Brown reflects on 34-year career



Thomas Brown, a political leader for 34 years, has been described as "Mr. Westland." Losing a bid for a new city council term last week, Brown said "it's time I enjoyed myself."

After the curtain fell on Thomas Brown's 34-year political career last Tuesday, he came to terms with his Westland City Council election loss with thoughts of Spencer Tracy's performance as a defeated politician in the 1958 film, "The Last Hurrah."

Tracy played an aging politician running one last time for office, only to suffer defeat in an honorable career.

"As he went along, he served diligently," Brown, 78, said Friday. "But, at the end of the line, he is walking down a street, going home. It's a sad movie."

Although he was disappointed by his first election defeat in 14 years — and his only loss ever in a city council race — Westland's elder statesman has accepted his fate with dignity, class.

On election night, when he placed seventh among eight candidates vying for four seats, Brown voiced certainty that the newly revamped council will unite for the betterment of Westland.

And he had particularly kind words for Westland residents, saying they have given the city a strong sense of community through their volunteer efforts.

On Friday, Brown said he won't run for public office again.

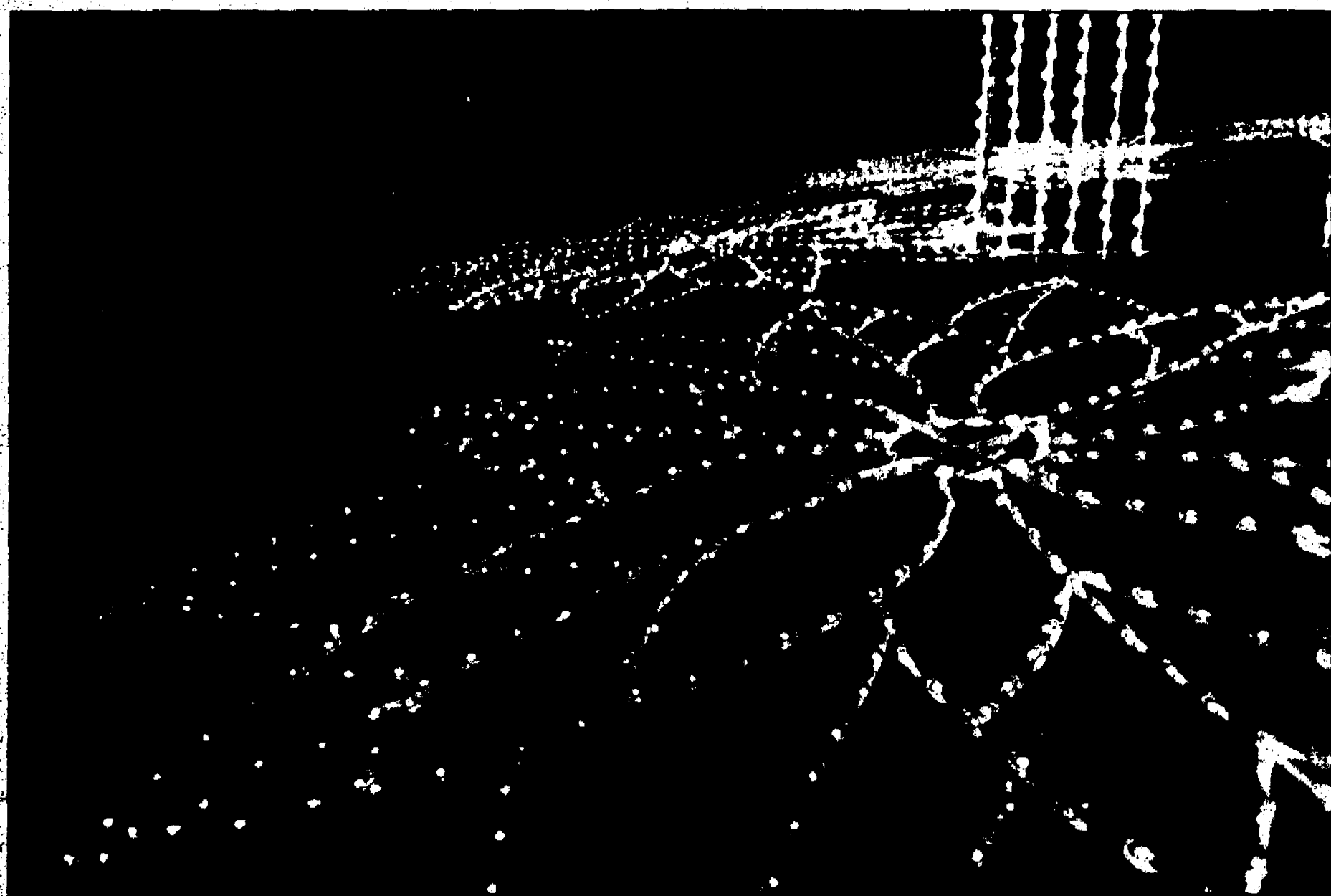
"It's time that I enjoyed myself," he said, adding that he and his wife, Dee, will spend more time traveling and visiting family members.

"There's a time when you have to face things and move on," Brown said.

Even so, he didn't rule out volunteering his time to help the city in some capacity other than elected office. Already, he has been deeply involved in historical preservation ef-

School musical's fate up in the 'Hair'

After watching a dress rehearsal of "Hair" early this week, Churchill High School Principal Rodney Hoaman will decide the musical's fate.

Will it open, as revised, Thursday? Or are still more changes needed to tone the controversial Broadway play down for its first-ever showing in the Livonia School District, which serves the northern section of Westland?

This year's Creative and Performing Arts production of the musical "Hair" has been as controversial in the district as it was when first presented nationwide.

Bowing to the dictates of the district and parents, the play that opens this Thursday at Churchill for a

three-day run is a far cry from the original musical.

But one resident, Caryle Schober, still questions administrators' wisdom in letting students perform the highly controversial musical (see accompanying story).

Gone, of course, is the nudity. But gone also is the foul language and glorification of drugs that permeated a musical that put the spotlight on the counterculture and protests of the 1960s.

"It's been appropriately edited and changed to make it an appropriate production," Hoaman said. "The original play was shock theater, with the hope of getting a reaction from the audience."

"If the writers of the musical were

here, they would say we were not true to their ideas. But things and times have changed. We had to make it appropriate for a high school setting."

CAPA director Steven Kosinski, who spent 10 years in New York working as an actor, backs presenting the play, as edited. He believes changes made to the original have not diluted its historical message — how events global and nationwide fed into each other and created the disillusionment among young people captured in "Hair."

"We edit films for TV, we're just doing the same thing. We've edited it to be seen by kids under 18. I believe my integrity as an artist and as an educator has been preserved."

Concerns over CAPA's production

went all the way to Superintendent Ken Watson and the Board of Education.

Watson spelled out the guidelines CAPA would have to follow if it wanted to present the musical.

"We're not in the censorship business, but we do have district issues involved here," Watson said. "They have to live up to the guidelines we gave them. It's not censorship; it's just telling them what they are responsible for doing. Our expectations are that they will live up to the guidelines. They can either censor themselves, or they can't perform."

Watson said the musical must adhere to the three guidelines:

forts in Westland. "Westland will always need a Tom Brown," Councilwoman-elect/retired state Rep. Justine Barns said Tuesday.

Before he became Westland's first mayor in 1966, Brown served as a former Nankin Township trustee, treasurer and supervisor.

He represented the city from 1970 through 1983 as a state representative, and he will wrap up nearly 11 years on the Westland City Council when his term expires Dec. 31.

"You do what you can," Brown said Friday.

He did a lot. But he said his greatest accomplishment came as Nankin Township treasurer, when he worked with then-township Supervisor William Faust and Clerk Bill Engle to fight Livonia's attempt, supported by some north Westland residents, to annex seven square miles of the township.

"That had to be the greatest accomplishment in my lifetime," Brown said.

The area threatened by annexation in the early '60s included Westland Center, for which the city was later named.

Victorious in their efforts, Brown, Faust and Engle paved the way for Westland to become a city in 1966.

"It was a big job," Brown recalls.

In 1987, Brown received Westland's First Citizen community

service award sponsored by the Westland Chamber of Commerce and the Westland Observer. He became only the second person to receive the honor.

"This man has had an impact on the community that has not been seen in a long time," Frank Moore, the man who nominated Brown, said at the time.

Brown lost two mayoral elections, in 1969 to Gene McKinney and in 1981 to Charles Pickering. But last Tuesday marked his first city council defeat. He will leave having served as council president for two years.

When chosen by his colleagues for the leadership post, he pledged that the council and the administration of Mayor Robert Thomas could seek common ground.

Although Brown and Thomas clashed on some occasions, the mayor said in the final days of the 1995 council campaign that relations between the council and his administration had improved dramatically during the last two years.

It's not the first time that Brown has turned opposition into respect.

Although McKinney opposed and beat Brown for the mayor's job in 1969, he said years later, in 1986, that Brown had the political savvy to turn the former Nankin Township into a city. McKinney admitted that he lacked that very quality that he admired in Brown.

"Now that I'm older, I can understand the problems Tom faced," McKinney told the Observer. Brown has been described as

"Mr. Westland." Last Tuesday, Councilman Charles "Trav" Griffin called him the city's "elder statesman." Much like the honorable char-

acter Spencer Tracy played in "The Last Hurrah," with one notable difference. Tracy only played the part. Thomas Brown has lived it.

Trial ordered in shooting of teenager

A 20-year-old Westland man has been ordered to stand trial for the accidental shooting of his 16-year-old friend.

Joseph Wiper, accused of shooting his friend in the hip with a short-barrel shotgun in October, was bound over for trial in Detroit Recorder's Court after waiving a preliminary hearing Thursday in Westland 18th District Court.

Judge Gail McKnight ordered Wiper to stand trial for possession of a short-barrel shotgun and the reckless use of a firearm, resulting in an injury.

The shooting occurred at 11:45 Oct. 26 in the 32000 block of Muskegon, near Palmer and Venoy, Westland police Sgt. Scott

Fetner said.

The gun was fired accidentally while the suspect was "monkeying around," he said.

The victim remains at the University of Michigan Hospital in Ann Arbor, where he has undergone surgery five times, Fetner said.

The bullet passed through the victim's body, but he has had to have surgery for injuries related to the shooting.

The 16-year-old was flown to U-M Hospital after originally being taken to Oakwood Hospital/Ann Arbor Center in Wayne.

A third person who was in the residence at the time of the shooting wasn't injured.

Wiper was arraigned on the shooting charges on Nov. 3, eight

days after the incident occurred. A not-guilty plea was entered for him.

He could face a maximum sentence of five years in prison if convicted of possession of a short-

barrel shotgun. He could face a two-year term if convicted of reckless use of a firearm, resulting in injury.

Pending trial, Wiper will be free on a \$10,000 personal bond.

2 men to be tried in gas station holdup

Two Detroit men have been ordered to stand trial in a Westland gas station holdup that erupted into gunfire on Oct. 18. No one was injured.

Gorlando Gardner, 30, and Cornelius Gardner, 34, were ordered to stand trial after they were identified in court Thursday by a witness who accused them of robbing the Union 76 station on Warren Road east of Middlebelt.

One shot was fired during the robbery that occurred shortly before noon on Oct. 18.

In the Westland case, Gorlando Gardner faces trial on charges of armed robbery, felony firearms possession and being a habitual offender.

Judge Gail McKnight ordered the Gardners (no known relation) to stand trial in Detroit Recorder's Court following testimony that emerged during a preliminary hearing in Westland 18th District Court.

They were implicated in the Union 76 robbery by a manager who was working at the time. They also were earlier identified in a suspect line-up at the Westland Police Department, Sgt. Scott Fetner said.

Two robbers escaped with \$1,500 in cash and cigarettes during the holdup. The suspects were captured later in Oak Park, Westland police have said.

The Gardners also have been ordered to stand trial in an unarmed robbery that occurred Oct. 18 at a Garden City convenience store in the 29300 block of Warren Road.

In the Westland case, Gorlando Gardner faces trial on charges of armed robbery, felony firearms possession and being a habitual offender.

Gorlando Gardner remains jailed in lieu of a \$250,000 cash bond in Garden City and a \$75,000 cash bond in Westland.

In Garden City District Court on Oct. 30, Gorlando Gardner was ordered to stand trial on charges of unarmed robbery, fleeing police and being a third-degree habitual offender.

At that time, Cornelius Gardner was bound over for trial on charges of unarmed robbery and being a fourth-degree habitual offender.

Habitual offender charges can lead to longer sentences upon conviction.

■The language used must be appropriate for any school setting. In other words, if it can't be said in the classroom, it can't be said on the stage.

■The story must not in any way promote drug use. The district has numerous drug education programs, and the message of stage presentations must not be inconsistent with the message of these programs.

■All viewpoints must be presented on controversial political issues.

"Hair represents a single political point of view, anti-establishment, that adults are not good people," Watson said. "During the '60s that was one politi-

cal viewpoint, but not the only one. We're not asking them to avoid this, just deal with all points of view."

CAPA will meet the guidelines through a variety of multimedia techniques and word changes.

For example, songs of the drug culture will be juxtaposed against slides of famous artists killed by drugs, including Janis Joplin and Jimi Hendrix.

Placards, slide projections, newspaper clippings and headlines as well as the program notes will all give opposite points of view. CAPA even plans a talk session after the musical ends so that all points of view

can be discussed.

"It's an excellent educational opportunity for our students," said Hosman, who grew up in the '60s during the counterculture movement. "Now there's more of a historical slant."

Adapting the musical to teenagers, Kosinski admitted, has been a "real challenge."

"I hope the audience gets an understanding of what is taking place, the struggle for identity, the struggle between generations, the lack of communication," Hosman said.

"We realize there is a risk to doing this. But we're willing to stretch the kids and let them take the risk."

Critic is outspoken over school's choice of 'Hair'

Caryle Schober opposes this weekend's production of "Hair" at Churchill High and has brought her concerns about the controversial play to the Livonia Board of Education, which represents the northern section of Westland.

Many scenes or songs she mentions have been "sanitized" or deleted in Churchill's production. In her own words, here are the reasons for her opposition:

"My children grew up in the Livonia schools. I am a musician and have worked in Livonia schools playing for choirs and for musicals. I now play in two other school districts.

"I believe in public education. It's hard to believe that with the climate in the state of Michigan regarding education, and especially public education, such poor judgment as to what is appropriate for high school students to study is allowed to take place.

"This is a musical that glorifies use of illegal drugs, loose morals regarding sex, burning

draft cards, disrespect for the flag, white girls preferring black boys for sex, etc. It has astronauts killing people, nuns killing people.

"The music is bad rock. Of all the songs, only two are unobjectional and one of them takes place during a nude scene. There is a scene that is a drug trip. A girl gets pregnant by a drug addict. He beats her up when he finds out she's pregnant. The song 'Hashish' names many illicit drugs. One song names every term ever used to designate a black person.

"There was a blacks vs. whites fight the other day at Churchill. I can't wait to see what the kind of reaction to that song will be.

"Young sisters and brothers, parents and grandparents come to these performances. If you cut out all the truly objectionable parts of this musical, you would have nothing left. It was a product of the '60s and '70s. This is all Livonia needs to add fuel to

the Michigan Legislature's campaign to destroy public schooling.

"We obviously have a drama teacher and a director of CAPA who have lost their capacity for judging what is appropriate for high school students in the Livonia community to study and perform.

"I have read their script. I would think the number of times the words m---f--- had to be scratched out would have been a sign that this was totally inappropriate for 14-17 year-olds to perform.

"If the drama teacher wants to do this as community theater, that's one thing. As part of a public high school curriculum it is unacceptable. The way to challenge students is with more difficult music or more challenging dramatic material — not with an obscene musical that denies the morality and ethics and values this country is fighting to resurrect."

role in ensuring blood is available to patients in the 57 hospitals served by our region."

Donors will have the chance to meet WNIC personalities and receive a commemorative WNIC 8th annual Thanksgiving Blood Drive T-shirt, compliments of SelectCare. Nearly 20 Wonderland Mall merchants will be offering special discounts (valid Nov. 24 only) to blood drive attendees.

While parents are donating, children can work on a holiday craft under the supervision of Red Cross volunteers.

Blood donors must be 17 or older, weigh more than 110 pounds, and be in general good health.

Beard named to national school-to-work council

Key Beard is headed to Washington, D.C., twice a year.

Beard, vice chair of the Wayne County Commission, has been appointed to the National Advisory Council for School-to-Work Opportunities.

The council is being established to advise the Departments of Labor and Education on the School-to-Work Opportunities Act of 1994.

Robert B. Reich, secretary of labor, and Richard W. Riley, secretary of education, announced the appointment.

"I'm excited about it. It dovetails so well into other things I've been doing," said Beard, D-Westland, who also represents Garden City.

Beard has served three years as chair of the National Association of Counties' Employment Steering Committee. She also serves as chair of the Job Training Subcommittee of the Employment Steering Committee.

Beard is also a board member of the recently formed Out-Wayne County School-to-Work Partnership. Last month she was appointed chair of the Labor and Manpower Committee for the Michigan Association of Counties.

As part of the appointment, Beard will go to Washington, D.C., twice a year, starting in January 1996. There will also be teleconferences, she said.

The goal of the School-to-Work Act is to create learning systems throughout the country to help all students master the academic and technical skills they need. The advisory council membership includes individuals involved in local School-to-Work Initiatives. About 40 individuals representing educators, employers, community groups, students, state and local officials, labor and the public will serve on the council.

She plans to bring information about what's going on locally and statewide with her to Washington. "I want to be up to speed

about what's going on in the whole state."

"I'm hoping I can be a good conduit," she said of her plans to take Michigan's concerns to Washington and come back with information on what other states are doing.

"It's important that all the players work together," she said. "We've got to have a better trained workforce."

Times have changed from the days when a person could do well in high school and expect to get a good-paying factory job, Beard said. Now factory jobs often require computer skills.

Changes in technology occur almost daily, Beard said. "It's an exciting time," she said.

"People have to understand the need for lifelong training," she said.

"We are very excited about the opportunities to create new learning structures that provide pathways for all students to be successful in our dynamic economy," a letter to Beard from Reich and

Riley said.

"As we rapidly approach the 21st century, the School-to-Work Act will help create learning systems in every state and every community in this country to help all students master the academic and technical skills they need. These new systems bring together parents and other leaders from business, labor, communities and schools to implement the three core components of School-to-Work — school-based learning, work-based learning and connecting activities," the letter said.

"It's an exciting concept. I'm delighted I was asked to be on it," Beard said.

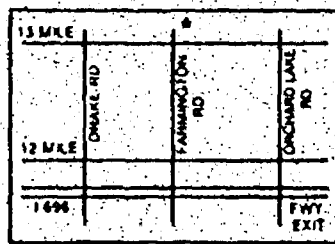
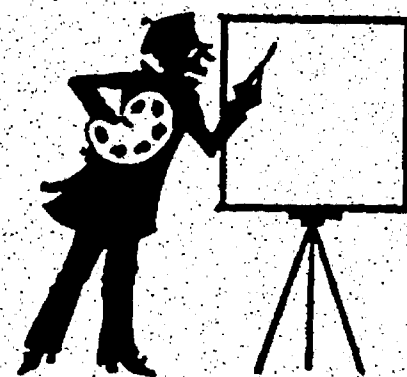

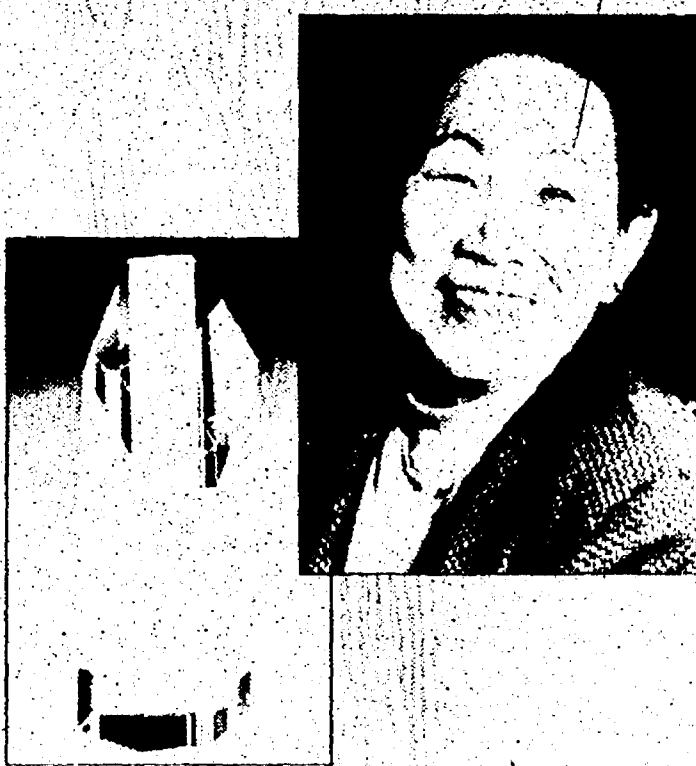

Ladies Pro Bowlers Tour stops in Wayne County

Aleta Sill may have won the \$12,000 prize in the Lady Ebonite Classic Thursday, but the big news locally is that the Ladies Pro Bowlers Tour made a stop in western Wayne County.

Eighty-two bowlers, including 17 amateurs, competed Monday through Thursday last week for \$75,000 in prize money at the Super Bowl on Ford Road in Canton Township.

By 8 p.m. Thursday, Sill had beaten longtime rival Tish Johnson 233-225 for the title. The event was cablecast later that night on ESPN.

Sill, a Dearborn-based left-hander, has now tied Patty Costello for the most career tournament titles. The 32-year-old bowling dynamo has 21 career 300 games and is the all-time LPBT wage-earner with nearly \$700,000 in winnings since 1980.

Sill's grandfather, Steven Zuke,

79, came out Wednesday to watch his kin compete.

"She's a good girl," Zuke said. "She watches me like a hawk."

Sill monitors her grandfather's nutrition, Zuke said, adding that she recently caught him eating something bad. "What are you doing with that bacon?" he said she said.

Residents looking for someone to thank for bringing pro bowling to Canton Township should start with Super Bowl owner Mark Voight, who formerly owned Satellite Bowl in Dearborn Heights and hosted a regular tour stop there.

The Satellite Bowl was razed to accommodate a Home Depot last year, so Voight moved the tour stop to the Super Bowl, which he purchased in 1992.

Currently, the LPBT bowlers compete in 22 tournaments each year, but just one in Michigan.

Carol Maclean of Belleville, a mega fan of women's bowling,

brought sons Mark and Eric to the Super Bowl Wednesday to assist her in obtaining autographs on a bowling pin.

"We're going to get all 24" of Wednesday's competitors, Maclean said. Asked if Mark is a fan, too, she added, "He doesn't have a choice."

Rose Vickerman, who works in the Super Bowl pro shop, took a break Wednesday to watch the athletes.

"It's very exciting to have this in Canton," she said. "I wish some of the local businesses would get involved to support the local amateurs."

A competent bowler herself, Vickerman averages more than 180 per game. Asked if good bowlers are born, or made, she said "both." However, chance plays a part as well. "Bowling is a lot of luck," she said.

Asked why bowler Jeanne Nacarato had eight balls with her, Vickerman explained that bowlers use different kinds of balls to compensate for varying lane conditions.

Tour officials configure lanes differently for each tournament, she said, mostly by varying the amount and placement of oil on the horizontal surface.

Vickerman herself owns 15 bowling balls, which nearly matches the number of shoes she has.

About 55 of the female pro bowlers tour full time, said LPBT spokesman Lennie Gessler, but only the top few players earn more than \$100,000 per year. Fifteen or so will make more than \$40,000, and the rest earn less, Gessler said.

For example, Sill earned \$126,000 in 1994, tops on the tour.

Eighty-two bowlers, including 17 amateurs, competed Monday through Thursday last week for \$75,000 in prize money at the Super Bowl on Ford Road in Canton Township.

Wendy Macpherson won \$9,200, and fifth-place winner Carolyn Dorin won \$2,800. The 32nd prize is \$726.

Cheryl Daniels is one of the top female bowlers from Detroit, and in 15 years on the pro tour she has earned just \$355,000, averaging \$23,670 per year.

Many of the bowlers supplement their winnings with jobs, Gessler said. Some manage bowling centers, others work in pro shops, and many give lessons.

To be accepted on the tour, a bowler must average 180 or more for at least 66 games in one league for two consecutive seasons.

The bowlers appreciate the area, Gessler said, because nearly everything they need or want is within a few miles. "When you're out on the road as much as we are, that's what you look for," he said.

Friend of court package moves in Senate

Nearly two years ago, Sen. Robert Geake was listening to stormy public testimony from hundreds of people complaining about Friend of the Court operations in most Michigan counties.

Recently the state Senate, without a word of debate, gave unanimous approval to the first 25 of 40 reform bills that the Northville Township Republican guided through committees to crack down on deadbeat parents and make life fairer for non-custodial parents.

"Michigan joins the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act on collecting child and spousal support," Geake said in his third-floor office behind the Senate chamber in the Capitol after the session. "We took a giant step toward helping the stability of Michigan children and families."

That bill sets up tribunals to forward support proceedings to other states and to serve as a responding tribunal for proceedings started in other states. In extreme cases, a governor could extradite deadbeats who failed to provide support.

The bills go to the House, where routine approval is likely. If enacted, most of the bills would become law in mid-1996.

Sen. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham, was sponsor of one part

of the package — to require Friend of the Court to tell credit agencies about non-payments of two or more months that reached \$1,000.

"Sometimes a person is short at the end of the month and has three bills to pay — phone, credit card and child support. He'll pay the phone and credit card because if he doesn't it will affect his credit rating," said Bouchard. "Now, his non-payment of support also can affect his credit rating."

Geake said one bill allows a custodial parent to sue for back support for as long as 10 years after a child reached age 18. That

would allow recovery when the non-custodial parent's economic circumstances have changed.

"There is a requirement that when a judge issues a bench warrant to require a parent to pay, the parent will have to pay court costs, too," Geake said.

No less than a dozen bills had to be passed to change "visitation" to "parenting time" in support, family counseling, probate, divorce, social welfare, penal, adoption and other laws.

"They mean the same thing," Geake said, "but non-custodial parents didn't want to be stigmatized as 'visitors.'"

The most politically controversial bill in Geake's package is still in the Family Law Committee. That would shift Friend of the Court from the jurisdiction of circuit courts to general county government. Geake says the office would get better supervision and funding. Circuit judges, however, oppose any reduction of their powers. And many county officials aren't eager to take over Friend of the Court.

Two bills will make it a felony to falsely charge child sexual abuse, physical abuse, emotional abuse or neglect of a child — currently a misdemeanor. Punishments would be up to two years in prison and a fine of \$2,000.

Such abuses are often charged in nasty divorce cases, but the

Senate Fiscal Agency said there is no data on how many prison sentences might result. It guessed the cost to the Department of Corrections at \$50,000 to \$65,000 annually on the basis of five sentences of one-year duration.

Two bills were needed — one to change the penal code, the other the child protection act.

Other bills would:
■ Specify that Friend of the Court has 14 days to disburse support payments, or pay interest, and to guard against gender bias. Currently FOC has 30 days to process support payments. The Senate Fiscal Agency said 10 percent of 713,000 cases aren't disbursed in a timely manner.

■ Make it a felony to conceal income if judicially required in the calculation of child support payments.

■ Allow a court to place deadbeat parents who had been found in contempt for non-payment on electronic tethers, confining them to home or the county jail except during working hours. The Senate Fiscal Agency said electronic tethers currently cost \$6.50 a day which is charged to the participant.

Among other sponsors of the bills were Sens. Loren Bennett, R-Canton, David Honigman, R-West Bloomfield, Mat Dunaskiss, R-Lake Orion, and George Z. Hart, D-Dearborn.

Hunt down recipes, tips for preparing wild game

Ah, the thrill of the hunt. For centuries, man hunted all the animals we now eat before he domesticated them. Our tastes for the exotic continue to increase. With proper connections, the game hunter who ventures into the north woods and emerges with nothing more than a hangover can visit any number of butcher shops and procure anything from fillets of white tail deer to mallard breasts, alligator, venison sausage, ostrich, and even loin of lion.

Unfortunately, it's usually a spouse or significant other who are left with the responsibility of preparing the wild game so that it tastes like it just came from Julia Child's oven. More often than not, it's the camp (or home) cook who shoulders the blame of the "it's too gamey tasting," comments that usually follow a wild game dinner.

If your hunter places the blame for bad-tasting wild game on your shoulders, be sure you hand 'em this article. The flavor of any freshly hunted game depends partly on how it was handled in the woods or field.

Venerable metro area chef Milos Cihelka, who has a four-part video series on the proper dressing, preparing, cooking and storing of wild game, says, "improper field dressing and the transport of wild game can ruin it."

Furthermore, "the animal needs to age and drain properly before butchering, claims Cihelka, who was lucky enough to be leaving for the north woods tomorrow.

Fortunately, in addition to Cihelka's video series (available at all Kitchen Glamour stores for \$19.95) there is a rather aged, but still widely

Here's a recipe originated by the late, great James Beard, adapted from his book James "Beard's American Cookery."

MRS. LESLIE'S VENISON PIE

1 1/2 pounds venison steak or stew meat
4 tablespoons flour
4 tablespoons butter-oil mixture
1 medium onion, chopped
1 bay leaf
1/4 teaspoon mace
1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon parsley
1/2 teaspoon thyme
1/4 cup Madeira (or sweet red wine)
2 teaspoons flour
3 tablespoons black currant jelly
Salt and pepper

4 eggs
Dough for 2 crusts

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Roll the meat cubes twice in flour that has been lightly salted. Sauté them in the butter-oil mixture until nearly browned. When meat is 1/4 brown, add the onion. Place the meat, onion, bay leaf, mace, nutmeg, parsley and thyme in a casserole or Dutch oven with just enough water to barely cover. Bring to a boil on the top of the stove, then cover and simmer in the preheated oven for 1 hour.

Make a paste with the wine and the remaining flour and stir into stew. Stir in jelly and continue simmering covered in the oven until very thick, about 45 minutes. Set aside to cool.

Boil the eggs in their shells until hard. Prepare the pie crusts. Peel eggs and set yolks aside (discard whites). When ready to assemble, divide the dough in half and roll out about 3/8-inch thick. Place bottom crusts in a deep oven proof glass pie pan. Pour in cooled venison and sauce. Crumble the egg yolks over and cover with remaining crust.

Bake at 375 degrees for 45-60 minutes or until crust is golden brown. Serves 4-6.

ROAST WILD TURKEY

8 ribs of celery, with leaves
7-10 pound wild turkey
1/2 cup salt pork, sliced thin
1 medium onion, with skin, quartered
1 carrot, cut into 4 sections
2 cloves
1 bay leaf
1 teaspoon thyme
1 bunch Italian parsley, chopped
The juice of 1 lemon
4 outer leaves from a head of lettuce
Salt and fresh ground pepper to taste
1/2 cup brandy, optional

Cut the leaves from the celery and reserve. Remove the neck, giblets and last two wing joints from the turkey.

Place these parts in 2 cups of cold water with the onion, carrot, 4 celery ribs, cloves, bay leaf, thyme and

parsley and bring to a boil.

Reduce heat to a simmer and cook for 1 hour, uncovered. Strain the broth. Wash turkey inside and out with lemon juice. Tie strips of the salt pork over the top and legs of the turkey.

Place remaining celery ribs inside the turkey. Place the turkey in an open roasting pan and surround it with onion skins, celery leaves and lettuce leaves. Roast for 1 1/4 hours in a preheated 400 degree F oven.

Remove salt pork and strings and any leaves and skin surrounding the bird. Reduce heat to 360 degrees F, and cook for 1 hour or until the juices run clear when pierced with a fork.

Baste frequently during the last hour of cooking with pre-prepared broth. Remove the turkey to a heated platter. Skim off as much fat from broth and prepare a gravy. Season with salt, pepper and brandy. Serves 8-10.

used book on the subject, The "L.L. Bean Game and Fish Cookbook" by Angus Cameron & Judith Jones (copyright 1983 by Random House Publishers, \$25), although not as descriptive and visual as Cihelka's video, suggests various ways to age, store, process, clean, cook and serve a vast assortment of wild game.

If you have to explain to your spouse that the \$600 you spent for four days at deer camp was well spent, you can walk through the door with just about any specialty venison cut from Michigan farm-raised white tail deer.

Farm-raised game

Barb Francis, who along with husband Don owns and operates Butcher Boy Game Meats in Warren, says that they can sell you everything from a \$4.95 per pound leg of venison to a \$7.95 boneless roast of white tail deer. Butcher Boy is metro Detroit largest supplier of exotic game. It's all farm-raised and USDA certified. The Francis' told me that there are more than 300 farms that raise venison for retail sales, and hopefully, that fact helps reduce poaching. Butcher Boy Meats is at 13869 Herbert in Warren, and the Francis' can be reached at (810) 779-0600.

Another major league player in the retail wild game market is Polarica Game Inc., who mail order out of San Francisco and New York City. In addition to exotic wild game such as elk, antelope, wild boar, pheasant, kangaroo and rattlesnake, Polarica also is a major handler of fresh wild and cultivated mushrooms, truffles, exotic fruit, edible blossoms and miniature vegetables. You can call them at (800) GAME-4US to request a product and price list.

Helpful books

Of course, my idea of hunting is going to a store where there are volumes of books with everything

I need to know about preparing wild game. I hunt for cookbooks that include proper cutting techniques, aging qualities and preparation details.

Gone are the days when all that was necessary was to fry up two pounds of onions in enough grease to warrant chest pains. Nowadays, savvy hunters know that tougher cuts, especially from the legs of the deer, need to be completely removed of all fat (tallow) and slow roasted, preferably with a continual brush of a marinade for optimum results. Leaner, more tender roasts and tenderloins can be baked with a little bacon or salt pork to assist in keeping the meat juicy.

Leaner game birds like pheasant, duck, partridge or wild turkey can be larded the old-fashioned way, wrapped in a little bacon or simply grilled. An all-around basic informational book entitled "The Home Book of Smoke Cooking Meat Fish and Game" by Jack Sleight and Ray Hull, (copyright 1971, Stackpole Books, \$12.95) offers suggestions on home smoking techniques that can be done anywhere from inside a household oven to the largest smokehouse. Just about all of the books I checked out include recipes for jerky, sausage, marinade and cooking techniques.

And remember, hunters, just as important as the first field dressing, if you need to take your trophy to a game processor, you get what you pay for. Inexperienced processors will give you 25 percent more burger instead of good cuts because in the processing, little care or effort is made to use the proper cutting techniques.

Ask an experienced hunter for references. The longer the meat "hangs" and is allowed to cure in cold, dry temperatures, the better the game will taste. Good luck.

Once again, the young woman from Kansas has her trusty basket in tow. Perhaps this time, Dorothy, planning ahead, consulted award-winning cookbook author Sheila Lukins and cooked up a mouth-watering medley of delights.

Here are some of her favorites:

CRISPY BUTTERMILK FRIED CHICKEN

2 frying chickens, about 2 1/2 pounds, cut in 8 pieces
Salt and freshly ground pepper
1 cup buttermilk
1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons paprika
1 1/2 cups solid vegetable oil shortening or enough to accommodate chicken, depending on the size of your skillet

Rinse chicken pieces. Remove excess fat and trim wing tips. Pat dry very well. Place in a large bowl and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Toss with the buttermilk. Let rest for 30 minutes at room temperature.

Put flour in a large plastic bag and season with paprika and 1 teaspoon each salt and pepper.

Heat the shortening in a 10-inch skillet over medium high heat until hot.

Remove chicken from the buttermilk and dredge in the seasoned flour, shaking off excess.

Fry the chicken, starting with the skin side up in batches, for 12-15 minutes per side, covered, until golden brown and cooked through. Drain on paper towels. Serves 6.

FRIED CHICKEN GRAVY

1 1/4 cups chicken frying fat
2 small onions, halved and slivered
2 cloves garlic, peeled and finely minced
2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
2 cups defatted chicken broth (canned broth or bouillon cubes is acceptable here)
Pinch of freshly ground black pepper

Place the chicken fat in a non-stick skillet over medium heat. Add the onion and garlic and cook for 3-4 minutes until lightly browned.

Add the flour and cook for 2 minutes, stirring until flour becomes golden brown. Add the broth and cook for 3 minutes at a gently simmer. Serve hot with fried chicken. Makes 1 1/4 cups.

COUNTRY CORNBREAD

1 1/2 cups cornmeal
1/2 cup all-purpose flour
3 tablespoons granulated sugar
1 tablespoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup plain non-fat yogurt
2 tablespoons melted butter
2 tablespoons vegetable oil

2 eggs, lightly beaten
1 cup creamed corn

Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Butter an 8-inch by 8-inch baking pan.

Combine the cornmeal, flour, sugar, baking powder and salt in a mixing bowl.

Combine the milk, yogurt, melted butter, oil and eggs in a bowl. Add to the cornmeal mixture and stir until just combined. Stir in the creamed corn.

Scrape the batter into the prepared pan and bake for 45 minutes or until the top is golden brown and a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean.

Cool on a rack and then remove from pan and cool completely. Cut into squares to serve. Makes 6 servings.

GRANDMA TORNOW'S STUFFING

- 1 package stuffing mix
- 2 eggs
- 1 onion
- 3 stalks diced celery
- 1 or 2 diced apples
- ¼ to 1 pound raw pork sausage

Prepare dressing according to package directions. Add all other ingredients, except pork sausage. Just before stuffing turkey, crumble up sausage and add to stuffing. You can prepare this recipe ahead of time and refrigerate, but do not add sausage until ready to stuff turkey.

Extra stuffing should be baked at 350 degrees F. for at least two hours.

GRANDMA'S TURKEY STUFFING

- 4 tablespoons margarine, divided
- 1 medium to large onion diced
- 3 stalks celery sliced
- 8 carrots sliced (1 pound)
- 1 small head of cabbage, sliced coleslaw style
- 1½ cups uncooked rice
- Salt and pepper to taste

Cook rice. Let stand to cool. Melt 2 tablespoons of margarine in very large frying pan. Sauté onion on medium to low heat, being careful not to brown. Add celery and sauté until crisp-tender. Add sliced carrots and sauté until crisp-tender. Add about 2 more tablespoons of margarine and add shredded cabbage.

Continue to sauté until cabbage is tender. Salt and pepper to taste.

A generous sprinkling of pepper is what gives this stuffing character. Add rice to frying pan while still cooking and mix well for about 2 minutes until rice absorbs color and flavor of vegetables. Let cool. Stuff turkey.

Recipe makes more than enough for a 12 pound turkey so that what's left can be wrapped in foil or put in a casserole to bake along side the turkey providing extra helpings of stuffing.

GARLIC MASHED POTATOES

- 3 pounds potatoes (about 4 large), peeled and quartered
- 2 (3-ounce) packages cream cheese, softened
- ½ cup sour cream
- ¼ cup milk
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon butter or margarine, melted
- ½ teaspoon paprika

Cook potatoes in boiling salted water to cover — 15 minutes or until tender. Drain and mash with potato masher. Combine potatoes, cream cheese and next 5 ingredients in large mixing bowl. Beat at medium speed with electric mixer until smooth. Spoon mixture into lightly greased 13 by 9 by 2-inch baking dish. Brush top of mixture with melted butter. Sprinkle with paprika. Bake at 350 degrees F, uncovered, 25 minutes or until heated. Serves 6-8.

To prepare ahead of time, cover the dish and chill up to 24 hours. Before baking, let it sit at room temperature for 20 minutes.

CHERRY-BERRY PIE

- 1 (16-ounce) can pitted red cherries, undrained
- 1 (10-ounce) package frozen red raspberries, thawed
- 1 cup sugar
- ¼ cup cornstarch
- ¼ cup butter or margarine
- ¼ teaspoon almond extract
- ¼ teaspoon red liquid food coloring
- 1 (15-ounce) package refrigerated pie crusts
- 1 teaspoon all-purpose flour
- Garnishes: fresh raspberries and powdered sugar

Drain cherries and raspberries, reserving 1 cup combined juices; set fruit aside. Combine sugar and cornstarch in a medium saucepan; gradually stir in 1 cup reserved juice. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, until mixture begins to boil. Cook 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat; stir in butter, almond extract, and food coloring. Gently fold in reserved fruit; cool slightly.

Unfold 1 pie crust, and press out fold lines; sprinkle with flour, spreading over surface. Place, floured side down, in a 9-inch pie plate; fold edges under, and flute. Spoon in filling. Roll remaining pie crust to press out fold lines. Cut 6 leaves with a 3¼-inch leaf-shaped cutter, and mark veins using a pastry wheel or knife; set aside. Cut remaining pastry into ¼-inch strips, and arrange in a lattice design over filling. Top with pastry leaves.

Bake at 375 degrees F. for 45 minutes. Cool on a wire rack. Garnish, if desired. Yield: one 9-inch pie.

You better not pout! Santa Claus is coming to town this weekend and area malls are decking the halls with million dollar holiday displays. It's beginning to look a lot like Christmas, everywhere you go . . .

One summer afternoon Northland Center's marketing director Linda Brown sat down with public relations agent Susan Haddad to dream up a spectacular holiday promotion for the mall's 40th winter.

When Santa arrives at Northland in Southfield on Saturday, Nov. 18, at 2 p.m. he will be greeted by four skylights situated atop the mall, five 40-foot shooting stars, white-winged horses in the Land of Pegasus, a North Star Postal Station furnished with gold star-shaped tables where visitors can compose Letters to Santa, and a 16-foot high snow globe animated by falling snow.

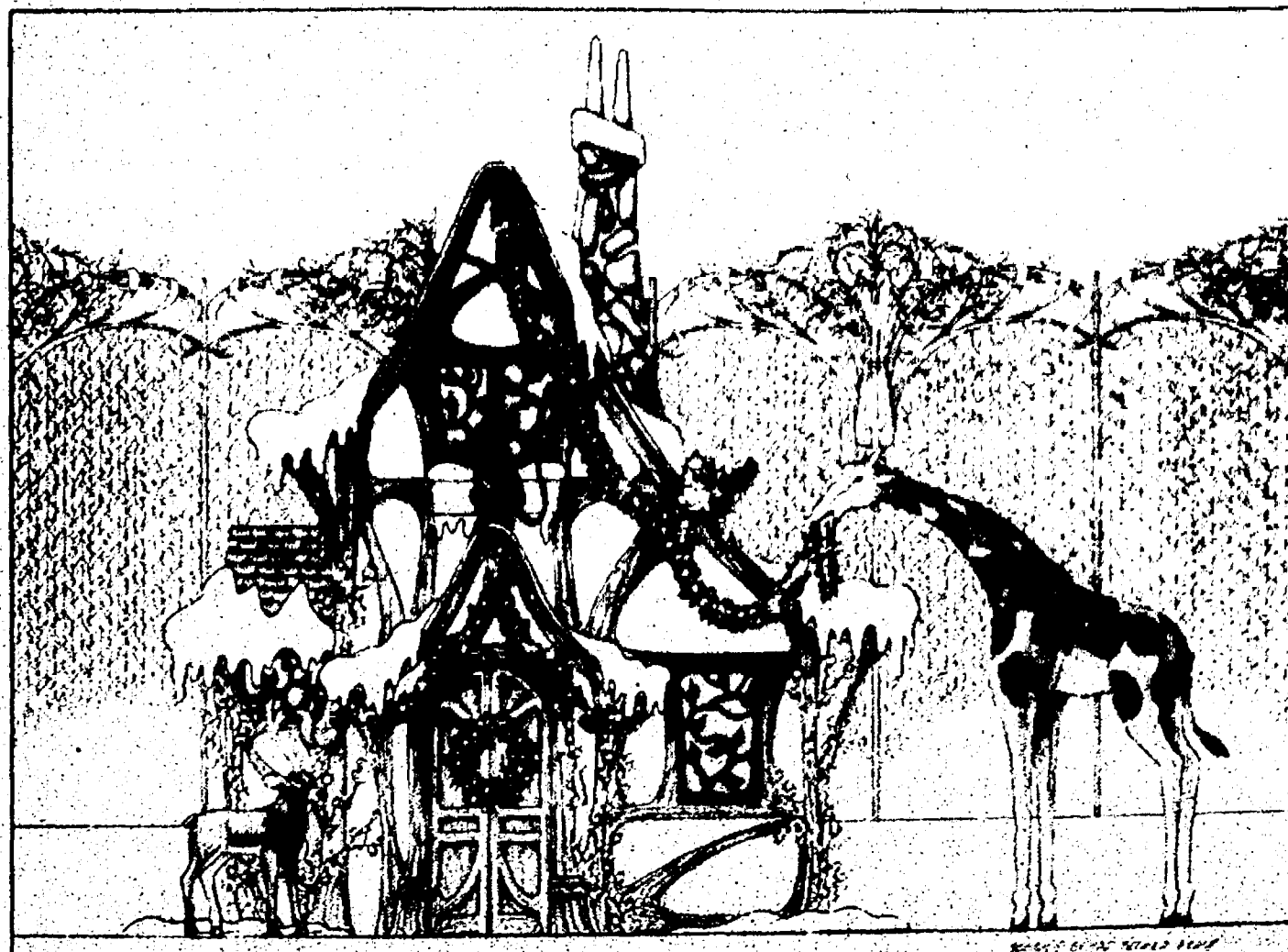

'Ace' loses animal magnetism in sequel

'Ace Ventura: When Nature Calls' is the eventual result of superstardom. Charismatic, forced, and only occasionally funny, it succeeds at only one thing: making the original 'Ace' look almost brainy in comparison.

It was only last year that Carrey went from 'In Living Color' ensemble player to one of the nation's hottest box office draws. Not nearly as bad as the critics said, 'Ace Ventura: Pet Detective' was an intentionally doozy device for Carrey's obvious talents at mimicry, bad taste, and crazy facial expressions.

Since then, Carrey has turned into a primary energy source, with high profile roles in 'The Mask,' 'Batman Forever,' and 'Dumb and Dumber.' His toothy goofball with the trademark 'Alrighty then' has been the most distinct comic personality since Pee Wee Herman, and infinitely more popular.

So where does the new 'Ace' movie go wrong? Probably with Carrey's much publicized ego. Creative differences with the original director led to installment of Steve Oedekerk, the film's writer and a longtime Carrey friend.

The resulting story, such as it is, finds Ace traveling to Africa to locate a missing white bat, the sacred symbol of the Wachati tribe. If it is not returned by a certain time and date, the Wachatis will hold their neighbors responsible and start a major tribal war. All too predictably, Simon Cal-

low's stuffy Brit is the actual kidnapper. He will control the lucrative bat dropping industry if the tribes wipe each other out.

Since Carrey's mega-salary accounts for most of the reported \$44 million budget, the producers use him in virtually every frame. Oedekerk's direction is so flat and uninspired that even diehard fans will overdose on the actor's million-dollar 'metamorpho-face.'

Granted, there are funny bits in the movie, like the parody from 'Cliffhanger' where the moun-

tain-climbing Ace allows a raccoon to slip from his grasp.

Leaving the ashram in Tibet where he has worked through his grief, Ace can't resist sending a Slinky down an impossibly long flight of stairs.

Most of the scenes, however, are just retreads from the first 'Ace' movie, but with the gross-out level amplified. The African

locales and wide screen should hold some surprises, but they don't.

With this latest venture, Carrey's comedy goes from dumb to dumber.

'Copycat' has some interesting moments

'It's a sick world, isn't it?' the serial killer says to his victim in 'Copycat.' And if you see this movie, you'll probably agree.

This suspense-thriller about two women who track an ingenious murderer has some interesting moments, but ultimately is done in by its tired, overused formula.

As the movie makes clear in its opening scene, serial killers tend to be intelligent and methodical as they go about their hideous business all the while keeping up an innocent exterior. The idea that such people can and do walk among us without suspicion gets your spine tingling right there.

It's surely not Sigourney Weaver's fault that 'Copycat' is not as compelling as it should be and leaves you feeling stale. She turns in her usual top-notch acting job playing Helen Hudson, a forensic psychiatrist who has specialized in the psychology of serial killers and who has made quite a bundle (judging from her sumptuous San Francisco apartment) from book royalties and lecture fees.

It's fitting she has such a great apartment, because now she can't leave it. At one of her lectures, she was stalked by crazed, slobbering psychopath Darryl Lee Cullum (Harry Connick Jr.), who, in a truly creepy scene, traps Helen in a bathroom stall, hangs her up like a piece of meat and almost kills her.

Although Cullum is caught and safely imprisoned, the near-death experience has left Helen totally agoraphobic, unable even to go outside to pick up the newspaper near her apartment door without having a panic attack.

When several young San Francisco women are murdered, however, her dormant tracking in-

instincts start to tingle. So she teams up with perky, no-nonsense police detective M.J. Monahan (Holly Hunter) and her good-looking young deputy, Ruben Goetz (Dermot Mulroney), who enlist her in the chase.

Instead of one measly murderer, the movie gets to draw on the ghoulish legacy of famous U.S. serial killers like Ted Bundy and Jeffrey Dahmer by creating a character who studies, imitates and pays homage to the 'great' killers of the past.

Director Jon Amiel ('Sommersby') works with wonderful ingredients: two likable actresses in the lead roles, the dramatic vistas of San Francisco and a clever idea from scriptwriters Ann Biderman and David Madsen.

As the movie unfolds, we quickly sense that by becoming an expert on serial killing, Helen has unwittingly made herself into a perfect audience. Only someone like her — an expert, a maven — will appreciate the references, the little touches of a killer like this copycat.

The problem is that, as usual, Hollywood is trying to have it

both ways. The formulaic movie teeters on the border of exploitation with one too many a shot of a ravaged co-ed in her underwear. And there's one lingering image that's so disturbing, you know a movie called 'Copycat' is going to bring it around a second time.

Putting a couple of smart, tough women in key roles doesn't fully inoculate the movie against charges of pandering.

American movies and television shows seem to be practically overflowing at the moment with images of sadistic killers and their victims. How about giving us a break for a few weeks?

Alcala lifts Shamrocks, 21-14

Redford Catholic Central advanced in the Class AA football playoffs with a 21-14 comeback victory over defending champion Troy in the regional final.

Redford Catholic Central used the wind and Greg Alcala to its advantage Saturday afternoon in the Class AA football regional final at Pontiac Wisner Stadium.

The Shamrocks scored two touchdowns, including one by their forgotten junior tailback Alcala, with the wind at their backs in the fourth quarter to rally for a 21-14 victory over Troy.

Alcala, who started the season as CC's No. 1 tailback, played only limited time as Kevin Quay's backup the last several games.

He gave the Shamrocks a 7-0 lead with an 80-yard run for a TD with 2:37 left in the first quarter. His 63-yard run in the fourth quarter tied the score 14-14 and the Shamrocks went ahead to stay with John Spolsky's seven-yard run with 3:40 remaining.

Rain and snow, a strong wind and cold temperatures made conditions miserable, but not for Alcala.

"I always seem to have big games in the mud," Alcala said. "I kind of had a feeling all week I'd get some action."

The 11-0 Shamrocks advance to the state semifinal to meet Sterling Heights Stevenson, a 46-0 winner over Detroit Martin Luther King. Kickoff is 1:30 p.m. Saturday at Mt. Clemens Chippewa Valley High School.

Alcala finished with 175 yards on 15 carries, meaning he had only 32 yards on 13 carries when he didn't cross the end zone.

"We didn't know anything about 20 (Alcala)," Troy coach Gary Griffith said. "You can't allow a team to score on 80 yard runs, I don't care who that team is. Especially, you can't give a team like CC plays like that and expect to win."

Defending-champion Troy trailed 7-0 at halftime and elected to kick off to start the second half with the wind at its back. The Colts stopped the Shamrocks on three plays and took over at CC's 42 following a 16-yard punt by Eron Kosmowski.

Quarterback Kyle Rance picked up a first down with a 12-yard run and three plays later hit Drew Patrick with a 26-yard TD pass to make the score 7-7 with 7:03 left in the third quarter.

CC failed to pick up a first down in its next two possessions. Following a 19-yard punt, which was pretty good considering the conditions, by Kosmowski, the Colts took over at CC's 46 late in the third quarter. On the first play, senior tailback Torrance Adams took the handoff and went in untouched to give Troy a 14-7 lead with 1:04 remaining in the third quarter.

"We decided to let it all hang out in the third quarter," Griffith said.

CC's had the wind in the fourth quarter and the Shamrocks capitalized with Alcala's 63-yard run on first down with 8:07 remaining out the deficit to 14-13. Kosmowski made the

extra point following a good hold by Steve Mondry to tie the score.

"Greg's really been running hard in practice the last few weeks," CC coach Tom Mach said. "We got out of a tight 'T' offense a bit and Greg's a good open field runner. He ran like a champ today. That's a great team we played."

Troy failed to pick up a first down on its next possession and the Shamrocks took over at the Colts' 35 following a short punt.

It took CC seven plays to score on Spolsky's seven yard run around right end for the go-ahead points with 3:40 remaining. Spolsky finished with 75 yards on 24 carries, sharing the limelight with Alcala, who goes by the nickname "Chewey" after the Star Wars character.

"We all understand our roles and we take turns, if it's not 'Chewey,' then it's Kevin," Spolsky said. "That's a well-disciplined team and the game went back and forth, but I kind of feel it's our destiny to go all the way."

The Shamrocks finished with eight first downs to Troy's six. CC had 261 of its 267 yards on the ground. Troy had 170 total yards, 125 rushing. Adams led Troy with 91 yards on 19 carries. Rance had 30 yards on 10 carries and was three of 18 through the air for 45 yards.

Borgess smacks King in city final

Wheaties may be the Breakfast of Champions, but what works best for Redford Bishop Borgess guard Adriane Bryant is Blueberry Belgian Waffles.

The 5-foot-4 dynamo proved to be a mighty mite in the Operation-Friendship girls basketball final Saturday at the University of Detroit's Calihan Hall.

The senior point-guard scored game-high 23 points as the Catholic League representatives rolled to a shocking 66-41 win over previously unbeaten and Detroit Public School League champion King.

"I felt pretty good," said Bryant, who destroyed King with her superior quickness, not to mention six of nine shooting from the floor and 10 of 11 free throws. "If you play scared against King you're not going to win. You can't be intimidated by the twins (Tiffany and Stephanie Weems)."

"I'm used to taking the ball to the

big players. And I was happy my shot was on."

Borgess, two-time defending state Class C champion, finishes the regular season at 18-2 overall.

The impressive win also atones for losses earlier in the year to No. 1-ranked and defending state Class A champion Flint Northern and Beverly Hills-Detroit Country Day, rated No. 1 in Class B.

"It was one of our goals at the beginning of the year," Borgess coach Dave Mann said. "We felt we had to schedule those teams to stake a claim as one of the best in the state. Maybe we can't make that claim, but we can still say we're one of the best."

And Mann knows Bryant, who recently signed with the University of Toledo, is one of the best backcourt players in the state.

"She just killed them and had a great game shooting the ball," the

Borgess coach said. "They (King) were not having success with their big kids, so they went to a smaller lineup. But they couldn't catch her."

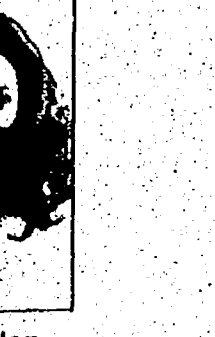

State qualifiers lead dream team

Instead of a reward, the Class A boys golf state meet must have felt like a punishment for the teams and individuals who qualified.

Cold, wind and rain greeted the players Oct. 20 and 21 at Forest Akers Golf Course in East Lansing. Redford Catholic Central, Livonia Churchill and Plymouth Salem qualified from Observerland and the Shamrocks persevered the best with a fourth-place finish.

But whatever took place at the state meet, the players knew what they accomplished in the previous two months wouldn't be washed away from their coach's minds in one weekend.

CC and Churchill were led by strong senior classes and have three representatives each on the All-Observer first team.

The Shamrocks won the Catholic League championship after going 10-0 through the dual meet season. CC placed second in the Class A regional at the Pontiac Country Club.

Churchill won the Pinckney Invitational and was later crowned the Western Lakes Activities Association and Class A regional champion. Salem handed the Chargers their only dual-meet defeat during the regular season and placed third in the same regional at Oak Pointe Golf Course.

The following is a profile of each golfer on the first team:

Chris Kiebler, senior, Livonia Churchill: The four-year letter winner was co-medalist at the Class A regional with teammate Gary Kraus, scoring 74 at Oak Pointe Golf Course. He was medalist at the WLAA meet with a round of 76 at Links of Pinewood.

He had a 37.35 average with a low of 34 and four scores of 35. He tied for ninth at the Brighton Invitational with 76.

His only struggle came at the state meet, recording 83 on the first day at Forest Akers Golf Course in East Lansing.

"Chris had a dream season," coach Kirk Osler said. "He was a determined competitor at every event he played in and it showed in his results."

Dave Higham, senior, Livonia

Churchill: Higham finished 13th at the state meet with a two-day total of 166 (75-81). He finished with a 79 at the regional and was tied for second at the WLAA meet with 78.

He recorded 75 to tie for fifth at the Pinckney Invitational. He led the Chargers with 74 at the Brighton Invitational and finished with a 38.14 average for nine holes.

"Dave has a great deal of talent in regards to ball-striking ability," Osler said. "He's probably the most-talented golfer we've seen at Churchill since Dean Kobane (who starred at the University of Michigan)."

Gary Kraus, junior, Livonia Churchill: Kraus rebounded from an 88 at the WLAA meet by tying Kiebler for medalist honors at the regional with 74. He also had a 79 at the state meet, which was four strokes off qualifying for a second day.

Kraus started the year strong, taking medalist honors at the Pinckney Invitational with a score of 73. He also helped the Chargers take fourth place at the Brighton Invitational with a score of 76 at Oak Pointe.

Kraus finished with a 38.84 average. "Gary showed great potential as a team leader and ability to shoot low numbers," Osler said. "I'm looking forward to his return next year."

Chris Misiak, senior, Redford Catholic Central: The four-year letter winner was medalist at the Catholic League Meet with a round of 74 at Riverview Highlands. His most impressive round came early in the year at the East Lansing Invitational, where he was medalist with 71 at Forest Akers Golf Course.

Misiak, who had a 77.5 average for tournaments, took sixth at the Class A regional with 76 at Pontiac Country Club. He had a 38.6 average for nine holes. He had 83 at the state meet.

"Chris has been a steady, three-year player for me," coach Phil Heyer said. "He's a good all-around athlete and strong iron player."

Brian Karabelski, senior, Redford Catholic Central: Karabelski came on strong near the end of the season, leading the Shamrocks to fourth in the team standings at the Class A state meet with a second-place total of 149 (72-77).

His 72 gave him first place after the first round.

He had a 39.9 nine-hole average and played his strongest at the 18-hole tournaments.

He finished seventh at the Class A regional with 77, tied for ninth at the Brighton Invitational with 76, and 13th in the Catholic League meet with 79 at Riverview Highlands.

"He was a little down going into the last stretch of the season and he got it all together at the end," Heyer said.

Brandon DiPaola, senior, Redford Catholic Central: DiPaola made Class A all-state after recording a 38.14 stroke aver-

Also earlier in the season, DiPaola was 13th at the Pinckney Invitational with 78 and sixth at the Brighton Invitational with 73.

"Brandon was probably one of the finest players CC has had in 10 years," Heyer said. "He is an excellent putter. When he's missing 'shots,' he makes up for it with his skill on the green."

Mike Hjelmsstad, senior, Plymouth Salem: Hjelmsstad carded 78 to tie for second at the WLAA meet at Links of Pinewood. He had 76 at the regional to tie for fifth. The four-year letter winner had a dual meet average of 38.1 as a senior.

His lowest nine-hole total was 34 and he had two 35s. He shot 71 in the first-round of the East Lansing Fall Classic, and 85 at the Class A meet.

"He had a stretch there for five duals in a row he was one over par or better," Salem coach Rick Wilson said. "I think we'll miss a guy who was that consistent. The thing about Mike is he didn't make many mistakes out there. He didn't allow himself to have a real bad hole to blow him out of the round. He is a good putter, drove the ball and managed the course well."

Dodge Grand Caravan changes for the better

OK, OK. I caught a lot of static from all of you out there when I said the Honda Odyssey was the very best minivan on the market.

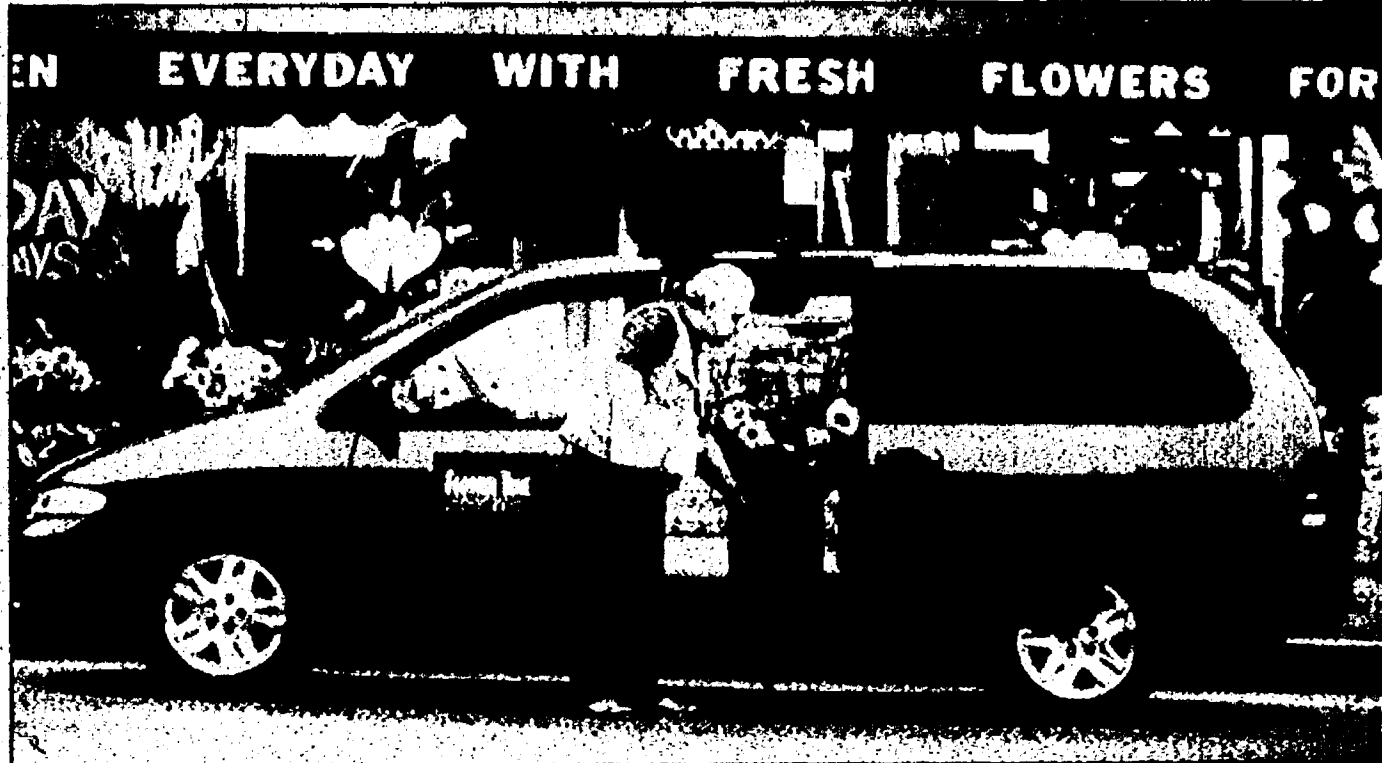
Well, at the time I drove it, it was.

It was the only minivan that drove like a car, was as easy — or easier — to get into than a car and had the magical fourth door on the driver's side.

I now stand corrected. The Odyssey now ties for first place with the 1996 Dodge Grand Caravan.

It's been more than a decade since Chrysler changed the way America drove when it introduced the minivan. And for 12 years, it had the ugliest, hardest to get into, uncomfortablest (is that a word?) minivans on the market.

Oh, sure, it made minor revisions and changes here and there, but other minivans had nicer options, better suspensions, more car-like ride and feel and car-like amenities.

than the Voyager and Caravan.

Let's throw all that out the window.

The new Dodge and Chrysler minivans have changed — and how they have changed. They haven't leapfrogged the competition, but they sure jumped ahead of the domestic offerings, that's for sure.

I mean, they're even kinda cute. For a minivan, that is. Exterior styling is smart and efficient. It doesn't look like

there's a lot more glass (even though there's been a 30 percent increase), but there's better visibility all around than before. I don't see any blind spots.

The front fascia looks friendly. The Grand Caravan is also higher and rounder than before, which translates into better front and rear headroom.

There are a lot of Caravans to choose from, including a short-wheelbase, long-wheelbase, entry level, mid-level and sporty versions. There are four choices in engines as well: 2.4-liter 16-valve 4-cylinder, 3.0-liter V-6, 3.3-liter V-6 and 3.8-liter V-6.

The 2.4-liter engine is mated to either a 3- or 4-speed automatic transaxle; the 3.0-liter has a 3-speed automatic and the 3.3-liter and 3.8-liter engines have 4-speed automatics.

The Grand Caravan evaluated was outfitted with the

3.3-liter sequential multi-port fuel injected V-6 that put out 158 horsepower. It was adequate for around-town driving. The 3.8-liter gives you 168 horsepower, which may be a little better for any towing you may have to do.

Fuel economy isn't too shabby: 18 in the city, 23 on the highway.

What I liked best was the interior.

Instrumentation is laid out well — logically, in fact. Everything is within easy reach, including the heating and cooling and the stereo.

There are pockets galore in this thing, from map pockets to coin holders to juice box holders.

Unfortunately, most "instrumentation" is done with warning lamps. Analog instrumentation is used only for the speedometer, odometer, trip odometer, fuel level and coolant level.

The tach is standard only on

the SE and LE trim levels. (I still would like to see more automakers use oil pressure gauges once in a while.)

Handling during city and highway driving was much better with the new Grand Caravan. It's quieter, too, and now has a car-like ride. It no longer feels like a truck.

The list of standard features on the Grand Caravan LE is long: Air, dual air bag (standard on all Caravans), front and rear door side beams, 4-wheel anti-lock brakes, eight cupholders, a rear defroster, power door locks, side window demister, tinted glass, intermittent wipers, windshield wiper de-icer and rear speed-delayed wiper.

By the way, all you smokers out there have to specifically ask for a "smoker's convenience package" that includes the lighter and ash receiver inserts. More and more automakers are doing away with those things, and Chrysler's no exception.

Oh, there's one thing Chrysler could do to top the Honda Odyssey. Put automatic sliding doors on the Grand Caravan.

Now THAT would make it perfect.

The Grand Caravan is a pleasant surprise. How 'bout that — now there are two minivans worth their weight out there.

How Many Fluids?

(CCC)-How many fluids can be checked on a typical car? Four? Six? Ten? If you guessed ten, you're right. They're found in the

1. Engine
2. Transmission
3. Braking System
4. Battery
5. Windshield Washers
6. Power Steering
7. Cooling System (Antifreeze)
8. CV Joints/Rear Axle
9. Gas Tank
10. Air Conditioner

All of the above require periodic checking and "topping off" except the CV joints (which should be checked for leakage) and some batteries. Which ones require changing? The engine oil, antifreeze, transmission fluid and brake fluid.

How many require filter replacement? Generally, three: the engine oil, transmission fluid and fuel. Late-model cars are more susceptible to trouble due to contaminated fuel and brake fluid, says the Car Care Council. The tiny orifices in fuel injection and braking systems require that the fluids passing through them be absolutely clean. For the long life and dependability of your vehicle, check fluids regularly, says the Council.
