High school students who failed the state's new proficiency tests will get a second chance this week. The initial scores, released a week ago, showed that a majority of students scored poorly.

A large majority of Wayne-Westland 11th-graders fell short of scores that they needed to pass a new proficiency test, meaning they could face high school graduation without a state-endorsed diploma.

However, students who posted failing scores on the tough new test, given to juniors last school year, will have two more opportunities as seniors to pass it.

"They get three cracks at it," John Glenn High School counselor Ken Mientkiewicz said Friday.

Students who posted low scores will get a second chance this week to pass the proficiency test, and a final opportunity will come early next year, he said.

For the first time ever, high school juniors last year took the four-part, 11-hour test that measures skills in science, math, reading and writing,

Even students who had high scores on other achievement tests found the proficiency exam "frustrating," Mientkiewicz said.

To add to the anxiety, many colleges, universities and employers are expected to begin paying closer

attention to state-endorsed diplomas as the proficiency test gains public attention.

"It's getting a stronger push right now," Mientkiewicz said.

Students who fail to earn a stateendorsed diploma still can receive a local diploma, although it may not have as much clout.

Students can earn state-endorsed diplomas in three areas: science, math and communication arts. The latter area requires graduates to be proficient in both reading and writ-

Moreover, students can earn a state-endorsed diploma in one subject while falling short in another.

District officials and schoolimprovement teams will try to address test problems in hopes of boosting student scores.

Impending curriculum changes may help to improve student test scores, and educators also will try to relay to students the importance of taking the exam seriously, said Jane Kuckel, assistant superintendent for instruction.

"We have our work cut out for us," she said during a recent Wayne-Westland school board meeting.

Only 17 percent of local 11thgraders earned a proficient score on last year's science test, compared to 32 percent of all Michigan high school juniors.

"Our science scores are not very good," Kuckel said.

In the Livonia school district, which also serves part of Westland, 35.5 percent of 11th-graders earned



# Police on the road with new weapon

The Westland police department has a new twowheeled tool in its battle to prevent crime and catch the bad guys.

The tools are in the form of five new Harley-Davidson motorcycles, put into use two weeks ago by a reactivated motor traffic unit.

The cycles' crime-fighting benefits are numerous, said the five officers who completed the 100-hour training course at the Pontiac Silverdome. Instructors came from the Northwest University Traffic Institute motorcycle police operations school.

Pat Corby, one of the five officers assigned to the new unit, describes the cycles as "stealth" bombers."

A colleague added that the Harleys can go nearly everywhere that patrol cars can as well as getting into fields and wooded areas which the larger vehi-

#### cles.can't go.

"We can go anywhere you can walk — almost such as school grounds and bike trials," said Tom Lessnau, motorcycle officer.

"We can do anything (with the cycles) except transport prisoners," he added.

Put into action Tuesday, Sept. 17, the cycles fulfilled their first official duties as the riders served as local escorts for President Bill Clinton, who brought his campaign spent to the William Ford Career/Technical Center and the John Glenn High School football field.

One advantage in traffic enforcement, said Officer Alan Ramsden, is that speeders in neighborhoods wouldn't realize that the nearby motorcycle they see is a police vehicle. Handling the new duties are Ramsden, Corby, Lessnau, Jack McIntosh and Dan Karrick.

McIntosh, Karrick and Ramsden each have six years of police experience, all with the Westland department.

Lessnau has 10 years of police work, with the last six in Westland. Corby is nearing his fourth anniversary with the local department.

The motorcycle unit will basically be used in "selective traffic enforcement," they said, with special attention paid to high-accident intersections, such as Wayne-Ford and Wayne-Warren, as well as complaints from residents.

7 The cycles "allow us to go to different areas for traffic violators" and "provides better accessibility to get traffic violators," said McIntosh.

The use of motorcycles for police use is nothing new for two of the five officers.

Lessnau's father was a motorcycle cop for the

Detroit department.

"They (the motorcycles) always fascinated me," the younger Lessnau said. It was a "dream" for him to later use one as a police officer.

McIntosh's father rode the two-wheel vehicle as a Dearborn officer.

One major advantage of the cycles is the financial savings.

The city is paying only \$300 a year to lease the cycles, far less than a patrol car's cost.

The base list price for an automobile is \$14,000 to \$16,000. Then police-required equipment is added.

A major reason for the low cost, Lessnau said, is that the cycles have such a high resale value. Harley dealers can take back the cycles after the one-year lease expires and still sell them.

Phase one of the school, designed by TMP Associates and contracted by Barton-Malow Co., and will start with grades kindergarten through fourth.

Future plans call for more classrooms and education through the eighth grade. 





# Molester gets 8 to 25 years

A Westland man who sexually molested an 11year-old neighborhood boy that he befriended has been sentenced to prison for eight to 25 years.

Matthew Hanlon, 24, is serving time for firstdegree criminal sexual conduct after being sentenced Sept. 18 by Wayne Circuit Judge Jeanne Stempien.

"If it was up to me, he would never get out," the victim's 34-year-old mother said Thursday.

The boy, an Adams Middle School seventh-grader, is receiving counseling to cope with molestings that occurred between October 1995 and March of this year, his mother said.

To protect her son, she asked that her name not. be used.

The boy also has to use medication to sleep at night, and he has had problems at school because of sudden "outbursts" that his mother blamed on the molestings.

"He has problems with male adults telling him: what to do," the mother said. "He also has been placed in a special education class because he can't stand to have a lot of people around him."

Even so, she said, "all in all, he seems to be doing pretty good, considering what he has been through."

Hanlon, who is married and has two teenage stepsons, was accused of molesting the boy at

three locations, including Hanlon's residence on Montmorency near Palmer and Venoy, Westland police Sgt. Michael Terry has said.

Hanlon also was accused of molesting the boy at the youngster's home, where Hanlon had lived temporarily during marital problems, Terry said.

Hanlon initially befriended the boy and had him perform odd jobs around the Hanlon residence, Terry said.

He originally faced five felony sex charges after the boy reported the alleged molestings to his family which, in turn, notified the Westland Police Department.

Hanlon pleaded no contest July 30 to one count of first-degree criminal sexual conduct, punishable by a maximum sentence of life in prison.

In return, prosecutors dropped four other felony charges.

Hanlon's guilty plea averted a trial that had been scheduled in Wayne County Circuit Court. He was ordered to stand trial after he waived a preliminary hearing in June in front of Westland 18th District Judge C. Charles Bokos.

Even though the mother would have preferred to see Hanlon imprisoned for life, she said she is not upset with the sentence.

Under a plea agreement, Hanlon had expected to receive five to 25 years, but the judge increased the sentence to a minimum of eight years.

"I feel a little bit better about that," the mother

# Audience likes Engler's anti-tax talk

Gov. John Engler brought his tax-cut and lessgovernment-is-better program to the area Thursday and his audience generally liked what they heard.

Not surprisingly, several business persons complimented Engler for the major thrust of his talk.

He spoke to nearly 100 persons at the weekly Garden City Rotary Club luncheon program. The club extended an invitation to the Garden City Kiwanis Club and Chamber of Commerce to join it in welcoming the governor.

One business person who applauded Engler's talk was Douglas North, president of North Brothers Ford, on Ford near Farmington Road, Wesland.

North said his reaction is "very positive."

"His message is what people want to hear," North commented following the governor's 45minute appearance.

That message is about "less taxes, less government, less regulations and more emphasis on the family and community involvement," the car dealer said.

"I see (economic) growth under his administra-

tion," he concluded.

Pete Tavormina, co-owner of Misty's gift and card shop in Sheridan Square, said the governor "sounded good" but declined to comment on Engler's call for tax cuts.

But he did say that "if we want families to get back together, we need a day of rest," suggesting that businesses close on Sundays.

But there was one problem voiced by Vince Flippo, a local financial services advisory, during the question-and-answer portion of the program.

Flippo, a Garden City Kiwanian, said that with the closing of some state treasury department offices, the staff in other locations "aren't very customer-friendly."

Engler said that he doesn't want the treasury department to get the same reputation as the federal Internal Revenue Service.

But he added that an advisory group is looking at possible improvements in the way the department operates.

Before addressing Flippo's issue, the governor pointed out that his administration has worked hard to make the business tax system more fair and simpler.

As an example, he said, the Single Business Tax has been revised to eliminate some 50,000 businesses from filing required tax forms.

In his prepared remarks. Engler told the audience at Amantea's Restaurant that he wanted to say where "we are headed."

He reiterated his record of cutting taxes 21 times, taking over a state government with a \$1.8 billion projected deficit, reducing the welfare caseload, and "changing the way we do business."

"In the past 5 1/2 years, the state has the most robust economy we've had in a long time," Engler said. "The state's 4 1/2 percent unemployment rate is the lowest since we've been keeping records.

"We've added new jobs and now lead the nation in per-capita income increase."

He cited the recent announcement that Compuware plans to add 1,200 new jobs in the Detroit area.

The governor, who also urged support for Republican congressional candidate Joseph Fitzsimmons

several times during the program, also commented on his role in changing educational and welfare system policies since taking office in January, 1991.

Engler also reported that Michigan spends a combined \$11 billion on K-12 schools and said the system needs more accountability and the public has to know how individual schools are doing on academic tests.

On welfare system changes, he explained that former policies discouraged people from working.

"That was a prescription for disaster and a failed policy," the governor said, stressing that the state's public assistance load is the lowest in 25 years.

Referring to the highly-publicized federal War on Poverty initiated more than 30 years ago, he said the program has failed.

"If anything, poverty is slightly ahead."

Fitzsimmons, making his first run for public office, is challenging U.S. Rep. Lynn Rivers, an Ann Arbor Democrat, in the Nov. 5 election.

He was unopposed in the Republican primary. The 13th Congressional District includes Garden City and Westland and stretches west to Ann Arbor.

# **Bentley numbers are up**

Adult education enrollment is increasing, but likely not enough to avoid significant income losses.

More than 100 students have signed up for evening adult education classes at Bentley Center and other Livonia school district locations.

But the evening enrollment is still low, and not enough to save some of the adult ed classes normally offered at the center, said Jay Young, director of the department of community services for the district which serves the northern section of Westland.

Bentley administrators turned in their student count to the state Friday — 104 students. The center will get state aid for each of these students.

Enrollment in adult education programs last year at this time was about 350. A week before student count day, it was 39.

"We gained a few more, but we're still disappointed because the numbers are so down," Young said.

Evening classes dropped because of low enrollment are mainly in the vocational field: building trades, legal office, emergency medical training, medical technician.

#### dents whose tuition is paid by the state.

Students who pay their own tuition can still enroll, even though they missed the first week of school, Young said. Tuition is \$186 for residents; \$195 for non-residents.

Enough students enrolled to keep four evening academic classes, Young said. English, math, social studies and law enforcement each enrolled at least 13 students to keep them open.

Another 52 students are enrolled in such off-campus classes as auto mechanics and CAD-CAM.

Enrollment is normal in the district's daytime alternative education program for Livonia students younger than 20.

The enrollment plunge - and the resulting loss of income comes at a time when the Bentley Center is at a crossroads in its 50year-history.

One way or another, the former high school at Five Mile and Hubbard will not stand much longer as it now exists.

Administrators are eying two plans: demolish part of the building and renovate the rest, or raze the entire building and turn the grounds into vacant parkland.

If residents don't approve the proposed 1.5 -mill tax increase, Bentley Center will be demolished.



# **Candidates stress connection with voters**

Democratic Congresswoman Lynn Rivers and her Republican challenger Joe Fitzsimmons, vying for the 13th District seat in Congress, both say their backgrounds serve them well.

Rivers, who struggled as a teen parent to make ends meet while she studied for her bachelor's and law degrees, says her background helps her identify with ordinary people.

Fitzsimmons, a retired business executive, says his business experience as CEO at UMI in Ann Arbor makes him qualified to serve as a U.S. representative.

In a race that has resulted in some heated exchanges by press release, Rivers, an Ann Arbor resident and former state representative and school board member, is seeking her second term in Congress in the 13th District, while Fitzsimmons, also an Ann Arbor resident, has been campaigning against her for about a year. This would be his first elected office.

Fitzsimmons' campaign has issued press releases accusing Rivers of many things including being against family values and welfare reform.

Rivers calls the attacks nasty, adding she has supported welfare reform and a balanced budget. "It is very surprising to me. I hadn't expected that from him," she said.

On the issues, Fitzsimmons said he sees the major ones as the economy and education.

The country needs to grow a stronger economy, he said. It is not growing at the rate it needs to grow, and the way to make it grow is to reduce taxes, Fitzsimmons said.

Government spending needs to be controlled as well, he said.

"The only way we can balance the budget is to do both simultaneously," Fitzsimmons said.

Constituents decide the issues, Rivers said, adding that retirees. at a picnic she had just attended before stopping for an interview, expressed concerns about the



balancing the budget, but concerned about the priorities in budgeting, she said.

Rivers said she is interested in proposals that are going to strengthen the middle class and is in favor of raising the minimum wage.

A lot of things proposed in the 104th Congress would make things harder on working families such as a proposal that would have changed the way overtime is handled, an employee could be expected to work an average of 40 hours a week over several weeks meaning it could be 65 hours one week and 15 the next, she said. Or an employee could be forced to accept comp time instead of getting overtime pay, she said.

As someone who at one time time pay to make ends meet, allow more local decision mak-

Fitzsimmons is also focusing on is education, which he feels goes hand-in-hand with a better economy. If the economy is changed and the budget balanced, interest rates will come down and student loan interest rates will also come down, Fitzsimmons said.

"I want to provide access for everyone who wants to get a good education," he said.

Fitzsimmons said he would depended on her husband's over- look at the education process to

he said. "People in the education system are consumed with red tape," he said.

He would reduce red tape by downsizing the Department of Education to "eliminate interference," he said.

He would fight for more direct funding as opposed to reducing student loans, but accountability is needed, he said.

People need jobs with paychecks that aren't chewed up by taxes, Fitzsimmons said.

"I'm not one to vote to increase taxes," Rivers said. As a state representative she supported very few tax increases, she said. "I run my office in a very fru-

gal manner," she said, pointing out she returned more than \$244,000 to the treasurer from her office budget in 1995.







**Democrats fall short** on minimum wage bill

State Senate Democrats fell three votes short of forcing a minimum wage bill onto the floor for a final vote.

"This bill went through the House like (pause) manure through a goose," said Senate Labor Committee chair Mike Rogers, R-Brighton, who fought the Democratic effort to discharge the bill from his committee.

**Replied Senate Democratic** leader John Cherry of Clio: "The geese in his district must be constipated. The minimum wage hasn't been increased in 15 years. And this bill has been in the House five years.

When the manure-slinging debate was over, the Senate failed, 17-18 with three absent, to force House Bill 4180 onto the floor Sept. 25, the last session day prior to the election break break.

"You're going to pay for it on election day," warned Democrat Virgil Smith of Detroit.

"It was a political rush to do someone's dirty work," said Republican floor leader Dan DeGrow of Port Huron.

Joining 16 Democrats to vote yes was Doug Carl, R-Macomb County. Seventeen Republicans voted no, and three outstate Republicans were absent. All area senators voted with their parties.

The bill cleared the House Sept. 10, first day of the fall session, by 94-12. It would raise the state minimum wage from the current \$4.25 to \$4.75 on Oct. 1 this year and to \$5.15 on Oct. 1. 1997. It also would reduce the tip deduction for restaurant waiters. The effect would be to bring the state minimum into line with the federal.

The parties drew radically different pictures of the 133,000 workers not in interstate commerce who would be affected.

Democrat Alma Smith of

operators taking home \$40,000 out of a \$300,000 gross who would lay off two or three workers apiece if the minimum wage were raised.

Added Republican Shugars: "A study by President Jimmy Carter's commission showed that every 10 percent increase in the minimum wage causes a 2 to 3 percent reduction in entrylevel jobs."

Rogers closed by saying he would heed the requests of such House Republicans as Jim Ryan of Redford to take up the bill in November.

for me.'

Libby Maynard (D), recently an adjunct instructor of social work at U-M: "We are committed to help all students. It's an issue the whole state faces."

Deane Baker (R), incumbent regent: For any young person who starts, "the university assures they'll have financial support to continue their education. In 1978 the state provided 80 percent of the general fund budget; today, 38 percent."

S. Martin Taylor (D), Detroit Edison vice president: "It's critical that the university not price itself out of reach of the ordinary. person. We have to get the biggest bang for our (budget) dollars. We have to make certain we get our faire share of state aid."

#### Charter schools?

Unlike Central Michigan Uni-

Marcy of Garden City has a load of gorgeous eggplant in her garden, and wants to make the Middle Eastern dish called baba ghannouj. Here's a great recipe:

#### BABA GHANNOUJ

- 1 (1 pound) eggplant
- 3 tablespoons tahini (sesame seed paste)
- Juice of 1 lemon, (about 1/4 cup)
- 1 clove garlic, peeled and crushed with 1/2teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons cold water 1/2 teaspoon Hot Hungarian paprika
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- Olive oil


Prick the eggplant three or four times with a fork and set in a hot oven or over hot coals and turn as each side becomes black and the flesh very soft.

Meanwhile, place tahini, lemon juice and crushed garlic in a food processor and blend until smooth. Add 3 tablespoons cold water to thin and lighten the mixture. When the eggplant has completely collapsed, remove from heat.

When cool enough to handle, remove the charred skin and any hard seeds. Squeeze the eggplant to remove bitter juices. Mash eggplant with a masher, then add to the tahini mixture in the food processor. Pulse to blend. Place the dip in a shallow bowl and garnish with paprika, parsley and drizzle with olive oil. Serve with pita triangles. Serves 4. Makes about 2 cups.

ven if we're in a hurry, we'll stop at a gas station on the way to work to fuel our cars, but we won't make time for breakfast. Cars don't run on empty, and neither do people. We need fuel to start our day. "Breakfast is brain food," said

American Dietetic Association president Doris Derelian, a registered dietitian. "A child who fills his tank in the morning does better in the classroom - he'll perform better on tests and is more likely to remember what is learned in school. After eight to 10 hours without food, the body is essentially a cold furnace, waiting to be stoked."

Contrary to what you might think, skipping meals won't help you lose weight faster. In a study of women, on a 1,200-calorie-a-day diet, researchers at Vanderbilt University discovered those who skipped breakfast lost about 13 pounds each; those who ate breakfast lost 17 to 19 pounds.

We even burn calories when we sleep. "A lot of refueling goes on while you're asleep,' said Betty Kriegel a registered dietitian, and clinical manager of food and nutrition services at Crittenton Hospital in Rochester.

"The first meal we eat when we wake up is important to give the body the nutrition it needs for the rest of the day, to help us face the day, and the activities. Our metabolism is raised by eating."

Those few minutes saved by skipping breakfast could cost you later. "When we miss breakfast we get into a slump around 10 or 11 a.m.," said Kriegel. "Then we grab - a pastry, doughnut, or something from the vending machine."

Eating and preparing breakfast doesn't take a lot of time, Kriegel recommends a bowl of whole grain cereal and piece of fruit. Read labels, though, because cereals sometimes contain a lot of sugar and sodium.

According to the American Dietetic Association, one-third of school-aged kids fix their own breakfast. Stock up on several kinds of cereals, raisins, fruit, juice, milk and yogurt, breads, and rice cakes.

"Children are most likely to eat breakfast if their parents eat breakfast," said Kay ~ day. Messages change every month. Sweeney of Southfield, a registered dietitian for Botsford Hospital's Health Development

Network in Novi: "Children who don't eat breakfast in the morning become restless, and have trouble concentrating in school."

Adults who skip breakfast often feel irritable and restless by mid-morning because our blood sugar level drops when we don't eat. If we're at work, "we'll grab whatever's readily available, often a doughnut, to satisfy our hunger, and this defeats weight-loss efforts," said Sweeney.

Reviewing research on the effects of breakfast on school performance, Ernesto Pollitt, Ph.D. reported a significant correlation

Encouraging children to eat nutritious foods takes effort. "Kids are the toughest," she said. "I asked them, 'what foods do you like to eat?' Fast food was their answer." But these foods don't have to be unhealthy.

Potato Wedge Fries, and Honey Coated Crunchy Chicken Fingers, found in the "Kids Favorites" chapter, contain only one gram of fat per serving.





sorzio line five years ago. Since then he has written two cookbooks filled with recipes for cooking with infused oils and flavored vinegars, \$12.95 each. Besides Tra Vigne, the 35-year old chef is also a partner in five restaurants in Aspen, San Francisco and Napa Valley and a bakery in Petaluma. He grew up in an Italian home devoted to the heritage of hearty foods. Chiarello began preserving just-picked herbs, vegetables and fruits in oil to retain the flavor in his foods at Tra Vigne (French for between the vines).

We're the largest producer of virgin olive oil in North America." he boasted. "We farm over 250 acres of fruit and produce more than 40,000 gallons of olive oil a year. I believe that making olive oil is an art, cooking is a craft."

Freshness is key to dishes at Tra Vigne, which on a busy day feeds 1,000 customers.

"We serve simple food you can understand. For our tomato-mozarella salad, tomatoes are picked fresh every morning so the dish. smells as good as it tastes. My food is food for your soul," said the recipient of the 1995 Culinary Institute of America Chef of the Year Award.

Health plays an important role with Chiarello who ran seven miles before appearing at Hudson's. While he claims not to be a low-fat freak, he does not eat a lot of meat, opposes adding chemicals and preservatives to foods, and uses kosher instead of table salt because the more than 100 nutrients the body needs are removed during salt processing.

Wendy Williams first saw Chiarello at the Food and Wine festival in Aspen in June. She drove from Ann Arbor to watch Chiarello demonstrate creative ways of using flavored oils and infused vinegars to enhance foods:

"I like the Mango Vignette with berries, and the Tomato Vignette I use like a salad dressing. They just give it a good flavor. The Mango or Passion Fruit Vignette over a fruit salad is really good," she insisted.

Seated next to me were Dorothy and Tony Suchocki of Rochester Hills. They agreed Chiarello put on "quite a show."

"It was entertaining besides being good," said Dorothy Suchocki who loves to cook and especially enjoyed tasting the pastina and sweet potatoes flavored with Consorzio Cilantro Oil.

Marie Burgess, a former home economics teacher from Detroit, and Cecile Vexler of Windsor agreed with the Suchockis.

"The food was wonderful and he presented it with such finesse," said Burgess.

Beverly Sherman of Clinton Township has been attending Hudson's cooking classes three years. She already uses several of Consorzio's flavored oils. She liked the pastina made in risotto style with a pesto sauce "It's very flavorful."

Hudson's Somerset cooking demonstrator Debbie Rogers uses the Five Pepper Oil in summertime pasta salads. "The garlic oil is wonderful in Potatoes O'Brien or for frying chicken breasts in," said the Waterford resident.

According to Hudson's demonstrator Betty Louney, the cooking classes are set to stir up interest in products. #### Wow! 1997 **BMW Z3** is pure fun

BMW's longtime motto has been "The Ultimate Driving Machine."

With the 1997 BMW Z3, ultimate is an understatement.

Get behind the wheel of this finely crafted instrument and start to play with it. Everything is right there, waiting, wanting to be touched. Knobs and controls are large enough that an ape could drive this thing.


Top speed: 140 mph.

My only wish is that I could have driven it on the speed-limitless Autobahn. It begs to be opened up every time you press down on the gas pedal. A license to speed.

From its traditional BMW heritage and distinctive styling to its ease of operation, this roadster is pure, unadulterated fun.

Everyone noticed this "Bond company car" when I drove it. Some poor gentleman riding his bicycle in Royal Oak craned his head a little too long and crashed into a parked car.

Powered by a 1.9-liter 4-cylinder engine mated to a 5-speed manual transmission, the Z3 is the first BMW roadster to hit the States since 1959, when BMW released the 507, and then in

are collector cars today.

'In contrast, the Z3 — although just as exotic as its predecessors is affordable at just \$28,750. It's pure BMW engineering at its very best and the Z3 is assembled by American hands in Spartanburg, S.C.

With a wheelbase of just 96.3 inches, the Z3 is 10 inches shorter than BMW's 3-series models. The shorter wheelbase and wide front and rear track immediately anything else on the road.

The Z3 is very agile, quick in handling and has a better-thanyou-would-expect ride. The front and rear suspension systems are the same as you would find in the 3-series. It's a quiet ride even with the top secured and the windows rolled up.

This open 2-seater has a manual folding top that's very easy to use. Two quick arms release it from the front windshield and it's back there with the flick of the wrist. The entire top can be hidden with a smart-looking and easy-to-install soft cover that matches the interior color. The manual top is also very light, so you don't have to get out of the car to reinstall it.

As for safety — which is a valid concern with roadsters -BMW was mindful to crash-test it in straight frontal and offset barrier crashes. It meets the

pants during a rollover accident. Instrumentation is smartly done, and the speedometer has

great graphics with white numbers on a black background. There's also a tachometer and temp and fuel gauges. The rear trunk is, well, as you

would expect it to be - not too practical. There are storage places throughout the car, however, including in the pretty big glovebox, center console, doors, behind the seats and a lockable compartment directly behind the seats.

There's even a power outlet right up front for that cellular phone or radar detector.


Standard is an AM/FM cassette stereo with six speakers. You wouldn't know it. If there's one thing this baby needs it's headrest-mounted speakers. On a freeway, you lose the stereo. Heck, on a busy street, you lose it.

But the car is so cool it's easy to overlook.

One neat feature is the intermittent wipers. When you're driving, they're going full tilt. When you slow speed or come to a stop, the windshield automatically gets intermittent wiping.

#### **Many Cold-Weather Car Problems Are Preventable**

(AAA) – Basic car care and early preparation are the keys to safe and enjoyable cold-weather driving, according to the American Automobile Association.

"Winter breakdowns are more likely to occur when batteries are weak and when regular maintenance is neglected," said George Giek, managing director of AAA Automotive Services.

Based on a review of 27.5 million calls for emergency road service in 1995, AAA makes the following suggestions for avoiding winterdriving headaches:

 Have your vehicle thoroughly inspected. The engine oil, radiator, tires, battery and ignition system all must be in top condition to perform properly in cold weather. Windshield wipers, brakes, tires and exterior lights also should be checked.

 Prepare a winter survival kit. Suggested items include: a flashlight, blankets, booster cables, a warning device (flares or reflective triangle), a small bag of abrasive material (sand or nonclumping cat litter), cloth or roll of paper towels and a small shovel.

• To prevent fuel line freeze-up and to avoid running out of gas in dangerous, cold conditions, keep your fuel tank at least half full.


 Before attempting to jump-start a vehicle, always consult your owner's manual for hook-up instructions and safety information.

• Consider carrying a cellular phone or CB radio to summon assistance in case of an emergency.
