about his comic book heroes as reactions to a lost love. Character actor Michael Rooker has a thankless part as a shaved-head comic foil for our heroes.

Even the best running gag — a lumpy guy camps out in front of one of those irritating 3-D Magic Eye displays where everyone can see the sailboat but him — doesn't know how to deliver a satisfying payoff. Like most of the movie, it just repeats itself and then trickles away.

# Versatile rice will help stretch food dollars

AP — Rice's versatility and nutritional benefits can fit into anyone's diet, but it can also stretch the food budget.

Because of its mild flavor and ability to absorb other flavors, rice can be incorporated into almost any recipe for soups, salads, main dishes and desserts.

The U.S. Department of Agriculture recommends the largest portion of a diet should come from the rice, bread, cereal and pasta group. Recommended daily intake is six to 11 servings; with a serving defined as half a cup of rice.

The nutritional benefits of rice are many.

"Rice is high in complex carbohydrates, and when combined with beans or lentils, it is considered a complete protein," said Meliassa Mixon, extension human nutrition specialist at Mississippi State University.

If nothing is added during preparation or serving, rice is low in fat, sodium and has no cholesterol. A single serving has only 103 calories for regular mill white rice and 106 calories for brown rice.

While brown rice provides slightly more fiber, vitamin E, phosphorus and calcium than white rice, most of the rice sold in the United States is enriched. Enriched rice is high in iron, thiamin and niacin.

By adding rice to a dish, you can increase the number of serv-

ings in a meal.

"Rice is an extender of the food dollar. It can be used in most dishes and adds to the number of portions," said Mixon. "It is low in cost and in the uncooked form can be stored in an airtight container on a shelf or in a pantry for long periods of time."

Once rice has been cooked, Mixon said to treat it with the principles of food safety in mind.

"If cooked rice is left at room temperature for more than two hours then it should be thrown away, especially if the dish contains any kind of meat," said Mixon. "Remember to always refrigerate immediately after serving."

Here are some nutritious recipes using rice:

### EASY PORK FRIED RICE

1½ tablespoons vegetable oil, divided

2 eggs, beaten  
1 cup diced fully cooked ham  
1 cup finely chopped fresh mushrooms  
½-cup thinly sliced green onions  
3 cups cooked brown rice, chilled  
1 tablespoon reduced-sodium soy sauce

Heat ½-tablespoon oil over medium heat in large skillet or wok. Add eggs and cook without stirring until set. Invert skillet over baking sheet to removed cooked eggs; cut in ¼-inch strips.

In a skillet, heat remaining 1 tablespoon oil over medium-high heat. Stir-fry ham, mushrooms, and onions in oil about 3 minutes, or until mushrooms and onions are tender. Stir in cooked rice and reserved egg strips; sprinkle with soy sauce. Toss lightly; heat thoroughly. Makes 4 servings.

### TURKEY AU GRATIN

1 Package (4.5 to 5.2 oz.) broccoli rice au gratin rice mix  
1 cup cubed smoked turkey  
1 jar (2 oz.) pimento  
12 buttery crackers, crushed

Prepare rice mix in 2-quart saucepan according to package directions. Add turkey and pimento; heat thoroughly. Transfer to serving dish; top with cracker crumbs. Makes 4 servings.

# Add spice to sweet potato pie

AP — The following recipe for sweet potato pie uses vanilla and cinnamon instead of the more commonly used flavorings of pumpkin pie spice, nutmeg and cloves.

Try adding chopped toasted almonds or macadamia nuts to the crust, then garnish with whipped cream, topped with additional nuts.

### SWEET POTATO PIE

1¼ cups cooked mashed sweet potatoes

¾ cup granulated sugar  
½ cup firmly packed brown sugar  
½ cup packed French vanilla instant pudding mix

¾ cup evaporated milk  
2 large eggs, at room temperature

6 tablespoons butter or margarine, softened

1½ tablespoons vanilla extract  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
9-inch unbaked pastry shell

In a large bowl of electric mixer, combine first nine ingredients. Beat at medium speed until well blended. Spread evenly into unbaked pastry shell.

Bake in a 450-degree F oven for 10 minutes. Reduce temperature to 350 degrees F; bake 40 minutes longer or until set. Cool on wire rack. If desired, garnish with whipped cream, raspberries and mint leaves. Makes 8 servings.

# Granger spoils Stevenson's bid

Stevenson made a stirring second-half comeback, but Harrison tailback Jason Granger spoiled the Spartans' title hopes with 77-yard kickoff return.

The numbers will say it was Farmington Hills Harrison's 11th Western Lakes Activities Association football title, seventh in the last eight years and third in a row.

But the Hawks' 31-18 championship conquest Friday over host Livonia Stevenson was dialed up by No. 2 in the green and gold jersey — 5-foot-8, 165-pound senior speedster Jason Granger.

After squandering what appeared to be a commanding 17-0 halftime lead, the Hawks needed a pair of scores in the final 10 minutes to erase an 18-17 deficit to win the battle of divisional champs.

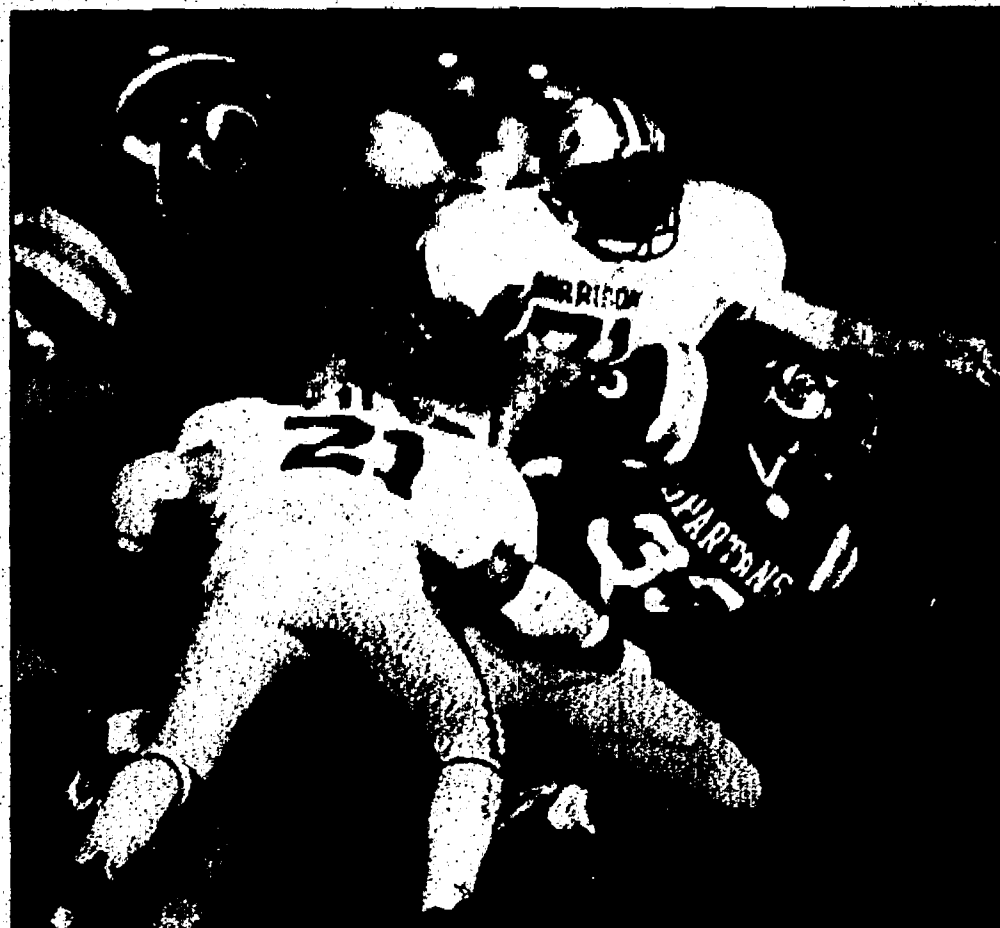
Granger, although gimpy and bloodied, broke the Spartans' back with an electrifying 87-yard kickoff return with only 9:44 remaining to put the Hawks back on top, 23-18. He then cut loose for 40 yards on the next series and brought home the WLAA trophy for Harrison with a 4-yard touchdown run followed by two-point conversion sweep with 6:17 to go.

Granger, who sat out a majority of the second quarter with a perforated lip, finished with 128 yards on 18 carries.

"He looked like Mel Gray on that play," Stevenson coach Tim Gabel said of the pivotal kickoff return. "He wasn't juking around, he just took off."

"It really wasn't our kicker's mistake. We were trying to go away from him, but the ball took a bad hop. In fact, it almost went over his head."

"Great players step up when they have to, and when they needed it, he stepped up big-time. That was a big momentum shift."

Harrison coach John Herrington, who has orchestrated all 11 Hawks' WLAA title quests along with seven state championship runs, calls Granger "an outstanding competitor."

"Great players make great plays, it was the same when we had (Nick) Williams and (Kevin) Bryant last year," Herrington said. "Jason got beat twice (playing the secondary), but he came through when needed him."

Stevenson put three TDs on the board in the second half.

The Spartans, behind the passing of senior quarterback Dean Bacheller (nine of 16 for 171 yards) began their comeback with a pair of third-period TDs.

Junior tailback Gabe Clark (17 for

54 yards) capped an 11-play, 80-yard drive with 2-yard TD run with 6:59 left in the quarter. Tight end Rob Drolet's 35-yard catch from Bacheller set up the score. (The Spartans missed the point-after attempt.)

After a short Harrison punt, Stevenson took just six plays to score again, this time Bacheller hooking up with split end Jeff Backus on a 32-yard scoring play at the 2:55 mark.

Backus, who led all receivers with 120 yards in receptions, couldn't hold on to the two-pointer, but the senior caught a 53-yard bomb from Bacheller with 9:57 to go in the final quarter to give the Spartans a stunning 18-17 advantage.

"I asked the rhetorical question to our kids at halftime, 'Were we getting our butts kicked?' and nobody felt

they were," Gabel said. "There was no panic at halftime, but we were disappointed to be down 17-0."

"We talked about adjustments, the normal things. I thought our defense was very good the first half and it was some of the best hitting I've seen from our team all year."

Herrington could feel the momentum shift to swing the third.

"They moved the ball on the ground to set up their passing," he said. "They did a lot of play-action when we were in our 6-2 (alignment) coming up to jam. And then they started to beat our best corner men. Bacheller is very good. He hurt us last year."

The Hawks, who beat Stevenson in last year's championship game, 21-20, looked as if they would blow out the Spartans during the first half.

Harrison took the opening kickoff 71 yards in seven plays, scoring on Kevin Bambenek's 32-yard pass to a wide-open tight end Marcus Carter.

The Hawks' Nick Shaleb then recovered a Stevenson fumble on the ensuing kickoff. Harrison marched to the Stevenson 7-yard line, but Backus intercepted Bambenek in the end zone.

Pinned in by poor field position, Stevenson stared another Harrison scoring opportunity in the face when the Hawks drove to the 3. But the Hawks coughed up the ball on a fumble to end the first quarter. (Stevenson's Ryan Culloty recovered.)

Harrison, however, got the ball back at the Stevenson 39 on the second series of the second period.

And this time, the Hawks cashed in when Bambenek, who kept Stevenson off-balance with rollout action, scored on a 5-yard run.

"Kevin has a lot of experience after starting for us all last year (as a sophomore) and he'll make the plays when he has to," Herrington said. "He runs pretty well for a skinny basketball player."

Harrison's strong leg, Kyle Vessell, then became a weapon.

# Spartans run past girls foes

Livonia Stevenson captured the first jewel in the triple crown for girls cross country by repeating as Western Lakes Activities Association champions Friday at Cass Benton Park.

The Spartans, undefeated in dual meets, winners of all six invitational titles this year and now WLAA champs, move on to the Class A regional this Saturday at Ann Arbor's Buhr Park.

Stevenson, expected to challenge Troy Athens for the state title, took five of the first seven places to win the Western Lakes championship for the third time in the 1990s.

Stevenson scored 21 points with state-ranked Farmington second with 57 and Plymouth Salem third with 96. See statistical summary.

The sophomore tandem of Kelly Travis and Kelly McNeilance took first and second, respectively, with times of 19:26 and 19:54 over the rain-soaked 5,000-meter course.

North Farmington's Becky Naglik (20:01) and Salem's Leah Rutherford (20:02) were wedged in between Stevenson's Jeannette Stojcovski (20:04), who ran the all-time sixth best Spartan time; freshman Kim McNeilance (20:18) and Laura Pilon (20:19).

"This is the best group I've ever had, and I've had some awfully good kids and teams," Stevenson coach Paul Holmberg said. "But we still have to prove ourselves going into the regional."

"We don't have to change our routine a great deal. We'll still do our basic work, only shorter and faster reps."

Despite a cough, Travis repeated as individual champion as temperatures plummeted and the winds kicked up late Friday afternoon.

"It was really slippery and you had to watch your step on the wide turns," Travis said. "All during warmups it was pretty rough, but we're pretty used to it. We just set against Salem that was worse than

this, but it got a little cold at the end."

In the third quarter, Rich Beal took a Brad Rivers pass to the Churchill 1, which led to Lessway's first TD.

The Chargers cut the deficit in half when Todd Wilson (22 carries for 165 yards) ran 4 yards for a TD and Churchill earned the PAT.

North was pinned at its own 8 following the kickoff and a holding penalty, but Lessway sprinted 92 yards for another TD.

## Little League football coach Miller wearing Falcon crest

What do Tom Landry, Don Shula and Vince Lombardi have in common?

They all belong to a select list of the winningest coaches in the National Football League.

Add another one to the list of coaching greats: Fred Miller, coach of the Falcons of the Livonia Junior Football League.

Though it may not be the NFL, the 43-year-old Detroit policeman has earned his way into Livonia football legend status.

Miller, a 1969 Redford Union graduate, has coached the Falcons for the past 24 years and his record speaks for itself.

The Falcons have had only one losing season in Miller's regime (a 3-5 mark in 1987), and four perfect 8-0 campaigns. Only a tie prevented the Falcons from unblemished seasons several other years.

The Falcons, who mostly come from Holmes Middle School, are off to a 5-0 start this season. The team consists of mostly eighth-graders and a few ninth-graders under 165 pounds.

The Falcons also field a freshman squad (fourth and fifth-graders) and a junior varsity team (sixth and seventh-graders).

It all began when Miller, then a 20-year old, received a call from a friend who said the Falcons needed offensive and defensive line coaches. The 6-foot-3, 220-pounder offered his services.

The head coach of the Falcons at the time left the next season and Miller stepped into his shoes.

At times it's been hectic juggling his career with coaching. Miller admitted, but he has no regrets.

"It's really something to see how the kids begin a season, develop through the season and then end it," Miller said.

Miller has also developed several players who went on to have successful football careers — most at Livonia Stevenson.

One of those players was Dave Hall, who played tight end and

defensive end for Miller in the mid-1970s. Hall went on to become an all-state quarterback at Stevenson and played at the University of Michigan.

"I guess that shows my coaching genius," Miller said sarcastically, about playing Hall at tight end and defensive end.

Other familiar players include Mike Gatt, who starred at Redford Catholic Central before becoming an All-American quarterback at Hillsdale College.

Another player Miller grew fond of was Rob Shepley, who started at fullback as a freshman at Plymouth Salem fresh out of the Falcon program. He later played in the 1993 Michigan High School All-Star game.

Fifteen of the current Stevenson players — including tailback Gade Clark — also are Falcon alumni.

"We've had a lot of overachievers who went on to have great high school careers," Miller said.

Most of Miller's former players return to see how the Falcons are doing.

"From parents' comments, I find that kids who go through the program are more disciplined, buckle down more in school and receive better grades," Miller said. "We try to make them work hard and it shows. They start believing that if they work harder, they'll get better. A good example is this year's team that is 5-0 despite being very small. They're a smart team."

The team has to be smart as Miller has them learn more than 100 offensive plays and seven different defensive schemes.

Miller recently became a father

for the first time. His son Matthew is already penciled in on the depth chart.

"I see him as a fullback," Miller said. "The joke around here is that I'll have to stay around 13 more years to coach him."

All joking aside, the Falcons don't have to worry about losing Miller any time soon.

"When it stops being fun, that's when you know it's time to stop, but I don't see that time coming," Miller said. "I still get butterflies before the games."

Miller said he has turned down offers to coach the freshmen or JV at Redford Catholic Central. The reason, he said, is because he likes being his own boss. He wouldn't want to run his team the way the varsity coach might want, which is how it works at the high school level.

"I would rather run my own program and I hope I'm running it right," he said. "This way, I can run my offense or defense the way I want to, not just the way the varsity wants me to."

Rick Colley, who has coached the Falcons freshman team the past eight years, is one person happy that Miller hasn't left.

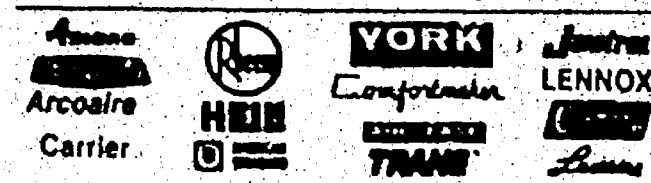
"He's an incredible asset to Livonia and if he ever leaves, it would be a tremendous loss," Colley said.

After 16 years of coaching boys cross country and three runner-up finishes, Walled Lake Central's David Darnton has a league championship team.

The Vikings put four runners in the top 11 and held on to edge Plymouth Salem for the Western Lakes Activities Association title Friday at Cass Benton Park.

The duel with Salem was closer than Darnton would have liked, but junior Eugene Vyortkin clinched the win in 40th place (18:19).

"It's been an interesting season, because some meets our fifth runner has won it for us," Darnton said. "This time it was really our first-place runner. Rob finishing second instead of fourth or fifth made the difference, and he beat some very good runners today."

"Rob and Steve Adams ran their best races this year and, with a two-point difference, it would not have taken much for us to slip into second place. That's why it's a team sport."

The contest between Central and Salem was so close there was no predicting the outcome until the very end of the race.

"I knew our fifth-place runner was around 40th, and I knew where the Salem runners were," Darnton said. "You could tell it was close. If we had been 30th the whole time, I would have been pretty confident."

The Vikings will try to qualify for state next weekend in regional action at Davisburg against Holly, Brighton and Lakeland — the Nos. 2-3-4 teams in the Class A rankings.

"There is a way for a fourth team to get out of the regional, if four runners qualify as individuals — and most likely we'll get three," Darnton said. "If we can get a fourth runner to run his absolute best, we can make it."

Salem had two of the top three runners — Bieniecki ran 16:28 and senior Scott Pengelly was third (16:45) — and five within the top 28. But the numbers just didn't add up fight for the Rocks.

Freshman Nick Allen was 16th, freshman John Little 24th and sophomore Japbir Gill 28th.

"We knew we had to have help from our other five runners, because Central's pack is that tough," Salem coach Geoff Baker said. "A couple of places either way, and it's a different story."

## Suzuki Samurai: Fun on the cheap

Unique, bare-bones, four-wheel-drive and fun to drive. And it has an option some one like me would be stupid not to have: A rugged, powerful, 1,500-pound capacity, front-bumper-mounted winch with a 25-foot cable.

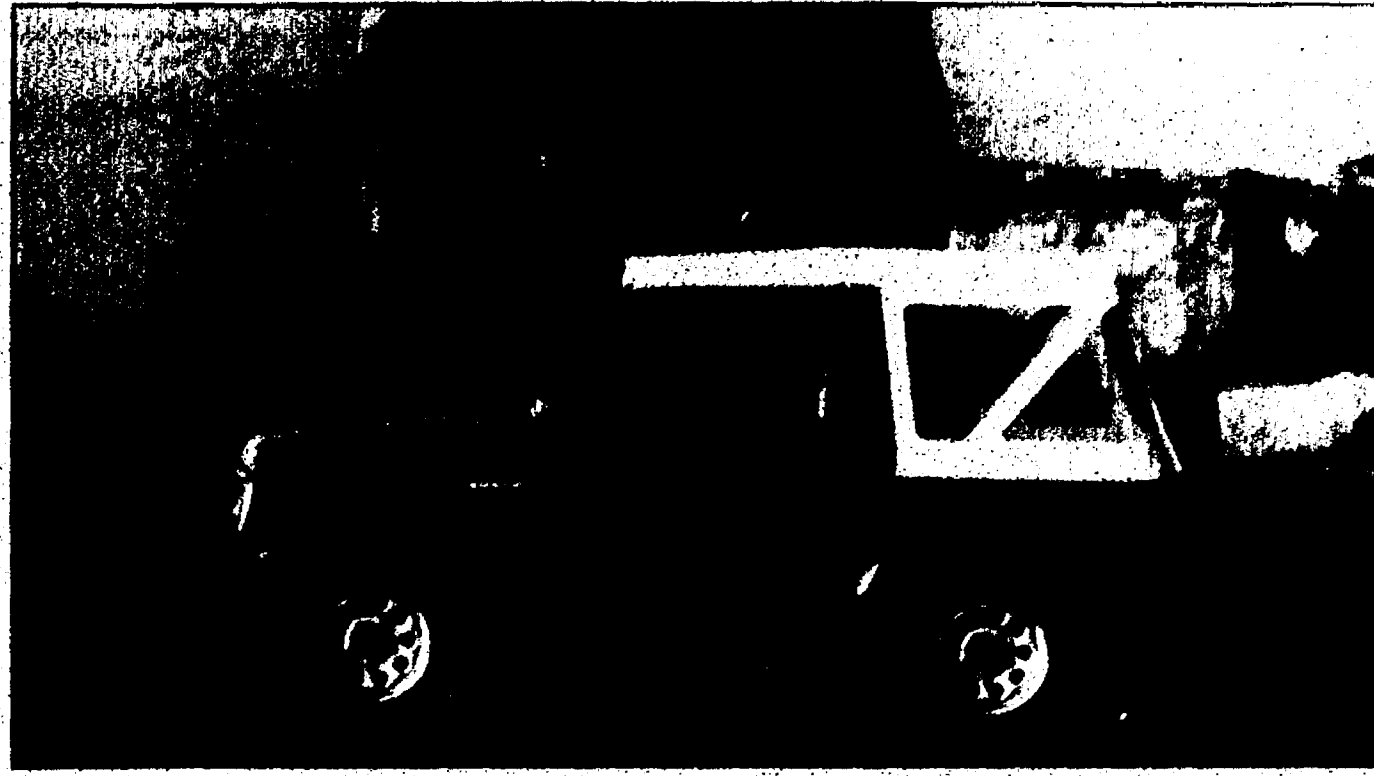
Surely the winch could get me out of any stuck-in-the-mud off-roading adventure while I'm dressed in my Sunday best, right?

The new Suzuki Samurai never provides a dull moment in everyday driving experiences. Nearing a decade on U.S. soil, the Samurai isn't cheap on performance, yet is cheap with its \$10,000-range sticker price. Find a better price for a sport utility 4X4 and you should buy it.

The Samurai has a 1.3 liter, electronically fuel-injected, four-cylinder inline, four-stroke cycle, water-cooled, overhead cam engine that promises a top 66 horsepower at 6000 rpm.

A bit of a problem with acceleration in rush-hour highway situations, but tooling around the city, the Samurai takes care of itself.

It isn't usually the first vehicle away from the light, but keep in mind that it gets 28 mpg in the city, 29 mpg on the

material that its new leaf-spring suspension on the Samurai provides "a comfortable, yet sturdy ride." Comfortable? No. Sturdy? Well, if you enjoy feeling every pebble in the roadway, this baby's for you.

But isn't that what a sport utility is all about? The ride's rough. But rough is what you expect from an SUV, right?

Instrumentation is easy to read and simple to understand. All controls, from heating/cooling to stereo radio, are easy to reach and within grasp of the steering wheel.

Standard equipment includes the deluxe canvas top, Halogen headlamps, dual sport mirrors, tripmeter, two-speed intermittent windshield wipers and four-wheel-drive indicator lamp.

The Samurai tested had a removable canvas top. I tried to remove it. It proved to be more trouble than it was worth. On the freeway, the top

flapped wildly in the wind — even all sealed up — and I could barely hear the stereo — even at full zip.

The best part of the Samurai is outfitting it for your personal needs. Here are a few of the accessories available: Chrome wheels, front bra/mask, chrome front guards, automatic free-wheel hubs, off road lamps, tailgate security box, fog lamps, surf/sailboard carrier, ski carrier, luggage rack, hatchback removable hardtop, bikini top and boot, tonneau cover, altimeter/inclinometer, a host of stereo systems and plush mats.

All in all, if you're looking for a great value in a small sport utility vehicle, the Samurai is the one for you.

But if you can afford a higher-priced 4X4, you'd be disappointed if you opted for this one.
