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Murderer gets 15 to 30 years



Christopher David Poremba of Westland has received a 15-30-year prison sentence for the second-degree murder of his roommate. Family members of the victim pleaded with the judge for a lengthy sentence.

A Detroit judge Wednesday sentenced Westland murderer Christopher David Poremba to prison for 15 to 30 years for the shooting death of roommate Eric Alexander Lucia, a longtime Redford Township resident.

Wayne County Circuit Judge

Michael Callahan announced his decision after tearful Lucia family members pleaded for a long sentence for Poremba, 29.

Lucia's sister, Luanne Mueller, described the emotional pain of trying to cope with her 27-year-old brother's death last Sept. 18.

"The laughs, the tears, the tickle fights, the long talks, the hugs and the dinners that I made for him — all

I know now is that there will be no more," Mueller told Callahan.

She also described how her children, Jayson, 8, and Diane, 10, miss their "uncle Ricky."

Diane often clings to a stuffed bunny that Lucia gave to her, knowing that she won't be receiving any more presents from him, Mueller said. Jayson cherishes a football given to him by Lucia, who had planned to coach his nephew's youth team.

"They want to know why this bad man killed their uncle," Mueller told Callahan.

For a school project, Jayson made

a booklet that he titled, "In Memory of Uncle Ricky."

"To say that my children are devastated would be an understatement," Mueller said. "They now awake from nightmares that this man (Poremba) will come after them."

Poremba, a Wayne Memorial High graduate and Ford Motor Co. apprentice, was sentenced 19 days after a jury convicted him of second-degree murder.

Jurors rejected defense attorney Neil Fink's claims that Poremba was

Sassafras supporters circulate petitions

A citizens group fighting to stop the potential residential development of Sassafras Trails, a 64-acre nature area, seized an opportunity during last week's Westland Festival to circulate petitions for its cause.

Friends of Sassafras Trails member Teresa Robbins said the group has now collected about 2,000 signa-

tures urging the Wayne-Westland school board to protect Sassafras Trails, a heavily wooded area northeast of Palmer and Wildwood.

"We really pushed the issue at the festival," Robbins said.

The school board is considering selling the land after receiving appraisals that indicate the property could bring in more than \$1 million for the money-strapped district.

Board members are considering

rejecting a lesser offer of \$520,000 from the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, which would buy the development rights and preserve Sassafras Trails.

On Friday, board member Patricia Brown said a decision may arise during a 7 p.m. school board meeting today (Monday), even though Sassafras Trails isn't listed on the formal agenda.

"It's not on the agenda, but there's

a chance that it could be added if we amend the agenda," she said.

In another development, the Observer has learned that school Superintendent Duane Moore and Westland Mayor Robert Thomas have met to discuss Sassafras Trails, a meeting that some Sassafras supporters viewed as hopeful.

Thomas has vowed that his administration won't pressure the

under attack by Lucia when he shot the victim in the chest.

The killing occurred at Poremba's Westland home in the 32700 block of Parkwood. Witnesses said a dispute occurred when Poremba made derogatory remarks to a woman who came to his residence to visit Lucia and Lucia's friend, Richard Gofourth.

Poremba told the woman that Lucia and Gofourth were "trouble," Gofourth has testified.

Following a scuffle, Poremba pulled a gun and shot Lucia to death.

Mueller had to identify her dead brother's body.

"I realized what it was like to have your heart literally broken," she told Callahan.

"His murder has just ripped my world apart," she said, adding that Lucia family members have been sentenced to "a lifetime of hurt and longing."

Lucia's family members would

have preferred a longer prison term for Poremba, but Mueller said the judge followed sentencing guidelines based on issues such as Poremba's background.

"He's a good judge," Mueller said. "He's a fair judge."

She also commended assistant Wayne County prosecutor Augustus Hutting, saying he "left no stone unturned" in prosecuting Poremba.

Now that Poremba has been sentenced, Lucia's family will try to overcome the grief that has continued throughout Poremba's court proceedings.

"All of these court hearings made it rough," Mueller said. "Now our family needs some time to heal."

school board on its decision about Sassafras Trails. However, the mayor has pledged that - if asked - he would be willing to help school officials seek additional state grants to complement the DNR offer and preserve the land.

The DNR grant has to be accepted by Sept. 30, Robbins said, but city officials could continue afterward to seek additional state dollars.

Robbins said she is also encouraged that some Westland City Council members, namely Glenn Anderson and Sandra Cicirelli, have shown support for saving Sassafras Trails.

"They are just super people,"

she said.

Some school board members have said they support selling the property because it would not only bring in new revenue, but also would boost student enrollment from residential development.

The district receives about \$5,600 a year in state aid for each pupil that attends Wayne-Westland schools.

Other board members want to preserve Sassafras Trails and have long promised Sassafras supporters that they won't vote to sell the property.

The citizens group has said it hopes the district will eventually use Sassafras Trails to teach

students about science and the environment.

The school board last month deadlocked 3-3, with Brown absent, on the Sassafras Trails issue. But the board has since been revamped with newly elected members David Cox and Robin Moore assuming their posts on July 1.


Cox and Moore haven't made firm commitments either way on Sassafras Trails, saying they plan to study the issues before a new vote is taken.

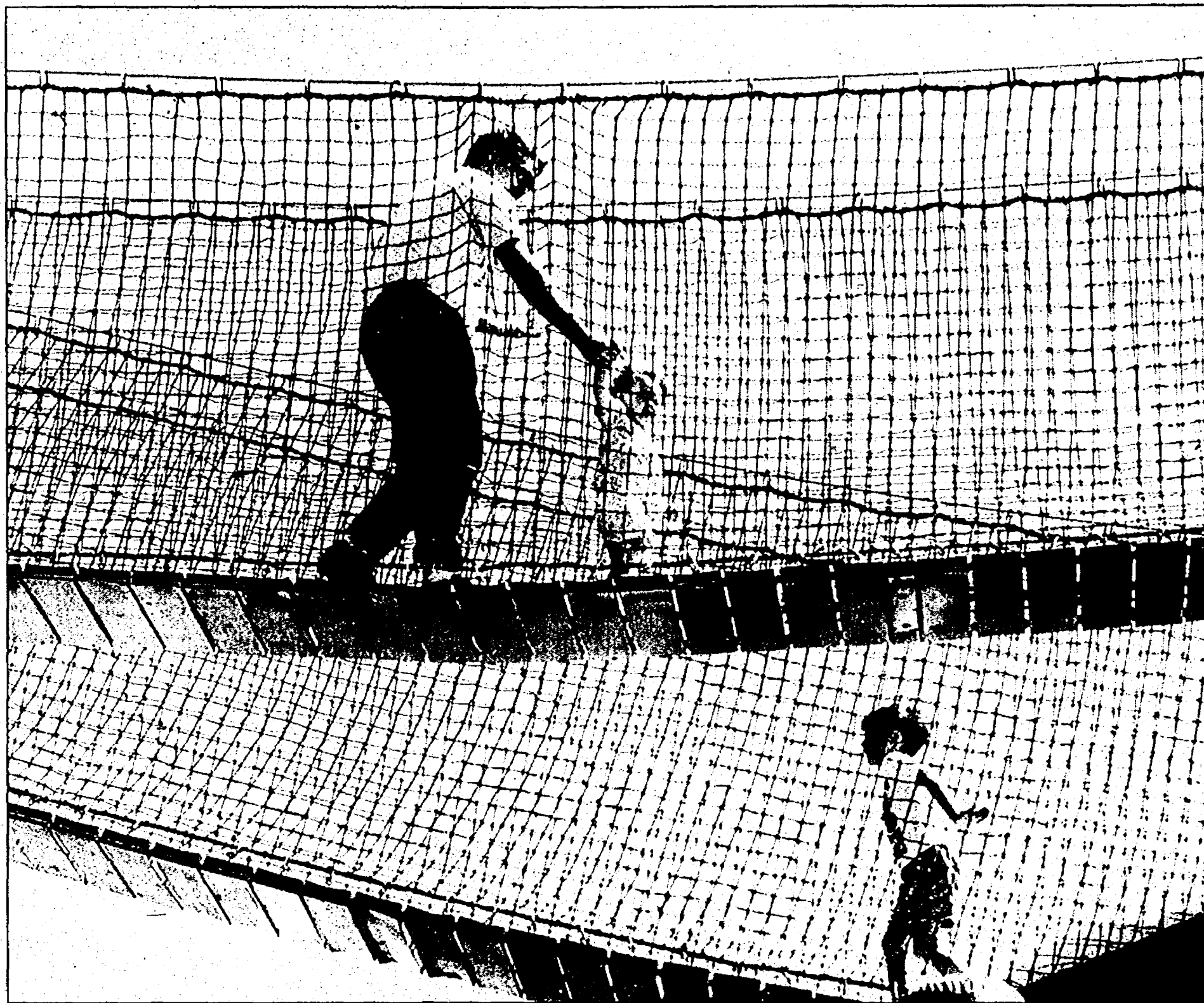

Westland Festival offers fun for participants

Everybody loves a parade, but 6-year-old Jenny Bone got to march in one.

Jenny, in the summer before she enters first grade at P.D. Graham Elementary School, marched with the Cheer America pompon team during Tuesday's 30th annual Westland Festival parade.

"It was fun," she said. "I liked marching."

On Friday, Jenny and her mother, Monica, returned to the festival where Jenny rode the carousel and braved a big slide that brought smiles to many youngsters' faces.

"It's a real nice festival," Monica Bone said. "They have a lot of ticket stands, so we didn't have to wait in a long line. The parade was real nice, too."

Thousands of people attended last week's festivities, which were to culminate Saturday with the city's annual fireworks display.

Jennifer Bird of Ann Arbor brought her Garden City niece, 3-year-old Aundrea Roye, to the festival.

"I want to go on the merry-go-round," Aundrea said.

Bird said she enjoyed playing games such as a basketball shoot.

"I liked it," she said of the festival. "There were a lot of things for kids to do."

Parade chairman Mike Spisak said this year's parade from Wildwood and Ford to the City Hall area lasted nearly two hours, twice as long as last year's.

"People were just delighted," he said. "I didn't hear one complaint."

Members of the U.S. Coast Guard flew overhead in helicopters, and some 90 units joined the parade, including the popular, national award-winning Coachmen Drum and Bugle Corps from Grand Rapids.

"People were lined up three and four deep on the curb," Spisak said. "They were actually coming out into the street. This is the biggest parade Westland has seen in 30 years."

Some food vendors expected record sales, he said.

"This is the best year some of them have ever had," Spisak said.

Some feared rain would spoil Tuesday's parade, which kicked off the festival.

"It was overcast, but we didn't get any rain until the end of the parade," Spisak said.

"It was the biggest parade we've ever had," community volunteer Sam Corrado said. "We had some great kids' groups, including dance groups and karate groups, and a lot of others. It was great."

Spisak commended Westland's business community and its residents for making the 30th festival a success.

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Wording of tax proposal raises questions

Former Westland City Councilman Thomas Brown is questioning the legality of an Aug. 6 public safety tax proposal aimed at strengthening the police and fire departments.

Brown is suggesting that even if voters approve the 1.5-mill, six-year tax plan, a possible lawsuit could block new revenues that city officials say would amount to \$11.5 million.

"It would seem to me that it would be subject to challenge at this time," he said.

But City Attorney Angelo Plakas said he believes the bal-

lot proposal - already revised once - is now properly worded.

The proposal was earlier amended because it failed to specify the number of years the tax would remain in effect.

New revenues would be used to implement a community policing program, provide paramedic training for all firefighters and renovate all four Westland fire stations.

The owner of an \$80,000 home would pay about \$60 more a year in taxes, city officials have said.

The ballot proposal will ask voters to approve a charter amendment raising the general operating millage ceiling from 8 mills to 9.5 mills.

During a July 1 council meeting, Brown objected to ballot language referring to a "special" election on Aug. 6.

The public safety proposal coincides with the Aug. 6 election primary, and Brown said the council shouldn't have approved language referring to a "special" city election.

After the meeting, Plakas said, "At this point I don't think it's a problem."

The following day, Plakas elaborated and said he believes the term "special" applies because the city has no other local elections.

The only other decisions facing voters have broader ramifications, such as the contest for the 18th District state House seat

currently occupied by Eileen DeHart, D-Westland.

DeHart is unopposed, but Republicans Dennis LeMaitre and Michael Novak are vying for the GOP nomination.

"Really we are having a special election," Plakas said, referring to the public safety proposal.

The plan is aimed at starting seven community policing districts, in which each of seven new officers would be assigned to patrol a specific area of the city.

In the fire department, officials have said the millage would provide a full-fledged Advanced Life Support system, meaning that paramedics would respond to medical emergencies from all four fire stations.

Paramedics, compared to

emergency medical technicians, have a higher level of on-the-scene skills for responding to heart attacks, diabetic seizures and other medical emergencies.

With the election drawing closer, firefighters and police officers have joined city leaders in pushing for approval of the tax plan.

The proposal is part of Mayor Robert Thomas' Project 2000, a plan that he said will help usher the city into the next century.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that at its regular meeting of Monday, July 1, 1996, the City Council of the City of Garden City did adopt the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE 96-006

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 161.222 CHAPTER 161, TITLE XV OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GARDEN CITY.

THE CITY OF GARDEN CITY HEREBY ORDAINS:

That Section 161.222 A (1), 161.222 C (1) (a), (b), (c), (10) (a) (i) of Chapter 161, Title XV of the Code of the City of Garden City be amended to read as follows:

Section 161.222 - SITE PLAN REVIEW PROCEDURES AND STANDARDS

A. SITE PLAN REVIEW

1. Site Plan Required

Except as provided in the sub-Section 161.222 A (2), the development of any new use, the construction of any new structures, any change of an existing use of land or structure that impacts any requirement of these regulations, and all other building or development activities shall require site plan approval prior to construction and/or occupancy pursuant to this Article. For example, site plan review is required for any of the following activities:

a. Erection, moving, relocation, or conversion of a building or structure to create additional floor space other than a single family dwelling.

b. Any development that would, if approved, provide for the establishment of more than one principal use on a parcel, such as a single family site condominium or similar project where a single parcel is developed to include two (2) or more sites for detached single family dwellings.

c. Development of non-single family residential uses on single family districts.

d. Any change in land use or change in the use of a structure that potentially affects compliance with the standards set forth within these regulations.

e. The development or construction of any accessory uses or structures, except for uses or structures that are accessory to a single family dwelling.

f. Any use or construction for which submission of a site plan is required by any provision of these regulations.

g. Establishment of any regulated use.

SECTION 161.222 - SITE PLAN REVIEW PROCEDURES AND STANDARDS

C. REVIEW AND ACTION

9. Modification to Approved Plan

A previously approved site plan may be subsequently modified, subject to the following requirements:

a. Review of Minor Modifications

Minor modifications to an approved site plan may be reviewed and approved by the Zoning Administrator consistent with the minimum information requirements of 161.222 (C) (10), provided that the modifications do not involve any one of the following items:

- a request for a variance.

- a Special Land Use

- a Planned Development plan, or

- the continuation of a nonconforming use or structure.

Minor modifications that require a variance, Special Land Use, Planned Development, or continuation of a nonconforming use or structure shall be subject to review and approval by the Planning Commission.

1. Minor Modification Defined

Minor modifications are changes that do not substantially affect the character or intensity of the use, vehicular or pedestrian circulation, drainage patterns, the demand for public services, or the vulnerability to hazards. Examples of minor modifications include:

- An addition to an existing building that does not increase or decrease the floor space by more than twenty-five percent (25%) or three thousand (3,000) square feet, whichever is less.

- Re-occupancy of a building by a similar use permitted by these regulations.

- Changes to building height that do not add an additional floor.

- Additions or alterations to the landscape plan or landscape materials.

- Relocation or re-fitting utility supply lines or service connections.

- Relocation or screening of the trash receptacle.

- Alterations to the internal parking layout of an off-street lot in which the total available spaces is unchanged.

Construction of a new building or structure, adding or deleting parking spaces, constructing additional stories or the introduction of additional curb cuts onto a public road are example of modifications that are not considered minor.

2. Determination of Minor Modification

The Zoning Administrator shall determine if the proposed modifications are minor in accordance with the guidelines in this section. In order to make a determination, the Zoning Administrator may solicit comments and recommendations from the City Attorney, City Planner, City Engineer, and Public Safety officials, as deemed necessary.

b. Modifications Not Deemed "Minor"

If the modifications are not deemed minor by the Zoning Administrator, then review and approval of the changes by the Planning Commission shall be required. Planning Commission review shall be required for all site plans that involve:

- a request for a variance

- a Special Land Use

- a discretionary decision such as a Planned Development plan, or

- the continuation of a nonconforming use or structure

City Council review and approval shall be required for modifications to a site plan that originally required City Council approval.

c. Record of Action

Each action related to modification of a site plan shall be duly recorded in writing on a copy of the approved plan, and shall be kept on file in the office of the Zoning Administrator. The Zoning Administrator shall have the authority to require a new site plan for the purposes of clarity. The Planning Commission shall be advised of all minor site plan modifications approved by the Zoning Administrator and such modifications shall be noted on the site plan and in the minutes of the Planning Commission.

10. Required Information for Sketch Plans

The following information shall accompany or be included on all sketch plans:

a. An application form as described in 161.222 (D) (1) shall be prepared and submitted with the sketch plan.

b. Sketch plans shall consist of an overall plan for the building and site or part of a site related to the building. The plan shall be drawn to scale of not less than 1 inch = 20 feet for property less than one acre, 1 inch = 30 feet for property larger than one acre but less than three acres, and 1 inch = 60 feet for property larger than three acres. Sheet size shall be at least 24 inches by 36 inches.

The following description and identification information shall be included on all sketch plans:

1. Scale and northpoint.

2. Name, address, and phone number of the applicant and the person preparing the drawing

3. Zoning classification of the subject site

4. Property boundary lines and dimensions; if more than one (1) lot is included in the site, the lot lines of each lot shall be indicated.

5. Front, side, and rear setbacks dimensioned from the minimum locations.

6. Existing and proposed driveways and edges of all existing and proposed paved surfaces, as required.

7. Parking spaces for the use, at the site required by the Ordinance.

8. The outline and dimensions of all existing and proposed exterior building walls on the site.

9. All exterior site improvements or modifications proposed in conjunction with the use described on the sketch plan including, but not limited to, building construction, new pavement, landscaping, trash receptacle, and site clearing.

10. A written description of the proposed use.

11. A floor plan describing the use of all interior floor space.

All Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

Except as herein modified, said code shall remain in full force and effect.

This amendatory ordinance is declared to be effective upon publication as required by law.

Area lawmakers say yes to trial court reform

"Go slow," Democrats warned as Legislative Republicans pushed for trial court reform. Republicans took the advice, taking two steps July 3 and paving the way for more massive steps in the fall.

The Legislature:

- Voted to abolish Detroit Recorder's Court effective Oct. 1, 1997, "grandfathering" its 29 judges as Wayne Circuit Court judges and requiring them to run countywide when seeking re-election.

For the first time in history, Michigan will have a uniform, statewide trial court system. Detroit no longer will be the only one of 271 Michigan cities with a separate criminal court. The law also blocks the Supreme Court from again shifting all suburban criminal cases to Detroit judges and juries.

- Established a uniform funding formula based on caseload. For a few outstate counties, it may be a windfall. Wayne County and Detroit are "held harmless," meaning they can't lose state aid through the end of fiscal 2001. Court employees' benefits also are protected.

Lawmakers must wait until a fall session beginning Sept. 10 to decide whether to:

- Establish a "family court" division of circuit court. It would involve transferring most of the powers of probate court and a few to district court.

- Place HJR S, a massive amendment to the judicial article of the Michigan Constitution, on the ballot. As drafted, it would establish a single "trial court," abolishing probate and district courts. Court borders would be county lines, but counties could have "election districts," meaning Detroit and the suburbs could be able to elect their "own" judges.

If adopted by voters, it will be the most massive change in state court history, surpassing the abolition of non-lawyer justices of the peace in the 1960s.

Engler prods

Gov. John Engler remained silent on the issue during the House-Senate conference committee's week of negotiations and the Legislature's two-day session.

Although legal reformers long sought the package of change, Engler precipitated it by (1) threatening to veto new judgeships in Oakland County, Farmington, the Northville-Plymouth-Canton area and Ypsilanti Township in 1994 and (2) actually vetoing more court funding this year until court reform took place.

"Reform," to supporters, means more ability to shift judges across jurisdictional and geographical boundaries. "A judge is a judge is a judge," in the words of House Judiciary Chair Michael Nye, R-Litchfield.

How they voted

Senate Republican stumbled when three of their 22 members missed the session - including Robert Geake of Northville. The bill failed on a 19-16 party-line vote with 20 needed for passage.

It was the second time Geake a 19-year senator with a nearly-perfect attendance record, missed a court reform vote. An aide said Geake had a church

camp commitment July 2 but changed it to July 3 when the one-day session was called. Majority leader Dick Posthumus, R-Alto, extended the session a day. Geake's aide said the senator couldn't break the July 3 commitment.

A month earlier, when the Senate Judiciary Committee took a key vote to report the reform bill out of committee, Geake attended a safety conference and had to be replaced on the committee so the GOP could have a majority to report out the bills.

On second try, the Senate passed the key bill won with a 23-12 vote as four Democrats crossed over: Chris Dingell of Trenton, Art Miller of Warren, Ken DeBeaussiaert of Macomb County and Don Koivisto of Ironwood.

All other senators voted with their parties except the three absentees.

The House vote was 70 to 33 with six not voting. Voting yes were 51 Republicans and 19 Democrats. Voting no were 33 Democrats.

Ryan was a key member of the conference committee, guarding funding for the Wayne County courts and employees' status. Whyman was a lightning rod for black lawmakers' wrath for her championing of abolishing Recorder's Court.

Debate brief

Debate was relatively brief and was confined to party spokesmen because no amendments are allowed on a conference committee report.

Senate Judiciary Chair William VanRegenmorter, R-Hudsonville, said, "I fully expect the family court bills will be passed when we take them up in September."

"Recorder's Court is abolished. Its uniqueness isn't the issue. It's not as efficient as it could be. Wayne County (suburban) voters can't vote for Recorder's Court judges. The judges will hear cases countywide and run countywide."

"A constitutional amendment will be considered, but it's not part of any agreement."

VanRegenmorter credited Wayne County senators Chris Dingell, D-Trenton, Robert Geake, R-Northville, and Loren Bennett, R-Canton, with being "effective spokesmen for their constituents" on Wayne County court funding.

"There's not a lot of reform in this bill," said Dingell. "My role

has been damage control... making it less odious."

Dingell said the bill sets up a 23-member commission to assess court cases on their difficulty with a goal of reallocating court resources.

In the House, Rep. Ted Wallace, D-Detroit, sounded like a suburbanite when he said twice the Supreme Court had been "wrong - no defense" in putting Detroit Recorder's Court in charge of all Wayne County criminal cases for nearly 19 years, adding, "But the Supreme Court has corrected that."

Rep. Michael Nye, R-Litchfield, House Judiciary chair who headed the conference committee, said, "Unification is a process that has been going on for a long time."

"When I started as a lawyer, we had justices of the peace. When they were abolished, some said, 'Migosh, we're losing control; this is a terrible thing'..."

"We've had battles in the counties about who's in control (of court budgets). The judges are going to fight this, no matter what. We say to the judges, 'You can hire and fire,' but the counties will handle the money."

"The 'family court' bills are Senate Bills 1052, 1054 and 1055. The constitutional amendment to establish a single 'trial court' is House Joint Resolution S. Refer to bill numbers when writing to your legislators. State Capitol, Lansing 48909.

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Commission denies golf cart contract

A contract to buy 140 new golf carts for the county-owned Warren Valley Golf Course didn't get enough votes for approval by the Wayne County Commission last week.

The \$382,175 contract with Club Car Inc. of Livonia would have bought 140 new golf carts and included a five-year maintenance agreement for the carts for the Warren Valley Golf Course in Dearborn Heights.

The plan would have replaced the 110 carts at the course, according to golf manager Ray Glenn. All of those carts are six years old and require spending \$6,000 out of the golf course budget for maintenance, Glenn said.

"It's not cost-efficient to continue using the carts we have," Glenn said.

Also, more carts are needed because on the nights leagues play the carts run out by 5:30 or 6 p.m., he said.

Cart rentals are also a "major revenue producer" as each cart generates \$2,300 a year, he said.

COUNTY NEWS

The contract needed eight votes for approval, but failed on a 7-4 vote, when two commissioners were out of the room and two were absent.

Local commissioners Thaddeus McCotter, R-Livonia, and Bruce Patterson, R-Canton Township, voted no, while Vice Chair Kay Beard, D-Westland, voted yes. Commissioner Michelle Plawecki, who represents Redford Township and part of Livonia, was absent.

Gypsy moths

Commissioners last week approved a resolution in support of continued federal funding of the gypsy moth spraying program.

"The problem is creating a panic situation among some home and woodland owners in Wayne County," according to the resolution sponsored by

Commissioner Bruce Patterson, R-Canton Township. Many other commissioners added their names as sponsors during the meeting.

Gypsy moths infest wooded areas and strip trees of their foliage. Treatment includes spraying a pesticide during the spring. Michigan State University through the Cooperative Extension program conducts a spraying program.

Gypsy moth spraying was conducted in May in Livonia and several other areas of the county, but residents in other parts of the county, such as Van Buren and Sumpter townships, have also reported a problem.

New signals

A contract for the installation of side-of-street flashing light signals, half-roadway gates and constant warning time devices at the railroad tracks of CSX Transportation at Eckles Road in Livonia was approved last week.

Commissioners approved a

Michigan Department of Transportation contract between MDOT, the county, and the city of Livonia. The signals won't cost the county, according to the CEO's office.

Video arraignments

A program which is designed to speed up arraignments, allow for more officers on the streets and offer better services for victims of crime was approved last week by the Wayne County Commission.

A memorandum of understanding between Wayne County, the Detroit Police Department, and the 36th District Court will begin a program of video arraignments and conferencing.

A \$175,000 grant will implement the program.

The plan went to the Detroit City Council for approval after it left the commission.

CAPITOL CAPSULES

You can't be sued if you provide true information during insurance fraud investigations under a new state law.

Public Act 229 of 1996 protects companies and employees who uncover insurance fraud from "the chilling effect lawsuits have had on anti-fraud efforts," said Dale Robertson, of Blue Cross-Blue Shield of Michigan. "Even when acting in good faith, we get sued," he said. Since 1980 the agency has recovered \$44 million and prevented the loss of approximately \$81 million.

The act was sponsored by Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, vice-chair of the House Insurance Committee.

Condo tax break

All condominium owners would pay property taxes at homeowner rates rather than commercial rates under a House-passed bill waiting action this fall in the Senate.

Rep. Dan Gustafson, R-

Williamston, is sponsor and Rep. Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, co-sponsor, of House Bill 5706, aimed at correcting what they call a glitch in the Proposal A reforms approved by voters in 1994. The package calls for taxing homes at 6 mills and business property at 24 mills.

Most condo owners pay the 6-mill rate, but tenants who did not own stock were denied the tax break, Law said. "One word seems to be causing all the problems. This legislation changes the wording from 'stockholder' to 'owner' and ensures that everyone gets the exemptions they're entitled to," said Law. HB 5706 is in the Senate Finance Committee.

Kudos to Doctoroff

Chief Judge Martin M. Doctoroff of the state Court of Appeals has been nominated for an award to the Foundation for Improvement of Justice in Carrollton, Ga.

Doctoroff, of Birmingham, and

William B. Murphy, chief judge pro tem, were nominated by state attorney general Frank Kelley for reducing the appellate court's backlog from 5,000-plus cases and a three-year wait to less than 1,400 cases and a one-year wait.

Voters in 1994 approved a constitutional amendment eliminating an automatic right of appeal for convicts who plead guilty. The court was expanded from 18 to 24 judges. Circuit judges were assigned to sit on all three-member appellate panels, expanding the number of working appellate judges to 36.

Kelley said he nominated Doctoroff and Murphy in a category called "Speeding the Process." The Foundation for Improvement of Justice is a private, non-profit institution founded in 1985 to improve federal and state justice systems in the United States.

Traffic report

Michigan State Police report: Traffic fatalities were up 8 percent in 1995 - 1,537 deaths versus 1,419 in 1994. It was the second annual increase in a row.

Safety belt use is creeping up and is now at 69 percent. But 58 percent of fatalities involved people who failed to use seat belts. "Clearly, our most aggressive and at-risk drivers are not buckling up," said Betty Mercer, director of the Office of Highway Safety Planning.

Drunk driving arrests increased in 1995 to 59,484, up 7.8 percent over the previous year. An anti-drunk driving campaign and more troopers on the road were credited for helping the increase. Of those arrested, 83.4 percent were male. Nearly one in five arrests occurred as the result of a traffic crash.

Designer's jewels are fancy and fun

I've always wondered, "How much jewelry is too much?"

I got the chance to put it to an expert recently when internationally recognized jewelry designer Patricia Daunis met with shoppers at Orin Jewelers, Garden City and Northville.

Daunis said she studied people in order to create jewelry enhancing the wearer. She arrived wearing gold earrings, necklace, bracelet, lapel pin, a ring on each hand, and a 14K gold spider (\$219) pinned on the cuff of one sleeve.

"If you're having fun, who cares how much jewelry you're wearing?" she laughed. "What drives me crazy is when women say, 'All my jewelry is locked up in a vault.'"

Daunis, 44, is a three-time winner of the World Gold Council Awards, DeBeer's Diamonds Today Design Award and the Jewelers of America Jewel Award. She's been designing jewelry for 15 years.

According to Daunis, a Rhode Island School of Design graduate, a woman should choose jewelry based on her face shape, body type, hair style and personality. When consulting with a customer, Daunis asks what type of image her customer is trying to convey. Is she tall or short? What types of earrings has she worn in the past? What style of clothing does she wear? What colors, fabrics, does she prefer?

Before sitting down to design jewelry in her Maine studio, Daunis "tears pages from fashion magazines such as *W* and *Vogue* because clothes and jewelry must work together." On this occasion, Daunis wore a shawl-collared brown suit with a plain cocoa blouse without detail to provide a clean, unconflicting canvas for her accessories.

"Jewelry should be part of your whole story. Good earrings call attention to your eyes and mouth.

A basic rule of thumb is a rounder face goes with a longer style earring, a longer face with a rounder earring. Short-haired women shouldn't wear drop style earrings while women with longer hair should," she advised.

"Concentrate on elements that make you special or beautiful and then accent them. Don't get sucked into trends," she continued. "Wear less jewelry if you dress in prints. Consider the weight of the jewelry. Avoid wearing large, bold jewelry unless you are tall or have strong features and utilize only one or two pieces at a time."

"The biggest mistake women make is not wearing jewelry. Most women have a sense of what looks good on them. I like jewelry I can just put on, dress it up or down, and it will carry me through the day."

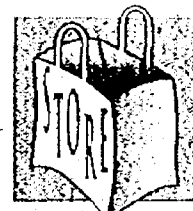
Versatility is key to Daunis' designs. She strives to incorporate movement and light in each piece. She avoids producing hard edges believing curving shapes interplay with the human body fitting into its niches. Nature is a major inspiration. Daunis' sculptural 14K gold Bay of Fundy earrings (\$570) were actually created to mirror the wave-action of water in the Norway bay.

"That's the magic making. My designs are soft because metal is hard," she pointed out. "Good jewelry is site specific sculpture. Your ear is very three dimensional. The earring should relate to that part of the body without overwhelming it."

Daunis' new collection, carried by independent retailers from New York to California and Japan, features a woven pattern that goes back to her roots. Originally, she planned to study architecture then switched to textile design. Rather than take a weaving class requiring tremendous amounts of patience, Daunis again changed directions this time to metalsmithing and sculpture. After receiving a bachelor of fine arts degree from one of the top art schools in the country, Daunis started her own wholesale/retail jewelry and holloware business in the basement of her home.

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New dean of centers likes the team spirit Schoolcraft offers

Scott Jenkins is a man with a plan.

During his 17 years working various jobs at General Motors, he went to school whenever he could fit it into his schedule to complete his degrees.

He knew he wanted to work in education, and it took years of work to reach his goals.

But as the newly appointed dean of College Centers at Schoolcraft College and with the expected completion of his doctorate in 1997, Jenkins is on his way to completing his plan.

He made the move into education when he went to work at Mott Community College where he most recently held the position of dean of continuing education.

As dean of college centers at Schoolcraft, he oversees Radcliff Center in Garden City and satellite centers in Plymouth and Canton Township.

Since starting his job in May, he has some ideas he'd like to explore. He sees a need to expand the daytime program at

Radcliff, while the evening program is near capacity and expansion may be necessary at Garden City Junior High School, which is next to Radcliff Center. Radcliff already uses some space at the junior high.

He is also looking at expanding course offerings in Plymouth, where Schoolcraft offers classes at Plymouth Salem High School.

The college also offers classes at the Summit on the Park in Canton Township, and Jenkins is looking at expanding offerings there to include more general education classes.

Radcliff's weekend college is growing and an expansion of that program looms in the future.

Any additions, however, will be gradual as he thinks Schoolcraft has a good handle on the people it serves.

"I don't believe we would make any major changes for at least a year," Jenkins said.

At Mott, Jenkins held a job somewhat similar to his new position, but he estimates about

80 percent of it involved training programs and 20 percent degree programs.

His new job is approximately the opposite, with 80 percent degree students and 20 percent in training programs.

In addition to course offering, Jenkins is also seeing through a renovation program at Radcliff. Work is being done now to improve the overall appearance of Radcliff - repairs are being made on the roof, and other building renovations are being completed.

All the work is part of a renovation plan which began several years ago. Radcliff is a different place compared to what it was just two years ago, Jenkins said. It's all part of a major initiative to improve Radcliff's stature in the community, he said.

It's also part of a plan to get Radcliff up to higher education standards, he said. "We want to make sure the facility is as good as our instructors or better," he said.

Jenkins likes the residential setting at Radcliff, and he likes the metro Detroit area.

While he is still living in Flint, he and his wife are planning to make the move to the Detroit area soon.

Jenkins is a graduate student at Michigan State University,

where he is working on a doctorate in college and university administration.

He holds a master's degree from Central Michigan University in education administration and a bachelor's degree from University of Michigan-Flint in sociology and corrections.

At GM he started out as an hourly employee in security. He worked through five years of commuting to a GM plant in Lake Orion where he was a first line supervisor and general foreman.

His goal was to work for GM for 20 years while pursuing his education and then to change

careers. "We always wanted to raise our kids in one area," he said. Once the kids were grown he was ready to make a move. He has three grown children, ages 22, 24 and 27.

His opportunity came three years early. "It was one of those things I'd always planned," he said.

Getting his education took persistence and time, he said. He took classes around his work schedule - at night when he worked days and during the day when he worked the third shift.

GIVE IT TWO MINUTES

It is estimated that three out of four adults have bacterial infection associated with gum disease due to a buildup of plaque. If the milky buildup of bacteria-laden plaque is not removed from the teeth each day with brushing, it produces toxins that cause bloody gums and bad breath. In time, the bacteria plaque will pull the gums away from the teeth to form pockets that will fill with more plaque to cause trouble nearer the bone. The good news is that it only takes a minimum of two minutes of brushing to clean teeth properly. Studies show, however, that the typical American brushes for 37 seconds. According to the American Dental Association's Council on Scientific Affairs, this inadequate brushing time results in teeth that still have

some plaque left on them after cursory attempts at brushing. Because the bacteria need a full 24 hours to reorganize themselves, a minimum two-minute brush daily is all it takes to keep them at bay.

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P.S. While you are brushing your teeth, think about easing up on the pressure you exert on your teeth. Most people use two, three, and four times the pressure that they should.

Stockpile staples for no sweat meals

With the volume of cookbooks, press releases, newsletters and other food news that continually crosses my desk, one can get pretty bogged down just trying to locate the ingredients for "Lobster Cakes with a Three Pepper Relish and Papaya Mayonnaise."

I don't cook like that, never have, and while there are times when I might have to prepare something fancy, I do it with reluctance. During the summer, the last thing I want to do is shop for exotic ingredients, pull out my good cookware, and slave over a hot stove, timing everything to the "nth" degree. I want something light, something fresh, something fast. When the temperature is hovering around 90 degrees F, I only want to break a sweat making lemonade or something that can be chilled and eaten two days later. The recipe should include ingredients that I already have on hand either in the refrigerator or pantry. If this sounds like I'm asking for too much, it should also be somewhat healthy. Sounds like too tall a request? Hardly.

When unexpected guests drop by, or I feel like dining on the patio with one bowl and a hunk of bread, I always think of how easy it is to make hummus, tapenade or a simple plate of tomatoes, mozzarella slices, chopped basil, and a drizzle of olive oil.

Sensational staples

A drained can of chick peas from the pantry, a dollop of tahini (sesame seed paste) from the refrigerator and a splash of lemon juice all thrown into the food processor makes a meal that can be dipped with vegetables, spread on flour tortillas, served with crackers or tortilla chips. If there are some roasted red peppers or the remnants of another bean dish in the refrigerator, I might become more creative and combine the flavors and textures. I've made hummus with navy beans, black beans, pinto beans and a combination of those beans, all with great tasting results. Everyone has a can of beans on their shelves, right?

Whenever I shop at those trendy markets like the Merchant of Vino, Vic's, Papa Joe's or the Long Lake Market, I always pick up a jar of pitted black Calamatta olives. Again, tossed into a food processor with a handful of capers (buy the bigger jars; it's cheaper and they last forever) and a healthy splash of olive oil and you can feel like a guest in your own kitchen. With the emergence of Italian delis flourishing on all sides of metro Detroit I can hardly wait for the tomatoes to ripen in my garden. Soothsayers say that although everything is three weeks behind, the warm, wet spring should bring forth a bumper crop for backyard gardeners. I've already picked fresh basil and ground it up with pine nuts, imported Parmesan cheese, garlic and olive oil for a pesto that gave a plain box of pasta new meaning.

I always keep a standing supply of burpable containers and tight fitting jars filled with bulgur wheat, couscous, barley and other grains. Cold salads are tossed together in the time it takes the grains to soak, about 15 minutes, they are not only nutritious, but taste good too.

Last week I soaked some bulgur wheat and stirred in a jar of salsa, a handful of parsley from my garden, and some leftover mushrooms. I splashed them with a low-fat bottled Italian salad dressing, and by the time it took to heat a frozen pita in the oven to hot tenderness, the chilled salad was ready.

Baked potatoes

Whenever I bake potatoes, I always bake an extra half dozen or so and they end up in the vegetable crisper just waiting to be used. On days when I decide to grill, I brush an old metal pie tin with oil and fill it with shredded potatoes and a bit of finely chopped onion. This mélange sits on the grill surface, next to the steak, fish or poultry and turns into a crispy side dish. Looking for something a bit more exotic? I always keep a jar of dried mushrooms handy and after soaking them in some hot water for 15 minutes they usually end up chopped into a burger, steak, or tossed with potatoes.

What's that you say? How about something for kids? Who says frozen chicken tenders can't be grilled? Who says a raw potato can't be sliced with the skin on and grilled, all while being brushed with a low cal vinaigrette and then topped with a sprinkle of Parmesan or cheddar cheese? Ever roast broccoli, cauliflower or asparagus? Spray it with some broth or bouillon during cooking. Your kids will love it, and so will you!

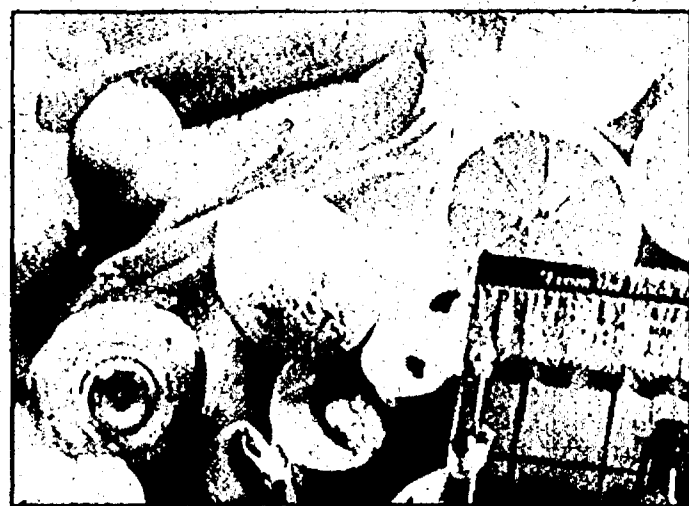

SCALLOPS SAUTEED WITH FRESH HERBS

- 1 1/2 pounds scallops
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Flour
- 4 tablespoons butter, clarified
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh herbs combined: chives, parsley, tarragon, chervil
- Juice of 1/2 lemon

Prepare a large, stick-free skillet or two.

Dry the scallops, season them and roll in flour. Add butter to hot pans, then the scallops in a single layer and over high heat sear them quickly on all sides, just to heat through. Add the herbs and lemon juice, toss to coat.

Serve with mashed or boiled potatoes and a salad.

Healthier version: Replace clarified butter with 2 tablespoons canola oil. Omit flour. Serves 4. From "Cooking Seafood" video.

SWORDFISH STEAK MARTINI

- 4 8-ounce swordfish steaks
- 1/2 cup dry vermouth
- 1/4 cup gin
- Salt and fresh ground pepper to taste
- 3 tablespoons clear melted butter
- 1/4 cup chopped green olives

In a glass (or ceramic or plastic) dish marinate the swordfish in vermouth and gin, covered and refrigerated for two hours.

Remove, pat dry with a paper towel. Reserve juice. Preheat 2 non-stick skillets, add butter and place swordfish in. Over medium-high heat cook steaks until you see their juice rising on the surface, turn them over and finish on the other side. Do not overcook.

Place cooked swordfish on plates. Add marinating juice to the skillets and swirl around. Combine in one pan, add olives, reduce if necessary by boiling, then spoon over fish.

Serve with sauteed or boiled potatoes and a nice vegetable or salad. Serves 4.

WALLEYE SAUTEED IN HAZELNUT CRUST

- 6 walleye fillets, boned and skinned, 6-8 ounces each
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Flour
- 3/4 cup fresh bread crumbs
- 3/4 cup finely ground hazelnuts
- 1 egg, beaten with 2 tablespoons milk
- 1/2 cup clarified butter

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Preheat 2 large skillets to medium hot.

Mix hazelnuts with bread crumbs

Season fish and dust with flour. Dip it in the beaten egg, then coat with hazelnut and crumb mixture on both sides. Shake excess crumbs off. Heat the butter in pans, place fish in.

Brown nicely on one side, turn and brown the other side. Transfer fish to a cookie sheet, place in the oven for about 3 minutes.

You may serve it as is with lemon wedges. Serves 6.

Chef's Tips: To make fresh bread crumbs, trim crust off fresh white bread, place the white bread in a food processor or mixer and grind up.

To make clarified butter, place it in a tall pot over moderate heat and cook until it stops bubbling, then pour it into another container.

Travel agents will have to wait awhile before booking the right Livonia Collegiate Baseball League party to Johnstown, Pa. for the All-American Amateur-Baseball Association tournament.

Decision Consultants, Inc., facing a must-win situation, kept their hopes alive by downing first-place Hines Park Lincoln/Mercury, 4-2, in a LCBL showdown Wednesday at Ford Field.

O'Shea resigns from Churchill

Citing increased responsibilities as women's soccer coach at Oakland University, Nick O'Shea submitted a letter of resignation as Livonia Churchill girls varsity coach Wednesday to new athletic director Marc Hage.

O'Shea, 36, leaves Churchill with an impressive 106-41-17 record in 10 seasons. He led the Chargers to a pair of runner-up finishes in the state Class A finals, 1987 and '88, his first two seasons. He won a total of two regionals, six districts and one Western Lakes Activities Association crown.

"It's really too difficult to both jobs in the spring," said O'Shea, who launched the OU's women's varsity program last fall. "It was cutting my spring season short. I was starting the day at Oakland, coming back over to Churchill in the afternoon, and then going back for evening practices at Oakland."

"I was in the car almost two hours and 20 minutes each day during the week and that wasn't at all productive."

O'Shea also oversees the Michigan State Youth Soccer Association's Girls Olympic Development selection process and is an ODP regional coach (ages 15-16), which encompasses 13 states. He also is heavily involved in running summer camps.

"My only regret about leaving Churchill is that I would have liked to have won a title," O'Shea said. "We were in the finals twice and I thought this year we had a chance. Two of our three losses this year were to the teams in the state finals."

Churchill finished 12-3 this season, winning both the Western Division and the WLA's first-place crossover game against Lakes Division champion Plymouth Salem, but the season ended on a sour note in the Plymouth Canton district-semifinals when the Lady Chargers were

eliminated by the host Chiefs, 3-2, in a double-overtime game that was played under the wrong OT format. Instead of going to a sudden-death format (which Churchill scored first), the two teams played it out under a pair of 10-minute periods.

Ironically, Canton went on to win the state title.

"We could have gotten it done had it not been for the fiasco we had in the tourney," O'Shea said. "But overall my experience at Churchill was rewarding, enjoyable and beneficial to my personal development and enhancement of my profession."

"What I'll miss most is dealing with the younger players, but I'll still be active with the ODP. I'm not leaving coaching."

Hage, who replaced the retired Don Albertson as Churchill's A.D. in June, said he will post the girls varsity soccer position sometime this week. (He also said he will begin interviews for the boys varsity basketball job in the middle of the month).

"With Nick's increased commitment to the A.D. (and the athletic department at Oakland), he felt it was time to step down at Churchill even though it was something he enjoyed and did a very good job at," Hage said. "I'm going to miss him and he's done wonders for our program. He's been a source of inspiration for many players and his knowledge and level of play will be hard to duplicate. He's a good person and good coach."

O'Shea is a graduate of Livonia Franklin and played collegiately at both Schoolcraft Community College and OU (where he earned All-NCAA Region II honors in 1983). He played professionally for Oklahoma City and Kalamazoo of the old American Professional Soccer League.

O'Shea began his high school coaching career in 1986 where he

served as an assistant under Ed Dudek, who guided the Lady Chargers to the state championship.

"I felt I could have won a few more games at Churchill," O'Shea said, "But I tried developmental things,

Slowly, surely, Glen Donahue is taking Schoolcraft College's men's basketball team toward his goal - a deeper, more talented group of Ocelots and, ultimately, a better record.

At present, size could be a problem, but the backcourt shouldn't be if the newcomers Donahue has coming in are as good as hoped.

"At guard, we have five solid players," Donahue said. "We've improved at depth and at quality of players."

Helping attain that goal are guards Pete Males, a 1995 Garden City graduate, and Tykie Reeves, from Willow Run. They join forward Kevin Melson, from Detroit Commu-

Reeves is a 6-1 off-guard whom Donahue hopes can supplement the offense. With Hoener and returnee Dwaun Warmack, both at point guard, and Stan Cavin, another returnee, at off-guard, SC should be set in the backcourt.

The frontcourt is another question, however. Rudy Hatfield, a 6-3 forward from Livonia Churchill; Bruce Goode, a 6-1 forward from Detroit Henry Ford; and Naron Burks, a 6-6 center/forward from River Rouge, return.

They'll be joined by the 6-6 Melson, a player Donahue is extremely high on. "I hate to compare him to someone like Vernon Carr," the SC





Comfort, convenience are hallmarks of Achieva

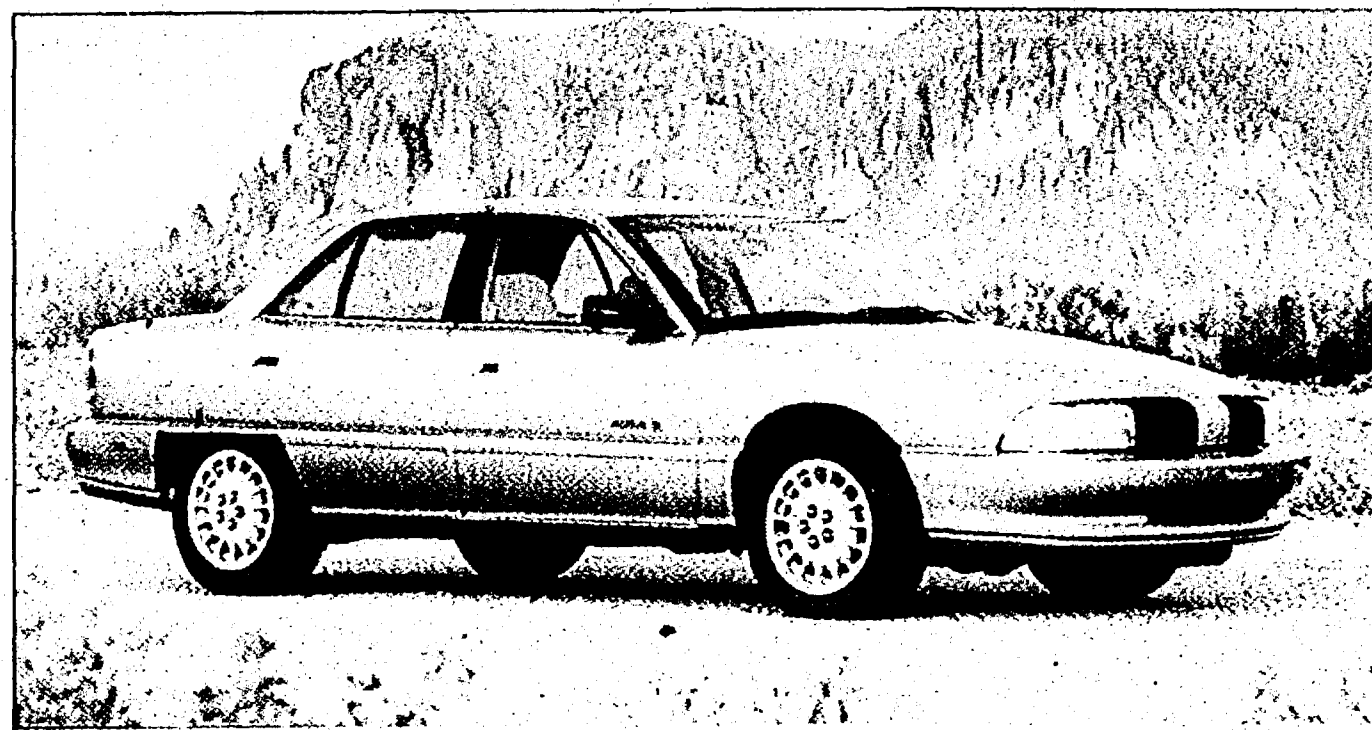
There were only two things I don't like about the 1996 Oldsmobile Achieva: Its lack of power and the price — around \$18,000, if nicely equipped.

So let's get that over with and get on with the nice parts of the car, because there are a lot of good things to say about the Achieva.

The standard 2.4-liter twin cam 4-cylinder engine just doesn't provide enough power for a car of this size. It's classified as a compact, but I would call this car a large compact. I was really surprised, as well, that the horsepower on this engine is 150. It just doesn't seem like there's that much horsepower to tool this thing around town. The Achieva's a bit noisy, too.

And the price: Base is \$16,495. There's a fair list of standard equipment, but it's a bit steep for a small car with a 4-cylinder engine.

Maybe if I had driven the standard engine mated to the 5-speed manual instead of the

fort and room and very fuel efficient — 22 in the city and 32 on the highway.

It really surprised me that the amount of headroom, legroom and hiproom was impressive. I'm tall person, so comfort is important to me. Driven was the SL sedan. The rear seats were really easy to get in and out of. And the rear doors swing out wide to provide access.

First introduced in 1992, the Achieva is available in three trim levels and can be ordered in a 2-door coupe or 4-door sedan. This year, the Achieva has been given a fresh look on the inside with dual air bags, an improved V6 and an enhanced traction system. Added to the standard equipment list are air conditioning and a PASSlock theft deterrent system.

The 155-horsepower V6 powertrain has been upgraded this year with a stiffer cylinder block

and intake manifold design to cut down on the noise. As with many General Motors vehicles, the Achieva's engine is outfitted with platinum-tipped spark plugs that avoid misfire and don't have to be changed until they reach the 100,000-mile mark.

Also adding to the low maintenance list is filled-for-life transmission fluid, long-life coolant and distributorless ignition.

The interior has been changed from top to bottom — "floor mats to headliner," Oldsmobile officials say.

I love the new three-point, pillar-mounted safety belts. They're so comfortable to wear. No cutting on the neck, not hard to engage in the clip and just plain easy to get in and out of. I wish everyone would have three-point belts.

The center console has two

cupholders and an auxiliary power outlet — a lifesaver for anyone who has a cellular flip phone and uses the power cord on lengthy trips. The cupholders are even deep enough to hold the phone safely.

The power mirror and window switches are now located on the driver's door, making it a lot more convenient. Also added this year were adjustable lumbar support for the driver's seat and a leather-wrapped steering wheel and shifter.

Standard is an AM/FM stereo, but you can upgrade to a cassette, compact disc or cassette and CD.

Other improvements on the Achieva this year include a one-key system for the doors, ignition, deck lid and glove box.

The standard equipment list on the SL sedan isn't short: Anti-lock brakes, a security system, intermittent wipers, 4-speed automatic transmission, 15-inch steel belted radial blackwall

tires, reclining front buckets with driver's 4-way adjustable and passenger's 2 way adjustable seats, rear cupholders, air conditioning, AM/FM cassette stereo with clock and rear window grid antenna, rear window defogger, courtesy lamps, illuminated entry and exit, power mirrors, remote fuel door and trunk release, tinted windows and tilt steering wheel.

The bottom line: The Achieva measures up when it comes to comfort and convenience. Just wish it cost less.
