Pupils 'vote' for president

President Bill Clinton will score a landslide victory against Republican Robert Dole if U.S. voters Tuesday follow the lead of Madison Elementary School students.

Clinton captured 324 votes to Dole's paltry 67 during a mock election Wednesday at the Westland school. Ross Perot placed third with 46 votes.

"Billy boy won by a lot," fourth-grader Doug Rose, 9, said.

He and 9-year-old classmate Christie Music, students of teacher Sandra Vasko, announced election results at 3 p.m. Wednesday on the school's public announcement system.

Earlier, Madison pupils lined up to cast ballots at six polling booths, made from cardboard boxes placed atop tables in a hallway that Doug pegged as the Hall of Presidents.

The name fit. Red, white and blue balloons, hats and flags heightened the patriotic atmosphere.

"It's the first time I've ever voted for president," Doug said. "I thought it was pretty cool because we got to vote like our parents do."

"I voted for Bill Clinton. I liked him on the debates, and he wants to raise hospital funds."

Doug also said he fears that Dole would slash education funding.

Christie chose not to reveal her presidential choice.

"I don't want to tell," she said, smiling.

High election turnout foreseen



Numerous state and county proposals along with several hot political races are expected to attract a 65 percent voter turnout Tuesday in Westland.

Westland voters have pulled nearly 6,000 absentee ballots for Tuesday's general election, indicating a significant interest in political races and ballot proposals.

City Clerk Diane Fritz has predicted that 65 percent of Westland's 56,000 voters will go to the polls,

open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

That turnout would more than quadruple the 14 percent showing at polls during the Aug. 6 primary.

Westland voters will help decide numerous political races and ballot proposals, and they will use a new electronic voting system to make their choices.

Following are highlights of the Westland ballot:

- Most Westland voters will decide a heated political race between incumbent 18th District state Rep. Eileen DeHart, D-Westland, and Republican challenger Dennis LeMaitre, a Westland business owner.
- In the city's far southeast end, voters will choose between 17th District state Rep. Tom Kelly, D-Wayne, and GOP challenger Diane Dore, who hasn't campaigned.
- Westland District Judge C. Charles Bokos is on the ballot, unopposed for a six-year term.
- Democratic U.S. Rep. Lynn Rivers of Ann Arbor is being chal-



lenged by Republican Joe Fitzsimmons, also of Ann Arbor, in the 18th Congressional District.

• Democratic incumbent Kay Beard faces a challenge from Carol Juarez for the 12th District Wayne County Commission seat. Beard has been on the commission for 18 years.


• Voters will decide Proposition S, which would allow a 1 percent tax on hotel room charges and 2 percent on car rental fees to pay for a new

District's financial picture includes good news

The Wayne-Westland school district received a clean bill of health last week from its "financial doctor" who also warned money problems remain.

The financial report was presented to the school board Monday, Oct. 28, by Tom Doyle, senior partner with the Plante & Moran auditing firm.

The good news is that the district is recovering from its deficit for the

fiscal year ending last June 30.

But the current \$3.1 million surplus may be wiped out next year when a 3-mill property tax levy expires, leaving the school board with a \$4 million revenue gap.

In recent years, the district had a surplus of \$6.884 million in 1992; \$6.76 million in 1993; a deficit of \$278,230 in 1994, and \$1.925 million last year.

In recent months, school officials have been urging the state Legislature and governor's office to change

what the district says is a quirk in the implementation of the Proposal A school finance reform approved by voters in March 1994.

Under that proposal, some districts were allowed to ask voters for an enhancement millage increase but others, like Wayne-Westland, weren't.

Another problem, Doyle told the school board, is that the district, like others throughout the state, is paying more for employees' pension costs.

That figure has nearly tripled in less than three years with another increase projected for the current school year, Doyle said.

The problem, he pointed out, is that the state shifted the pension cost to local school districts in 1994.

In Wayne-Westland's case, the dollars have soared from \$3.4 million in 1994 to \$9 million this year.

Another way of looking at the pension problem, Doyle and the school board noted, is that the percentage

First Citizen believes in giving to community

Glenn Shaw Jr. got the community service bug shortly after he joined the Westland Jaycees 25 years ago.

He recalls visiting a state facility in Northville at Christmas time to create a holiday spirit for handicapped children.

"There was a handicapped girl who reminded me of my 2-year-old daughter," said Shaw.

"I then realized how fortunate I was to have a healthy daughter. I also realized there are a lot of people who need help."

For the next 25 years, Shaw has been helping needy families in high-profile and very quiet

ways.

For his many years of helping, Shaw was selected last week as the recipient of the Westland First Citizen community service award.

He will be honored at a public recognition program Tuesday, Nov. 12, at the Westland Chamber of Commerce's monthly luncheon.

The award was initiated 10 years ago by the Westland Observer and is co-sponsored by the newspaper and the chamber.

More recently, Shaw has been a leader in organizing major fund-raising programs for several agencies, with a special focus on the Salvation

Army Corps which serves low-income families in Westland and nearby communities.

In the spring of 1995, Shaw was approached by Capt. Mark Welsh about helping in funding a summer day camp for children from low-income families.

Within weeks, Shaw recruited volunteers to hold their first "Christmas in July" holiday party to raise \$30,000.

Three months ago, a similar party was held with more than twice the amount collected.

On a low-profile basis, Shaw has held Christ-

of payroll budgeted for the retirement system was 5 percent in 1994. It soared to 14.56 percent this year and will be 15.1 percent by the end of this fiscal year.

Another problem, the auditor said, is that the district's per-pupil foundation grant from the state, at \$5,574 last year, was far less than most neighboring districts.

For example, he said, Romulus received \$7,303; Dearborn, \$7,247; Livonia, \$6,758; Garden City, \$5,836; and Plymouth-Canton, \$5,677.

Doyle and Moore pointed out that if Wayne-Westland received the same state foundation grant as Romulus, it would have an additional \$26 million.

Superintendent Duane Moore said that although Proposal A was said to narrow the financial inequity between rich and poor districts, the gap still exists.

He said he saw a financial projection that the gap will continue for another 100 years.

In commenting on the required annual audit report, board President Patricia Brown said the findings "are a perfect illustration of the (financial) inequities between districts" although the change was promised under Proposal A.

Pointing out that all of the adjoining school districts have a higher state aid grant than Wayne-Westland, board trustee Mathew McCusker suggested that the problem won't be solved soon.

"I don't believe in Santa Claus, either," he quipped.

Moore also said that the state's 3 percent "increase" in the foundation grant is misleading because of the local districts being required to pick up the pension costs previously paid by the state.

Trading barbs

Rivers-Fitzsimmons race down to the wire

U.S. Rep Lynn Rivers said she spends tax money frugally, and opponent Joe Fitzsimmons proclaimed he would not cut Medicare.

Democrat Rivers and Republican Fitzsimmons both rejected negative charges made in their rival's respective TV campaign ads.

With one day left before Tuesday's vote, they are winding their campaigns in the 13th Congressional District which includes Garden City and Westland and stretches west to Ann Arbor.

They joined a range of candidates seeking elected office in a forum Tuesday, presented by the VFW Post 6695 Ladies Auxiliary of Plymouth.

One candidate even sang. Wayne County circuit judge candidate Bill Callahan gave about 100 veterans, wives and guests a means to remember his name, by singing "C-A-double L-

A-H-A-N spells Callahan."

Candidates each presented an opening statement, then took questions from the audience.

Fitzsimmons told the audience, "I'm running because I think tax bills should be smaller and paychecks should be larger." He said he'll seek to "restore economic responsibility for our government" and toughen crime laws.

On Medicare, he said the fund goes bankrupt in five years and suggested a bipartisan group "needs to work on some real solutions to the problem."

"I will not cut, I will protect and preserve Medicare," Fitzsimmons said.

Rivers said she's kept promises made when she was elected to Congress two years ago, among them votes to maintain veterans benefits.

"I've been a voice for fiscal responsibility, I voted for the balanced budget amendment that protected Social Security."

Rivers said she joined three

freshmen Republicans in the U.S. House in seeking to eliminate Congressional perks, ranging from large pensions to free campaign mailings. "I don't think it's right to take gifts and lunches, I think others should do the same," Rivers said, adding she returned \$244,000 of her office budget "because I'm careful with your dollar."

Also on hand for the forum were representatives for both U.S. Sen. Carl Levin and challenger Ronna Romney. Westland's Richard McKnight, 13th Congressional District Democratic Party chairman, read a letter from Levin to the gathering, and the senator said he opposed cuts in Medicare and Medicaid, which many veterans depend on.

Levin wrote that he backs tax cuts to help pay the cost of higher education, adding he's fought to "turn back an attempt for corporations to raid workers pension funds."

"We have cut the deficit by

more than half in just four years," Levin said, adding unemployment in Michigan has dropped from 7 to 4.4 percent.

Don Knapp, representing Ronna Romney, said the candidate has two top priorities — balancing the federal budget and cutting taxes. Romney also supports a 15 percent tax cut and a \$500 tax credit per child for families.

Knapp said that while Levin has made much of his record at reducing defense department waste, he asked, "When was the last time Carl Levin ever said the money that was saved should go back to you?"

Also appearing at the forum was Wayne Circuit Judge Sean Cox who is seeking re-election. Representing Wayne County Sheriff Robert Ficano, also seeking re-election, was sheriff's department executive Orville Tungate.



mas parties for three years in which he invites business contacts, friends and employees with the requirement that they bring a gift toy for the Salvation Army.

Through those fund-raising efforts, Shaw was instrumental in forming the new Westland Community Foundation, which sponsors benefits for educational and social service organizations.

Shaw, now a Canton Township resident, lived in then-Nankin Township and the city of Westland for all but six of his 53 years.

He attended Cady School, which was on the Wayne Road-Cherry Hill corner for decades before it was sold by the Wayne-Westland school board for business development. Coincidentally, one of the property owners later sold the site to Shaw who

built a small business strip there.

A graduate of Wayne Memorial High School, Shaw is the owner of Glenn Shaw Jr., Enterprises, based in the Ford-Hix area of Westland; father of seven children; and a Salvation Army "Army of Stars" award recipient earlier this spring.

Shaw was also publicly honored several weeks ago as the "Citizen of the Month" by radio station WWJ-AM.

Interviewed by telephone at his Florida winter home last week, Shaw said he is occasionally recognized by someone who remembers him as a former Westland city councilman.

The latest was just a few days earlier when he was at Detroit Metro Airport.

Shaw served on the council from 1971 to 1976.

Over the years, he was the city's municipal assessor, a founder and former board chairman of the Nankin Transit Authority and recipient of several community service awards.

Other First Citizen nominees were Barbara Barr-Barrell, Lauren Jacobi, and Donna Kassuba.

In the past 10 years, the award has been presented to people active in government, recreation, education and church groups.

Madison students had to register at school prior to the mock election. Pupils at all grade levels could vote; kindergartners made their choices by looking at pictures of Clinton and Dole.

Doug and Christie said they recently learned about the electoral college, the history of political parties and other aspects of presidential elections. They spoke eloquently about the process and seemed to know more about it than many adults.

"I'm really impressed with what the kids know," Madison principal Mary Goedert said. "They've taken this quite seriously."

Madison's election results became part of a larger Michigan vote that, in turn, was added to totals from other states for a national count.

Doug and Christie said they will vote in a real election as soon as they are old enough. They simply don't understand why many adults don't vote.

"I think they shouldn't have a right to complain about who wins because it's their fault," Doug said.

"Yeah, they didn't voice their choice," Christie

added. Offering an analysis of Madison's vote, Doug said Clinton may have won by a landslide because he is already the president.

Christie added that "people probably think that he is doing a good job, so they may as well leave him there."

Doug found it interesting that Perot garnered nearly as many votes as Dole.

"I think some people who voted for him just wanted to be different from other people," Doug said.

Goedert commended Doug and Christie for effectively communicating Madison's results to the student population. She called them "leaders."

Christie said she didn't know if she would ever use her leadership skills to run for U.S. president, but Doug hinted that he wouldn't mind leading the country someday.

"I might try to run for president when I get older," he said.

Wayne-Westland school district voters will decide whether to renew a 1-mill tax levy for five years for Wayne County Community College.

Kids provide lots of ideas for project

If you want to design a new product, then you ask its users what they want in it.

That's what happened last week when scores of Westland youngsters were questioned by an architect what they wanted in a planned \$150,000 playscape to be built next spring in Central City Park.

They took part in a series of activities held in local elementary schools and Bailey Recreation Center directed by Dennis Wille of Leathers and Associates, based in Ithaca, N.Y.

Without judging the feasibility or costs of the playscape's features, here are some of the suggestions given Wille, who specializes in designing playscapes:

Punching bag, spider web, a challenging maze, a shaky bridge, trampoline, monkey bars, circular slide, trolley, balance beam, tire swing, hamster wheel, bungee jump ropes, ferris wheel, castle and chess game, among others.

The 50 students at the group presentation were poster contest winners from 11 schools.

Among them were Edison School's Angela Fry who wants a balance beam in the 'playscape and Taylor Smith who wants a secret tunnel.

Wille said the site will be occu-

piated by the playscape and will be 130 feet by 200 feet, of which part will be some open space.


A public meeting was held last week for adults to plan various marketing, publicity and fundraising events to help pay for the playscape.

Program to offer college credit is hailed for making history

A new program allowing Wayne-Westland students to gain college credit at the William Ford Career Technical Center is being touted as a landmark in Michigan education.

In unveiling the program Thursday, local school officials and Wayne County Community College representatives made "educational history," Wayne-Westland Superintendent Duane Moore said.

Starting in January, the Ford center will offer community college courses in computer-aided drafting; automotive technology; electrical/electronics; office information systems; and heating, ventilation and air conditioning.

The courses, open to high school students and graduates, will be taught on Tuesday and Thursday evenings during the initial phase of the program.

Students from outside the Wayne-Westland district who attend the Ford center also will be allowed to participate in the program.

"We're looking forward to it. We feel positive about it," Moore said during a Thursday morning press conference at the Ford center. "The bottom line is that it's there to serve students."

Officials hope to enroll 150 students during the startup phase, said Greg Baracy, Wayne-Westland assistant superintendent/general administration.

WCCC will rent space at the Ford center for the classes, which will be offered at no cost to the Wayne-Westland district, Baracy said. Students will pay the same tuition for courses that they would pay at the community college, he said.

Curtis Ivery, WCCC president, said the program will be unique in Michigan.

"We believe the customized approach in the

delivery of higher educational services to students at a center with the reputation such as the William D. Ford Career Technical Center will offer career opportunities to students from all over Wayne County," Ivery said.

The Ford center serves not only Wayne-Westland, but also students from 13 other Wayne County high schools.

Moore noted that such programs as the Wayne-Westland/WCCC partnership are vital because, by the turn of the century, 70 percent of all jobs will require technical training beyond the high school level.

A few political candidates attended Thursday's press conference, which came five days before the Tuesday general election.

U.S. Rep. Lynn Rivers hailed the new program and underscored the importance of making educational opportunities affordable for local students.

She stressed that no one should be "priced out of education, priced out of success."

Ted Scott, chairman of WCCC's board of trustees, said such partnerships as the one between Wayne-Westland and the community college could lead to a "renaissance" of the Wayne County area.

In a prepared statement, officials noted that the press conference came one month after President Bill Clinton toured the Ford center and stressed the importance of creative education initiatives for the 21st century.

High school students who attend the Ford center college courses will receive college credit after they complete high school and enroll in WCCC classes.

Officials are hopeful that the program could become so successful that students eventually would be able to obtain a two-year associate's degree through the Ford center.

New Sears store source of help on how to handle remodeling

A new neighborhood Sears Hardware store opened its doors last week on the southeast corner of Ann Arbor Trail and Middlebelt, on the site of the former Cooper School.

Wayne improves bond rating, best in 17 years

Wayne County moved up two notches in the investment ratings of Standard and Poor's Ratings Group, reflecting the continuing improvement of the County's financial reputation on Wall Street, County Executive Edward McNamara announced Monday.

The new rating was Wayne County's highest in 17 years - its third upgrade by Standard & Poor's since 1989.

"This is good news for our residents," McNamara said. "Every time our investment grade goes up, we can sell bonds for a lower interest rate and put more money to work for taxpayers."

"The double upgrade, from BBB- to BBB+, is extremely unusual," said Steven Murphy, director of public finance ratings at Standard and Poor's. "We liked what we saw happening in Wayne County. They have shown real financial discipline."

The improved rating could

save Wayne County as much as one-quarter percent in interest rates on future bond issues, including the planned construction of a new, \$40 million juvenile detention facility.

If voters approve Proposal S on Tuesday, the upgrade will also lower the interest cost on the \$80 million in "tourist tax" bonds that would be used to construct new downtown stadiums for the Detroit Lions and Detroit Tigers.

The improved rating was awarded based on the strength of the county's financial condition, the strength of the local economy and consideration of financial management, according to Thomas Naughton, the county chief financial officer.

Since a brush with bankruptcy in 1987, the county has eliminated a \$134 million deficit and recorded eight straight balanced budgets. A ninth balanced budget is expected for 1996, when

the county is expected to end the year with a \$20 million surplus.

Naughton said the ratings serve as financial report cards for his staff, which has worked hard in recent years to bring county financial reporting in line with national accounting and auditing standards.

"There used to be a 60-page management letter attached to our financial reports - meaning auditors were seeing a lot of gray areas," Naughton said. "Now that management letter is only four pages long. We have addressed everything that our auditors had identified as major areas of concern and weakness, and we are getting a clean bill of health."

McNamara said he was particularly proud that the county had been able to restore its financial reputation without slashing needed services.

"We have worked hard to come up with more creative, cost-effective

ways of managing programs, from indigent health care to misdemeanor sentencing," he said. "We've improved the condition of our roads and parks, eliminated inefficient offices like the Drain Commission and Road Commission, and no program is allowed to linger on without being fiscally accountable."

"As we look toward the opening of the new Metro Airport at the turn of the century, we want to be in the strongest financial position possible. Better bond ratings for the county could lead to a better market and lower interest rate for airport bonds, and will help us with other long-term projects like parks

improvement, cleaning up the Rouge River, and fixing still more roads."

Standard & Poor's was the first of the three major bond-rating firms to report its findings.

"I think we have a solid shot at additional rating improvements," said Naughton said.



Ex-hospital chief dies after illness

Sister Mary Columbine Radzilowski, past president and chief executive officer of St. Mary Hospital, died Oct. 23 in the Felician Sisters Motherhouse in Livonia after a long illness.

As a member of the Greater Detroit Area Hospital Council, she served at different times on the council's board of trustees, its executive committee, its planning committee's subcommittee, and the health insurance council.

Sister Columbine also was a member of the state of Michigan's Hospital Advisory Committee, the Governor's Health Advisory Committee, and Schoolcraft College's Health Career Planning Committee.

Recognized as an outstanding woman in the hospital field by the Livonia Business and Professional Women's Club, Sr. Columbine was the recipient of its honor award in 1986. She began her career as an elementary teacher in South Bend, Ind., and in Detroit and Saginaw. She served as resident nurse at St. Joseph Home for Boys in Jackson and in Laugenburg Hospital in Saskatchewan, Canada.

After she returned from Canada, Sister Columbine was appointed infirmarian and health care coordinator for the Felician Sisters.

Business groups split over proposed legislation

A health-care bill that sailed through the state House on a 108-0 vote is center of a storm in the Senate, where small businesses insist it will drive up costs and drive out insurers.

Rep. John Jamian, R-Bloomfield Township, steered House Bill 5572 through months of negotiations and compromise to easy passage in mid-September. It would:

- Require insurers to cover "pre-existing conditions" of an individual under a group policy. "Pre-existing conditions" include such ailments as diabetes, hypertension and heart problems.

- Allow insurers to exclude an individual buyer from coverage of a "pre-existing condition" for six months.

Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek, a physician and supporter of the Jamian bill, accused insurers of "cherry-picking" - wanting to insure only healthy people on whom they can make a profit and leaving others out in the cold.

"I find that unacceptable. There's a fairness issue here," Schwarz said at an Oct. 30 hearing in Lansing of the Financial Services and Health Policy committees. He cited an Ohio worker who would like to move to a job in Michigan but is blocked from health insurance coverage for six months.

A spokesperson for Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Michigan agreed. "To avoid high-risk enrollees, carriers use evasive tactics such as medical underwriting, pre-existing condition exclusions, industry screening and durational writing," said

Sen. John Schwarz, R-Battle Creek, a physician and supporter of the bill, accused insurers of "cherry-picking" - wanting to insure only healthy people on whom they can make a profit and leaving others out in the cold.

Bad odds cited

But some insurance agents say irresponsible customers hurt the system. "You need to look at why people wait," said Neale Musoff, a Holt agent for 32 years. "We don't sell fire insurance to people whose house is on fire. You can't sell a parachute to someone already in an airplane."

Richard Ryman, of American Medical Security Co. of Green Bay, Wis., opposed the bill, citing Kentucky's 1994 law prohibiting exclusion of pre-existing conditions. "In some cases we received applications (for insurance) the day before (transplant) surgery because we covered transplants," said Ryman.

His company's experience was one transplant in 613 Kentucky policies versus one in 3,000 in Florida. Ryman accused Kentucky of promoting "adverse selection," the opposite of cherry-picking.

Schwarz replied: "The number of transplants will do nothing but increase."

Barry Cargill, of the Small Business Association of Michigan, predicted HB 5572 would force the exit of two to five insurers from the state and raise costs for the rest.

Senators heard testimony from two dozen people and haven't scheduled a vote on

either HB 5572 or other bills in the five-part package.

They are sponsored by Reps. Penny Crissman, R-Rochester, and Gerald Law, R-Plymouth, among others. Called the "Patient's Bill of Rights," the bills would require insurers to fully inform customers in plain-English documents and to establish formal grievance procedure by Oct. 1, 1997.

No comments on the testimony or bills were made by Sens. Michael Bouchard, R-Birmingham; Mike Rogers, R-Brighton; Willis Bullard Jr., R-Milford; or three Democrats.

'Modest step'

Larry Horwitz, of the Economic Alliance of Michigan, representing company and union buyers of health insurance, called an impromptu news conference during a break to rebut Ryman's charges concerning Kentucky and other states.

Many of those states regulated rates, guaranteed coverage and mandated benefits. "These (Michigan) bills don't do any of that. Their examples have been states that did far-reaching changes. They're comparing apples and grapefruit," said Horwitz, adding:

"The House bill is a very modest step."

Brighton insurance agent Patrick Humant said he had "mixed emotions" on the question of requiring coverage of pre-existing conditions. "I can't buy insurance from my own insurance company. That's not right. But it's not worth bankrupting the whole system for pre-existing conditions."

The answer, Humant said, is not to pass the House bills but to let the federal Kennedy-Kassebaum law take effect next July 1.

That federal act deals with portability of benefits, allowing workers to carry benefits from one job to the next. But it defines "eligible individual" as a person who recently had group health coverage, which some lawyers say won't help individual insurance buyers.

Chambers split

The debate found the Greater Detroit and Michigan Chambers of Commerce on opposing sides.

Tim Beck, a Detroit insurance agent, said that when he started in 1975 no one inquired about pre-existing conditions. After about 1980, insurers tried to get rid of pre-existing conditions. "The bottom line is how to avoid paying claims," said Beck. "I'm not interested in doing business that way."

Nancy McKeague, representing the state chamber, said in an earlier hearing that the Jamian bill "removes a major incentive for people to take personal responsibility and purchase health insurance before they need it."



Commission Beard merits vote

Tuesday's ballot features many high-profile races and highly contested ballot issues.

But for local voters it's important that after voting on these that they don't forget to vote the entire ballot including county commission.

The race pits longtime incumbent Democrat Kay Beard of Westland against Republican challenger Carol Juarez of Garden City.

Beard is seeking her ninth term on the Wayne County Commission. She has much experience on commission committees, and serves on the Ways and Means Committee.

She is an effective lawmaker and is knowledgeable about county issues. Kay Beard merits a new term on Tuesday, Nov. 5.

Beard supported placing the auditor general ballot question on the county ballot because she is concerned about how county departments and agencies spend money and the audit control by the county executive.

Active on several committees outside of the commission, Beard knows and understands the needs of her district.

She is a solid choice for local voters on Tuesday, Nov. 5.

Yes on auditor plan

Along with a series of state ballot issues, voters in Wayne County will decide three county issues - Proposition S, otherwise known as the "stadium tax", a proposal which would expand the power of the county auditor general's office and a related amendment that would permit county commissioners to appoint an independent lawyer, instead of relying on the county corporation counsel for legal services.

We have already recommended a yes vote on S. We also now recommend a yes vote on the auditor general proposal, and a no vote on the independent counsel.

The auditor general proposal would clarify and broaden the scope of the auditor general's authority, making the agency independent of the county executive. The auditor general

would have the power to hire an outside auditor to prepare an annual report on the county's finances.

In the past, the auditor has had a tough time conducting reviews because of challenges about authority. This amendment may not completely solve the problem, but it will clarify the lines of authority. It should be adopted on Nov. 5.

On the independent counsel issue, the present charter does allow for the commission to retain temporary counsel, and the commission already retains legal counsel.



al fund alone is \$22.9 million," Juarez said. "I do not think that this district, nor any other within western Wayne County, receives \$22.9 million in services from Wayne County in either direct or indirect services."

"People wanted to see me work at it, get involved and get our representation back."

The issues are "taxes, taxes, taxes," Juarez said.

"People are upset with all the county issues on the ballot. People out county are not voting for them. The only one that supported the parks proposal was Trenton."

But Beard points to \$6.7 million in improvements over the past four years as part of her

work for the district.

That included widening of Cherry Hill to five lanes between Newburgh and Wayne Roads, Middle Belt from Ford to Warren, Wayne from Warren to Cowan, and about \$700,000 in traffic equipment on Wayne from West Chicago in Livonia to Goddard in Romulus.

Also included in those improvements were three other projects scheduled to be completed in Inkster but postponed this year because of the debate between Gov. John Engler and local officials over federal monies for local projects.

The stadium tax proposal

Beard supported the place-

ment of the stadium tax proposal on the ballot.

"People should vote on that," Beard said. "I look at it as a referendum on whether people want the Lions back in Detroit."

The proposal allows out-of-town guests to support the stadiums, Beard said. She was surprised at the support from hotels and rental car companies.

"That in and of itself won't bring back downtown," Beard said. "The airport also will make a difference for Detroit. It is a huge job generator."

Beard does not believe the tax represents corporate welfare for the Ilitches and the Fords, the respective owners of the Tigers and Lions.

"They are paying more than half," Beard said. "Many, many stadiums around the country are paid with 100 percent tax dollars. That's real corporate welfare."

Juarez ripped the stadium tax proposal.

"People are upset with this," she said.

Juarez doesn't believe it will bring growth to Detroit. "Coleman Young said that about the People Mover, and people said that about the Cobo Hall expansion," Juarez said.

If the Tigers or Lions pulled out of the deal, the tax could still be in effect if it is approved by voters, she said.

If the expected \$5 million to \$6

million is not collected as anticipated, taxpayers would be responsible for the general obligation tax, Juarez said.

County ballot proposals

Beard proposed placing the corporation counsel question on the ballot.

"We found it really doesn't work well to have one corporation counsel for two separate branches of government," Beard said. "Our founding fathers 200 years ago set up our government so that we'd have some tension between the separate branches."

"We feel we need our own legal counsel. It seems to me the public is better served if we have the independence of our own counsel."

The auditor general question was proposed because the auditor general was not getting information from some departments, Beard said.

"The auditor general has saved

millions of dollars," Beard said. "(The auditor general's staff members) are always going in and making suggestions to save money. (The auditor general) needs more authority without being road blocked."

Juarez had not studied the proposal on corporation counsel, but believes and supports the auditor general's expanded role.

"Wayne County has had a problem with money forever. You always hear the excuse that 'we don't know where the money is' and people wonder is it spent where it is supposed to be spent."

Juarez also wants to repeal the parks tax. "My district voted 'no,' and they are upset about it," she said.

What needs improving?

Beard believes all services could use improvement. "All of us are unhappy about the roads," Beard said. She cited the \$6.7 million in improvements for the district over the past four years.

Juarez wants to appoint committees to examine the budget.



blems of housing, crime and drugs are more important?

Burnett: I think the county is putting the issues of stadiums in priority order with other important functions and issues. I support the concept of "year-round professional sports." I think twin stadiums will be needed to support professional sports overlapping seasons, predicted as a thing of the future.

McCotter: Ask the commission Democrats — every single

one of them supported the stadium issue. The county should ever be in the business of taxing us to build stadiums for millionaires — let alone when residents already pay too many taxes and receive too few services. I voted against the stadium tax — and every other county tax. I will continue to do so.

Should Wayne County be made into two counties? Why or why not?

Burnett: No. Secession from this part of the county from the rest will not solve problems. The commissioner said he would during the primary. His opponent did. This is a bad idea that will only increase taxes, bureaucracy, and one of the things we all hate, the size of government.

McCotter: Secession will cost taxpayers millions in just the "start-up" costs of a new governmental entity — let alone the new county's proportionate

share of outstanding Wayne County debt it will still be obligated to pay.

I am awaiting findings of the Conference of Western Wayne's formal study. In the remote instance that despite all current evidence to the contrary, secession proves to be in the best interests of western Wayne County taxpayers, I will support it.

I-94 to close at night for traffic sensor installation

I-94 in the vicinity of Detroit's Metro Airport will be closed during late evening and early morning hours periodically over the next week so that traffic sensor loops can be installed.

Airport management is advising motorists of planned road closures starting today and continuing between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 a.m.

Rockwell Transportation Systems will be installing sensor loops under contract to the Michigan Department of Transportation. The inductive pavement loops are intended for vehicle flow monitoring as part of MDOT's Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) program.

Here is the schedule of road closures:

Today: The main through lanes on eastbound I-94 will be closed but traffic will continue through on the CD (collector-distributor) lanes associated with the airport exit and entrance ramps.

Tuesday: The same drill for westbound traffic on I-94.

Wednesday: Lane closures on westbound I-94 at I-275.

Thursday: Lane closures on

eastbound I-94 at Inkster Road. **Friday:** Lane closures on westbound I-94 at Inkster Road.

Monday, Nov. 11: Lane closures on eastbound I-94 at I-275.

Once again, the closures will occur only between the hours of 10 p.m. and 6 p.m., and thus are expected to have little impact on most traffic in and out of the airport.

The installation was intention-

ally scheduled to occur during night time hours and before the holidays to have the least impact on airport customers.

Mountain man shares secrets for cooking venison

With hunting season upon us, thousands of people will be heading out, or up, to deer camp. I polled some deer hunters and was surprised to learn that while most of them know good hunting and safety techniques, less than 20 percent know how to cook venison properly.

When I say properly, I mean to be able to make it taste good. So delicious that your entire family (and guests) are willing to eat it. Just about everyone I talked to said they know how to: pan fry a venison tenderloin in bacon grease with onions; bake a venison roast with potatoes, carrots and onions; or make venison burger stew. Only two hunters (out of 14 polled) really knew how to properly cook venison.

My best friend Mick Livernois, a financial consultant for Merrill Lynch, has probably discovered the best-kept secret to cooking great venison. He's not an avid hunter, but he gets venison from friends, family members and clients. Mick has never turned down an offer of venison meat. Upon receipt of the meat, he heads to the party store for some Miller Lite Beer, and calls me.

Mountain Man advice

Another good source for information on cooking venison is the "Mountain Man Cookbook" by Thomas Canino, (copyright 1989, TLC Books, \$8.95). I contacted Canino at his residence just outside Littleton, Colo. When queried about venison cooking, here's what the Mountain Man had to say.

"The primary intention of the book is to introduce as many people as possible to the pleasure of venison cooking," he said. When asked for advice about cooking venison, Canino said to "remove as much of the bone, fat and sinew from all cuts before cooking to achieve success."

Canino's book is one of the few books on the market that offers recipes for just about every part of the deer (and if deer isn't your bag, Canino claims you can substitute elk, buffalo and even beef). His recipes feature venison cooked in butter, with cheese, spices, and on occasion, wine and sherry.

Cooking secrets

Now with all due respect to Mountain Man Canino, any inebriated hunter can make a tenderloin taste good. What I've discovered, in addition to the Mountain Man's recipes, is that when cooking venison, the tougher the cut, the longer the cooking time.

Roasts, ribs, chops and loins can be cooked like most cuts of beef, possibly requiring a bit more fat to keep them tender. Since venison fat (tallow) and sinew, which holds the various muscle sections together, are the nemesis of a good cook, I agree with the Mountain Man that they should be removed.

When roasting, I utilize strips of bacon secured over the well-trimmed cuts with toothpicks to ensure a good basting during cooking.

When cooking tougher cuts (such as hams, shoulder roasts and blade steaks), I prefer to cook the venison slow with lots of liquid. If the cut is small enough, I might dredge it in flour and then pan fry in a little grease to begin browning, only then to muster up a good marinade or baste made with wine, apple juice or broth and herbs.

Large hind quarters (my friend Mick says I excel at this) usually get slow roasted and basted over a low-heated grill or barbecue. (Of course, this prevails and only heralds the need for additional liquid refreshment for the chef.)

If you're looking to enjoy the great taste of venison (cooked right it really does taste good) and aren't heading for the fields or know someone like Mick, you can buy farm-raised venison at The Butcher Boy, 13869 Herbert, Warren (810) 779-0600. Prices are comparable to that of aged beef.

Seedy pomegranate:

FRUIT WITH A PAST

Like pumpkins, winter squash and homegrown apples, the truly remarkable pomegranate makes its appearance in produce departments in the fall.

Yet, even though it's been around for thousands of years and is frequently mentioned in the Old Testament, many questions surround this ruddy/red fruit. How do you peel it? How are you supposed to eat it? What about all those seeds: Do you crunch them up and swallow or spit them out? How do you use a pomegranate?

"Europeans often buy them by the case," said Harvey Freedman, one of the managers at Joe's Produce in Livonia. "They like to split them and eat them. Americans like to use the seeds as a garnish. Pomegranates are at their peak here between Thanksgiving and Christmas."

Julia Najor of West Bloomfield, who collects recipes from Middle-Eastern cultures in anticipation of publishing a cookbook, said, "My recipes that call for pomegranate seeds or juice are from Iran, Syria, Lebanon, Palestine, Jordan and such. But, the most popular thing is just to eat the seeds."

To sample these, you immediately realize that nobody packages like Mother Nature. The pomegranate, a marvel of ingenuity, comes with a leathery outer covering that firmly protects an inner honeycomb of crimson seeds clustered in sections separated by papery membranes.

Lucky for us, because that means this fist-size, tree-grown berry, native to warmer climates, was designed for long-distance travel. It made its way to America aboard the sailing ships of Spanish conquistadors.

Imagine what a treat those slightly tart, nutritious pomegranates must have been for 15th-century sailors. Pomegranates are high in potassium, and contain a modest amount of vitamin C.

The pomegranate was one of the wondrous things left behind when the last of the Moors fled Spain in 1492. It is still the emblem of the city of Granada, Spain.

But, pomegranates are as much fun to eat as they are to talk about.

Peeling method

To peel a pomegranate, cut off the blossom end and remove some of the white pithy membrane with it. Then score the rind in quarters working from where you cut the top to the bottom. Be careful not to penetrate beyond the rind or you may get sprayed with the red juice, which happens to be the base for grenadine syrup and fabric dyes.

Then break apart along the cuts, first in halves, then in quarters. Pull back the rind from each quarter and pull out the seeds. Be careful, or you'll understand in a hurry why the word grenade comes from pomegranate. With a less-than-delicate touch, the clumps will explode and seeds fly in all directions.

Eating pomegranates

To swallow or spit out the seeds is an individual matter. Sucking the seeds and spitting appears to be too much trouble for most pomegranate aficionados. Besides, there's a charming precedent for swallowing the seeds. In Greek mythology, after Persephone, daughter Demeter, goddess of agriculture, was kidnapped and taken to Hades, she disobeyed her mother and swallowed four or five pomegranate seeds. As punishment, she was condemned to spend that many months in the underworld away from the warmth of the sun. In short, that sweet kid who couldn't resist pomegranate seeds is responsible for our long winters - at least in mythology. Thank goodness, she didn't swallow a dozen.

Nathaniel Hawthorne used this myth as the basis of one of his Tanglewood Tales, "The Pomegranate Seeds." A contemporary version for children, "Persephone and the Pomegranate" by writer/illustrator Kris Waldherr was published by Dial Books in 1993.

Maybe, this tale is why it sounded so appropriate for Guy Wolf, produce manager of Vic's Quality Fruit Market in Beverly Hills, to say, "Pomegranates are a winter fruit. They will be around until January. Ours come from California. When they start losing their color and look a little brownish, that's when they're at their sweetest."

"Many of our customers buy pomegranates to make juice," said Tim Coward, produce manager at Nino Salvaggio's International Marketplace of Farmington Hills. To make juice, place 1-1/2 to 2 cups seeds in a blender or food processor; blend until liquefied. Pour through a cheesecloth-lined strainer.

The pomegranate's area of origin is elusive - Persia, Afghanistan, India and the Himalayan region are among those mentioned in various sources. Moses assured the Israelites that when they made it to the Promised Land there would be pomegranates.

In architecture, design, literature and as a food, the pomegranate links us with early civilization.

SOME USES FOR POMEGRANATES

Brightly-colored, juicy pomegranate seeds can dress up many dishes:

- Add them to fresh fruit salads. For a festive starter for a holiday breakfast or brunch, top slices of kiwi and oranges with pomegranate seeds.
- Drizzle them over Middle Eastern appetizers such as baba ghanouj.
- Add them to mixed green salads with a lemon and oil dressing or tossed salads such as the popular Middle Eastern salad, fattoush.
- If you make pomegranate juice and freeze it, add a bit to iced summer drinks for extra flavor.
- Use whole pomegranates in fruit and flower arrangements before you peel and eat them.
- Give youngsters a treat. Read them the book, "Persephone and the Pomegranate," by Kris Waldherr, then open and peel a pomegranate so they can see and taste it.

BUYING & STORAGE TIPS

- Choose pomegranates heavy for their size. The skin varies from bright to deep red with a fresh leather-like appearance, without cracks or splits.
- One medium pomegranate yields about 3/4 cup seeds and 1/2 cup juice.
- Whole pomegranates keep well at room temperature for several days, away from sunlight. They'll last up to three months stored in the refrigerator.
- Refrigerate seeds up to 3 days. Freeze in single layers, on trays; then up to 6 months in airtight containers. Remove only the seeds you plan to use.
- Refrigerate juice up to 3 days. Freeze up to 6 months in airtight containers.

Go portside with 1994 Vintage Ports

There's been significant press surrounding 1994 Vintage Ports. Many are available now. Are these majestic, vintage-dated fortified wines with an extraordinarily long life span as good as many have said? Based on cask samples we began tasting in spring 1996, an unqualified yes.

Nearly all major Port houses declared the 1994 vintage. Adrian Bridge, marketing director for Taylor Fladgate and Fonseca Ports, explained the vintage greatness.

"Exceptional high quality of 1994 Ports is due to a number of climatic conditions that came together to yield grapes of extraordinary ripeness," he said. "In May, 1994 rain at flowering reduced the crop about 40 percent. From then on, the weather was very good. Summer was a little cooler than

normal. Grapes ripened slowly and harvest conditions were ideal. Cool nights engineered long fermentations. Early tastings reveal Ports with great fruit intensity."

If you buy 1994 Vintage Ports (they would make a superior holiday gift), be prepared to age them at least 15 to 20 years before beginning to drink them or your money will be wasted. These wines will age up to 50 years from vintage quite easily.

Ports go through what is called a dumb stage, approximately between years seven and 10 from vintage," Bridge cautioned. "The patient will be rewarded for cellaring these wines."

About 10,000 cases of 1994 Fonseca Port \$51 per bottle were produced. A recent sampling showed a big, powerful red fruit melange in both aroma and flavor profile. Its incredible density is

VENISON STROGANOFF

2 pounds venison steak, cut into cubes
 1 cup chopped onion
 1/2 pound mushrooms, sliced (about 2 cups)
 1 (7 ounce) can tomato soup
 1 cup sour cream
 1 tablespoon paprika
 Sprinkle of red pepper (cayenne)
 1 tablespoon parsley
 2 tablespoons salad oil
 Sauté venison and onions with salad oil in a heavy fry pan or Dutch oven until meat has browned. Sprinkle with paprika and cayenne pepper. Drain off any excess fat. Combine remaining ingredients in a separate bowl and mix well. Pour over cooked veni-

son and mix well to coat. Cook in a preheated 350 degree F. oven, uncovered, for 35 minutes. Serve over cooked noodles, if desired. Serves 4.

VENISON SWISS STEAK

1 pound venison steak or chops, trimmed and cut into 1-inch cubes
 4 tablespoons olive oil or margarine
 1 (16 ounce) can chopped tomatoes (about 2 cups)
 1 onion, cut into 1/4 wedges
 1 bell pepper, seeded and sliced into 1/2 inch pieces
 3 tablespoons parsley, chopped
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon fresh ground white pepper
 1 clove garlic, cut in half

1/2 cup flour
 Dredge meat with flour. Sauté meat, onions and garlic in hot oil or margarine until meat is browned and onions are soft, about 5-7 minutes. Place in an oven proof casserole dish and cover with remaining ingredients. Place in a preheated 350 degree oven for 40 minutes (uncovered). Serves 4.

COLORADO VENISON STEW

2 pounds venison, cubed (all fat, bone and sinew removed)
 4 tablespoons cooking oil
 1/2 cup seasoned flour
 2 teaspoons salt
 1/2 teaspoon white pepper
 1/2 teaspoon rosemary
 6 tablespoons dried parsley

1 large onion, peeled and cut into quarters
 1 cup peas (frozen or fresh work best)
 1 cup dry red wine
 1 tablespoon paprika
 6 cups hot water

Dredge meat in flour. Brown meat and onions in cooking oil. Add remaining ingredients except peas and wine. Simmer, uncovered, for 1 hour over low heat, stirring occasionally or until liquid slowly reduces to a gravy like consistency. Add wine and simmer for 30 minutes. Add peas and simmer 5 minutes longer. Serve with French bread. Serves 4-6.

CHILI CON VENISON

1 clove garlic
 2 teaspoons salt
 1/2 cup warm water
 6 dried red chili peppers

(seeded and stemmed)
 1 pound ground venison
 1/2 pound diced venison
 6 tablespoons salad oil
 4 tablespoons soy sauce
 4 tablespoons butter
 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
 8 cups hot water
 4 green chilies (roasted, peeled and diced, canned may be used)
 4 dried red chilies (seeded and stemmed)
 3 tablespoons whole cumin seed (ground)
 2 teaspoon oregano leaves, crushed
 2 tablespoons salt (optional)

Sauté ground and diced meat in salad oil. Add butter, soy sauce and ginger and cook over medium heat for 1 minute. Combine meat and basic sauce in a crock pot or

slow cooker. Add water, chili (red and green), cumin, oregano and salt. Simmer slowly at low heat in crock pot or slow cooker for 24 hours, covered, stirring occasionally. Taste. In a blender or mortar and pestle, combine garlic, 2 teaspoons salt, 1/2 cup warm water and 6 dried red chilies (seeded and stemmed) and pulverize until smooth. Stir into chili and cook, uncovered for 1 hour. Serves 4-6.

Chef's secret: I tried this and instead of water, substituted 1/2 V-8 vegetable juice and 1/2 beef broth or stock and eliminated the salt and the dish was outstanding!

voluptuous, rich and viscous. Overall balance is excellent. A similar number of cases of Taylor Fladgate \$51 per bottle were produced. Currently, it is showing less fruity opulence. It's riper image has firmness and grip. It comes across weightier than Fonseca with more tannins, but a velvety chocolate texture in the finish.

We'd compare 1994 Vintage Ports with those from 1970. However, judging from the 1960s forward, we put 1963, 1977 and 1985 ahead of 1970. Following in order after 1970 are 1991, 1966, 1992 (only Taylor Fladgate and Fonseca declared), 1983, 1987, 1967, 1980, 1982 and 1975.

If you shop at some of the area's larger wine shops, many older vintages, drinking well

now, are available at not extraordinarily elevated prices. Based on our pre-release tastings, other 1994 Ports to buy are: Churchill's, Warre's, Cockburn, Dow's, Graham's, Sandeman's and Smith Woodhouse.

We're very impressed with Churchill's Ports overall. The 1994, \$41, has fabulous aromatics and a spice element not encountered in other Ports from this vintage. Every imaginable black-fruit can be found in the aroma and played out on the palate. Rich, ripe and concentrated, it is best described in one word — delicious. Churchill's, unlike Taylor Fladgate which has released Vintage Ports since 1890 or Fonseca from 1896, is the youngest of the major port houses. Founded in 1981, it has

come a long way in less than two decades releasing superbly crafted Ports.

If you're just discovering Ports, what is there to drink now while waiting for 1994s to age? 1990 Taylor Fladgate Late Bottled Vintage Port \$16 does nicely for starters as well as 1989 Quinta do Noval Late Bottled Vintage Port \$18. Serve these, as well as a vintage port, at the end of a meal with cheddar or stilton cheese or chocolates. Tawny Ports are also good, served

slightly chilled at the end of a meal with cheeses such as camembert or brie. The rainy, nutty flavors of tawnies evolve on the palate and make them good accompaniments to claret or colorado cigars.

Vintage-dated single quinta (vineyard) Ports have interesting vineyard characters. They mature earlier than Vintage Ports. The 1987 Churchill's Quinta da Agua Alta \$29 is a good example. In years when Vintage Ports are declared, the

single quinta is part of the blend. Quinta da Agua Alta is no exception. You should still be able to find some 1984 Warre's Quinta da Cavadinha \$25 which is also stellar.

White Ports are uncommon and make a very good winter time aperitif. We recommend: Nonvintage Churchill Graham White Port \$14.50. If you try it with your eyes closed, you'll easily taste it as a tawny style. It is seriously delicious and a fabulous accompaniment to Spanish

tapas, strong cheese or Chinese cuisine. Taylor Fladgate Chip Dry Porto \$15, an extra-dry white port, has an individual style. It's fragrant, delicate and nutty like a sherry. Over ice is nice. Serve it with roasted nuts as an aperitif pour.

Vegetables make fettucini flavorful

pressed.
 6 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese
 1/4 cup chopped fresh parsley
 Freshly ground black pepper to taste
 2 cups chopped and steamed vegetables of choice: carrots, green beans, zucchini, onions, broccoli or peas
 Cook pasta according to package

directions. Drain. Place pasta in a large nonstick sauté pan along with milk and garlic. Bring to a simmer, stirring frequently. Add cheese. Continue cooking until cheese melts and sauce thickens. Stir in parsley and black pepper. Add steamed vegetables and toss gently. Serves 4.



Master art of making low-fat muffins

The idea behind low-fat muffins is a great one: use careful ingredient substitution to create baked goods that are healthy and taste great. In practice, however, reduced-fat baked goods can result in food with bland taste; rubbery texture and lackluster appearance.

But with a few simple guidelines, you can cut the fat in your favorite baked goods recipes and still create moist, delicious snacks.

Because of their dense texture, muffins are one of the best candidates among baked goods for fat-reducing recipe adaptations. The key to success is to replace between a third to half of the fat

in a recipe and evaluate the results before reducing fat in further batches.

When a muffin recipe calls for butter, margarine or another solid shortening, replace the fat with a substitute: use half as much fruit juice, applesauce or fruit puree. If oil is an ingredient, replace all or part of it with three-fourths as much of a chosen substitute. Add a little more fruit, sauce or puree, if the resulting batter seems dry. Cut fat while preserving tenderness by using two egg whites for each whole egg. To retain moisture, bake the muffins at a slightly lower temperature and be careful not to over bake.

When you create lower fat versions of your favorite recipes, choose an alternative to fat that's compatible with the other ingredients. If the recipe already contains applesauce, fruit puree, fruit juice, buttermilk or yogurt, simply increase that ingredient as you reduce the fat. If there is no fat substitute among listed ingredients, consider adding a fat substitute with flavors that complement the recipe.

A mild-tasting substitute like nonfat buttermilk or plain non-fat yogurt would be a good addition to muffins with a subtle flavor. Spice muffins take fat alternatives with stronger flavors such as mashed bananas,

mashed pumpkin or maple syrup.

If you eliminate all the fat in a recipe, it helps to substitute a whole grain flour for at least a third to a half of the refined flour in a recipe. The fiber in whole grain flour will help to ensure a pleasing texture.

CRANBERRY MAPLE MUFFINS

- Batter:
- 1 1/2 cups flour
 - 1/4 cup sugar
 - 1/4 cup light brown sugar
 - 2 teaspoons baking powder
 - 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 1 egg
 - 1/2 cup skim milk
 - 1/4 cup applesauce
 - 2 tablespoons oil
 - 1 1/2 teaspoons maple extract
 - 1 1/4 cups fresh or frozen cranberries
- Topping:
- 1/4 cup flour
 - 1 tablespoon brown sugar
 - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, softened

1/4 cup old-fashioned oats
Preheat oven to 375 degrees F. Grease a 12-cup muffin tin.
Combine the dry ingredients in a medium mixing bowl. Mix the egg, milk, applesauce, oil and maple extract in a separate bowl. Add the liquid ingredients to the dry mixture and combine until just moistened. Stir in the cranberries.
To make the topping, combine the dry ingredients in a small mixing bowl. Work the butter into the dry ingredients until it is the size

of small peas. Stir in the oats and set aside.

Fill each muffin cup two thirds full with batter. Sprinkle topping evenly over each muffin. Bake for 25 minutes or until golden brown. Cool 5 minutes in the pan. Remove the muffins to a wire rack to cool completely. Each of the 12 muffins contains 157 calories and 5 grams of fat.

POMEGRANATE, ORANGE AND KIWI SALAD

- 1 1/2 tablespoons white wine vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 1/8 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1 1/2 quarts mixed salad greens (optional)
- 2 oranges, peeled and sliced
- 4 kiwis, peeled and sliced
- 1 medium pomegranate, seeded (about 3/4 cup)

To make dressing, combine vinegar and next three ingredients; whisk in oil. Toss greens with 2 1/2 tablespoons dressing; arrange on serving platter. Alternating, arrange orange slices and kiwi slices over greens. Drizzle with remaining dressing. Sprinkle with pomegranate seeds. Makes 6 servings.

BUTTERHEAD LETTUCE WITH POMEGRANATE AND PINE NUTS

- 2 tablespoons pine nuts

- 10 spinach leaves, rinsed and trimmed
- 5 cups butterhead or leafy green lettuce, rinsed, dried and torn for salad
- 2 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil
- Salt to taste
- Freshly ground pepper
- 1/4 cup pomegranate seeds
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice

Place the pine nuts in a frying pan and toast them over moderate heat until golden-brown, stirring constantly; set aside.

Roll the spinach leaves into a tight cigar shape and cut crosswise into 1/8-inch chiffonade or shreds.

Combine the lettuce and spinach in a salad bowl. Drizzle with oil, season with salt and pepper, and toss to mix. Sprinkle with pomegranate seeds, pine nuts, and lemon juice. Serves 4.

SALAD OF POMEGRANATES, PERSIMMONS, AND KIWIS

- 1 large pomegranate, seeded (1 cup seeds)

- 1 cup yogurt
- About 1 tablespoon honey
- About 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 4 small ripe persimmons
- 4 kiwis, peeled, halved lengthwise, then sliced crosswise

Lightly crush 2/3 cup pomegranate seeds in a bowl to extract some juice. Stir in yogurt and honey and lemon juice to taste. Refrigerate for 1/2 hour or longer.

Cut out leaf base from the persimmons, then halve fruits lengthwise. With a sharp paring knife gently cut into the flesh as close to the skin as possible, to separate the two. (Alternately, if you have one of the jelly-soft persimmons, you may have to first cut the fruit into lengthwise slices, then delicately pare off the skin from each slice.) Gently cut into the slices.

Arrange persimmons and kiwi slices on 4 salad plates. Drizzle the dressing over each, then sprinkle the reserved pomegranate seeds over all.

Sales are sweet in candy shops

Every time I visit Jacobson's candy department at Laurel Park Place in Livonia, the sweet business is bustling.

And a little investigation reveals an ironic twist - in the age when fitness reigns, rising candy sales suggest the need for a truffle or two to soothe psyches after all that strenuous exercise and healthy eating.

"It's a very exciting department here," said department manager Gladys Hines. We're always busy. Our best seller is Godiva, but people also seem to love our Jacobson's brand because of its creamy texture.

Jacobson's candy cases are filled with fine chocolates by Joseph Schmidt, Godiva (\$29 per pound), Long Grove, and the Jacobson's brand which recently got new packaging. Seasonal items like Joseph Schmidt's truffles, molded in the shapes of turkeys and pumpkins, have arrived just in time for the holidays.

According to Hines, customers like treating themselves as well as others to tempting chocolate treats.

"Customers really like to give Joseph Schmidt as hostess gifts. Made with Belgian chocolate and no other oil than cocoa butter, the truffles (\$1.75 each) are hand painted. They are beautiful as well as tasty. Seven times a year, Schmidt comes out with hand painted collector boxes for his goods. He even offers an edible acorn box filled with little chocolates (\$14.50) that's sold at Harrod's in London," she explained.

For personal or corporate giving, Hines suggests "there's no more welcome gift" than a box of chocolates and a bottle of wine or champagne.

"People like giving chocolate as gifts. Our gift basket business is year-round. For a real chocolate, our custom chocolate basket (\$150-\$200) would be the answer. We include a little bit of every chocolate we carry," she said.

Hudson's Westland candy department is filled with gift baskets of every size and description along with an array of fancy chocolates including Godiva, Hudson's Gourmet (bulk chocolates), Chocolat Nouveau, Perugina, Bari & Gail, and their signature brand Frango. Candy is definitely big business here. The sales goal for November is \$18,000, for December \$83,500!

"Candy sales for the year are up 13-percent and we only do half the volume of our stores at Oakland Mall and Somerset," said department manager Joanne MacKenzie. "One of our best sellers is our scoop bulk for kids. Hudson's has always had a line of fun candy for children since our Hudson's store opened downtown in 1881."

Assistant manager Joanne Welch attested to the popularity of the department with adults.

"While shopping, men or women will buy one or two truffles and pop them into the mouth as a stress reliever. That's their treat for the day," she observed.

Tired of giving the same old box of chocolates? MacKenzie suggests Frango's new Michigan Cherry Chocolates (\$15 for 16 ounces) made with Traverse City cherries. Also great little gifts are a ceramic Santabear dish filled with foil-wrapped milk chocolates (\$11.50 for two ounces) and a decorator reindeer tin bearing raspberry and mint twists (\$11.50 for eight ounces).

"Our candy department is a service that our customers really look for. We sold a lot of Godiva and Frango for Sweetest Day. You see more pre-packaged than years ago because people want ease," said acting store manager Maureen O'Brien.


Pre-packaged candy is all Neiman Marcus sells. Last September the Troy store eliminated the candy department, but it's temporarily being revived for the holidays.

"Holiday candy sales were always successful and this year is not intended to be any less. We'll have everything from Hanukkah items like stars with gold-wrapped chocolate coins to a \$1,200 train filled with chocolates and gifts" said Neiman's gift gallery manager William Garbe.

There are also hand-dipped carob treats (\$8) for the dog!

B'ham looks at 'new urbanism'



Somerset North and downtown Birmingham, are they oil & water - or milk and honey? That's the question put to two of the town's business leaders, Jacobson's operations manager and the Townsend Hotel president. Here are their answers.

The biggest influx of Somerset shoppers is coming from our suburbs to the west. So downtown Birmingham and its Jacobson's anchor store want to intercept them on their way to or from the newly expanded Troy mall.

That is key to the message that both Geoff Hockman, chairman of Birmingham's Principal Shopping District, and Chuck Viers, operational manager of Jacobson's Birmingham store, delivered to the Retail Executive Group Tuesday night at a dinner meeting at Chianti's in Southfield.

"If we do our job we have an opportunity to make that shopping trip include Birmingham," Hockman told the 30 people who attended to hear whether Somerset North and Downtown Birmingham are more like oil and water, or milk and honey. "The Somerset situation has not been negative but positive," he insisted.

Birmingham has engaged in a two-fold approach to accomplish this, according to Hockman, who is also president of the Townsend Hotel.

First, four years ago Lansing legislators were persuaded to give them the lawful legs to set up a Principal Shopping District. And over the past months the city has engaged an outside planner to oversee the creation of a new master plan.

The Birmingham PSD raises \$450,000 annually through a special assessment on commercial space within its boundaries to cohesively promote its downtown and oversee tenant recruitment - practices which come naturally to a single-landlord mall.

The money, Hockman acknowledges, is "a drop in the bucket" compared with Somerset which, he says, spent over a million dollars just on its opening. And, he added, "I will be the first to tell you that this (the PSD) is not without its controversy" with landlords, retailers and residents all having a say.

Inherent in the up and coming master plan, Hockman suggests, is development of a new urbanism. Its underlying philosophy is "The pedestrian is king." Free two-hour parking was recently instituted to encourage parking in the existing city decks. Changing the street frontage to encourage pedestrian access and expanding city parks are under consideration.

Building more in-town residential housing is also part of the thinking. So is continuing to develop restaurant and entertainment opportunities that transcend the traditional hours of retail. After January, Hockman predicts, you'll have a lot fewer chain stores in Birmingham since several have relocated to Somerset.

To take up that slack, "We're trying to attract retailers who are interested in being in traditional town settings. We have a chance to bring in services and goods that aren't necessarily competitive with Somerset." That could include more art and antique galleries in the city which now number 44.

A frequently asked question at the concierge desk in Somerset, Hockman reports, is: "How do I get to Birmingham?" To that end, both shopping districts are talking about shuttle buses running between them. Viers, who started out selling toys at Jacobson's 40 years ago, echoes Hockman's positive stance on the ability to compete.

"After 46 years in downtown Birmingham, Jacobson's hasn't just survived change and new competition, the store has actually thrived from it," Viers says. "We've weathered many mall openings including Northland, Tel-Twelve and the Oakland Mall expansion."

And, he says, the Birmingham store has not stood still for Somerset North. "It allowed us to accelerate the remodeling plan we had. We've added a lot more bright colors. I don't believe we would have done it this quickly."

And Jacobson's took the cue from Somerset and opened up a concierge desk where, for example, free rain bonnets are available. But Viers says service has always defined Jacobson's.

"The way you compete anywhere you are is with service. Nordstrom reminds us of that," he said.

Although Jacobson's continues its policies of refusing to advertise com-

parative pricing and sales, he acknowledges that they've gone to tying gift certificates to a customer's monthly sales and giving discounts for those opening up new checking accounts.

Viers says his main competition is not the new Hudson's or Nordstrom, but "our Livonia store" which he says is doing great business. He is striving to continue a 47-year tradition of Birmingham as the No. 1 store in the Jacobson's chain.

The audience of metro-Detroit retailers and service providers to the retail industry seemed impressed.

"Birmingham seems to have a pretty decent plan that they've thought through," said Joe Fada, a director of the Retail Executive Group and a retail specialist at the accounting firm of Arthur Andersen. "The speakers showed clearly that if you understand what your mission is, you can accomplish your goals," added retail analyst Steve Epstein.



Playoff-bound Trenton upset by Pats, 24-15

Livonia Franklin played as if it was the football team trying to accomplish an undefeated regular season Friday night.

The highly-motivated Patriots concluded the 1996 campaign with a huge home-field victory by handing Trenton its first loss, 24-15.

"I believe we're always capable of winning, but (the Franklin players) really came out fired up," Franklin coach Rick Lee said. "We very happy with the outcome."

PREP FOOTBALL

The Patriots dominated the game with a potent rushing attack as senior halfback Anthony Grech rushed for 234 yards and two touchdowns on 36 carries.

Franklin outgained Trenton on the ground 313-87, and Lee distributed the credit for that among the many players who blocked for Grech and John Kopchak, who added 70 yards on 13 carries.

"It's the offensive line and the fullbacks — everybody working together," Lee said. "After the Harrison loss, I challenged the offensive line to dominate like we thought they could at the beginning of the year, and they've met the challenge the last two weeks."

"Getting those surges, getting those (Trenton) guys on their heels makes a world of difference."

The Patriots (6-3) scored on their first possession and were ahead most of the game.

When the Trojans didn't field the opening kickoff, apparently thinking it would roll out of bounds, Franklin recovered the free ball in Trenton territory.

It took Franklin only a few plays to gain a 7-0 lead on Steve Ashbay's 2-yard run and the extra point by Nick Anagnostopoulos.

"That gave us a lot of confidence," Lee said. "I told them to come out hitting hard and see what happens. Then, the defense said 'OK, the offense is going,' and the defense stepped up, too. That was super defense."

Trenton (8-1) came back to tie in the second quarter when quarterback Ryan Szokola hit tight end Phil Nagy with a 48-yard touchdown pass.

The Patriots had an eight-minute drive that ended just before halftime with a 1-yard touchdown run by Grech. After a bad snap on the PAT, Anagnostopoulos passed to Paul Terek for two points and a 15-7 lead.

Franklin began the second half with a nine-play drive culminated in a 27-yard field goal by Anagnostopoulos, adding three points to the lead.

The Patriots cemented the victory with a four-play, 40-yard drive. Grech dashed 21 yards with 21 seconds remaining in the period for a 24-7 lead.

"This is a great example of one team playing harder and better than the other team," Trenton coach Bob Czarnecki said. "They did an outstanding job tonight, and we by and large stood around and watched them do it."

"Franklin plays in a great league. Their losses were to Harrison, Walled Lake Western and Sterling Heights Stevenson, and those three are going to be playoff teams."

The Trojans narrowed the gap with 2:52 left in the game. Franklin's defense stopped Trenton twice on fourth-and-1 before Szokola ran around left end for the TD. He also ran for the two points, making the score 24-15.

Szokola was 15-of-21 passing for 201 yards, and he also rushed 21 times for 66 yards.

Warriors wind up 8-1, but miss state playoffs

Normally an 8-1 record will get you into the state football playoffs, but Lutheran High Westland will have to watch from the sidelines.

Despite a season-ending 49-8 win Saturday at Rochester Hills Lutheran Northwest, the Warriors wound up fifth in Class C-Region IV behind Southgate Aquinas (8-0 going into Sunday's game), Almont (9-0), Deckerville (8-1) and Metro Conference champion Harper Woods (8-1).

Ironically, Lutheran Westland's only loss occurred in the season opener against Harper Woods, 16-14.

"We're disappointed we didn't make it in, but we had a very, very good year," Warriors second-year coach Scott Wiemer said. "We felt we could compete with some of those teams because our defense has improved so much the last four games."

Lutheran Westland's playoff fate was doomed by Saturday's opponent, Northwest, a Class D team which finished 0-9.

Senior tailback Albert Cook capped a sterling season by rushing for 141 yards in five carries. He scored four touchdowns including a fumble recovery in the end zone, 75-yard kickoff return, 19-yard run and a 50-yard run.

Cook finished the season with 1,275 yards rushing and 18 TDs.

Quarterback Luke Horton tossed a 25-yard TD pass to Joe Pruchnik and scored on a 2-yard run. Pruchnik also scooped up a fumble in the end zone.

Bill Garlick kicked four extra points, while Ryan Moser added a two-point conversion. Jon Kamin also booted an extra point for the Warriors, who led 28-0 after one quarter and 42-8 at halftime.

Glenn storms past Wayne, 36-18

Westland John Glenn is a perfect 9-0.

The Rockets capped their first unbeaten regular season in football since 1985 with a come-from-behind 36-18 victory Friday night over rival Wayne Memorial.

Glenn now leads the series, 18-4. And they did it by erasing an 18-7 third-quarter deficit with a Tony Boles-like running attack.

Sophomore tailback Reggie Spearmon led the way with 205 yards on 33 carries, while junior fullback Antonio Gibson added 112 on 13 attempts.

The win also assured Glenn of hosting a first-round playoff game in Class AA-Region III.

Boles, an All-Stater who later went on to star at the University of Michigan, helped Glenn earn its first berth in 1985. This will be the Rockets' eighth playoff appearance.

"It's an old coaching phrase, but these guys play with a lot of heart," Glenn coach Chuck Gordon said. "We've had guys banged and nicked up, but everybody is in November."

"The key thing, however, is we've had guys go in and play well. They have a lot of confidence in each other."

Wayne, which upset Glenn 26-21 a year ago, appeared primed for a re-run by forging an 11-point lead with 10:53 left in the third quarter.

Dwayne Jackson scored on a 4-yard run that was set up by Lavelle Guess' interception.

The Zebras tacked on the TD after leading 12-7 at halftime.

Glenn took its opening possession 53 yards in nine plays, but the Rockets couldn't push it in when quarterback Justin Berent failed to break the plane of the goal line, fumbling at the Wayne 1-yard line on a critical fourth down play.

With 6:09 left in the opening period, Wayne fourth-year varsity quarterback Lorenzo Guess heaved a 99-yard scoring pass to his brother Lavelle.

Glenn, however, regrouped to pull ahead 7-6 on a 5-yard TD run by Spearmon followed by Steve Paling's

extra point with 9:50 left in the half.

Just before intermission, the Guess brothers struck again, teaming up for a 24-yard touchdown play.

With just five seconds remaining in half, Glenn missed a chance to regain the lead when Gordon shunned a field goal try in favor of a pass to the end zone from the Wayne 11.

But Berent's toss, intended for Paul Merandi, fell incomplete.

"There was debate there," Gordon said. "But the way they (Wayne) were moving the ball, we needed big points right now."

"We felt we had chances in the first half and that's disappointing. Maybe we tried to get a little too cute. We just didn't play as well as we were capable of."

But to the Rockets' credit, they didn't panic even after Jackson's early third-quarter TD run.

"In the second half our backs got hot and our linemen started playing better," Gordon said. "We got it moving on the ground."

Glenn responded with 29 unanswered points.

With exactly four minutes left in the third quarter, Spearmon scored

on a 6-yard run and Berent ran in for the two-pointer to slice the deficit to 18-15.

Gibson then ran through a gaping hole on a simple dive play from 16 yards out and Paling converted the point-after to make it 22-18.

Lavelle Guess then tried a trick pass intended for Lorenzo, but Spearmon intercepted it at midfield.

Gibson, running the same dive-play, then bolted in from 41 yards out. With a 29-18 lead, Glenn's defense went to work, intercepting Lorenzo Guess twice, one each by Steve Waller and David Jarrett.

Gibson put some insurance points on the board with his third TD of the night, a 5-yard scamper with just 1:16 to go.

"We gave them a scare and I thought our kids played hard," said Wayne coach Chuck Howton, whose team finished 5-4 overall. "The first half was ours, but the second half was theirs. Glenn just defended us better. We were not able to run the ball as we had done earlier. We just got tired and outmanned."

Gordon made adjustments to try and negate the hot hand of Guess, who was seven of nine in the opening half for 175 yards. But the second half was a different story as Guess was two of eight for 37 yards.

"We made some major changes coverage-wise for the second half," Gordon said. "We were giving their receivers too much room and he (Guess) was putting the ball right in there. We tried to hold their receivers up at the line. We tried to disrupt their routes."

"We were determined at half they were not going to beat us on the ground and not give up big chunks of yardage."

Wayne was outgained 347-100 in rushing yards.

The playoff pairings came out late Sunday night.

Meantime, play continued. And other assorted misplays in front of Davis.

"I was watching the box," Canton coach Don Smith said. "And the referee. They were still playing. I didn't

Practice pays off. Everybody on the Livonia Churchill boys soccer team knows that now.

Overtimes and shootouts aren't used during the regular season, so practicing them would make as much sense as working on archery skills to get ready for fishing. But in the MHSAA tournament, shootouts are the tie-breaker of last resort.

State rules limit matches to two sudden-death overtimes. If

Shamrocks surprise Rice in final

Casey Cook is used to helping out his goalkeeper through his club soccer background. And it was that experience that helped Redford Catholic Central win the Class A Regional Saturday at Southgate-Anderson.

Cook led an inspired CC defense as the Shamrocks blanked rival Birmingham Brother Rice, 1-0.

With CC clinging to the slim one-goal lead with approximately 13 minutes left in regulation time, Rice was dominating play and appeared to have tied the game as Mike Koval's shot sailed past CC goalkeeper Matt Kessler.

But Cook, standing just in front of the goal line, was able to clear the shot, preserving the lead.

"I've done that throughout club soccer; I guess I'm the assigned person to do that," said Cook,

The Shamrocks (13-6-2), who have allowed only one goal in their last five games, advance to the Class A quarter final at Warren DeLaSalle on Tuesday. They will face Troy (17-2-3), a 1-0 regional winner Saturday over Mount Clemens Chippewa Valley.

But being one of the final eight teams remaining was never expected of CC, which finished fourth in the Catholic League Central Division and failed to make it into the league playoffs.

"This is like a dream come true," Orsucci said. "We're on cloud nine and don't want to come down."

"We lost two games to DeLaSalle, lost to Rice and everybody thought we'd be out of this tournament early. But it doesn't matter who wins the

league or who makes the conference playoffs; the only thing people remember is who went far into the playoffs."

It was CC's first ever regional title since the program began in 1982. When Orsucci played at CC in 1989, however, his team did advance to the state's final four before the regional format was developed.

"I think we have snuck up on people who thought we would fold," Orsucci added. "But now I think teams don't want to face us and may be afraid of us. Records don't matter now. It's important who the hot team is and who is on the roll."

The game was expected to be tight. The two squads split games this season with CC winning 2-1 before Rice came back to win a 1-0 affair.

Neither team carried play in the first half, but Shamrocks came out strong in the second half and scored the game's only

goal five minutes into play.

Sophomore midfielder Andy Kogut sent a corner kick toward the net where Tony Moucoulis headed it past Rice goalkeeper Charlie Nicholas.

"I was on the near post and no one was coming over to cover me," said Moucoulis, a senior midfielder. "I told Andy to get the ball to my head and he did."

The goal stood as Kessler recorded his sixth shutout in goal.

But Kessler needed the help of his defense led by Cook and junior Jeff Boogren, who effectively marked Rice's playmaker, junior Jeff Beeler, throughout the game.

The Warriors (14-4-3) dominated play after the CC goal but couldn't score. Rice had 11 scoring opportunities with six shots on goal in the second half to CC's six chances and two shots on net.

"I thought we played well today and dominated play in the

second half," Rice coach Jay Louis-Prescott said. "We just couldn't finish. Shots on goal don't matter; the only thing that matters is how many find the back of the net."

"But you have to give CC credit -- they were tough in the box today. They definitely protected the net well."

The Warriors had several excellent scoring opportunities late in the game. Koval bided for a goal with a header, but that was tipped just over the crossbar by Kessler. The CC goalkeeper also robbed Jason Canfield with a diving save.

The CC defense did the rest, keeping the Warriors away from Kessler as the game wore down.

"We just wanted to keep the ball under control and keep it wide," Orsucci said. "I thought the defense stepped up well. Casey has anchored our defense since the playoffs began and has played incredible."

Clark's 240 yards propels Spartans

It was not the best of endings to the football season Friday when crosstown rivals Livonia Churchill and Livonia Stevenson met at Stevenson.

The Spartans did get something more positive out of it than Churchill did, however — win, by a 28-7 margin.

Stevenson finishes the campaign with a 6-3 record. The Chargers go 0-for-9, which makes them 1-62 for the '90s.

But fourth-quarter scores by Clark and Matt Allison (five rushes, 60 yards), the latter a 1-yard plunge, insured Stevenson's triumph.

Defending champion Aleta Sill did not make it to the TV finals. She was slightly hampered by a muscle strain during practice. She seemed OK, but often even a little discomfort can be enough to get you off target, ever so slightly that it goes unnoticed.

Sill is still the leading all-time money winner on the ladies pro tour.

ORLANDO, Fla. — This is the perfect place to have a minivan. They're everywhere: At Disney World. At Disney-MGM Studios. At Sea World. Heck, even at the largest McDonald's hamburger and pizza store in the world, which is right down the street.

No matter where you look, every parking lot is 90 percent filled with minivans in this tourist town. Incredible.

That's what makes this the right site to test the 1997 Nissan Quest.

We decided the kids were big enough to enjoy the wonders of Disney, so off we went a few weeks ago. All the travel guides and the weather people told us the first week in October would be perfect: No rain, lower temperatures, less humidity, small crowds. It was supposed to be perfect, or close to it, but no one told us about the week being the 25th anniversary celebration or the fact that Hurricane Josephine was on her way or that it would rain every day we were there.

Despite the rain and despite the crowds, my 3-year-old and

5-year-old still had loads of fun. We can credit the Nissan Quest for getting us to the storied theme parks in comfort and without incident.

The sister truck to the Mercury Villager proved to be a great choice for our Disney trip. The Quest offered enough space to bring whatever we needed with us, and there was enough seating (and elbow room) to satisfy everybody. And since it rained so much, we had a chance to see the Quest react to

the bad weather by showing off the road manners of a high-end luxury sedan.

Built in Avon Lake, Ohio, next to the Villager, the Quest has a 3.0-liter V6 engine. Both vehicles were designed by the same classy lady (Ford's Bobbie Gaunt) who brainstormed the creation of the Taurus and Sable more than a decade ago.

Gaunt is the one who demanded the Quest drive like a fine sedan. Hop into it without the assist of running boards or assist grips. Everything on the inside is smartly laid out, with big buttons and easy-to-use controls.

Never mind the Quest has been the best-selling import-brand minivan since 1993.

This year, it's even better. Everything has been revised — exterior, interior, convenience and safety — it's all there.

The best part about it, though, is the car-like handling

and the ride comfort. We drove from Orlando to Tampa to St. Pete and other places and never once was I fatigued. My girls enjoyed the comfort as well, snoozing in the backseats without a care in the world on some of our longer trips around Florida.

The Quest has a unique feature that's worth a mention. It's called the Quest Trac flexible seating system. The seats can be arranged in 20 different configurations. That means lots and lots of passenger/cargo arrangements.

And if you outfit the Quest in captain's chairs, you can arrange the interior in four more ways. Seating capacity is for seven with everything in it. Leave just the front seats in and you can get almost 115 cubic feet of cargo room. That's versatile.

As always, safety is all there: Standard dual air bags, three-point front seat belts that are

height-adjustable, steel side-door guard beams and a child safety lock on the sliding side door.

And if you want, you can order integrated child safety seats on both the XE and GXE models.

Don't you ever worry about locking your keys in this van. The Quest has a micro computer chip that senses if the key is still in the ignition and doesn't allow you to lock the door. Neat. If anything else but the key is put in the ignition, the Quest won't start. Plain and simple, the security system shuts the whole thing down. Even neater.

Earlier we mentioned the engine, that 3.0-liter single overhead cam V6. It has more oomph than any other import-brand minivan — a whopping 151 horsepower. The powertrain is mated to an electronically controlled 4-speed automatic trans that has an overdrive fourth gear. What that means in plain English is that you've got greater pulling power and acceleration is smooth and constant — even if you're pulling a substantial load.

This sweetheart is loaded with standard equipment, including power windows, power mirrors, power locks, illuminated driver-side vanity mirror, a 12-volt power outlet in the second row seating area (on GXE models), remote keyless entry, power assisted steering and power front disc brakes. ABS is an option — and again, well worth the price.

By the way, the Quest we tested had ABS. Unfortunately, I had to use it. It was raining (again) on a main thoroughfare in Kissimmee, Fla., and some little bitty Cutlass in front of us

hammered its brakes without warning to stop at a light. I pumped mine to stay out of trouble, and we managed to stop in time. Thankfully, we avoided having to meet the Cutlass' owner over bent fenders that drizzled night.

Even competitors know that when it comes to quality, the Quest is no Mickey Mouse minivan. All this mini needs is a fourth door to make it as perfect as Minnie's smile.

Study Shows Asphalt Roads Safer, Quieter

(NAPS) — A study in Europe five years ago showed that when a road is constructed with a special-purpose mixture called open-graded friction course, or porous asphalt, it contains a relatively large percentage of air voids. The open structure of this mix drains rainwater effectively, thus reducing the splash and spray and eliminating aquaplaning. It also reduces noise.

All of this means increased safety. According to the National Asphalt Pavement Association, in many locations, pavement surfaces are wet between 12 and 15 percent of the average year. During this time, the number and severity of accidents decrease if roadways are constructed with this open-graded friction course mixture.
